RESOLUTION OBJECTING TO THE CITY OF FLOWERY BRANCH'S ANNEXATION OF THE PROPERTIES OF CD, II PROPERTIES, LLC KNOWN AS HALL COUNTY TAX PARCELS 15046 000008 AND 15046 000008B

WHEREAS, Hall County has received a notice of filing with the City of Flowery Branch of a petition for annexation of the properties of CD, II Properties, LLC located at 4651 Hog Mountain Road, Flowery Branch, Georgia 30542, and 4665 Hog Mountain Road, Flowery Branch, Georgia 30542, and bearing Hall County Tax Parcel Numbers 15046 000008 and 15046 000008B, respectively, (the "Subject Properties"); and

WHEREAS, the annexation petition seeks to rezone the Subject Properties from Hall County's designation of Agricultural-Residential 1 (AR-1) and Residential 1 (R-1) to the City of Flowery Branch's designation of Traditional Neighborhood Development (TND); and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation and rezoning of the Subject Properties, constituting approximately $19.398 \pm acres$, for the development of a one-hundred-and-sixteen (116) unit townhome community on the Subject Properties, represents a substantially more intense and significantly different use of the properties than allowed by Hall County's existing agricultural and residential zoning of the properties; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation, rezoning, and proposed use of the Subject Properties as a high-density townhome community would cause a substantial increase in the intensity of the allowable use of the Subject Properties; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation, rezoning, and proposed use of the Subject Properties as a high-density townhome community would cause a dramatic deviation from the current low to moderate density of development in the immediate area; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation, rezoning, and proposed use of the Subject Properties as a high-density townhome community would create a significant increase in the demand on local infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation and rezoning of the Subject Properties would result in the property located at 4675 Hog Mountain Road, Flowery Branch, Georgia 30542, known as Hall County Tax Parcel 15046 000009A, becoming an unincorporated island in violation of Georgia law under O.C.G.A. § 36-36-4(a)(1); and

WHEREAS, the Hall County Board of Commissioners has carefully reviewed the annexation and rezoning request, and the Board has determined that annexation, rezoning, and the

proposed use of the Subject Properties as a high-density townhome community is not in the best interest of the residents of Hall County; and

WHEREAS, the Official Code of Georgia Annotated provides a procedure for resolving annexation disputes under O.C.G.A. § 36-36-110 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners wishes to avail itself of the remedies provided by the annexation dispute resolution process through its objection to this annexation and rezoning request;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HALL COUNTY DOES HEREBY OBJECT to the City of Flowery Branch's annexation and rezoning of Hall County Tax Parcels 15046 000008 and 15046 000008B, as requested by the applicant, Rochester | DCCM, and the properties' owner, CD, II Properties, LLC. This objection is based upon a material increase in burden on Hall County's infrastructure demands, an increase in density in the local area, and a significant deviation from the current use of the Subject Properties directly related to the proposed change in zoning and land use.

Based upon the information presented in the application for annexation provided to Hall County, the County specifically objects to the proposed change in zoning and land use that would result from the annexation as follows:

The application for annexation of the Subject Properties, approximately 19.398 ± acres, describes a rezoning from Hall County's Agricultural-Residential 1 (AR-1) and Residential 1 (R-1) districts to the City of Flowery Branch's Traditional Neighborhood Development (TND) district for the development of a one-hundred-and-sixteen (116) attached unit townhome community comprised of twenty-one (21) buildings. Hall County attaches Flowery Branch's Notification of Intent to Annex and Rezone, the annexation application, and the supporting documents served upon Hall County. See Exhibit A. The Subject Properties are bordered on the north by Hall County's R-1 and Highway Business districts; on the south by Hall County's R-1 and Planned Residential Development zoning; on the east by Hall County's R-1 and Planned Residential Development districts; and on the west by Hall County's R-1 and Planned Residential Development districts and the City of Flowery Branch's Highway Business district.

The proposed high-density townhome community to be developed on the Subject Properties would directly contrast with the surrounding and existing uses permitted by Hall County. The County's existing AR-1 and R-1 zoning of the properties permits detached single-family dwelling units for agricultural or residential uses at a low density (approximately 1 to 1.2 units per acre), as shown in Sections 3.2 and 4.3 of Hall County's Uniform Development Code, Appendix A of the Official Code of Hall County. *See* Exhibit B. The County's current recommended density for the Subject Properties of 1 to 1.2 dwelling units per acre would be drastically increased by the proposed annexation and rezoning of the properties to the City of Flowery Branch's TND district, which would allow a maximum of six-and-a-half (6.5) units per acre as shown in Article 7 of Flowery Branch's Zoning Ordinance, Appendix C of the

