

 - a. Development is approved for lots as generally shown on the concept plan and typical lot layout (sheet 200) dated March 27, 2023 and as described in the project narrative, and as described in the final conditions of zoning, modified as necessary for compliance with development standards enforced at the time of site plan approval. Minor changes can be approved by the Planning Director provided there are no reductions in buffers, no changes in the structural design and materials, and the changes do not create the need for a variance from the Hall County development standards. Any conflict in development standards between the concept plans, project narrative, and conditions of zoning shall be determined by the final conditions of zoning.
 - b. Standard Hall County Development Review and permitting processes shall be followed. Approval of this request does not supersede development standards, or processes, in effect when the plans are submitted for review. Such standards include, but are not limited to, stormwater management and emergency access requirements.
 - c. This section of the development is approved for a maximum of 216 lots with a minimum lot size of 7,000 square feet each. The minimum lot frontage width shall be 40 feet, as previously approved by the Hall County Commission in 2017.
 - d. The minimum heated floor area (HFA) shall be 2,000 square feet for dwelling units. Houses shall be constructed with a mixture of cement materials, stone, and/or brick facades. The Purchase Instrument should reference the Statewide Contract and may include an identification of the items to be purchased, the delivery date and location, the address where the Contractor should submit the invoices, and any other requirements deemed necessary by the Agency or User Agencies.
 - (vi) "Response", "Contractor's Response" or "Final Response" means the Contractor's submitted response to the RFQ, including any modifications or clarifications accepted by the Agency.
 - (vii) "RFQ" means the Request for Quotation, or other solicitation document (and any amendments or addenda thereto) specifically identified in the Statewide Contract Form that was issued to solicit the goods and/or services that are subject to the Statewide Contract.
 - (viii) "State" means the State of Georgia, the Agency, User Agencies, and any other authorized state entities issuing Purchase Instruments against the Statewide Contract.

No objection or amendment by a Contractor to the RFQ requirements or the Statewide Contract shall be incorporated by reference into this Statewide Contract unless the Agency has accepted the Contractor's objection or amendment in writing. The Statewide Contract Form is defined separately and referred to separately throughout the Statewide Contract Terms and Conditions as a means of identifying the location of

- certain information. For example, the initial term of the Statewide Contract is defined by the dates in the Statewide Contract Form.
- (x) "User Agency" or "User Agencies" means any offices, agencies, departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, institutions, or other entities of the State of Georgia entitled to or required to make purchases from this Statewide Contract.
- 2. Certified Source of Goods and Services. Pursuant to Section 50-5-57 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A.), the Agency hereby certifies the Contractor as a source of supply to the User Agencies of the goods and services identified in this Statewide Contract. Orders shall be placed individually and from time to time by the User Agencies. The execution of this Statewide Contract only establishes the Contractor as an authorized source of supply by the Agency and creates no financial obligation on the part of the Agency.
- 3. **Priority of Contract Provisions**. Any pre-printed contract terms and conditions included on Contractor's forms or invoices shall be null and void.
- 4. Reporting Requirements. Contractor shall provide all reports required by the RFQ. In addition, unless otherwise provided in the RFQ, Contractor shall keep a record of the purchases made pursuant to the Statewide Contract and shall submit a quarterly written report to the Agency.

B. DURATION OF CONTRACT

- 1. Contract Term. The Statewide Contract shall begin and end on the dates specified in the Statewide Contract Form unless terminated earlier in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions. Renewal will depend upon the best interests of the State, funding, and Contractor's performance. Renewal will be accomplished through the issuance of a Notice of Award Amendment. Upon the Agency's election, in its sole discretion, to renew any part of this Statewide Contract, Contractor shall remain obligated to perform in strict accordance with this Statewide Contract unless otherwise agreed by the Agency and the Contractor.
- 3. Contract Extension. In the event that this Statewide Contract shall terminate or be likely to terminate prior to the making of an award for a new contract for the identified goods and services, the Agency may, with the written consent of Contractor, extend this Statewide Contract for such period as may be necessary to afford the State a continuous supply of the identified goods and services.

- 3. Priority of Contract Provisions. Any pre-printed contract terms and conditions included on Contractor's forms or invoices shall be null and void.
- 4. Reporting Requirements. Contractor shall provide all reports required by the RFQ. In addition, unless otherwise provided in the RFQ, Contractor shall keep a record of the purchases made pursuant to the Statewide Contract and shall submit a quarterly written report to the Agency.

B. DURATION OF CONTRACT

- 1. Contract Term. The Statewide Contract shall begin and end on the dates specified in the Statewide Contract Form unless terminated earlier in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Renewal will depend upon the best interests of the State, funding, and Contractor's performance. Renewal will be accomplished through the issuance of a Notice of Award Amendment. Upon the Agency's election, in its sole discretion, to renew any part of this Statewide Contract, Contractor shall remain obligated to perform in strict accordance with this Statewide Contract unless otherwise agreed by the Agency and the Contractor.
- 3. Contract Extension. In the event that this Statewide Contract shall terminate or be likely to terminate prior to the making of an award for a new contract for the identified goods and services, the Agency may, with the written consent of Contractor, extend this Statewide Contract for such period as may be necessary to afford the State a continuous supply of the identified goods and services.

C. DESCRIPTION OF GOODS AND SERVICES

Specifications in Bidding Documents. The Contractor shall provide all goods, services, and
other deliverables in compliance with the specifications contained in the RFQ and the terms of
the Statewide Contract, plus those equipment, services and deliverables as may additionally
be described in the Response.

- 2. Product Shipment and Delivery. All products shall be shipped F.O.B. destination. Destination shall be the location(s) specified in the RFQ or any provided Purchase Instrument. All items shall be at the Contractor's risk until they have been delivered and accepted by the receiving entity. All items shall be subject to inspection on delivery. Hidden damage will remain the responsibility of the Contractor to remedy without cost to the User Agencies, regardless of when the hidden damage is discovered.
- 3. Non-Exclusive Rights. The Statewide Contract is not exclusive. The Agency reserves the right to select other contractors to provide goods and services similar to goods and services described in the Statewide Contract during the term of the Statewide Contract. User Agencies may obtain similar goods and services from other contractors upon prior approval of the Agency, which approval shall be made at the sole discretion of the Agency when it is deemed to be in the best interests of the State and shall be conclusive.
- **4. No Minimums Guaranteed.** The Statewide Contract does not guarantee any minimum level of purchases.

D. COMPENSATION

1. Pricing and Payment. The Contractor will be paid for the goods and services sold pursuant to the Statewide Contract in accordance with the RFQ and final pricing documents as incorporated into the Statewide Contract Form and the terms of the Statewide Contract. Unless clearly stated otherwise in the Statewide Contract, all percentages off catalog prices are minimum percentages off catalog prices and can be increased but not decreased. Delivery pricing is considered ceiling pricing and can be lowered to meet to ensure the Authorized Users receive competitive delivery prices. Prices include, but are not limited to insurance, fuel surcharges and customs duties. User Agencies are solely and individually financially responsible for their respective purchases.

Supplier price list must remain firm for 1 year from the date of award. Price increase requests will be reviewed on an annual basis after the twelfth (12) month at contract renewal. If renewal options are exercised, the below mentioned price increase methodology will be used to determine any price adjustments. Increase(s) will not exceed the average percentage increase as shown for the previous twelve (12) month period for two US Department of Labor Producer Price Index (PPI) series ID Numbers: 336110 Automobile and Light Truck Manufacturing and 441110 New Car Dealers. Temporary data will not be used in the evaluation. In the event the increase request exceeds the increase amount allowed by the PPI, supplier(s) must provide strong justification and invoices from the manufacturer to substantiate. The State must be notified at least sixty (60) days in advance prior to any price change, and the Supplier must have the State's approval before such change may be implemented.

DOAS expects any market reductions to be passed along to the State. If the PPI Series ID (referenced in Mandatory Requirement # 17 above) reflect a decrease of two percent (2%) or greater for the previous 12 months of activity, prices may be reduced to the State accordingly on an annual basis, and the Bidder(s) will be notified no less than 30 days in advance. Supplier agrees and will comply with this section.

2. Billings. If applicable, and unless the RFQ provides otherwise, the Contractor shall submit, on a regular basis, an invoice for goods and services supplied to the User Agencies under the Statewide Contract at the billing address specified in the Purchase Instrument or Statewide Contract. The invoice shall comply with all applicable rules concerning payment of such claims. User Agencies shall pay all approved invoices in arrears and in accordance with applicable provisions of State law.

Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Agency and the Contractor, the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any other payment or compensation from the User Agencies for any goods or services provided by or on behalf of the Contractor under the Statewide Contract. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for paying all costs, expenses and charges it incurs in connection with its performance under the Statewide Contract.

- 3. Delay of Payment Due to Contractor's Failure. If the User Agencies in good faith determine that the Contractor has failed to perform or deliver any service or product as required by the Statewide Contract, the Contractor shall not be entitled to any compensation under the Statewide Contract until such service or product is performed or delivered. In this event, the User Agencies may withhold that portion of the Contractor's compensation which represents payment for services or products that were not performed or delivered. To the extent that the Contractor's failure to perform or deliver in a timely manner causes the User Agencies to incur costs, the User Agencies may deduct the amount of such incurred costs from any amounts payable to Contractor. The User Agencies' authority to deduct such incurred costs shall not in any way affect the Agency's sole authority to terminate the Statewide Contract.
- 4. Set-Off Against Sums Owed by the Contractor. In the event that the Contractor owes the User Agency any sum or the User Agency must obtain substitute performance, the User Agency may set off the sum owed against any sum owed by the User Agency to the Contractor.

E. TERMINATION

- 1. Immediate Termination. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Section 50-5-64, any purchase made pursuant to this Statewide Contract will terminate immediately and absolutely if the User Agency determines that adequate funds are not appropriated or granted or funds are deappropriated such that the User Agency cannot fulfill its obligations under the Statewide Contract, which determination is at the User Agency's sole discretion and shall be conclusive. Further, the Agency may terminate the Statewide Contract for any one or more of the following reasons effective immediately without advance notice:
 - (i) In the event the Contractor is required to be certified or licensed as a condition precedent to providing goods and services, the revocation or loss of such license or certification may result in immediate termination of the Statewide Contract effective as of the date on which the license or certification is no longer in effect;
 - (ii) The Agency determines that the actions, or failure to act, of the Contractor, its agents, employees or subcontractors have caused, or reasonably could cause, life, health or safety to be jeopardized;
 - (iii) The Contractor fails to comply with confidentiality laws or provisions; and/or
 - (iv) The Contractor furnished any statement, representation or certification in connection with the Statewide Contract or the bidding process which is materially false, deceptive, incorrect or incomplete.
- 2. Termination for Cause. The occurrence of any one or more of the following events shall constitute cause for the Agency to declare the Contractor in default of its obligations under the Statewide Contract:

- (i) The Contractor fails to deliver or has delivered nonconforming goods or services or fails to perform, to the Agency's satisfaction, any material requirement of the Statewide Contract or is in violation of a material provision of the Statewide Contract, including, but without limitation, the express warranties made by the Contractor;
- (ii) The Agency determines that satisfactory performance of the Statewide Contract is substantially endangered or that a default is likely to occur;
- (iii) The Contractor fails to make substantial and timely progress toward performance of the Statewide Contract;
- (iv) The Contractor becomes subject to any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding under federal or state law to the extent allowed by applicable federal or state law including bankruptcy laws; the Contractor terminates or suspends its business; or the Agency reasonably believes that the Contractor has become insolvent or unable to pay its obligations as they accrue consistent with applicable federal or state law;
- (v) The Contractor has failed to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, ordinances, regulations and orders when performing within the scope of the Statewide Contract;
- (vi) The Contractor has engaged in conduct that has or may expose the Agency or the State to liability, as determined in the Agency's sole discretion; or
- (vii) The Contractor has infringed any patent, trademark, copyright, trade dress or any other intellectual property rights of the Agency, the State, or a third party.
- 3. Notice of Default. If there is a default event caused by the Contractor, the Agency shall provide written notice to the Contractor requesting that the breach or noncompliance be remedied within the period of time specified in the Agency's written notice to the Contractor. If the breach or noncompliance is not remedied within the period of time specified in the written notice, the Agency may:
 - (i) Immediately terminate the Statewide Contract without additional written notice; and/or
 - (ii) Procure substitute goods or services from another source and charge the difference between the Statewide Contract and the substitute contract to the defaulting Contractor; and/or,
 - (iii) Enforce the terms and conditions of the Statewide Contract and seek any legal or equitable remedies.
- 4. Termination Upon Notice. Following thirty (30) days' written notice, the Agency may terminate the Statewide Contract in whole or in part without the payment of any penalty or incurring any further obligation to the Contractor. Following termination upon notice, the Contractor shall be entitled to compensation from the User Agency, upon submission of invoices and proper proof of claim, for goods and services provided under the Statewide Contract to the User Agencies up to and including the date of termination.
- 5. Termination Due to Change in Law. The Agency shall have the right to terminate this Statewide Contract without penalty by giving thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor as a result of any of the following:

- (i) The Agency's authorization to operate is withdrawn or there is a material alteration in the programs administered by the Agency; and/or
- (ii) The Agency's duties are substantially modified.
- 6. Payment Limitation in Event of Termination. In the event of termination of the Statewide Contract for any reason by the Agency, the User Agencies shall pay only those amounts, if any, due and owing to the Contractor for goods and services actually rendered up to the date specified in the notice of termination for which the User Agencies are obligated to pay pursuant to the Statewide Contract or Purchase Instrument. Payment will be made only upon submission of invoices and proper proof of the Contractor's claim. This provision in no way limits the remedies available to the State under the Statewide Contract in the event of termination. The State shall not be liable for any costs incurred by the Contractor in its performance of the Statewide Contract, including, but not limited to, startup costs, overhead or other costs associated with the performance of the Statewide Contract.
- 7. The Contractor's Termination Duties. Upon receipt of notice of termination or upon request of the Agency, the Contractor shall:
 - (i) Cease work under the Statewide Contract and take all necessary or appropriate steps to limit disbursements and minimize costs, and furnish a report within thirty (30) days of the date of notice of termination, describing the status of all work under the Statewide Contract, including, without limitation, results accomplished, conclusions resulting therefrom, and any other matters the Agency may require;
 - (ii) Immediately cease using and return to the State, any personal property or materials, whether tangible or intangible, provided by the State to the Contractor;
 - (iii) Comply with the State's instructions for the timely transfer of any active files and work product produced by the Contractor under the Statewide Contract;
 - (iv) Cooperate in good faith with the Agency, the User Agencies, and their employees, agents and contractors during the transition period between the notification of termination and the substitution of any replacement contractor; and
 - (v) Immediately return to the User Agencies any payments made by the User Agencies for goods and services that were not delivered or rendered by the Contractor.

F. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 1. Access to Confidential Data. The Contractor's employees, agents and subcontractors may have access to confidential data maintained by the State to the extent necessary to carry out the Contractor's responsibilities under the Statewide Contract. The Contractor shall presume that all information received pursuant to the Statewide Contract is confidential unless otherwise designated by the State. If it is reasonably likely the Contractor will have access to the State's confidential information, then:
 - (i) The Contractor shall provide to the State a written description of the Contractor's policies and procedures to safeguard confidential information;
 - (ii) Policies of confidentiality shall address, as appropriate, information conveyed in verbal, written, and electronic formats:

- (iii) The Contractor must designate one individual who shall remain the responsible authority in charge of all data collected, used, or disseminated by the Contractor in connection with the performance of the Statewide Contract; and
- (iv) The Contractor shall provide adequate supervision and training to its agents, employees and subcontractors to ensure compliance with the terms of the Statewide Contract.

The private or confidential data shall remain the property of the State at all times. Some services performed for the Agency and/or User Agencies may require the Contractor to sign a nondisclosure agreement. Contractor understands and agrees that refusal or failure to sign such a nondisclosure agreement, if required, may result in termination of the Statewide Contract.

- 2. No Dissemination of Confidential Data. No confidential data collected, maintained, or used in the course of performance of the Statewide Contract shall be disseminated except as authorized by law and with the written consent of the State, either during the period of the Statewide Contract or thereafter. Any data supplied to or created by the Contractor shall be considered the property of the State. The Contractor must return any and all data collected, maintained, created or used in the course of the performance of the Statewide Contract, in whatever form it is maintained, promptly at the request of the State.
- 3. Subpoena. In the event that a subpoena or other legal process is served upon the Contractor for records containing confidential information, the Contractor shall promptly notify the State and cooperate with the State in any lawful effort to protect the confidential information.
- 4. Reporting of Unauthorized Disclosure. The Contractor shall immediately report to the State any unauthorized disclosure of confidential information.
- 5. Survives Termination. The Contractor's confidentiality obligation under the Statewide Contract shall survive termination of the Statewide Contract.

G. INDEMNIFICATION

- 1. Contractor's Indemnification Obligation. The Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State and State officers, employees, agents, and volunteers (collectively, "Indemnified Parties") from any and all costs, expenses, losses, claims, damages, liabilities, settlements and judgments, including reasonable value of the time spent by the Attorney General's Office, related to or arising from:
 - (i) Any breach of the Statewide Contract;
 - (ii) Any negligent, intentional or wrongful act or omission of the Contractor or any employee, agent or subcontractor utilized or employed by the Contractor;
 - (iii) Any failure of goods to comply with applicable specifications, warranties, and certifications under the Statewide Contract;
 - (iv) The negligence or fault of the Contractor in design, testing, development, manufacture, or otherwise with respect to the goods or any parts thereof provided under the Statewide Contract:

- (v) Claims, demands, or lawsuits that, with respect to the goods or any parts thereof, allege product liability, strict product liability, or any variation thereof:
- (vi) The Contractor's performance or attempted performance of the Statewide Contract, including any employee, agent or subcontractor utilized or employed by the Contractor;
- (vii) Any failure by the Contractor to comply with the "Compliance with the Law" provision of the Statewide Contract;
- (viii) Any failure by the Contractor to make all reports, payments and withholdings required by federal and state law with respect to social security, employee income and other taxes, fees or costs required by the Contractor to conduct business in the State of Georgia or the United States;
- (ix) Any infringement of any copyright, trademark, patent, trade dress, or other intellectual property right; or
- (x) Any failure by the Contractor to adhere to the confidentiality provisions of the Statewide Contract.
- 2. Duty to Reimburse State Tort Claims Fund. To the extent such damage or loss as covered by this indemnification is covered by the State of Georgia Tort Claims Fund ("the Fund"), the Contractor (and its insurers) agrees to reimburse the Fund. To the full extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State and the terms of the Fund, the Contractor and its insurers waive any right of subrogation against the State, the Indemnified Parties, and the Fund and insurers participating thereunder, to the full extent of this indemnification.
- 3. Litigation and Settlements. The Contractor shall, at its own expense, be entitled to and shall have the duty to participate in the defense of any suit against the Indemnified Parties. No settlement or compromise of any claim, loss or damage entered into by the Indemnified Parties shall be binding upon Contractor unless approved in writing by Contractor. No settlement or compromise of any claim, loss or damage entered into by Contractor shall be binding upon the Indemnified Parties unless approved in writing by the Indemnified Parties.
- 4. Patent/Copyright Infringement Indemnification. Contractor shall, at its own expense, be entitled to and shall have the duty to participate in the defense of any suit instituted against the State and indemnify the State against any award of damages and costs made against the State by a final judgment of a court of last resort in such suit insofar as the same is based on any claim that any of the software constitutes an infringement of any United States Letters Patent or copyright, provided the State gives the Contractor immediate notice in writing of the institution of such suit, permits Contractor to fully participate in the defense of the same, and gives Contractor all available information, assistance and authority to enable Contractor to do so. Subject to approval of the Attorney General of the State of Georgia, the Agency shall tender defense of any such action to Contractor upon request by Contractor. Contractor shall not be liable for any award of judgment against the State reached by compromise or settlement unless Contractor accepts the compromise or settlement. Contractor shall have the right to enter into negotiations for and the right to effect settlement or compromise of any such action, but no such settlement shall be binding upon the State unless approved by the State.

In case any of the software is in any suit held to constitute infringement and its use is enjoined, Contractor shall, at its option and expense:

(i) Procure for the State the right to continue using the software;

- (ii) Replace or modify the same so that it becomes non-infringing; or
- (iii) Remove the same and cancel any future charges pertaining thereto.

Contractor, however, shall have no liability to the State if any such patent, or copyright infringement or claim thereof is based upon or arises out of:

- (i) Compliance with designs, plans or specifications furnished by or on behalf of the Agency as to the software;
- (ii) Use of the software in combination with apparatus or devices not supplied by Contractor;
- (iii) Use of the software in a manner for which the same was neither designed nor contemplated; or
- (iv) The claimed infringement of any patent or copyright in which the Agency or any affiliate or subsidiary of the Agency has any direct interest by license or otherwise.
- 5. Survives Termination. The indemnification obligation of the Contractor shall survive termination of the Statewide Contract.

H. INSURANCE

Contractor shall provide all insurance as required by the RFQ.

I. BONDS

The Contractor shall provide all required bonds in accordance with the terms of the RFQ and as stated in the Statewide Contract Form.

J. WARRANTIES

- 1. Construction of Warranties Expressed in the Contract with Warranties Implied by Law. All warranties made by the Contractor and/or subcontractors in all provisions of the Statewide Contract and the Contractor's Response, whether or not the Statewide Contract specifically denominates the Contractor's and/or subcontractors' promise as a warranty or whether the warranty is created only by the Contractor's affirmation or promise, or is created by a description of the materials, goods and services to be provided, or by provision of samples to the State shall not be construed as limiting or negating any warranty provided by law, including without limitation, warranties which arise through course of dealing or usage of trade, the warranty of merchantability, and the warranty of fitness for a particular purpose. The warranties expressed in the Statewide Contract are intended to modify the warranties implied by law only to the extent that they expand the warranties applicable to the goods and services provided by the Contractor. The provisions of this section apply during the term of the Statewide Contract and any extensions or renewals thereof.
- 2. Warranty Nonconforming Goods. All goods delivered by Contractor to the User Agencies shall be free from any defects in design, material, or workmanship. If any goods offered by the Contractor are found to be defective in material or workmanship, or do not conform to Contractor's warranty, the User Agencies shall have the option of returning, repairing, or replacing the defective goods at Contractor's expense. Payment for goods shall not constitute

- acceptance. Acceptance by the User Agencies shall not relieve the Contractor of its warranty or any other obligation under the Statewide Contract.
- 3. Compliance with Federal Safety Acts. Contractor warrants and guarantees to the State that the goods provided under the Statewide Contract are in compliance with Sections 5 and 12 of the Federal Trade Commission Act; the Fair Packaging and Labeling Act; the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act; the Consumer Product Safety Act; the Federal Environmental Pesticide Control Act; the Federal Hazardous Substances Act; the Fair Labor Standards Act; the Wool Products Labeling Act; the Flammable Fabrics Act; the Occupational Safety and Health Act; the Office of Management and Budget A-110 Appendix A; and the Anti-Kickback Act of 1986.
- 4. Originality and Title to Concepts, Materials, and Goods Produced. Contractor represents and warrants that all the concepts, materials, goods and services produced, or provided to the State pursuant to the terms of the Statewide Contract shall be wholly original with the Contractor or that the Contractor has secured all applicable interests, rights, licenses, permits or other intellectual property rights in such concepts, materials and works. The Contractor represents and warrants that the concepts, materials, goods and services and the State's use of same and the exercise by the State of the rights granted by the Statewide Contract shall not infringe upon any other work, other than material provided by the Statewide Contract to the Contractor to be used as a basis for such materials, or violate the rights of publicity or privacy of, or constitute a libel or slander against, any person, firm or corporation and that the concepts, materials and works will not infringe upon the copyright, trademark, trade name, trade dress patent, literary, dramatic, statutory, common law or any other rights of any person, firm or corporation or other entity. The Contractor represents and warrants that it is the owner of or otherwise has the right to use and distribute the goods and services contemplated by the Statewide Contract.
- 5. Conformity with Contractual Requirements. The Contractor represents and warrants that the goods and services provided in accordance with the Statewide Contract will appear and operate in conformance with the terms and conditions of the Statewide Contract.
- 6. Authority to Enter into Contract. The Contractor represents and warrants that it has full authority to enter into the Statewide Contract and that it has not granted and will not grant any right or interest to any person or entity that might derogate, encumber or interfere with the rights granted to the State.
- 7. Obligations Owed to Third Parties. The Contractor represents and warrants that all obligations owed to third parties with respect to the activities contemplated to be undertaken by the Contractor pursuant to the Statewide Contract are or will be fully satisfied by the Contractor so that the State will not have any obligations with respect thereto.
- 8. Title to Property. The Contractor represents and warrants that title to any property assigned, conveyed or licensed to the State is good and that transfer of title or license to the State is rightful and that all property shall be delivered free of any security interest or other lien or encumbrance. Title to any supplies, materials, or equipment shall remain in the Contractor until fully paid for by the User Agencies.
- 9. Industry Standards. The Contractor represents and expressly warrants that all aspects of the goods and services provided or used by it shall at a minimum conform to the standards in the Contractor's industry. This requirement shall be in addition to any express warranties, representations, and specifications included in the Statewide Contract, which shall take precedence.

- 10. Contractor's Personnel and Staffing. Contractor warrants that all persons assigned to perform services under this Statewide Contract are either lawful employees of Contractor or lawful employees of a Subcontractor authorized by the Agency as specified in the RFQ. All persons assigned to perform services under this Statewide Contract shall be qualified to perform such services. Personnel assigned by Contractor shall have all professional licenses required to perform the services.
- 11. Use of State Vehicles. Contractor warrants that no State vehicles will be used by Contractor for the performance of services under this Statewide Contract. Contractor shall be responsible for providing transportation necessary to perform all services.

