WHEREAS, *as other holidays repose upon the past, Arbor Day proposes for the future reminding each of us the magnitude of protecting and maintaining our environment for upcoming generations; and*

WHEREAS, *it is important for government and citizens to celebrate the value of trees, which promote outdoor recreating, and improves human health and well-being; and*

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED *that the Hall County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim Friday, February 20, 2026 to be*

in Hall County, and calls upon our citizens to recognize the importance valuing our trees in order to protect and maintain our environment for future generations.