City's Code of Ordinances. See Exhibit C. Per the site plan provided by the applicant, Rochester | DCCM, the proposed high-density townhome community would feature a density average of 6 units per acre. Construction of the proposed development, therefore, would be out of character with the Subject Properties' immediate neighbors and would interfere with the existing landowners' quiet enjoyment of their properties through overcrowding and by upsetting their expectation of a lower density usage in the area. Further, the rise in density would result in substantially increased traffic on local roads in the immediate vicinity of the Subject Properties. The applicant has not proposed any road improvements that would sufficiently ameliorate the increase in traffic volume and the related infrastructure costs associated with increased road congestion. Thus, the proposed change in zoning and land use contained in the application for annexation would create a large material increase in burden upon Hall County directly related to the proposed change in zoning and land use. (Hall County notes that the City of Flowery Branch currently has two other properties along Hog Mountain Road neighboring the Subject Properties for which it has accepted annexation applications that would allow for the creation of additional high-density residential developments that will further increase the burden on Hall County's infrastructure needs. See Exhibit D. Hall County is also objecting to those other proposed annexations through separate resolutions.)

Additionally, the proposed change in zoning and land use as described in the application for annexation of the Subject Properties would result in a substantial increase in the intensity of the allowable uses of the properties as well as a change to significantly different allowable uses. An aerial photograph of the area immediately surrounding the proposed annexation shows that there are no high-density residential subdivisions near the Subject Properties. See Exhibit E. A review of the City of Flowery Branch's zoning ordinance for TND shows more permitted uses with a higher density than that allowed by Hall County's current zoning of the Subject Properties. These alternative uses provide for more intense uses of the Subject Properties than intended by Hall County and would allow for significantly different uses of the properties than currently allowed; moreover, there is nothing to prevent the Subject Properties from being converted to these other uses in the future following its annexation and rezoning.

Finally, the proposed annexation of the Subject Properties would result in the property located at 4675 Hog Mountain Road, Flowery Branch, Georgia 30542, known as Hall County Tax Parcel 15046 000009A, becoming an unincorporated island in violation of Georgia law under O.C.G.A. § 36-36-4(a)(1). See Exhibit F. This problem would be further compounded should the City of Flowery Branch annex and rezone the property located at 4560 Hog Mountain Road, Flowery Branch, Georgia 30542, known as Hall County Tax Parcel 08097 000005, which the County is also objecting to, as Hall County Tax Parcels 08096 000008, 08096 000014, and 08096 000015 would also become an unincorporated island of properties together with 15046 000009A.

For the foregoing reasons, the members of the Board of Commissioners have executed this objection to the annexation petition of Rochester | DCCM, and CD, II Properties, LLC, regarding Hall County Tax Parcels 15046 000008 and 15046 000008B this the 22nd day of May, 2025.

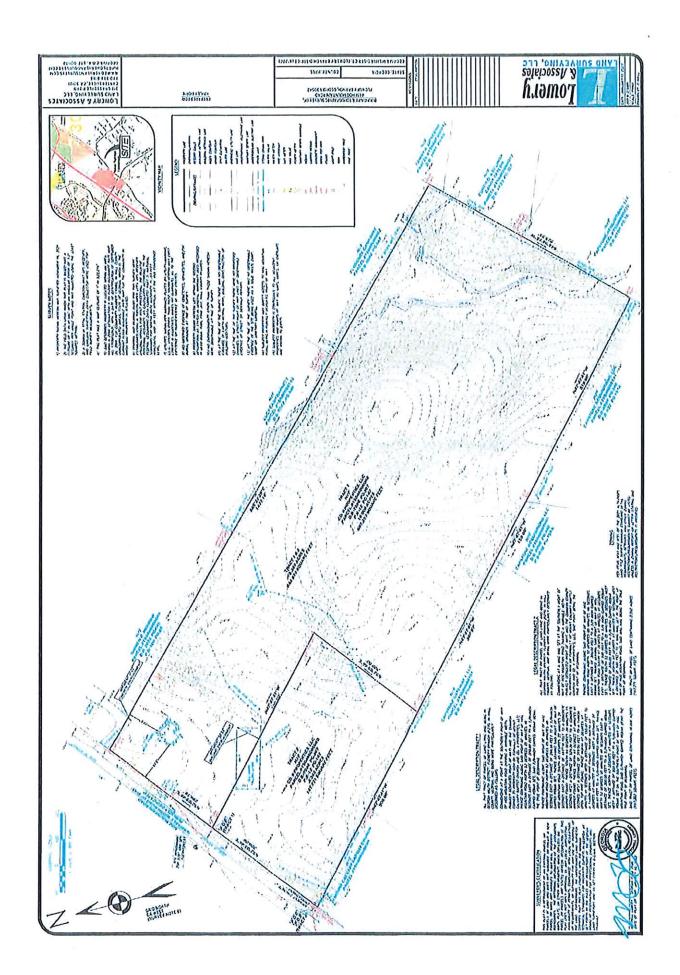

Sec. 7.1. - Purpose and Description.

