My name is Kathryn Askew, I live at 8720 Forrester rd. LulaGa. My family moved here from Dublin Ga. in 1984 to help My gradpa with his chicken farm and feild crops. I was five and my brother was eleven years old. We as a family all worked the farm, wile my father attended college at the University of Georgia, for his Doctorate in education. My mother also attended the University of Georgia, and soon became a first grade teacher at Wank MI. Elem school
In the eairly nineties my father became a professor, a doctor of education at Georgia College, in Milledgeville GA, to teach teachers. So we as a family decided we were going to buy a house in middle $G A$. We decided to sell to our neighbor Reggie cochran land. We trusted Reggie so, we gifted him an easement. Reggie promissed my father he would only ale it for Agriculture. We bought a house in middle ga., Our house at $\$ 720$ would be our summer home. wis My fathe started commuting back and forth. My father would come home on weekends.

The seperation was very hard on the family. We stayed here because my mother wanted my brother and I to finish school. My mother also loved her job teaching children how to read. she was a teacher of excellence at wank mt elem. School.

In 1995 my father was commuting home and ran off road on Hwy. 52 five miles from Home, He was pronounced deceased at the scene, we as farl were all devastated. My father wasn't a ordinary man, He was very important to everyone who knew him and everyone he came in contact with, His students truly love him. There is a tree dedicated and named Wally's Tree in Lockerly Arboretum, he enjoyed teaching in nature.

My mother was strong, but so, so hurt, we all were, We had to sell the house in Milledgeville. ga., This all left my poor mama with to kid to raise in their rebellious teenage years that had just lost their father tragically.

A few years of agony passed, just to be told that now my mother was dying of liver disease, and I was to take care of her, so I did and it was good we had our time,
but she couldn't go on without her hushan. there was a green house dedicated in her honor at wauka Mt. Elem. that is in use tie this day still teaching Children aggricut-
During the battle of live disease is when Reggie Cochran sold the land we had previously sold to him with the gifted easment to steven and Holly V. Crumbly.

The plat of land 8730 has only existed since it was filed and sold in 1999. When the land was soled in was in a agricultural timber covenant agreement. We spoke against even the house going there. Our land / driveway has become a commercial road with a estimatelguess of 26 to 30 cars entering and exiting everyday.

When I was growing up my father would walk the land with me expressing his loves for animals and nature, teaching me things, he even built the 1 house My brother his daughter and I live in. He always walked the driveway with me. The view was beautiful, and most of my memories are of use walking and talking on my driveway. Unfortunely When you do go for a walk its loud dogs barking halfway and traffic on the other half. We barely even walk it anymore

Dear Gregg Dou 4-18-2.3 because I feel it is dangerous. I feel very. used, sad, depressed about all of this. I feel these people took advantage of a broken family. This is our property and we pay the taxes and love this land. We have to see this every

I hope this letter touches your day heart I love this land and I consider it my families home for generations to come. ## THIS IS A LETTER MY MUM WROTE IN 1999

Johnny,
Great to talk to you. A lot of time has passed since I have Family seen you. Hope your family is doing well. Would love to see the girls and Hannah. Hope time has been nicer to you than it has to me. Cant believe how "gray" and "wrinkled"I have become.

As Daddy has mentioned to you, 1 am in the middle of a situation about which I feel very confused. I feel that I may be being taken advantage of. I realized that all zoning laws are different in different counties, but 1 will try to explain. In August of 1993, Wally and I sold some land to purchase the house in Milledgeville. Wally's dad also sold property. In the surveying and setting up of all the plots, Wally then had the remaining property put in my name. The situation that was created was that due to the fact that my property would be landlocked, a tract of land was created whereby my nine acres of land would also include a fifty foot driveway that would go to Forrester Road, thus creating the fifty foot frontage necessary for all property. My driveway is almost half a mile long. All of these transactions took place on the same day including the transference of the property to my name. (Recording the documents) I was never aware of a "permanent easement". I was also told that Mr. Cochran and Mr . Oliver would be able to use the driveway for
maintenance of the field and cow pasture. My well is also in the middle of the cow pasture purchased by Freeman Oliver
so lwas given water rights which are explained in the enclosed document. I have also enclosed the plat, so maybe fhis will not be so difficult to figure out. Now to the present. I was informed un August that Mr. Cochran was going to sell the field on the right side of my diryerray to Steve Crumiey and that they would then used my driveway for their property. They are planning to build a house on this propertyl changing it from agricultural to residentiat use The tract of land that he sold them, approximately nine acres is landlocked Mr. Cochrar has additional property next to the property he purchased next to the property we sold him. However, he did not want to use auy of his land. He would "arrange" things so they would be abie to use my driveway: I was very upset about this and contacted my layyer here, only to have him tell me that a permanent easement had been set up at the time of the selling of the property in 1993 and that there was nothing 1 could do. However, being aware of new zoning laws in Hall County tho one can sell or build on property that does not have fifty foot frontage, not sure about soll, but definitely not build. I did feel, however that I was not being treated totally fair, so decided then to begin investigating myself After several telephone calls, I ended up talking to the "head of zoming in Hall County. (Shuler) His first response to me was that my name sounded familiar. I explained my situation to him, and the said he would investigate and call me back the nexi day with a complete story on my situation I thought his was rather strange considering he is such a busy person. He did, however, call me back the next day. He began his explanation with the fact that he and the lavyers had spent the last three
weeks "sweating" over my situation as to where the plot of land under consideration was a buildable plot. He said that it was decided it was. Even though the tract is land locked, my driveway would serve as the way for them to be able to buld then house. He further explaned to me that due to the fact that the 9 aere tack of fand had not been incorporated into Mr. Cochearis onisinal land and was ler isolated because it had an cascment, it was a buildable lot. In Hall County now property can $t$ be sold with frontage access. Also, thave great difficulty understanding how an easement can be sold. Also, what has come to light is that when Mr. Cochran bought the land, that land that was next to the track that we sold him actually belonged to Notha Cochran. This created a totally land locked area of land.