K. PRODUCT RECALL

In the event that any of the goods are found by the Contractor, the State, any governmental agency, or court having jurisdiction to contain a defect, serious quality or performance deficiency, or not to be in compliance with any standard or requirement so as to require or make advisable that such goods be reworked or recalled, the Contractor will promptly communicate all relevant facts to the Agency and undertake all corrective actions, including those required to meet all obligations imposed by laws, regulations, or orders, and shall file all necessary papers, corrective action programs, and other related documents, provided that nothing contained in this section shall preclude the Agency from taking such action as may be required of it under any such law or regulation. The Contractor shall perform all necessary repairs or modifications at its sole expense except to any extent that the Contractor and the State shall agree to the performance of such repairs by the State upon mutually acceptable terms.

L. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

- 1. Order of Preference. In the case of any inconsistency or conflict among the specific provisions of the Statewide Contract Terms and Conditions (including any amendments accepted by both the Agency and the Contractor attached hereto and the Awarded Item Schedule, if any), the RFQ (including any subsequent addenda and written responses to bidders' questions), and the Contractor's Response, any inconsistency or conflict shall be resolved as follows:
 - (i) First, by giving preference to the Statewide Contract Terms and Conditions.
 - (ii) Second, by giving preference to the specific provisions of the RFQ.
 - (iii) Third, by giving preference to the specific provisions of the Contractor's Response, except that objections or amendments by a Contractor that have not been explicitly accepted by the Agency in writing shall not be included in this Statewide Contract and shall be given no weight or consideration.

- 2. Intent of References to Bid Documents. The references to the parties' obligations, which are contained in this document, are intended to supplement or clarify the obligations as stated in the RFQ and the Contractor's Response. The failure of the parties to make reference to the terms of the RFQ or the Contractor's Response in this document shall not be construed as creating a conflict and will not relieve the Contractor of the contractual obligations imposed by the terms of the RFQ and the Contractor's Response. The contractual obligations of the Agency cannot be implied from the Contractor's Response.
- Compliance with the Law. The Contractor, its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall 3. comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, regulations and orders now or hereafter in effect when performing under the Statewide Contract, including without limitation, all laws applicable to the prevention of discrimination in employment and the use of targeted small businesses as subcontractors or contractors. The Contractor, its employees, agents and subcontractors shall also comply with all federal, state and local laws regarding business permits and licenses that may be required to carry out the work performed under the Statewide Contract. Contractor and Contractor's personnel shall also comply with all State, Agency, and User Agency policies and standards in effect during the performance of the Statewide Contract, including but not limited to the Agency and User Agencies' policies and standards relating to personnel conduct, security, safety, confidentiality, and ethics. Further, the provisions of O.C.G.A. Section 45-10-20 et seq. have not and must not be violated under the terms of this Statewide Contract. Contractor certifies that Contractor is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of this Contract not to engage in, a boycott of Israel, as defined in O.C.G.A. §50-5-85.
- 4. Drug-free Workplace. The Contractor hereby certifies as follows:
 - (i) Contractor will not engage in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of this Statewide Contract; and
 - (ii) If Contractor has more than one employee, including Contractor, Contractor shall provide for such employee(s) a drug-free workplace, in accordance with the Georgia Drug-free Workplace Act as provided in O.C.G.A. Section 50-24-1 et seq., throughout the duration of this Statewide Contract; and
 - (iii) Contractor will secure from any subcontractor hired to work on any job assigned under this Statewide Contract the following written certification: "As part of the subcontracting agreement with (Contractor's Name), (Subcontractor's Name) certifies to the contractor that a drug-free workplace will be provided for the subcontractor's employees during the performance of this Contract pursuant to paragraph 7 of subsection (b) of Code Section 50-24-3."

Contractor may be suspended, terminated, or debarred if it is determined that:

- (i) Contractor has made false certification here in above; or
- (ii) Contractor has violated such certification by failure to carry out the requirements of O.C.G.A. Section 50-24-3(b).
- 5. Amendments. The Statewide Contract may be amended in writing from time to time by mutual consent of the parties and upon approval by the Agency. All amendments to the Statewide Contract must be in writing and fully executed by duly authorized representatives of the Agency and the Contractor.

- **6. Third Party Beneficiaries.** There are no third-party beneficiaries to the Statewide Contract. The Statewide Contract is intended only to benefit the State and the Contractor.
- 7. Choice of Law and Forum. The laws of the State of Georgia shall govern and determine all matters arising out of or in connection with this Statewide Contract without regard to the choice of law provisions of State law. In the event any proceeding of a quasi-judicial or judicial nature is commenced in connection with this Statewide Contract, such proceeding shall solely be brought in a court or other forum of competent jurisdiction within Fulton County, Georgia. This provision shall not be construed as waiving any immunity to suit or liability, including without limitation sovereign immunity, which may be available to the State.
- 8. Parties' Duty to Provide Notice of Intent to Litigate and Right to Demand Mediation. In addition to any dispute resolution procedures otherwise required under this Statewide Contract or any informal negotiations which may occur between the State and the Contractor, no civil action with respect to any dispute, claim or controversy arising out of or relating to this Statewide Contract may be commenced without first giving fourteen (14) calendar days written notice to the State of the claim and the intent to initiate a civil action. At any time prior to the commencement of a civil action, either the State or the Contractor may elect to submit the matter for mediation. Either the State or the Contractor may exercise the right to submit the matter for mediation by providing the other party with a written demand for mediation setting forth the subject of the dispute. The parties will cooperate with one another in selecting a mediator and in scheduling the mediation proceedings. Venue for the mediation will be in Atlanta, Georgia; provided, however, that any or all mediation proceedings may be conducted by teleconference with the consent of the mediator. The parties covenant that they will participate in the mediation in good faith, and that they will share equally in its costs; provided, however that the cost to the State shall not exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).

All offers, promises, conduct and statements, whether oral or written, made in the course of the mediation by any of the parties, their agents, employees, experts and attorneys, and by the mediator or employees of any mediation service, are inadmissible for any purpose (including but not limited to impeachment) in any litigation or other proceeding involving the parties, provided that evidence that is otherwise admissible or discoverable shall not be rendered inadmissible or non-discoverable as a result of its use in the mediation. Inadmissibility notwithstanding, all written documents shall nevertheless be subject to the Georgia Open Records Act O.C.G.A. Section 50-18-70 et.seq.

No party may commence a civil action with respect to the matters submitted to mediation until after the completion of the initial mediation session, forty-five (45) calendar days after the date of filing the written request for mediation with the mediator or mediation service, or sixty (60) calendar days after the delivery of the written demand for mediation, whichever occurs first. Mediation may continue after the commencement of a civil action, if the parties so desire.

9. Assignment and Delegation. The Statewide Contract may not be assigned, transferred or conveyed in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the Agency. For the purpose of construing this clause, a transfer of a controlling interest in the Contractor shall be considered an assignment.

- 10. Use of Third Parties. Except as may be expressly agreed to in writing by the Agency, Contractor shall not subcontract, assign, delegate or otherwise permit anyone other than Contractor or Contractor's personnel to perform any of Contractor's obligations under this Statewide Contract or any of the work subsequently assigned under this Statewide Contract. No subcontract which Contractor enters into with respect to performance of obligations or work assigned under the Statewide Contract shall in any way relieve Contractor of any responsibility, obligation or liability under this Statewide Contract and for the acts and omissions of all subcontractors, agents, and employees. All restrictions, obligations and responsibilities of the Contractor under the Statewide Contract shall also apply to the subcontractors. Any contract with a subcontractor must also preserve the rights of the Agency. The Agency shall have the right to request the removal of a subcontractor from the Statewide Contract for good cause.
- 11. Integration. The Statewide Contract represents the entire agreement between the parties. The parties shall not rely on any representation that may have been made which is not included in the Statewide Contract.
- **12. Headings or Captions.** The paragraph headings or captions used in the Statewide Contract are for identification purposes only and do not limit or construe the contents of the paragraphs.
- 13. Not a Joint Venture. Nothing in the Statewide Contract shall be construed as creating or constituting the relationship of a partnership, joint venture, (or other association of any kind or agent and principal relationship) between the parties thereto. Each party shall be deemed to be an independent contractor contracting for goods and services and acting toward the mutual benefits expected to be derived herefrom. Neither Contractor nor any of Contractor's agents, servants, employees, subcontractors or contractors shall become or be deemed to become agents, servants, or employees of the State. Contractor shall therefore be responsible for compliance with all laws, rules and regulations involving its employees and any subcontractors, including but not limited to employment of labor, hours of labor, health and safety, working conditions, workers' compensation insurance, and payment of wages. No party has the authority to enter into any contract or create an obligation or liability on behalf of, in the name of, or binding upon another party to the Statewide Contract.
- 14. Joint and Several Liability. If the Contractor is a joint entity, consisting of more than one individual, partnership, corporation or other business organization, all such entities shall be jointly and severally liable for carrying out the activities and obligations of the Statewide Contract, and for any default of activities and obligations.
- 15. Supersedes Former Contracts or Agreements. Unless otherwise specified in the Statewide Contract, this Statewide Contract supersedes all prior contracts or agreements between the Agency and the Contractor for the goods and services provided in connection with the Statewide Contract.
- 16. Waiver. Except as specifically provided for in a waiver signed by duly authorized representatives of the Agency and the Contractor, failure by either party at any time to require performance by the other party or to claim a breach of any provision of the Statewide Contract shall not be construed as affecting any subsequent right to require performance or to claim a breach.
- 17. Notice. Any and all notices, designations, consents, offers, acceptances or any other communication provided for herein shall be given in writing by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, by receipted hand delivery, by Federal Express, courier or other similar and reliable carrier which shall be addressed to the person who signed the Statewide

Contract on behalf of the party at the address identified in the Statewide Contract Form. Each such notice shall be deemed to have been provided:

- (i) At the time it is actually received; or,
- (ii) Within one (1) day in the case of overnight hand delivery, courier or services such as Federal Express with guaranteed next day delivery; or,
- (iii) Within five (5) days after it is deposited in the U.S. Mail in the case of registered U.S. Mail.

From time to time, the parties may change the name and address of the person designated to receive notice. Such change of the designated person shall be in writing to the other party and as provided herein.

- 18. Cumulative Rights. The various rights, powers, options, elections and remedies of any party provided in the Statewide Contract shall be construed as cumulative and not one of them is exclusive of the others or exclusive of any rights, remedies or priorities allowed either party by law, and shall in no way affect or impair the right of any party to pursue any other equitable or legal remedy to which any party may be entitled as long as any default remains in any way unremedied, unsatisfied or undischarged.
- 19. Severability. If any provision of the Statewide Contract is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other part or provision of the Statewide Contract. Further, if any provision of the Statewide Contract is determined to be unenforceable by virtue of its scope, but may be made enforceable by a limitation of the provision, the provision shall be deemed to be amended to the minimum extent necessary to render it enforceable under the applicable law. Any agreement of the Agency and the Contractor to amend, modify, eliminate, or otherwise change any part of this Statewide Contract shall not affect any other part of this Statewide Contract, and the remainder of this Statewide Contract shall continue to be of full force and effect.
- 20. Time is of the Essence. Time is of the essence with respect to the performance of the terms of the Statewide Contract. Contractor shall ensure that all personnel providing goods and services to the State are responsive to the State's requirements and requests in all respects.
- 21. Authorization. The persons signing this Statewide Contract represent and warrant to the other parties that:
 - (i) It has the right, power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under the Statewide Contract; and
 - (ii) It has taken all requisite action (corporate, statutory or otherwise) to approve execution, delivery and performance of the Statewide Contract and the Statewide Contract constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation upon itself in accordance with its terms.
- **22. Successors in Interest.** All the terms, provisions, and conditions of the Statewide Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors, assigns and legal representatives.
- 23. Record Retention and Access. The Contractor shall maintain books, records and documents which sufficiently and properly document and calculate all charges billed to the

State throughout the term of the Statewide Contract for a period of at least five (5) years following the date of final payment or completion of any required audit, whichever is later. The Contractor should maintain separate accounts and records for the Agency and the User Agencies. Records to be maintained include both financial records and service records. The Contractor shall permit the Auditor of the State of Georgia or any authorized representative of the State, and where federal funds are involved, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any other authorized representative of the United States government, to access and examine, audit, excerpt and transcribe any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, electronic or optically stored and created records or other records of the Contractor relating to orders, invoices or payments or any other documentation or materials pertaining to the Statewide Contract, wherever such records may be located during normal business hours. The Contractor shall not impose a charge for audit or examination of the Contractor's books and records. If an audit discloses incorrect billings or improprieties, the State reserves the right to charge the Contractor for the cost of the audit and appropriate reimbursement. Evidence of criminal conduct will be turned over to the proper authorities.

- 24. Solicitation. The Contractor warrants that no person or selling agency (except bona fide employees or selling agents maintained for the purpose of securing business) has been employed or retained to solicit and secure the Statewide Contract upon an agreement or understanding for commission, percentage, brokerage or contingency.
- **25. Public Records.** The laws of the State of Georgia, including the Georgia Open Records Act, as provided in O.C.G.A. Section 50-18-70 et seq., require procurement records and other records to be made public unless otherwise provided by law.
- 26. Clean Air and Water Certification. Contractor certifies that none of the facilities it uses to produce goods provided under the Statewide Contract are on the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) List of Violating Facilities. Contractor will immediately notify the Agency of the receipt of any communication indicating that any of Contractor's facilities are under consideration to be listed on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.
- 27. Debarred, Suspended, and Ineligible Status. Contractor certifies that the Contractor and/or any of its subcontractors have not been debarred, suspended, or declared ineligible by any agency of the State of Georgia or as defined in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 48 C.F.R. Ch.1 Subpart 9.4. Contractor will immediately notify the Agency if Contractor is debarred by the State or placed on the Consolidated List of Debarred, Suspended, and Ineligible Contractors by a federal entity.
- 28. Use of Name or Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees it will not use the name or any intellectual property, including but not limited to, State trademarks or logos in any manner, including commercial advertising or as a business reference, without the expressed prior written consent of the State.
- 29. Taxes. User Agencies are exempt from Federal Excise Taxes, and no payment will be made for any taxes levied on Contractor's employee's wages. User Agencies are exempt from State and Local Sales and Use Taxes on the services. Tax Exemption Certificates will be furnished upon request. Contractor or an authorized subcontractor has provided the Agency with a sworn verification regarding the filing of unemployment taxes or persons assigned by Contractor to perform services required in this Statewide Contract, which verification is incorporated herein by reference.
- 30. Certification Regarding Sales and Use Tax. By executing the Statewide Contract the Contractor certifies it is either (a) registered with the State Department of Revenue, collects,

and remits State sales and use taxes as required by Georgia law, including Chapter 8 of Title 48 of the O.C.G.A.; or (b) not a "retailer" as defined in O.C.G.A. Section 48-8-2. The Contractor also acknowledges that the State may declare the Statewide Contract void if the above certification is false. The Contractor also understands that fraudulent certification may result in the Agency or its representative filing for damages for breach of contract.

- 31. Delay or Impossibility of Performance. Neither party shall be in default under the Statewide Contract if performance is delayed or made impossible by an act of God. In each such case, the delay or impossibility must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. If delay results from a subcontractor's conduct, negligence or failure to perform, the Contractor shall not be excused from compliance with the terms and obligations of the Statewide Contract.
- 32. Limitation of Contractor's Liability to the State. Except as otherwise provided in this Statewide Contract, Contractor's liability to the State for any claim of damages arising out of this Statewide Contract shall be limited to direct damages and shall not exceed the total amount paid to Contractor for the performance under this Statewide Contract.

No limitation of Contractor's liability shall apply to Contractor's liability for loss or damage to State equipment or other property while such equipment or other property is in the sole care, custody, and control of Contractor's personnel. Contractor hereby expressly agrees to assume all risk of loss or damage to any such State equipment or other property in the care, custody, and control of Contractor's personnel. Contractor further agrees that equipment transported by Contractor personnel in a vehicle belonging to Contractor (including any vehicle rented or leased by Contractor or Contractor's personnel) shall be deemed to be in the sole care, custody, and control of Contractor's personnel while being transported. Nothing in this section shall limit or affect Contractor's liability arising from claims brought by any third party.

- 33. Obligations Beyond Contract Term. The Statewide Contract shall remain in full force and effect to the end of the specified term or until terminated or canceled pursuant to the Statewide Contract. All obligations of the Contractor incurred or existing under the Statewide Contract as of the date of expiration, termination or cancellation will survive the termination, expiration or conclusion of the Statewide Contract.
- **34.** Counterparts. The Agency and the Contractor agree that the Statewide Contract has been or may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same instrument.
- **35.** Further Assurances and Corrective Instruments. The Agency and the Contractor agree that they will, from time to time, execute, acknowledge and deliver, or cause to be executed, acknowledged and delivered, such supplements hereto and such further instruments as may reasonably be required for carrying out the expressed intention of the Statewide Contract.
- 36. Transition Cooperation and Cooperation with other Contractors. Contractor agrees that upon termination of this Statewide Contract for any reason, it shall provide sufficient efforts and cooperation to ensure an orderly and efficient transition of services to the State or another contractor. The Contractor shall provide full disclosure to the State and the third-party contractor about the equipment, software, or services required to perform services for the State. The Contractor shall transfer licenses or assign agreements for any software or third-party services used to provide the services to the State or to another contractor.

Further, in the event that the State has entered into or enters into agreements with other contractors for additional work related to services rendered under the Statewide Contract,

Contractor agrees to cooperate fully with such other contractors. Contractor shall not commit any act, which will interfere with the performance of work by any other contractor.

ARTICLE #101 - INTRODUCTION

This Contract for Services to furnish and install four (4) standby generators at four (4) different County Facilities in Hall County., (hereinafter "Services") as entered into on [County to enter date here] and with an Effective Date of [County to enter date here], is by and between; Hall County, Georgia (hereinafter "County") located at 2875 30504, Gainesville, Georgia **Browns** Bridge Rd. located at 1743 cheveland frui Gainevile, 64 30511 Cain Eleutriu Cosinc. (hereinafter "Contractor"). Contractor is an entity that is legally registered and qualified, and holding any such licenses and certifications as may be required to render Services to do business in the State of Georgia. County and Contractor are known individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Whereas, the parties do mutually desire to enter into this Contract to document the provision of Services or other valuable consideration by the Contractor to the County in exchange for payment as compensation.

ARTICLE #102 - CONTRACT

A. Contractor agrees to provide the Services to the County as detailed herein as the **Scope of Work**, and for

locations and services as described in the <u>IFB #059-43</u> and the bidder's response.

Services include furnishing and installing new, outside playground equipment at Cool Springs Park.

- B. ARTICLE #104 - NON-EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS:

The Contract is not exclusive. The County reserves the right to select other Contractors to provide the Services similar to those described in this Contract, during the term of the Contract should the need arise or the contractor fail to perform.

ARTICLE #105 – CONTRACT TERM:

Until substantial, completion, and all sub-contractor(s) and material suppliers' liens are satisfied.

ARTICLE #106 - CONTRACT AMENDMENTS AND MODIFICATION:

This Contract can only be modified, amended, or added to in writing and fully executed by both parties hereto. This Contract document constitutes the sole and entire Contract and understanding between the parties as to the subject matter hereof, and no verbal promises have been made by either party in relation hereto.

ARTICLE # 107 - REMEDIES AND CONTRACT PERFORMANCE:

In the event that either party to this Contract breaches this Contract, including by failure to meet the timetables set forth herein, the non-breaching party shall provide written notice to the breaching party which describes the breach of this Contract. The party whose breach is alleged shall have thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the written notice to cure the breach or to otherwise negotiate a resolution of the breach.

If the breach has not been cured and the parties hereto have not resolved the issue described in the notice letter by thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice letter, the party authoring the letter shall be entitled to seek any and all remedies allowed by Georgia law, including damages, equitable relief, declaratory relief, specific performance, and/or seeking relief as to any bonds issued hereon. Additional provisions are;

A. Delay or Impossibility of Performance. Any failure or delay must be beyond the control of and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. If the Services to be provided to the County are interrupted by a Force Majeure Event, as defined below, the County will be entitled to an equitable adjustment to the fees and other payments due to the Contractor under this Contract. If delay results from a subcontractor's negligent conduct or failure to perform, the Contractor shall not be excused from compliance with the terms and obligations of the Contract. Epidemics and pandemics are not considered Force Majeure events by the County.

Neither party shall be held liable or responsible to the other party nor be deemed to have defaulted under or breached this Agreement for failure or delay in fulfilling or performing any obligation under this Agreement when such failure or delay is caused by or results from causes beyond the reasonable control of the affected party, including but not limited to fire, floods, embargoes, war, acts of war, insurrections, riots, strikes, lockouts or other labor disturbances, or acts of God; provided, however, that the party so affected shall use reasonable commercial efforts to avoid or remove such causes of nonperformance, and shall continue performance hereunder with reasonable dispatch whenever such causes are removed. Either party shall provide the

other party with prompt written notice of any delay or failure to perform that occurs by reason of Force Majeure.

Definition: The term 'force majeure' as defined in Black's Law Dictionary, is 'an event or effect that can be neither anticipated nor controlled. It is a contractual provision allocating the risk of loss if performance becomes impossible or impracticable, especially as a result of an event that the parties could not have anticipated or controlled."

- **B.** Obligations beyond Contract Term. The Contract shall remain in full force and effect to the end of the specified term or until terminated or canceled pursuant to the Contract.
- C. Transition Cooperation with the County and Cooperation with other Contractors. Contractor agrees that upon termination of this Contract for any reason, it shall provide sufficient efforts and reasonable cooperation and assistance to the County to ensure an orderly and efficient transition to the County or an alternative Contractor. Further, in the event that the County has entered into or enters into contracts with other Contractors related to the Services, Contractor agrees to cooperate fully with such other Contractors. Contractor shall not engage in any act that will interfere with the performance of work by any other Contractor(s).

ARTICLE # 108 - TERMINATION:

Either party may terminate this Contract by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party at any time. Should either party terminate this Contract prior to the date of automatic termination pursuant to section four (4) above, Contractor shall provide the County with all deliverables up to the date of termination thirty (30) days after the Notice to Terminate is issued. The County shall pay the Contractor for all work properly performed in compliance with the terms of the Contract up to the date of termination.

- A. **Termination for Convenience**. Following thirty (30) days written notice, either party may terminate the Contract in whole or in part for any reason without the payment of any penalty or incurring any further obligation to the Contractor.
- B. Termination for Cause. The occurrence of any one or more of the following events shall constitute cause for the County to declare the Contractor in default of its obligations under the Contract:
 - The Contractor fails to deliver or has delivered nonconforming Services or fails to perform, to the County's satisfaction, any material requirement of the Contract or is in violation of a material provision of the Contract, including, but without limitation, the express warranties made by the Contractor.

- 2. The County determines that satisfactory performance of the Contract is substantially endangered or that a default is likely to occur.
- The Contractor fails to make substantial and timely progress toward performance of the Contract.
- 4. The Contractor becomes subject to any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding under federal or state law to the extent allowed by applicable federal or state law including bankruptcy laws; the Contractor terminates or suspends its business; or the County reasonably believes that the Contractor has become insolvent or unable to pay its obligations as they accrue consistent with applicable federal or state law.
- 5. The Contractor has failed to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, County ordinances, regulations and orders when performing within the scope of the Contract.
- 6. The Contractor has engaged in conduct that has or may expose the County or the State to liability, as determined in the County's sole discretion; or a material breach of the terms of the Contract by County upon County's failure to cure such material breach after written notice thereof has been delivered in accordance with ARTICLE #108.C. below constitutes cause for the Contractor to declare that the County is in default of its obligations under the Contract.
- C. Notice of Default. If either party causes one or more of the default events set out in ARTICLE #108, then either party shall issue a written Notice-of-Default to the party that causes one or more of the default events, requesting that the breach or noncompliance be remedied within the period of time specified in the party's Notice-of-Default to the Contractor. If the breach or noncompliance is not remedied within the period of time specified in the written notice, the non-breaching party may:
 - Immediately terminate the Contract for default without additional written notice.
 - In the event of a breach by the Contractor, the County may procure substitute Services from another source and charge the difference between the Contract and the substitute Contract to the defaulting Contractor; and/or,
 - 3. Enforce the terms and conditions of the Contract and seek any legal or equitable remedies.
 - D. Termination Due to Non-Availability of Funds.

 This Contract will terminate immediately and absolutely if the County determines that adequate funds are de-appropriated such that the County cannot fulfill its obligations under the Contract, such

determination being at the County's sole discretion and conclusive. County agrees to provide prompt written notice to Contractor in the event of any de-appropriation.

