STATEMENT OF HARDSHIP

The Hall County Planning Commission has the authority, in specific cases, to grant variances from the terms of the Zoning Regulations when the variance will not be contrary to the public interest where, owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of the Zoning Regulations will, in specific cases, result in unnecessary hardship and so that the resolution shall be observed, public safety and welfare secured, and substantial justice done. The authority to grant such variances shall be limited to those instances where a hardship is clearly established as required by the Zoning Regulations.

In all cases involving requests for residential variances from the terms of the Zoning Regulations, a plat or survey of the property prepared by a registered surveyor, architect, or engineer shall be required. In all cases involving variances for commercial or industrial uses of land, a site plan of the property prepared by a registered surveyor, architect, or engineer shall be required. Variances may be granted only upon a finding by the board that:

Describe how each situation listed below relates to your application:
1. There are extraordinary and exceptional conditions pertaining to the particular piece of property in question
because of its size, shape or topography (the hardship must relate to the physical character of the lot and not to a
personal or economic hardship). As is the case with many lake frontage properties, the amount of available road frontage is disproportional to the amount of lake frontage. The lake
frontage can easily support 6 lots, based on minimum Army Corps of Engineer's criteria but the road frontage will only support a 3 lot subdivision.
Trontage can easily support 6 lots, based on minimum Army Corps of Engineer's criteria but the road nontage will only support a feet destruction.
2. The application of the requirements of this resolution to this particular property would create an unusual hardship. A hardship will be created if the property owner is not allowd to fully subdivide the property based on the underlying zoning requirements. The property owner has
offered to construct a common driveway in order to limit the number of driveways from 6 to 2.
3. Such conditions are peculiar to the particular piece of property involved and not common to other properties in the neighborhood. That is, the application of the regulation would deprive the applicant of the rights commonly enjoyed by others in the neighborhood.
Two other projects on Shirley Road, with lake frontage, have been approved with road frontages of less than 150'. The Summercrest S/D in 2016
and the Sosewood Property Group, LLC S/D in 2021.
4. Such conditions are not the result of any actions of the property owner. The property owner has taken no actions which would faciliate the request for this variance.
5. Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of this resolution provided; however, that no variance may be granted for a use of land or building or structure that is
prohibited by this resolution. For example, granting the variance would not confer any special privilege that is denied
by this regulation to other property in the same zoning district. If granted, this variance would not be detrimental as the result does not increase the density allowed by the underlying zoning. In fact, the resulting
lot sizes are much larger than the minimum for the V-C zoning district. The specifics of this variance are unique to this property and and would not confer any other specific
privelege.
