- WHEREAS, Martin (Marty) Grady Nix began his public service career with Hall County on July 3, 1984; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Nix has served the citizens of Hall County in many capacities; Detention
 Officer I, Deputy Sheriff, Sheriff Sergeant Investigations, Lieutenant of CID
 (Criminal Investigations Division), Victim Witness Assistant, Deputy Warden,
 Director of Central Communications, and Assistant County Administrator; and
- WHEREAS, during his employment with Hall County, Mr. Nix served dutifully as a jailer; was a lead investigator on countless high profile cases, bringing justice to victims of some of the most heinous crimes; helped put countless criminals behind bars through his work with the Courts System; spearheaded the move of the 911 center and the construction of Hall County's Emergency Services Complex; implemented, among numerous other initiatives, Emergency Medical Dispatch at Hall County 911, saving countless lives as a result; as Central Communications (911) Director, he implemented the 800 MHz radio system, allowing for better communication between public safety officials; helped stabilize and restore Healan's-Head's Mill; was instrumental in moving County offices to the Hall County Government Center; and was a significant force in numerous construction projects Countywide, including North Hall Park, Cherokee Bluffs Park, Fire Station 16, Fire Station 1, Murrayville Park and the Highlands to Islands Trail, just to name a few; and
- WHEREAS, County Administrator Jock Connell stated that Mr. Nix has spent his entire career serving the citizens of Hall County. What is truly unique about Marty's service is not the length of his tenure, but the way he serves. He is in the trenches alongside those who work for him, he knows how to get to know those he works with and works for on a personal, friendly level, and he does it all without any expectation of recognition or reward; and
- WHEREAS, the Hall County Board of Commissioners deeply appreciates the services rendered to the citizens of Hall County by Mr. Nix; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hall County Board of Commissioners does hereby pay tribute to Martin (Marty) Grady Nix and recognizes him for his many accomplishments, contributions, and 38 years of dedicated service to the Hall County Sheriff's Office and the citizens of Hall County and extends to him their most sincere wishes for continued success in his future endeavors.

WHEREAS, GAINESVILLE AND HALL COUNTY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (the "Issuer") has considered the request of LANIER CHRISTIAN ACADEMY, INC., a Georgia non-profit corporation (the "Corporation"), for the Issuer's assistance in refinancing and financing the planning, design, acquisition, construction, equipping and installation of a new academic campus, including real property, infrastructure, and academic facilities containing classrooms, a media center, a music room, a practice gym, and a cafeteria, which campus shall be located at 4937 Chestnut Mountain and 4883 Winder Highway, Flowery Branch, Hall County, Georgia, 30542 (the "Project"), to be used by Lanier Christian Academy, Inc. - B. WARRANTY. Vendor warrants that all Equipment, Products, and Services furnished are free from liens and encumbrances, and are free from defects in design, materials, and workmanship. In addition, Vendor warrants the Equipment, Products, and Services are suitable for and will perform in accordance with the ordinary use for which they are intended. Vendor's dealers and distributors must agree to assist the Participating Entity in reaching a resolution in any dispute over warranty terms with the manufacturer. Any manufacturer's warranty that is effective past the expiration of the Vendor's warranty will be passed on to the Participating Entity.
- C. DEALERS, DISTRIBUTORS, AND/OR RESELLERS. Upon Contract execution, Vendor will make available to Sourcewell a means to validate or authenticate Vendor's authorized dealers, distributors, and/or resellers relative to the Equipment, Products, and Services related to this Contract. This list may be updated from time-to-time and is incorporated into this Contract by reference. It is the Vendor's responsibility to ensure Sourcewell receives the most current version of this list.

3. PRICING

All Equipment, Products, or Services under this Contract will be priced as stated in Vendor's Proposal.

When providing pricing quotes to Participating Entities, all pricing quoted must reflect a Participating Entity's total cost of acquisition. This means that the quoted cost is for delivered Equipment, Products, and Services that are operational for their intended purpose, and includes all costs to the Participating Entity's requested delivery location.

Regardless of the payment method chosen by the Participating Entity, the total cost associated with any purchase option of the Equipment, Products, or Services must always be disclosed in the pricing quote to the applicable Participating Entity at the time of purchase.

A. SHIPPING AND SHIPPING COSTS. All delivered Equipment and Products must be properly packaged. Damaged Equipment and Products may be rejected. If the damage is not readily apparent at the time of delivery, Vendor must permit the Equipment and Products to be returned within a reasonable time at no cost to Sourcewell or its Participating Entities. Participating Entities reserve the right to inspect the Equipment and Products at a reasonable

time after delivery where circumstances or conditions prevent effective inspection of the Equipment and Products at the time of delivery.

Vendor must arrange for and pay for the return shipment on Equipment and Products that arrive in a defective or inoperable condition.

Sourcewell may declare the Vendor in breach of this Contract if the Vendor intentionally delivers substandard or inferior Equipment or Products. In the event of the delivery of nonconforming Equipment and Products, the Participating Entity will notify the Vendor as soon as possible and the Vendor will replace nonconforming Equipment and Products with conforming Equipment and Products that are acceptable to the Participating Entity.

- B. SALES TAX. Each Participating Entity is responsible for supplying the Vendor with valid taxexemption certification(s). When ordering, a Participating Entity must indicate if it is a taxexempt entity.
- C. HOT LIST PRICING. At any time during this Contract, Vendor may offer a specific selection of Equipment, Products, or Services at discounts greater than those listed in the Contract. When Vendor determines it will offer Hot List Pricing, it must be submitted electronically to Sourcewell in a line-item format. Equipment, Products, or Services may be added or removed from the Hot List at any time through a Sourcewell Price and Product Change Form as defined in Article 4 below.

Hot List program and pricing may also be used to discount and liquidate close-out and discontinued Equipment and Products as long as those close-out and discontinued items are clearly identified as such. Current ordering process and administrative fees apply. Hot List Pricing must be published and made available to all Participating Entities.

4. PRODUCT AND PRICING CHANGE REQUESTS

Vendor may request Equipment, Product, or Service changes, additions, or deletions at any time. All requests must be made in writing by submitting a signed Sourcewell Price and Product Change Request Form to the assigned Sourcewell Contract Administrator. This form is available from the assigned Sourcewell Contract Administrator. At a minimum, the request must:

- Identify the applicable Sourcewell contract number;
- Clearly specify the requested change;
- Provide sufficient detail to justify the requested change;
- Individually list all Equipment, Products, or Services affected by the requested change, along with the requested change (e.g., addition, deletion, price change); and
- Include a complete restatement of pricing documentation in Microsoft Excel with the effective date of the modified pricing, or product addition or deletion. The new pricing

restatement must include all Equipment, Products, and Services offered, even for those items where pricing remains unchanged.

A fully executed Sourcewell Price and Product Request Form will become an amendment to this Contract and be incorporated by reference.

5. PARTICIPATION, CONTRACT ACCESS, AND PARTICIPATING ENTITY REQUIREMENTS

A. PARTICIPATION. Sourcewell's cooperative contracts are available and open to public and nonprofit entities across the United States and Canada; such as federal, state/province, municipal, K-12 and higher education, tribal government, and other public entities.

The benefits of this Contract should be available to all Participating Entities that can legally access the Equipment, Products, or Services under this Contract. A Participating Entity's authority to access this Contract is determined through its cooperative purchasing, interlocal, or joint powers laws. Any entity accessing benefits of this Contract will be considered a Service Member of Sourcewell during such time of access. Vendor understands that a Participating Entity's use of this Contract is at the Participating Entity's sole convenience and Participating Entities reserve the right to obtain like Equipment, Products, or Services from any other source.

Vendor is responsible for familiarizing its sales and service forces with Sourcewell contract use eligibility requirements and documentation and will encourage potential participating entities to join Sourcewell. Sourcewell reserves the right to add and remove Participating Entities to its roster during the term of this Contract.

B. PUBLIC FACILITIES. Vendor's employees may be required to perform work at government-owned facilities, including schools. Vendor's employees and agents must conduct themselves in a professional manner while on the premises, and in accordance with Participating Entity policies and procedures, and all applicable laws.

6. PARTICIPATING ENTITY USE AND PURCHASING

A. ORDERS AND PAYMENT. To access the contracted Equipment, Products, or Services under this Contract, a Participating Entity must clearly indicate to Vendor that it intends to access this Contract; however, order flow and procedure will be developed jointly between Sourcewell and Vendor. Typically, a Participating Entity will issue an order directly to Vendor. If a Participating Entity issues a purchase order, it may use its own forms, but the purchase order should clearly note the applicable Sourcewell contract number. All Participating Entity orders under this Contract must be issued prior to expiration of this Contract; however, Vendor performance, Participating Entity payment, and any applicable warranty periods or other Vendor or Participating Entity obligations may extend beyond the term of this Contract.

Vendor's acceptable forms of payment are included in Attachment A. Participating Entities will be solely responsible for payment and Sourcewell will have no liability for any unpaid invoice of any Participating Entity.

- B. ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS/PARTICIPATING ADDENDUM. Additional terms and conditions to a purchase order, or other required transaction documentation, may be negotiated between a Participating Entity and Vendor, such as job or industry-specific requirements, legal requirements (e.g., affirmative action or immigration status requirements), or specific local policy requirements. Some Participating Entitles may require the use of a Participating Addendum; the terms of which will be worked out directly between the Participating Entity and the Vendor. Any negotiated additional terms and conditions must never be less favorable to the Participating Entity than what is contained in this Contract.
- C. SPECIALIZED SERVICE REQUIREMENTS. In the event that the Participating Entity requires service or specialized performance requirements (such as e-commerce specifications, specialized delivery requirements, or other specifications and requirements) not addressed in this Contract, the Participating Entity and the Vendor may enter into a separate, standalone agreement, apart from this Contract. Sourcewell, including its agents and employees, will not be made a party to a claim for breach of such agreement.
- D. TERMINATION OF ORDERS. Participating Entities may terminate an order, in whole or in part, immediately upon notice to Vendor in the event of any of the following events:
 - 1. The Participating Entity fails to receive funding or appropriation from its governing body at levels sufficient to pay for the goods to be purchased;
 - 2. Federal, state, or provincial laws or regulations prohibit the purchase or change the Participating Entity's requirements; or
 - 3. Vendor commits any material breach of this Contract or the additional terms agreed to between the Vendor and a Participating Entity.
- E. GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE. The governing law and venue for any action related to a Participating Entity's order will be determined by the Participating Entity making the purchase.

7. CUSTOMER SERVICE

A. PRIMARY ACCOUNT REPRESENTATIVE. Vendor will assign an Account Representative to Sourcewell for this Contract and must provide prompt notice to Sourcewell if that person is changed. The Account Representative will be responsible for:

- Maintenance and management of this Contract;
- Timely response to all Sourcewell and Participating Entity inquiries; and
- Business reviews to Sourcewell and Participating Entities, if applicable.

B. BUSINESS REVIEWS. Vendor must perform a minimum of one business review with Sourcewell per contract year. The business review will cover sales to Participating Entities, pricing and contract terms, administrative fees, supply issues, customer issues, and any other necessary information.

8. REPORT ON CONTRACT SALES ACTIVITY AND ADMINISTRATIVE FEE PAYMENT

A. CONTRACT SALES ACTIVITY REPORT. Each calendar quarter, Vendor must provide a contract sales activity report (Report) to the Sourcewell Contract Administrator assigned to this Contract. A Report must be provided regardless of the number or amount of sales during that quarter (i.e., if there are no sales, Vendor must submit a report indicating no sales were made).

The Report must contain the following fields:

- Customer Name (e.g., City of Staples Highway Department);
- Customer Physical Street Address;
- Customer City;
- Customer State/Province;
- Customer Zip Code;
- Customer Contact Name;
- Customer Contact Email Address;
- Customer Contact Telephone Number;
- Sourcewell Assigned Entity/Participating Entity Number;
- Item Purchased Description;
- Item Purchased Price;
- Sourcewell Administrative Fee Applied; and
- Date Purchase was invoiced/sale was recognized as revenue by Vendor.

B. ADMINISTRATIVE FEE. In consideration for the support and services provided by Sourcewell, the Vendor will pay an administrative fee to Sourcewell on all Equipment, Products, and Services provided to Participating Entities. The Administrative Fee must be included in, and not added to, the pricing. Vendor may not charge Participating Entities more than the contracted price to offset the Administrative Fee.

The Vendor will submit payment to Sourcewell for the percentage of administrative fee stated in the Proposal multiplied by the total sales of all Equipment, Products, and Services purchased by Participating Entities under this Contract during each calendar quarter. Payments should note the Vendor's name and Sourcewell-assigned contract number in the memo; and must be mailed to the address above "Attn: Accounts Receivable" or remitted electronically to Sourcewell's banking institution per Sourcewell's Finance department instructions. Payments must be received no later than 45 calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter.

Vendor agrees to cooperate with Sourcewell in auditing transactions under this Contract to ensure that the administrative fee is paid on all items purchased under this Contract.

In the event the Vendor is delinquent in any undisputed administrative fees, Sourcewell reserves the right to cancel this Contract and reject any proposal submitted by the Vendor in any subsequent solicitation. In the event this Contract is cancelled by either party prior to the Contract's expiration date, the administrative fee payment will be due no more than 30 days from the cancellation date.

9. AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE

Sourcewell's Authorized Representative is its Chief Procurement Officer.

Vendor's Authorized Representative is the person named in the Vendor's Proposal. If Vendor's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this Contract, Vendor must promptly notify Sourcewell in writing.

10. AUDIT, ASSIGNMENT, AMENDMENTS, WAIVER, AND CONTRACT COMPLETE

- A. AUDIT. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 16C.05, subdivision 5, the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by Sourcewell or the Minnesota State Auditor for a minimum of six years from the end of this Contract. This clause extends to Participating Entities as it relates to business conducted by that Participating Entity under this Contract.
- B. ASSIGNMENT. Neither the Vendor nor Sourcewell may assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Contract without the prior consent of the parties and a fully executed assignment agreement. Such consent will not be unreasonably withheld.
- C. AMENDMENTS. Any amendment to this Contract must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been fully executed by the parties.
- D. WAIVER. If either party fails to enforce any provision of this Contract, that failure does not waive the provision or the right to enforce it.
- E. CONTRACT COMPLETE. This Contract contains all negotiations and agreements between Sourcewell and Vendor. No other understanding regarding this Contract, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party. For any conflict between the attached Proposal and the terms set out in Articles 1-22, the terms of Articles 1-22 will govern.
- F. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. The relationship of the parties is one of independent contractors, each free to exercise judgment and discretion with regard to the conduct of their

respective businesses. This Contract does not create a partnership, joint venture, or any other relationship such as master-servant, or principal-agent.

11. LIABILITY

Vendor must indemnify, save, and hold Sourcewell and its Participating Entities, including their agents and employees, harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorneys' fees, arising out of the performance of this Contract by the Vendor or its agents or employees; this indemnification includes injury or death to person(s) or property alleged to have been caused by some defect in the Equipment, Products, or Services under this Contract to the extent the Equipment, Product, or Service has been used according to its specifications.

12. GOVERNMENT DATA PRACTICES

Vendor and Sourcewell must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided by or provided to Sourcewell under this Contract and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Vendor under this Contract.

If the Vendor receives a request to release the data referred to in this article, the Vendor must immediately notify Sourcewell and Sourcewell will assist with how the Vendor should respond to the request.

13. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, PUBLICITY, MARKETING, AND ENDORSEMENT

A. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

- 1. *Grant of License*. During the term of this Contract:
 - a. Sourcewell grants to Vendor a royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive right and license to use the Trademark(s) provided to Vendor by Sourcewell in advertising and promotional materials for the purpose of marketing Sourcewell's relationship with Vendor.
 - b. Vendor grants to Sourcewell a royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive right and license to use Vendor's Trademarks in advertising and promotional materials for the purpose of marketing Vendor's relationship with Sourcewell.
- 2. Limited Right of Sublicense. The right and license granted herein includes a limited right of each party to grant sublicenses to its and their respective distributors, marketing representatives, and agents (collectively "Permitted Sublicensees") in advertising and promotional materials for the purpose of marketing the Parties' relationship to Participating Entities. Any sublicense granted will be subject to the terms and conditions of this Article. Each party will be responsible for any breach of this Article by any of their respective sublicensees.
- 3. Use; Quality Control.

- a. Sourcewell must not alter Vendor's Trademarks from the form provided by Vendor and must comply with Vendor's removal requests as to specific uses of its trademarks or logos.
- b. Vendor must not alter Sourcewell's Trademarks from the form provided by Sourcewell and must comply with Sourcewell's removal requests as to specific uses of its trademarks or logos.
- c. Each party agrees to use, and to cause its Permitted Sublicensees to use, the other party's Trademarks only in good faith and in a dignified manner consistent with such party's use of the Trademarks. Upon written notice to the breaching party, the breaching party has 30 days of the date of the written notice to cure the breach or the license will be terminated.
- 4. As applicable, Vendor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Sourcewell and its Participating Entities against any and all suits, claims, judgments, and costs instituted or recovered against Sourcewell or Participating Entities by any person on account of the use of any Equipment or Products by Sourcewell or its Participating Entities supplied by Vendor in violation of applicable patent or copyright laws.
- 5. Termination. Upon the termination of this Contract for any reason, each party, including Permitted Sublicensees, will have 30 days to remove all Trademarks from signage, websites, and the like bearing the other party's name or logo (excepting Sourcewell's pre-printed catalog of vendors which may be used until the next printing). Vendor must return all marketing and promotional materials, including signage, provided by Sourcewell, or dispose of it according to Sourcewell's written directions.
- B. PUBLICITY. Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this Contract must not be released without prior written approval from the Authorized Representatives. Publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Vendor individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors, with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this Contract.
- C. MARKETING. Any direct advertising, marketing, or offers with Participating Entities must be approved by Sourcewell. Materials should be sent to the Sourcewell Contract Administrator assigned to this Contract.
- D. ENDORSEMENT. The Vendor must not claim that Sourcewell endorses its Equipment, Products, or Services.

14. GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION, AND VENUE

Minnesota law governs this Contract. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this Contract, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state court in Todd County or federal court in Fergus Falls, Minnesota.

15. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party to this Contract will be held responsible for delay or default caused by acts of God or other conditions that are beyond that party's reasonable control (including either pandemic or epidemic). A party defaulting under this provision must provide the other party prompt written notice of the default.

16. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Contract is found to be illegal, unenforceable, or void then both Sourcewell and Vendor will be relieved of all obligations arising under such provisions. If the remainder of this Contract is capable of performance, it will not be affected by such declaration or finding and must be fully performed.

17. PERFORMANCE, DEFAULT, AND REMEDIES

- A. PERFORMANCE. During the term of this Contract, the parties will monitor performance and address unresolved contract issues as follows:
 - 1. *Notification.* The parties must promptly notify each other of any known dispute and work in good faith to resolve such dispute within a reasonable period of time. If necessary, Sourcewell and the Vendor will jointly develop a short briefing document that describes the issue(s), relevant impact, and positions of both parties.
 - 2. Escalation. If parties are unable to resolve the issue in a timely manner, as specified above, either Sourcewell or Vendor may escalate the resolution of the issue to a higher level of management. The Vendor will have 30 calendar days to cure an outstanding issue.
 - 3. Performance while Dispute is Pending. Notwithstanding the existence of a dispute, the Vendor must continue without delay to carry out all of its responsibilities under the Contract that are not affected by the dispute. If the Vendor fails to continue without delay to perform its responsibilities under the Contract, in the accomplishment of all undisputed work, any additional costs incurred by Sourcewell and/or its Participating Entities as a result of such failure to proceed will be borne by the Vendor.
- B. DEFAULT AND REMEDIES. Either of the following constitutes cause to declare this Contract, or any Participating Entity order under this Contract, in default:
 - 1. Nonperformance of contractual requirements, or
 - 2. A material breach of any term or condition of this Contract.

Written notice of default and a reasonable opportunity to cure must be issued by the party claiming default. Time allowed for cure will not diminish or eliminate any liability for liquidated or other damages. If the default remains after the opportunity for cure, the non-defaulting party may:

- Exercise any remedy provided by law or equity, or
- Terminate the Contract or any portion thereof, including any orders issued against the Contract.

18. INSURANCE

A. REQUIREMENTS. At its own expense, Vendor must maintain insurance policy(ies) in effect at all times during the performance of this Contract with insurance company(ies) licensed or authorized to do business in the State of Minnesota having an "AM BEST" rating of A- or better, with coverage and limits of insurance not less than the following:

1. Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability.

Workers' Compensation: As required by any applicable law or regulation.

Employer's Liability Insurance: must be provided in amounts not less than listed below:

Minimum limits:

\$500,000 each accident for bodily injury by accident

\$500,000 policy limit for bodily injury by disease

\$500,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease

2. Commercial General Liability Insurance. Vendor will maintain insurance covering its operations, with coverage on an occurrence basis, and must be subject to terms no less broad than the Insurance Services Office ("ISO") Commercial General Liability Form CG0001 (2001 or newer edition), or equivalent. At a minimum, coverage must include liability arising from premises, operations, bodily injury and property damage, independent contractors, products-completed operations including construction defect, contractual liability, blanket contractual liability, and personal injury and advertising injury. All required limits, terms and conditions of coverage must be maintained during the term of this Contract.

Minimum Limits:

\$1,000,000 each occurrence Bodily Injury and Property Damage

\$1,000,000 Personal and Advertising Injury

\$2,000,000 aggregate for Products-Completed operations

\$2,000,000 general aggregate

3. Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance. During the term of this Contract, Vendor will maintain insurance covering all owned, hired, and non-owned automobiles in limits of liability not less than indicated below. The coverage must be subject to terms no less broad than ISO Business Auto Coverage Form CA 0001 (2010 edition or newer), or equivalent.

Minimum Limits:

\$1,000,000 each accident, combined single limit

4. *Umbrella Insurance*. During the term of this Contract, Vendor will maintain umbrella coverage over Workers' Compensation, Commercial General Liability, and Commercial Automobile.

Minimum Limits: \$2,000,000

5. Network Security and Privacy Liability Insurance. During the term of this Contract, Vendor will maintain coverage for network security and privacy liability. The coverage may be endorsed on another form of liability coverage or written on a standalone policy. The insurance must cover claims which may arise from failure of Vendor's security resulting in, but not limited to, computer attacks, unauthorized access, disclosure of not public data – including but not limited to, confidential or private information, transmission of a computer virus, or denial of service.

Minimum limits:

\$2,000,000 per occurrence

\$2,000,000 annual aggregate

Failure of Vendor to maintain the required insurance will constitute a material breach entitling Sourcewell to immediately terminate this Contract for default.

B. CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE. Prior to commencing under this Contract, Vendor must furnish to Sourcewell a certificate of insurance, as evidence of the insurance required under this Contract. Prior to expiration of the policy(ies), renewal certificates must be mailed to Sourcewell, 202 12th Street Northeast, P.O. Box 219, Staples, MN 56479 or sent to the Sourcewell Contract Administrator assigned to this Contract. The certificates must be signed by a person authorized by the insurer(s) to bind coverage on their behalf.

Failure to request certificates of insurance by Sourcewell, or failure of Vendor to provide certificates of insurance, in no way limits or relieves Vendor of its duties and responsibilities in this Contract.

- C. ADDITIONAL INSURED ENDORSEMENT AND PRIMARY AND NON-CONTRIBUTORY INSURANCE CLAUSE. Vendor agrees to list Sourcewell and its Participating Entities, including their officers, agents, and employees, as an additional insured under the Vendor's commercial general liability insurance policy with respect to liability arising out of activities, "operations," or "work" performed by or on behalf of Vendor, and products and completed operations of Vendor. The policy provision(s) or endorsement(s) must further provide that coverage is primary and not excess over or contributory with any other valid, applicable, and collectible insurance or self-insurance in force for the additional insureds.
- D. WAIVER OF SUBROGATION. Vendor waives and must require (by endorsement or otherwise) all its insurers to waive subrogation rights against Sourcewell and other additional insureds for losses paid under the insurance policies required by this Contract or other

insurance applicable to the Vendor or its subcontractors. The waiver must apply to all deductibles and/or self-insured retentions applicable to the required or any other insurance maintained by the Vendor or its subcontractors. Where permitted by law, Vendor must require similar written express waivers of subrogation and insurance clauses from each of its subcontractors.

E. UMBRELLA/EXCESS LIABILITY/SELF-INSURED RETENTION. The limits required by this Contract can be met by either providing a primary policy or in combination with umbrella/excess liability policy(ies), or self-insured retention.

19. COMPLIANCE

- A. LAWS AND REGULATIONS. All Equipment, Products, or Services provided under this Contract must comply fully with applicable federal laws and regulations, and with the laws in the states and provinces in which the Equipment, Products, or Services are sold.
- B. LICENSES. Vendor must maintain a valid and current status on all required federal, state/provincial, and local licenses, bonds, and permits required for the operation of the business that the Vendor conducts with Sourcewell and Participating Entities.

20. BANKRUPTCY, DEBARMENT, OR SUSPENSION CERTIFICATION

Vendor certifies and warrants that it is not in bankruptcy or that it has previously disclosed in writing certain information to Sourcewell related to bankruptcy actions. If at any time during this Contract Vendor declares bankruptcy, Vendor must immediately notify Sourcewell in writing.

Vendor certifies and warrants that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from programs operated by the State of Minnesota; the United States federal government or the Canadian government, as applicable; or any Participating Entity. Vendor certifies and warrants that neither it nor its principals have been convicted of a criminal offense related to the subject matter of this Contract. Vendor further warrants that it will provide immediate written notice to Sourcewell if this certification changes at any time.

21. PROVISIONS FOR NON-UNITED STATES FEDERAL ENTITY PROCUREMENTS UNDER UNITED STATES FEDERAL AWARDS OR OTHER AWARDS

Participating Entities that use United States federal grant or FEMA funds to purchase goods or services from this Contract may be subject to additional requirements including the procurement standards of the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, 2 C.F.R. § 200. The Contractor hereby agrees that Proprietary Information shall include, but is not limited to, Gordian's IQCC Applications and support documentation, Construction Task Catalog, training materials, marketing materials and any other proprietary materials provided to Contractor by Gordian. In the event this Contract expires or terminates as provided herein, or the Gordian's contract with Sourcewell expires or terminates, this IQCC System License shall terminate and the Contractor shall return all Proprietary Information in its possession to Gordian.
- B. Contractor acknowledges that Gordian shall retain exclusive ownership of all proprietary rights to the Proprietary Information, including all U.S. and international intellectual property and other rights such as patents, trademarks, copyrights and trade secrets. Contractor shall have no right or interest in any portion of the Proprietary Information except the right to use the Proprietary Information for the Limited Purpose set forth herein. Except in furtherance of the Limited Purpose, Contractor shall not distribute, disclose, copy, reproduce, display, publish, transmit, assign, sublicense, transfer, provide access to, use or sell, directly or indirectly (including in electronic form), any portion of the Proprietary Information.
- C. 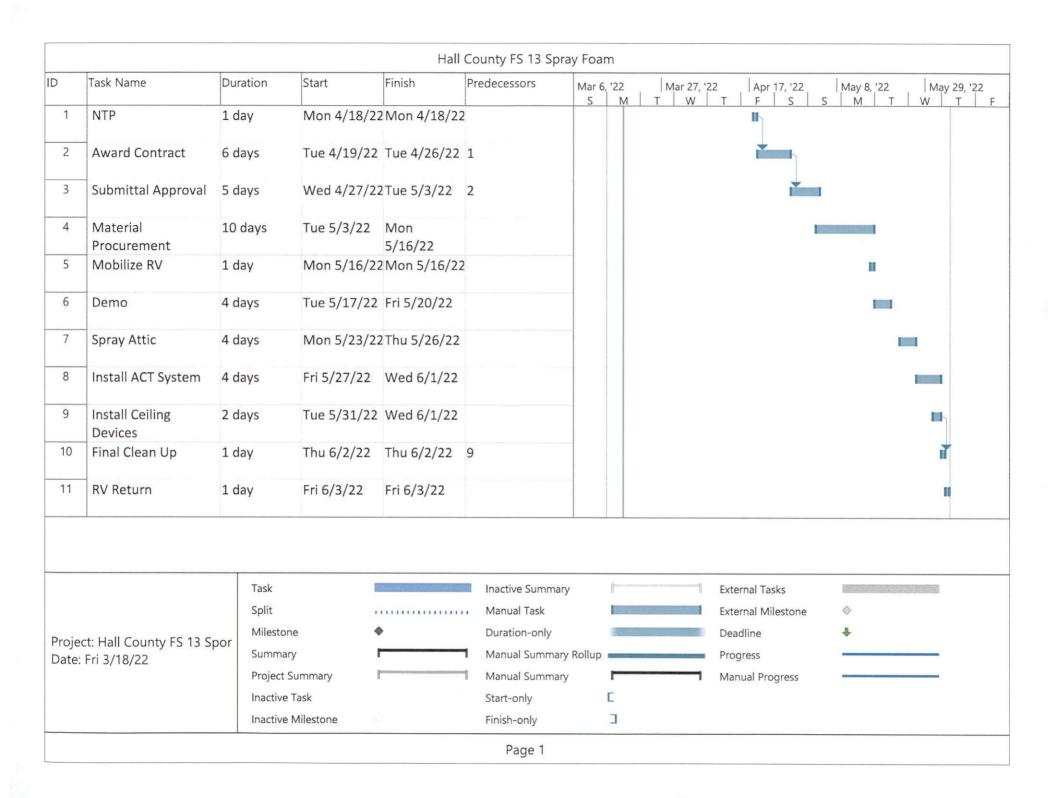

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE THE CONVEYANCE OF CERTAIN PERMANENT SEWER EASEMENTS TO THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, GEORGIA; AND FOR SUCH OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, said Sardis Road Connector Project (the "Project") is located in Land Districts 9 and 10 and G.M.D. 570 of Hall County, Georgia, and consists of the widening, realignment, and reconstruction of existing roadways and the construction of new roadways to provide a connector roadway between Georgia State Route 53 to the South and Georgia State Route 60 to the North; and

WHEREAS, the Project will begin at the Sardis Road and Chestatee Road intersection and will extend northward approximately 3.55 miles to Georgia State Route 60 ending near the intersection of State Route 60 and Mount Vernon Road; and

WHEREAS, the proposed roadway will consist of a four-lane curb and gutter divided roadway, having 2 lanes in each direction that will be separated by a 20-foot wide, 6 inch high curb and gutter median and sidewalks will be provided on both sides of the road having a design speed limit of 45 mph; and

WHEREAS, the Project will widen Sardis Road from 2 lanes to 4 lanes, necessitating that utility lines be relocated so that such utility lines will not be located under the roadway once the Project is complete; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the Project; Hall County acquired in fee simple the property known as Tax parcel #10105 002007, which property is located at 3678 Garden Boulevard Gainesville, Georgia 30506 ("Parcel 132"), and the property known as Tax parcel #10105 002010, which property is located at 3666 Garden Boulevard Gainesville, Georgia 30506 ("Parcel 135"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville, Georgia (the "City") operates and maintains sewer lines that will be impacted by the Project and must be relocated; and

WHEREAS, the City has prepared a plan to relocate certain utilities, including but not limited to sewer lines, in response to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City has requested that Hall County convey to the City permanent utility easements over, under, and through portions of Parcel 132 and Parcel 135; and

WHEREAS, the Board now desires to authorize the conveyance of the requested easements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Hall County (the "Board"), in regular session, as the managing and controlling body of the County, and it is hereby resolved by authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. The conveyance of a permanent sanitary sewer easement over, under, and through Parcel 132 is hereby authorized and approved. The Chairman and Clerk of the Board are hereby authorized to execute and deliver said permanent sanitary sewer easement, the form of which is attached as **Appendix A** hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The conveyance of a permanent sanitary sewer easement over, under, and through Parcel 135 is hereby authorized and approved. The Chairman and Clerk of the Board are hereby authorized to execute and deliver said permanent sanitary sewer easement, the form of which is attached as **Appendix B** hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

This Resolution is adopted in regular session of the Board, this 28th day of July, 2022, to become effective immediately upon its execution, the public health, safety, and general welfare demanding it.

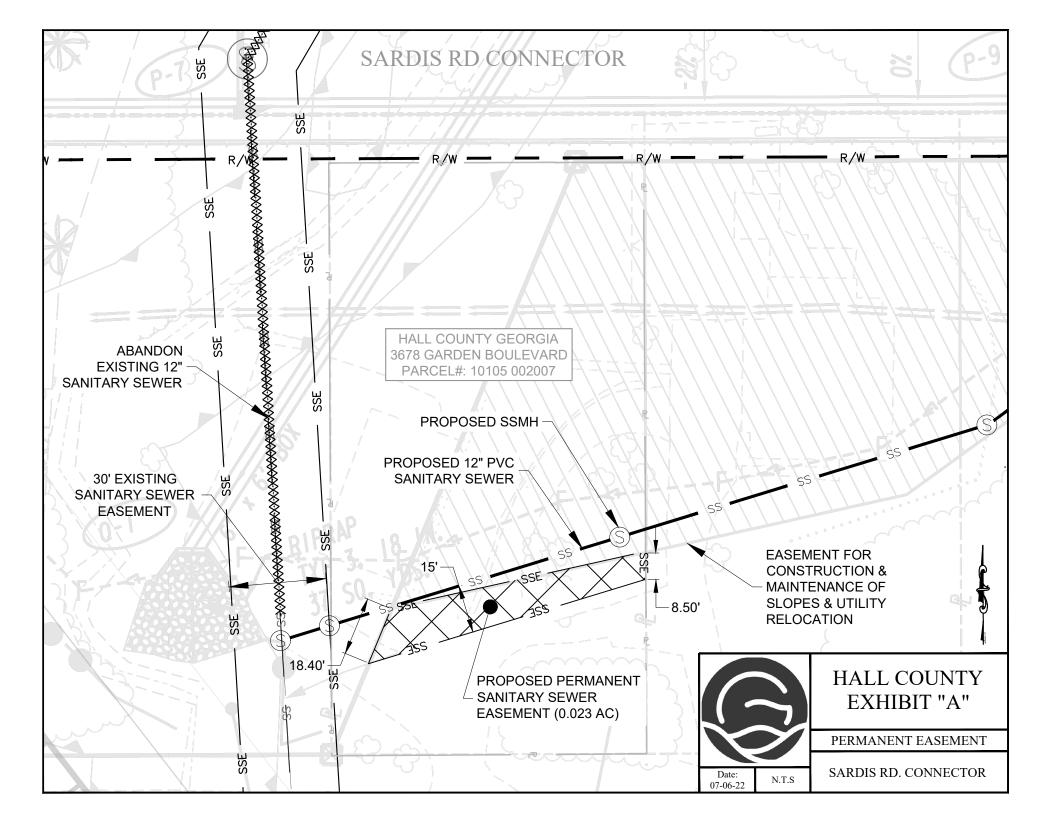

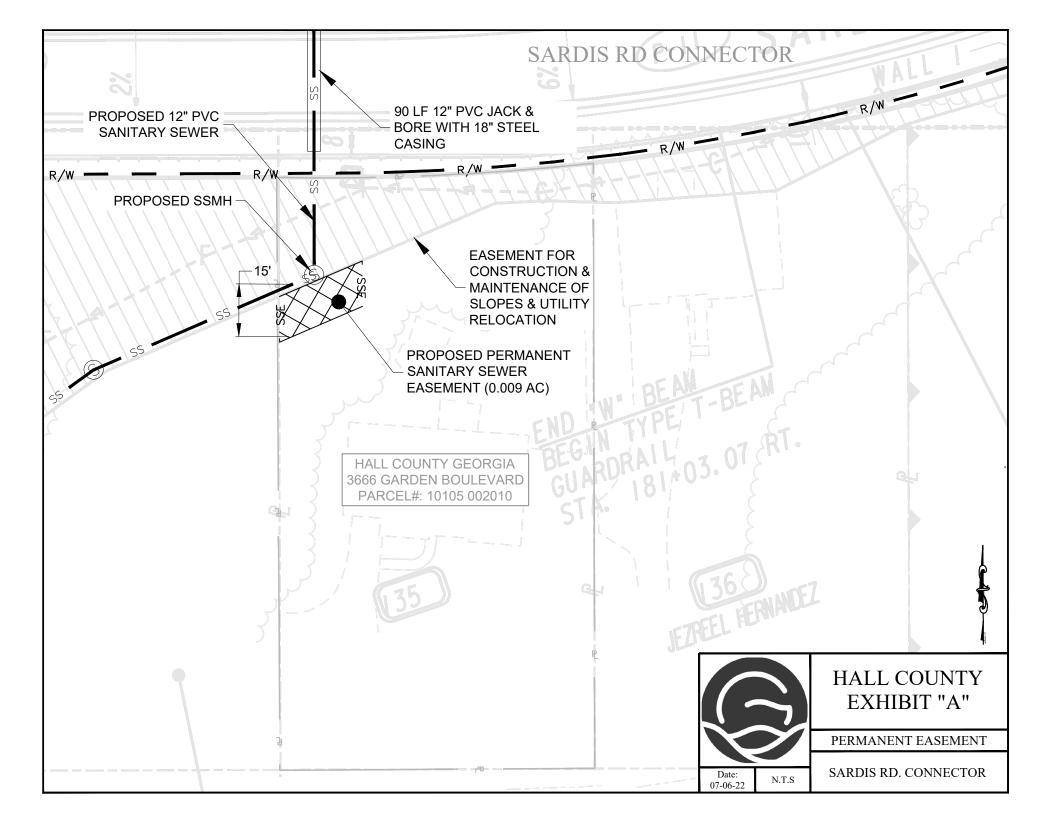

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

Assistant Planning and Development Director

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 28th day of July, 2022, by and between **HALL COUNTY, STATE OF GEORGIA,** hereinafter called "the County", as party of the first part, and **Ellis Still**, herein called "Employee", as part of the second part, both of whom agree as follows:

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the County desires to employ the services of said Ellis Still as the Assistant Planning and Development Director of Hall County; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing board, hereafter called "Commission" to provide certain benefits, establish certain conditions of employment and to set working conditions of said Employee; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Hall County to secure and retain the services of said Employee and provide inducement for him or her to remain in such employment, and to make possible full work productivity by assuring said Employee's morale and peace of mind with respect to future security, and to provide a just means of terminating the Employee's services at such a time as desired by the County Administrator, or his or her designee; and

WHEREAS, the Employee desires to accept employment as Assistant Planning and Development Director for Hall County;

NOW THEREFORE; in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>Duties</u>

The County hereby agrees to employ **Ellis Still** as **Assistant Planning and Development Director**, to perform legally permissible functions and duties specified and assigned by the County Administrator or his or her designee.

