## MG Fiscal Accountability Policy

- Originally adopted by Consortium membership January 2013
- Includes:
  - LEFs over \$100k in revenue must submit financial audit
  - LEFs under \$100k in revenue must adopt fiscal policies if requesting exemption from audit requirement
  - Annual expenditures "spot check"
    - One project from 20% of program participants
    - Random selection from those not spot checked in the past five years



- Review of expenditures (both state and private dollars) of your project
- Check receipts against final budget





#### Allowable Expenditures

- Salaries and Benefits <u>DIRECTLY</u> Admission Fees related to program implementation
- Classroom Materials
- Travel
- Program Supplies
- Computer Software & Hardware
- Other Equipment (not computers)\*Only percentage of total cost
- Printing
- Tuition/Training/Conferences

- Room Rental Fees
- Internet Service\*
- Telephone Service\*
- Postage\*
- iPads, iPods, Nooks, Kindles

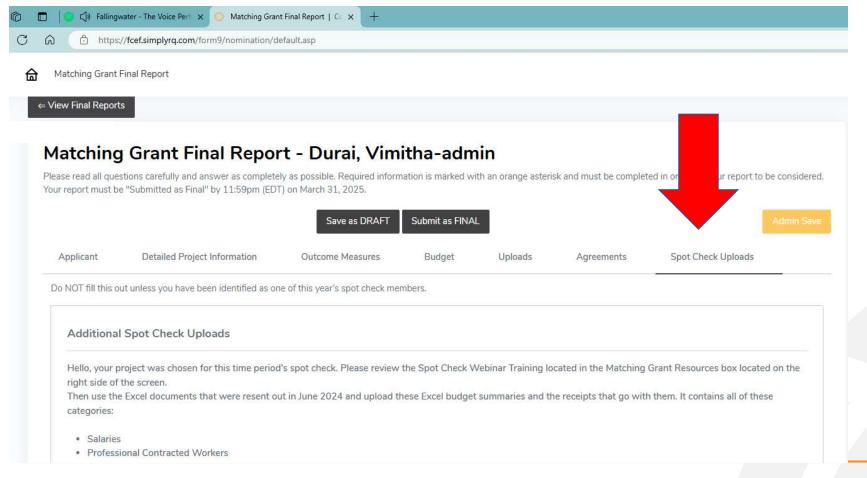


#### Unallowable Expenditures

- Percent of General Administrative Expenses
  - Salaries/Benefits/Prof. Contract Workers for grant management
  - Indirect Office Expenses (Internet Service, Telephone Service, etc. not related to grant management)
- Food/Beverage/Entertainment
- Support of Interscholastic Athletics
- Capital Improvements

- Decorative Items
- Awards/incentives
- Fund Raising
- Pre-award costs
- PDAs/cell phones
- Repairs and maintenance
- Out-of-state travel without prior permission







Be sure to name each one separately to correspond with the file upload name. All receipts must be submitted separately, in one document per category.

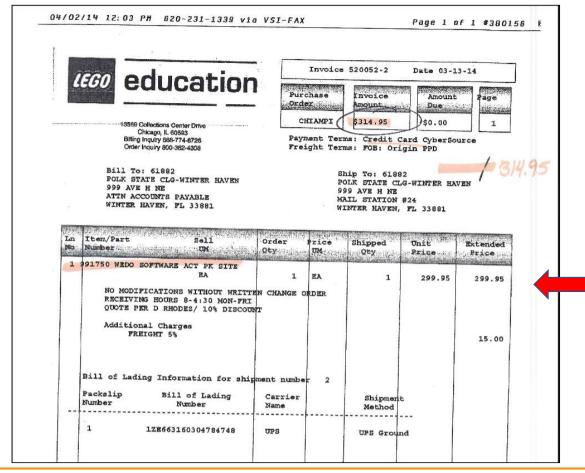

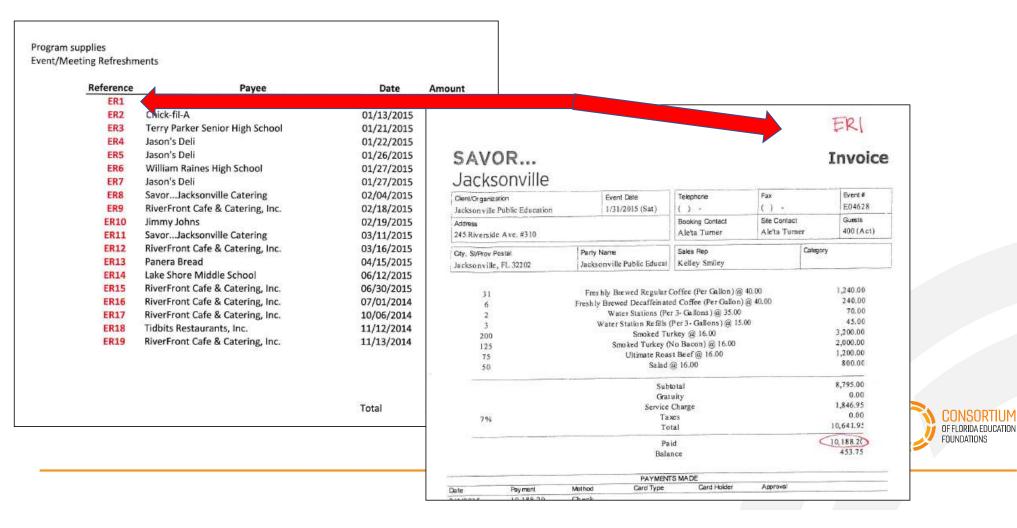




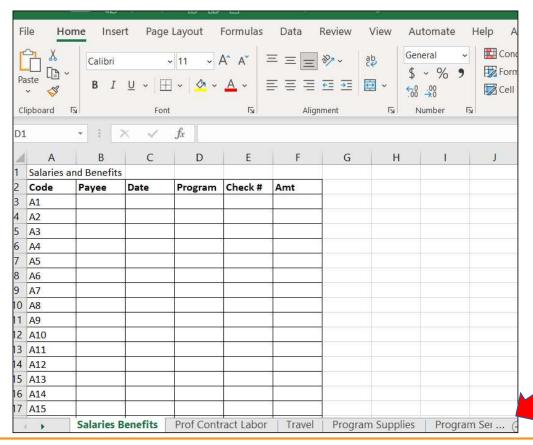

#### Tracking of Technical Items

- While formal tracking is not a requirement, we highly recommend tracking of technical items
- Keep Property Records of All Items Purchased
  - Tracking may be done through your School Districts
  - Tracking may also be done through the foundation with a hard-to-remove tag or label
- The Consortium <u>recommends</u> all items over \$500 with life expectancy of more than one year; the DOE <u>recommends</u> a policy on tracking of small, attractive items of \$1,000 or less
- Physical Inventory of Purchased Items:
  - At least every year
  - Investigate all discrepancies

#### "Small attractive items" include:

- Tablets
- Mini-tablet media devices (iPods)
- Audio digital voice recorders
- Document cameras
- Digital microscopes
- Handheld mobile computers
- Memory storage devices
- Any digital or analog device that presents a challenge in maintaining inventory control
