On December 13, 2022, a Hall County grand jury fixed the bailiff compensation at \$100 per day for calendar year 2023, representing an increase from the 2022 rate of \$85 per day. The increase will be effective February 1, 2023 "subject to the approval of the governing authority of the county" pursuant to OCGA § 15-2-7(b).

Due to grant funding provided by the courts' 2023 ARPA award from the State of Georgia's Administrative Office of the Courts, no budget adjustment for FY 2023 is necessary.

History:

Bailiff compensation was last adjusted by the Grand Jury and Hall County Commission on 12/09/2021. While this represents the second adjustment in as many years, the rate was previously unchanged from 2007-2021.

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 26th day of January 2023, by and between **HALL COUNTY, STATE OF GEORGIA,** hereinafter called "the County", as party of the first part, and **Brandon Smith**, herein called "Employee", as part of the second part, both of whom agree as follows:

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the County desires to employ the services of said Brandon Smith as the Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services of Hall County; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing board, hereafter called "Commission" to provide certain benefits, establish certain conditions of employment and to set working conditions of said Employee; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Hall County to secure and retain the services of said Employee and provide inducement for him or her to remain in such employment, and to make possible full work productivity by assuring said Employee's morale and peace of mind with respect to future security, and to provide a just means of terminating the Employee's services at such a time as desired by the County Administrator, or his or her designee; and

WHEREAS, the Employee desires to accept employment as Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services for Hall County;

NOW THEREFORE; in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. Duties

The County hereby agrees to employ **Brandon Smith** as **Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services**, to perform legally permissible functions and duties specified and assigned by the County Administrator or his or her designee.

Assistant Director of Parks and Community

SECTION 2. <u>Term</u>

- A. Nothing in this agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of the County Administrator to terminate the services of this Employee at any time, subject only to the provisions set forth in SECTION 3 of this agreement. The Employee understands that he or she serves at the pleasure of the County Administrator.
- B. Nothing in the agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employee to resign at any time from his or her position with the County, subject to the provisions set forth in SECTION 3, Paragraphs B and C of this agreement.

SECTION 3. <u>Termination and Severance Pav</u>

- A. In the event the Employee is terminated pursuant to Paragraph B hereof and the Employee is willing and able to perform the duties of the position under this agreement, upon execution of a Separation Agreement and General Release, the Employer agrees to pay the Employee a lump sum cash payment equal to three (3) months aggregate annual salary, exclusive of other forms of compensation, less standard withholdings, in addition to the continuation of medical, dental and vision insurance benefits during the three (3) month period immediately following the date of termination. However, in the event the Employee is terminated because the Employee has been convicted of a misdemeanor or a felony, or if the County determines that the Employee has engaged in unprofessional and improper practice, other than negligence, and breach of public trust, including but not limited to illegal acts involving personal gain, or moral turpitude, the County shall be entitled to terminate the Employee immediately without any severance pay, or medical, dental and vision insurance continuation aside from COBRA.
- B. In the event the Employer at any point during the term of this agreement reduces the salary or other financial benefits of the Employee in a greater percentage than reductions to all other employees of Employer, or if Employer refuses, following a written request to comply with any provision benefiting Employee herein; or the Employee resigns following a suggestion, whether formal or informal, by the County Administrator that he or she resign, then, in that event, Employee may, at his or her option, be deemed to be terminated at the date of such reduction or refusal to comply within the meaning and context of the herein severance pay provision.

C. In the event the Employee voluntarily resigns his or her position with the County as **Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services** then the Employee shall give the County **thirty (30)** days written notice in advance, unless the parties otherwise agree. The provision for severance pay and continuation of employment benefits detailed in SECTION 3, Paragraph A shall not apply to a voluntary resignation.

SECTION 4. Termination Due to Disability

If the Employee is unable to perform his or her duties because of sickness, accident, injury, or mental incapacity, and no reasonable accommodations are available, the County shall have the option to terminate employment, subject to the severance pay requirements of SECTION 3, Paragraph A. However, the Employee shall be compensated for any accrued benefits, in accordance with current policies.

SECTION 5. Salary

The County agrees to pay the Employee for his or her services rendered, pursuant hereto, an annual base salary of \$98,000.00 payable in installments at the same time as other employees of the County are paid, except that the county may put in place cost reduction measures at any time and for any duration as required by a lack of financial resources. The base annual salary and benefits may be reviewed annually by the County Administrator and consideration for increases may be determined based upon the performance of the employee or consideration of providing a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA).

SECTION 6. Performance Evaluation

The County Administrator, or his or her designee, shall review and evaluate the performance of Employee at least annually on the anniversary day of this agreement. Said review and evaluation shall be in accordance with criteria developed by the County Administrator, or his or her designee, and Employee. Performance criteria may be added to or deleted from, as the County Administrator, or his or her designee may from time to time determine. Further, the County Administrator, or his or her designee, shall provide the Employee with a written summary statement of the findings of the evaluation.

Assistant Director of Parks and Community

SECTION 7. Hours of Work

It is generally recognized that the position of **Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services** involves the devotion of a great deal of time beyond typically recognized business hours.

SECTION 8. Outside Activities

The Employee shall devote his or her full time to the position described in this agreement. With the approval of the County Administrator, or his or her designee, the Employee may engage in teaching, consulting or other non-employer related activities as long as he or she does not interfere with the execution of the duties of this position, or present a conflict of interest. Such consent must be obtained by advance approval, in writing, detailing the specifics of such activity.

SECTION 9. Political Activity

If the Employee announces as a candidate for any elective office during the duration of this contract, he or she will resign from Hall County employment immediately upon declaring candidacy as defined by state law. During the term of this contract, the Employee may not:

- A. Be involved in any political activity that would constitute a conflict of interest; including participation in any aspect of any local political campaign on behalf of one's self if intending to seek elected office, or other individual or in opposition to any candidate for office within Hall County; including municipal and/or county government office. This restriction includes but is not limited to displaying or distributing information, materials, or paraphernalia in support of any political candidate, party or organization.
- B. Knowingly solicit, accept, or receive political contributions from any person, to be used in support of or in opposition to any political candidate for election within Hall County, including municipal and/or county government office.
- C. Use, or promise to use, directly or indirectly, any official authority or influence, whether possessed or anticipated, to secure or attempt to secure for any person a job or other advantage for the purpose of influencing the vote or political action of any person.

SECTION 10. Vehicle and Phone

Employee's duties require the substantial use of their personal automobile during the term of employment. The County shall pay to the Employee in addition to salary a monthly vehicle allowance of \$433.33. A cellular phone dedicated solely for business usage may be provided by the Employer. In such case, the Employer shall be responsible for paying for and maintaining regular monthly service. Should the Employee desire to use their personal cellular phone for business purposes, Employer shall reimburse the Employee the amount of \$50 per month.

SECTION 11. <u>Insurance Benefits</u>

The County agrees to put in force and make premium payments for Medical, Dental, Vision, Short-Term Disability and Life Insurance policies on behalf of the Employee and if so elected, eligible dependents, at a level of coverage available to other County employees. The Employee may choose not to cover his/her dependents.

SECTION 12. Retirement Benefits

Provided that contributions are being made by the County, if the Employee elects, Hall County agrees to contribute 8% of annual compensation as defined by the retirement plan in addition to Employer matching contributions made on contributions by the Employee as received by other County employees, into a defined contribution plan, except that the County may reduce or suspend this contribution at any time and for any duration as required due to a lack of financial resources. Retirement contributions shall not be made on any severance pay provided by the Employer, paid in accordance with Section 3.