Assistant Planning and Development Director

SECTION 2. Term

- A. Nothing in this agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of the County Administrator to terminate the services of this Employee at any time, subject only to the provisions set forth in SECTION 3 of this agreement. The Employee understands that he or she serves at the pleasure of the County Administrator.
- B. Nothing in the agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employee to resign at any time from his or her position with the County, subject to the provisions set forth in SECTION 3, Paragraphs B and C of this agreement.

SECTION 3. Termination and Severance Pav

- A. In the event the Employee is terminated pursuant to Paragraph B hereof and the Employee is willing and able to perform the duties of the position under this agreement, upon execution of a Separation Agreement and General Release, the Employer agrees to pay the Employee a lump sum cash payment equal to three (3) months aggregate annual salary, exclusive of other forms of compensation, less standard withholdings, in addition to the continuation of medical, dental and vision insurance benefits during the three (3) month period immediately following the date of termination. However, in the event the Employee is terminated because the Employee has been convicted of a misdemeanor or a felony, or if the County determines that the Employee has engaged in unprofessional and improper practice, other than negligence, and breach of public trust, including but not limited to illegal acts involving personal gain, or moral turpitude, the County shall be entitled to terminate the Employee immediately without any severance pay, or medical, dental and vision insurance continuation aside from COBRA.
- B. In the event the Employer at any point during the term of this agreement reduces the salary or other financial benefits of the Employee in a greater percentage than reductions to all other employees of Employer, or if Employer refuses, following a written request to comply with any provision benefiting Employee herein; or the Employee resigns following a suggestion, whether formal or informal, by the County Administrator that he or she resign, then, in that event, Employee may, at his or her option, be deemed to be terminated at the date of such reduction or refusal to comply within the meaning and context of the herein severance pay provision.

Assistant Planning and Development Director

C. In the event the Employee voluntarily resigns his or her position with the County as **Assistant Planning and Development Director** then the Employee shall give the County **thirty (30)** days written notice in advance, unless the parties otherwise agree. The provision for severance pay and continuation of employment benefits detailed in SECTION 3, Paragraph A shall not apply to a voluntary resignation.

SECTION 4. Termination Due to Disability

If the Employee is unable to perform his or her duties because of sickness, accident, injury, or mental incapacity, and no reasonable accommodations are available, the County shall have the option to terminate employment, subject to the severance pay requirements of SECTION 3, Paragraph A. However, the Employee shall be compensated for any accrued benefits, in accordance with current policies.

SECTION 5. Salary

The County agrees to pay the Employee for his or her services rendered, pursuant hereto, an annual base salary of \$115,000, payable in installments at the same time as other employees of the County are paid, except that the county may put in place cost reduction measures at any time and for any duration as required by a lack of financial resources. The base annual salary and benefits may be reviewed annually by the County Administrator and consideration for increases may be determined based upon the performance of the employee or consideration of providing a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA).

SECTION 6. Performance Evaluation

The County Administrator, or his or her designee, shall review and evaluate the performance of Employee at least annually on the anniversary day of this agreement. Said review and evaluation shall be in accordance with criteria developed by the County Administrator, or his or her designee, and Employee. Performance criteria may be added to or deleted from, as the County Administrator, or his or her designee may from time to time determine. Further, the County Administrator, or his or her designee, shall provide the Employee with a written summary statement of the findings of the evaluation.

Assistant Planning and Development Director

SECTION 7. Hours of Work

It is generally recognized that the position of **Assistant Planning and Development Director** involves the devotion of a great deal of time beyond typically recognized business hours.

SECTION 8. Outside Activities

The Employee shall devote his or her full time to the position described in this agreement. With the approval of the County Administrator, or his or her designee, the Employee may engage in teaching, consulting or other non-employer related activities as long as he or she does not interfere with the execution of the duties of this position, or present a conflict of interest. Such consent must be obtained by advance approval, in writing, detailing the specifics of such activity.

SECTION 9. Political Activity

If the Employee announces as a candidate for any elective office during the duration, of this contract, he or she will resign from Hall County employment immediately upon declaring candidacy as defined by state law. During the term of this contract, the Employee may not:

- A. Be involved in any political activity that would constitute a conflict of interest; including participation in any aspect of any local political campaign on behalf of one's self if intending to seek elected office, or other individual or in opposition to any candidate for office within Hall County; including municipal and/or county government office. This restriction includes but is not limited to displaying or distributing information, materials, or paraphernalia in support of any political candidate, party or organization.
- B. Knowingly solicit, accept, or receive political contributions from any person, to be used in support of or in opposition to any political candidate for election within Hall County, including municipal and/or county government office.
- C. Use, or promise to use, directly or indirectly, any official authority or influence, whether possessed or anticipated, to secure or attempt to secure for any person a job or other advantage for the purpose of influencing the vote or political action of any person.

Assistant Planning and Development Director

SECTION 10. Vehicle and Phone

Employee's duties require the substantial use of their personal automobile during the term of employment. The County shall pay to the Employee, in addition to salary, a monthly vehicle allowance of \$433.33. A cellular phone dedicated solely for business usage may be provided by the Employer. In such case, the Employer shall be responsible for paying for and maintaining regular monthly service. Should the Employee desire to use their personal cellular phone for business purposes, Employer shall reimburse the Employee the amount of \$50 per month.

SECTION 11. Insurance Benefits

The County agrees to put in force and make premium payments for Medical, Dental, Vision, Short-Term Disability and Life Insurance policies on behalf of the Employee and if so elected, eligible dependents, at a level of coverage available to other County employees. The Employee may choose not to cover his/her dependents.

SECTION 12. Retirement Benefits

Provided that contributions are being made by the County, if the Employee elects, Hall County agrees to contribute (8 %) of annual compensation as defined by the retirement plan in addition to Employer matching contributions made on contributions by the Employee as received by other County employees, into a defined contribution plan, except that the County may reduce or suspend this contribution at any time and for any duration as required due to a lack of financial resources. Retirement contributions shall not be made on any severance pay provided by the Employer, paid in accordance with Section 3.

SECTION 13. Paid Time Off (PTO) or Vacation and Sick Leave

As applicable, the County will provide for Paid Time Off (PTO) or vacation and sick leave in the same manner as the accruals currently received by other County Employees. In the event that the County changes or adopts a new program for all employees, such changes shall also apply to the **Assistant Planning and Development Director**. Accrued PTO or vacation leave, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to Employee upon termination of employment. Employee shall be credited with an additional one hundred twenty (120) hours of Paid Time Off (PTO) on August 1, 2022.

Assistant Planning and Development Director

SECTION 14. <u>Dues, Subscriptions and Professional Development</u>

- A. The County agrees to pay the Employee's annual membership dues, subscriptions and conference expenses incurred by the Employee in conjunction with the Employee's duties, not to exceed the budget and subject to prior approval by the County Administrator or his or her designee.
- B. The County agrees to pay the travel and subsistence expenses of the Employee for expenses related to maintenance of professional certifications, professional and official travel, meetings and occasions adequate to continue the professional development of the Employee and to adequately pursue necessary official and other functions for the department, not to exceed the budget and subject to prior approval by the County Administrator or his or her designee.

SECTION 15. <u>Indemnification</u>

The County shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Employee against any claim or demand or legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the performance of the Employee's duties as **Assistant Planning and Development Director**. The County or its insurance carrier will pay the amount of any settlement or judgment agreed to or rendered against the Employee and the County may agree to such settlement or the payment of a judgment with or without the express consent of the Employee.

SECTION 16. General Provisions

- A. The text herein shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Any amendment hereto shall be in writing and be executed by both parties.
- B. This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs at law and executors of the Employee.
- C. If any provision, or any portion thereof, contained in this agreement is held unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement, or portion thereof, shall be deemed severable, shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

Assistant Planning and Development Director

- D. This agreement will become effective on the 1st day of August 2022, and shall continue thereafter unless or until the agreement is terminated by either party set forth herein.
- E. This agreement shall be executed in duplicate, each of which shall be deemed to be complete of itself and may be introduced into evidence or used for any purpose without the production of the other copy.

(A) DESCRIPTION OF CHALLENGES TO HOLDING SAFE, ACCESSIBLE HEARINGS AND TO ENSURING THAT THE SAFETY, PERMANENCE, AND WELL-BEING NEEDS OF CHILDREN ARE MET IN A TIMELY AND COMPLETE MANNER TO JUSTIFY NEED FOR COVID-19 GRANT FUNDS

Hall County Juvenile Court has conducted hybrid hearings since the start of the Covid19 public health emergency. It has been challenging for the court to conduct hearings without all of the necessary technology needed to ensure accessible hearings for everyone involved. The court has purchased several chromebooks but unfortunately, we do not have enough to provide one in each courtroom. Several of the chromebooks purchased in 2019 for the court were provided courtesy of funds given to us from J4C. Each of the chromebooks are presently being used in all of our zoom rooms. The existing chromebooks are used consistently by the attorneys, parents and other interested parties. We would like to have a chromebook available in each of our three courtrooms for witnesses to use when testifying from the witness stand. This would allow the witness to participate in the hybrid hearings on the zoom platform. The laptop would be rotated among all three courtrooms to assist the attorneys and families as well, particularly with evidence presentations. We are slowly phasing back into having full court hearings but may continue to offer hybrid hearings in the event that someone has been exposed or impacted by the COVID19 virus. The court does not have an adequate amount of chromebooks or laptops available to assist in this effort. A number of our foster care placements are a great distance from the court and both the foster parents and the children prefer to participate remotely due to the ongoing concerns of the COVID19 virus. Therefore, we are requesting grant funds to purchase three chromebooks and one laptop computer.

(B) DESCRIPTION OF TECHNOLOGY INVESTMENTS, TRAINING, AND/OR PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO ADDRESS THE CHALLENGES DESCRIBED IN SECTION (A)

Hall County Juvenile Court will use the grant funds requested to purchase three chromebooks and one Lenovo laptop computer. Each of the technology devices will be accessible and assigned to each of the three courtrooms. The chromebooks currently cost \$329.00 each on Amazon totaling \$987.00 and a Lenovo laptop computer costs \$1,339.00. The total cost for all four devices is estimated at \$2,326.00 which is the total grant amount Hall County Juvenile Court is requesting. 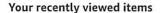

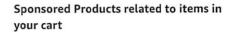

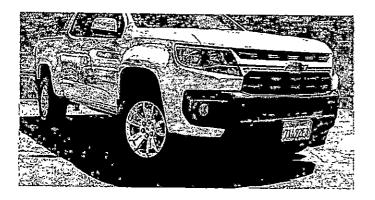

This item was tabled at the July 14, 2022 Board of Commissioners voting meeting because the Board of Commissioners were not provided all Planning Commission conditions of approval prior to the meeting. No changes or revisions have been submitted since the July 14, 2022 meeting.

At their June 6, 2022 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval (4-0) of this request.

There were zero (0) written comments in opposition submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting and zero (0) people spoke in opposition during the public hearing on June 6, 2022.

There have been no changes to the request since the Planning Commission took action.

This rezoning request has an associated conditional use requiring Planning Commission only. The Planning Commission approved the use with thirteen (13) conditions:

- 1. This Conditional Use Permit application is contingent on the approval by the Board of Commissioners of the concurrent rezoning request to Highway Business (H-B) as the AR-III district does not allow the commercial use as required by §17.350.100.
- 2. The development shall meet all of the conditions specified in §17.350.100. Additional parking on other than principal lot, except for approved variance.

- 3. The development shall conform substantially with the proposed site plan and narrative, modified as necessary for compliance with current development standards at time of site plan approval.
- 4. Development shall conform to the standards set forth by the Gateway Corridors Overlay District with exceptions of variances granted.
- 5. The development shall be subject to the Hall County Development Review process and any improvements required shall be installed prior to the lot being used for parking and the storage of equipment.
- 6. The applicant shall coordinate with the City of Buford regarding commercial driveway permitting from Holiday Road.
- 7. The parking lot shall be approved for use by the applicant for overflow storage of business related equipment and materials and employee parking only for businesses owned by Mr. Cameron Reeves.
- 8. There shall be no leasing of spots for boats or RV storage.
- 9. There shall be no more than 9 semi-trucks parked on the site as 10 truck parking spaces requires review as a Development of Regional Impact (DRI) according to Rules of Georgia Department of Community Affairs, Chapter 110-12-3, Development of Regional Impact.
- 10. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plat created for the property.
- 11. There shall be a variance for a gravel parking lot.
- 12. This conditional use approval shall be granted for this applicant only and shall expire in 12 months.
- 13. There shall be a variance that the proposed additional parking area does not have to be within 400 feet of the main entrance to the principal use building. (§17.350.100)

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is seeking to rezone a 2.07± acre parcel from Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III) to Highway Business (H-B) for development as an overflow parking area for his businesses in the area. The applicant has also submitted a conditional use request to be considered concurrently with the rezoning application for additional parking on other than the principal lot.

The narrative states that the property is currently a gravel lot on which he would like to park equipment, vehicles, trucks and trailers. Employees will use the lot to pick up the vehicles stored there, leaving their personal vehicles on-site during the day. Employees will typically access the property between 6:00am and 5:00pm but may need to access the site earlier at times. The narrative continues that there will be no work conducted onsite and it is for storage of vehicles only.

The applicant is also requesting a variance from §17.420.050.E of the Official Code of Hall County. §17.420 provides development standards for properties within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD). The GCOD is supplemental to the underlying zoning district classifications and governs non-residential property development standards, including parking lot materials. Properties which fall within the GCOD requires that parking areas shall be paved with asphalt, concrete (or pervious materials

approved by the director.) A variance from the paving requirement has been requested as this property is not visible from Lanier Islands Parkway. Additionally, access to the property is from Holiday Road.

The applicant's narrative states that no other relief from the GCOD standards are requested, and plans to install a privacy fence all the way around the property, landscape and buffers, but paving would be cost-prohibitive. The applicant says that the intention is to further develop the property either commercially or residentially in the future.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject property is zoned AR-III and is undeveloped. The parcel is recorded with the Hall County Clerk of Court in Plat Book 862 page 144. The property is bounded to the east by Holiday Road, with both residential and commercial properties located across the right-of-way. To the north is a commercial property located within the City of Buford and Lanier Islands Parkway. To the south is a Highway Business (H-B) zoned property, developed with a single-family residential home, located in unincorporated Hall County.

Part of the property also falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD). The GCOD is supplemental to the underlying zoning district classifications and governs nonresidential property development standards, including signage.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The future land use map shows the subject property as "Lake Area Residential" and within the Lake Supportive Corridor which includes low-density residential development and neighborhoods. Land use patterns are similar to Residential Areas, and there is orientation toward Lake Lanier in terms of development and flexibility in use of singlefamily homes. The area includes the 500-feet buffer around the lake, wherein properties have the potential to be zoned Vacation Cottage District in order for singlefamily homes to be used as short-term vacation rentals.

Future development will continue to be detached, single family homes at low densities in addition to less intensive agricultural uses that are found in the northwestern part of the area.

The primary land uses within the Lake Supportive Corridor are commercial uses that are boat related (boat sales, storage and equipment sales) or complement recreational use of Lake Lanier (such as non-franchise restaurants). The intent of the corridors in the Comprehensive Plan are to enhance and maintain well-functioning, attractive corridors that facilitate vehicular traffic flow and pedestrian/bicycle connectivity, serve local needs, and coordinate land use patterns without encroaching on adjacent neighborhoods.

This use request is inconsistent with the Future Land Use Designation found in the Comprehensive Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 13th 2022, Emily McGahee stated that there were no comments for this request.

Hall County Fire Services

The property is located approximately 2.7 miles from Hall County Fire Station #8, located at 6175 Gaines Ferry Road. The nearest fire hydrant is located to the rear of the subject property on Lanier Islands Parkway.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

A memo dated May 19, 2022 from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Hall County Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

Engineering

The site may require a stormwater management report, should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

Traffic Engineering

Driveway will need to be permitted by the City of Buford.

Utilities

No comment.

Hall County Tax Assessors No

comments were provided.

Gainesville Water Resources (per GIS)

Per Hall County GIS, Public water is available to the property along Holiday Road and Lanier Islands Parkway

Georgia Department of Transportation

Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Operations Supervisor, provided the following comment via and email dated May 18, 2022: "If access is from Holiday Rd and no work is being done in GDOT R/W – no further coordination is required. If either of these conditions are not met, GDOT Coordination will be required."

