

Georgia County Internship Program Grant Application Summer 2024

Section II requires the applicant to provide answers to a series of questions and Section III requires a detailed description of the internship project being proposed, the need it addresses, and the expected benefits to the county. The application deadline for the 2024 GCIP grant program is Monday, December 18, 2023

Please note that factors that influence consideration include but are not limited to the type of project submitted, the overall impact and benefit to the county of the project(s) proposed, the ability to partially fund the internship position(s), collaboration with other counties, regional commissions, colleges/universities, and/or non-profits, and the number of interns requested.

Reminder: Interns should be <u>currently enrolled</u> in college as undergraduate or graduate students or have recently graduated from college within one year of the grant period. High school students 16 years of age or older who are dually enrolled in a college or university are also eligible. Interns cannot work more than 200 total hours during the grant period unless the county agrees to pay for all expenses beyond the 200-hour period. The county and the intern can decide how many hours the intern works per week and the total number of weeks worked. It is recommended that the minimum hours worked per week be no less than 15 hours.

JOB SUMMARY:

To provide a variety of administrative support responsibilities, to include compiling and analyzing data in the production of reports, compiling survey results, assisting in assessment of capital project needs, assisting in production of presentations. Provide clerical and light administrative office tasks and other duties relative to Parks operations and events.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Record and analyze statistics related to various department functions.

Produce reports identifying year-over-year trends in participation, survey results and other departmental data.

Assists director and other department staff as needed.

Light typing and word processing to include emails, orders, memos, and other business documents.

Performs other related work as required.

ADA Minimum Qualifications

Physical Ability: Essential functions of this position continuously require the ability to remain in a stationary position (sitting or standing); operate a computer and other office machinery, such as a calculator, copier, printer, telephone. Incumbents must continuously be able to think analytically, handle stress and emotion; concentrate on tasks. Remember names, and other details; examine and observe details; make decisions and adjust to change. Incumbents must also continuously direct others, meet deadlines, stay organized, use math/calculations, use a keyboard/type.

Essential functions frequently require the ability to move about inside the complex and move and transport items up to 20 lbs.; ability to bend body downward and forward by bending spine and legs. And twisting at the waist, hips, or knees; reach overhead, push, pull, and repetitive use hands, arms, legs. Incumbents are frequently required to be on-call and work irregular hours.

Sensory Requirements: Essential functions regularly require the ability to use effective verbal and written communication; and use of hand/eye coordination and fine manipulation to use equipment.

Environmental Factors: Essential functions of this position continuously require the ability to work with others or work alone.

This class specification should not be interpreted as all-inclusive. It is intended to identify the major responsibilities and requirements of this job. The incumbent may be requested to perform job-related responsibilities and tasks other than those stated in this specification.