SECTION 13. Paid Time Off (PTO) or Vacation and Sick Leave

As applicable, the County will provide for Paid Time Off (PTO) or vacation and sick leave in the same manner as the accruals currently received by other County Employees. In the event that the County changes or adopts a new program for all employees, such changes shall also apply to the **Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services**. Accrued PTO or vacation leave, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to Employee upon termination of employment.

SECTION 14. Dues, Subscriptions and Professional Development

- A. The County agrees to pay the Employee's annual membership dues, subscriptions and conference expenses incurred by the Employee in conjunction with the Employee's duties, not to exceed the budget and subject to prior approval by the County Administrator or his or her designee.
- B. The County agrees to pay the travel and subsistence expenses of the Employee for expenses related to maintenance of professional certifications, professional and official travel, meetings and occasions adequate to continue the professional development of the Employee and to adequately pursue necessary official and other functions for the department, not to exceed the budget and subject to prior approval by the County Administrator or his or her designee.

SECTION 15. Indemnification

The County shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Employee against any claim or demand or legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the performance of the Employee's duties as **Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services**. The County or its insurance carrier will pay the amount of any settlement or judgment agreed to or rendered against the Employee and the County may agree to such settlement or the payment of a judgment with or without the express consent of the Employee. Any defense and/or indemnification of the Employee by the County shall be subject to all of the terms and conditions found in the County's Defense and Indemnification ordinance/policy.

SECTION 16. General Provisions

- A. The text herein shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Any amendment hereto shall be in writing and be executed by both parties.
- B. This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs at law and executors of the Employee.
- C. If any provision, or any portion thereof, contained in this agreement is held unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement, or portion thereof, shall be deemed severable, shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

- D. This agreement will become effective on the 26th day of January 2023, and shall continue thereafter unless or until the agreement is terminated by either party as set forth herein.
- E. This agreement shall be executed in duplicate, each of which shall be deemed to be complete of itself and may be introduced into evidence or used for any purpose without the production of the other copy.

This item originally appeared before the BOC on December 8, 2022 and was tabled to the January 26, 2023 voting meeting to allow the applicant an opportunity to prepare a revised site plan that did not access Holiday Road and to address concerns raised during the public hearing. To date, no revised site plan has been submitted.

The applicant failed to post the required signs at least 15 days prior to the meeting; therefore, staff requests that this be tabled to the February 9, 2023 BOC voting meeting. The public portion of the meeting was closed on December 8, 2023, so the February 9, 2023 meeting will be for a vote only.

The applicant sought approval to rezone the property to allow covered boat and RV storage. This item was presented to the Planning Commission as a rezoning report and a conditional use report. However, the Planning Commission opined that since it was advertised as a single item and since planned developments have historically been voted on as one item, that this should be heard and voted on as one item. The item is located within Commission District 2.

At their November 7, 2022 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of this request with four (4) conditions (5-0).

There were two (2) written comments in opposition submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting but no one spoke during the public hearing.

There have been no changes to the request since the Planning Commission took action.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting to rezone the 2.12 acre property from Highway Business (H-B, <u>17.150</u>) to Planned Commercial District (PCD, <u>17.180.080</u>) for the purpose of developing a boat & RV storage lot with 67 covered parking spaces. The narrative continues to explain that the existing residence will be remodeled and brought up to commercial code to serve as an office space for the development.

The narrative explains that the development will be in accordance with the requirements Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, $\underline{17.420}$), including exterior building materials, site lighting, and signage. Access to the site will be from Holiday Road, with no access proposed on Lanier Islands Parkway. The proposed hours of operation will be 6:00 am - 10:00 pm via an access controlled gate. The office will be staffed between the hours of 9:00 am - 6:00 pm. The proposed driveway will be approximately 75 feet in length before an access gate to allow for vehicle stacking. The site will be graded and a stormwater detention facility will be installed adjacent to Lanier Islands Parkway / State Route 347.

The current request is to rezone the property. A concurrent conditional use application has been submitted for boat & RV storage. A separate staff report has been prepared for the conditional use.

- > The Planning Commission can hear these items simultaneously but must vote on them separately.
- Within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, <u>17.420</u>), boat & RV storage requires conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioners, which is being heard concurrent to this request.

 Should the Planning Commission deny the rezoning request, the conditional use subject to County Commission is automatically denied since boat & RV storage are not allowed in the H-B district.

No variances were requested as part of this application and none have been identified during the zoning analysis.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the <u>requested zoning designation</u> is consistent with the future land use map designation of Lake Area Residential and within a Lake Supportive corridor; <u>2022-Comprehensive-Plan, page 35</u>.

Zoning Analysis

The proposed boat & RV storage facility is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan as the property is part of the Lake Supportive corridor where the intent is to develop commercial uses that are boat related (boat sales, storage and equipment sales) or compliment recreational use of Lake Lanier (such as locally-owned restaurants); 2022-Comprehensive-Plan, page 35.

In cases where only a plat or map is provided and no land use is proposed, the planning commission and county commission shall evaluate the application based on the most intense possible land use permitted in the proposed district. 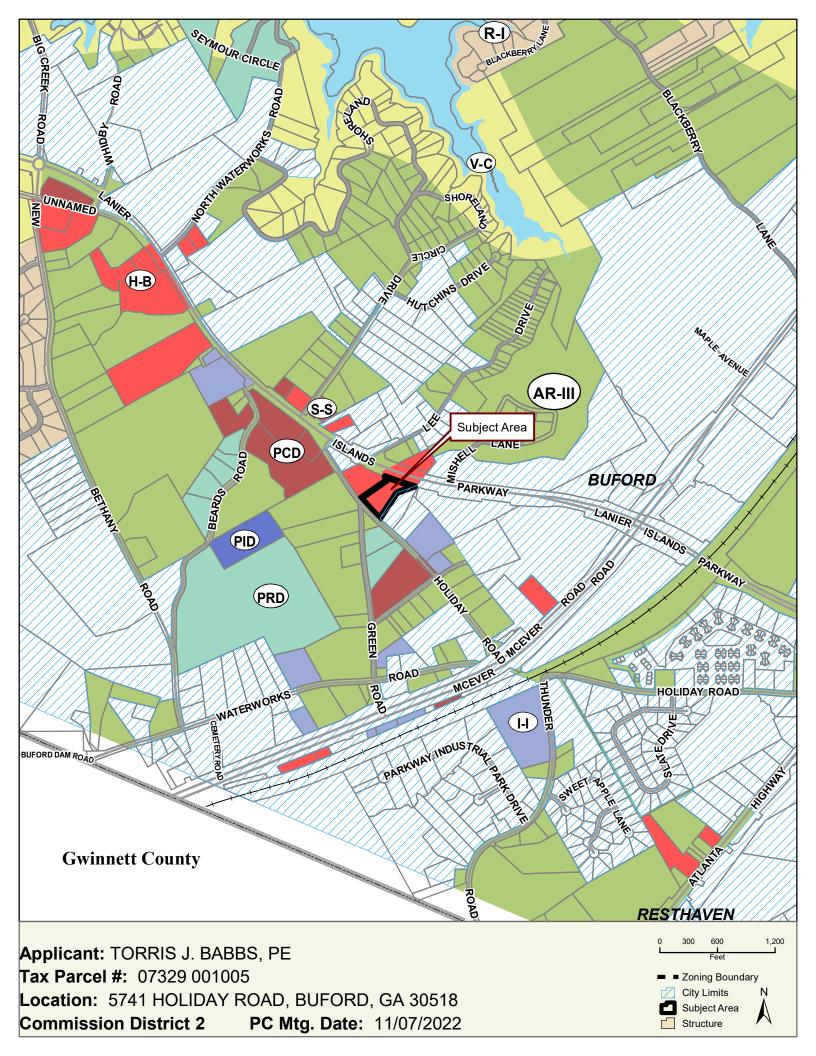

The request before you is the application of Ridgeline Land Planning to rezone approximately 134.14 acres for a heavy industrial subdivision. The development will consist of 11 lots ranging in size from 2.5 acres to 14 acres and will include the construction of a new public road that will intersect with Cornelia Highway. The development will be served by public water and sewer. The property is located in the Gateway Corridor Overlay District (17.420) and the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225) which places greater emphasis on design standards, landscaping, and buffers. The property is located within Commission District 3.