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed use is not residential in nature and is not within the character described for the Lake Supportive Corridor designation.
 - The proposed use is not consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Plan.
 - The request will provide additional parking for nearby businesses owned by the applicant for associated equipment and employees, in accordance with a conditional use permit as outlined in §17.350.100.
- Within the Highway Business (H-B) zoning district any retail or retail service establishment, including the making of articles sold at retail on the premises providing the conditions of chapter §17.210 are met.
 - The applicant is requesting to use the property of additional storage of equipment and vehicles related to his businesses.

- Within the Highway Business (H-B) zoning district parking on additional parking on other than
 principal lot is a conditional use subject to the approval of the Planning Commission.

 The
 applicant has submitted a concurrent request for a conditional use permit.
- Per §17.240 of the Official Code of Hall County, the required setbacks for H-B are: 55 feet from center line of road or 30 feet from property line, whichever is greater, 20 feet from side property lines, and 10 feet from the rear property line.
 - No structures are proposed at this time.
- The subject property falls within the Gateway Corridor Overlay District (GCOD) and is subject
 to design standard for non-residential development including: architectural, buffering,
 landscaping and signage requirements.
- The GCOD provides guidelines for non-residential property development. The guidelines apply
 to both permitted uses and development standards. Within the GCOD, the following uses are
 prohibited: adult entertainment, junk yards, and billboard signs. Uses subject to the approval
 of the Hall County Board of commissioners (BOC) include self-storage warehouses, vehicle
 sales lots (new or used), automobile repair and maintenance, commercial outdoor recreation,
 car washes and outdoor storage.
 - The applicant has requested a variance from §17.420.050.E, which requires the paving of properties which fall within the GCOD to be asphalt, concrete (or pervious materials approved by the director.)
 - The applicant has requested this relief as this property is not visible from Lanier Islands Parkway and because access to the property is from Holiday Road.
 - The applicant's narrative states that no other relief from the GCOD standards are requested, and plans to install a privacy fence all the way around the property, landscape and buffers
 - The applicant says that the intention is to further develop the property either commercially or residentially in the future.
- Per §17.420.050.D.2.a of the Official Code of Hall County, along each street frontage there shall be a ten-foot wide landscape strip, continuous along the frontage except for perpendicular crossings for driveways and utilities. The adjacent properties are commercially zoned and as such no buffer is required.
 - The applicant's site plan shows a 10 foot landscape strip adjacent to both Lanier Islands Parkway and Holiday Road. ■ This standard is met.
- Per §17.420.050.D.4.d of the Official Code of Hall County, outdoor storage or sales displays shall be prohibited from front yards except when permitted in the underlying zoning district and further authorized by a conditional use permit pursuant to the procedures of the Hall County Zoning Ordinance. Outdoor storage or sales displays shall be screened from view from public streets and adjacent property by a permanent opaque enclosure consisting of a minimum eight-foot high solid fence or wall.
 - The applicant's narrative states that they intend to install a privacy fence around the entire property.
 - This standard is met.
- Per §17.420.050.E.3 of the Official Code of Hall County, all parking areas shall be paved with asphalt, or concrete.
 - The site plan shows a central gravel parking area for equipment, trailer, and truck parking with 96 standard vehicular parking spaces around the borders of the property.
 No specific spaces have been depicted within the gravel area.
 - The material for the 96 parking spaces is not labeled.
 - A variance is necessary for the use of gravel as a parking material.

- Per §17.420.050.E.4 of the Official Code of Hall County, each parking area of over 50 spaces shall include landscaped islands within the parking area equivalent to not less than five to ten percent with planning director discretion of the total paved area of the parking lot, not including pervious paving surfaces.
 - The site plan does not depict any parking lot landscape islands. This standard is not met.

Variances to the Official Code of Hall County

Staff recommends **denial** to the following variances:

1. §17.420.050.E.3 requires all parking areas to be paved with asphalt or concrete.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the applicant's request subject to the following conditions:

- The development shall conform substantially with the proposed site plan and narrative, modified as necessary for compliance with current development standards at time of site plan approval.
- 2. Development shall conform to the standards set forth by the Gateway Corridors Overlay District. No variances are granted as part of this application.
- The development shall be subject to the Hall County Development Review process and any improvements required shall be installed prior to the lot being used for parking and the storage of equipment.
- 4. The applicant shall coordinate with the City of Buford regarding commercial driveway permitting from Holiday Road.
- 5. The parking lot shall be approved for use by the applicant for overflow storage of business related equipment and materials and employee parking only. There shall be no leasing of spots for boats or RV storage.
- 6. There shall be no more than 9 semi-trucks parked on the site as 10 truck parking spaces requires review as a Development of Regional Impact (DRI) according to Rules of Georgia Department of Community Affairs, Chapter 110-12-3, Development of Regional Impact.
- 7. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plat created for the property.

Applicant's Presentation:

Randi Doveton, Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Cameron Reeves, 5750 Holiday Road, Buford, presented the request. The applicant stated that he would like to park trailers from other businesses he's involved with onto the property or lease it out to neighboring businesses to extend their parking space. The applicant stated that there was no visibility from Lake Lanier Boulevard since the property is up on a hill. The applicant stated he is willing to keep the number of tractor trailer parking under ten. The applicant stated that he is requesting for a variance for a gravel parking lot.

Public Forum:

There were no comments in support or opposition.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell questioned what kind of vehicles would be parked there. The applicant stated cars, trucks, and trailers. Mr. Braswell questioned if there were any issues following Gateway standards. The applicant stated that he will follow Gateway Standards with the exception of his request for a gravel parking lot if granted. Mr. Varner questioned if there would be reefer trucks and if so, will they be pulling loads. The applicant stated there could be depending who it's leased out to. Mr. Braswell questioned if the Use Subject could be applicant specific and expire in twelve months. Ms. Doveton stated that could be a condition if approved.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to subdivide an existing 4.22± acre Vacation Cottage (V-C) zoned parcel into three tracts, creating two new building lots. Pursuant to §17.50.040 of the Official Code of Hall County a residential subdivision in this zoning district requires conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioners.

The submitted site plan depicts the proposed lot layout of the three lots. Tract 2 contains the existing residence and consists of 2.221± acres with approximately 228.82 feet of road frontage. Tract 3 is 1.001± acres and contains approximately 103 feet of road frontage. Tract 4 is 1.00± acres and has 100 feet of road frontage.

The applicant's narrative states that the intention is to sell Tracts 3 and 4 to private buyers for the properties to be developed with single family residences, pending approval of this request.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject property is 4.22± acres, is zoned Vacation Cottage (V-C) and is developed with a 6,191 square foot residence, constructed in 2019. The property is recorded with the Hall County Clerk of Courts and can be found in Plat Book 875 page 36 recorded on October 15, 2017. The property deed goes back to October 1950, located in Deed Book 126 page 570.

The subject property is located on the east side of North Waterworks Road. To the north and east of the subject property is U.S.A.C.E land which borders Lake Lanier and a 16.28± acre parcel zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD), a former mobile home park proposed to be redeveloped into a mixed use residential community. To the south are two V-C zoned parcels. Further south, and west across North Waterworks Road, are properties which fall within the City of Buford and their zoning is unknown. The property to the west is a City of Buford water treatment plant.

The current V-C zoning does not allow subdivisions by right. The applicant has chosen to request a conditional use approval from the County Commission to accommodate the proposed 3-lot residential subdivision.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The Comprehensive Plan's future land use designation for the subject parcel is "Lake Area Residential." This land use category is characterized by low-density single-family residential and neighborhoods. The intent of land use category is to preserve established neighborhoods and create opportunities for permanent and vacation residences similar in land use patters to Residential Areas but at a lower density.

This request complies with the Comprehensive Plan and Future Land Use Map designation.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 31, 2022, Emily McGahee, Hall Environmental Health, provided the following comment: "All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements. Environmental Health has preliminarily reviewed the submitted plat during Plat Review process and can stamp the plat for recordation with the Clerk of Courts."

The subject property is located approximately 2.3 miles from Fire Station #13, located at 2709 Sardis Road.

- The subject parcel is a total of 4.22± acres in size. The applicant is requesting to allow a minor subdivision to create three building lots.
- The proposed property use is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. These parcels are not located within any corridors or activity centers.
- Per §17.150.010 of the Official Code of Hall County, the following are the permitted uses within the Vacation Cottage zoning district: A. Residences:
 - 1. Site-built single-family detached dwelling units.

 - 3. Transient occupancy of a vacation home provided all requirements of chapter 17.216 are met.

- B. Noncommercial accessory residential uses including but not limited to a private garage, detached home workshop, swimming pool, or greenhouse, all of which shall be incidental to the use of the property as a residence. C. Home offices.
- D. Agricultural or horticultural uses.
- E. Churches and other places of worship, but excluding cemeteries.
- F. County uses including parks and playgrounds, but excluding cemeteries.
- G. [Reserved.]
- H. Substations for electrical transformers, gas regulators and telephone subscriber carrier sites, provided the conditions of chapter 17.210 are met. I. Family day care home.
- J. Community residences, provided the conditions of chapter 17.210 are met.
- K. Home occupations, provided the conditions of chapter 17.210 are met.
- Per §17.240.010 of the Official Code of Hall County, the minimum dimensional standards for the Vacation Cottage zoning district are as follows: A. 35,000 square foot minimum lot size.
 - 1. This standard is met as each lot is greater than 35,000 square feet in size.
 - B. 50' minimum frontage for local roads or 150' minimum frontage for road designated as an arterial or collector per §16.50.040 of the Official Code of Hall County.
 - 1. North Waterworks Road is classified as a local and requires 50 feet of frontage for each lot.
 - 2. The proposed subdivision **meets** this standard.
 - C. 75' minimum lot width (at front setback line) per §17.240.120.
 - 1. Each parcel is at least 75' in width at the building line.

Item 1, 3053, 3087 McEver Road, Botrus: No parking of stock, employee, or customer vehicles on top of or within 5' of drainline or 10' from septic tank. Environmental Health will not approve any additional paved/gravel parking on parcel.

Item 2, 5340, 5342 Waterwood Drive, Gonzalez: Must meet all Environmental Health residential septic system permitting requirements. Septic system issued to property (OSC 5804) has expired. A new septic permit must be issued prior to application for building permit.

Item 3, 4164 Pine Vale, Davis: The detached carport was approved by Environmental Health on 4.27.22.

Item 4, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements.

Item 5, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: No comment. Proposed structures will have no plumbing per applicant.

- i. Allow more than 125 percent of the minimum allowable parking spaces.
- j. Applicant shall install a 12' high composite wall approximately 5-10 feet off western boundary, adjacent to Sugar Hill Elementary, to extend to the rear of the property until it reaches the creek.
- k. A 50' buffer shall be placed along the exterior boundaries, except for the side pf property facing Athens Highway.
- 2. All future development shall be subject to all standards set forth by the Gateway Corridor Overlay District; no variances to these standards shall be approved, unless approved by the Planning Commission and Board of Commissioners.
- 3. All access off Athens Highway shall be approved and permitted by GDOT.
- 4. Any outdoor storage shall be screened in accordance with §17.260.020 of the Official Code of Hall County.
- 5. All mechanical services shall be conducted within a garage bay.
- 6. Elevations depicting the proposed building shall be submitted to the Planning Department for approval of the director during the Development Review process. No building permit shall be issued for the development without the approval of said elevations.
- 7. All conditions of zoning be made a part of any plat recorded for this property.
- 8. All previous conditions of zoning shall apply except as specifically modified in this approval.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to rezone the subject property from Agricultural-ResidentialIV (AR-IV) to Planned Industrial Development (PID) for the purpose of developing a truck terminal on the property. The 28.27± acre property is to be developed in combination with a 36.33 acre PID parcel to the west, which was approved for an amendment to a previous PID zoning by the Hall County Board of Commissioners on January 27, 2022.

The applicant's narrative states that the proposed uses are permitted within the Light Industrial zoning classification, specifically: truck terminals, "flex-space" multi-tenant uses (business requiring a varied square foot mix of office and warehouse space), the conditional use of additional parking on other than the principal lot. The site plan depicts a T-shaped building square

foot inside, a maintenance shop and truck washing area that does not list the square footage, an area identified for gas, and substantial parking areas.

Specifically, there are 175 proposed tractor parking spaces, 222 proposed employee parking spaces, 249 loading bays, and 320 trailer parking spaces.

The proposed development will specifically exclude the following uses:

- A. Bus stations.
- B. Drive-in theaters
- C. Junk yards
- D. Service stations E. Group day care home.
- F. Adult establishments.
- G. Astrologers
- H. Clairvoyants
- I. Fortune tellers
- J. Palmists
- K. Phrenologists
- L. Other similar or related occupations licensed by the Board of Commissioners

The proposed building site development standards are as follows:

- Minimum Lot Area: 15,000 square feet (if subdivided)
- Maximum Impervious Area: 80% of lot
- Maximum Building 400,000 square footage
- Maximum Building Height: 50'-0
- Minimum Lot Frontage: 100'-0 (if subdivided)
- Front Building Setback (Interior Street): 30'-0
- Front Building Setback (U.S 129): 75'-0 from centerline or 50'-0 from the property line, whichever is greater
- Building & Buffer Setback for side & rear of outside boundaries: 25'-0
- Parking Ratio: Based upon user design needs but not to exceed maximum impervious area as noted above.

The subject property also falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD) which is supplemental to the underlying zoning district classification. The GCOD governs non-residential property development standards. The applicant has proposed the following development standards for this property:

A. Allow exterior walls of the buildings to be pre-engineered metal building, EIFS, and stucco. Front and 50 feet along both sides of office shall be EIFS or stucco. See Title 17, Ch. 17 420 050 H

- Allow standing seam or architectural metal roof panels on all building structures except for gas canopy, with colors approved by the Planning Director. See Title 17, Ch. 17.420.050
 H
- C. Roof-top HVAC units to be installed with screening along front of building. See Title 17, Ch. 17.420.050 D
- D. Allow a primary monument sign, at main entrance into the property, with dimension of what maximum square footage the code will allow, based upon the project maximum build-out of 230,000 square feet. See Title 17, Ch. 17.420.060
- E. Allow the monument sign to use a "halo" or back-lit type of illumination. See Title 17, Ch. 17.420.050 F
- F. Allot the use of LED exterior lighting, whether pole mounted or attached to the building or structures. See Title 17, Ch. 17.420.050 F
- G. Allow 30 foot front building setback from property line. See Title 17, Ch. 17.240.010
- H. Employee parking areas will meet Gateway Corridor Overlay landscape requirements.
- I. Allow more than 125% of the minimum allowable parking spaces. See Title 17, Ch. 17.240.010
- J. A 50 foot buffer shall be placed along the exterior boundaries abutting residentially zoned properties.

Finally, the applicant's narrative notes that the attached site plan is a conceptual design and that the number of buildings, building dimensions, and building and street layout may need to be adjusted to meet the specific user requirements. However, the Permitted Uses, Exclusions, and Development Standards shall not change without further board approval.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject property consists of 28.27± acres and is zoned Agricultural-Residential-IV (AR-IV). The property is undeveloped and mostly wooded. Adjacent properties to the east and north are also zoned AR-IV, and developed with single family residences or mobile homes. To the west are two tracts, totaling 36.33 acres that will be developed in conjunction with the subject parcel. Further west are two large tracts – tax parcels 15023 000041 and 15023 000084 –owned and utilized by Hall County Government for the Hall County Landfill and other municipal uses.

On January 27, 2022 the Board of Commissioners voted to approve an amendment to a previously approved Planned Industrial Development for a proposed truck terminal, repair garage, and office space. This was approved with the following conditions:

- 1. The development shall conform substantially with the proposed narrative, site plan, and variances below. Building layout and orientation may shift, but the maximum thresholds and uses outlined in the project narrative and on the site plan shall apply.
 - a. Allow exterior walls of the buildings to be pre-engineered metal building, EIFS, and stucco. Front and 50 feet along both sides of office shall be EIFS or stucco. Maintenance shop front shall be EIFS or stucco.

- b. Allow standing seam or architectural metal roof panels on all building structures except for gas canopy, with colors approved by the Planning Director.
- c. Roof-top HVAC units shall be installed with screening along front of building and side adjacent to elementary school.
- d. Allow a primary pylon sign, at main entrance into the property, with dimensions of what maximum sq. ft. the code will allow, based upon the projected maximum buildout of 2300,000 SF.
- e. Allow the pylon sign to use of the "Halo" or back-lit type.
- f. Allow the use of LED exterior lighting, whether pole mounted or attached the building or structures.
- g. Allow a 30' front building setback from property line.
- h. Employee parking areas will meet Gateway Corridor Overlay landscape requirements.
- i. Allow more than 125 percent of the minimum allowable parking spaces.
- j. Applicant shall install a 12' high composite wall approximately 5-10 feet off western boundary to extend to the rear of the property until it reaches the creek.
- k. A 50' buffer shall be placed along the exterior boundaries, except for the side pf property facing Athens Highway.
- 2. All future development shall be subject to all standards set forth by the Gateway Corridor Overlay District; no variances to these standards shall be approved, unless approved by the Planning Commission and Board of Commissioners.
- 3. All access off Athens Highway shall be approved and permitted by GDOT.
- 4. Any outdoor storage shall be screened in accordance with §17.260.020 of the Official Code of Hall County.
- 5. All mechanical services shall be conducted within a garage bay.
- 6. Elevations depicting the proposed building shall be submitted to the Planning Department for approval of the director during the Development Review process. No building permit shall be issued for the development without the approval of said elevations.
- 7. All conditions of zoning be made a part of any plat recorded for this property.

The subject property also falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD), which is supplemental to the underlying zoning district classification. The GCOD governs non-residential property development standards.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The subject property is located within a "Mixed-use" corridor according to the Future Land Use Designation. The primary future land uses within this type of corridor are for retail, office, higher density residential (including multi-family), civic uses, and open/park spaces. Developments within this corridor should be low-impact industrial or higherdensity residential only where the same is found on adjacent properties.

The proposed use is **consistent** with the Comprehensive Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 31, 2022 Emily McGahee stated that the development "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements if able to be permitted by Environmental Health. Non-domestic wastewater treatment and disposal may be required to be permitted through EPD. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan and detailed waste stream analysis (including flow) must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review. Additional items, including, but not limited to: recorded plat, soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan."

