Uniform Purchase Supply Annual Contract

Whereas, the County desires to extend the contract period for a one year period through June 30, 2022, in accordance with the terms and conditions of Bid #27-41 / Uniform Purchase Supply Annual Contract, dated July 9, 2020, and

Whereas the Contractor has agreed to this extension and agrees to provide services and/or materials previously supplied in accordance with the original agreement; and

Whereas, with both parties agreeing to the extension as stated and therefore, the above numbered contract is hereby changed as follows:

- 1. By extending the contract coverage for a one year period through June 30, 2022,
- 2. Allow for price adjustments as agreed to and recorded in Attachment A,
- 3. Change orders: any and all change orders requested by the successful bidder on this project must be approved per the County purchasing policies through the contract administrator prior to any work being performed. Any work performed outside the contract agreement for which compensation over and above the contract is requested must have an approved change order. If work is done before approval of a change order, the subsequent change order will be rejected.

With the above change to the original contract set forth herein, the parties hereto agree that all terms and conditions of the original agreement will remain in full force and effect and legally binding on both parties.



Rhodium Surcharge Increasing to 10% Effective July 1st

We regret to inform you that due to the drastic rise in the price of Rhodium our manufacturing costs have increased beyond sustainable limits. In order to maintain our high-quality standards we are forced to increase our current 5% surcharge on our **Rhodium to 10%.** This equates to an extra \$3.00 on a \$30.00 badge. The surcharge will be effective July 1, 2021. The surcharge will not affect contract pricing and is only on our badge product line.

Background Information About Rhodium

Rhodium futures have been trading above \$27,500 an ounce level since April 6th, not far from a record peak of \$29,800 an ounce touched in March on the back of growing demand from the auto industry due to increasingly stringent emissions regulations and as the market heads for the third consecutive year of a supply deficit. Car companies in Europe and China are using more rhodium to meet tougher clean-air legislation while supply from South Africa, the biggest producer, has been disrupted by the coronavirus pandemic and lack of investment in new mines over the past decades.
