

WHEREAS, gynecological cancer is a leading cause of cancer death among women; and

WHEREAS, there is no effective screening test for ovarian cancer, and it often shows no obvious signs or symptoms until late in its development; and

- WHEREAS, 19,680 women will receive a diagnosis of ovarian cancer in 2024 and 12,740 will die from the disease; and
- WHEREAS, According to the Mayo Clinic more than 60 women are given the diagnosis of ovarian cancer daily in the United States; roughly 270 mothers, daughters, wives and friends will be taken from our lives each week; and
- WHEREAS, according to the American Cancer Society the survival rate of ovarian cancer is less than 31% at five years. 1 in every 78 women will be given the diagnosis of ovarian cancer in their lifetime; and
- WHEREAS, the health and well being of women in Hall County are enhanced by increased public awareness of cervical and gynecological cancers. With a comprehensive approach to prevent, screen, and treat, we can end cervical cancer as a public health problem within a few generations; and
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hall County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim the month of September 2024 to be

GYNECOLOGICAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

and calls upon citizens to educate themselves on the prevention and treatment of gynecological cancer.