Hall County Fire Services

In a letter dated June 1, 2022 Lieutenant John Hornick provided the following comments:

- 1) Fire apparatus accessibility must meet IFC minimum standards.
- 2) Fire hydrants will be required inside development.
- 3) Electronic controlled access gate(s) will require a Knox override switch for Fire Department access.
- 4) Required: onsite fire hydrants and fire protection system will be supported by a dedicated fire line complete with fire vault. See Gainesville Water FireVault Detail.

Per Hall County GIS, the subject property is located approximately 5.0 miles from Hall County Fire Station #1, located at 2460 Athens Highway. There is a fire hydrants shown on Hall County GIS in the western corner of the subject parcel, along Athens Highway.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memorandum dated June 2, 2022 from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Public Works and Utilities, the following comments were provided:

Engineering

The site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

Avoid impacts to FEMA and Hall County flood plain.

Traffic

Driveway must be permitted through GDOT.

Utilities

Sewer is unavailable; Septic System required.

Hall County Tax Assessors

In an email dated May 17, 2021 Erika Vargas with the Tax Assessors office stated that this property is under the conservation covenant which started in 2021. Ms. Vargas states that the applicants reached out to their office and are aware that the rezoning will not breach the covenant but a change in use will.

Water Service

Per Hall County GIS, there is access to public water along Athens Highway.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated June 1, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Operations Supervisor stated that this project will require GDOT coordination.

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed use for the property as a truck terminal, maintenance shop, and office space
 is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan designation of a Mixeduse Corridor as there is
 an existing industrial use on an adjacent parcel.
- Per §17.180.090.B.2 of the Official Code of Hall County "The development controls for the district shall be detailed (lot coverage, setbacks, building heights, lot sizes, etc.). If standards are not specifically proposed, then the applicable standards in the light industrial (I-I) district, together with the screening and buffer requirements, shall apply." o The applicant has provided proposed development standards, which have been listed above. For any standards that are not provided the requirements of the Official Code of Hall County shall apply, as outlined above.
- §17.250.020A of the Official Code of Hall County lists the following minimum parking standards for the development:
 - o Office, office building or studio:
 - 3.5 spaces for each 1,000 square feet of gross floor area (§17.250.20A)
 OWarehousing:
 - 1 space for each 2 employees (§17.250.20A)

oIndustrial uses:

- 1.6 spaces for each 1,000 square feet of gross floor area (§17.250.20A)
- The applicant has proposed specific maximums for different parking types on the site. Specifically, there are 175 tractor parking spaces, 222 employee parking spaces, 249 loading bays, and 320 trailer parking spaces, but no information has been provided as to how those standards have been determined.
- The GCOD provides guidelines for non-residential property development. The guidelines apply to both permitted uses and development standards.
 - Within the GCOD, the following uses are prohibited: adult entertainment, junk yards, and billboard signs.
 - Uses subject to the approval of the Hall County Board of Commissioners include: self-storage warehouses, vehicle sales lots (new or used), automobile repair and maintenance, commercial outdoor recreation, car wash, and outdoor storage.
 - The applicant has requested the approval of automobile repair and maintenance for the subject parcel.
- Per §17.420.050.C.2.c, where an industrial zoning district abuts property zoned for residential or agricultural uses, the minimum width shall be 50 feet.

- The applicant has proposed a 50 foot exterior buffer along all property lines with the exception of the front along Athens Highway.
 This meets the standard.
- Per §17.420.050.D.2.a, a ten-foot wide landscape strip is required along each street frontage, continuous along the frontage except for perpendicular crossings for driveways and utilities.
 - This is not depicted on the applicant's submitted site plan; it is unable to be determined if this standard is met.
- Per §17.420.050.D.3, in addition to general perimeter landscaping and required buffers, if a loading or service area is located within 50 feet of a side or rear lot line abutting property that is residentially zoned or used for residential purposes, or public or institutional use, then the loading or service areas shall be surrounded by either a six feet high masonry screening wall, or a six feet high solid wooden fence, placed on the inside of the landscaped buffer required in section 17.420.050.C.
 - This is not depicted on the applicant's submitted site plan; it is unable to be determined if this standard is met.
- Per §17.420.050.E.2, all parking areas shall be paved with asphalt or concrete (or other pervious materials approved by the director).
 - The site plan states that all parking areas will be concrete pavement. This meets
 the standard.
- Per §17.420.050.E.4.A, each parking area over 50 spaces shall include landscaped islands within the parking area equivalent to not less than five to ten percent with planning director discretion of the total paved area of the parking lot.

The applicant is proposing to only do this in the employee parking lot. This **does not** meet the GCOD standard.

- Per §17.420.050.H.2, building materials for all four sides of a new building are restricted to the following: brick, stone, and glass or glass block. Up to 50% of the surface area of each side may be stucco, and up to 50% of the surface area of each side of a principal building may be split-face block/concrete masonry unit. Concrete block, painted concrete block, tilt-up and pre-cast concrete are not allowed.
 - The applicant is requesting the following variances from this standard:
 - Allow exterior walls of the buildings to be pre-engineered metal building, EIFS, and stucco. Front and 50 feet along both sides of office shall be EIFS or stucco.
- Metal buildings are not permitted within the GCOD. This does not meet the standard.
- Per §17.420.050.H.3, roof materials for pitched roofs shall be limited to architectural grade composition shingles, natural slate, natural terra cotta, natural wood shake, or factory finished metal with standing seams.
 - The applicant is requesting approval for standing seam or architectural metal roof panels, with colors approved by the Planning Director. This meets the GCOD standard,
- Per §17.420.050.4.b, rooftop mechanical equipment, including HVAC and utility equipment shall be screened from adjacent streets, sidewalks, residential, public and institutional uses. Screening shall consist of parapet walls or an opaque enclosure around the equipment that is constructed of one of the materials used on the primary facade of

the principal structure \circ The applicant is requesting roof-top HVAC units to be installed with screening along the front of the building.

- There is potential that the rooftop mechanical equipment may still be visible from the adjoining properties. This does not meet the GCOD standard.
- Per §17.420.050.F.1 outdoor lighting shall be provided on all public streets and parking lots.
 - No lighting is proposed on the site plan or in the narrative; it is unable to be determined if this condition is met.
- Per §17.420.050.F.4.a/b, internally illuminated signs, automatic changeable copy signs, and externally mounted neon signs are prohibited. Signs may be illuminated with external lighting fixtures provided that fixtures are directed downward and away from streets and adjacent property and public streets. All lighting shall have recessed luminaries, or be semi-cutoff luminary fixtures.

The applicant is requesting a variance from the GCOD architectural standards in order to utilize internal illumination and halo style lighting. This **does not** meet GCOD standards.

§17.420.060.1 Monument signs establishes requirements for monument signs, and allows
one ground mounted monument sign to be permitted per lot. The maximum sign area and
height will be based on the standards set forth in this section and are listed below:

Excerpts from the minutes of the June 20, 2022 meeting

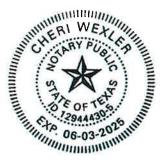

This rezoning application requests to change the current zoning of the above referenced 28.696 Acres (the "Property") from AR-IV (Agricultural-Residential-IV District) to PID (Planned Industrial Development). 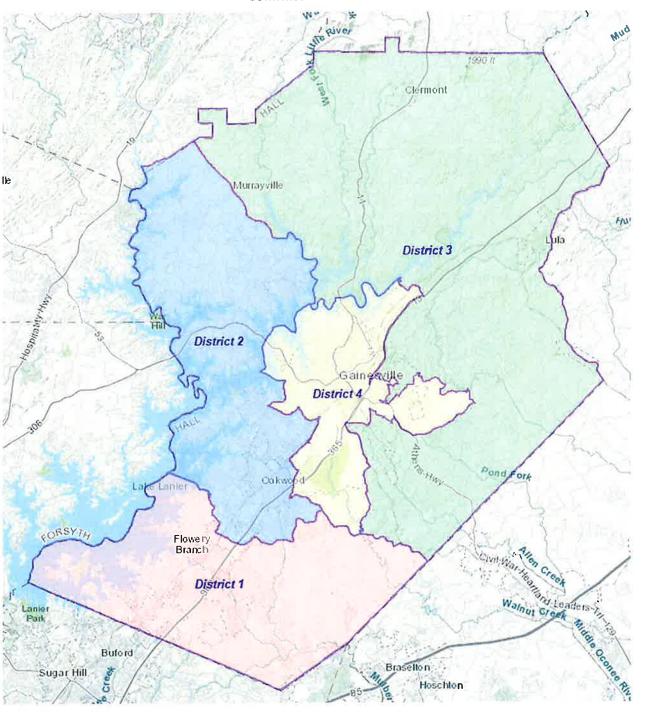




Exhibit C Comprehensive Plan Map

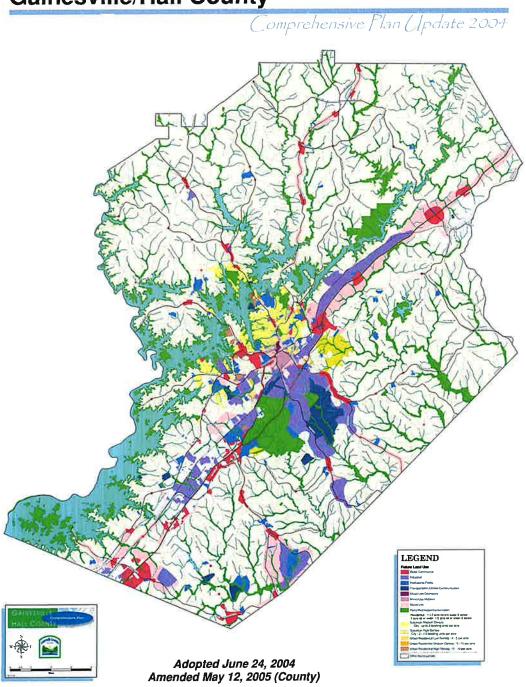




Exhibit C Vicinity Zoning

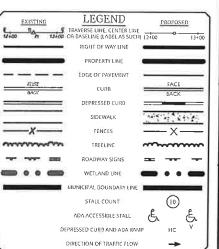

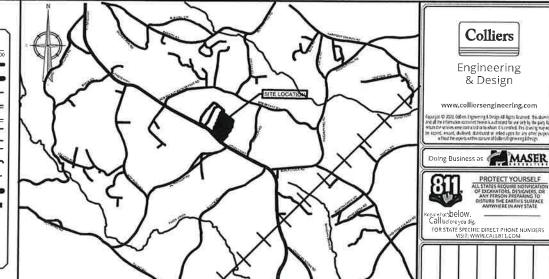

Item 1, 3053, 3087 McEver Road, Botrus: No parking of stock, employee, or customer vehicles on top of or within 5' of drainline or 10' from septic tank. Environmental Health will not approve any additional paved/gravel parking on parcel.

Item 2, 5340, 5342 Waterwood Drive, Gonzalez: Must meet all Environmental Health residential septic system permitting requirements. Septic system issued to property (OSC 5804) has expired. A new septic permit must be issued prior to application for building permit.

Item 3, 4164 Pine Vale, Davis: The detached carport was approved by Environmental Health on 4.27.22.

Item 4, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements.

Item 5, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: No comment. Proposed structures will have no plumbing per applicant.

Item 6, 3385 North Waterworks Road, Ley: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements. Environmental Health has preliminarily reviewed the submitted plat during Plat Review process and can stamp the plat for recordation with the Clerk of Courts.

Item 7, 3596 Meadow Lane, Brown: No comment. Public sewer.

Item 8, 5086 Hog Mountain Road, WeStore: Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. It appears that the proposed covered boat and RV storage facilities are on top of or do not meet required setbacks to the proposed septic system in HDV2021-00068. Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to rezone a $0.17 \pm acret ract$ from Residential-II (AR-III) to Highway Business (H-B) for a tire sale and replacement business. The narrative describes the proposed business being open from 9:00am to 6:00pm. The applicant intends to use the existing driveway for customer parking and the tire replacement. The applicant's site plan shows a 16 foot by 20 foot carport under which the applicant intends to store tires and equipment use to change the tires. There is an existing chain link fence along the side and rear property lines. The applicant's narrative states that the existing house will not be used for any commercial reason and will be left as is.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject property zoned Residential-II (R-II) and is developed with a single-family residence constructed in 1940. The zoning appears to be original to the property. The property is a lot of record, being recorded in Plat Book 5, page 89.

The property is bounded to the south by a 1.62 acre undeveloped parcel in the City of

Gainesville, zoned General Business (G-B). To the north and east are properties zoned R-II that are similar shapes and sizes to the subject parcel. Across Atlanta Highway to the west are commercial properties within unincorporated Hall County.

The subject parcel also falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD). The GCOD is supplemental to the underlying zoning district classifications and governs nonresidential property development standards, including signage.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The subject property is located within a Revitalization Corridor land use designation, according to the Future Land Use map. The primary future land uses within this type of corridor are for retail, office, higher density residential (including multi-family), civic uses, and open /park spaces.

This request is consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 31, 2022, Emily McGahee, with Hall County Environmental Health stated that the proposed development "No public restroom to be permitted. No additional structures or driveway expansions to be permitted. Do not drive, park, or store equipment on top of any part of septic system."

Hall County Fire Services

No comments were provided as part of this request.

Hall County GIS shows the subject parcel is located approximately 2.5 miles from Hall County Fire Station #5, located at 4187 Falcon Parkway. There are fire hydrants at the two adjacent parcels along Hog Mountain Road.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated June 2, 2022, Srikanth Yamala, Director of Hall County Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

Engineering:

Need updated survey showing existing conditions.

The site may require a stormwater management report, should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

Traffic:

GDOT Coordination required. Driveway modifications may be necessary. No parking permitted on the right-of-way.

Utilities:

No comments.

Hall County Tax Assessors

No comments were provided for this request.

Gainesville Water Resources

The Hall County GIS map shows that public water is available to the subject property along Atlanta Highway.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated June 1, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Engineer for the Georgia Department of Transportation, commented "GDOT Coordination required."

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed use request is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, as it meets the intention of the "Revitalization Corridor" land use designation.
- The applicant is proposing to operate a tire sale and replacement business by utilizing the
 existing driveway for work area and a 16 foot by 20 foot carport for equipment and material
 storage. The existing residence will remain and not be used for commercial purposes.
 - Per §17.150.010, permitted uses within the Highway Business zoning district, a single family residence is not a permitted use.
 - Per §17.150.030, a caretaker or employee residence is a use subject to the approval of the Planning Commission.
 - If the applicant wishes for the residence to remain, an application for a caretakers residence shall be submitted and approved by the Planning Commission.
- Per §17.250.020, of the Official Code of Hall County, no parking area shall be used for the sale, repair, dismantling or servicing of any vehicles, equipment, materials or supplies.
 - The applicant is proposing to use the existing driveway for both customer parking and the tire replacement. This does not meet the standard.
- The subject property falls within the Gateway Corridor Overlay District (GCOD) (§17.420) and is subject to design standard for non-residential development including: architectural, buffering, landscaping and signage requirements.
- The GCOD provides guidelines for non-residential property development. The guidelines apply to both permitted uses and development standards. Within the GCOD, the following uses are prohibited: adult entertainment, junk yards, and billboard signs. Uses subject to the approval of the Hall County Board of commissioners (BOC) include self-storage warehouses, vehicle sales lots (new or used), automobile repair and maintenance, commercial outdoor recreation, car washes and outdoor storage.
 - The proposed business is only for the sale and replacement of tires. There is no vehicle maintenance or repair proposed.

- Per 17.420.050.2.b. of the Official Code of Hall County, where a commercial zoning district abuts property zoned for residential or agricultural use, the minimum width shall be 25 feet. The adjacent properties to the north and east are zoned RII, therefore there shall be a 25-foot landscape buffer along this boundary.
 - o The site plan does not depict any buffers. This does not meet the standard.
 - The property is 50 feet in width and the application of the 25 foot buffer along the northern property line cannot be accommodated as the site is currently developed.
- Per §17.420.050.D.2.a, a ten-foot wide landscape strip is required along each street frontage, continuous along the frontage except for perpendicular crossings for driveways and utilities.

 This is not depicted on the applicant's submitted site plan; this does not meet the standard.
- Per §17.420.050.D.3, in addition to general perimeter landscaping and required buffers, if
 a loading or service area is located within 50 feet of a side or rear lot line abutting property
 that is residentially zoned or used for residential purposes, or public or institutional use,
 then the loading or service areas shall be surrounded by either a six feet high masonry
 screening wall, or a six feet high solid wooden fence, placed on the inside of the
 landscaped buffer required in section 17.420.050.C.
 - This is not depicted on the applicant's submitted site plan; this does not meet the standard.
- Per §17.420.050.E.2, all parking areas shall be paved with asphalt or concrete (or other pervious materials approved by the director).
 - The applicant intends to use the existing driveway, which is paved. This meets the standard.
- The applicant will need to work with Hall County Public Works and Utilities to ensure the site meets the stormwater management requirements of the Official Code of Hall County.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends **denial** of the applicant's request for the following reasons:

- 1. Development of the site for commercial purposes will require multiple variance from the Official Code of Hall County in relation to buffers and outdoor storage requirements.
- 2. Per §17.250.020, of the Official Code of Hall County, no parking area shall be used for the sale, repair, dismantling or servicing of any vehicles, equipment, materials or supplies. The applicant proposes to change the tires in the existing driveway in conflict with the ordinance.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to rezone a $1.29 \pm acretary$ acretary from Agricultural Residential-III (AR-III) to Planned Commercial Development (PCD) for the expansion of previously approved self-storage facility on adjacent parcels to the south. The narrative describes the proposed development consisting of four two-story buildings with a security fence and code-operated gate. On August 26 2021, the Board of Commissioners approved, with conditions, a request to rezone to PCD on 6.41 acres adjacent to the subject parcel for a self-storage warehouse development. The addition would ultimately combine the three parcels for the completion of the self-storage facility.

The newly acquired tract is to be dedicated to covered boat and RV storage and would increase the total square footage by 4,000 to 22,000 square feet. The original tracts are to be dedicated to 96,000 square feet of climate controlled dry storage, as originally proposed. This additional tract acquisition and rezoning will allow separate entrances to the RV/boat storage and dry storage facilities.

The applicant's narrative states that, if approved, they will abide by the conditions of the 2021 rezoning on the 1.29 acres subject of this request.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject property in discussion is parcel 08116 000003. It is zoned Agricultural Residential-III (AR-III) and is developed with a single-family residence constructed in 1950. The zoning appears to be original to the property. The property is located between Hog Mountain Road and Interstate 985.