E. Termination due to Failure of Contractor to Act.

The County may terminate the Contract for any one or more of the following reasons effective immediately without advance notice:

- In the event that the Contractor must be certified or licensed as a condition precedent to providing the Services, the revocation or loss of such license or certification may result in immediate termination of the Contract effective as of the date on which the license or certification is no longer in effect.
- The County determines that the actions, or failure to act, of the Contractor, its agents, employees or sub-Contractors have caused, or reasonably could cause, life, health or safety to be jeopardized.
- The Contractor furnished any statement, representation, or certification in connection with the Contract or the bidding process, which is materially false, deceptive, criminal activity, incorrect or incomplete.
- 4. Failure of the Contractor to obtain, provide, maintain, and deliver the Performance and Payment Bonds (if required) as and when required under this Contract, or failure to comply with any requirement pertaining to the appropriate amounts thereof as set forth in ARTICLE #123 PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BOND REQUIREMENT.
- F. Payment Limitation in Event of Termination. In the event of termination of the Contract for any reason by either party, the County shall pay only those amounts, if any, due and owing to the Contractor for Services actually received and accepted by the County up to and including the date of termination of the Contract and for which the County is obligated to pay pursuant to the Contract.
- G. The Contractor's Termination Duties. Upon receipt of notice of termination, the Contractor shall:
 - Cease work under the Contract and take all necessary or appropriate steps to limit disbursements and minimize costs and furnish a report within thirty (30) days of the date of notice of termination, describing the status of all work under the Contract, including, without limitation, results accomplished, conclusions resulting therefrom, and any other matters the County may require.
 - 2. Immediately cease using and return to the County, any personal property or materials, whether tangible or intangible, provided by the County to the Contractor.

- Comply with the County's instructions for the timely transfer of any active files and work product produced by the Contractor under the Contract.
- 4. Cooperate in good faith with the County, its employees, agents, and Contractors during the transition period between the notification of termination and the substitution of any replacement Contractor; and
- Immediately return to the County any payments made by the County for goods and services that were not delivered by the Contractor.
- H. Liquidated Damages. Reserved

ARTICLE # 109 - NO DEFENSE OR INDEMNIFICATION BY COUNTY:

The parties agree that the County shall not be responsible for defending or indemnifying any Contractor from any claim brought by any third party against the Contractor.

ARTICLE #110 - ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION BY CONTRACTOR:

The Contractor shall not assign or delegate this Contract, or any performance required by it, in whole or in part, without the prior express written consent of the County.

ARTICLE #111 - USE OF THIRD PARTIES (SUB-CONTRACTORS):

This Contract is for the benefit of the parties hereto only and is not intended to benefit any third-party or give rise to any duty or causes of action for any third party. All restrictions, obligations and responsibilities of the Contractor under the Contract shall also apply to third parties such as sub-Contractors, if allowed in writing by the County. Any Contract with a subcontractor must also preserve the rights of the County.

ARTICLE #112 - SUPERSEDES FORMER CONTRACTS

Unless otherwise specified in the Contract, this Contract supersedes all prior Contracts or Agreements between the County and the Contractor for the Services provided in connection with the Contract.

ARTICLE #113 - SEVERABILITY:

If any paragraph, sub-paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Contract is declared invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction or if the provisions of any part of this Contract as applied to any particular situation or set of circumstances shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not

be construed to affect the remaining portions of this Contract not so held to be invalid or the application of this Contract to other circumstances not so held to be invalid.

ARTICLE # 114 - RECORDS:

- A. Public Records Request. The Georgia Open Records Act, as provided in O.C.G.A. § 50-18-70 et seq, requires procurement records and all other records received by or prepared or maintained on behalf of the County, shall be made open to public inspection, unless otherwise provided by law.
 - B. Record Retention and Access. The Contractor shall maintain books, records, and documents in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures and which sufficiently and properly document and calculate all charges billed to the County throughout the term of the Contract for a period of at least five (5) years following the date of final payment or completion of any required audit, whichever is later. Records to be maintained include both financial records and service records.

ARTICLE # 115 - ADDITIONAL TERMS:

- A. The County shall not be bound by any terms and conditions included in any Contractor's literature, packaging, invoice, catalog, brochure, technical data sheet, on-line representation, warranties or service level agreement or other document which attempts to impose any condition in variance with or in addition to the terms and conditions contained herein.
- B. The County shall not be bound to any Terms and Conditions of the Contractor that are only accessible by hyper-link. All Terms and Conditions must be in print and approved by the County.

ARTICLE # 116 - WAIVER:

The failure of any party hereto to seek a remedy for any alleged breach of this Contract shall not constitute a waiver of any claim, cause of action, or remedy allowed by Georgia law for breach thereof.

ARTICLE # 117 - CONTRACTOR AND COUNTY RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS:

A. The County has the right to issue a written Stop Work Order at any time to require the Contractor cease any procedure, or the use of any equipment materials or chemicals considered by the County to be hazardous (or toxic) to persons, buildings, or surfaces. The Contractor will utilize acceptable substitutes as quickly as possible.

- B. The County has the right to require the Contractor to reassign or remove any employee or subcontractor's employee from the premises temporarily or permanently when, in the County's sole opinion, the employee is not suitable. The County's decision on this matter shall be final, and Contractor will remove this employee immediately and replace with a person of at least equivalent training, experience and requisite qualifications as quickly as possible, subject to the County's prior approval.
- C. Contractor agrees to obtain prior written approval from the County for the use of sub-Contractors to provide the Services described in *SCOPE OF WORK* prior to subcontractor's performance of work.

ARTICLE # 118- INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

Workers Compensation Insurance: Required for all contracts.

<u>Additional Provisions:</u> Waiver of Subrogation. The insurer agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against Hall County Board of Commissioners (BOC), its elected or appointed officers, officials, agents, authorized volunteers and employees for losses paid under the terms of this policy which arise from work performed by the Named Insured for Hall County BOC; but this provision applies regardless of whether or not Hall County BOC has received a waiver of subrogation from the insurer.

General Liability Insurance: Required for all contracts.

a. \$2,000,000 General Aggregate

b. \$2,000,000 Products & Completed Operations Aggregate

c. \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence

<u>Commercial Auto Liability Insurance</u>: Required for all contracts, except for Goods and/or Services that are remote in nature and/or are delivered by a professional delivery service.

d. \$100,000 Property Damage

e. \$1,000 for Medical Payments (no fault coverage)

Additional Provisions:

- a. Uninsured motorists coverage should be equal to the per occurrence limit except for contracts with other governmental entities

 - The insurance certificate must reference the Contract number assigned by the County and document that the liability coverage purchased by the Contractor includes contractual liability coverage to insure the indemnity agreement as stated herein.
- C. The Contractor understands and agrees that the foregoing policies will not be canceled, or not renewed or allowed to lapse for any reason until at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the County, or until such time as other valid and effective insurance coverage acceptable in every respect to the County and providing protection equal to protection called for in the policies referenced in this section shall have been received, accepted, and acknowledged by the County. Certificates of insurance showing such coverage to be in force shall be filed with the County prior to commencement of any work under the Contract. The foregoing policies shall be obtained from insurance companies licensed to do business in Georgia and, unless waived or modified in writing by the County, shall be an insurer with a minimum A.M. Best Rating of "A-". All such coverage shall remain in full force and effect during the term

- and any renewal or extension thereof. The insurance certificate must be submitted with this Contract.
- D. **Waiver of Subrogation.** There is no waiver of subrogation rights by either Party with respect to insurance.

ARTICLE # 119 - NO WAIVER:

- A. Authority to Enter into Contract. The Contractor represents and warrants that it has full authority to enter into and perform its obligations under the Contract and that the Contract constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation upon the Contractor in accordance with its terms. The representatives of the parties hereto also represent and warrant that they are authorized to sign this Contract on behalf of each party hereto."
 - B. **Solicitation**. The Contractor warrants that no person or selling agency (except bona fide employees or selling agents maintained for the purpose of securing business) has been employed or retained to solicit and secure the Contract upon an agreement or understanding for commission, percentage, brokerage or contingency.

ARTICLE # 120 - INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS and OWNERSHIP:

Contractor agrees it will not use the name or any intellectual property, including but not limited to, County trademarks or logos in any manner, including commercial advertising or as a business reference, without the expressed prior written consent of the County.

ARTICLE # 121 - COMPENSATION:

- A. The County will pay the Contractor for the Services provided pursuant to this Contract and in accordance with the prices quoted and conditions set forth in the Bidder's response on Exhibit C Mandatory Cost Proposal Worksheet, which is attached hereto and incorporated into this Contract as if fully set forth herein. Payments will be made monthly in arrears_to the Contractor after acceptance of the Contractor's delivered Services by the County, and after receipt of undisputed invoice to the County.
- B. Prices quoted shall be firm and fixed throughout the term of this Contract, unless otherwise Amended or Modified by mutual agreement.
- C. Cost may be prorated for Services added or removed under this Contract to align cost with the remaining term of Contract.

D. It is understood that this bid or proposal is made without collusion or fraud. Contractor understands and acknowledges that collusive bidding is a violation of state and federal law and may result in the cancellation of the Contract.

ARTICLE # 122 - COUNTY PAYMENT TO CONTRACTOR:

A. The County will issue a Notice to Proceed (NTP) to the Contractor, and Purchase Order(s) (herein after 'PO'). The terms of this Contract shall be incorporated by reference into any and all PO(s) issued prior to the expiration or termination of this Contract. The County will issue the PO by electronic mail (e-mail) to the Contractor's representative in *ARTICLE #103 - NOTICES*. A PO is considered "issued" when the e-mail containing the PO is sent by the County to the Contractor.

The Contractor shall not deliver any Services, equipment, devices, or components thereof until authorized in writing by the County through issuance of a PO, which shall provide a commencement Notice to Proceed date. Any work, including but not limited to travel, preliminary meetings, planning, etc., performed outside of the terms and conditions of and before the issuance of the PO will not be considered for payment. Contractors are not to begin work or ship any product on any verbal communication from within the County. The County will not be liable for payment for any work or product with the issuance of a verbal communication.

The Scope of Work shall remain in effect from the Notice to Proceed to completion of the project. The Parties agree that the County will not pay or otherwise compensate the Contractor for any Services, materials, equipment, devices or components thereof outside of the Scope of Work and/or beyond the term of this Contract, unless specifically authorized in writing as evidenced by an amendment (see ARTICLE #106 - CONTRACT AMENDMENTS &, MODIFICATION), a time extension letter, or as otherwise authorized by the County.

B. Invoice/Payment.

- Contractor shall invoice the County via email solely to <u>accountspayable@hallcounty.org</u> and only after the County inspects and accepts the Services provided. Receipt of the Services does not constitute acceptance. Invoice amounts shall not exceed the Contractor's pricing set forth in ARTICLE #102.
- 2. Each invoice shall include the Contractor's current "Remit to" address; a description and location of the Services provided; the invoice amount; the Contract number and the associated PO number issued. Each properly prepared invoice must be sent in accordance with the instructions listed on

- the PO. Standard payment terms are net 30 days (N30) in arrears from the date the invoice is accepted, following delivery of the Services.
- 3. The County does not pay for services not yet received but only in arrears.
- 4. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for paying all costs, expenses and charges it incurs in connection with its performance under the Contract, which includes release of any liens from all sub-contractors and material providers.

C. Unsatisfactory Performance; Delay of Payment.

- 1. If the County determines that the quality of the Services provided are deficient, unacceptable, or unsatisfactory, the County's Project Manager identified in ARTICLE #103 shall issue a written notice to Contractor. Contractor agrees that upon receipt of the written notice, it shall make every effort to correct the deficiency (ies) within the timeframe prescribed therein. If the Contractor fails to timely correct the deficiencies, the County reserves the right to delay or withhold payment pursuant to this ARTICLE #122 or terminate the Contract (ARTICLE #108 TERMINATION PROVISIONS).
- 2. Delay of Payment Due to Contractor's Failure. If the County determines that the Contractor has failed to perform or deliver any Services as required by the Contract, the Contractor shall not be entitled to any compensation under the Contract until such Services are delivered and accepted. In this event, the County may withhold that portion of the Contractor's compensation, which represents payment for Services that were not delivered. To the extent that the Contractor's failure to perform or deliver in a timely manner causes the County to incur costs, the County may deduct the amount of such incurred costs from any amounts payable to Contractor. The County's authority to deduct such incurred costs shall not in any way affect the County's authority to terminate the Contract.
- D. Set-Off Against Sums Owed by the Contractor. In the event that the Contractor owes the County any sum under the terms of the Contract, pursuant to any judgment, or pursuant to any law, the County may set off the sum owed by the Contractor against any sum owed to the Contractor, in the County's sole discretion.
- E. **Final Payment.** Contractor shall issue an invoice for final payment to the County no later than thirty (30) days following the expiration or termination date of the Contract.
- F. The Contractor must not "Factor or Assign Payments" to another or a financial institution. The County will only pay the party to whom it is contracted with. The County will not in any circumstances pay a third party.

ARTICLE #123 - PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BONDS

The Contractor must furnish to the County a Performance Bond equal to one-hundred percent (100%) of the Contract's total initial term dollar amount, and additionally a Payment Bond equal to one-hundred percent (100%) of the total initial term dollar amount. After receipt of the bonds, the County will issue a Notice-to-Proceed. Only surety companies licensed to do business in the State of Georgia are acceptable. The Contractor is required to provide new bonds at the issuance of each Renewal Option Term(s) or Extension(s) that follow.

The Contractor must provide all required bonding instruments to the County prior to commencement of any work. The County will consider any work done prior to the receipt of bonding instruments as null-and-void and thus not eligible for compensation.

ARTICLE #124 - RETAINAGE

The County will retain funds from compensation in compliance with Georgia law. Hall County may hold up to <u>five-percent (5%) retainage</u> throughout the entire project and will release said retainage at the point of completion and final acceptance by the County and issuance of Occupancy Permit by County.

ARTICLE #125 - VENUE AND GOVERNING LAW

The parties agree that this Contract shall be interpreted, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia. To the extent that either party may bring a legal suit to enforce the terms of this Contract, including suit in equity, the parties agree and consent to file any such suit in the Superior Court of Hall County, Georgia.

ARTICLE # 126 - NOTICE OF INTENT TO LITIGATE

Contractor hereby agrees not to file any civil action of disputes or claims relating to the Contract except after first giving thirty days (30) written notice to the County of the claim and the intent to initiate a civil action.

ARTICLE # 127- GEORGIA SECURITY AND IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE ACT:

A. By signing this Contract, the Contractor certifies that prior to and throughout the performance of all applicable work under this Contract it will remain in full compliance with all federal and state immigration laws, including but not limited to 8 U.S.C. § 1324a and the Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act (O.C.G.A. §13-10-90 et seq.), as amended by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011, regarding the verification of employment eligibility of employees under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986. Contractor will ensure that only persons who are citizens

or nationals of the United States or non-citizens authorized under federal immigration laws are employed to perform services under this Contract or any subcontract or sub-subcontract hereunder.

B. Contractor further certifies its compliance with the aforementioned federal and state immigration laws set forth by signing a sworn affidavit, the Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act Affidavit, notarized by an Official Notary Public, and obtaining the same affidavits from any sub-contractor providing services pursuant to this Contract.

ARTICLE # 128 – ORDER OF PRECEDENCE:

In the event of any inconsistency, ambiguity, or conflict among the specific provisions of the Contract and the Contractor's Response, the order of precedence shall be as follows:

- A. First, any amendments to the Contract, including all Exhibits thereto.
- B. Second, the Contract itself, including all Exhibits thereto.
- C. Third, Attachments appended to the Contract.

ARTICLE # 129- CONTRACT EXHIBITS AND ATTACHMENTS:

The Parties mutually acknowledge that any following Exhibits and Attachments listed below made a part of this Contract, as though expressly written in the RFQ/P documents and the bidder's response, are-herein-incorporated into this contract by reference.

EXHIBIT C - Mandatory Cost Proposal

ARTICLE # 130 - ENTIRE CONTRACT:

This Contract, as executed and approved, shall constitute the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all other prior and contemporaneous statements, agreements, and understandings between the Parties. No written or oral statements, agreements, or understandings that are not set out, referenced, or specifically incorporated in this Contract shall in any way be binding or of effect between the Parties.

ARTICLE # 131- VALIDITY

If any paragraph, sub-paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or any portion of this agreement shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction or if the provisions of any part of this agreement as applied to any particular situation or set of circumstances shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not be constructed to affect the portions of this agreement not so held to

be invalid or the application of this agreement to other circumstances not so held to be invalid. The parties hereby declare that this is the intent of the parties to this agreement is to provide for separate and divisible parts.

ARTICLE #132 – SALES TAX EXEMPTION STATUS

The County is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes and from Georgia State and Local Sales and Use Taxes on the Services. The Contractor may request a copy of the County's Georgia Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate.

ARTICLE #133 - HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The successful respondent hereby agrees to indemnify, hold free and harmless, Hall County Government, County Commissioners, its agents, servants, employees, officers, directors and elected officials, or any other person(s) against any loss or expense. This includes attorney fees, because of any liability imposed by law upon the County, except in cases of the County's sole negligence, sustained by any person(s) on account of bodily injury or property damage arising out of or in the consequence of this agreement.

ARTICLE # 134 - CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. All purchases must comply with The Official Code of Hall County Sections 3.10.010 3.10.190.
- 2. If any conflict or ambiguity arises between the Terms and Conditions herein, and The Official Code of Hall County, the latter will govern.
- 3. The Terms and Conditions set forth herein shall supersede and govern over all Contractor's Terms and Conditions or Service Level Agreements.
- 4. Hall County, Georgia, herein referred to as 'The County', retains the right to 'red-line' sections of the Supplier's Terms and Conditions if such are in conflict with the best interest of the County.
- 5. Acceptance of a Purchase Order (PO) and delivery of Goods or Services serves as the Supplier's full and complete acceptance of The County's Terms and Conditions.
- The terms; supplier, vendor, bidder, offeror, Contractor, Contractor, designer, distributor, dealer or manufacturer or otherwise purveyor or source of supply or performance of service shall mean one-and-the-same, herein denoted as 'Supplier' for goods and 'Contractor' for services.
- 7. - 15. The County does not accept automatic contract renewals with the exception of monthly subscription services.
- 16. The County only pays for services rendered in arrears. The County does not pay for services not yet rendered.
- 17. The County does not pay deposits towards goods ordered. Exceptions exist for custom made items (such as window coverings and blinds, or carpet, tile etc.), fabrication, decoration, or otherwise custom designed specifically for the County.
- 18. The County will accept backorders only if goods are out of stock and with prior written notice. Supplier's shall ship all quantities that it has in stock and hold orders for backorders.
- 19. The County participates in Cooperative Purchasing Agreements, State of Georgia Statewide Contracts, and other state, local, Intergovernmental Agreements, Memorandums-of-Understanding and other such Agreements.
- 20. In all cases, the jurisdiction shall be the State of Georgia, County of Hall, for arbitration or other legalities

This issuance of the PO shall not violate the Code of Ethics and Conflicts of Interest for Public Officers and Employees for Government Service set forth in the 2020 Section 45-1020 et seq. of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated and the Official Code of Hall County Section 3.10.070 governing Ethics.
- 30. All goods and services supplied pursuant to this PO shall, unless otherwise noted, must conform exactly to all of the descriptions, specifications, Exhibits and attachments contained in the Bid Solicitation upon which a PO is based and all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the Bid Solicitation are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.

- 31. Any-and-all media production, recordings, videos, photography, artwork, plates, engravings, and other printed or digital media materials paid in full by The County is considered County property and shall be delivered to The County upon request.
- 32. Invoices submitted to The County will reflect the language of the PO with the PO Number printed on each invoice submitted.
- 33. In the event that a PO has an attached Contract or Agreement, the terms and conditions of the latter shall govern in the event of any conflict with these terms and conditions.
- 34. The Supplier may be suspended, terminated, or debarred if it is determined that the Supplier has made false certification(s) or has violated such certification(s) by failure to carry out the requirements herein.
- 35. The Supplier certifies that it and its subcontractors are not been debarred, suspended, or declared ineligible by any agency of the County, or State of Georgia or as defined in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 48 C.F.R. Ch. 1 Subpart 9.4.
- 36. The Supplier certifies that the Supplier is not currently engaged in an active or pending lawsuit or other grievance, injunction, or levy against the County.
- 37. Goods are Free-On-Board (F.O.B.) destination and freight, shipping and delivery shall be pre-paid and added to the invoice as a separate line item.
- 38. The County does not pay late fees nor interest charges.
- 39. The Supplier shall charge the County the exact amount of freight, delivery, handling and insurance charges.
- 40. The County is not bound to any minimum or maximum quantity or dollar amount set by the Supplier
- 41. In the event there is a discrepancy between the unit price and extended price, the unit price shall govern.

This letter is in regards to the 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio Study dated August 9, 2023 issued by the State Auditor's Office. The preliminary results of this 2022 study state that Hall County's Public Utility Equalization Ratio Calculation is 35.48%, which is below the 38% required to be able to assess Public Utilities at 40%. These results would have the effect of requiring Hall County to compute the Public Utility Property Valuations at an assessed ratio value of less than 40%, thus reducing potential property tax revenue.

After conducting an internal review, the Tax Assessor's Office has determined that the data used for the testing by the State Auditor's Office includes non-arm's length sales. These sales include properties where new construction was partially complete, parcels with 299 (c) treatment, lots with statutory absorption rates, SB 346 treatment, and sales between related parties. Additionally, we determined that the time adjustment given by the State Auditor's Office does not accurately represent market conditions at the time of the study in Hall County.

Based on these findings, the Hall County Board of Commissioners and the Hall County School Board are formally requesting an appeal, on the basis of questioning the correctness of the Public Utility Equalization Ratio Calculation per the results of the 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio, dated August 9, 2023.

We appreciate the willingness of the State Auditor's Office to consider this appeal, and look forward to the results of the updated Ratio Study using accurate sales data and consideration for adjustment for time.

WHEREAS, Hall County is in receipt of a 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio Study dated August 9, 2023 issued by the Georgia Department of Audits & Accounts (DOAA); and

WHEREAS, the 2022 study provides that Hall County's public utility equalization ratio calculation is 35.48 percent, which is below the 38 percent required to be able to assess public utilities at 40 percent; and

WHEREAS, the Hall County Tax Assessor's Office has conducted an internal review and has determined that the data used for testing by DOAA included some non-arm's length sales; and

WHEREAS, the Hall County Tax Assessor's Office has also determined that the time adjustment used by DOAA does not accurately represent market conditions at the time of the study for Hall County; and

WHEREAS, in order to appeal the DOAA's 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio Study, the Chairman of the Hall County Board of Commissioners will need to timely execute an audit appeal letter.

NOW THEREFORE, the Hall County Board of Commissioners hereby appeals the State Auditor's Office's (DOAA's) 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio Study. This appeal questions the correctness of the 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio Study pursuant to the Official Code of Georgia Annotated Title 48, Chapter 5. Hall County is aggrieved and hereby refers the question of the correctness of the current equalized adjusted property tax digest of Hall County to the Georgia State Auditor.

The Hall County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Hall County Board of Commissioners to execute a letter to the Georgia Department of Audits and Accounts (DOAA) appealing the results of the 2022 Hall County Sales Ratio Study. The Board further authorizes the Chairman to execute any and all additional documents necessary to effectuate and pursue this appeal.

2021 PUBLIC UTILITY EQUALIZATION RATIO CALCULATION

Issue: Each year the Georgia Department of Audits & Accounts does a Sales Ratio Study to determine the correctness of each counties tax digest. The DOAA compares the county valuation to the price of the property sold. If there is too much variation or deficiencies between the sale price and the valuation there are consequences regarding Public Utility Valuations and potential penalties if the deficiencies are not corrected within 3-years.

The 2021 tax digest the study was just published August 4, 2022.

There were no noted deficiencies in the Hall County study. However, the overall average assessment was determined to be below 38%, <u>37.48%</u>.

This means that Public Utilities cannot be assessed at 40% for 2022 thus causing a loss in revenue.

- To determine valuations for the 2021 tax digest counties are required to use sales that occur in the previous calendar year i.e. 2020.
- However, the DOAA uses sales in the first 6-months of 2021 to compare to valuations set on sales that occurred in 2020.
- Obvious lapses in time require the DOAA to make adjustments for time since the sales they are using have occurred as much as twelve months after the date of valuation for the 2021 tax year.

The DOAA study can be appealed and we will be recommending appealing the DOAA study on the following basis.

- 1. The data used for the testing by the State Auditor's Office included over 100 non-arm's length sales. These sales included properties where new construction was partially complete, parcels with 299c treatment, lots with statutory absorption rates, SB 346 treatment and sales between related parties.
- 2. We assert that the time adjustment given by the State Auditor's Office does not accurately represent market conditions at the time of the study in Hall County.

Overview of Statewide Department of Audits Sales Ratio Results - Goal is to be at or above 38%

- Of 159 counties 95/59.75% scored below 38%.
- Of 159 counties 55/34.59% scored below 36%.
- Of 159 counties 64/40.25% scored above 38%.
- * The issue of not allowing an adequate time adjustment is systemic 60% of all Georgia counties fell below 38%.
- * Multiple counties will be appealing their DOAA Sales Ratio Study results.

To support our claim and obtain a sales ratio of 38% or better please see the following and attached information.

- Statewide map showing pass/failure rate.
 - You will see in this map that the passing counties are generally clustered into two areas of the state.
 - o This looks to indicate that adjustments made by the DOA seem to benefit the smaller counties only.
- Statewide map show counties ranked by Economic Growth.
 - Trend of pass/failure coincides with the level of growth and housing demand being lower in these areas than other areas of the state.
- Statewide map show counties ranked by Population Growth.
 - o This continues to indicate that adjustments made by the DOA seem to benefit the smaller counties only.
- Spreadsheet that includes the counties along with the adjusted ratios of each.
 - This chart includes the population of each county according to worldpopulationreview.com and the growth percentages since 2010.
 - o This aligns with our assertion that the DOAA study has an unintended bias.







The request before you is the request of Arabella Capital, LLC to Rezone from Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III) and Vacation-Cottage (V-C) to Planned Residential Development (PRD) to allow a 121-lot subdivision. This item is located within Commission District 3.

At their July 17, 2023 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval with twelve (12) conditions (4-0, Varner absent).

