



The Approach

The ETC 6 Meridian Hedged Equity-Index Option Strategy ETF (SIXH) seeks to provide capital appreciation. To achieve this objective, the fund pairs a portfolio of equity securities with an index call option writing strategy designed to reduce the exposure of the fund to broad equity market risk with the goal of providing strong risk-adjusted returns.

Investment Thesis

Through the use of call-writing, the fund aims to provide investors with exposure to equity return with less risk and volatility.

Investment Process

The fund is composed of an equity and an options sleeve.

Equities Sleeve In constructing the equity portion of the portfolio, the Fund utilizes a three-step process to select securities to be held in the portfolio:

Step One *STOCKS EXCLUDED*

Low Quality • Low Momentum

Step Two *STOCKS RANKED ON*

Beta • Momentum • Yield • Value • Quality

Step Three *PORTFOLIO CONSTRUCTION*

Most attractively ranked stocks held in portfolio

Weightings based on the number of factors for which the security ranks highly

Options Sleeve The fund writes call options on broad market indexes and index ETFs based on 6 Meridian's proprietary option writing framework.

Equity Exposure

SIXH may be used as a portion of your portfolio's U.S. equity allocation.

By writing covered call options in return for the receipt of premiums, the Fund will give up the opportunity to benefit from potential increases in the value of the reference index above the exercise prices of such options, but will continue to bear the risk of declines in the value of the reference index. The Sub-Adviser relies heavily on quantitative models as well as data and information supplied by third parties that are utilized by the models. To the extent the models do not perform as designed or as intended, the Fund's strategy may not be successfully implemented and the Fund may lose value. If the models or data are incorrect or incomplete, any decisions made in reliance thereon may lead to the inclusion or exclusion of securities that would have been excluded or included had the models or data been correct and complete.

A new or smaller fund is subject to the risk that its performance may not represent how the fund is expected to or may perform in the long term. In addition, new funds have limited operating histories for investors to evaluate and new and smaller funds may not attract sufficient assets to achieve investment and trading efficiencies. Additionally, during the Fund's liquidation all or a portion of the Fund's portfolio may be invested in a manner not consistent with its investment objective and investment policies.

Shares are bought and sold at market price (not NAV) and are not individually redeemed from the Fund. Brokerage commissions will reduce returns. The market price returns are based on the official closing price of an ETF share or, if the official closing price isn't available, the midpoint between the national best bid and national best offer ("NBBO") as of the time the ETF calculates current NAV per share, and do not represent the returns you would receive if you traded shares at other times. Therefore, NAV is used to calculate market returns prior to the first trade date because there is no bid/ask spread until the fund starts trading.