The property is bounded by the City of Flowery Branch to the northeast and south across Hog Mountain Road. The property to the northeast is currently zoned Manufacturing & Industrial, Light (M-I), and according to Hall County Tax records it is a vacant lot owned by LDM Central USA Evangelical Ministries.

The properties to the south of the subject parcel were rezoned to PCD on August 26, 2021 and are intended to be developed as part of this rezoning request. The following conditions were the conditions of approval:

- The development shall conform substantially with the proposed site plan and narrative, modified as necessary for compliance with current development standards at time of site plan approval.
- Development shall conform to the standards set forth by the Gateway Corridors
 Overlay District. No variances are granted as part of this application except where the
 property abuts Interstate 985, the applicant may be exempt from architectural
 requirements as long as it is not visible.
- 3. Access to the development shall be approved by Hall County Traffic and/or the Georgia Department of Transportation, whichever applies.
- 4. The self-storage units shall be limited to a total of 96,000 square feet, and a maximum of 18,000 square feet shall be dedicated to outdoor boat and RV storage.
- 5. Building height shall be limited to 2-stories.
- 6. One building to be used as an office/caretaker's residence is permitted and shall be no smaller than 2,000 heated square feet.
- 7. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plat created for the property.
- 8. All building materials and colors shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to the issuance of any building permits.

The subject parcel also falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD). The GCOD is supplemental to the underlying zoning district classifications and governs nonresidential property development standards, including signage.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The subject property is located within a Revitalization Corridor land use designation, according to the Future Land Use map. The primary future land uses within this type of corridor are for retail, office, higher density residential (including multi-family), civic uses, and open /park spaces.

This request is consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 31, 2022, Emily McGahee, with Hall County Environmental Health stated that the proposed development "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. It appears that the proposed covered boat and RV storage facilities are on top of or do not meet required setbacks to the proposed septic system in HDV2021-00068. Any abandoned well shall be properly closed as per Water Well Standards Act. Any abandoned septic tank shall be pumped by a State certified pumper/hauler and crushed/filled. A combination plat was submitted for county review on

May 19; however, comments have not been provided to the applicant as of this date."

Hall County Fire Services

No comments were provided as part of this request.

Hall County GIS shows the subject parcel is located approximately 2.5 miles from Hall County Fire Station #5, located at 4187 Falcon Parkway. There are fire hydrants at the two adjacent parcels along Hog Mountain Road.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated June 2, 2022, Srikanth Yamala, Director of Hall County Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

Engineering:

The site may require a stormwater management report, should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

Traffic:

No comment.

Utilities:

City of Flowery Branch Sewer.

Hall County Tax Assessors

No comments were provided for this request.

Gainesville Water Resources

The Hall County GIS map shows that public water is available to the subject property along Hog Mountain Road.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated June 1, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Engineer for the Georgia Department of Transportation, commented that this project "GDOT Coordination required if encroaching on GDOT R/W along Lanier Parkway."

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed use request is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, as it meets the intention of the "Revitalization Corridor" land use designation.
- The applicant is proposing the newly acquired tract to be dedicated to the RV and boat storage portion of the program, while the previously acquired tracts are to be dedicated to climate-controlled storage and an office/caretaker residence.

- The original square feet dedicated to RV and boat storage is 18,000 square feet. With the acquisition of the new tract, this will increase by 4,000, to 22,000 square feet.
- The adjacent 6.41 acres will be used for 96,000 square feet of climate controlled dry storage.
- The subject property falls within the Gateway Corridor Overlay District (GCOD) and is subject to design standard for non-residential development including: architectural, buffering, landscaping and signage requirements.
- The GCOD provides guidelines for non-residential property development. The guidelines apply to both permitted uses and development standards. Within the GCOD, the following uses are prohibited: adult entertainment, junk yards, and billboard signs. Uses subject to the approval of the Hall County Board of commissioners (BOC) include self-storage warehouses, vehicle sales lots (new or used), automobile repair and maintenance, commercial outdoor recreation, car washes and outdoor storage.
 - By proposing a PCD, the applicant is addressing the conditional use of selfstorage warehouses and outdoor storage.
- Within the GCOD, the use of a common palette of building materials should be maintained
 for all four sides of principle buildings to create a consistent and traditional architectural
 identity. For large commercial/retail buildings, variations in building materials, texture, and
 depth should be employed to provide design variation. Building materials used for all four
 sides should consist of natural masonry materials.
 - The applicant has not provided examples of proposed building materials. The applicant's narrative states they will abide by the conditions approved in the 2021 rezoning.
 - Condition 2 reads as follows: Development shall conform to the standards set forth by the Gateway Corridors Overlay District. No variances are granted as part of this application except where the property abuts Interstate 985, the applicant may be exempt from architectural requirements as long as it is not visible.
- Per 17.420.050.2.b. of the Official Code of Hall County, where a commercial zoning district abuts property zoned for residential or agricultural use, the minimum width shall be 25 feet. The adjacent property to the west is zoned AR-III, therefore there shall be a 25-foot landscape buffer along this boundary.
 - The site plan shows this standard being met.
- Per 17.420.050.E.3 of the Official Code of Hall County, all parking areas shall be paved with asphalt, or concrete.

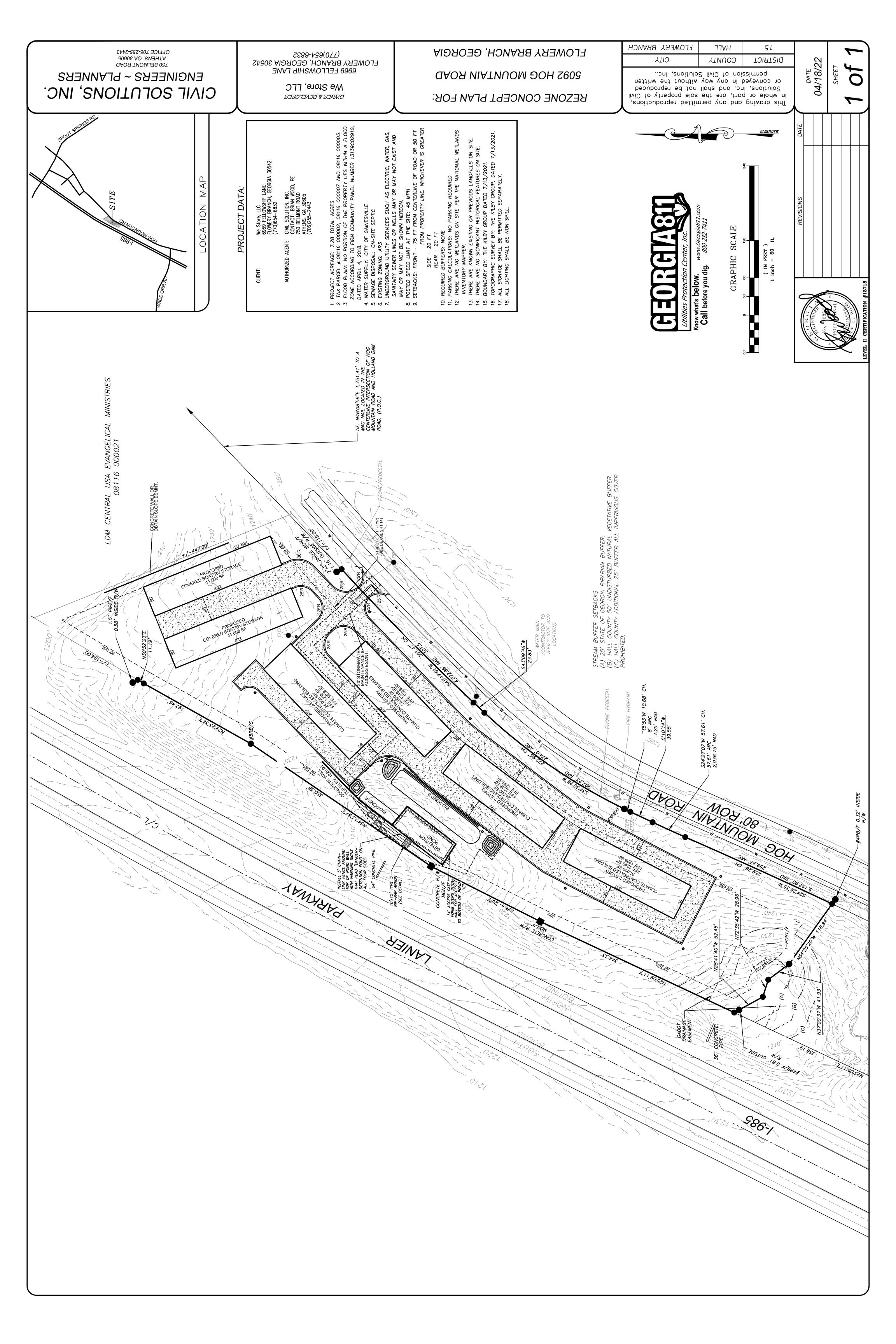
Narrative for 5086 Hog Mountain Rd, Flowery Branch, GA

WeStore, LLC, a Georgia company owned by C. Sam McGee and Trey Davis recently purchased (April 18, 2022) tract 5086 Hog Mountain Road, Flowery Branch, Ga. Tract 5086 is a 1.29 acre parcel located between I-985 and Hog Mountain Road in Flowery Branch. We are requesting 5086 Hog Mountain Road to be rezoned to PCD from AR-III to match the zoning with our adjoining property of 6.41 acres, 5092 and 5118 Hog Mountain Road, that was approved for rezoning to PCD by the Hall County Commission on August 26, 2021 as a proposed use of self-storage warehouse.

The approved plans for the self-storage warehouse business to be located at 5092 and 5118 Hog Mountain Road consists of 18,000 square feet of covered RV and Boat storage and 96,000 square feet of climate-controlled and dry storage and a 2,000 square foot office/caretaker residence for a total square footage of 116,000 square foot. With the purchase of 5086 Hog Mountain Road and upon approval of rezoning, we would then combine 5086, 5092 and 5118 for completion of the self-storage business. We would use the newly acquired tract, 5086, for the RV and Boat storage portion of the project and would increase the square footage by 4,000 feet to 22,000 square feet. The existing tracts, 5092 and 5118, would be used for the 96,000 square feet of climate-controlled and dry storage as originally proposed. This would allow us to have separate entrances for the RV and Boat storage and the climate-controlled and dry storage.

We will abide by all of the conditions on this tract 5086 Hog Mountain Road (1.29 acre) that are required by the conditions of the rezoning of 5092 and 5118 Hog Mountain Road.

We believe that rezoning this property to Planned Development from AR-III is the best use of the property and the traffic noise from I-985 and Hog Mountain is not conducive to residential use.

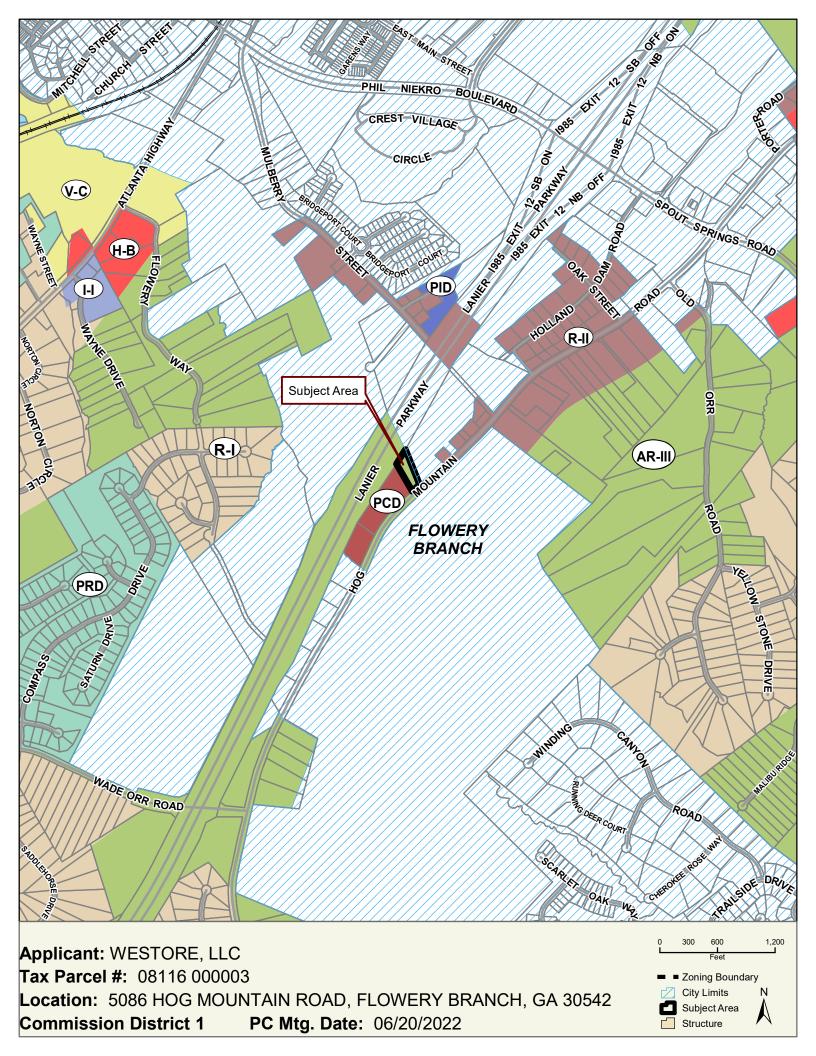

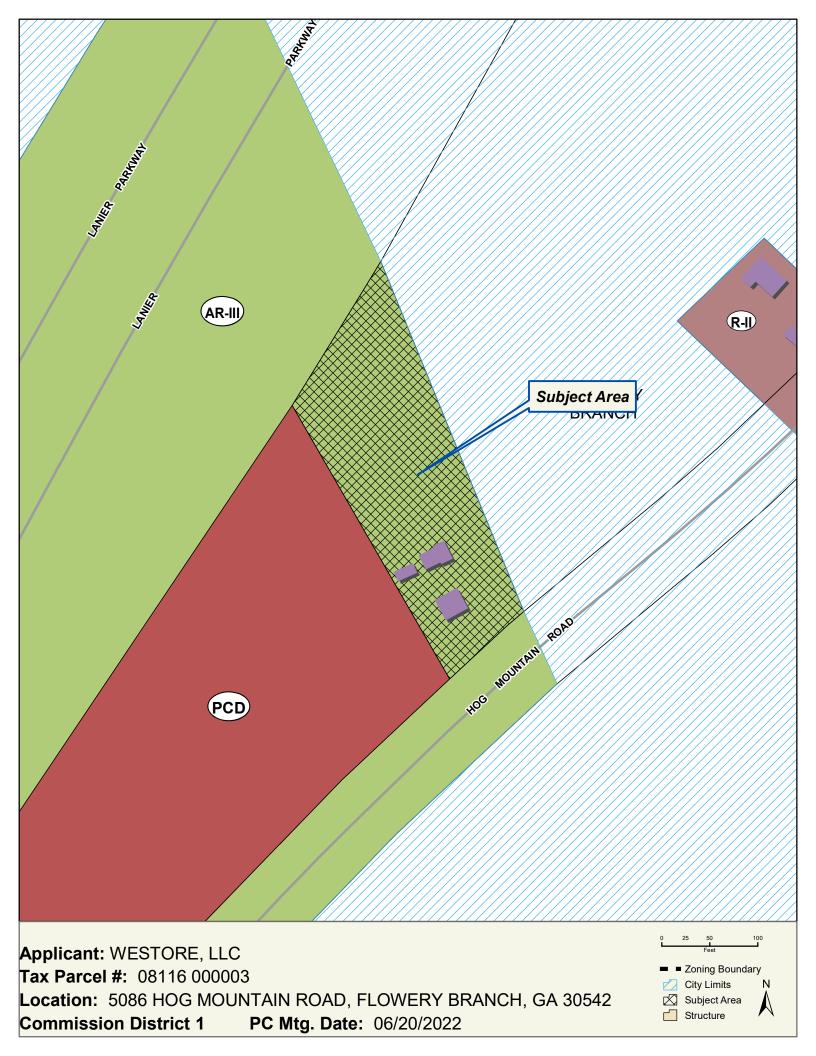

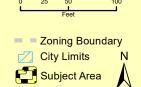

Item 1, 3053, 3087 McEver Road, Botrus: No parking of stock, employee, or customer vehicles on top of or within 5' of drainline or 10' from septic tank. Environmental Health will not approve any additional paved/gravel parking on parcel.

Item 2, 5340, 5342 Waterwood Drive, Gonzalez: Must meet all Environmental Health residential septic system permitting requirements. Septic system issued to property (OSC 5804) has expired. A new septic permit must be issued prior to application for building permit.

Item 3, 4164 Pine Vale, Davis: The detached carport was approved by Environmental Health on 4.27.22.

Item 4, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements.

Item 5, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: No comment. Proposed structures will have no plumbing per applicant.

Item 6, 3385 North Waterworks Road, Ley: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements. Environmental Health has preliminarily reviewed the submitted plat during Plat Review process and can stamp the plat for recordation with the Clerk of Courts.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to rezone 9.65± acres from Residential I (R-I) to Planned Residential Development (PRD) in order to develop a 44 unit single-family townhome development. The submitted site plan shows 7 buildings each containing either 5, 6, 7, or 8 units. The gross density of the project is 4.6 units/acre. The submitted narrative and site plan assign a total of 2.86 acres or 30% of the overall site as open space.

The property is located at the end of Meadow Lane, an existing local road. The site plans shows two buildings, containing a total of 11 units along the existing cul-de-sac. A proposed road connects to the cul-de-sac and extends north into the property, before curving to the east and ending in a second cul-de-sac. There are an additional 5 buildings along this road, containing the remaining 33 units, and three areas of on-street guest parking spaces. There is a 50 foot buffer identified around the exterior of the property. Portions of the lots and driveways are located within this buffer, but none of the residences encroach.

There is a creek on the western portion of the property, across which the applicant's site plan depicts a walking path and amenity area for the development. The amenity site includes a pocket park, playground, a half basketball court, and an area for a gazebo and picnic tables.

The applicant's narrative states that the intent of the development is to create more housing and amenities for people moving to the Gainesville area. The narrative continues that the proposed

development will meet the setback requirements as shown in the Hall County Planned Residential Development Code. Water and sewer access will be provided by the City of Gainesville and trash pick-up will be provided by Red Oaks Sanitation.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject property is approximately 9.65± acres of undeveloped and vacant property. No development plans have been submitted for this tract, according to zoning records, and the current zoning designation appears to be original to the tract.

