Usable lots by the health department are determined to be usable lots if the usable soils meets or exceeds 21,760sf. These lots exceed this requirement and most of the lots site on some of the best soils out there being the Madison Soil Group.

There may be 2 or 3 lots that are questionable but lotlines will be adjusted as needed during the design phase.

We could just move forward and submit to the health department for approval if we need to.

As for the County requiring additional requirements along the DOT road the answer is yes and no. The County could say you need 2 entrances but the DOT may only allow you to have 1.

BUT I feel if the County said we had to have a middle turn lane, I do not think the DOT would disagree with the County. We are right on the border line of requiring a middle turn lane but the plan we have now currently shows a passing lane. I was just hoping the condition would read "as required by GA DOT". A passing lane is MUCH cheaper than a middle turn lane. A middle turn lane would be overkill for sure.

The only per GA DOT standards to remove the 100ft Right Hand Passing Lane would be to reduce the number of lots in the subdivision.

The threshold for requiring the 100ft Right Hand Passing Lane is 75 Left Turns per day and currently as designed we are yielding 80 Left Hand Turns per day.

Each lot is responsible for 4-5 Left Hand Trips per day so the lot yield would have to be reduced by two if we wanted to have an argument with the DOT to not have to provide any kind of left turn lane.

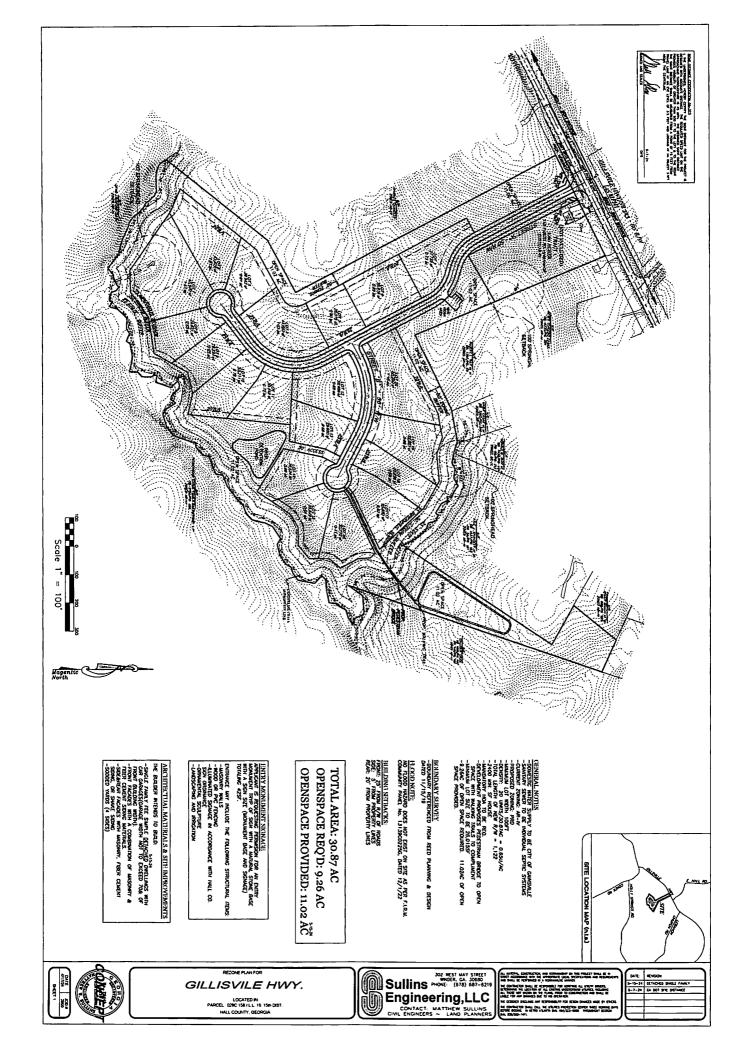
FYI. Even if we reduced the lot count by two there is still a possibility they could still require a passing lane BUT we would have a real good argument.

On August 5, 2024 the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval, with conditions for your application for **0 & 3454 Gillsville Highway | Rezone |** from Agricultural Residential IV (AR-IV) to Planned Residential Development (PRD) | on a combined 30.78± acre tract located on the south side of Gillsville Highway (GA-323), approximately 370 feet from its intersection with East Hall Road | Zoned AR-IV; Tax Parcels 15016 000158A & 000028C | **Proposed Use: 20-lot residential subdivision |** Commission District 3 | **Sabina Chowdhury, applicant**

Conditions:

- The property shall be developed in accordance with the site plan dated June 7, 2024, and as described in the project narrative dated May 15, 2024, modified as necessary for compliance with conditions herein and development standards enforced at the time of site plan approval.
- 2. The development shall be limited to no more than 20 single-family lots.
- 3. The minimum heated floor area (HFA) shall be 2,400 square feet for all residential units.
- Each lot within the development shall be served by individual on-site septic systems. Each lot must follow Environmental Health regulations.
- 5. There shall be a mandatory Homeowners' Association (HOA).
- 6. All designated open space within the development shall be commonly held, and not held by any individual homeowner(s).
- 7. All interior roads shall be designed and constructed to Hall County standards. Coordination and approval from Hall County Engineering shall be required. The developer shall be responsible for all costs associated with improvements necessary for access to the development and the entrance from Gillsville Highway. The entrance shall be designed and constructed according to GDOT standards and requirements.
- All stream buffers must be fully within Homeowners' Association common space and shall not encroach onto any individual residential building lot.
- No variances or development exceptions are granted as part of this request unless explicitly listed herein. The development shall be compliant with the Official Code of Hall County.

- 10. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operation in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property: "Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."
- 11. All conditions of zoning shall be made a part of any plats or development plans created for the subdivision.

The Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing for final determination of this request at their meeting scheduled for **Tuesday, September 10, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.** at the Hall County Government Center, 2nd Floor Meeting Room, 2875 Browns Bridge Road, Gainesville, Georgia.