At their November 7, 2022 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the Rezoning request with nine (9) conditions (5-0).

There were no written comments submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting and no one spoke during the public hearing.

There have been no changes to the request since the Planning Commission took action.

Planning Commission Approval Conditions:

 The development shall occur substantially as depicted on the site plan dated 8-15-2022 and described in the project narrative. Due topographical, ecological, or geological constraints, the developer may be allowed to adjust lot lines and the quantity of lots as long as the total buildings square footage does not exceed 1,067,000 sq. ft. for the entire development.

- 2. The proposed development may contain flood zones. The site shall require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate that the proposed development meets stormwater threshold for impervious surfaces. The proposed development is located in the North Oconee watershed overlay, which doubles all stream buffers and setbacks from rested vegetation not the centerline of the stream.
- 3. The subdivision shall follow the standard preliminary and final plat review process (16.40).
- 4. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operations in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property:
 - "Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."
- 5. The GDOT permit shall be required prior to issuance of a land disturbance permit (LDP).
- 6. Tilt up concrete wall construction shall be allowed.
- 7. Architectural reef panels shall be allowed with the color being approved by the Director of Planning and Development.

Staff recommended denial, based on the findings that the request does not meet criteria 1, 2, 13, 14, and 16, of 17.380.060 as the request proposes a use out of scale and intensity for the environmentally sensitive conditions on the site.

Public Forum:

There were no comments in support or opposition.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting to rezone 131.41 from Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, $\underline{17.110}$) and Agricultural Residential IV (AR-IV, $\underline{17.120}$) to Heavy Industrial (I-II, $\underline{17.170}$) to allow for a heavy industrial development. According to the narrative, the applicant expects this to be a 5 to 10 year build out.

The narrative states that the proposed uses will be in conformance with those uses listed in Permitted Uses (17.170.010), with the exception of items P (Adult establishments) and R (Astrologers, clairvoyants, fortune tellers, palmists, phrenologists and related occupations), of the Official Code of Hall County. The applicant is proposing to delete uses P and R and anticipates that the majority of the uses will be office and warehousing.

The narrative continues to explain the proposed Industrial development will consist of 11 lots ranging in size from 2.5 to 14 acres. These lots will be accessed via a new public road connecting to Cornelia Highway (State Route 365). The front setback will be 50 feet, and the side and rear setbacks will be 30

feet, as required by Official Code of Hall County. A 50-foot buffer will be provided adjacent to residentially zoned property.

The proposed development will be served by Hall County Sewer and City of Gainesville Water. Signage conforming to the Hall County sign ordinance will be located at the entrance off Hwy 365 and at individual lot entrances within the development. Lighting within the development will be LED style and shielded to minimize light spillage onto adjacent properties.

No variance to the Official Code of Hall County were submitted as part of this request; however, the subject properties lie within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, <u>17.420</u>). Since the site plan submitted is a conceptual plan and no architectural elevations, proposed sign information, or landscape plan were submitted as part of this request, variances may be required for each lot prior to its development; <u>any such variances will require a public hearing</u>.

Zoning Analysis

While the proposed use of an 11 lot industrial park is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and Future Land Use Map which shows it to be within an employment corridor, the site is environmentally sensitive and part of the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225), and as such, an industrial use is not the most suitable use of the property. The subject properties also lie within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, 17.420) which imposes landscaping, signage, buffer, and architectural design and materials standards.

The proposed development is located in the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District which places limitations on the intensity of development (17.225.030):

 The impervious surface area, including all public and private structures, utilities, or facilities, of the entire water supply watershed shall be limited to twenty-five (25) percent, or existing use, whichever is greater.



- The site plan indicates a total impervious area of 29.05 acres or 24.9%.
 - For reference 3551 Kubota Way has approximately 188 acres with approximately 26.97acres of impervious area. 25% of 188 acres is 47 acres.
 - 5855 Whitehall Road has approximately 280 acres and 40.3 acres of impervious area. 25% of 280 acres is 110.3 acres.



 Both sites are within the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (<u>17.225</u>) but are under the maximum pervious area of 25%.



When considering a zoning amendment to the zoning maps, the following items must be considered:

- 1. Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of adjacent and nearby property; The proposed development is an 11-lot industrial park located on the south side of Cornelia Highway / SR 365. The subject property is adjacent to undeveloped large tracts of agricultural residential zoned property, both developed and undeveloped. While Gateway Industrial Centre is located across Cornelia Highway, it is a considerable distance away from other commercial property, approximately 2 miles from an activity corridor. Therefore, the proposed use is not suitable in view of the use and development of nearby property.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The subject property is located in the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225) which results in environmentally sensitive conditions on site due to proximity to the North Oconee River. As such, the intensity of an 11-building /lot industrial use has the potential to adversely affect the environmental characteristics intended to be protected.
- 3. Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. Without a market study, it is hard to determine if there is economic value as the property is currently zoned however there a number of permitted and conditional uses within the AR-III (17.110) and AR-IV districts (17.120).
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities; A Development of Regional Impact (DRI) review was conducted by Georgia Mountains Regional Commission (GMRC). A notice of decision was issued to Hall County staff on October 7, 2022. The results of that review indicated that "the proposed action does not present any adverse interjurisdictional impacts, however the GMRC recommends that the County and applicant work with the GHMPO and GDOT to ensure optimal resolution of the intersections and access to allow existing traffic to safely turn left (southward) without disrupting highway traffic."
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The <u>requested zoning designation</u> is consistent with the <u>2022 Comprehensive Plan</u>, page <u>35</u> and the

Future Land Use map; however, the site is environmentally sensitive and part of the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225), and as such, intense industrial use is not the most suitable use of the property.

- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; It is likely that property values are lower as agriculturally-zoned parcels as opposed to industrially-zoned. That said, rezoning the subject property may adversely impact the values of adjacent properties. A market study is necessary to make a determination.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; The subject property is located in the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225) as a result of the environmentally sensitive conditions on site and proximity to the North Oconee River. As such, the intensity of an 11-building industrial use has the potential to adversely affect the environmental characteristics intended to be protected.
- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; There is likely to be public gain by protecting environmentally sensitive land and limiting the intensity of use on such property.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; Staff is not aware of the length of time the property has been vacant.
- 10. Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal;
 Staff is not aware of any changing conditions that impact the development of the property.
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; The proposed district would present an isolated zoning designation from; however, the Comprehensive Plan supports this use on the subject property.
- 12. Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; The zoning district boundaries are not illogically drawn in relation to conditions in the area.
- 13. Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; The scope is out of proportion to the existing uses within the neighborhood and on adjacent parcels; however, it is located in an area designated as an employment corridor on the Future Land Use Map. There is significant interest in this area of Hall County due to the Northeast Ga Inland Port. The site has challenges related to environmental sensitivity as part of the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225).
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; There are other sites in Hall County more appropriate for heavy industrial uses that are supported by the future land use map, zoning ordinance, and existing conditions on the site.