This zoning district is intended to provide for neighborhoods that are designed according to the principles of "new urbanism" with a grid or modified-grid street network, pedestrian scale and orientation, shallow front yards, relatively narrow local streets planted with shade trees and provided with wide sidewalks, and with automobile garages located to the rear or side of residential lots. TND districts are further distinguished from conventional suburban subdivision developments in their provision of public greens or common areas, when new neighborhoods are created.

Sec. 7.5. - Additional Development Requirements.

- (a) Maximum Block Width and Block Length. When a new subdivision is created within this district, the lots shall be designed in a grid-like pattern of blocks and interconnecting streets, where no new block created shall have a length or width exceeding 800 feet in length without an alley or intervening (mid-block) pedestrian footpaths.
- (b) Front Porches. Any new, detached dwelling shall have a front porch no less than sixteen feet in width as measured along the street frontage and no less than six feet in depth measured from the front property line to the interior of the lot.
- (c) On-site Parking. A two-car garage or carport located in the rear or side yard is required.

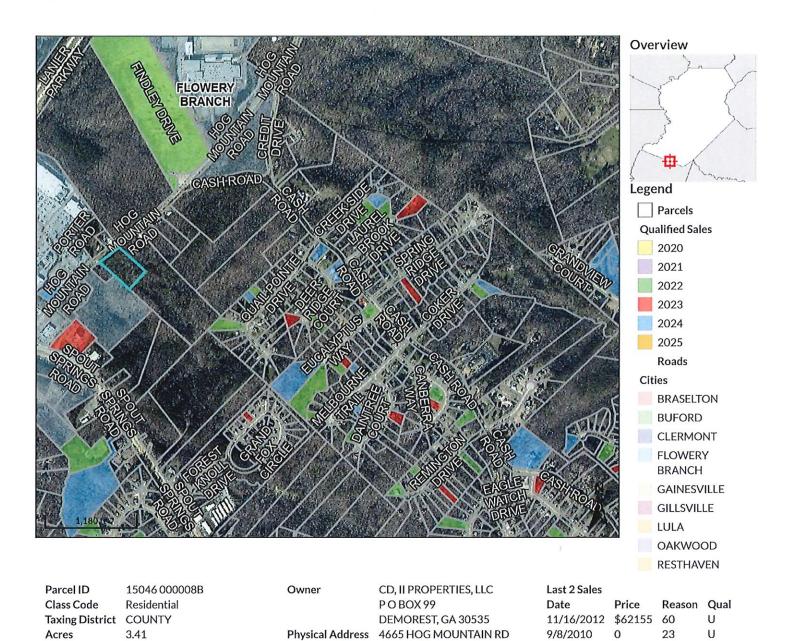

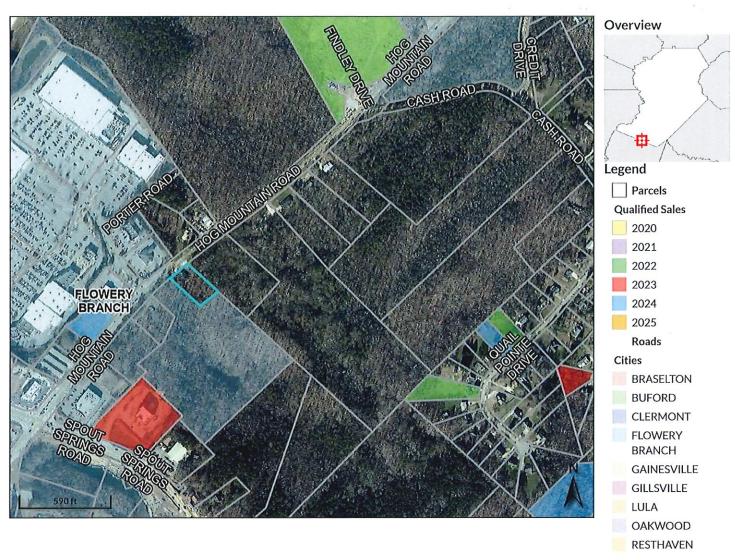
