the first Arbor Day was celebrated on April 10, 1872 in Nebraska, advocated by Julius Sterling Morton, a Nebraska journalist and politician; and

WHEREAS,

as a member of Nebraska's State Board of Agriculture, Mr. Morton proposed that a special day be set aside dedicated to tree plantings and increasing awareness of the importance of trees; and

WHEREAS,

Arbor Day is an excellent opportunity to stress the value of trees which provide windbreaks, shade, fuel, building materials, habitat for wildlife and adds beauty to the community; and

WHEREAS,

as other holidays repose upon the past, Arbor Day proposes for the
