Business Mastermind Group

Purpose: Reduce the sense of isolation for entrepreneurs and support individuals as they navigate business decisions and choose among competing values

In the meeting, group members:

- Report current challenge and goal
- Get coached and coach one another
- Identify specific experiments and actions

Members commit to:

- Take action between meetings
- Report back on learning and results

Group Members:

- Get coached
- Coach others
- Take turns in the role of facilitator

Facilitator (one member of the group, rotates at each meeting):

- Determines length of time slots
- Keeps track of time
- Keeps coaching focused on presenter's coaching goal
- Affirms and models good questions
- Calls on quiet members
- Tells members when they have 2-3 minutes left in their time
- Makes sure actions are specific

Mastermind Process

Opening (5-10 minutes)		
The Facilitator reads the following NORMS out loud:	 Confidentiality Honor all perspectives Communicate your needs Participate fully in each meeting Give more than you expect to receive Start and end on time Manage your time slot; help the group help you Keep the process focused 	
The Facilitator reads these GUIDELINES FOR GETTING COACHED out loud:	 Explain your challenge and coaching goal in 2-3 minutes and in concrete terms Describe your feelings about the challenge and coaching goal Use "I" statements Be concise 	
The Facilitator reads these GUIDELINES FOR COACHING OTHERS out loud:	 Listen, actively and deeply Focus on the presenter's coaching goal Ask open-ended questions about the presenter's perspectives, assumptions, actions, etc. Use the Question Quick Guide as needed Help the presenter explore other points of view Limit advice and discussion If you see or feel something, respectfully say it out loud Help the presenter come to specific experiments, actions, and learning Intervene if the meeting gets off track 	

Coaching & Being Coached (90-120 minutes)

- Each member gets an equal time slot to be coached (15-20 minutes each)
- Each member shares their challenge, coaching goal, and how they would like to be coached from the Business Mastermind Prep Worksheet (pg. 4) (2-3 minutes)
- Members coach one another
- Facilitator records learning and intended action

Closing (10 minutes)

- Complete the Mastermind Meeting Reflection individually (pg. 5)
- Each member evaluates the meeting out loud: state what worked and what *you* would do differently next time to make the meeting more productive
- If necessary or desired, confirm date, time, place, and facilitator of the next meeting.

Question Quick Guide

Ask questions when:

- You want someone to think creatively
- You suspect they have the answer
- They need someone to listen
- o A different perspective might be helpful
- You need information

Characteristics of powerful questions:

- Powerful questions are open-ended
- Ask "what" or "how," not "why"
- Ask from a stance of curiosity
- Ask to understand and clarify NOT to argue or interrogate
- Ask one question at a time
- Ask a question as simply as possible

Partner powerful questions with SILENCE. Powerful questions need no backup.

Question ideas:

- Explain to me...
- Help me understand...
- o Tell me more about...
- o What else might you say about that?
- o What do you want?
- o What are some other perspectives on the challenge?
- o What is non-negotiable?
- o What will that get you?
- o What did you learn?
- o What does your gut tell you?
- o What is your purpose?
- o How will you know you're making progress?
- o What will success look like?
- o What's possible here?
- o What's at stake for you?
- o What have you already tried that didn't work?
- o What's holding you back?
- o What's your part of the mess?
- o What is one thing you're wiling to commit to doing?
- o Whose support do you need?