- 1. Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the zoning board of adjustment; The request could not be handled alternatively as a variance since the proposed use is neither permitted nor conditional in the AR-III district (17.110) or AR-IV district (17.120).
- 15. Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; The subject property is located in the North Oconee Water Supply Watershed District (17.225) as a result of the environmentally sensitive conditions on site and proximity to the North Oconee River. As such, the intensity of an 11-building industrial use has the potential to adversely affect the environmental characteristics intended to be protected.
- **16.** Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; **There is no indication that a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property.**
- Heavy Industrial (I-II, <u>17.170</u>): the Heavy Industrial (I-I) zoning district allows a variety industrial uses, both permitted and subject to either Planning Commission or Board of Commissioners. The uses include any commercial use or industrial use which involves manufacturing, processing, or assembly operations or the storage and sale of heavy materials, products, or equipment, but not including uses which may cause injurious or obnoxious noise, vibrations, smoke, gas, fumes, odor, dust, fire hazard, or other objectionable conditions to nearby areas or those uses listed in <u>section</u> <u>17.170.020</u>.
- 17.380.050. Submission requirements for a rezoning request
- A. Any person or persons requesting a change in the official zoning map or use subject to approval of the county commission shall file an application with a plat or map of the property attached thereto, together with payment of such fees set forth in chapter 17.30 to cover administrative and advertising costs, in the planning department office. Such person or persons or their authorized agent shall appear in person at the public hearing held to consider the district change. Proposal meets the requirement. Applicant has paid the appropriate fees and understands that someone must be present at both the Hall County Planning Commission meeting and the voting meeting of the Hall County Board of Commissioners.
- B. All applications for a change of zoning classification or use subject to approval of the county commission shall include:
 - 1. A narrative statement identifying the existing and proposed use of the property and addressing each of the criteria set forth in section 17.380.060.C of this section [chapter]. Proposal does not meet the requirement, as the applicant has not addressed the review and approval criteria in Section 17.380.060.C. but did submit a narrative.
 - 2. A site plan drawn to scale designating the area covered by the application and identifying existing and proposed buildings and uses, adjacent existing land uses, zoning on contiguous parcels, including those across an abutting public right-of-way, and any other significant site improvements proposed to accommodate the proposed use or buffer adjacent uses, etc., or a plat of the subject property where no specific land use is proposed. In cases where only a plat or map is provided and no land use is proposed, the planning commission and county commission shall evaluate the application based on the most intense possible land use permitted in the proposed district. Proposal meets this requirement.

In an email dated October 20, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick provided the following comments:

- 1. IFC Section D104.1, buildings exceeding three stories or 30 feet in height shall have not fewer than two means of fire apparatus access for each structure.
- 2. IFC Section D104.2, buildings having a gross building area of more than 62,000 SF shall be provided with two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads.
- 3. IFC Section D104.3, where two fire apparatus roads are required, they shall be placed a distance apart equal to not less than one half of the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the lot or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses.

- 6. IFC Section 903.2, where required approved automatic sprinkler systems in new buildings shall be provided in the locations described in sections 903.2.1 through 903.2.12
- 7. IFC Section 503, fire apparatus access roads shall be provided and maintained in accordance with sections 503.1.1 through 503.1.3
- 8. IFC Section 506.1, access controlled gate(s) will require a Knox key switch override device for fire department access.
- 9. IFC Section 510, emergency responder radio coverage confirmation will apply to each building.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memorandum dated October 20, 2022, Public Works Director Srikanth Yamala stated the following:

Engineering:

Flood (not future Hall County studied)

The site may require a stormwater management report, should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

North Oconee Reservoir Watershed Protection. District doubles all stream buffers and impervious setbacks. Show stream buffers/setbacks from wrested vegetation not centerline of stream.

Traffic:

GDOT permit required. While access to Cagle Mill Road is not proposed on the concept, it should be noted that it would not be permitted.

Utilities:

Hall Sewer on Cornelia Highway lift station to remain private. Developer to construct manhole on property to connect to existing manhole on HWY 365.

Hall County Tax Assessors

No comments were provided in relation to this request.

Gainesville Water Resources

No comments were provided in relation to this request.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated October 20, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Operations Supervision, stated "GDOT Coordination In Progress – See GDOT Access Permit A-139-008556-1."

Georgia Mountains Regional Commission

In a memorandum dated October 7, 2022, Adam Hazell, AICP, Planning Director, stated: "Based on the comments received and staff analysis of this project, conducted in accordance with the Georgia Department of Community Affair's Procedures for the Review of the Developments of Regional Impact, the GMRC finds that the proposed action does not present any adverse inter-jurisdictional impacts, however the GMRC recommends that the County and applicant work with the GHMPO and GDOT to ensure optimal resolution of the intersections and access to allow existing traffic to safely turn left (southward) without disrupting highway traffic. Please note that this finding is advisory only and assumes the project will proceed as presented to the GMRC and will comply with all applicable local, State and federal rules and regulations."

The GMRC staff analysis are included in the memo.

The proposed use is also a conditional use subject to Board of Commissioners because it is in the Gateway Corridors Overlay District.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting to rezone 11.36± acres from Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, <u>17.110</u>) to Planned Commercial Development (PCD, <u>17.180.080</u>) for the purpose of developing a self-storage facility. The proposed development will contain a total of 72,000 square feet of storage space, which will be evenly

divided between three (3) two (2) storied buildings, each being 24,000 square feet in area. A 2,400 square foot office building is proposed with associated parking adjacent to the proposed access onto McEver Road. The storage area is located through a gated access point. The buildings will be constructed in such a manner that they will appear to be one-story from the south. The storage facility will have both climate controlled and non-climate controlled storage spaces. The hours of operation will be Monday – Saturday, 9:00am – 6:00pm for the office, with 24 hour access to the storage facility.

The narrative continues to describe that for the purpose of the rezoning application, all Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, <u>17.420</u>) standards, including buffer and landscaping requirements, shall apply to the development. The site plans shows a 50 foot buffer along the southern property line where it is adjacent to residentially zoned parcels. Per the narrative, the buffer shall consist of a mixture of existing vegetation, supplemented by evergreen shrubs and trees where necessary. *The narrative notes that trees planted or retained in the buffer areas shall count towards the overall tree density unit requirements.*

The applicant's narrative states that the buildings will be constructed out of **steel and will have corrugated sheet metal walls.** The walls facing McEver Road will be full brick or a brick/stone combination. Per the non-residential property development standard (17.420.050.H.2) of the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, 17.420), the use of a common palette of building materials should be maintained for all four sides of principal buildings to create a consistent and traditional architectural identity. Building materials used for all four sides of new or reconstructed buildings are restricted to the following: brick, stone, split-face block/concrete masonry unit (CMU) is restricted to 50 percent of the surface area of each side of a principal building, stucco is restricted to 50 percent of the surface area of each side of a building, or glass and glass block. Exposed concrete block, painted concrete block, metal, tilt/up and pre-cast concrete are prohibited materials for any exterior wall.

Within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, $\underline{17.420}$), self-storage facilities require conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioners, which is being heard concurrent to this request.

No variances were explicitly requested as part of the application, but **staff has identified the need for several variances** from the non-residential property development standard (<u>17.420.050</u>) of the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, <u>17.420</u>) during the review of this request. A separate variance report is provided related to these standards.

- The narrative states that the buildings will be constructed out of steel and will have corrugated sheet
 metal walls. The walls facing McEver Road will be full brick or a brick/stone combination. This is
 inconsistent with non-residential property development standards (<u>17.420.050.H.2</u>) of the Gateway
 Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, <u>17.420</u>), which requires the use of a common palette of building
 materials should be maintained for all four sides of principal buildings.
- The submitted plans indicate that the sign will be internally illuminated, which is inconsistent with non-residential property development standard (17.420.050.F.4.a) of the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, 17.420) that prohibits internally illuminated signs.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the <u>requested zoning designation is inconsistent</u> with the future land use map designation of Lake Area Residential within the Hall County <u>Comprehensive Plan</u>.

