COUNTY OF HALL

RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING BOTH THE HALL COUNTY SAFE STREETS FOR ALL SAFTEY ACTION PLAN AND A GOAL OF WORKING TOWARDS ZERO TRAFFIC RELATED DEATHS AND SERIOUS INJURIES IN HALL COUNTY, GEORGIA BY 2050

WHEREAS, between 2018 and 2022, 130 people died in traffic related incidents and another 625 people experienced a serious or life-threatening injury due to a traffic collision in Hall County, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, traffic incidents resulting in death or serious injury are not inevitable, but are largely preventable, and Hall County, Georgia acknowledges that the only acceptable goal is the elimination of traffic-related deaths and serious injuries; and

WHEREAS, creating safe, user-friendly streets will encourage active transportation, improve population health, improve air quality, improve access to healthy foods, and improve the overall well-being of the public; and

WHEREAS, adoption of the 2025 Hall County Safety Action Plan (attached hereto as Exhibit A) demonstrates Hall County's commitment to the recommended strategies intended to eliminate traffic-related deaths and serious injuries; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Hall County Safety Action Plan highlights the needs of historically disadvantaged communities and the most vulnerable users of the transportation system.

NOW THEREFORE, the Hall County Board of Commissioners does hereby adopt and approve the following:

- 1. Hall County, Georgia hereby establishes a goal of zero traffic-related deaths and serious injuries by the year 2050; and
- 2. Hall County, Georgia hereby adopts the 2025 Hall County Safety Action Plan; and
- 3. Hall County, Georgia dedicates itself to measuring progress towards this goal and to providing quantitative metrics to be reported with future updates to the Safety Action Plan.
