Parmesan Summer Squash Crisps

Yields: 4 servings as a side dish or appetizer Prep time: 5-10 minutes Cook time: 20-25 minutes

Ingredients:

- 2 medium zucchini or yellow squash (or a combination)
- 1¹/₂ cups grated Parmesan cheese (or your preferred type)
- ¹/₄ to ¹/₂ teaspoon garlic powder
- Black pepper
- Olive oil spray

Instructions:



- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit (200 degrees Celsius). Line a large baking sheet (or two smaller sheets) with parchment paper.
- 2. Wash zucchini or squash and slice into thin rounds. For a crispier texture, slice thinly; thicker rounds will result in a softer consistency.

- 9. Remove from oven and let cool slightly. Gently lift the edges of the Parmesan crisp and break into pieces. Serve immediately.