Despite being inconsistent with the future land use map, there is an established commercial corridor along this portion of McEver Road. The adjacent parcel to the north is also zoned Planned Commercial

Development (PCD, <u>17.180.080</u>), and developed with a mini-golf course. To the south are parcels within the City of Oakwood jurisdiction, which are zoned Highway Business District, C-2.

Zoning Analysis

The proposed self-storage facility is inconsistent with the <u>Comprehensive Plan</u> as the future land use designation is Lake Area Residential. The parcel is not part of the Lake Supportive Corridor, though the neighboring properties are commercially zoned and developed.

When considering a zoning amendment to the zoning maps, the following items must be considered:

Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of adjacent and nearby property; There is an established commercial corridor along this portion of McEver Road. The adjacent parcel to the north is also zoned Planned Commercial Development (PCD, 17.180.080), and developed with a mini-golf course. To the south are parcels within the City of Oakwood jurisdiction, which are zoned Highway Business District, C-2.

Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The zoning proposal should not have an adverse effect on the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property. Self-storage facilities traditionally are a low impact use, with those who rent a storage space visiting infrequently.

Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. The property is currently undeveloped and zoned Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110). The property has reasonable economic use as currently zoned.

Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The proposed zoning of Planned Commercial Development (PCD, 17.180.080) for a self-storage facility is inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan. The future land use designation is Lake Area Residential which includes low-density residential development and neighborhoods. The parcel is not part of a Lake Supportive Corridor, though the neighboring properties are commercially zoned and developed.

The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; **The appears to have been vacant as far back as GIS aerial imagery goes, 1999.**

Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; **No, the** change would not create an isolated zoning district. The adjacent parcel to the north is also zoned Planned Commercial Development (PCD, <u>17.180.080</u>), and developed with a mini-golf course. To the south are parcels within the City of Oakwood jurisdiction, which are zoned <u>Highway Business</u> District, C-2

Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; The request does not appear to be out of scale with the needs of the County as a whole, as there is a need for additional storage facilities in the County.

Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; There are other properties within the County that support the proposed self-storage facility without rezoning.

- A Planned Commercial Development (PCD, <u>17.180.080</u>) shall provide for the maximum attainable commercial usage of property while employing the best aspects of prior site planning and development controls to insure: protection of surrounding residential uses; safe access by motorists; minimum traffic congestion; and a development which is consistent with long-range plans of the county.
- Applications for Planned Commercial Developments (PCD, <u>17.180.080</u>) shall include the following required plans:

The proposed exterior lighting shall be shown.

Although not shown, the submitted narrative states that security lighting in the form of wall packs with outer shields to direct light downwards are intended to be used for the development.

All proposed signs, advertising or identification graphics shall be indicated, showing their number, size, height and location.

The submitted narrative meets this standard. The narrative describes one sign constructed at the McEver Road entrance to the property, which will be a monument style sign and meet Hall County Zoning Regulations (<u>Title 17</u>) standards. It should be noted that the submitted plans indicate that the sign will be internally illuminated, which is inconsistent with non-residential property development standard (<u>17.420.050.F.4.a</u>) of the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, <u>17.420</u>) that prohibits internally illuminated signs.

The type and number of uses proposed for the commercial development shall be indicated.

The submitted narrative describes the proposed use as a 72,000 square foot self-storage facility, comprised of 3 buildings plus an office.

The development controls for the district shall be stated (lot coverage, setbacks, building heights, lot sizes, etc.). If standards are not specifically proposed, then the applicable standards in the suburban shopping district (S-S) shall apply.

The submitted site plan shows the setbacks for the Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) district – 40 feet from property line or 65 feet from centerline of road, whichever is greater, front; 15 feet, side. It should be noted that McEver Road is classified as an arterial road per the regulations and Hall County GIS maps; per setback requirements from arterial streets (17.240.040), no structure may be placed less than 100 feet from the center line of an arterial street (as defined in section 17.20). The proposal meets this requirement.

- The property falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District, (17.420.) which provides supplemental design standards for non-residential property development. The proposal will be subject to the standards found within 17.420.050 (non-residential property development standards) which relate to building materials, landscaping, and buffer requirements. Variances in the design standards found in 17.420.050.H.2.c and 17.420.050.H.3. are required.
- The applicant has met the submission requirements for a rezoning request (<u>17.380.050</u>).

Development Support and Constraints – Departmental /agency comments

Hall County Environmental Health

An email dated December 2, 2022 from Emily McGahee states: "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review.

Additional items, including, but not limited to: recorded plat, soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan."

Hall County Fire Rescue

In an email dated December 2, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review, states:

- 1) IFC Section 507.5.1 where a building(s) is constructed and is more than 400' from a fire hydrant on an approved fire access route fire hydrant(s) shall be installed. Fire hydrant(s) may have to be installed inside the development to meet fire code requirements.
- 2) IFC Section 506.1 access controlled gate will require a Knox key switch override device for fire department access into gated development.
- 3) IFC Section 510 emergency responder radio coverage confirmation will apply to each of the 24,000 SF buildings.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated December 1, 2022, from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Public Works and Utilities, the following comments were provided:

Engineering:

This site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage. Show buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation, not the centerline of creek.

Traffic:

Access must be approved/permitted by GDOT.

Utilities:

No Hall County Sanitary Sewer in the area.

Georgia Department of Transportation

Per an email dated November 23, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Operations Supervisor confirmed that GDOT coordination will be required.

Excerpts from the minutes of the December 19, 2022 Meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell wanted to make it clear that there would be no access to the proposed facility from Pleasant Hill Road. Mr. Varner questioned the buffer measurements between the property and Pleasant Hill Road. Mr. Hipple stated 400 feet of existing vegetation. Ms. Pilcher questioned if the three buildings were it for the property. Mr. Smith stated it was for this request and if they were able to expand they would want to come back in front of the county. Mr. Braswell questioned hours of operation. Mr. Hipple stated that staff would be onsite Monday – Friday, 9 am – 6 pm with 24 hour access seven days a week. Mr. Braswell suggested splitting the property's zoning to avoid encroaching into the neighboring residence. Mr. Hunt suggested using buffers. Mr. Hipple suggested a 100 foot buffer towards Pleasant Hill Road. Mr. Hipple pointed out that they are not planning to have white metal buildings as seen in the renderings. Summary Analysis

This report is an accompaniment to the rezoning and conditional use report/application. It is related to the necessary variances identified by staff while reviewing and analyzing the rezoning and proposed use. <u>This report is only addressing the variances necessary to approve the rezoning and use as presented. All other information about the rezoning and use are found in the rezoning and use report.</u>

• The narrative states that the buildings will be constructed out of steel and will have corrugated sheet metal walls. The walls facing McEver Road will be full brick or a brick/stone combination. This is inconsistent with non-residential property development standards (17.420.050.H.2.c) of the

Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, $\underline{17.420}$), which requires the use of a common palette of building materials should be maintained for all four sides of principal buildings. The plans submitted indicate that the structures will have metal roofing ($\underline{17.420.050.H.3}$).

- Variance to allow corrugated metal walls within GCOD.
- Variance to allow metal roofing within GCOD.
- The submitted plans indicate that the sign will be internally illuminated, which is inconsistent with non-residential property development standard (17.420.050.F.4.a) of the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD, 17.420) that prohibits internally illuminated signs.
 - Variance to allow internally illuminated signs in GCOD.

Zoning Analysis

The Planning Commission is hereby authorized to grant variances from the strict application of this Resolution upon proof by a preponderance of the evidence that $\underline{2.60.030.J}$ provided the request meets the criteria set forth in $\underline{2.60.030.K}$.