The surrounding parcels are developed with single-family residential uses. The property is bordered to the north by Country Club Gardens subdivision and Hardy Hills Subdivision is to the south. Both subdivisions were developed and recorded as subdivisions with the Hall County Clerk of Court in the 1960's.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The Hall County Comprehensive Plan identifies the subject property and surrounding area as "Lake Area Residential". This land use category includes low-density residential development and neighborhoods. Land use patterns are similar to Residential Areas, and there is orientation toward Lake Lanier in terms of development and flexibility in use of single-family homes. The area includes the 500-feet buffer around the lake, wherein properties have the potential to be zoned Vacation Cottage District in order for single-family homes to be used as short-term vacation rentals. Future development will continue to be detached, single family homes at low densities in addition to less intensive agricultural uses that are found in the northwestern part of the area.

The Lake Area Residential category recommends 1 unit per acre. The proposed development standards would allow an alternative housing option to the conventional single-family construction in a rapidly growing area of Hall County. However, the proposed gross density of over four units/acre is would be inconsistent with the vision the Comprehensive Plan describes.

The proposed use is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 31, 2022 Emily McGahee stated, "No comment. Public sewer"

Hall County Fire Services

No comments were provided in relation to this request.

Per Hall County GIS, the subject parcel is located approximately 2.6 miles from Hall County Fire Station 16, located at 4209 Shirley Road. There is a fire hydrants located in front 3584 Meadow Lane.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

Gainesville Water Resources

The applicant has submitted a capacity assurance statement from the City of Gainesville Water Resources Department that speaks to both water and sewerage capacity.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated June 1, 2021 Parker Niebauer confirmed that this project will not require GDOT coordination

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed development is not consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Plan.
 The proposed development standards provide alternative housing options located in a growing region but at a greater residential density than the one unit per acre as described in the Plan.
 - The development proposes 44 multifamily townhomes on 9.65 acres for a gross density of 4.6x units per acre.
 - There is a discrepancy in the proposed number of units. When calculating the total number of units based on building type it appears there are 46 proposed units as opposed to 44 (the 7 unit building was calculated at 5 units, see note table on site plan).
- A PRD allows for more flexibility in the design and development of the property. This
 provides for a mixture of housing types and encourages maximum use of natural features,
 through proper site planning measures. The development should conform to the existing
 character and development pattern of the surrounding area.
- §17.180.060.B.4. *Dimensional standards for multi-family residences:* The development controls for the development shall be detailed (lot coverage, setbacks, building heights, lot

area, etc.). Minimum standards for multi-family residences in a planned residential development are as follows:

- a. Lot area: The minimum lot area for lots without access to sanitary sewer shall be determined by the requirements of the county environmental health department.
 The following lot area standards apply to lots served by sanitary sewer:
 - For a two-story or greater multi-family residence with the minimum three dwelling units, the minimum lot area standard of 40,000 square feet will apply.
 - For each additional unit in a two-story or greater multi-family residence over three dwelling units, the minimum additional lot area standard of 4,000 square feet will apply.
- The proposed development meets this standard according to the following standard.

- §17.180.060.B.5 *Buffers:* A minimum 50 foot planted buffer shall be established along the perimeter of all property boundaries adjacent to residential and/or non-residential zoning districts to ensure that the planned residential development is appropriately screened.
 - The proposed development meets this standard according to the submitted site plan and description in the submitted narrative.
- §17.180.060.B.6 Landscape requirements requires that all requirements of §17.280, Tree Protection, shall be met, and in addition, a minimum of 2 trees per lot shall be provided or preserved in the front, side, or rear yard. Trees that are provided or preserved to meet the two trees per lot may not be counted toward the overall development's tree density unit requirements.
 - The applicants narrative and site plan do not include information regarding landscape plans for the development.
- §17.180.060.B.7.b requires that all PRDs construct sidewalks on both sides of the streets that are a minimum of five feet wide.
 - The applicant's site plan includes sidewalks through the majority of the development. It appears where they are not included on the site plan that it is due to a stream buffer requirement. The proposed development meets this standard.
- §17.180.060.B.8 requires that there shall be a minimum of at least thirty percent (30%) of the gross tract area provided in open space.
 - The applicant has proposed to retain 2.86 acres / 30% of the property for open space. The proposed development meets this standard.
- §17.180.060.B.9 provides architectural standards for all planned residential developments. Alternatively, detailed architectural design guidelines and standards can

be submitted by the applicant to include garage types and placement, elevations of all sides, building materials, etc.

- All facades of all residences, including single-family, two-family, and/or multi-family, and any non-residential buildings shall be finished with brick, stone, stucco, wood siding, wood shakes, or fiber cement type siding. The front facades shall incorporate changes in building material, texture, and/or color. Vinyl siding on all residential and non-residential buildings shall be prohibited.
 - No architectural renderings were submitted with the application no were descriptions provided in the project narrative. It cannot be determined if the standard is met.
- Garage placement: Townhouses fronting a minor street may be front or rear loaded.
 - No architectural renderings were submitted with the application no were descriptions provided in the project narrative. It cannot be determined if the standard is met.
- §17.180.060.B.11 relates to the United States Postal Service (USPS) policy that all new subdivisions and new phases of existing subdivisions are required to provide Cluster mailbox
 - unit (CBU) for regular mail service delivery. A CBU is a structure or shelter housing multiple mailbox units to serve each residential dwelling of the development for the express purpose of regular mail delivery provided by the USPS.
 - The proposed development **meets** this standard.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends **denial** of the application for the following reasons:

- 1. The proposed zoning to PRD does not comply with the Comprehensive Plan designation of Lake Area Residential that recommends 1 unit per acre.
- 2. The proposed townhome development is not in character with the established single-family detached neighborhood that surrounds the property.
- 3. The street access to the proposed development is through an established single-family neighborhood without direct access to an arterial or collector road to support the increased density and traffic. Meadow Lane (Plat Book 31, Page 4) does not meet current county standards as the pavement width varies between 16' and 18' with a 40-foot right of way.

If the Board chooses to approve the application for PRD, staff recommends the following conditions:

- The development shall generally occur as described in the site plan project narrative, modified for compliance with zoning conditions, Hall County regulations, and any other regulatory agencies at time of development.
- 2. The development shall not exceed 7 buildings with a maximum of 44 attached single family dwelling units. The overall site density shall not exceed 4.6 dwelling units per acre.
- 3. No building shall exceed 8 attached single family units as depicted on the concept plan received 5-25-22 by Day Design Group.
- 4. The following standards shall apply to the development:
 - a. Setbacks:

- 1. Front 20 feet from ROW, with the garage door located a minimum of 20 ft.
 - from the edge of the sidewalk nearest the dwelling.
- 2. Side -10 feet to external property line/ 20 feet from adjacent building
- 3. Rear 20 feet from adjacent property
- b. Minimum heated floor area 1,450 sq. ft.
- c. A minimum of 2 off-street parking spaces will be provided per dwelling unit
- d. There shall be a minimum of 18 guest parking spaces, spaced evenly through the buildings, as shown on the concept plan received 5-25-22 by Day Design Group.
- e. With the exception of required stormwater or utility improvements and the amenity area, existing trees and a vegetative buffer will remain undisturbed.
- f. All facades shall be finished with a combination of brick, stone, stucco, or fiber cement type siding. Front facades shall incorporate changes in these materials to alter color or texture. Vinyl siding shall be prohibited
- g. Materials and colors for exterior finishes shall be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director or their designee prior to construction.
- h. Each townhome shall have a single-car garage with a door that is no wider than 50% of the front façade of the individual unit.
- i. The development shall meet or exceed the required 30% Open Space for a PRD. The open space location shall be identified on the Preliminary and Final Plats.
- j. The area of the stormwater detention area shall not count in the calculation of the minimum required open space in accordance with §17.430.100 through §17.430.150.
- k. The proposed stormwater detention area shall be on a separate lot with a minimum of 20' wide access to the proposed public road.
- I. The proposed streets shall be designed to Hall County Public Works standards for a proposed future public right of way dedication.

Excerpts from the minutes of the June 20, 2022 meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Randi Doveton, Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Tyrus Brown, 3478 Lakeside Drive, Atlanta, presented the request.

Jesse Fink, 210 James Avenue, Temple, presented the request. The applicant stated that they want to develop affordable homes on the property. The applicant stated that there is a road with no easement to connect to the proposed road. The applicant stated that the abandoned lot is heavily unkept and home to illegal dumping. The applicant stated that there will be a wooden bridge to cross the stream leading to a community amenity.

Joshua Greene, 3203 Long Iron Drive, Lawrenceville, presented the request. The applicant stated that he wanted to address some of the public comments regarding the density for the property. The applicant stated that they want to provide affordable housing as the county is

growing and this is a in a desirable area. The applicant stated that the vegetation will still be able to provide privacy.

Rebuttal

Mr. Brown stated that the amenities would be for the people living in the community. Mr. Greene stated that the HOA will be able to contain a lot of the noise and maintain safety. Mr. Greene stated that they can cut back on number of units and make adjustments to the cul-de-sac. Mr. Greene stated that they understand that the proposed development is different from what is already existing but change is coming to Gainesville. Mr. Green stated that they want to keep the aesthetic as is and not take away from it.

Public Forum:

Jacky Cloyes, 3673 Green Crest Road, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were basketball court, water runoff, sewer, crime, traffic and overflow of people.

Vickie Sanders, 3590 Meadow Lane, spoke in opposition. Concerns were the narrow road, traffic, density, lights, and buffers.

Pam Helton, 3670 Collins Drive, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were home styles, safety, street lights, and number of townhomes per acreage.

Edna Rogers, 3655 Green Crest Road, **Gainesville**, spoke in opposition. Concerns were home styles, environmental disturbance, amenities, and narrow road.

Adam Allison, 3659 Green Crest Road, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were open space, unit size, density, and not matching the County's comprehension plan.

Dale Cowart, 3584 Meadow Lane, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were traffic, noise, and safety.

Chris Spruce, Meadow Lane, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were overflow, traffic, narrow road, and safety.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Hunt questioned if the homes would be for sale or for rent. Mr. Greene stated that they will be for sale and there will be a Home Owners Association in place. Mr. Hunt questioned how they plan to gate the community at the cull de sac. Mr. Fink stated that they have a concept plan that can accommodate. Mr. Braswell questioned the number of bedroom and bathrooms. Mr. Greene stated that all the units will be three bedrooms, two baths, with a one car garage. Ms. Pilcher questioned the width of the garage door. The applicant stated they would be 9 inches wide. Mr. Hunt stated that the cul-de-sac at the end of the development was not compliant with buffers. Ms. Pilcher questioned the price point of the proposed townhomes. Mr. Greene stated they would range from \$250k to \$300k. Mr. Bell stated that this application is a perfect example of spot zoning.

Mr. Braswell stated that the width of Meadow Lane was a cause for concern with the proposed development when it comes to safety.

Item 1, 3053, 3087 McEver Road, Botrus: No parking of stock, employee, or customer vehicles on top of or within 5' of drainline or 10' from septic tank. Environmental Health will not approve any additional paved/gravel parking on parcel.

Item 2, 5340, 5342 Waterwood Drive, Gonzalez: Must meet all Environmental Health residential septic system permitting requirements. Septic system issued to property (OSC 5804) has expired. A new septic permit must be issued prior to application for building permit.

Item 3, 4164 Pine Vale, Davis: The detached carport was approved by Environmental Health on 4.27.22.

Item 4, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements.

Item 5, 4151 Nopone Road, Alpaca Self Store: No comment. Proposed structures will have no plumbing per applicant.

Item 6, 3385 North Waterworks Road, Ley: All proposed lots must meet Hall County Board of Health Lot Size Resolution requirements. Environmental Health has preliminarily reviewed the submitted plat during Plat Review process and can stamp the plat for recordation with the Clerk of Courts.

I am writing to strongly urge the Hall County Planning Commission to follow the recommendation of its professional and expert staff and completely deny the rezoning request from Tyrus Brown to rezone 9.65 acres in District 2 from R1 to PRD for purposes of building a 44-unit townhome development.

My husband and I have owned and lived in our home on Greencrest Road for 21 years. Our property is adjacent to the proposed development site - specifically the western area of the property that contains a creek and is proposed for "amenities." The quiet, wooded area that is home to many varieties of wildlife is what drew us to this neighborhood.

While I will lay out several reasons why this zoning request should be denied, one of the main reasons for denial is that, as the staff report states: "The proposed development is not consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Plan." The site is in an area identified as "Lake Area Residential," which calls for low-density residential development and is surrounded by detached, single-family homes. The proposed development by Mr. Brown would call for four times the density recommended in the Lake Area Residential category, which calls for 1 unit per acre; your own staff in their report say it "would be inconsistent with the vision the Comprehensive Plan describes." Further, because a significant portion of the site cannot be developed due to the presence of a creek, all of the proposed units would be forced into one side of the property that constitutes some 70% of the acreage. The staff report notes "(T)he development should conform to the existing character and development pattern of the surrounding area." It clearly does not.

Additional reasons for denial of this request include:

I have serious concerns about the traffic impact that adding this many residents would have on the roads in the area. At present, there is not sufficient access to a road that would be able to handle this amount of traffic. As your staff's report states: "Meadow Lane ... does not meet current county standards..." It is my concern that the impending Sardis Road Connector project, due to the location of the proposed development, will magnify this deficiency rather than provide additional road support. This proposed development site is located less than a mile from the Connector's intersection with Thompson Bridge Road. The Connector will result in major changes to the roads and neighborhoods immediately surrounding this proposed development site, including ending Ledan Road in a cul de sac not too far from the current Meadow/Ledan intersection. Ledan is one of three roads in the immediate area that will be turned into cul de sacs.

Another concern is the plans to create amenities on the western side of the property, as this would be adjacent to my property and very close to an existing stream. For the half basketball court, I'm concerned about lights being on all night and causing light pollution. There also have been indications of a park or trail. In this case, will there be any fencing and vegetative buffers that indicate where the development property ends? I enjoy spending time in the wooded area of my own lot to observe birds and wildlife like deer who are common in the area. I do not want to encounter someone who has wandered onto my property. After reading the staff report, I'm concerned about the number of inconsistencies or missing information in the proposal. I also would like to point out that two depictions that show the number of houses around the site are misleading as my house and my neighbors' homes are cut off of the images. There were no plans or details included about the landscaping plans nor were there any architectural renderings. What type of building materials will be used in these units? From the included photo illustrations, it is hard to tell if it is one of the accepted materials. How many trees will be preserved on the property? Will there be any walls or vegetative buffers? I also would request that the Planning Commission ask Mr. Brown and/or the developer for examples of similar projects they have completed elsewhere. Or is this the first?

The application from Mr. Brown includes a letter from the City of Gainesville that confirms water and sewer capacity. However, it additionally states that: "Properties desiring to connect to Gainesville public sanitary sewer must be within the City limits." The owner of the property must sign an agreement to be annexed into the city (when the property becomes contiguous, which is is not currently) in order to get sewer service? This is a cause for concern because I do not want to become part of the City of Gainesville and this would bring it to my backdoor – literally.

I have heard from many people living near this proposed development, and we are agreed that it does not fit with the character of the area. Nor does it fit the Comprehensive Plan, Hall County crafted for a reason. There are other locations in Hall County – and Gainesville, for that matter – that would be a better fit for a multi-family development like this one. This area already is being significantly impacted by the impending Sardis Connector project, please do not approve a development that will cause even more disruption in this single-family residential area.

Also, I urge you to think about the precedent you would set by letting someone add an island of high-density development – one that is four times as dense as all of the surrounding area – to the region you call "Lake Area Residential."

Thank you for your time and thoughtful consideration of my comments.

At their June 20, 2022 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval (4-0) of this request with the following thirteen (13) conditions:

- 1. The development shall conform substantially with the proposed site plan and narrative.
- 2. All access off Nopone Road shall be approved and permitted by GDOT and Hall County Traffic Engineer, as required.
- 3. Any outdoor storage shall be screened in accordance with §17.260.020 of the Official Code of Hall County.
- 4. All conditions of zoning be made a part of any plat recorded for this property.
- 5. A security gate shall be installed at the entrance to the facility.
- 6. A 20' landscaped buffer shall be planted. Between the parking spaces and the buffer, shall be a 6' opaque fence along the eastern boundary.
- 7. The Nopone Road frontage strip shall be in accordance with Gateway Corridor Overlay District Standards and shall include masonry columns and decorative iron fence.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to rezone 5.61± acre tract currently zoned Agricultural Residential-IV (AR-IV) and Suburban Shopping (S-S) to Planned Commercial Development (PCD) for the purpose of developing a boat and RV storage facility. The applicant has an option to purchase the 5.61± acre tract, which will be subdivided from the property owner's existing 18.00± acre parcel, creating two parcels. There is a concurrent application for a road frontage variance from 150 feet to 50 feet for the remnant 12.39 acres parcel.

The applicant has submitted a conceptual site plan which shows five rows of covered boat storage stalls. Three of the rows are orientated north/south, while two are oriented east/west, towards Nopone Road. The narrative states that boat and RV spaces shall be gravel, with the internal driveway being asphalt. The access will be right in, right out, from Nopone Road. In total, there are 90 proposed storage spaces provided with the development. Customers will have access to the site 24/7, from Nopone Road, via cloud-based keypad system. No access is proposed from Cleveland Highway.

The site plan includes a monument sign, landscape buffers to protect surrounding properties, security lighting, and a 20-foot buffer adjacent to AR-IV zoned parcels. There is no proposed water or sewer service proposed, as there will be no restroom facilities provided.

The applicant's narrative has included specific sections from the Official Code of Hall County for certain site development standards:

- §17.180.080.B.7 PCD Design Standards o The developer intends to comply with Hall County Municipal Code Sec. 17.140, which states all design standards for a PCD that are not specifically stated must comply with the design standards of S-S.
- §17.260.020 Vegetation buffers and vision clearance o A fence will be installed around the perimeter of the site for security and visual screening
- §17.270. 070.C Sign Standards The developer intends to install one (1) monument sign.

History and Existing Land Uses

The property was previously considered for rezoning at the January 4, 2022 Planning Commission Meeting. Prior to the Board of Commissioners hearing, the application was <u>withdrawn</u> by the applicant.

At the January 4, 2022 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval, with conditions of this request.