- 3. This section of the development is approved for a maximum of 121 lots with a minimum lot size of 6,800 square feet each.
- 4. The minimum heated floor area (HFA) shall be 1,600 square feet for dwelling units. Houses shall be constructed with a mixture of cement siding, stone, and/or brick façade, with a minimum of brick or stone accents on the front of the homes. The balance of the home may be the same material or of fiber-cement material. Vinyl siding is prohibited. Houses shall be consistent with the submitted renderings for the Annapolis, Harrisburg, Macland, and Creekside elevations. Elevations shall provide a similar expression of depth, dimension, and architectural detailing articulated on the proposed renderings.
- 5. All homes shall be constructed with a garage with a minimum of two-car capacity.
- 6. Minimum front yard setback must be a minimum of 20 feet, to accommodate additional parking in driveways without encroaching into rights-of-way.
- 7. A maximum of 19 lots shall be permitted driveway access from Buffington Farm Road per the conceptual site plan dated March 27, 2023.
- 8. A left turn lane and deceleration lane on Cagle Road for Buffington Farm Road shall be constructed by the developer per the requirements of the Hall County Traffic Engineering Department.
- 9. All conditions of zoning shall be made a part of any plats or construction plans created for the subdivision.
- 10. The development shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) model homes prior to approval and recording of the final plat.
- 11. No variances or development exceptions not specifically listed in these conditions of approval are granted.
- 12. A 50 foot undisturbed buffer shall be maintained along the eastern boundary of the subject property from Buffington Farm Road to the U.S.A.C.E. property.

Public Forum:

Seth Vining, 3587 Lake View Drive, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were traffic with new construction nearby and the size of the development.

Jerry Springfield, 12 Forest Hill SW, Cartersville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were public road access and traffic.

Summary Analysis

The subject request is to rezone $55.54\pm$ acres from Agricultural Residential-III (AR-III, $\underline{17.110}$) and Vacation-Cottage (V-C, $\underline{17.50}$) to Planned Residential Development (PRD, $\underline{17.180.060}$) for the purpose of developing a 121-lot subdivision.

The properties exist without any dwellings and sit adjacent to Lake Lanier. The general area does not have a singular identifiable character. Several subdivisions populate the area – Surfside Club Estate, Pine Point, and Lake View Section. There are a significant number of vacant lots – large and small. The zoning varies throughout the area – AR-III, PRD, R-I, I-II, and V-C. Thus, the development types vary between mobile homes and single-family dwelling units of various sizes.

The proposed development is comprised of 121 single-family residential lots, an addition to the existing proposed development on the adjacent parcels. The proposed development will include accessory uses of amenity areas, community areas/buildings, lake access, parking for residents, and other typical ancillary support services for a residential subdivision. Additional alterations in the proposed development as identified by the applicant's narrative and site plan submittals are identified below:

The narrative states that single-family lots shall be at least 6,500 square feet in area and at least 40 feet wide. The following development standards were proposed, some of which are deficient based on the Planned Residential Development (PRD, 17.180.060) standards:

Standard	Required	Proposed
Minimum Lot Area	8,000 square feet	6,500 square feet
Minimum Lot Width	50 feet	40 feet
Minimum Front Yard Setback	25 feet	20 feet
Minimum Exterior Buffer	50 feet	6 foot fence and a single row of trees (only a portion of boundary in Phase III)

All other standards are either proposed to be met or will be required to demonstrate compliance during the permitting process.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the <u>requested zoning designation</u> is not consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan's future land use designation for the subject parcel is "Lake Area Residential." This land use category is characterized by low-density single-family residential and neighborhoods. The intent of land use category is to preserve established neighborhoods and create opportunities for permanent and vacation residences similar in land use patterns to Residential Areas but at a lower density. The Lake Area Residential designation envisions 1 dwelling per acre; however, the maximum recommended density is 2 units per acre within a Planned Residential Development (PRD, 17.180.060), and the proposed development falls just below that at 1.96 DU/acre.

There is an associated application to amend the conditions of a previously approved Planned Residential Development (PRD, <u>17.180.060</u>) on a neighboring 110.345± acres. The intent is to develop the two subject areas in phases of one cohesive development.

Zoning Analysis

When considering a zoning amendment to the zoning maps, the following items must be considered by Planning commission and the Hall County Commission pursuant to <u>17.380.060</u>:

- 1. Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of adjacent and nearby property; The zoning proposal is suitable given the context of the surrounding area. The adjacent developed parcels are a consistent character.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; No, it is not anticipated that the proposed residential use will adversely affect adjacent properties. An updated traffic study found that "due to overall low traffic volumes in the vicinity of

- the project site, the existing roadway capacity and lane configuration is expected to be sufficient to accommodate future traffic volumes in the area. No roadway improvements are recommended along Buffington Farm Road or at the study intersections."
- **3.** Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. It is unclear whether the property has reasonable economic use as currently zoned.
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities; Staff does not find that the proposed development will cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The proposed use is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and the "Lake Area Residential" land use designation. Density is envisioned to be less than one unit per acre, and the proposed development exceeds that minimum.
- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; The proposed density is greater than the current zoning, so it is likely the value of the property is increased with the added density.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; Staff is unable to comment on the impact of property values without a full market analysis. Multiple factors impact property value including construction types, proposed uses, and maintenance. Often it is difficult to determine the effect of a development on adjacent properties until the development is completed.
- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; Staff has not identified a hardship imposed on the property owner as the property is currently zoned.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; Hall County property tax records shows that tax parcel 09106 000001A is developed with a single-family residence constructed in 1941. Tax parcel 09106 000005 is undeveloped.
- **10.** Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal; **Staff** is not aware of any changing conditions that affect the use and development of the property.
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; The proposed zoning is a Planned Residential Development (PRD, 17.180.080). Per the Official Code of Hall County, Planned Development District (17.180) are to be utilized as a "floating zone" which shall mean that areas will not be pre-designated as planned development districts but rather each such designation shall result from a specific and separate application for amendment. That being said, the proposed density is higher than that found on surrounding properties.
- **12.** Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; **There is no evidence that the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn.**

- 13. Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; The proposed density is higher than that found on surrounding properties but in general the use does not appear to be out of scale with the needs of the County as a whole, as there is a need for additional and a variety of housing.
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; There are other properties within the County that support a moderate-density single-family residential uses based on the Future Land Use Map.
- **15.** Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the [Planning Commission]; **The request could not be handled alternatively as a variance.**
- 16. Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; Any land disturbance activities on the property shall be required to go through the land development permitting process and as a result are subject to local, state, and federal regulations. As a result, there should not be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from any modification to the land if the request is granted.
- 17. Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; There is no indication that a mistake was made in the original zoning.

A Planned Residential Development (PRD, 17.180.080) allows for more flexibility in the design and development of the property. This provides for a mixture of housing types and encourages maximum use of natural features through proper site planning measures. The development should conform to the existing character and development pattern of the surrounding area. Based on the intended use and prior approvals, the requested zoning designation is appropriate.

<u>17.380.050</u>. - Submission requirements for a rezoning request

- A. Any person or persons requesting a change in the official zoning map or use subject to approval of the county commission shall file an application with a plat or map of the property attached thereto, together with payment of such fees set forth in chapter 17.30 to cover administrative and advertising costs, in the planning department office. Such person or persons or their authorized agent shall appear in person at the public hearing held to consider the district change. Proposal meets the requirement. Applicant has paid the appropriate fees and understands that someone must be present at both the Hall County Planning Commission meeting and the voting meeting of the Hall County Board of Commissioners.
- B. All applications for a change of zoning classification or use subject to approval of the county commission shall include:
 - A narrative statement identifying the existing and proposed use of the property and addressing each of the criteria set forth in section 17.380.060.C of this section [chapter].
 Proposal does provide a narrative outlining the intent of the change; however, the applicant has not prepared a response to each of the criteria listed in 17.380.060.C.
 - 2. A site plan drawn to scale designating the area covered by the application and identifying existing and proposed buildings and uses, adjacent existing land uses, zoning on contiguous parcels, including those across an abutting public right-of-way, and any other significant site improvements proposed to accommodate the proposed use or buffer adjacent uses, etc., or a plat of the subject property where no specific land use is proposed. In cases where only a plat

or map is provided and no land use is proposed, the planning commission and county commission shall evaluate the application based on the most intense possible land use permitted in the proposed district. Proposal does meet the requirement. The applicant has provided typical house location plans, but the siting of each unit will not be submitted until the building permit process.

- C. For any application for a slow rate land treatment system (see chapter 17.20), the following additional requirements apply. The proposed development will utilize public sewer and water; as such, this is not applicable.
- D. For any application proposing the development of 100 or more residential dwelling units, a traffic impact study shall be submitted prior to consideration of the application by the planning commission. At the applicant's expense, the traffic impact study shall be prepared by a professional engineer in accordance with requirements established by the Hall County Engineering Department. The engineering department shall review the traffic impact study and forward any comments to the Hall County Planning Commission. Proposal does meet the requirement. The traffic study found that "due to overall low traffic volumes in the vicinity of the project site, the existing roadway capacity and lane configuration is expected to be sufficient to accommodate future traffic volumes in the area. No roadway improvements are recommended along Buffington Farm Road or at the study intersections."

<u>Development Support and Constraints – Departmental / Agency Comments</u>

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated June 9, 2023, Emily McGahee stated "No comment, public sewer."

Hall County Fire Marshal

An email dated May 1, 2023 John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review Lieutenant stated the following:

Phase 1, 2, and 3 must meet the following fire codes below.

503.2.2 Authority.

The *fire code official* shall have the authority to require or permit modifications to the required access widths where they are inadequate for fire or rescue operations or where necessary to meet the public safety objectives of the jurisdiction. The fire apparatus access roads shall comply with the requirements of this section and Appendix D of the International Fire Code 2018 edition including Georgia State modifications.

Georgia State Modifications Below:

Add a new section, Appendix D 107.1, as follows:

Developments of one- or two-family dwellings where the number of dwelling units exceeds 120 shall be provided with two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads. Phase 2 is proposed to have 136 dwelling units.

Exceptions:

1. Where there are more than 120 dwelling units on a single public or private fire apparatus access road and all dwelling units are equipped throughout with an approved automatic sprinkler system in

- accordance with Section 903.3.1.1, 903.3.1.2 or 903.3.1.3, access from two directions shall not be required.
- 2. The number of dwelling units on a single fire apparatus access road shall not be increased unless fire apparatus access roads will connect with future development, as determined by the fire code official.
- 3. The fire apparatus access roads cannot be installed because of location on the property, topography, waterways, nonnegotiable grades or other similar conditions, and an approved alternative means of fire protection is provided. Plans shall accompany the written request that delineate improvements to proposed fire apparatus access roads approved by the fire code official of the local responding fire department. Recommended compliance alternatives for residential developments having less than the minimum of two entrances includes, but is not limited to one of more of the following alternative remedies:
 - 1. Enhanced turning radii to meet local responding fire department requirements; and/or
 - Increased road widths to meet local responding fire department requirements; or the Hall County Fire Marshal's Office requires road widths of 26' when the number of dwellings exceed 120 in residential developments.
 - 3. Fire Lane signs per D103.6 in locations determined by the Fire Code Official; or
 - 4. The absence of dead-end streets and cul-de-sacs; and unless the requirements meet or exceed Table D103.4 for Fire Apparatus Access Roads; or
 - 5. The primary entrance roadway being a boulevard with medians and each lane meeting fire access road widths; or
 - 6. Single entrance roads providing a dedicated emergency lane separating each drive lane; or
 - 7. Additional fire apparatus access road which is permitted to be a roadway or approved surface not accessible to motor vehicles, designed by a registered design professional to meet the loading requirements and minimum specifications of Appendix D; and this surface provides all weather conditions capabilities for emergency fire department access; or
 - 8. Statement by Fire Code Official that the Plans submitted meet the requirements of Exception 3 and/or Appendix D for access by local responding fire department
 - Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Title 25-2-12 (e)(4) the local fire official, building official, or developer may obtain a waiver when adequate access appropriate for the fire apparatus of the local responding fire department is not met or provided by using alternative methods on a waiver form designed and prescribed by the Safety Fire Commissioner. The State Fire Marshal or designated representative shall respond within 30 days for the decision for approval or disapproval or recommendations for modifications to the Plan If the 30-day time frame is not met, the Plans submitted shall be deemed to be approved.

Add a new section, Appendix D 107.2, as follows:

Where two fire apparatus access roads are required, they shall be placed a distance apart equal to not less than one-half of the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the property or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses.

503.2.5 Dead ends.

Dead-end fire apparatus access roads in excess of 150 feet (45 720 mm) in length shall be provided with an approved area for turning around fire apparatus. See Table D103.4 Requirements for dead end fire apparatus roads.

503.6 Security gates.

The installation of security gates across a fire apparatus access road shall be *approved* by the *fire code official*. Where security gates are installed, they shall have an *approved* means of emergency operation. The security gates and the emergency operation shall be maintained operational at all times. Electric gate operators, where provided, shall be *listed* in accordance with UL 325. Gates intended for automatic operation shall be designed, constructed and installed to comply with the requirements of ASTM F2200. Knox key switch override device shall be installed at each gate that is access controlled.

Fire apparatus roads shall not terminate abruptly at a security gate, approved turnaround shall be provided.

507.5.1 Where required.

Where a portion of the facility or building hereafter constructed or moved into or within the jurisdiction is more than 400 feet (122 m) from a hydrant on a fire apparatus access road, as measured by an *approved* route around the exterior of the facility or building, on-site fire hydrants and mains shall be provided where required by the *fire code official*. All proposed dwellings shall be no greater than 400' hose lay distance from a fire hydrant as the fire truck travels.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memorandum from Public Works and Utilities dated June 15, 2023, Bill Nash, Director, stated the following:

Engineering:

The site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

Show stream buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation not center line of stream.

All lots to be accessed by internal roads.

Phase #3 comments already on package.

Traffic:

Recommend requiring a left turn lane and deceleration lane on Cagle Road for Buffington Farm Road.

Utilities:

Hall county sewer district- sewer connection may be within feasible distance.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated April 28, 2023, Parker Niebauer, D1TO Traffic Operations Supervisor, indicated coordination would not be required.

Excerpts from the minutes of the July 17, 2023 meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Randi Doveton, Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Wes Robinson, 200 E.E. Butler Parkway, Gainesville, presented the request. The applicant stated that the location of the amenity area has changed and that the rezoning request is for a separate phase with its own entrance but same layout. The applicant is requesting a variance to not require the 50 foot undisturbed buffer in the rear of 8 lots in Phase III but instead to construct a 6 foot fence and single row of trees along the property line. The applicant stated the updated traffic study has taken into consideration future development and suggest no new street lights are needed.

Adam Whitmire, 829 Long River Trail, Hoschton, presented the request.

Rebuttal

Mr. Robinson stated that the traffic study doesn't specifically name the new elementary school or inland port but it does take into consideration the overall future traffic. Mr. Whitmire explained that Buffington Farm Road will not become a private road, it will continue to be a public road. Mr. Whitmire discussed options of a gate placement in Phase II. The applicants explained the site plan.

Public Forum:

Seth Vining, 3587 Lake View Drive, Gainesville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were traffic with new construction nearby and the size of the development.

Jerry Springfield, 12 Forest Hill SW, Cartersville, spoke in opposition. Concerns were public road access and traffic.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell clarified that the correct acreage size of the rezone request is 62.26± acres. Mr. Braswell questioned if there would be any other private roads or gates. Mr. Whitmire stated that Phase I is private with a gate, Phase II will have a gate, but Phase III will not. Mr. Hunt stated that his only concern with a gate

in Phase II is that it impedes access to other residents on the public road. The applicants stated they will accommodate to prevent that. Mr. Whitmire stated that the homes in Phase III will be smaller with a minimum 1,600 sq. ft. Mr. Hunt stated that smaller homes are needed. Ms. Pilcher and Mr. Hunt stated that they could not support a variance in Phase III that did away with the rear 50 foot undisturbed buffer. Ms. Pilcher suggested that the 8 lots affected by the buffer be reconfigured to be wider and have the layout adjusted. Mr. Robinson stated it would be favorable to have the variance since the topography is tricky.

<u>Motion:</u> A motion to approve, with conditions was made by Mr. Hunt and seconded by Ms. Picher. Vote: 4-0 (Varner absent)

Conditions:

- 1. Development is approved for lots as generally shown on the concept plan and typical lot layout (sheet 200) dated March 27, 2023, and as described in the project narrative, and as described in the final conditions of zoning, modified as necessary for compliance with development standards enforced at the time of site plan approval. Minor changes can be approved by the Planning Director provided there are no reductions in buffers, no changes in the structural design and materials, and the changes do not create the need for a variance from the Hall County development standards. Any conflict in development standards between the concept plans, project narrative, and conditions of zoning shall be determined by the final conditions of zoning.
- 2. Standard Hall County Development Review and permitting processes shall be followed. Approval of this request does not supersede development standards, or processes, in effect when the plans are submitted for review. Such standards include, but are not limited to, stormwater management and emergency access requirements.



<u>History of Use</u>. That portion of the property that is now designated as Phase I was originally platted as a subdivision of estate lots in 2005 as currently shown on the tax assessor records. That development was never successful. In May 2016 the property that is now designated as Phase I and Phase II of the Haselton subdivision was rezoned to PRD for use as a subdivision. This PRD did away with the previous estate lots. The current PRD is configured as shown below:



Phase I of the subdivision is currently under development. A land disturbance permit was issued on December 14, 2017. The development of sewer infrastructure in the area, the pandemic and other market conditions have delayed the development of this Phase. However, horizontal development of infrastructure for this Phase is now underway. A copy of the Civil/Site plans for Phase I have been included with the materials filed along with this application.


The adjoining tract, Tax Parcel 09106 000005, containing 61.65 acres is located off of Buffington Farm Road and adjoins this above PRD tract. This property is currently vacant and undeveloped apart from a 100' transmission line which traverses the property. This parcel is currently owned by Mambo Cat, LLC and is under contract for sale to the Applicant.

<u>Proposed Use</u>. The application requests both the amendment of an existing PRD and to add additional property to that PRD. The existing subdivision is called Haselton and is located off of Buffington Farm Road in East Hall County.

Applicant proposes to amend the existing PRD so as to add eleven (11) additional lots to Phase I of the Haselton PRD. The proposed revised site plan also reconfigures the approved roadways in Phase II of the Haselton Subdivision and relocates the amenity area.

Applicant seeks to add additional property to the existing PRD. The additional property, consisting of a 61.65 acres tract of land, will be rezoned from AR-III to PRD. This additional property is designated as Tax Parcel 09106 000005 by the Hall County Tax Assessor. The basis for this zoning action is to allow for the development of an additional phase within the existing Haselton Subdivision.

The proposed use of the property is for a one hundred twenty-one (121) lot phase to be added to the existing Hazelton Subdivision. The property will have an amenity area including a swimming pool and an associated playground. The proposed site plan is depicted below:



As proposed the entire property will consist of approximately 171.84 acres. Of that, 56.72 acres (33%) will be residential lots, 78.62 Acres (44.64%) will be greenspace and ponds, 16.75 acres (10%) will be HOA recreational areas and 21.26 acres (12.36%) will be right of way areas. There will be a total of 337 lots. The density for the entire project is less than two units per acre.





<u>Current Zoning</u>. The current zoning for the undeveloped 61.65 acres (09106 000005) is AR-III. The balance of the property is already zoned PRD.

<u>Development Schedule</u>. Development of Phase I is currently underway. Horizontal development is expected to be completed in mid-2024. Vertical construction will begin immediately thereafter. Current plans are to begin horizontal development of Phases II and III in the first part of 2024. It is anticipated that infrastructure will be completed by the end of 2026.

<u>Surrounding Zoning/Uses</u>. The existing PRD property is largely surrounded by Lake Lanier and residential property, largely zoned AR-III. The 61.65-acre tract adjoins the PRD and other residential uses largely zoned AR-III and R-I. The property is in across Cagle Road from the property currently zoned I-I and I-II which are part of the future inland port. A copy of the GIS map with surrounding zoning is below:



<u>Sewer/Septic</u>. The homes would be serviced by sewer provided by Hall County Sewer and water provided by the City of Gainesville. A Sewer Availability Letter from Hall Counter Public Works and Utilities is

included in the application. The sewer allocations for 338 lots represents all of the proposed lots in Phases 1, 2 and 3.

<u>Traffic</u>. A traffic study has been provided as a part of the application. The site is accessed from Buffington Farm Road. Original plans for Haselton Phase II called for a cul-de-sac at the end of Buffington Farm Road. Applicant proposes to eliminate that cul-de-sac as outlined on the attached plan so as to access Phase II lots via an extension of Buffington farm Road. This will eliminate the need for an additional roadway between Phase I and Phase II, allowing for additional recreational space, green space lots. The extension of Buffington Farm Road will also provide for superior access to the driveways of the adjacent landowners at the end of Buffington Farm Road. Phase III will include 19 lots on Buffington Farm Road. The remaining 99 lots would be accessed via new roads as depicted on the site plan.

Home Size. The homes for Phases 1 & 2 will be a minimum of 2,000 SF 4-6 bedrooms applying a modern farm and costal architectural style. The price point will be from \$600-\$900k. Phase 3 will be a minimum of 1,500 SF 3-4 bedrooms using a similar architectural style as phase 1 & 2 with a price point of \$300-\$400k. All homes will have a 2-car garage with adequate driveway parking. Below are elevations similar to what will be built. Because of the higher price point of phase 1 & 2, there will be many semi-custom homes with unique features. Detailed examples of home plans have been included with this submission. The general appearance of and materials will be similar to the following:






















Amenities. There will be several separate Homeowner's Associations established to maintain all private utilities and common areas. The current plan is to have a number of amenities including swim and boat slips for interested homeowners. There will be a large amenity area located between Phase I and Phase II as depicted as Rec Area #1 on the site plan. This area will have a pool and pool house, playground and pickle ball courts. The intent is for this to serve Phase I and Phase II only. There is an additional community dock area located within Phase II as depicted as Rec Area #2 on the site plan. his will have a small community area with a pavilion and parking for the dock. There is a currently approved seventy-two (72) slip dock. Walking trails in common areas will traverse the open space with pocket parks located at convenient locations. The open space will be available for all homeowners to use and enjoy with restricted areas to be determined by the association. There will be a separate amenity area located with the boundaries of Phase III that will serve only the homeowners within that phase as depicted as Rec Area #3 on the site plan.

Model Home. Applicant proposes the use of at least one Model Home to be constructed before final plat.

<u>Set Back Issues</u>. Several lots in Phase III border another residential subdivision. Topography in the area limits the placement of the roadways. In this area Applicant proposes to substitute a six (6') foot fence and single row of trees in lieu of a traditional buffer.

The fire apparatus access roads cannot be installed because of location on the property, topography, waterways, nonnegotiable grades or other similar conditions, and an approved alternative means of fire protection is provided. Plans shall accompany the written request that delineate improvements to proposed fire apparatus access roads approved by the fire code official of the local responding fire department. Recommended compliance alternatives for residential developments having less than the minimum of two entrances includes, but is not limited to one of more of the following alternative remedies:
 - 1. Enhanced turning radii to meet local responding fire department requirements; and/or

- 2. Increased road widths to meet local responding fire department requirements; or The Hall County Fire Marshal's Office requires road widths of 26' when the number of dwellings exceed 120 in residential developments.
- 3. Fire Lane signs per D103.6 in locations determined by the Fire Code Official; or
- 4. The absence of dead-end streets and cul-de-sacs; and unless the requirements meet or exceed Table D103.4 for Fire Apparatus Access Roads; or
- 5. The primary entrance roadway being a boulevard with medians and each lane meeting fire access road widths; or
- 6. Single entrance roads providing a dedicated emergency lane separating each drive lane; or
- 7. Additional fire apparatus access road which is permitted to be a roadway or approved surface not accessible to motor vehicles, designed by a registered design professional to meet the loading requirements and minimum specifications of Appendix D; and this surface provides all weather conditions capabilities for emergency fire department access; or
- 8. Statement by Fire Code Official that the Plans submitted meet the requirements of Exception 3 and/or Appendix D for access by local responding fire department

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Title 25-2-12 (e)(4) the local fire official, building official, or developer may obtain a waiver when adequate access appropriate for the fire apparatus of the local responding fire department is not met or provided by using alternative methods on a waiver form designed and prescribed by the Safety Fire Commissioner. The State Fire Marshal or designated representative shall respond within 30 days for the decision for approval or disapproval or recommendations for modifications to the Plan. If the 30-day time frame is not met, the Plans submitted shall be deemed to be approved.

Add a new section, Appendix D 107.2, as follows:

Where two fire apparatus access roads are required, they shall be placed a distance apart equal to not less than one-half of the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the property or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses.

503.2.5 Dead ends.

Dead-end fire apparatus access roads in excess of 150 feet (45 720 mm) in length shall be provided with an *approved* area for turning around fire apparatus. See Table D103.4 Requirements for dead end fire apparatus roads.

503.6 Security gates.

The installation of security gates across a fire apparatus access road shall be approved by the fire code official. Where security gates are installed, they shall have an approved means of emergency operation. The security gates and the emergency operation shall be maintained operational at all times. Electric gate operators, where provided, shall be listed in accordance with UL 325. Gates intended for automatic operation shall be designed, constructed and installed to comply with the requirements of

ASTM F2200. Knox key switch override device shall be installed at each gate that is access controlled.

Fire apparatus roads shall not terminate abruptly at a security gate, approved turnaround shall be provided.