- There are extraordinary and exceptional conditions pertaining to the particular lot in question because of its size, shape or topography (the hardship must relate to the physical character of the lot and not to a personal or economic hardship); Based on the topography and lot configuration, the proposed metal sides should have minimal visibility from McEver Rd or the adjacent properties (Google Street View).
- 2. The application of the requirements of this <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would create an unusual hardship; imposing the requirements of GCOD on all four walls of all buildings would be more costly and all sides are not visible from the right-of-way or adjacent properties. The intent of the regulations is to create an aesthetically pleasing development along the primary corridors within Hall County and to mitigate the visual impact of commercial developments from those rights-of-way and adjacent properties.

3. Such conditions are peculiar to the particular piece of property involved and are not common to other properties in the neighborhood; and The topography is rather challenging on this

property as compared to the adjacent

properties.

- 4. Such conditions are not the result of any actions of the property owner; and Although not presented in the narrative, the property has some topographical challenges and is situated in such a way that the proposed metal facades should be minimally visible, if at all, from the adjacent properties or the rights-of-way.
- 5. Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of Title 17; provided, however, that no variance may be granted for a use of land or building or structure that is

prohibited by Title 17 or for a conditional use which has been denied by the county planning commission. If granted, would be in line with variances granted for similar uses within the corridor with similar situations of topography and adjacent uses, although it would be inconsistent with the Hall County Gateway Corridor Overlay District standards (17.420.050.F.4.a).

Development Support and Constraints – Departmental /agency comments

Hall County Environmental Health

An email dated December 2, 2022 from Emily McGahee states: "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review. Additional items, including, but not limited to: recorded plat, soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan."

Hall County Fire Rescue

In an email dated December 2, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review, states:

- 1) IFC Section 507.5.1 where a building(s) is constructed and is more than 400' from a fire hydrant on an approved fire access route fire hydrant(s) shall be installed. Fire hydrant(s) may have to be installed inside the development to meet fire code requirements.
- 2) IFC Section 506.1 access controlled gate will require a Knox key switch override device for fire department access into gated development.
- 3) IFC Section 510 emergency responder radio coverage confirmation will apply to each of the 24,000 SF buildings.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated December 1, 2022, from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Public Works and Utilities, the following comments were provided:

Engineering:

This site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage. Show buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation, not the centerline of creek.

Traffic:

Access must be approved/permitted by GDOT.

Utilities:

No Hall County Sanitary Sewer in the area.

Georgia Department of Transportation

Per an email dated November 23, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Operations Supervisor confirmed that GDOT coordination will be required.

Excerpts from the minutes of the December 19, 2022 Meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Randi Doveton, Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Tyler Smith, 340 Jesse Jewell Parkway, Gainesville, presented the request. The applicant discussed the topography of the property. The applicant pointed out that the neighboring properties were zoned for commercial business. The applicant presented their two variance requests: 1. the sides of the buildings viewable from McEver Road will comply with exterior building requirements of the Gateway Corridor Overlay Districts. Allow a variance so that sides not viewable from McEver may be constructed of other materials, provide they match the color scheme with powder coated finish; 2. Allow metal roof panels, provided they are architectural standing seam with colors and façade.

Charlie Hipple, 4763 Falling Brooke Drive, Flowery Branch, presented the request.

Public Forum:

Bill Oberholtzer, 3709 Whiting Road, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were zoning, size of retention pond, buffers, and site plan.

Mary Anna Jackson, 3632 Pleasant Hill Road, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were future expansion, devaluing neighboring property, vegetation, and topography.

Gerald Kowalle, 3633 Pleasant Hill Road, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were zoning.

Mauricio & Ellie Santos, 3654 Pleasant Hill Road, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were expansion, disruption, and devaluing property.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell wanted to make it clear that there would be no access to the proposed facility from Pleasant Hill Road. Mr. Varner questioned the buffer measurements between the property and Pleasant Hill Road. Mr. Hipple stated 400 feet of existing vegetation. Ms. Pilcher questioned if the three buildings were it for the property. Mr. Smith stated it was for this request and if they were able to expand they would want to come back in front of the county. Mr. Braswell questioned hours of operation. Mr. Hipple stated that staff would be

onsite Monday – Friday, 9 am – 6 pm with 24 hour access seven days a week. Mr. Braswell suggested splitting the property's zoning to avoid encroaching into the neighboring residence. Mr. Hunt suggested using buffers. Mr. Hipple suggested a 100 foot buffer towards Pleasant Hill Road. Mr. Hipple pointed out that they are not planning to have white metal buildings as seen in the renderings. Mr. Braswell stated that the building would not have access between 12 am - 5 am.

<u>Motion:</u> A motion to approve, with conditions was made by Mr. Hunt and seconded by Mr. Bell. Vote: 4-1 (Pilcher opposed)

Conditions:

- 1. The development shall occur as depicted on the site plan presented. Minor changes can be approved by the Planning Director provided there is no increase in the square footage of storage area or number of buildings, there are no reductions in buffers, no changes in the structural design and materials, and the changes do not create the need for a variance in Hall County development standards unless approved.
 - 2. The applicant shall be required to meet all applicable local, state, and/or federal regulations required as part of the land development process, including all GCOD standards (17.420.050). No variances from the Hall County standards are granted as part of this request, unless specifically approved and added as conditions to follow.
 - 3. The applicant shall receive approval from the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) for a commercial driveway.
 - 4. A Landscape Plan shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to issuance of the Land Disturbance Permit (LDP).
 - 5. Applicant shall submit architectural elevations of all four sides of all structures for approval by the Planning Director with the following variances:
 - a. The north, west, and south walls of office building shall meet Gateway Corridor Standards.
 - b. The north and west portions of the 3 two-story buildings shall meet Gateway Corridor Standards, the east and south of the 3 two-story buildings shall have metal sidings with the color to be approved by the Planning Director.
 - c. There shall be standing seam metal roof panels with the color to be approved by the Planning Director.

 - 7. The buffers shall be protected in perpetuity by a deed that follows the property. The removal or modification of this condition shall require action by the Board of Commissioners (BOC).

 - 9. A 200 foot undisturbed buffer shall be parallel to Pleasant Hill Road.
 - 10. Office hours of operation shall be from 9 am 6 pm, Monday Saturday and there shall be no tenant access onto the property from 12 am 5 am, Monday Sunday.
 - 11. All fencing requirements by Gateway Corridor shall be met.
 - 12. There shall be no ingress and egress along Pleasant Hill Road.

Conditions of Zoning -

Purpose

This report explores the possibility of rezoning an 11.27-acre tract off McEver Road in Hall County. The tract is currently vacant and zoned AR-III. The applicant wishes to rezone the property to PCD for the purposes of a self-storage facility. Build out of the project is expected to be over a period of one to two years. The McEver Road Self-Storage development will adhere to all Hall County ordinances.

This plan is conceptual in nature, and certain modifications may be necessary on the design of the preliminary plat and construction documents for the project. Modifications may include specific building and parking lot alignments, amenity locations, and other improvements to adjust for field conditions. Land uses shown herein will not change.

Land use consists of 3-2 story 24,000 sq. ft. buildings (12,000 sq. ft. per floor) and 1- single story 2,400 sq that includes an on-site office area. The total building square footage in the 1^{st} phase will be 74,400 sq. ft and will consist of both climate-controlled and non-climate-controlled units. The three 2 story buildings will be built into the hill and will appear to be one story buildings from the south-side. The office will be served by on-site septic system.

Site Characteristics

The site is 11.27 acres, wooded and currently vacant. Dense underbrush grows along the northeast property line, along with some smaller scrub trees. Topographically, the site drops an average of 50' from the southwest to the northeast.

