As a patron of Flowery Branch Winery and Vineyard since day one, I am excited for the next chapter of the winery's growth. It is a wonderful, welcoming, family-friendly gathering place and an asset to the community.

The winery brings shoppers (and therefore tax revenue) from out of town. I know several folks who travel from Lawrenceville, McDonough, Fayetteville, and Macon to visit Flowery Branch because of the winery. Rarely will a weekend pass without out-of-state plates seen in the parking lot. Becoming an official venue will only draw more dollars to Flowery Branch and Hall County!

I've seen safety concerns raised by neighbors, but I can say from personal experience that walking the stretch out to GC Crow and then McEver is safest while on Conner Rd. Additionally, having watched and