507.5.1 Where required.

Where a portion of the facility or building hereafter constructed or moved into or within the jurisdiction is more than 400 feet (122 m) from a hydrant on a fire apparatus access road, as measured by an *approved* route around the exterior of the facility or building, on-site fire hydrants and mains shall be provided where required by the *fire code official*. All proposed dwellings shall be no greater than 400' hose lay distance from a fire hydrant as the fire truck travels.

Executive Summary

The purpose of this study is to evaluate the potential traffic impacts of the proposed *Buffington Farm Road Tract* development. The site is in Hall County and located along the west and east side of Buffington Farm Road, an existing public road. Based on the concept plan (dated 03/27/2023), the +/-171.99-acre development will include a total of 337 detached single-family homes. The concept plan (see Appendix B) for the development illustrates the conditions in the study area, including the three phases of the proposed development and proposed access. Vehicular traffic access to the site is proposed via the existing intersection of Buffington Farm Road at Cagle Road. Access from the three phases of development is proposed at two driveways along Buffington Farm Road and extending Buffington Farm Road (into phase 2 of the development).

Cagle Road is a two-lane roadway with a 35-mph posted speed limit in the area of the proposed development. White Sulphur Road is a two-lane roadway with a 35-mph posted speed limit near the site. Buffington Farm Road is a two-lane dead-end roadway with residential land use along its length. The existing site is undeveloped.

For the purposes of the traffic study, the analysis included the expected completion (build-out) of the development by year 2025. This study performed an analysis of existing traffic conditions and future traffic conditions. The future conditions analysis was performed for the year 2025 No-Build Conditions and the year 2025 Build Conditions (with the Buffington Farm Road Tract development).

The traffic impact study network consisted of two intersections. The study intersections were Cagle Road at Buffington Farm Road and White Sulphur Road at Cagle Road. It is important to note a Hall County roadway project is programmed for White Sulphur Road and involves shifting White Sulphur Road to the south side of the railroad tracks which would cut off White Sulphur from intersecting with Cagle Road. Therefore, future conditions analyses were not performed for Cagle Road at White Sulphur Road (the intersection is removed).

The results of the traffic analysis indicate the intersections of Cagle Road at Buffington Farm Road and White Sulphur Road at Cagle Road currently operate at level of service A during both the AM and PM peak hours.

In the future year 2025 No-Build conditions (without the Buffington Farm Road Tract development traffic volumes) the study intersection of Buffington Farm Road at Cagle Road is expected to operate at acceptable levels of service during both the AM and PM peak hours.

In the future year 2025 Build Conditions (with the Buffington Farm Road Tract development traffic volumes), the study intersection of Buffington Farm Road at Cagle Road is expected to operate at acceptable levels of service during the AM and PM peak hours. Additionally, the two driveways on Buffington Farm Road are expected to operate at acceptable levels of service during the AM and PM peak hours.

Due to overall low traffic volumes in the vicinity of the project site, the existing roadway capacity and lane configuration is expected to be sufficient to accommodate future traffic volumes in the area. No roadway improvements are recommended along Buffington Farm Road or at the study intersections.



Based on estimated traffic volumes in the year 2025 Build year conditions, and Buffington Farm Road is a dead-end road, the following driveway geometric recommendations are provided at the site access driveways:

- Buffington Farm Road at Driveway #1 (Access to Phase 1)
 - o Driveway (two lane: one entry lane and one exit); driveway to be stop-control
- Buffington Farm Road at Driveway #3 (Access to Phase 3)
 - o Driveway (two lane: one entry lane and one exit); driveway to be stop-control

1. Existing Conditions

1.1 Site Conditions

The proposed development is located on undeveloped property. **Figure 1** provides a general location map. **Figure 2** is an aerial that shows the site location and the proposed site driveways (Figures included in Appendix A). Access to the property is proposed to be provided at three locations along Buffington Farm Road (The concept plan is included in Appendix B). Nearby land uses are predominantly residential homes. The development is also located along Lake Lanier.

1.2 Roadway Conditions

Cagle Road is a two-lane roadway, with a 35mph posted speed limit in the area of the proposed development. Cagle Road is a northeast-southwest oriented roadway in the vicinity of the development. GDOT classifies Cagle Road as a Local Road. The roadway has grassed, rural shoulders on both the east and west side, with no sidewalks.

White Sulphur Road is a two-lane roadway, with a 35mph posted speed limit in the area of the proposed development. White Sulphur Road is an east-west oriented roadway in the vicinity of its intersection with Cagle Road. GDOT classifies White Sulphur Road as a Major Collector to the east and Minor Arterial to the west. The roadway has grassed, rural shoulders on both the north and south side, with no sidewalks.

Buffington Farm Road is a narrow two-lane dead-end public roadway. It is classified as a Local Road. The roadway has grassed, rural shoulders on both the east and west side, with no sidewalks.

Cagle Road at Buffington Farm Road and White Sulphur Road at Cagle Road are both side-street stop-controlled intersections. Buffington Farm Road is the side-street at its intersection with Cagle Road while Cagle Road is the side-street at its intersection with White Sulphur Road.

1.3 Traffic Volumes

Traffic counts were collected on Tuesday, May 16, 2023, for use in the traffic analysis. Hall County public schools were in session. Two 24-hour volume counts were collected, one on Cagle Rd south of Buffington Farm Rd and one on Buffington Farm Rd, west of Cagle Rd. The existing Average Daily Traffic (ADT) on Cagle Road is 1,459 vehicles and the existing ADT on Buffington Farm Road is 88 vehicles. Additionally, the traffic data collected included intersection turning movement counts at the following locations during the 7-9AM and 4-6PM peak periods.

- Cagle Road at Buffington Farm Road
- White Sulphur Road at Cagle Road

Historical traffic volume data available from the GDOT TADA source were utilized to inform the annual growth factor. The two locations are indicated in Appendix D. The two locations are:

- GDOT Count Station #139-0538 located on White Sulphur Road, east of Harrington Road.
- GDOT Count Station #139-0536 located on White Sulphur Road, between Ramsey Circle.



2. Future Conditions

2.1 Future No-Build Traffic Volumes

Future No-Build traffic volumes were developed by reviewing the historical traffic volumes roadways within the vicinity of the project and historic population growth in the county. Two GDOT count stations in the area were reviewed. The annual historic compound growth rate at the GDOT count stations averaged to 1.9% per year. Hall County's population growth rate was most recently reported as 1.2% per year in 2020. The Governor's Office of Planning and Budget developed population projections which indicates an estimated growth of 1.5% per year by 2025 in Hall County.

Considering this data, a 1.6% per year growth rate to account for background traffic volume growth was used in the traffic study. For the purposes of this study the proposed development is expected to be completed and opened by 2025. A 1.6% per year growth rate was applied to the 2023 existing volumes to calculate year 2025 No-Build traffic volumes. The 2025 No-Build traffic volumes are indicated in the Intersection Volume Development tables included in the Appendix E.

Additionally, the roadway network modification due to the Hall County project (explained in next section), resulted in re-routing existing vehicles crossing the railroad and traveling on White Sulphur Road. Based on the Hall County in-progress plans, and a review of the road network, the existing volume was redirected to White Sulphur Road to the south. This would provide access towards Gainesville and to I-985.

2.2 Future Roadway Conditions

A review of Georgia DOT and Gainesville-Hall Metropolitan Planning Organization planned and programmed transportation projects was performed. Hall County has two planned projects near the proposed development:

- PI 1162100: White Sulphur Road Realignment involves realigning White Sulphur Road to be on the south side of the railroad tracks and will remove the intersection of White Sulphur Road at Cagle Road near the development. This project is expected to be completed in 2024. A PDF of the inprogress roadway plan (cover sheet only) indicating the modification is included in Appendix G.
- Cagle Road Improvements
 - o This project is a repaving project of Cagle Road just north of the proposed development.



3. Proposed Development Traffic

Project traffic was calculated for the proposed development. Project traffic is defined as the vehicular trips expected to be generated by the development and distributed over the roadway network.

3.1 Trip Generation

The project driveway volumes were calculated based on the Institute of Transportation Engineers' (ITE) Trip Generation Manual, Eleventh Edition. The development proposes a total of 337 detached single-family homes for all three phases of development. The most applicable ITE land use (LU) codes is LU 210 (Single-Family Detached). Due to the development type, pass-by reductions and internal capture reductions were not included for the traffic analysis. **Table 1** below summarizes the trips expected daily, during the AM peak hour and during the PM peak hour for the development.

3.2 Trip Distribution and Assignment

An overall trip distribution and assignment of project trips was based on existing traffic patterns and a review of land uses and the street network in the area. This information was used to apply the project traffic volumes at the study intersections. Additionally, the roadway network modification due to the Hall County project was considered. The directional distribution for the proposed development is estimated to be:

- 10% to/from the northeast along Cagle Road
- 90% to/from the southwest along White Sulphur Road

Figure 4 (in Appendix A) illustrates the residential trip distribution in the study area. All site generated trips will access the roadway network through Buffington Farm Road.

3.3 Future Build Traffic Volumes

The 2025 future Build traffic volumes were calculated by adding the proposed development (Buffington Farm Road Tract) traffic volumes to the projected year 2025 No-Build traffic volumes. **Figure 5** (in Appendix A) illustrates the year 2025 Build traffic volumes.



4. Capacity Analysis

Capacity analysis was performed at the study intersections for the weekday AM and PM peak hours. Intersection Level of Service (LOS) was calculated based on the methodologies contained in the Highway Capacity Manual, 6th Edition. The Synchro Studio software, which utilizes the HCM 6th Edition methodology, was utilized to perform the analyses.

Capacity is defined as the maximum number of vehicles that can pass over a particular road segment or through a particular intersection within a specified period under prevailing roadway, traffic, and control conditions. Level of service (LOS) is used to describe the operating characteristics of a road segment or intersection in relation to its capacity. LOS is defined as a qualitative measure that describes operational conditions and motorist's perceptions. The Highway Capacity Manual defines six levels of service, LOS A through LOS F. Level of service A indicates excellent operations with little delay to motorists, while level of service F indicates extremely long delay.

Level of service for unsignalized intersections is calculated for the average control delay incurred for vehicles on the stop control approach, compared to the average control delay per vehicle for all approaches at a signalized intersection. Control delay for vehicles include initial deceleration delay, queue move-up time, stopped delay, and final acceleration delay. **Table 2** below indicates the relationship between delay and LOS for signalized and unsignalized intersections, respectively. Level-of-service "E" is typically considered to be the limit of acceptable delay.

Several factors affect the controlled delay for unsignalized intersections, including the availability of gaps in the cross-street traffic, and acceptable gap time to make the movement from the stop position. For stop-control intersections, LOS E and F exist when there are insufficient gaps in traffic, resulting in long delays. Low level of service for stop-control approaches are not uncommon at major cross-streets.

4.1 Existing Conditions Capacity Analysis

Capacity analysis was performed for the year 2023 traffic volumes and the existing roadway conditions. The existing traffic conditions are illustrated in **Figure 3**. **Table 3** summarizes the results of the capacity analysis.

Both study intersections are currently operating at an acceptable level of service in both the AM and PM peak hours.

4.2 Future No-Build Conditions Capacity Analysis

Capacity analysis was performed for the year 2025 Future Conditions and includes the No-Build traffic volumes (without the Buffington Farm Road Tract development traffic) and the existing roadway conditions for one intersection. Since the intersection of White Sulphur Road at Cagle Road is expected to be removed by year 2025, the intersection was not analyzed in future year conditions. **Table 4** summarizes the results of the capacity analysis for the Future No-Build Conditions.

The study intersection is expected to continue operating at an acceptable level of service during both the AM and PM peak hours.



4.3 Future Build Conditions Capacity Analysis

Capacity analysis was performed for the year 2025 Future Conditions and includes the No-Build traffic volumes plus the Buffington Farm Road Tract development volumes. The Build traffic conditions and volumes are illustrated in **Figure 5**. **Table 5** summarizes the results of the capacity analysis.

The study intersection is expected to operate at an acceptable level of service during both the AM and PM peak hours. Additionally, both driveways are expected to operate at acceptable levels of service during both the AM and PM peak hours.

The existing intersection is not expected to need any geometric modifications due to the low volume on both Cagle and Buffington Farm Road.



5. Recommendations

Recommendations for access for the proposed development are based on existing conditions, the proposed development use, and expected traffic volumes. The need for dedicated turn lanes at the study intersections and appropriate traffic control (i.e. stop control) were reviewed. Recommendations included reviewing Hall County Code of Ordinances requirements, knowledge of general transportation standards, and engineering judgment.

Hall County Code of Ordinance 16.60.290 identifies when deceleration and turn lanes are required at development driveways, which is primarily based on roadway ADT and number of proposed residential lots. The Ordinance states the Hall County Traffic Engineer determines if any improvements are required.

The estimated daily traffic volumes along the study roadways and at the proposed development driveways is illustrated in **Figure 6**. Due to the low volumes on Buffington Farm Road, the volumes generated by the development are not expected to have a major impact on operations of the existing intersection of Buffington Farm Road at Cagle Road. The existing roadway capacity and lane configuration is expected to be sufficient to accommodate future traffic volumes at the intersection. No roadway improvements are recommended along Buffington Farm Road or at the intersection.

5.1 Recommended Driveway Geometry

Vehicular traffic access to the site is proposed via the existing intersection of Buffington Farm Road at Cagle Road. Access from the three phases of development is proposed at two driveways along Buffington Farm Road and extending Buffington Farm Road (into phase 2 of the development).

Based on estimated traffic volumes in the year 2025 Build year conditions, and Buffington Farm Road is a dead-end road, the following driveway geometric recommendations are provided at the site access driveways:

- Buffington Farm Road at Driveway #1 (Access to Phase 1)
 - o Driveway (two lane: one entry lane and one exit); driveway to be stop-control
- Buffington Farm Road at Driveway #3 (Access to Phase 3)
 - Driveway (two lane: one entry lane and one exit); driveway to be stop-control










Location Map Figure 1


















Project Trip Distribution

Location Map of GDOT Count Stations







This firm represents Arabella Capital, LLC in its application for amendment to the existing zoning classification for the above referenced tract ("the Property"). Please note this letter is being forwarded to you because Georgia law requires that the following Constitutional objections be submitted in order to preserve the rights of the Applicant during the rezoning process.

Please accept this letter as notice of the position of the Applicant/Owner that those portions of the zoning regulations of the County as presently in effect which prohibits the use of the Property above as Planned Residential Development use are unconstitutional as applied to the Property. The zoning ordinances as applied to the above referenced Property is unconstitutional in that they render this Property unusable and destroy its marketability, and as such the zoning ordinances therefore constitute a taking of property without just and adequate compensation and without due process of law in violation of the provisions of the Fifth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution (as made applicable to the states by the Fourteenth Amendment) and Article I, Section I, Paragraph I; and Article I, Section III, Paragraph 1(a) of the Constitution of the State of Georgia.

Additionally, the current zoning ordinances as applied to this Property denies the Applicant equal protection under the law as provided in the Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and Article I, Section I, Paragraph I; Article I, Section III, Paragraph 1(a) and Article I, Section I, Paragraph 2 of the Constitution of the State of Georgia in that the zoning ordinances as applied to this Property makes it impractical to develop the Property and thus significantly diminishes its value. The zoning ordinance as applied to this Property is arbitrary and capricious in that it inflicts a significant detriment on the Property owner that is insubstantially related to the health, safety, morality and welfare of the public. These ordinances as applied restrict the unfettered use of the owner's property inflicting serious and significant injury and damage to the Applicant which resulted with relatively little gain or benefit to the public as such, we will object to their application to the above referenced property in the current zoning request and ask that they be declared unconstitutional.

Additionally, the imposition of a condition that Applicant make improvements on Cagle Road potentially on property not owned by Applicant is an unconstitutional taking of property without just and adequate compensation in and of itself, and further denies the Applicant equal protection.

I request this letter be made part of the record regarding the application above.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioners for the purpose of developing the 4.19± acre parcel with a poultry processing facility. Within the Light Industrial (I-I, <u>17.160</u>) zoning district, food processing plants involving the further processing of animals or animal products are subject to approval of the Board of Commissioners.

Per the applicant's narrative, the facility is intended to be used as a further processing facility for poultry. No slaughtering is proposed on the subject parcel. The subject parcel is 4.17± acres in size and is undeveloped. The western portion of the property is bordered by a stream, resulting in flood plain on the northern portion of the parcel, with the proposed development occupying the eastern side of the parcel. The proposed access for the development is from a single entrance on Centennial Drive. The submitted site plan shows a 19,241 square foot metal-sided building and a loading dock with five (5) bays located behind the building. The proposed parking lot contains 92 parking spaces and a 10 foot landscape strip follows the frontage of the parcel along Centennial Drive.

The narrative continues to explain that during the development process the property will be graded for a future 9,636 square foot expansion. There are anticipated to be 10 refrigerated semi-trucks accessing the facility on a daily basis and the business will operate 3 shifts:

1st Shift: Quality Assurance – 6:00am to 4:30pm

Production - 8:00am - 4:00pm

+/- 100 employees

2nd Shift: Quality Assurance – 4:30pm to 1:00am

Production – 4:00pm to 12:30am

+/- 60 people

3rd Shift: Sanitation – 12:00am – 8:00am

+/- 15 people

The applicant has requested no variances from the Zoning Ordinance and has stated that the proposed development will be consistent with the requirements of the Light Industrial (I-I, <u>17.160</u>) zoning district, as well as landscaping, lighting, and signage requirements. Staff has not identified any needed variances during the analysis of the request.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the proposed <u>conditional use request inconsistent</u> with the future land use classification of Lake Area Residential in the <u>Comprehensive Plan</u>. It should be noted that Light Industrial (I-I, <u>17.160</u>) zoning classification is already established and the current request is for conditional use approval. The proposed use is consistent with the general development pattern along Centennial Drive, which contains a mixture of light industrial businesses.

Zoning Analysis

Per Planning Commission and Hall County Commission consideration and decision (17.380.060), the planning commission shall study the need and justification for the change based on a determination of the facts applicable to the particular case, and the following general lines of inquiry shall be considered, to wit:

- Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use, development and zoning of adjacent and nearby property; The property has previously been rezoned to Light Industrial (I-I, 17.160) and the current request is for a use subject to approval of the Board of Commissioners for poultry processing business. Within the I-I district, food processing plants involving the further processing of animal or animal product are subject to approval of the Board of Commissioners.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The site is already zoned Light Industrial (I-I, 17.160) and is currently undeveloped. It is not anticipated that the proposed development and use would have an adverse impact on adjacent or nearby property. The subject property is bounded to the northwest by the City of Gainesville water treatment facility, and to the southwest, east, and south by light industrial uses.
- 3. Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has a reasonable economic use as currently zoned; Yes, the property is currently zoned Light Industrial (I-I, <u>17.160</u>). As such, the property can be used for any use permitted by right. As the requested use requires conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioner, the proposed use cannot operate unless approval is granted.
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, utilities, schools, police protection, fire protection, public health facilities or emergency medical service; This question is not applicable as the Light Industrial (I-I, 17.160) zoning classification is currently established on the property. The proposed use is not anticipated to cause excessive or burdensome use of community facilities.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the future land use plan for the physical development of the area; The Light Industrial (I-I, 17.160) zoning classification has already been established on the property, and as such, this criteria is not applicable.
- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; Staff is unable to assess the extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions. If the conditional use request is not approved, the applicant would not be able to operate the business at the subject property.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; As the Light Industrial (I-I, 17.160) zoning classification has already been established, this criteria is not applicable.

- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; If the conditional use request is not approved, the applicant would not be able to operate the business at the subject property.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; **The property is undeveloped and appears to have been so for a number of years.**
- 10. Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal; There are no known changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property.
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; The current request is a conditional use request and there are no proposed changes to the underlying zoning.
- 12. Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; There is no evidence that the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn.
- 13. Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; No, the request is not out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole.
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; The proposed use of a poultry processing facility requires conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioners in the Light Industrial (I-I, 17.160), meaning a conditional use request would be required on another I-I property in the county.
- 15. Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the [planning commission]; No, the request could not be handled instead by a variance.
- 16. Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; Any land disturbance activities on the property shall be required to go through the land development permitting process, and as a result are subject to local, state, and federal regulations. As a result, there should not be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from any modification to the land if the request is granted.
- 17. Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; **There is no indication that a mistake was made in the original zoning.**

Per Hall County GIS, current zoning for the property is I-1, Light Industrial District. It does not appear that any overlay districts are applicable to this property.

 - This facility is intended to be a processing plant for poultry. The product will be slaughtered at another facility, and broken down further in this facility. Intended operations schedule is as follows:

1st Shift: Quality Assurance from 6:00 AM to 4:30 PM

2nd Shift: Quality Assurance from 4:30 to 1:00 AM

- On a daily basis, we estimate 10 refrigerated semi-trucks in and out of the facility's loading docks on a daily basis. Poultry will be offloaded into the on-site cooler facility (3100 sf) and processed in the Processing Area, which will be kept at a maximum of 50 degrees Fahrenheit in accordance with Health Code regulations. Based on currently used facilities, the noises, odors, and chemicals will not be significant outside of the facility.
- · Proposed standards for development including restrictions on use of property, density (lot size), number of lots, and setback requirements.
 - We are pursuing use of this property for poultry processing pursuant to 17.160.040.G, requiring approval of the county commission and this application.
 - Lot size is 181,817 SF or 4.174 AC.

This will all occur prior to routing the water into the County sanitary lines.

· Plans for protecting abutting properties (buffers)

- To the West side of the property, there is a stream, which will require natural vegetative buffers. We intend to minimize any construction related impact to this protected area.
- To the North side of the property, we will maintain the existing vegetation up to the setback. Based on grading needs, we will evaluate what needs to be done within the setback to the back of the proposed pad for the future expansion.
- The South side of the property is the road frontage. We will only be modifying approximately half of this frontage for our access and utilities.
- The East side of the property will have minimal buffering with the driveway running along this side of the property. But is facing a non-active side of the adjacent building and will not require significant buffering as a result.

Building Design:

We are proposing to erect a 19,241 sf insulated metal panel building on the site to house operations. Approximate break down of the facility square footage is as follows:







ON-SITE SEWAGE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS RULES 511-3-1-.03 General Requirements for On-Site Sewage Management Systems. (1) If public or community sewage treatment systems are not available, the owner of a building, residence, or property that is designed or intended for human occupancy or congregation shall provide an approved on-site sewage management system sufficient for the number of persons normally expected to use or frequent the building, residence or other property for two hours or more. (2) No person may begin the physical development of a lot or structure where an on-site sewage management system will be utilized, nor install an on-site sewage management system or component thereof, without having first obtained from the County Health Department a construction permit for the installation of an onsite sewage management system. And (1)(a) Connection shall be made to a public or community sewage treatment system if such system is available within two hundred feet (200') of the property line, or available in a public right-of-way abutting the property.

The request before you is the request of Kimberly Zax for a Use Subject to County Commission Approval to allow a 5-lot subdivision. This item is located within Commission District 2.

At their August 7, 2023 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval with six (6) conditions (3-2, Varner & Pilcher opposed).

There was three (3) public comments submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting and six (6) people spoke in opposition during the public hearing.

There have been no changes to the request since the Planning Commission took action.

Planning Commission Approval Conditions:

- 1. The property shall be subdivided into a maximum of 5 building lots in accordance with the requirements of the Residential-I (R-I, 17.60) zoning district as detailed in 17.240, area and setback requirements.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting approval to subdivide a 5.30± acre parcel into 5-building lots. Per the requirements of 17.60.040, uses permitted subject to approval of the county commission, within the Residential-I (R-I, 17.60) zoning district, subdivisions require Board of Commissioner approval. The submitted narrative explains that the applicant intends to subdivide the property into 5 building lots.

According to tax records, the property is currently developed with a shop with a canopy; the structure would need to be removed as it does not meet the setback requirements for the R-I (17.60) district and no variances have been requested.

Within the Residential-I District (R-I, 17.60) the following development standards are required:

No variances were requested as part of this application.

Zoning Analysis

Per Planning Commission and Hall County Commission consideration and decision (17.380.060), the planning commission shall study the need and justification for the change based on a determination of the facts applicable to the particular case, and the following general lines of inquiry shall be considered, to wit:

- Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of
 adjacent and nearby property; The proposed use of 5 residential lots is compatible with the
 development of nearby and adjacent property. Adjacent and nearby properties are found in a range
 of sizes, with some being smaller in size than what is proposed by the applicant while others are
 larger.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The proposed use of a 5 lot subdivision will not adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby properties.
- 3. Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. Yes, the property has reasonable economic use as currently zoned, Residential-I (R-I, 17.60), but the applicant cannot subdivide the property into 5-lots without approval of the County Commission.
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities; If approved, the development of 5 building lots should not cause an excessive or burdensome use of the existing streets, transportation facilities, etc.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The proposed use of a 5-lot subdivision is consistent with the <u>Comprehensive Plan's</u> future land use classification of Lake Area Residential. In this land use classification, the recommended density is 1 dwelling unit per acre; the current proposal is 1.06 units per acre.
- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; Unless the conditional use request is approved, the applicant will not be able to subdivide the property into 5-lots.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; Staff is unable to comment on the impact of property values without a full market analysis. Multiple factors impact property value including construction types, proposed uses, and maintenance. Often it is difficult to determine the effect of a development on adjacent properties until the development is completed.
- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; Staff has not identified a hardship imposed on the property owner as the property is currently zoned.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; The property is currently developed with an old shed, which has been on the property since 1985.