Soils information taken from the S.C.S. Soils Map for Hall County indicates the site consists of predominately Madison Sandy Clay Loam (MID2) soils with 10% to 15% slopes. These soils are rated somewhat limited for building

and engineering purposes by the online soil database for Barrow, Hall and Jackson Counties.

During an on-site investigation, no apparent rock or wetland areas were visible. There does appear to be state waters associated with the property, in the form of a perennial, spring-fed branch that runs along the northeast property line. A 50' undisturbed buffer as measured from the top of the bank will be left and maintained as per State and County regulations.

Water is provided by the City of Gainesville, and there are fire hydrants present within the McEver Road frontage. The property will be serviced by an on-site septic system.

Cultural Requirements for PCD Zoning

The subject acreage is in Hall County, Georgia, and is currently zoned AR-lll (as confirmed by Hall County Planning Department). The owner proposes to change the current zoning to PCD for the purpose of a Self-Storage facility.

Public access to the development will be from McEver Road (State Route 53) in the form of a "right turn in, right turn out" driveway meeting all GDOT requirements.

According to ordinance 17.420.050, a self-storage warehouse is allowed in the GCOD only if such use is permitted in the underlying zoning district and the board of commissioners grants a conditional use pursuant to the procedures of the Hall County Zoning Ordinance. The buffer along the residential area is 50' with the nearest driveway at 55.8'. The development will comply with 17.420.050 C.3 with a staggered double row of evergreen trees and 2 staggered rows of evergreen shrubs where the property abuts the residential area.

17.420.050 D.2 requires a 10' wide landscape strip, continuous along McEver Road. The landscape strip will be planted with shade trees (6' tall, 2" caliper, dbh) at time of planting and not less than 35' tall at maturity, planted not less than 40' on center, with shrubbery forming an intermittent hedge not less than 3' in height designed to provide an adequate screen.

Proposed Land Use

The subject property is situated within a pocket of AR-Ill zoned properties, with one small tract fronting Pleasant Hill Road zoned R-1. To the southwest along the McEver Road frontage is a commercial tract, zoned C-2. To the northeast along the McEver Road frontage is a tract zoned PCD.

The proposed rezoning to PCD will be for the purpose of developing self-storage units.

McEver Road Corridor Overlay District Requirements

The development will observe all the Hall Gateway Corridor District requirements as per 17.420.050 in the Hall County ordinance. This includes vegetative buffers, setbacks, lighting and signage.

Lake Area Residential

The property lies within the Lake Area Residential district. Due to the topography of the subject property, McEver Road frontage and surrounding commercial development, residential use is not practical for this property.

Architecture

The buildings will be constructed out of steel and will have corrugated sheet metal walls with the walls facing McEver Road being full brick or a brick/stone combination. The 3 large buildings will be built into the hillside and will be 21'6" in height on the lower side and 11'6"H on the upper side.

Parking

On-site parking will be available and will consist of approximately 12-15 spaces.

Landscaping

For the purpose of this rezoning application, all Hall Gateway Corridor District Ordinances, Buffer Ordinances, and Landscape Ordinances shall apply to the development.

Buffers shall consist of a mix of existing vegetation supplemented by evergreen shrubs and trees where necessary to achieve a screen affect as per Hall County ordinances. Existing vegetation may be used as part of the buffer only if it meets the screening requirements of the Hall County ordinance pertaining to buffers. Existing vegetation may need to be enhanced with new plantings to meet the applicable buffer ordinance conditions.

Trees planted or retained in buffer areas (whether disturbed or undisturbed) shall count towards overall tree density unit requirements. Tree fencing and protection requirements shall be put into place and maintained as per the County's Tree Ordinance.

Infrastructure Improvements

Water will be provided by the City of Gainesville. An on-site septic system will serve the office restroom and breakroom

All utilities, including but not limited to water, sewer, power, gas, cable, and telephone, will be underground and meet all applicable standards, and will be installed per regulatory standards in common trenches or conduit after curbing is installed but before driveway or sidewalk construction. No open cuts shall be allowed in curb or roadbed. All open trenches shall be covered at the end of each workday.

Grading & Erosion Control: Construction of the project will abide by the Georgia Manual of Erosion and Sediment Control, latest edition. All necessary Best Management Practices will be used. The project will be developed in accordance with all local, state, and federal regulations, with erosion and sediment control designed specifically for the clearing and grubbing phase, the grading phase, and the stabilization phase.

BMP's and storm water management facilities will be in place and operating as construction proceeds and inspected and maintained as per all applicable ordinances.

All applicable local, state and Federal erosion and sediment control and stormwater management regulations shall be adhered to.

Low Impact Development practices, such as infiltration swales and bioretention areas, may be used where practical. These practices serve dual purposes - storm water management and aesthetic appeal.

Where Low Impact Development practices are not enough to mitigate storm water impacts, conventional detention ponds meeting all Hall County standards will be used within the project.

Lighting

Security lighting will be in the form of wall packs with outer shields to direct light downward and not toward neighboring properties

Signage

One sign will be constructed at the McEver Road entrance to the property and will meet all current Hall County signage standards. The sign will be lighted.

Development Entrance off McEver Road: a monument sign with accompanying walls and/or fences shall front the main entrance to the project off McEver Road. All signage, hardscape materials and planting will be subject to review and approval by Hall County planning staff.

The sign area itself will not include any accompanying walls or fencing, except for that portion of a wall that might include the sign facing materials.

Temporary signs for marketing purposes are limited to a maximum of 64 sq. ft. and 8' or less in height may be used within the development proper or fronting the right-of-way of McEver Road. Temporary signs shall be limited to two (2) and will be removed after 80% project build out.

Signs will be governed by Hall County's Sign Ordinance and requirements of the Hall Gateway Corridor District.