Another area of concern that has recently come to light is the fact that the recording of the sale of all these properties and the transier of our property to me all took place on the same day Also, even in the description of the land that was sold by Wally's dad. 1 am listed as the owner. Inever signed any document giving a permanent casement to anyone. I am listed as the owner of the land. I feel very uncomfortable about the entire situation. Something is not right. Because I am possibly umiformed in this area as far as the law is concemed, because 1 am female, (there is a tremendous amount of diserimmation of all types in this area) and because of the fact that all these men are very wealthy I feel somethino is very wrong. This is my land I pay the taxes
things have been done without my permission. I am very angry. Any advice or direction would greatly be appreciated. I hope to be in
Dublin soon. If I did not have to go through Milledgeville it would be alot easier. Times still get extremely difficult for us. I keep waiting for the peak; so far it won't come. Situation like this one make it very difficult. It's difficult making decision all alone. There's no one to blame but me when they're wrong ones. Oh, well, enough of giving myself a hard time. Hope 10 see you real soon.

Hello, my name is James. Ask. Ido not want to allow the property at 8730 Forrester Rd to be split and sold to two-different-people or companies. The easement wording was changed on the Crumleys easement, it is not non- exclusive it is a permanent perpetual easement the word non exclusive was added. When I look outside my home I see a giant building, when I walk outside all I hear is dogs, non stop barking. Anytime I drive down my driveway I see about 15 cars parked in the parking lot, and almost every time run into someone coming or going from the business. I fear my Grand child will never get to walk the driveway to even catch the bus. I fear the noise, the traffic and even the size of this building will continue to be more and more because it has already in the last 10 years. Please don't let this happen. Please help us. Thank you

In 2007 Hall County approved 8730 Forrester Rd. for a Commercial Kennel, which is allowed under uses permitted in AR-IV upon Boc approval (17.120.040 N).
17.20.620. - Kennel, commercial.
"Commercial kennel" means any place in or at which more than four adult dogs (or cats) are kept for the purpose of sale, boarding, care, breeding or training and for which any fee is charged. A commercial kennel shall be located on not less than five acres of land in the residential zoning districts. The raising of four or fewer adult dogs (or cats) would be inherently allowed in all residential zones that allow a commercial kennel.
17.290.030. - Prohibited uses.
A. The keeping, breeding, or training of any animals or fowl for monetary gain or profit shall be deemed a commercial business and is expressly prohibited in all residential districts except where such operations may qualify as a home occupation.
17.20.560. - Home occupation.
"Home occupation" means an occupation or profession conducted entirely within a dwelling and which is carried on by an occupant thereof and which is clearly incidental and secondary to the use of the dwelling for residential dwelling purposes. There is no access by the public. A home occupation is designed to be less restrictive than a home office but more restrictive than a residential business in regard to access by the public, size, visibility, number of employees and types of business. Conditions for a home occupation are listed in chapter 17.210.
17.20.920. - Residential business.
"Residential business" means an occupation or profession conducted within à dwelling, and which is carried on by an occupant thereof and which is clearly incidental and secondary to the use of the dwelling for residential dwelling purposes. The business may require access by the public. The residential business is designed to be less restrictive than a home office or home occupation but more restrictive than a rural business in regard to access by the public, size, visibility, number of employees and types of business. Planning commission approval is required in accordance with the conditions outlined in section 17.350.130.
17.20.960. - Rural business.
"Rural business" means an occupation or profession conducted within a dwelling, an accessory structure or outside and which is carried on by a resident of that property and which is clearly incidental and secondary to the use of the property for residential dwelling purposes. The rural business is designed to be less restrictive than a home office, home occupation or residential business in regard to access by the public, size, visibility, number of employees and types of business. Planning commission approval is required for a rural business in accordance with the conditions outlined in section 17.350.140.

According to Randi Doveton (head of planning and zoning), Brandi Smith (supervisor of business license division), and many other employees at the planning office, the Commercial Kennel at 8730 Forrester Rd. is Not a Home Occupation, it is Not a Residential Business, or a Rural Business. When asked, "well what is it "? We were told we would need to see the Occupation Permit to see what it is. That Occupation Permit is one for a Commercial Business. Somehow this makes the commercial kennel at 8730 Forrester Rd ( that should fall under guidelines for home occupation, residential business, or rural business) to be viewed as a Commercial Property. The regulations for a Home Occupation, Residential Business, or Rural Business would keep someone from establishing and developing a commercial business on a residential parcel, and then deciding once it would deemed profitable enough, divide and sell said property as a Commercial Business, because in each case, according to hall county ordinances "the business shall be valid only as long as the original principal practitioner resides in the dwelling, is conducting the business and has a current business license". These ordinances are put in place to lead, guide, direct and Protect the citizens of Hall County and should be fully enforced to do so.
