Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting a variance to section 3.2 to reduce the front yard setback from 40 feet to 15 feet for a residential addition on a tract measuring approximately 3.36± acres zoned Agricultural Residential 1 (AR-1). The property is currently developed with a single-family residence and an accessory structure.

On September 5, 2025, the applicant was denied a building permit due to the encroachment of the proposed addition into the required front setback (HRADD25-0294).

Per the Statement of Hardship, the location of the existing residence, which was constructed in 1950, encroaches into the required front setback; therefore, the proposed addition will also encroach into the front setback.

One (1) **variance** related to the front yard setback on Davis Bridge Road will be required if the site plan, as presented, is approved.

- Front yard setback requirement on Davis Bridge Road of 40 feet from the property line as found in Table 3.2 for Agricultural Residential 1 (AR-1) zoning district.
 - A front yard setback along Davis Bridge Road of 15 feet from the property line is proposed for a residential addition.

Zoning Analysis

The Commission may grant variances in individual cases of unnecessary hardship upon a finding of the board that:

- There are extraordinary and exceptional conditions pertaining to the lot in question because of
 its size, shape, or topography (the hardship must relate to the physical character of the lot and
 not to a personal or economic hardship); There are no extraordinary or exceptional conditions
 pertaining to the lot in question because of its size, shape, or topography; however, the
 location of the existing single-family residence was established in 1950 prior to the adoption
 of the Hall County Unified Development Code (UDC).
- 2. The application of the requirements of Article 11 to this particular piece of property would create an unusual hardship; No unusual hardship would be created if the requirements of Article 11 are applied to this particular piece of property.
- 3. Such conditions are peculiar to the particular piece of property involved and are not common to other properties in the neighborhood; The topography of the subject parcel is similar to parcels in the surrounding area.
- 4. Such conditions are not the result of any actions of the property owner; No. The location of the existing single-family residence is not a direct action of the property owner; however, the proposed addition is a direct action of the property owner.
- 5. Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of Article 11; provided, however, that no variance may be granted for a use of land or building or structure that is prohibited or for a conditional use which has been denied by the county Planning Commission; Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of Article 11.