- **10.** Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal; **There are no known changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property**
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; This question is not applicable as there are no proposed changes to the zoning classification.
- **12.** Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; **There is no evidence that the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn.**
- **13.** Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; **No, the request is not out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole**
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; The subdivision of land within the Residential-I zoning district (R-I, <u>17.60</u>) requires County Commission approval.
- **15.** Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the Planning Commission; **This question is not applicable as there are not proposed changes to the zoning classification.**
- **16.** Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; **No, there should not be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted.**
- 17. Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; There is no indication that a mistake was made in the original zoning.

Within the Residential-I (R-I, $\underline{17.60}$) zoning district, subdivisions require conditional use approval from the Board of Commissioners.

17.380.050. - Submission requirements for a rezoning request

- A. Any person or persons requesting a change in the official zoning map or use subject to approval of the county commission shall file an application with a plat or map of the property attached thereto, together with payment of such fees set forth in chapter 17.30 to cover administrative and advertising costs, in the planning department office. Such person or persons or their authorized agent shall appear in person at the public hearing held to consider the district change. Proposal meets the requirement. Applicant has paid the appropriate fees and understands that someone must be present at both the Hall County Planning Commission meeting and the voting meeting of the Hall County Board of Commissioners.
- B. All applications for a change of zoning classification or use subject to approval of the county commission shall include:
 - A narrative statement identifying the existing and proposed use of the property and addressing each of the criteria set forth in section <u>17.380.060.C</u> of this section [chapter]. 















SECOND FLOOR PLAN

Additional items such as a soil evaluation and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan. Tourist Accommodation permit/plan review and/or Food Service permit/plan review may be required after review of business plan. ON-SITE SEWAGE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS RULES 511-3-1-.03 General Requirements for On-Site Sewage Management Systems. (1) If public or community sewage treatment systems are not available, the owner of a building, residence, or property that is designed or intended for human occupancy or congregation shall provide an approved on-site sewage management system sufficient for the number of persons normally expected to use or frequent the building, residence or other property for two hours or more. (2) No person may begin the physical development of a lot or structure where an on-site sewage management system will be utilized, nor install an on-site sewage management system or component thereof, without having first obtained from the County Health Department a construction permit for the installation of an onsite sewage management system. And (1)(a) Connection shall be made to a public or community sewage treatment system if such system is available within two hundred feet (200') of the property line, or available in a public right-of-way abutting the property.

Item 2, 8511/8515 Belton Bridge Road, Cole: This plat is currently under review by the Hall County Plat Review Team and Environmental Health can approve the subdivision plat.

Items 3A/3B, 3463 Leisure Lane, Justus: No comment.

I wish to register my opposition to the proposed development of the five acres on Pocahontas Drive because of the destruction of wildlife habitat, potential damage to the lake due to runoff, damaged property values due to construction and the safety hazard that heavy equipment and trucks passing through the neighborhood cause. Many of our neighbors are elderly and walk for their health. The roads in this neighborhood are narrow, and the trucks involved in previous construction have driven very fast up and down the road hauling supplies and/or equipment, posing a safety hazard to residents walking their dogs or walking for health. The simultaneous construction of five houses will cause a significant increase in heavy traffic, resulting in unsafe conditions. There are few undeveloped areas in the neighborhood, and wildlife that lives in this plot of land will be displaced, resulting in traffic hazards as the wildlife crosses roads looking for shelter.

The grading that would take place in order to build these houses would likely cause silt and runoff that could cause significant damage to the lake ecosystem nearby, as well as causing a deterioration of neighboring properties and docks.

If this project is approved, at least the following measures must be taken to prevent these problems:

- 1. Significant buffers to prevent silt and drainage issues.
- 2. Speed tables placed every 1/4 mile along Nachoochee Trail.
- 3. Consideration of widening the roadbed by at least 12 inches to permit safe passage of walkers and traffic.
- 4. Entrance/Exit lanes on McEver Road to accommodate the increased ingress/egress of traffic in the neighborhood.

The request before you is the request of John A. Moore, Sr. for a Use Subject to County Commission Approval with two variances to allow an agrientertainment venue. This item is located within Commission District 1.

At their August 7, 2023 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend denial of all three requests (5-0). The Planning Commission expressed concern over the magnitude of the variance requests; without the variances, the use, as proposed is not possible. Therefore, the Planning Commission recommends denial of all associated applications: use subject to County Commission, setback reduction for the structure, and setback reduction for the parking.

There were sixteen (16) public comments submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting, six (6) people spoke in favor, and three (3) people spoke in opposition during the public hearing.

There have been no changes to the request since the Planning Commission took action.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting (A) Use Subject to County Commission Approval for an agri-entertainment (17.215) venue within the Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) zoning district on a 7.03± acre parcel. Concurrent to the rezoning request, the applicant is requesting relief from 17.215.040 (conditions and regulations for agri-entertainment) to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment structures from 300 feet to 15 feet, and (C) to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment parking from 200 feet to 15 feet.

The applicant is proposing to operate an agri-entertainment venue on the subject property, which will be located in a proposed 50 foot by 100 foot barn, with an attached 70 foot by 100 foot pavilion. Per the submitted site plan, the proposed barn location is approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and 140 feet from the rear property line. There is a proposed gravel parking area, located immediately adjacent to the proposed event venue. The parking area is approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and

approximately 25 feet from the rear property line and will contain 60 parking spaces. The site plan notes there area an additional 84 grass parking spaces, but it is not clear where on the property those are located. The site plan shows a proposed buffer of Leyland Cypress trees along the left and right side property lines. The narrative states that the buffer may be vegetated or consist of a split rail fence. Additionally, the site plan notes that the gravel parking area would be surrounded by an 8 foot tall fence to mitigate any impact on the neighboring property.

The submitted narrative states that intent of the agri-entertainment venue is to provide an event space for the community. The primary use will be weddings, which the narrative states may occur Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 5pm – 10pm or 11pm. During the week, the venue is proposed to be used by community organizations, between the hours of 11am – 6pm. The maximum number of guests proposed by the applicant is 300. The applicant submitted two examples of the proposed structure for reference, which are included in the application packet.

The subject property is developed with a 4,500 square foot single family residence, constructed in 2014. An existing barn will be demolished and the proposed event venue constructed in its place. Access to the property will be from the existing driveway on North Bogan Road.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the <u>requested use inconsistent</u> with the future land use classification of Residential in the <u>Comprehensive Plan</u>. The primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments, greenspace, and civic uses such as libraries, churches, and schools.

Zoning Analysis

Per section <u>17.215.040</u>, conditions and regulations for agri-entertainment:

- A. A Hall County Business License shall be required if the zoning request is approved for the agrientertainment events.
 - The applicant will be required to obtain a Hall County Business License, subject to the below conditions and any additional conditions added, prior to beginning operation.
- B. The property shall be used for the purpose of providing an agri-entertainment venue, as provided for in section 17.215.030(A).
 - The proposed uses are consistent with those described in <u>section 17.215.030(A)</u>.
- C. The structure that will house the agri-entertainment event shall be located a minimum of 300 feet from any property lines of a different owner.
 - The applicant has requested relief from the building setback requirement, with the proposed structure located approximately 20 feet from the right side property line. The requested variance is 15 feet from property line.
 - Required setback = 300 feet
 Proposed setback = 15 feet
 Required variance = 285 feet
- D. All parking for an agri-entertainment event shall be located a minimum of 200 feet from any property lines of a different owner.
 - The applicant has requested relief from the parking setback requirement, with the proposed parking area located approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and 25 feet from the rear property line. The requested variance is 15 feet from property line.

- Required setback = 200 feet
 Proposed setback = 15 feet
 Required variance = 185 feet
- E. Parking shall be permitted on grass or gravel.
 - The applicant's narrative states that the parking areas will be both gravel and grass.
- F. The agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall be permitted to be constructed only on the property described.
 - The applicant intends to construct a 50 foot by 100 foot barn, with an attached 70 foot by 100 foot pavilion, if the agri-entertainment use is approved.
- G. The maximum number of attendees to occupy any agri-entertainment event barn or structure on the premises shall be regulated by the Hall County Fire Marshal.
 - The applicant's narrative states that maximum number of guests is proposed to be 300, with 144 proposed parking spaces. The maximum number of occupants will be determined by the Hall County Fire Marshal during the development process.
- H. The occupancy of the agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall not exceed the occupancy load provisions of the Uniform Building Code and those occupancy load limits shall be posted on the premises by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the occupancy will be determined by Hall County Building Inspections and the Fire Marshal, based on the above criteria.
- I. The use of the premises for an agri-entertainment venue shall be permitted only after the issuance of a certificate of occupancy by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the applicant shall be required to obtain a certificate of occupancy prior to commencing operations.
- J. Any improvements required to support the property as an agri-entertainment venue shall be made only after the issuance of a building permit by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the applicant shall be required to obtain a building permit from Hall County Building Inspections.
- K. Outdoor activities within the agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall not involve the outside amplification of voice, music and/or instruments except during a wedding ceremony.
 - The applicant has not indicated that outside amplification of voice, music, and/or instruments is proposed as part of the application.
- L. Agri-entertainment events shall commence no earlier than 9:00 a.m. and shall terminate no later than 10:00 p.m. on Sunday through Thursday and no later than 12:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.
 - For [the] purpose of this section, termination shall mean the termination of food, drinks, service and entertainment with the understanding that attendees will need a reasonable amount of time after termination to exit the premises.
 - The proposed agri-entertainment business meets this condition. The proposed hours of operation for special events such as weddings are Friday Sunday from 5pm 10pm and 11pm to meet the requirements of this section. During the week, the venue is proposed to be used by community organizations, between the hours of 11am 6pm.
- M. All agri-entertainment events shall be provided with adequate potable water and sanitary waste disposal systems as approved by the Hall County Environmental Health Department.
 - The applicant must meet this requirement if the request is approved, and has indicated there is enough land to meet the septic requirements.
- N. All agri-entertainment events shall provide for adequate access and egress for emergency vehicles as determined through the development review process.

- The applicant will be required to receive approval from Hall County Engineering for the proposed site access.
- O. All agri-entertainment events shall be provided with adequate personnel to assist with parking, emergency and other potential impacts of each event.
 - If approved, the applicant must meet this requirement.
- P. If the property being considered for agri-entertainment use is "bona-fide conservation use property" as defined under O.C.G.A. §§ 48-5-7.1 through 48-5-7.4, caution should be used to insure that the proposed agri-entertainment use of the property does not constitute a breach of the conservation covenants applicable to the property.
 - The property is not under a conservation use covenant and as such this regulation is not applicable.

(A) Use Subject to County Commission Approval | for an agri-entertainment venue.

Per Planning Commission and Hall County Commission consideration and decision (17.380.060), the planning commission shall study the need and justification for the change based on a determination of the facts applicable to the particular case, and the following general lines of inquiry shall be considered, to wit:

- Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of
 adjacent and nearby property; The proposed use of the property is an agri-entertainment venue in the
 Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. Properties to the north and west across North Bogan
 Road are within the city limits of Buford. The properties to the east are zoned Residential I (R-I, 17.60)
 and are developed with single-family residential uses.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The request is for conditional use approval for an agri-entertainment venue in the Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. The proposed use may be more intense than that of the adjacent or nearby parcels and the requested variances for the building location and parking setback requirements reduce the separation of the event venue and parking from adjacent properties.
- 3. Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. Yes, the property has reasonable economic use as currently zoned, but the proposed business cannot occur as described without approval of the conditional use request. The subject property is zoned Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) and is developed with a 4,500 square foot single-family residence, constructed in 2014, and a 80 foot by 80 foot barn, per Hall County Property Tax records.
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities; The proposed use may cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets and transportation facilities, depending on the number of visitors the business can accommodate.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The current application is for a conditional use request for agri-entertainment business within the Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. The parcel falls within the Residential future land use classification of in the Comprehensive Plan. The intent of this classification is to preserve the established neighborhoods and create new residential developments consistent with surrounding suburban densities. The proposed use is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; **Staff has not** identified that the existing property values have been impacted by the existing zoning.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; Staff is unable to comment on the impact of property values without a full market analysis. Multiple factors impact property value including construction types, proposed uses, and maintenance. Often it is difficult to determine the effect of a development on adjacent properties until the development is completed.
- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; Staff has not identified a hardship imposed on the property owner as the property is currently zoned.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; The site has been developed with a residence since at least 2014.
- **10.** Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal; **There** are no known changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property.
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; There is no proposed change to the underlying zoning, as such, this criteria is not applicable.
- **12.** Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; **There is no evidence that the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn.**
- 13. Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; The proposed use is not out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole, as an event venue could compliment the residential growth occurring in the South Hall area.
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; As the proposed uses require Board of Commissioner approval for a conditional use permit, there are not adequate sites already zoned for an agri-entertainment business.
- 15. Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the [Planning Commission]; As the proposed uses require Board of Commissioner approval for a conditional use permit, the request could not be handled instead by a variance.
- 16. Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; Any land disturbance activities on the property shall be required to go through the land development permitting process, and as a result are subject to local, state, and federal regulations. As a result, there should not be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from any modification to the land if the request is granted.
- 17. Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; There is no evidence to indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property.

(B) Variance from <u>17.215.040</u> to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment structures from 300 feet to 15 feet and (C) Variance from <u>17.215.040</u> to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment parking from 200 feet to 15 feet:

Section <u>17.420.070</u>, appeals and modifications states that "if substantial modifications or changes are necessary, any person, firm, group or organization may apply for relief from the requirements set forth in this chapter to the Hall County Planning Commission, unless otherwise specified in this chapter."

The Planning Commission is hereby authorized to grant variances from the strict application of this Resolution upon proof by a preponderance of the evidence that $\underline{2.60.030.J}$ provided the request meets the criteria set forth in 2.60.030.K.

- 1. There are extraordinary and exceptional conditions pertaining to the particular lot in question because of its size, shape or topography (the hardship must relate to the physical character of the lot and not to a personal or economic hardship); Though the property is 7.03 acres in size, the site is somewhat limited by the existing structures and a pond on the property. It is possible that the proposed event venue and parking could be located so that no variances are needed, but the potential area is limited by the location of the pond and septic system.
- 2. The application of the requirements of this <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would create an unusual hardship; The application of the requirements of <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would not create an unusual hardship. The property can continue to be used as currently developed, with single-family residential and agricultural uses.
- 3. Such conditions are peculiar to the particular piece of property involved and are not common to other properties in the neighborhood; The existing site development limits the potential places an event venue could be located on the property.
- 4. Such conditions are not the result of any actions of the property owner; The applicant is proposing the development standards for the project that require the variance request.
- 5. Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of <u>Title 17</u>; provided, however, that no variance may be granted for a use of land or building or structure that is prohibited by <u>Title 17</u> or for a conditional use which has been denied by the county planning commission. It is difficult to assess the full impactof a development on the public, but if these variances were granted there should not be detriment to the public good or impair the intent of <u>Title 17</u>. The property will be subject to all other applicable local, state, and federal development standards.

<u>17.380.050</u>. - Submission requirements for a rezoning request

A. Any person or persons requesting a change in the official zoning map or use subject to approval of the county commission shall file an application with a plat or map of the property attached thereto, together with payment of such fees set forth in chapter 17.30 to cover administrative and advertising costs, in the planning department office. Such person or persons or their authorized agent shall appear in person at the public hearing held to consider the district change. Proposal meets the requirement. Applicant has paid the appropriate fees and understands that someone must be

present at both the Hall County Planning Commission meeting and the voting meeting of the Hall County Board of Commissioners.

- B. All applications for a change of zoning classification or use subject to approval of the county commission shall include:
 - A narrative statement identifying the existing and proposed use of the property and addressing each of the criteria set forth in section 17.380.060.C of this section [chapter]. The applicant has submitted a narrative and site plan but did not specifically address the criteria listed in 17.380.060.C.
 - 2. A site plan drawn to scale designating the area covered by the application and identifying existing and proposed buildings and uses, adjacent existing land uses, zoning on contiguous parcels, including those across an abutting public right-of-way, and any other significant site improvements proposed to accommodate the proposed use or buffer adjacent uses, etc., or a plat of the subject property where no specific land use is proposed. In cases where only a plat or map is provided and no land use is proposed, the planning commission and county commission shall evaluate the application based on the most intense possible land use permitted in the proposed district. The applicant has submitted a site plan drawn to scale.
- C. For any application for a slow rate land treatment system (see chapter 17.20), the following additional requirements apply. This standard is not applicable as the site will be served by an onsite septic system.
- D. For any application proposing the development of 100 or more residential dwelling units, a traffic impact study shall be submitted prior to consideration of the application by the planning commission. At the applicant's expense, the traffic impact study shall be prepared by a professional engineer in accordance with requirements established by the Hall County Engineering Department. The engineering department shall review the traffic impact study and forward any comments to the Hall County Planning Commission. As there are not 100 or more residential dwelling units proposed this question is not applicable.

<u>Development Support and Constraints – Departmental / Agency Comments</u>

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated June 22, 2023, Emily McGahee stated "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review. Additional items, including, but not limited to: soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan. Tourist Accommodation permit/plan review and/or Food Service permit/plan review may be required after review of business plan. Sewage flows for the entire property will be limited to 600 gallons per non-restricted acre per day."

Hall County Fire Marshal

In an email dated June 22, 2023, John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review Lieutenant provided the following comments:

- 1. If approved engineered site development plan will need to be submitted to Hall County for review and approval by the Development Review Committee
- 2. Based off the size of the proposed building and occupant load a fire protection and fire alarm system will be required
- 3. 8 inch underground fire line will be required for the fire protection water supply
- 4. Gainesville Fire Service Vault will be required
- 5. Additional fire hydrant(s) may be required
- 6. Fire apparatus accessibility must meet International Fire Code Standards.
- 7. Emergency responder radio coverage test will be required

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated May 18, 2023, Bill Nash, Director of Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

The site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage. (1) If public or community sewage treatment systems are not available, the owner of a building, residence, or property that is designed or intended for human occupancy or congregation shall provide an approved on-site sewage management system sufficient for the number of persons normally expected to use or frequent the building, residence or other property for two hours or more. (2) No person may begin the physical development of a lot or structure where an on-site sewage management system will be utilized, nor install an on-site sewage management system or component thereof, without having first obtained from the County Health Department a construction permit for the installation of an onsite sewage management system. 3555 North Bogan Road Rezoning Request for Wedding/Other Events

The main concerns with this rezoning request at 3555 N. Bogan Rd. in Buford, that I and my nearby neighbors have are:

- 1. Much more traffic congestion with 144 cars trying to get on to N Bogan Rd from Friendship going to an event or getting onto Friendship from N. Bogan when leaving an event and the backups that already occur in this area will be seriously multiplied. Everyone in all the surrounding neighborhoods knows how difficult it is to turn left on Friendship Rd at the school there is no light there. And, it is just as difficult to turn left from Jones Rd onto Friendship already with no light there either, but add 144 more cars it will to be extremely long wait times to get to Friendship Rd, turn left or right there, or get to 985. I wonder what might happen if 175 cars showed up for a wedding event would the invited guests in 31 of those cars be turned away because the car limit has been reached? If not where will they park? The only access & exit to these venues will be N. Bogan Rd.
- 2. The noise level will increase due to the request for an outdoor pavilion where 300 people in a 99.9% residential area will be milling around talking and likely consuming alcohol. Hall County officials told me the outside music cannot be amplified but outdoor voices can be (like using a microphone and speakers). This could mean that entire ceremonies and other types of events could be amplified outdoors in the pavilion, toasting, celebrating, clapping, talking etc.
- 3. Mr. Moore has requested his setbacks from his neighbor's property lines be changed and reduced from 200 feet to 15 feet so he can put the proposed 2 buildings and the parking within 15 feet of his neighbors. The neighbors directly across the street and some whose backyards are in Bogan Gates subdivision are close to Mr. Moore's property. Also, the Morgan's Crossing neighbor's backyards are very close to the back of Mr. Moore's property right where he is proposing to build these 2 large buildings and parking.
- 4. Event venues could be of all kinds, not just weddings, including rock concerts if he ever chose to do so. These events could potentially be between 9am 10pm Sunday through Thursday and 9 am Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is a lot of traffic and car emissions and potential noise every day of the week and late into the evenings when folks are trying to sleep.
- 5. If this proposal is approved, having a commercial venue such as this in a 99.9% residential neighborhood and surrounded by other single homes and subdivisions on all sides will change the look and feel of our area. It can impact traffic flow, increase noise levels, and increase traffic backups and emissions in the area and reduce air quality.
- 6.This request of Mr. Moore's for an event venue is also totally inconsistent with the Residential Future land use designation in the Hall County's Comprehensive Plan. In part, this Plan states the primary future land uses for this area are "moderate density single-family residential developments..." The Narrative submitted by Mr. Moore to Hall County states "...it is about making money" thus making this a proposal for a commercial venue in a primarily residential area.

My name is Tony Reilly. I am against this proposed request for an Entertainment Venue for 3355 N. Bogan Rd for several reasons as follows:

- 1. Bogan Rd is only a small 2 lane road with no bike, walking, running, or turn lanes with the exception of some small turn lanes into some of the existing subdivisions and properties. There are already traffic bottlenecks for access from the N. Bogan Rd. to Friendship Rd. intersection at the school and from N. Bogan Rd. to the small cut through street Jones Rd. to Friendship intersection. These bottlenecks occur in the morning rush hour at the school on Friendship and at the intersection at Jones to Friendship. Cars are trying to mostly turn left to get to 985 so Jones and Bogan Roads get very backed up there. It also backs up on the weekends when folks are out and about running errands and trying to get to 985. There are no lights at either intersection. It is so bad on school mornings that there is usually a policeman directing traffic at N. Bogan and Friendship. The property at 3555 N. Bogan Rd is very close to Jones Rd and also very close to Friendship Rd and if wedding events or any other kinds of events that might be held according to the applicant's Narrative document this could cause a lot of major backups and a potential rise in accidents at those intersections with Friendship. The applicant has requested possible space for parking of at least 144 vehicles that is a lot more vehicles coming and going in the area coming around the same time and leaving around the same time. I do not believe that narrow Bogan Rd nor the intersections could handle the traffic.
- 2. Our area is 99.9% residential and has a nice residential feel including 3555 N. Bogan Rd. property. The look and feel or residential would change to a more commercial look and feel. The applicant has never said he would apply for a liquor or alcohol license and most wedding events serve alcohol so this would be likely going forward. The applicant has stated in his Narrative that this proposal is "to make money", so it will be commercial because of that and it will contain a larger building plus another large outdoor pavilion which will certainly be used for outside purposes so if people are outside there will be potential much higher noise levels even if most, but not necessarily all, amplified music and noise are going to be inside the building. What is the use of the Pavilion for it is not specifically stated in the Narrative so it is difficult to say what the noise levels in the surrounding residences and neighborhoods would be like until it happens, if this request is approved. If an event, whether wedding or other type of event, did include imbibing of alcohol then drivers leaving the area after a few hours may very well be inebriated and potentially be less safe drivers to say the least, thus more traffic accidents could occur, particularly trying to turn left on Friendship Rd. from N. Bogan Rd or Jones Rd. I have lived in this area for 24 years and have seen many people almost have an accident trying to go left on Friendship Rd and Friendship Rd. traffic is flying and coming to those intersections way beyond the posted speed limits.

- 3. Allowing this to become a potential commercial event venue may encourage the other nearby neighbors who have single homes on their properties to sell out to some commercial venture going forward. As is mentioned in the Hall County Planning Commission Staff Report, "Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the requested use inconsistent with the future land use classification of Residential in the Comprehensive Plan. The Primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments..." I, and many of my nearby Hall County neighbors agree with this statement wholeheartedly. Others, who do not live near our residential area and neighborhoods may support the applicant but they do not have to be around it in the future, nor the traffic and potential safety issues, nor the possible drop in our property values. Who wants to buy a residential home near commercial businesses? I am all for commercial business success in areas where there are already many other commercial businesses that have been zoned for those purposes but not in a primarily residential area as ours.
- 4.I am also against the times for the events being requested and what could potentially be allowed according to already existing Hall County rules for a venue like this. The applicant's Narrative proposed that events might be held on "Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays between 5pm to 11pm and some events also on week days from 11 am through 6pm." But I believe the Hall County rules events say that if the applicant's proposal is approved, the applicant could potentially be allowed to hold events between 9 am to 10 pm Sunday through Thursday, and from 9 am to Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is potentially all day everyday from 9 am to 10 pm or Midnight. With those hours in mind plus the applicant states in the proposal there up to but "not more than 300 people" at an event means a lot of cars leaving at midnight on the weekends and possibly at 10 pm during the week. With a possible 144 parking spaces that is a lot of potential traffic noise late at night on work and school nights plus later at night on the weekends, and all of this in a residential neighborhood area surrounding this property. And, the applicants Narrative states he wants to "have as many weddings as possible" as well as other types of events not described in the narrative. Since none of these other types of events have been described in the Narrative, how can neighbors in the area know what to expect going forward. Will these other events be rock concerts? Will these other events be for parties and social events? What type of customers will this venue be attracting to our neighborhood areas? We just do not know what this will look like or possibly turn into in the future whether the applicant stays as the owner in the future or builds it up, then decides to sell out to some other owner who wants to turn it into a dance club, a bar, or who knows what?

