- 5. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (44.25.00). Include only the costs of activities specifically emphasizing TIP development and monitoring.
- 6. Other Activities (44.27.00). Include only the costs of those activities whose primary emphasis is unrelated to the specific types of activities described above.

Appendix C: Performance-Based Transit Planning Agreement

Background

In accordance with enacted provisions of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act, and the Fixing America's Transportation System (FAST) Act, the final rule for statewide and metropolitan transportation planning was published on May 27, 2016. A provision of the rule, 23 CFR 450.314 (h), requires that MPO(s), State(s), and the providers of public transportation develop and jointly agree upon specific written provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the selection of performance targets, the reporting of performance targets, and the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO.

To comply with these federal requirements, GDOT has developed a draft Transit Asset Management Agreement available for your use. The Agreement specifies the roles and responsibilities of GDOT and MPOs with regard to transit asset management data, targets, and plans. MPOs may develop alternative written agreements to meet the requirements of 23 CFR 450.314 (h), however, such agreements must be shared with GDOT and jointly agreed upon.

FAQs

"Who should sign the Agreement?"

The Agreement can be signed by an MPO and transit provider staff members. Per GDOT's consultation with FTA, it is *not* required that an MPO board vote to approve the Agreement.

"What if we need to update or amend an agreement?"

Agreement updates will be made on an as-needed basis rather than according to a set cycle. For example, modifications to individual agreements may be required due to changes in MPO boundaries, transit providers, or similar circumstances.

"My MPO is already developing a different agreement, does this mean we have to use the Agreement provided instead?"

No. An MPO may develop and use an alternative agreement so long as it meets all federal requirements. GDOT developed the included Agreement for MPOs that have not developed their own. If your MPO wishes to use an alternative agreement, that alternative should be shared with GDOT staff to ensure it complies with all requirements of 23 CFR 450.314 (h).

On May 27, 2016, the final rule for statewide and metropolitan transportation planning was published, based on 2012's Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act and 2015's Fixing America's Transportation System (FAST) Act. As part of this final rule, 23 CFR 450.314 (h) requires the metropolitan planning organizations (MPO), State(s), and the providers of public transportation (referred to here as "providers") to jointly agree upon and develop specific written provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the selection of performance targets, the reporting of performance targets, and the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO.

The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT), the MPO, and provider(s) hereby agree to share transit asset management data, targets, and plans as follows:

- Providers will share their Transit Asset Management (TAM) Plan, and TAM targets with the MPO and GDOT and report to the National Transit Database.
- Providers will coordinate with the MPO and GDOT during the development of their TAM
 Plan and targets.
- The MPO will set TAM targets for their planning area in coordination with providers in their planning area and share those targets with providers and GDOT.
- GDOT sponsors a Group TAM Plan for participating Tier 2 transit providers, collects inventory information from these providers, sets targets in coordination with the providers, and shares the TAM Plan with providers and MPOs statewide.
- MPOs will reflect TAM targets in their short range and long-range planning documents and share with GDOT and providers in their planning area.
- GDOT will provide a Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Performance Report, reflecting TAM targets set by the GDOT Group Plan, and will share this report with MPOs and transit providers statewide.
