1. Description of Proposed Use

The applicant respectfully requests rezoning of the subject property to **H-B** (**Highway Business**) to allow for a **small**, **low-volume used auto dealership**.

This business model is **not** a high-traffic dealership but rather a **boutique-style sales operation**, facilitating approximately **20-30 vehicle sales per month**. Given this limited volume, the dealership will have a minimal effect on local traffic patterns and will not contribute to congestion in the area.

- **Type of Business:** Used Auto Dealership (Low-Volume)
- Vehicle repair, minor: Installation of GPS devices and minor reconditioning on inventory vehicles in preparation for sale.
- **Operating Hours:** 9:00 AM 7:00 PM, Monday through Saturday
- Traffic Impact: The business will generate only a small number of customer visits per day, ensuring a low impact on surrounding roadways.

2. Entrance & Traffic Considerations

To further mitigate any traffic concerns and maintain harmony with the surrounding area, and due to the fact that a Cornelia highway entrance is **infeasible**, we need commercial access and the primary entrance to the property be located on **Dana Drive**.

- Given the low sales volume and minimal daily traffic, this entrance would not negatively impact Dana Drive's existing traffic conditions.
- The business does **not** require large transport trucks or high-volume deliveries, further reducing any potential strain on local roads
- This entrance location would also help ensure smooth traffic flow for customers without disrupting neighboring properties.

3. Proposed Development Standards

Number of Lots: 1 lot (after combination)

Lot Size: 1.41 acres
 Setback Requirements:
 Front: 30 feet

Side: 20 feet
Rear: 10 feet

- Use Restrictions: No additional restrictions beyond Hall County's H-B zoning requirements.
- Vehicle parking spaces:

4. Proposed Signage

- A professional business sign will be affixed to the building.
- Size: Approximately 15 feet wide by 10 feet tall.
- **Lighting:** The sign will be **either externally illuminated with a mounted light or internally backlit**, ensuring visibility while minimizing light pollution for nearby properties.

5. Proposed Lighting & Security Measures

We are committed to maintaining a **safe and well-lit environment** while being mindful of neighboring properties. The lighting plan includes:

- Parking lot lights to ensure the safety of customers and employees.
- Building-mounted lighting fixtures to provide additional security and visibility.
- Minimizing Light Pollution: A fence will be installed at the rear of the property to serve as a light shield for any neighboring properties.

By implementing these measures, we aim to create a secure and inviting business space without negatively affecting surrounding residences.

6. Provisions for Water and Wastewater Disposal

- The property will be **connected to public water** to ensure adequate service.
- A new septic system will be installed to meet all Hall County Health Department regulations and standards for wastewater disposal.

7. Plans for Protecting Neighboring Properties (Buffers & Fencing)

Respecting and protecting **neighboring properties** is a **top priority** for this rezoning request. To ensure this, we will implement the following:

- A 15-foot transitional buffer along the rear of the property, which will provide natural separation from adjacent properties.
- A fence enclosing the rear portion of the property to offer both visual and noise screening for our neighbors.
- An additional 15-foot buffer between our lot and the adjacent property owned by LCTL Properties, LLC (Parcel #15021A000036C).

These steps will ensure privacy, reduced noise, and minimal visual impact on nearby residential and business properties.

8. Additional Documentation

A proposed site plan has been submitted alongside this application, detailing:

- The property layout,
- Proposed entrance location,
- Planned buffers and fencing,

• Lighting and signage plans.

Conclusion & Justification for Rezoning Approval

The proposed rezoning will **positively contribute** to the local economy while ensuring minimal disruption to the surrounding community. Key justifications include:

- Low-Traffic Impact: With only 20-30 vehicle sales per month, the dealership will not create congestion or strain existing infrastructure.
- **Respectful to Neighbors:** Proper fencing, buffers, and lighting control measures will **protect neighboring properties** from noise and light pollution.
- **Appropriate Commercial Use:** The **H-B zoning designation** aligns with the gradual commercial growth of this area while maintaining a responsible and well-managed business presence.
- **Reasonable Entrance Location Request:** The entrance on **Dana Drive** is a logical and respectful choice, given the **low volume of traffic** the business will generate.
