


Project Details

Summarize the proposed project, including its purpose and how it aligns with the State's funding priorities for this Grant:

The Hall County Sheriff's Office SWAT Team is seeking \$28,815 in equipment that will assist in Preventing, Mitigating, Responding to, and Recovery of acts of domestic terrorism. The Hall County Sheriff's Office SWAT Team is responsible for providing a tactical response to law enforcement agencies in unincorporated Hall County; the city limits of Gainesville, Oakwood, Flowery Branch, and Braselton, as well as provide mutual aid for neighboring cities & counties, or any jurisdiction throughout northeast Georgia that makes a request. The County has two heavy traffic interstates (1985 and Ga. 365), Lake Lanier and the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains. The estimated population is 215,000 residents (250,000+ with daily visitors). This number drastically increases in the summer months with an average of 8-10 million visitors to Lake Lanier. There is a high volume of commuters traveling into Hall County every day with venues that are vulnerable to a domestic terrorism attack in the Hall County Sheriff's Office jurisdiction (or surrounding jurisdictions) are more than 300 manufacturing and processing facilities, and 49 locations of international companies representing 19 countries. Hall County has a major rail station, airport, federal courthouse, 2 county courthouse, and 4 municipal courtrooms, 11 postal facilities, 3 colleges, 3 water treatment facilities, 11 nursing homes, 20 daycares and 37 public schools. Hall County is home to largest hospital system in northeast Georgia with two hospitals, one located on the north side of the county and one on the south side.

Funds will be used as follows:

Purchase of one Infrared Laser Zoom Spotlight attachment for Matrice 300 drone \$6,000

Purchase of six USNV PVS-14A Gen 3, Full Spec, OMNI VIII monocular \$22,815

This equipment would greatly improve our ability to perform night operations and assist us in our efforts of preventing, mitigating, responding to, and recovery of acts of domestic terrorism to our jurisdiction and the jurisdictions we respond to as mutual aid.