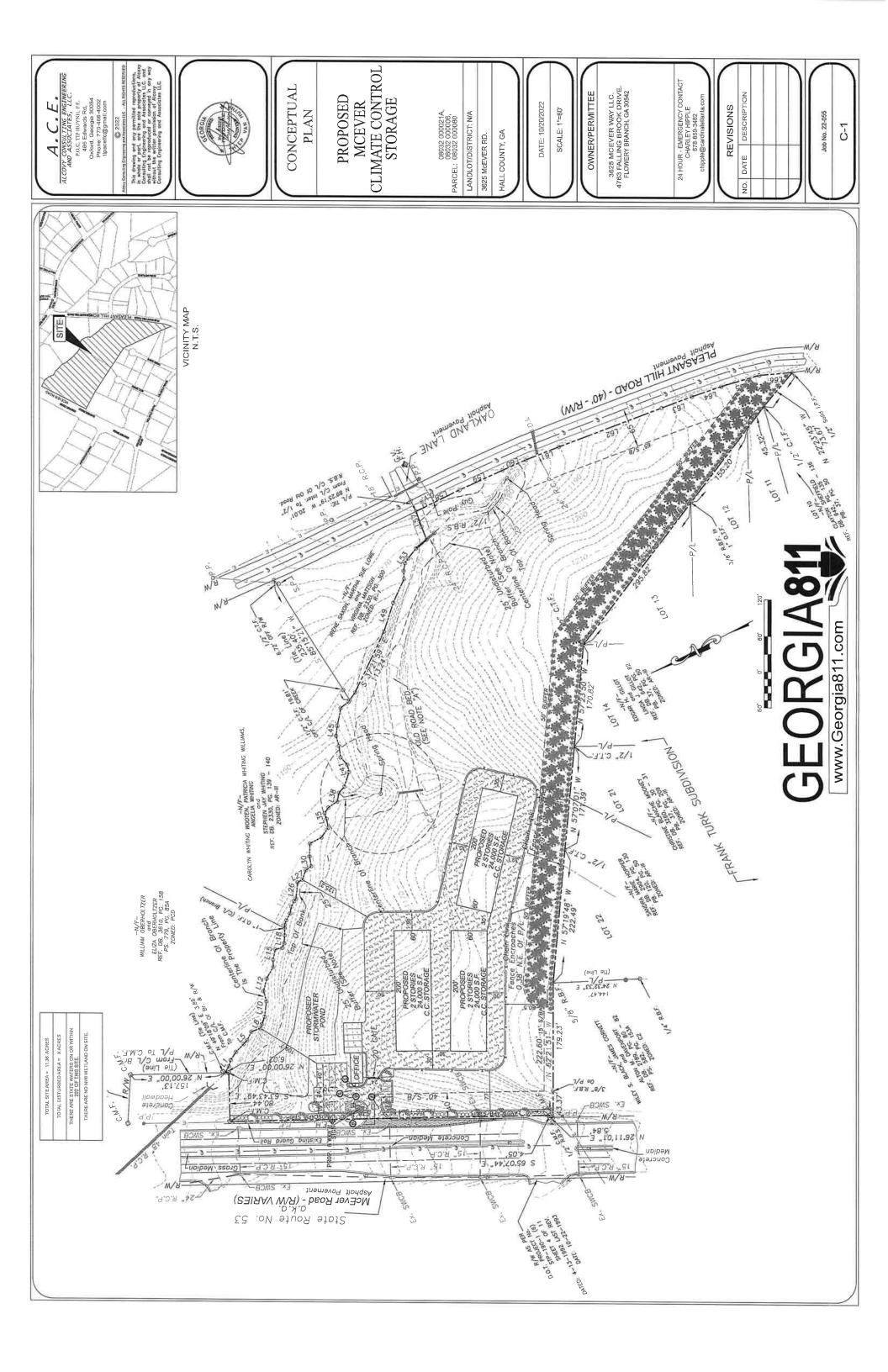

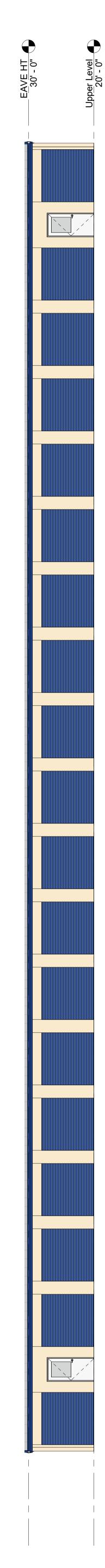

 - **b)** Traffic: Access must be approved/permitted by GDOT.
 - c) Utilities: No Hall County Sanitary Sewer in the area.

The Georgia Department of Transportation is currently developing plans to widen and reconstruct State Route 60 (Thompson Bridge Road from just north of the intersection of SR 136 (Price Road) to Yellow Creek Road in northern Hall County. Roundabouts are proposed for three intersections within this project:

- 1. Thompson Bridge Road at Elrod Road.
- 2. Thompson Bridge Road at Hubert Stephens Road.
- 3. Thompson Bridge Road at Old Dahlonega Highway / Kanaday Road.

Project construction is currently programmed for 2030, and as part of plan development, GDOT is requesting Hall County to approve the roundabout lighting agreement for the three intersections. The agreement stipulates that after project completion and acceptance, Hall County will provide for the repair, maintenance, and energy required for the operation of the lighting at the three intersections. There is currently no projected completion date, but Hall County would need to budget for the monthly utility costs at that time.

Georgia, hereinafter called the DEPARTMENT , and HALL	COUNTY, GEORGIA actin	g by and
through its Board of Commissioners, hereinafter called the C	OUNTY.	

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has represented to the DEPARTMENT a desire to obtain roundabout lighting as part of the **SR 60 FM SR 136 TO CR 158/YELLOW CREEK RD IN MURRAYVILLE** project, said lighting to be installed under P.I. No. 132610-, Hall County;

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has represented to the DEPARTMENT a desire to participate in:

1) Providing the Energy and 2) the Operation and Maintenance of said lighting system at the aforesaid location, and the DEPARTMENT has relied upon such representation; and

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT has indicated a willingness to fund the materials and installation for the said lighting system at the aforesaid location, with funds of the DEPARTMENT, funds apportioned to the DEPARTMENT by the Federal Highway Administration under Title 23, United States Code, Section 104, or a combination of funds from any of the above sources.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises made and of the benefits to flow from one to the other, the DEPARTMENT and the COUNTY hereby agree each with the other as follows:

- The DEPARTMENT or its assigns shall cause the installation of all materials and equipment necessary for roundabout lighting as part of the SR 60 FM SR 136 TO CR
 158/YELLOW CREEK RD IN MURRAYVILLE project, said lighting to be installed under P.I.
 No. 132610-, Hall County as shown on Attachment "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 2. Upon completion of installation of said lighting system, and acceptance by the DEPARTMENT, the COUNTY shall assume full responsibility for the operation, the repair and the maintenance of the entire lighting system, including but not limited to repairs of any damages, replacement of lamps, ballasts, luminaires, lighting structures, associated equipment, conduit, wiring and service equipment, and the requirements of the Georgia Utility Facility Protection Act. The COUNTY further agrees to provide and pay for all the energy required for the operation of said lighting system.

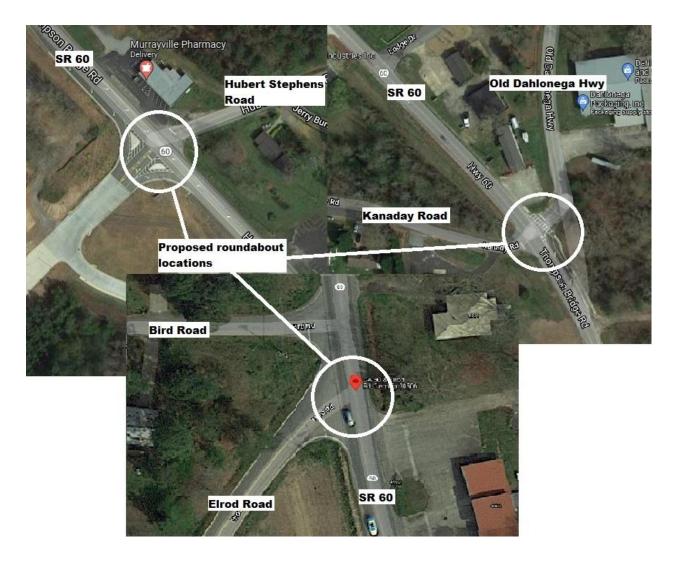
- 3. The DEPARTMENT shall retain ownership of all materials and various components of the entire lighting system. The COUNTY, in its operation and maintenance of the lighting system, shall not in any way alter the type or location of any of the various components which make up the entire lighting system without prior written approval from the DEPARTMENT.
- 4. This Agreement is considered as continuing for a period of fifty (50) years from the date of execution of this Agreement. The DEPARTMENT reserves the right to terminate this Agreement, at any time for just cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the COUNTY.
- 5. It is understood by the COUNTY that the DEPARTMENT has relied upon the COUNTY'S representation of providing for the energy, maintenance, and operation of the lighting represented by this Agreement; therefore, if the COUNTY elects to de-energize or fails to properly maintain or to repair the lighting system during the term of this Agreement, the COUNTY shall reimburse the DEPARTMENT the materials cost for the lighting system. If the COUNTY elects to de-energize or fails to properly maintain any individual unit within the lighting system, the COUNTY shall reimburse the DEPARTMENT for the material cost for the individual unit which will include all costs for the pole, luminaires, foundations, and associated wiring. The DEPARTMENT will provide the COUNTY with a statement of material costs upon completion of the installation.

The covenants herein contained shall, except as otherwise provided accrue to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