Conditions:

- 1. The development shall conform substantially with the proposed site plan and narrative, modified as necessary for compliance with current development standards at time of application.
- 2. All access off Nopone Road shall be approved and permitted by GDOT and Hall County Traffic Engineer, as required.
- 3. Any outdoor storage shall be screened in accordance with §17.260.020 of the Official Code of Hall County.
- 4. All conditions of zoning be made a part of any plat recorded for this property.
- 5. A security gate shall be installed at the entrance to the facility.
- A 20' landscaped buffer shall be planted. Between the parking spaces and the buffer, shall be a 6' opaque fence along the eastern boundary.
 The Nopone Road frontage strip shall be in accordance with Gateway Corridor Overlay District Standards and shall include masonry columns and decorative iron fence.
- 8. Signage proposed shall be in accordance with Gateway Corridor Overlay District Standards.
- 9. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operations in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property: "Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."

There were zero (0) written comments in opposition submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting and no one spoke in opposition during the public hearing on January 4, 2022.

This property is zoned Agricultural Residential-IV and totals 18.00± acres in size and is developed with a barn, built in 1970. The site plan notes that barn will be removed if the rezoning request is approved.

Zoning surrounding the subject property is a mixture of AR-IV and S-S and is developed with agricultural, commercial, and residential uses. The subject parcel falls just outside the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD) and is not subject to the non-residential property development standards required by the GCOD.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The subject property is located within a "Mixed Use Corridor" and "Rural Residential" character area within the Future Development Guide of the Hall County Comprehensive Plan. It is also located at a "Community Crossroads" within the Future Development Guide.

The Rural Residential Area is characterized by low-density single-family residential uses with deep setbacks from the road. Future development should continue to reflect lower density detached single-family residential uses, and neighborhood design should incorporate a high percentage of open space (i.e. 'Conservation Subdivision' design).

Additionally, Mixed-Use Corridors generally consist of retail activities, office-based employment, civic uses, and single family residential developments. Low-impact industrial or higher density residential only where the same is found on adjacent properties.

The Community Crossroads are meant to maintain and create access to local goods and services at major intersections. They are characterized by clustered commercial development. In "Rural" development areas, the Community Crossroads should emphasize compact, small-scale development that supports the immediate surrounding area.

The applicant's request is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated May 31, 2022, Emily McGahee with Hall County Environmental Health stated "No comment. Proposed structures will have no plumbing per applicant."

Hall County Fire Services

In a memo dated June 1, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick provided the following comments:

- 1. Fire apparatus accessibility must meet IFC minimum standards.
- 2. Fire hydrant(s) may be required inside development.
- 3. Electronic controlled access gate(s) will require a Knox override switch for Fire Department access.

The subject parcel is located approximately 3 miles from Hall County Fire Station #15, located at 4219 Autry Spur. The nearest fire hydrant is located across the street at 4164 Nopone Road.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated June 2, 2022, Srikanth Yamala, Director of Hall County Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

Engineering

The site may require a stormwater management report, should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage. Recommend joint access driveway for both parcels. Also, check with GDOT as this appears to have GDOT right-of-way from 129 construction.

Traffic

Proposed driveway must meet Hall County commercial standards

Utilities

No sanitary sewer available for this site.

Hall County Tax Assessors

Tracy Gilreath, Specialized Assessment Manager with the Tax Assessors Office, has confirmed via email on June 3, 2022 that this property is currently under a conservation covenant, which the property owner renewed earlier this year.

Gainesville Water Resources

The Hall County GIS shows that public water is available to the subject property along Nopone Road from the City of Gainesville Water Resources Department.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated June 1, 2022, Parker Niebauer, DITO Traffic Operations Supervisor, stated: "GDOT Coordination required due to proximity to state route intersection"

Zoning Analysis

- The applicant is requesting to rezone the subject property to Planned Commercial District (PCD) to develop self-storage boat and RV facility.

 A self-storage facility such as boat and RV storage is an allowable use under the S-S Zoning District.
 - o There is a concurrent road frontage variance request before the Planning Commission as part of the proposed development of this parcel. Per §16.50.040.
 - Access, all new lots accessing a road designated as an arterial or collector shall have a minimum frontage of 150 feet.
 - The property only has approximately 220 total feet of road frontage along Nopone Road. The road frontage variance is to reduce the frontage requirement from 150 feet to 50 feet for the remaining 12.39 acres of the property.
 - Staff has recommended denial of the road frontage variance request.
- The proposed site could be reconfigured so that there is no longer a need for a road frontage variance. Per Hall County GIS, the property owner of the subject parcel also owns parcel 12026 000045, which has frontage on Cleveland Highway. The proposed storage facility could be reconfigured so that it takes up the entire frontage along Nopone Road, and the remaining acreage in the rear combine with parcel 12026 000045.

- The subject property falls within the Rural Residential character, is part of a Mixed-Use Corridor and the intersection of Nopone Road and Cleveland Highway is designated as a Community Crossroad on the future land use map.
 - The Rural Residential Areas are characterized by low-density single-family residential uses with deep setbacks from the road. Future development should continue to reflect lower density detached single-family residential uses, and neighborhood design should incorporate a high percentage of open space (i.e. 'Conservation Subdivision' design).
 - Additionally, Mixed-Use Corridors generally consist of retail activities, office-based employment, civic uses, and single family residential developments. Low-impact industrial or higher density residential only where the same is found on adjacent properties.
 - The Community Crossroads are meant to maintain and create access to local goods and services at major intersections. They are characterized by clustered commercial development. In "Rural" development areas, the Community Crossroads should emphasize compact, small-scale development that supports the immediate surrounding area.
 - The proposed use of a self-storage facility is consistent with this land use classification as there are adjacent commercially zoned properties at the intersection of Nopone Road and Cleveland Highway. Additionally, to the east of the proposed development is the North Hall Community Center, which would separate this use from other residential and agricultural uses.
 - The applicant's narrative has included specific sections from the Official Code of Hall County for certain site development standards:
 §17.180.080.B.7 – PCD Design Standards
 - The development controls for the district shall be stated (lot coverage, setbacks, building heights, lot sizes, etc.). If standards are not specifically proposed, then the applicable standards in the suburban shopping district (S-S) shall apply.
 - The applicant has not proposed standards which differ from the standards for the S-S district.
 - §17.260.020 Vegetation buffers and vision clearance
 - The applicant has proposed to install a fence will be around the perimeter of the site for security and visual screening.
 - The applicant has not indicated the material or height of the proposed fence. Per §17.260.020, where a retail use with outside activity abuts residential use, the minimum buffer shall be 20 feet.
 - A solid fence buffer may be substituted, with planning commission approval, for part or all of the vegetated buffer as follows:
 - A brick or stone wall with a minimum height of six feet may be placed on the property line in lieu of some or all of the buffer requirements.
 - 2. A solid wooden fence with a minimum height of six feet may be placed on the property line. The fence must have a

- natural finish. If stained or varnished, the resulting finish must be natural in appearance, and the finished side of the fence shall face the neighboring property.
- 3. The width of the buffer may be reduced and the planted screening may be reduced or eliminated if the planning commission finds that a wall or fence will provide a satisfactory overall screening of the property, considering use, topography and appearance, and that a wall or fence will not create a safety problem or impose an adverse visual barrier that could affect the use or value of the residential property.
- This standard is **not met**.
- o §17.270. 070.C Sign Standards
 - One ground mounted monument sign shall be permitted on each lot, except that in the case of a corner lot, the provisions of this section shall apply separately to each street frontage. However, no sign on a corner lot shall be closer than 50 feet from the lot corner, defined by the lot lines extended.
 - This **meets** the requirement.
 - The applicant's site plan and narrative do not discuss landscaping requirements for development of the property as outlined in §17.280.080, tree requirements for non-single family residential development.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends **denial** of the applicant's request to rezone the parcel for the following reasons:

- 1. The remaining 12.39 acre parcel is substandard to the Official Code of Hall County and requires a road frontage variance.
- 2. The submitted plan does not address all of the standards of the PCD district to determine compliance.

If the Commission chooses to grant the rezoning request, staff recommends the following conditions:

- 1. The PCD approval is contingent on the granting of a Lot Width Variance to achieve the proposed subdivision with a reduced lot width.
- 2. The subdivision shall follow the Minor Plat approval process.
- 3. The Minor Plat shall be recorded in the Hall County Clerk of Courts registry prior to the project being submitted to Development Review for the Land Disturbance Permit.
- 4. All Conservation Easements shall be removed from the proposed PCD area prior to submission of the Minor Plat for review. The Minor Plat shall give the deed reference to for the removal of the Conservation Easement.
- 5. The total acreage for the commercial portion (PCD) of the development shall be 5.61 acres.

- 6. The requirements of §17.260.020, Screening, Fencing, and Outdoor Storage Requirements, shall apply to the development.
- 7. The requirements of §17.280.080, Tree Protection, shall apply to the development.
- 8. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operations in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property:

"Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."

- As the property is located adjacent to a public park facility, the standards of CHAPTER 17.420. - GATEWAY CORRIDORS OVERLAY DISTRICT (GCOD) shall be applied to the property.
- 10. All access off Nopone Road shall be approved and permitted by GDOT and Hall County Traffic Engineer, as required.
- 11. Any outdoor storage shall be screened in accordance with §17.260.020 of the Official Code of Hall County.
- 12. All conditions of zoning be made a part of any plat recorded for this property.
- 13. A security gate shall be installed at the entrance to the facility.
- 14. All conditions of zoning be made a part of any plat recorded for this property with the approval placed letter on the face of the plat.

Excerpts from the minutes of the June 20, 2022 meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Randi Doveton, Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Howard Baker, 4030 Mount Vernon Road, Gainesville, presented the request. The applicant stated that the previous request on this property was for a chain link fence with dirt gravel parking lot, no lights, and no coverings. The applicant stated that the property will not be visible to the Hall County facility next door. The applicant stated that he would like for the fence to be on the property line to be able to maintain landscaping and have more shade for the RV's.

Jason Smith, 155 Clarksville Street, Cornelia, presented the request. The applicant stated that the property will have a security gate and there will not be any restroom facilities, therefore there will be no need of septic or sewer. The applicant stated that there would be asphalt throughout the property. The applicant stated that they will follow GDOT requirements for the entrance/exit.

Public Forum:

There were no comments in support or opposition.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell stated that there will be a need for a fire hydrant somewhere in the property even though there are no plans for septic. Mr. Baker stated that was fine. Mr. Braswell questioned if there would be any maintenance of vehicles on the property. Mr. Baker stated that would not be allowed on the property. Mr. Hunt requested the applicants address the finish material they intended to use at for the first building that is visible from Nopone Road. Mr. Baker stated he doesn't think it will be visible from the road. Mr. Braswell questioned if the applicant would object if there was a condition for brick stone on the building. Mr. Baker stated he did not have a problem with that because he wants to build a nice building for the community. Mr. Braswell requested that the applicants submit a clearer site plan for the Board of Commissioners.

I. Subject Property

The subject property is located at 4151 Nopone Road, Gainesville, GA, and comprises of PIN 12026 000004. The site is located within the jurisdictional limits of unincorporated Hall County. Please refer to Figure 1 for Vicinity Map.

The site is located near the northeast comer of the intersection of Nopone Road and Cleveland Highway (Hwy 129 / SRII). II. Current Status and Zoning

Existing Conditions and Access

The subject property is currently zoned AR-IV, Agricultural-Residential-IV district. Please refer for Figure 2 for existing zoning map.

III. Rezoning

Proposed Zoning

The developer proposes a rezoning of the property from the AR-IV district to the Planned Commercial Development (PCD) district. Per Hall County Municode Sec. 17.180.080, the purpose of the PCD district is to attain the maximum commercial usage of property while also providing protection of surrounding residential uses, safe access by motorists, minimal traffic congestion, and a development which is consistent with county long-range plans.

This request had been previously submitted under a different applicant, however was withdrawn due to loss of funding prior to reaching the County Commission meeting. This application is similar in nature, however a more detailed study has been conducted for the property and there is a new concept based on a more aesthetically pleasing layout with covered protected storage areas on an improved surface. This request for rezoning has been prompted by the proposed use intended for the subject property, as noted below.

Proposed Use

The developer intends to use the subject property for rental boat and/or recreational vehicle (RV) storage.

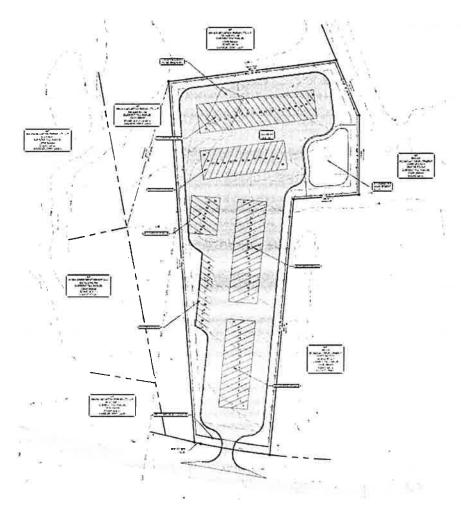


Figure 3 Conceptual Site Plan

All boat/RV storage spaces shall be gravel. All private roads shall be asphalt. There will be one right-in, right-out access point from Nopone Road. Please refer to Figure 3 for conceptual site plan.

Proposed Business Hours

The rental storage spaces shall be accessible 24-hours a day, 7-days a week via an electronic, controlled access gate. No staff shall be required onsite. All entry/exit from the gate is to be provided to rental spaces in a passive manner via a cloud-based, keypad system.

IV. <u>Proposed PCD Design Standards</u>

Proposed Design Standards

Per Hall County Municode Sec. 17.180.080.B.7, if development design standards for a PCD are not specifically stated, the development shall comply with the standards of S-S.

The developer intends for all design standards for the subject property to comply with Hall County Municode Sec. 17.140, which are consistent with the S-S district. Furthermore, the developer intends for the site to comply with Hall County Municode Sec. 17.260.020 regarding vegetation buffers and vision clearance to mitigate visual impact to surrounding properties. A fence is to be installed around the perimeter of the sight for security and visual screening.

Landscape buffers will be provided for protection of surrounding properties. Refer to Section V of this report below for further information.

Proposed Signs

The developer intends to install one (1) monument sign in conformance with Hall County Municode Sec. 17.270.070.C.

Proposed Lighting

Security lighting onsite is proposed to provide adequate security and safety to the property. A detailed foot-candle illumination and/or light pollution study will be conducted as part of the design process to ensure that light pollution does not affect surrounding residential properties in a negative manner. All site illumination is to be downward facing dark sky compliant lighting and lighting will comply with all applicable Hall County rules and regulations.

The developer does not intend to install any lighting within the public right-of-way.

Water/Sewer

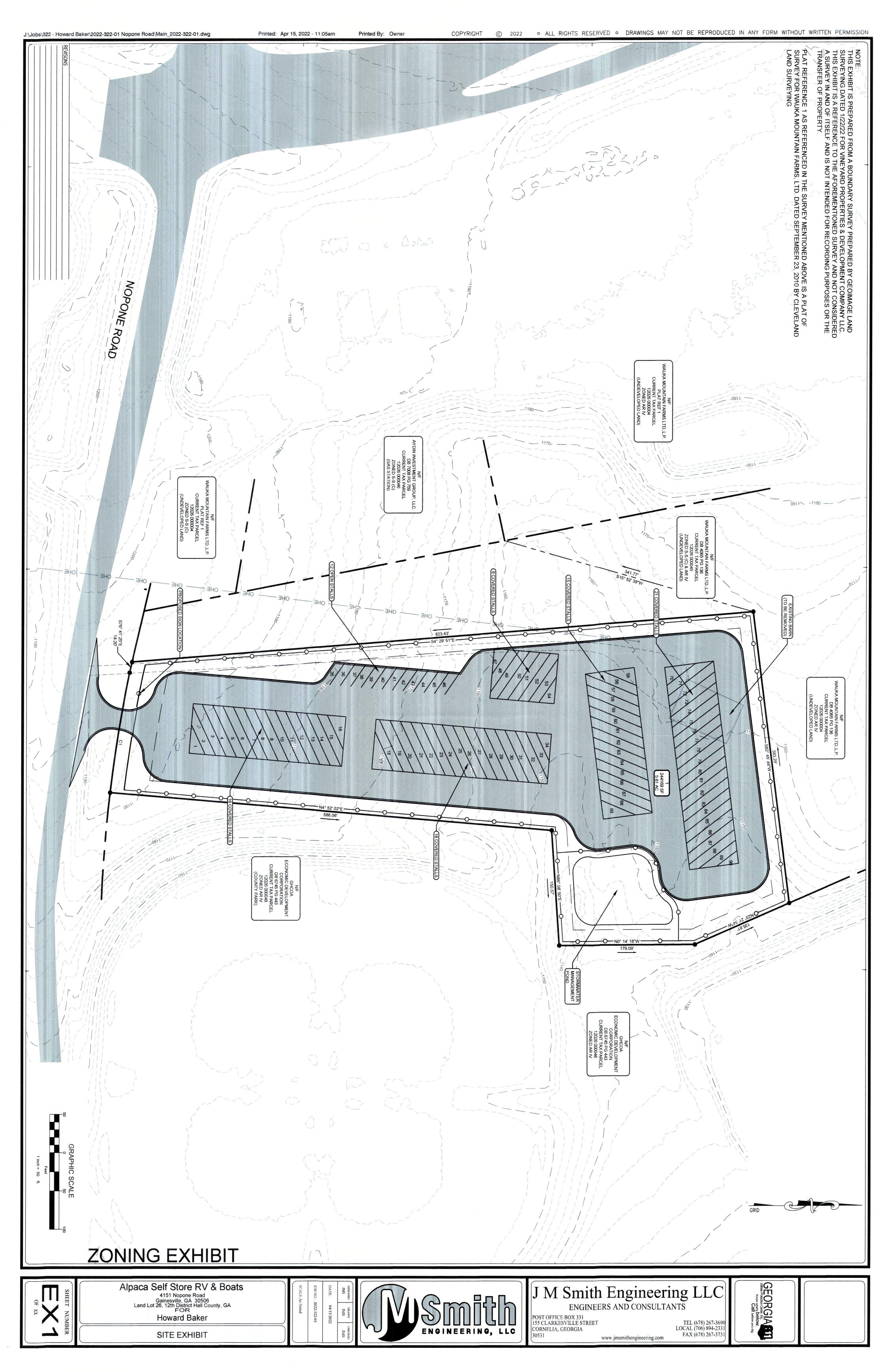