In summary, my main concerns at this time are

- 1.Traffic backup issues and access from Bogan Rd to Friendship Rd to go left to get to 985 and from Bogan Rd to Jones to Friendship Rd. to get to 985. This will be a problem with any day or night time venues and especially when an approximate potential 144 cars come to a venue or leave a venue along with the noise level of cars potentially leaving at late hours of the night even up to 10 pm weekdays and up to midnight on weekends.
- 2.The impact on our residential look and feel with a commercial venue operating in the heart of several existing residential neighborhoods & subdivisions. There is a definite possibility of dropping home property values going forward if the request is approved, particularly for the homes nearest the venue. Who wants to buy a home near a commercial venture such as this?
- 3. If this applicant's request is approved, there are several nearby single & property homeowners not within a subdivision who might be encouraged to try to get their property rezoned to allow for commercial use as well thus changing our area even more toward commercial useage. This would of course go against the Hall County's "Comprehensive Plan which states that this area's land use classification is Residential in the Comprehensive Plan. And it also states, "The Primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments..."
- 4. If the proposal is approved, the times that potential events could be held are every day between 9 am to 10pm work and school week days and 9 am to Midnight on weekends. This means it could possibly go on all day everyday until late hours at night with lots of noisy traffic leaving the events late at night. There are surrounding neighbors and subdivisions close by 3555 N. Bogan Rd. as well as neighbors directly across the street from this location that will have to deal with any traffic or event noise on any given day. And since the applicant has stated in his Narrative that he wants to "have as many weddings as possible" as well as other events but has not given a description of any of these other types of events, nearby neighbors have no idea of what the circumstances will be like going forward and cannot know until after the fact, if this is approved. More information would definitely be needed by all Hall County and all of our neighbors up front on the other types of events might be like so as to have a thorough understanding of what might be coming from this rezoning if approved.

3555 North Bogan Road Rezoning Request for Wedding/Other Events

The main concerns with this rezoning request at 3555 N. Bogan Rd. in Buford, that I and my nearby neighbors have are:

- 1. Much more traffic congestion with 144 cars trying to get on to N Bogan Rd from Friendship going to an event or getting onto Friendship from N. Bogan when leaving an event and the backups that already occur in this area will be seriously multiplied. Everyone in all the surrounding neighborhoods knows how difficult it is to turn left on Friendship Rd at the school there is no light there. And, it is just as difficult to turn left from Jones Rd onto Friendship already with no light there either, but add 144 more cars it will to be extremely long wait times to get to Friendship Rd, turn left or right there, or get to 985. I wonder what might happen if 175 cars showed up for a wedding event would the invited guests in 31 of those cars be turned away because the car limit has been reached? If not where will they park? The only access & exit to these venues will be N. Bogan Rd.
- 2. The noise level will increase due to the request for an outdoor pavilion where 300 people in a 99.9% residential area will be milling around talking and likely consuming alcohol. Hall County officials told me the outside music cannot be amplified but outdoor voices can be (like using a microphone and speakers). This could mean that entire ceremonies and other types of events could be amplified outdoors in the pavilion, toasting, celebrating, clapping, talking etc.
- 3. Mr. Moore has requested his setbacks from his neighbor's property lines be changed and reduced from 200 feet to 15 feet so he can put the proposed 2 buildings and the parking within 15 feet of his neighbors. The neighbors directly across the street and some whose backyards are in Bogan Gates subdivision are close to Mr. Moore's property. Also, the Morgan's Crossing neighbor's backyards are very close to the back of Mr. Moore's property right where he is proposing to build these 2 large buildings and parking.
- 4. Event venues could be of all kinds, not just weddings, including rock concerts if he ever chose to do so. These events could potentially be between 9am 10pm Sunday through Thursday and 9 am Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is a lot of traffic and car emissions and potential noise every day of the week and late into the evenings when folks are trying to sleep.
- 5. If this proposal is approved, having a commercial venue such as this in a 99.9% residential neighborhood and surrounded by other single homes and subdivisions on all sides will change the look and feel of our area. It can impact traffic flow, increase noise levels, and increase traffic backups and emissions in the area and reduce air quality.
- 6.This request of Mr. Moore's for an event venue is also totally inconsistent with the Residential Future land use designation in the Hall County's Comprehensive Plan. In part, this Plan states the primary future land uses for this area are "moderate density single-family residential developments..." The Narrative submitted by Mr. Moore to Hall County states "...it is about making money" thus making this a proposal for a commercial venue in a primarily residential area.

To the Hall County Board of Commissioners, my name is Tony Reilly and I live at 4561 Bogan Gates Trail in Buford, Ga. 30519 which is just south of 3555 North Bogan Rd by about 1000 feet.

I am definitely opposed to any conditional use changes or variance requests for 3555 N. Bogan Rd to allow any kinds of events for the following reasons:

- 1. Mr. Moore's request is inconsistent with Hall County's Comprehensive Plan for this area which is zoned for "Moderate Density Single Family Homes". Our area is 99.9% residential now and has a nice quiet residential look and feel definitely not a commercial feel. Mr. Moore's Narrative stated that "many businesses exist" in this area on N. Bogan Rd. which is totally incorrect. There is only one in this area. Our neighborhood area is not commercialized. There are businesses further up off of the 4 lane Friendship Rd. but not on two lane residential area of N. Bogan Rd. Mr. Moore's property has single homes adjacent to his, single residential homes directly across the narrow 2 lane Bogan Rd from him, and single residential homes backed up to and very close to his property as well as many nearby subdivisions all with single family residences.
- 2. Mr. Moore has requested incredible and unprecedented 15' variances from adjacent neighbors and wants to build a huge building and huge pavilion within 15' of other neighbors properties. Noise level will increase tremendously with outside wedding event music and ceremonies with speakers which will be allowed to be amplified in his proposed Pavilion or on other places on his property if this is approved. The noise levels inside the proposed building may end up being loud enough to be heard outside of the building though it may be insulated. No one knows what it will be like until it is too late. This is commercial venue
- 3. Mr. Moore's Site Plan drawing shows he wants the option of having 60 cars on gravel parking and 84 cars on grass parking for a total of 144 cars. The Site Plan itself only shows one Proposed Parking place for about 44 cars and does not say if that is the gravel area or the grass area. Who knows where 144 total cars will end up parking on this property during Events and how will they enter and leave will it be on N. Bogan Rd only or does Mr. Moore want to try and exit out onto Chatuge in Morgan's Crossing? The Site Plan does not seem to clearly draw this out. And will the parked cars be close to the road? How close will they be near surrounding neighbors. How loud will these cars be starting up and driving out at 10 pm on school and work nights or at midnight on weekends when they leave Events? Will it be so loud that close neighbors can't get to sleep or will be awakened?
- 4. There is no traffic study to show the impact on traffic flow of a potential 144 cars coming and going to the Events which is only about 2000 feet from the major intersection of N. Bogan Rd and Friendship Rd at the school. Traffic already backs up at that intersection when people are going to work, school or shopping at different times of the day. This is especially true when cars are trying to turn left on to Friendship to get to 985. Average length of cars in 2023 is about 15' so if a potential

144 cars left an event at the same time that would be about 2160' of total car lengths without any space between them which means they would be backed up all the way from Friendship Rd to 3555 N. Bogan Rd property if they were all exiting toward Friendship Rd. What neighbors would want to have to get behind a trail of cars like that just to get to Friendship Rd. to get to work, school, shopping,or to the freeway or to the NE Georgia Hospital in Braselton on Friendship Rd? It can already take up to 5 to 10 minutes waiting time at these intersections with only having to wait for 5 - 6 cars. Narrow two lane only North Bogan Rd is simply not set up to accomodate 144 cars nor a commercial event venue such as the one being proposed by Mr. Moore. In the Narrative Mr. Moore talks about having "Wet Lands" that will never be developed but this is not shown on the Site Plan and he gives different addresses referring to that. The Pond may be what he is talking about as the wetlands but he lists 116 Spring St and 4340 Chatuga Drive when mentioning Wetlands so this is extremely confusing.

- 5. Mr. Moore states in his Narrative that he wants to operate this commercial Event Venue for the next 30 years and to have "as many weddings as possible" as well as other events where he wants to "extend the range of activity" to mornings, and have other various Events but never describes what kinds of Events he means. Could they be rock concerts, dance club events, and will alcohol be served which is usually the case at most weddings? Will folks be milling around outside in the 'Pavilion' having drinks and partying, etc? Who knows what this might look like or turn into in the future?
- 6. Mr. Moore's Narrative talks about giving back to the community but what he proposes would actually take away from our neighborhood residential community in many ways with rising noise levels, increased traffic and more traffic congestion, potentially lowering of home values and changing the look and feel of our residential look and feel. The quality of life of Mr. Moore's neighbors will definitely be impacted for years and years to come and all for the purpose that Mr. Moore gives in his Narrative when in his own words he said, '...this is about making money." This is totally a commercial enterprise in a single family home residential area. How many folks on the Board of Commissioners would like to have something like this across the street from them. Many of our neighbors definitely do not want this in their area. Please do not approve this conditional use request and change the quality of life in our single family home residential area. Thank you.

The request before you is the request of John A. Moore, Sr. for a Use Subject to County Commission Approval with two variances to allow an agrientertainment venue. This item is located within Commission District 1.

At their August 7, 2023 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend denial of all three requests (5-0). The Planning Commission expressed concern over the magnitude of the variance requests; without the variances, the use, as proposed is not possible. Therefore, the Planning Commission recommends denial of all associated applications: use subject to County Commission, setback reduction for the structure, and setback reduction for the parking.

There were sixteen (16) public comments submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting, six (6) people spoke in favor, and three (3) people spoke in opposition during the public hearing.

There have been no changes to the request since the Planning Commission took action.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting (A) Use Subject to County Commission Approval for an agri-entertainment (17.215) venue within the Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) zoning district on a 7.03± acre parcel. Concurrent to the rezoning request, the applicant is requesting relief from 17.215.040 (conditions and regulations for agri-entertainment) to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment structures from 300 feet to 15 feet, and (C) to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment parking from 200 feet to 15 feet.

The applicant is proposing to operate an agri-entertainment venue on the subject property, which will be located in a proposed 50 foot by 100 foot barn, with an attached 70 foot by 100 foot pavilion. Per the submitted site plan, the proposed barn location is approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and 140 feet from the rear property line. There is a proposed gravel parking area, located immediately adjacent to the proposed event venue. The parking area is approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and

approximately 25 feet from the rear property line and will contain 60 parking spaces. The site plan notes there area an additional 84 grass parking spaces, but it is not clear where on the property those are located. The site plan shows a proposed buffer of Leyland Cypress trees along the left and right side property lines. The narrative states that the buffer may be vegetated or consist of a split rail fence. Additionally, the site plan notes that the gravel parking area would be surrounded by an 8 foot tall fence to mitigate any impact on the neighboring property.

The submitted narrative states that intent of the agri-entertainment venue is to provide an event space for the community. The primary use will be weddings, which the narrative states may occur Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 5pm – 10pm or 11pm. During the week, the venue is proposed to be used by community organizations, between the hours of 11am – 6pm. The maximum number of guests proposed by the applicant is 300. The applicant submitted two examples of the proposed structure for reference, which are included in the application packet.

The subject property is developed with a 4,500 square foot single family residence, constructed in 2014. An existing barn will be demolished and the proposed event venue constructed in its place. Access to the property will be from the existing driveway on North Bogan Road.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the <u>requested use inconsistent</u> with the future land use classification of Residential in the <u>Comprehensive Plan</u>. The primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments, greenspace, and civic uses such as libraries, churches, and schools.

Zoning Analysis

Per section <u>17.215.040</u>, conditions and regulations for agri-entertainment:

- A. A Hall County Business License shall be required if the zoning request is approved for the agrientertainment events.
 - The applicant will be required to obtain a Hall County Business License, subject to the below conditions and any additional conditions added, prior to beginning operation.
- B. The property shall be used for the purpose of providing an agri-entertainment venue, as provided for in section 17.215.030(A).
 - The proposed uses are consistent with those described in <u>section 17.215.030(A)</u>.
- C. The structure that will house the agri-entertainment event shall be located a minimum of 300 feet from any property lines of a different owner.
 - The applicant has requested relief from the building setback requirement, with the proposed structure located approximately 20 feet from the right side property line. The requested variance is 15 feet from property line.
 - Required setback = 300 feet
 Proposed setback = 15 feet
 Required variance = 285 feet
- D. All parking for an agri-entertainment event shall be located a minimum of 200 feet from any property lines of a different owner.
 - The applicant has requested relief from the parking setback requirement, with the proposed parking area located approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and 25 feet from the rear property line. The requested variance is 15 feet from property line.

- Required setback = 200 feet
 Proposed setback = 15 feet
 Required variance = 185 feet
- E. Parking shall be permitted on grass or gravel.
 - The applicant's narrative states that the parking areas will be both gravel and grass.
- F. The agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall be permitted to be constructed only on the property described.
 - The applicant intends to construct a 50 foot by 100 foot barn, with an attached 70 foot by 100 foot pavilion, if the agri-entertainment use is approved.
- G. The maximum number of attendees to occupy any agri-entertainment event barn or structure on the premises shall be regulated by the Hall County Fire Marshal.
 - The applicant's narrative states that maximum number of guests is proposed to be 300, with 144 proposed parking spaces. The maximum number of occupants will be determined by the Hall County Fire Marshal during the development process.
- H. The occupancy of the agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall not exceed the occupancy load provisions of the Uniform Building Code and those occupancy load limits shall be posted on the premises by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the occupancy will be determined by Hall County Building Inspections and the Fire Marshal, based on the above criteria.
- I. The use of the premises for an agri-entertainment venue shall be permitted only after the issuance of a certificate of occupancy by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the applicant shall be required to obtain a certificate of occupancy prior to commencing operations.
- J. Any improvements required to support the property as an agri-entertainment venue shall be made only after the issuance of a building permit by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the applicant shall be required to obtain a building permit from Hall County Building Inspections.
- K. Outdoor activities within the agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall not involve the outside amplification of voice, music and/or instruments except during a wedding ceremony.
 - The applicant has not indicated that outside amplification of voice, music, and/or instruments is proposed as part of the application.
- L. Agri-entertainment events shall commence no earlier than 9:00 a.m. and shall terminate no later than 10:00 p.m. on Sunday through Thursday and no later than 12:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.
 - For [the] purpose of this section, termination shall mean the termination of food, drinks, service and entertainment with the understanding that attendees will need a reasonable amount of time after termination to exit the premises.
 - The proposed agri-entertainment business meets this condition. The proposed hours of operation for special events such as weddings are Friday Sunday from 5pm 10pm and 11pm to meet the requirements of this section. During the week, the venue is proposed to be used by community organizations, between the hours of 11am 6pm.
- M. All agri-entertainment events shall be provided with adequate potable water and sanitary waste disposal systems as approved by the Hall County Environmental Health Department.
 - The applicant must meet this requirement if the request is approved, and has indicated there is enough land to meet the septic requirements.
- N. All agri-entertainment events shall provide for adequate access and egress for emergency vehicles as determined through the development review process.

- The applicant will be required to receive approval from Hall County Engineering for the proposed site access.
- O. All agri-entertainment events shall be provided with adequate personnel to assist with parking, emergency and other potential impacts of each event.
 - If approved, the applicant must meet this requirement.
- P. If the property being considered for agri-entertainment use is "bona-fide conservation use property" as defined under O.C.G.A. §§ 48-5-7.1 through 48-5-7.4, caution should be used to insure that the proposed agri-entertainment use of the property does not constitute a breach of the conservation covenants applicable to the property.
 - The property is not under a conservation use covenant and as such this regulation is not applicable.

(A) Use Subject to County Commission Approval | for an agri-entertainment venue.

Per Planning Commission and Hall County Commission consideration and decision (17.380.060), the planning commission shall study the need and justification for the change based on a determination of the facts applicable to the particular case, and the following general lines of inquiry shall be considered, to wit:

- Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of
 adjacent and nearby property; The proposed use of the property is an agri-entertainment venue in the
 Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. Properties to the north and west across North Bogan
 Road are within the city limits of Buford. The properties to the east are zoned Residential I (R-I, 17.60)
 and are developed with single-family residential uses.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The request is for conditional use approval for an agri-entertainment venue in the Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. The proposed use may be more intense than that of the adjacent or nearby parcels and the requested variances for the building location and parking setback requirements reduce the separation of the event venue and parking from adjacent properties.
- 3. Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. Yes, the property has reasonable economic use as currently zoned, but the proposed business cannot occur as described without approval of the conditional use request. The subject property is zoned Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) and is developed with a 4,500 square foot single-family residence, constructed in 2014, and a 80 foot by 80 foot barn, per Hall County Property Tax records.
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities; The proposed use may cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets and transportation facilities, depending on the number of visitors the business can accommodate.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The current application is for a conditional use request for agri-entertainment business within the Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. The parcel falls within the Residential future land use classification of in the Comprehensive Plan. The intent of this classification is to preserve the established neighborhoods and create new residential developments consistent with surrounding suburban densities. The proposed use is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; **Staff has not** identified that the existing property values have been impacted by the existing zoning.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; Staff is unable to comment on the impact of property values without a full market analysis. Multiple factors impact property value including construction types, proposed uses, and maintenance. Often it is difficult to determine the effect of a development on adjacent properties until the development is completed.
- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; Staff has not identified a hardship imposed on the property owner as the property is currently zoned.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; The site has been developed with a residence since at least 2014.
- **10.** Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal; **There** are no known changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property.
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; There is no proposed change to the underlying zoning, as such, this criteria is not applicable.
- **12.** Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; **There is no evidence that the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn.**
- 13. Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; The proposed use is not out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole, as an event venue could compliment the residential growth occurring in the South Hall area.
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; As the proposed uses require Board of Commissioner approval for a conditional use permit, there are not adequate sites already zoned for an agri-entertainment business.
- 15. Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the [Planning Commission]; As the proposed uses require Board of Commissioner approval for a conditional use permit, the request could not be handled instead by a variance.
- 16. Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; Any land disturbance activities on the property shall be required to go through the land development permitting process, and as a result are subject to local, state, and federal regulations. As a result, there should not be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from any modification to the land if the request is granted.
- 17. Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; There is no evidence to indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property.

(B) Variance from 17.215.040 to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment structures from 300 feet to 15 feet and (C) Variance from 17.215.040 to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment parking from 200 feet to 15 feet:

Section <u>17.420.070</u>, appeals and modifications states that "if substantial modifications or changes are necessary, any person, firm, group or organization may apply for relief from the requirements set forth in this chapter to the Hall County Planning Commission, unless otherwise specified in this chapter."

The Planning Commission is hereby authorized to grant variances from the strict application of this Resolution upon proof by a preponderance of the evidence that $\underline{2.60.030.J}$ provided the request meets the criteria set forth in 2.60.030.K.

- 1. There are extraordinary and exceptional conditions pertaining to the particular lot in question because of its size, shape or topography (the hardship must relate to the physical character of the lot and not to a personal or economic hardship); Though the property is 7.03 acres in size, the site is somewhat limited by the existing structures and a pond on the property. It is possible that the proposed event venue and parking could be located so that no variances are needed, but the potential area is limited by the location of the pond and septic system.
- 2. The application of the requirements of this <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would create an unusual hardship; The application of the requirements of <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would not create an unusual hardship. The property can continue to be used as currently developed, with single-family residential and agricultural uses.
- 3. Such conditions are peculiar to the particular piece of property involved and are not common to other properties in the neighborhood; The existing site development limits the potential places an event venue could be located on the property.
- 4. Such conditions are not the result of any actions of the property owner; The applicant is proposing the development standards for the project that require the variance request.
- 5. Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of <u>Title 17</u>; provided, however, that no variance may be granted for a use of land or building or structure that is prohibited by <u>Title 17</u> or for a conditional use which has been denied by the county planning commission. It is difficult to assess the full impactof a development on the public, but if these variances were granted there should not be detriment to the public good or impair the intent of <u>Title 17</u>. The property will be subject to all other applicable local, state, and federal development standards.

<u>17.380.050</u>. - Submission requirements for a rezoning request

A. Any person or persons requesting a change in the official zoning map or use subject to approval of the county commission shall file an application with a plat or map of the property attached thereto, together with payment of such fees set forth in chapter 17.30 to cover administrative and advertising costs, in the planning department office. Such person or persons or their authorized agent shall appear in person at the public hearing held to consider the district change. Proposal meets the requirement. Applicant has paid the appropriate fees and understands that someone must be

present at both the Hall County Planning Commission meeting and the voting meeting of the Hall County Board of Commissioners.

- B. All applications for a change of zoning classification or use subject to approval of the county commission shall include:
 - A narrative statement identifying the existing and proposed use of the property and addressing each of the criteria set forth in section 17.380.060.C of this section [chapter]. The applicant has submitted a narrative and site plan but did not specifically address the criteria listed in 17.380.060.C.
 - 2. A site plan drawn to scale designating the area covered by the application and identifying existing and proposed buildings and uses, adjacent existing land uses, zoning on contiguous parcels, including those across an abutting public right-of-way, and any other significant site improvements proposed to accommodate the proposed use or buffer adjacent uses, etc., or a plat of the subject property where no specific land use is proposed. In cases where only a plat or map is provided and no land use is proposed, the planning commission and county commission shall evaluate the application based on the most intense possible land use permitted in the proposed district. The applicant has submitted a site plan drawn to scale.
- C. For any application for a slow rate land treatment system (see chapter 17.20), the following additional requirements apply. This standard is not applicable as the site will be served by an onsite septic system.
- D. For any application proposing the development of 100 or more residential dwelling units, a traffic impact study shall be submitted prior to consideration of the application by the planning commission. At the applicant's expense, the traffic impact study shall be prepared by a professional engineer in accordance with requirements established by the Hall County Engineering Department. The engineering department shall review the traffic impact study and forward any comments to the Hall County Planning Commission. As there are not 100 or more residential dwelling units proposed this question is not applicable.

<u>Development Support and Constraints – Departmental / Agency Comments</u>

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated June 22, 2023, Emily McGahee stated "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review. Additional items, including, but not limited to: soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan. Tourist Accommodation permit/plan review and/or Food Service permit/plan review may be required after review of business plan. Sewage flows for the entire property will be limited to 600 gallons per non-restricted acre per day."

Hall County Fire Marshal

In an email dated June 22, 2023, John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review Lieutenant provided the following comments:

- 1. If approved engineered site development plan will need to be submitted to Hall County for review and approval by the Development Review Committee
- 2. Based off the size of the proposed building and occupant load a fire protection and fire alarm system will be required
- 3. 8 inch underground fire line will be required for the fire protection water supply
- 4. Gainesville Fire Service Vault will be required
- 5. Additional fire hydrant(s) may be required
- 6. Fire apparatus accessibility must meet International Fire Code Standards.
- 7. Emergency responder radio coverage test will be required

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated May 18, 2023, Bill Nash, Director of Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

The site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage. Show stream buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation not center line of stream. Show stream buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation not center line of stream.

Tourist Accommodation permit/plan review and/or Food Service permit/plan review may be required after review of business plan. ON-SITE SEWAGE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS RULES 511-3-1-.03 General Requirements for On-Site Sewage Management Systems. (1) If public or community sewage treatment systems are not available, the owner of a building, residence, or property that is designed or intended for human occupancy or congregation shall provide an approved on-site sewage management system sufficient for the number of persons normally expected to use or frequent the building, residence or other property for two hours or more. (2) No person may begin the physical development of a lot or structure where an on-site sewage management system will be utilized, nor install an on-site sewage management system or component thereof, without having first obtained from the County Health Department a construction permit for the installation of an onsite sewage management system. And (1)(a) Connection shall be made to a public or community sewage treatment system if such system is available within two hundred feet (200') of the property line, or available in a public right-of-way abutting the property.

Sewage flows for the entire property will be limited to 600gallons per non-restricted acre per day.

3555 North Bogan Road Rezoning Request for Wedding/Other Events

The main concerns with this rezoning request at 3555 N. Bogan Rd. in Buford, that I and my nearby neighbors have are:

- 1. Much more traffic congestion with 144 cars trying to get on to N Bogan Rd from Friendship going to an event or getting onto Friendship from N. Bogan when leaving an event and the backups that already occur in this area will be seriously multiplied. Everyone in all the surrounding neighborhoods knows how difficult it is to turn left on Friendship Rd at the school there is no light there. And, it is just as difficult to turn left from Jones Rd onto Friendship already with no light there either, but add 144 more cars it will to be extremely long wait times to get to Friendship Rd, turn left or right there, or get to 985. I wonder what might happen if 175 cars showed up for a wedding event would the invited guests in 31 of those cars be turned away because the car limit has been reached? If not where will they park? The only access & exit to these venues will be N. Bogan Rd.
- 2. The noise level will increase due to the request for an outdoor pavilion where 300 people in a 99.9% residential area will be milling around talking and likely consuming alcohol. Hall County officials told me the outside music cannot be amplified but outdoor voices can be (like using a microphone and speakers). This could mean that entire ceremonies and other types of events could be amplified outdoors in the pavilion, toasting, celebrating, clapping, talking etc.
- 3. Mr. Moore has requested his setbacks from his neighbor's property lines be changed and reduced from 200 feet to 15 feet so he can put the proposed 2 buildings and the parking within 15 feet of his neighbors. The neighbors directly across the street and some whose backyards are in Bogan Gates subdivision are close to Mr. Moore's property. Also, the Morgan's Crossing neighbor's backyards are very close to the back of Mr. Moore's property right where he is proposing to build these 2 large buildings and parking.
- 4. Event venues could be of all kinds, not just weddings, including rock concerts if he ever chose to do so. These events could potentially be between 9am 10pm Sunday through Thursday and 9 am Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is a lot of traffic and car emissions and potential noise every day of the week and late into the evenings when folks are trying to sleep.
- 5. If this proposal is approved, having a commercial venue such as this in a 99.9% residential neighborhood and surrounded by other single homes and subdivisions on all sides will change the look and feel of our area. It can impact traffic flow, increase noise levels, and increase traffic backups and emissions in the area and reduce air quality.
- 6.This request of Mr. Moore's for an event venue is also totally inconsistent with the Residential Future land use designation in the Hall County's Comprehensive Plan. In part, this Plan states the primary future land uses for this area are "moderate density single-family residential developments..." The Narrative submitted by Mr. Moore to Hall County states "...it is about making money" thus making this a proposal for a commercial venue in a primarily residential area.

