A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES
OF HALL COUNTY WITH REGARD TO FORBIDDEN DEPOSITS AT
COUNTY DISPOSAL SITES

WHEREAS, Hall County has adopted a comprehensive Solid Waste Ordinance, which is codified under Title 8, Chapter 8.60 of the Official Code of Hall County (hereinafter the “Solid Waste Ordinance”); and

WHEREAS, Hall County has received input from County staff regarding certain revisions to the Solid Waste Ordinance specifically regarding currently forbidden deposits at County disposal sites; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has considered certain proposed revisions to the Solid Waste Ordinance that would expand the types of material accepted at County disposal sites and deems it to be in the best interest of the citizens of Hall County to adopt such revisions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners does hereby amend the Official Code of Hall County, Georgia as follows:

1.

Title 8, Chapter 8.60.300 of the Official Code of Hall County, Georgia, is hereby amended by deleting Section 8.60.300 (A) (9). Currently Title 8, Chapter 8.60.300 in it’s entirety provides as follows:

8.60.300. - Forbidden deposits and prohibited actions at county disposal sites; deposit or storage of junk.

A. None of the following shall be deposited or dumped at the sanitary landfill or at any county solid waste compactor site:

1. Waste originating outside of Hall County;
2. Liquid waste, except used motor oil for recovery;
3. Regulated quantities of hazardous waste as defined in the rules promulgated by the board of natural resources, chapter 391-3-11;
4. Septic tank pumpings and sewage;
5. Tires;
6. Yard trimmings;
7. Sludges which, upon certified laboratory testing, meet the definition of hazardous waste as defined herein. Industrial and commercial generators wishing to dispose of sludges in Hall County solid waste handling facilities shall first furnish test results, due annually January 1 of each year, certifying that such sludges are deemed non-hazardous;
8. Boats of any size, including kayaks, canoes, flat bottom boats, and motorized boats;
9. Roofing shingles, tiles, and similar roofing materials;
10. Bulk styrofoam, including styrofoam used for floatation;
11. Pressurized tanks of any type, including air tanks, gasoline tanks, and propane tanks; and
12. Mobile homes.

The county's board of commissioners may, at their election, allow non-profit corporations or other charitable entities to deposit some or all of the above-referenced materials in exceptions for special events that serve community or civic purposes.

- B. It shall be unlawful to place, abandon, leave, keep or store junk and salvage material, including non-functioning motor vehicles, appliances, machinery, equipment or parts thereof, out of doors upon any public or private land, except within the confines of a permitted junk or salvage yard or designated public disposal area. All such materials shall be stored in such manner that will preclude the harborage of rodents and insects.

2.

Title 8, Chapter 8.60.300 of the Official Code of Hall County, Georgia, is hereby amended to provide in it's entirety as follows:

8.60.300. - Forbidden deposits and prohibited actions at county disposal sites; deposit or storage of junk.

- A. None of the following shall be deposited or dumped at the sanitary landfill or at any county solid waste compactor site:
1. Waste originating outside of Hall County;

2. Liquid waste, except used motor oil for recovery;
3. Regulated quantities of hazardous waste as defined in the rules promulgated by the board of natural resources, chapter 391-3-11;
4. Septic tank pumpings and sewage;
5. Tires;
6. Yard trimmings;
7. Sludges which, upon certified laboratory testing, meet the definition of hazardous waste as defined herein. Industrial and commercial generators wishing to dispose of sludges in Hall County solid waste handling facilities shall first furnish test results, due annually January 1 of each year, certifying that such sludges are deemed non-hazardous;
8. Boats of any size, including kayaks, canoes, flat bottom boats, and motorized boats;
9. Bulk styrofoam, including styrofoam used for floatation;
10. Pressurized tanks of any type, including air tanks, gasoline tanks, and propane tanks; and
11. Mobile homes.

The county's board of commissioners may, at their election, allow non-profit corporations or other charitable entities to deposit some or all of the above-referenced materials in exceptions for special events that serve community or civic purposes.

- B. It shall be unlawful to place, abandon, leave, keep or store junk and salvage material, including non-functioning motor vehicles, appliances, machinery, equipment or parts thereof, out of doors upon any public or private land, except within the confines of a permitted junk or salvage yard or designated public disposal area. All such materials shall be stored in such manner that will preclude the harborage of rodents and insects.

3.

The remaining provisions of Title 8, Chapter 8.60 of the Hall County Code of Ordinances shall remain as codified, unchanged by these amendments.

Any and all provisions of the Official Code of Hall County which directly conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed.