My name is Tony Reilly. I am against this proposed request for an Entertainment Venue for 3355 N. Bogan Rd for several reasons as follows:

- 1. Bogan Rd is only a small 2 lane road with no bike, walking, running, or turn lanes with the exception of some small turn lanes into some of the existing subdivisions and properties. There are already traffic bottlenecks for access from the N. Bogan Rd. to Friendship Rd. intersection at the school and from N. Bogan Rd. to the small cut through street Jones Rd. to Friendship intersection. These bottlenecks occur in the morning rush hour at the school on Friendship and at the intersection at Jones to Friendship. Cars are trying to mostly turn left to get to 985 so Jones and Bogan Roads get very backed up there. It also backs up on the weekends when folks are out and about running errands and trying to get to 985. There are no lights at either intersection. It is so bad on school mornings that there is usually a policeman directing traffic at N. Bogan and Friendship. The property at 3555 N. Bogan Rd is very close to Jones Rd and also very close to Friendship Rd and if wedding events or any other kinds of events that might be held according to the applicant's Narrative document this could cause a lot of major backups and a potential rise in accidents at those intersections with Friendship. The applicant has requested possible space for parking of at least 144 vehicles that is a lot more vehicles coming and going in the area coming around the same time and leaving around the same time. I do not believe that narrow Bogan Rd nor the intersections could handle the traffic.
- 2. Our area is 99.9% residential and has a nice residential feel including 3555 N. Bogan Rd. property. The look and feel or residential would change to a more commercial look and feel. The applicant has never said he would apply for a liquor or alcohol license and most wedding events serve alcohol so this would be likely going forward. The applicant has stated in his Narrative that this proposal is "to make money", so it will be commercial because of that and it will contain a larger building plus another large outdoor pavilion which will certainly be used for outside purposes so if people are outside there will be potential much higher noise levels even if most, but not necessarily all, amplified music and noise are going to be inside the building. What is the use of the Pavilion for it is not specifically stated in the Narrative so it is difficult to say what the noise levels in the surrounding residences and neighborhoods would be like until it happens, if this request is approved. If an event, whether wedding or other type of event, did include imbibing of alcohol then drivers leaving the area after a few hours may very well be inebriated and potentially be less safe drivers to say the least, thus more traffic accidents could occur, particularly trying to turn left on Friendship Rd. from N. Bogan Rd or Jones Rd. I have lived in this area for 24 years and have seen many people almost have an accident trying to go left on Friendship Rd and Friendship Rd. traffic is flying and coming to those intersections way beyond the posted speed limits.

- 3. Allowing this to become a potential commercial event venue may encourage the other nearby neighbors who have single homes on their properties to sell out to some commercial venture going forward. As is mentioned in the Hall County Planning Commission Staff Report, "Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the requested use inconsistent with the future land use classification of Residential in the Comprehensive Plan. The Primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments..." I, and many of my nearby Hall County neighbors agree with this statement wholeheartedly. Others, who do not live near our residential area and neighborhoods may support the applicant but they do not have to be around it in the future, nor the traffic and potential safety issues, nor the possible drop in our property values. Who wants to buy a residential home near commercial businesses? I am all for commercial business success in areas where there are already many other commercial businesses that have been zoned for those purposes but not in a primarily residential area as ours.
- 4.I am also against the times for the events being requested and what could potentially be allowed according to already existing Hall County rules for a venue like this. The applicant's Narrative proposed that events might be held on "Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays between 5pm to 11pm and some events also on week days from 11 am through 6pm." But I believe the Hall County rules events say that if the applicant's proposal is approved, the applicant could potentially be allowed to hold events between 9 am to 10 pm Sunday through Thursday, and from 9 am to Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is potentially all day everyday from 9 am to 10 pm or Midnight. With those hours in mind plus the applicant states in the proposal there up to but "not more than 300 people" at an event means a lot of cars leaving at midnight on the weekends and possibly at 10 pm during the week. With a possible 144 parking spaces that is a lot of potential traffic noise late at night on work and school nights plus later at night on the weekends, and all of this in a residential neighborhood area surrounding this property. And, the applicants Narrative states he wants to "have as many weddings as possible" as well as other types of events not described in the narrative. Since none of these other types of events have been described in the Narrative, how can neighbors in the area know what to expect going forward. Will these other events be rock concerts? Will these other events be for parties and social events? What type of customers will this venue be attracting to our neighborhood areas? We just do not know what this will look like or possibly turn into in the future whether the applicant stays as the owner in the future or builds it up, then decides to sell out to some other owner who wants to turn it into a dance club, a bar, or who knows what?

In summary, my main concerns at this time are

- 1.Traffic backup issues and access from Bogan Rd to Friendship Rd to go left to get to 985 and from Bogan Rd to Jones to Friendship Rd. to get to 985. This will be a problem with any day or night time venues and especially when an approximate potential 144 cars come to a venue or leave a venue along with the noise level of cars potentially leaving at late hours of the night even up to 10 pm weekdays and up to midnight on weekends.
- 2. The impact on our residential look and feel with a commercial venue operating in the heart of several existing residential neighborhoods & subdivisions. There is a definite possibility of dropping home property values going forward if the request is approved, particularly for the homes nearest the venue. Who wants to buy a home near a commercial venture such as this?
- 3. If this applicant's request is approved, there are several nearby single & property homeowners not within a subdivision who might be encouraged to try to get their property rezoned to allow for commercial use as well thus changing our area even more toward commercial useage. This would of course go against the Hall County's "Comprehensive Plan which states that this area's land use classification is Residential in the Comprehensive Plan. And it also states, "The Primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments..."
- 4. If the proposal is approved, the times that potential events could be held are every day between 9 am to 10pm work and school week days and 9 am to Midnight on weekends. This means it could possibly go on all day everyday until late hours at night with lots of noisy traffic leaving the events late at night. There are surrounding neighbors and subdivisions close by 3555 N. Bogan Rd. as well as neighbors directly across the street from this location that will have to deal with any traffic or event noise on any given day. And since the applicant has stated in his Narrative that he wants to "have as many weddings as possible" as well as other events but has not given a description of any of these other types of events, nearby neighbors have no idea of what the circumstances will be like going forward and cannot know until after the fact, if this is approved. More information would definitely be needed by all Hall County and all of our neighbors up front on the other types of events might be like so as to have a thorough understanding of what might be coming from this rezoning if approved.

3555 North Bogan Road Rezoning Request for Wedding/Other Events

The main concerns with this rezoning request at 3555 N. Bogan Rd. in Buford, that I and my nearby neighbors have are:

- 1. Much more traffic congestion with 144 cars trying to get on to N Bogan Rd from Friendship going to an event or getting onto Friendship from N. Bogan when leaving an event and the backups that already occur in this area will be seriously multiplied. Everyone in all the surrounding neighborhoods knows how difficult it is to turn left on Friendship Rd at the school there is no light there. And, it is just as difficult to turn left from Jones Rd onto Friendship already with no light there either, but add 144 more cars it will to be extremely long wait times to get to Friendship Rd, turn left or right there, or get to 985. I wonder what might happen if 175 cars showed up for a wedding event would the invited guests in 31 of those cars be turned away because the car limit has been reached? If not where will they park? The only access & exit to these venues will be N. Bogan Rd.
- 2. The noise level will increase due to the request for an outdoor pavilion where 300 people in a 99.9% residential area will be milling around talking and likely consuming alcohol. Hall County officials told me the outside music cannot be amplified but outdoor voices can be (like using a microphone and speakers). This could mean that entire ceremonies and other types of events could be amplified outdoors in the pavilion, toasting, celebrating, clapping, talking etc.
- 3. Mr. Moore has requested his setbacks from his neighbor's property lines be changed and reduced from 200 feet to 15 feet so he can put the proposed 2 buildings and the parking within 15 feet of his neighbors. The neighbors directly across the street and some whose backyards are in Bogan Gates subdivision are close to Mr. Moore's property. Also, the Morgan's Crossing neighbor's backyards are very close to the back of Mr. Moore's property right where he is proposing to build these 2 large buildings and parking.

To the Hall County Board of Commissioners, my name is Tony Reilly and I live at 4561 Bogan Gates Trail in Buford, Ga. 30519 which is just south of 3555 North Bogan Rd by about 1000 feet.

I am definitely opposed to any conditional use changes or variance requests for 3555 N. Bogan Rd to allow any kinds of events for the following reasons:

- 1. Mr. Moore's request is inconsistent with Hall County's Comprehensive Plan for this area which is zoned for "Moderate Density Single Family Homes". Our area is 99.9% residential now and has a nice quiet residential look and feel definitely not a commercial feel. Mr. Moore's Narrative stated that "many businesses exist" in this area on N. Bogan Rd. which is totally incorrect. There is only one in this area. Our neighborhood area is not commercialized. There are businesses further up off of the 4 lane Friendship Rd. but not on two lane residential area of N. Bogan Rd. Mr. Moore's property has single homes adjacent to his, single residential homes directly across the narrow 2 lane Bogan Rd from him, and single residential homes backed up to and very close to his property as well as many nearby subdivisions all with single family residences.
- 2. Mr. Moore has requested incredible and unprecedented 15' variances from adjacent neighbors and wants to build a huge building and huge pavilion within 15' of other neighbors properties. Noise level will increase tremendously with outside wedding event music and ceremonies with speakers which will be allowed to be amplified in his proposed Pavilion or on other places on his property if this is approved. The noise levels inside the proposed building may end up being loud enough to be heard outside of the building though it may be insulated. No one knows what it will be like until it is too late. This is commercial venue
- 3. Mr. Moore's Site Plan drawing shows he wants the option of having 60 cars on gravel parking and 84 cars on grass parking for a total of 144 cars. The Site Plan itself only shows one Proposed Parking place for about 44 cars and does not say if that is the gravel area or the grass area. Who knows where 144 total cars will end up parking on this property during Events and how will they enter and leave will it be on N. Bogan Rd only or does Mr. Moore want to try and exit out onto Chatuge in Morgan's Crossing? The Site Plan does not seem to clearly draw this out. And will the parked cars be close to the road? How close will they be near surrounding neighbors. How loud will these cars be starting up and driving out at 10 pm on school and work nights or at midnight on weekends when they leave Events? Will it be so loud that close neighbors can't get to sleep or will be awakened?
- 4. There is no traffic study to show the impact on traffic flow of a potential 144 cars coming and going to the Events which is only about 2000 feet from the major intersection of N. Bogan Rd and Friendship Rd at the school. Traffic already backs up at that intersection when people are going to work, school or shopping at different times of the day. This is especially true when cars are trying to turn left on to Friendship to get to 985. Average length of cars in 2023 is about 15' so if a potential

144 cars left an event at the same time that would be about 2160' of total car lengths without any space between them which means they would be backed up all the way from Friendship Rd to 3555 N. Bogan Rd property if they were all exiting toward Friendship Rd. What neighbors would want to have to get behind a trail of cars like that just to get to Friendship Rd. to get to work, school, shopping,or to the freeway or to the NE Georgia Hospital in Braselton on Friendship Rd? It can already take up to 5 to 10 minutes waiting time at these intersections with only having to wait for 5 - 6 cars. Narrow two lane only North Bogan Rd is simply not set up to accomodate 144 cars nor a commercial event venue such as the one being proposed by Mr. Moore. In the Narrative Mr. Moore talks about having "Wet Lands" that will never be developed but this is not shown on the Site Plan and he gives different addresses referring to that. The Pond may be what he is talking about as the wetlands but he lists 116 Spring St and 4340 Chatuga Drive when mentioning Wetlands so this is extremely confusing.

- 5. Mr. Moore states in his Narrative that he wants to operate this commercial Event Venue for the next 30 years and to have "as many weddings as possible" as well as other events where he wants to "extend the range of activity" to mornings, and have other various Events but never describes what kinds of Events he means. Could they be rock concerts, dance club events, and will alcohol be served which is usually the case at most weddings? Will folks be milling around outside in the 'Pavilion' having drinks and partying, etc? Who knows what this might look like or turn into in the future?
- 6. Mr. Moore's Narrative talks about giving back to the community but what he proposes would actually take away from our neighborhood residential community in many ways with rising noise levels, increased traffic and more traffic congestion, potentially lowering of home values and changing the look and feel of our residential look and feel. The quality of life of Mr. Moore's neighbors will definitely be impacted for years and years to come and all for the purpose that Mr. Moore gives in his Narrative when in his own words he said, '...this is about making money." This is totally a commercial enterprise in a single family home residential area. How many folks on the Board of Commissioners would like to have something like this across the street from them. Many of our neighbors definitely do not want this in their area. Please do not approve this conditional use request and change the quality of life in our single family home residential area. Thank you.

Summary Analysis

The applicant is requesting (A) Use Subject to County Commission Approval for an agri-entertainment (17.215) venue within the Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) zoning district on a 7.03± acre parcel. Concurrent to the rezoning request, the applicant is requesting relief from 17.215.040 (conditions and regulations for agri-entertainment) to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment structures from 300 feet to 15 feet, and (C) to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment parking from 200 feet to 15 feet.

The applicant is proposing to operate an agri-entertainment venue on the subject property, which will be located in a proposed 50 foot by 100 foot barn, with an attached 70 foot by 100 foot pavilion. Per the submitted site plan, the proposed barn location is approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and 140 feet from the rear property line. There is a proposed gravel parking area, located immediately adjacent to the proposed event venue. The parking area is approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and

approximately 25 feet from the rear property line and will contain 60 parking spaces. The site plan notes there area an additional 84 grass parking spaces, but it is not clear where on the property those are located. The site plan shows a proposed buffer of Leyland Cypress trees along the left and right side property lines. The narrative states that the buffer may be vegetated or consist of a split rail fence. Additionally, the site plan notes that the gravel parking area would be surrounded by an 8 foot tall fence to mitigate any impact on the neighboring property.

The submitted narrative states that intent of the agri-entertainment venue is to provide an event space for the community. The primary use will be weddings, which the narrative states may occur Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 5pm – 10pm or 11pm. During the week, the venue is proposed to be used by community organizations, between the hours of 11am – 6pm. The maximum number of guests proposed by the applicant is 300. The applicant submitted two examples of the proposed structure for reference, which are included in the application packet.

The subject property is developed with a 4,500 square foot single family residence, constructed in 2014. An existing barn will be demolished and the proposed event venue constructed in its place. Access to the property will be from the existing driveway on North Bogan Road.

Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the <u>requested use inconsistent</u> with the future land use classification of Residential in the <u>Comprehensive Plan</u>. The primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments, greenspace, and civic uses such as libraries, churches, and schools.

Zoning Analysis

Per section <u>17.215.040</u>, conditions and regulations for agri-entertainment:

- A. A Hall County Business License shall be required if the zoning request is approved for the agrientertainment events.
 - The applicant will be required to obtain a Hall County Business License, subject to the below conditions and any additional conditions added, prior to beginning operation.
- B. The property shall be used for the purpose of providing an agri-entertainment venue, as provided for in section 17.215.030(A).
 - The proposed uses are consistent with those described in <u>section 17.215.030(A)</u>.
- C. The structure that will house the agri-entertainment event shall be located a minimum of 300 feet from any property lines of a different owner.
 - The applicant has requested relief from the building setback requirement, with the proposed structure located approximately 20 feet from the right side property line. The requested variance is 15 feet from property line.
 - Required setback = 300 feet
 Proposed setback = 15 feet
 Required variance = 285 feet
- D. All parking for an agri-entertainment event shall be located a minimum of 200 feet from any property lines of a different owner.
 - The applicant has requested relief from the parking setback requirement, with the proposed parking area located approximately 20 feet from the right side property line and 25 feet from the rear property line. The requested variance is 15 feet from property line.

- Required setback = 200 feet
 Proposed setback = 15 feet
 Required variance = 185 feet
- E. Parking shall be permitted on grass or gravel.
 - The applicant's narrative states that the parking areas will be both gravel and grass.
- F. The agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall be permitted to be constructed only on the property described.
 - The applicant intends to construct a 50 foot by 100 foot barn, with an attached 70 foot by 100 foot pavilion, if the agri-entertainment use is approved.
- G. The maximum number of attendees to occupy any agri-entertainment event barn or structure on the premises shall be regulated by the Hall County Fire Marshal.
 - The applicant's narrative states that maximum number of guests is proposed to be 300, with 144 proposed parking spaces. The maximum number of occupants will be determined by the Hall County Fire Marshal during the development process.
- H. The occupancy of the agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall not exceed the occupancy load provisions of the Uniform Building Code and those occupancy load limits shall be posted on the premises by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the occupancy will be determined by Hall County Building Inspections and the Fire Marshal, based on the above criteria.
- I. The use of the premises for an agri-entertainment venue shall be permitted only after the issuance of a certificate of occupancy by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the applicant shall be required to obtain a certificate of occupancy prior to commencing operations.
- J. Any improvements required to support the property as an agri-entertainment venue shall be made only after the issuance of a building permit by the Hall County Building Inspection Department.
 - If approved, the applicant shall be required to obtain a building permit from Hall County Building Inspections.
- K. Outdoor activities within the agri-entertainment event barn or primary event structure shall not involve the outside amplification of voice, music and/or instruments except during a wedding ceremony.
 - The applicant has not indicated that outside amplification of voice, music, and/or instruments is proposed as part of the application.
- L. Agri-entertainment events shall commence no earlier than 9:00 a.m. and shall terminate no later than 10:00 p.m. on Sunday through Thursday and no later than 12:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.
 - For [the] purpose of this section, termination shall mean the termination of food, drinks, service and entertainment with the understanding that attendees will need a reasonable amount of time after termination to exit the premises.
 - The proposed agri-entertainment business meets this condition. The proposed hours of operation for special events such as weddings are Friday Sunday from 5pm 10pm and 11pm to meet the requirements of this section. During the week, the venue is proposed to be used by community organizations, between the hours of 11am 6pm.
- M. All agri-entertainment events shall be provided with adequate potable water and sanitary waste disposal systems as approved by the Hall County Environmental Health Department.
 - The applicant must meet this requirement if the request is approved, and has indicated there is enough land to meet the septic requirements.
- N. All agri-entertainment events shall provide for adequate access and egress for emergency vehicles as determined through the development review process.

- The applicant will be required to receive approval from Hall County Engineering for the proposed site access.
- O. All agri-entertainment events shall be provided with adequate personnel to assist with parking, emergency and other potential impacts of each event.
 - If approved, the applicant must meet this requirement.
- P. If the property being considered for agri-entertainment use is "bona-fide conservation use property" as defined under O.C.G.A. §§ 48-5-7.1 through 48-5-7.4, caution should be used to insure that the proposed agri-entertainment use of the property does not constitute a breach of the conservation covenants applicable to the property.
 - The property is not under a conservation use covenant and as such this regulation is not applicable.

(A) Use Subject to County Commission Approval | for an agri-entertainment venue.

Per Planning Commission and Hall County Commission consideration and decision (17.380.060), the planning commission shall study the need and justification for the change based on a determination of the facts applicable to the particular case, and the following general lines of inquiry shall be considered, to wit:

- Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of
 adjacent and nearby property; The proposed use of the property is an agri-entertainment venue in the
 Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. Properties to the north and west across North Bogan
 Road are within the city limits of Buford. The properties to the east are zoned Residential I (R-I, 17.60)
 and are developed with single-family residential uses.
- 2. Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property; The request is for conditional use approval for an agri-entertainment venue in the Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. The proposed use may be more intense than that of the adjacent or nearby parcels and the requested variances for the building location and parking setback requirements reduce the separation of the event venue and parking from adjacent properties.
- 3. Whether the property to be affected by the zoning proposal has reasonable economic use as currently zoned. Yes, the property has reasonable economic use as currently zoned, but the proposed business cannot occur as described without approval of the conditional use request. The subject property is zoned Agricultural Residential III (AR-III, 17.110) and is developed with a 4,500 square foot single-family residence, constructed in 2014, and a 80 foot by 80 foot barn, per Hall County Property Tax records.
- 4. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, or utilities; The proposed use may cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets and transportation facilities, depending on the number of visitors the business can accommodate.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the policy and intent of the land use plan; The current application is for a conditional use request for agri-entertainment business within the Agricultural-Residential-III (AR-III, 17.110) district. The parcel falls within the Residential future land use classification of in the Comprehensive Plan. The intent of this classification is to preserve the established neighborhoods and create new residential developments consistent with surrounding suburban densities. The proposed use is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

- 6. The extent to which property values are diminished by the existing zoning restrictions; **Staff has not** identified that the existing property values have been impacted by the existing zoning.
- 7. The extent to which the destruction of the subject property's value under the existing zoning promotes the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the public; Staff is unable to comment on the impact of property values without a full market analysis. Multiple factors impact property value including construction types, proposed uses, and maintenance. Often it is difficult to determine the effect of a development on adjacent properties until the development is completed.
- 8. The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner; Staff has not identified a hardship imposed on the property owner as the property is currently zoned.
- 9. The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned considered in the context of land development in the area in the vicinity of the property; The site has been developed with a residence since at least 2014.
- **10.** Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal; **There** are no known changing conditions affecting the use or development of the property.
- 11. Whether the change would create an isolated district unrelated to the surrounding districts; There is no proposed change to the underlying zoning, as such, this criteria is not applicable.
- **12.** Whether the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn in relation to existing conditions in the area; **There is no evidence that the present zoning district boundaries are illogically drawn.**
- 13. Whether the change requested is out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole or the immediate neighborhood; The proposed use is not out of scale with the needs of the county as a whole, as an event venue could compliment the residential growth occurring in the South Hall area.
- 14. Whether it is impossible to find adequate sites for the proposed use in districts permitting such use and already appropriately zoned; As the proposed uses require Board of Commissioner approval for a conditional use permit, there are not adequate sites already zoned for an agri-entertainment business.
- 15. Whether the need for rezoning could be handled instead by a variance request to the [Planning Commission]; As the proposed uses require Board of Commissioner approval for a conditional use permit, the request could not be handled instead by a variance.
- 16. Whether there would be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from major modifications to the land if the request is granted; Any land disturbance activities on the property shall be required to go through the land development permitting process, and as a result are subject to local, state, and federal regulations. As a result, there should not be an ecological or pollution impact resulting from any modification to the land if the request is granted.
- 17. Whether there is reasonable evidence based upon existing and anticipated land use that would indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property; There is no evidence to indicate a mistake was made in the original zoning of the property.

(B) Variance from 17.215.040 to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment structures from 300 feet to 15 feet and (C) Variance from 17.215.040 to reduce the setback for agri-entertainment parking from 200 feet to 15 feet:

Section <u>17.420.070</u>, appeals and modifications states that "if substantial modifications or changes are necessary, any person, firm, group or organization may apply for relief from the requirements set forth in this chapter to the Hall County Planning Commission, unless otherwise specified in this chapter."

The Planning Commission is hereby authorized to grant variances from the strict application of this Resolution upon proof by a preponderance of the evidence that $\underline{2.60.030.J}$ provided the request meets the criteria set forth in 2.60.030.K.

- 1. There are extraordinary and exceptional conditions pertaining to the particular lot in question because of its size, shape or topography (the hardship must relate to the physical character of the lot and not to a personal or economic hardship); Though the property is 7.03 acres in size, the site is somewhat limited by the existing structures and a pond on the property. It is possible that the proposed event venue and parking could be located so that no variances are needed, but the potential area is limited by the location of the pond and septic system.
- 2. The application of the requirements of this <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would create an unusual hardship; The application of the requirements of <u>Title 17</u> to this particular piece of property would not create an unusual hardship. The property can continue to be used as currently developed, with single-family residential and agricultural uses.
- 3. Such conditions are peculiar to the particular piece of property involved and are not common to other properties in the neighborhood; The existing site development limits the potential places an event venue could be located on the property.
- 4. Such conditions are not the result of any actions of the property owner; The applicant is proposing the development standards for the project that require the variance request.
- 5. Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of <u>Title 17</u>; provided, however, that no variance may be granted for a use of land or building or structure that is prohibited by <u>Title 17</u> or for a conditional use which has been denied by the county planning commission. It is difficult to assess the full impactof a development on the public, but if these variances were granted there should not be detriment to the public good or impair the intent of <u>Title 17</u>. The property will be subject to all other applicable local, state, and federal development standards.

<u>17.380.050</u>. - Submission requirements for a rezoning request

A. Any person or persons requesting a change in the official zoning map or use subject to approval of the county commission shall file an application with a plat or map of the property attached thereto, together with payment of such fees set forth in chapter 17.30 to cover administrative and advertising costs, in the planning department office. Such person or persons or their authorized agent shall appear in person at the public hearing held to consider the district change. Proposal meets the requirement. Applicant has paid the appropriate fees and understands that someone must be

present at both the Hall County Planning Commission meeting and the voting meeting of the Hall County Board of Commissioners.

- B. All applications for a change of zoning classification or use subject to approval of the county commission shall include:
 - A narrative statement identifying the existing and proposed use of the property and addressing each of the criteria set forth in section 17.380.060.C of this section [chapter]. The applicant has submitted a narrative and site plan but did not specifically address the criteria listed in 17.380.060.C.
 - 2. A site plan drawn to scale designating the area covered by the application and identifying existing and proposed buildings and uses, adjacent existing land uses, zoning on contiguous parcels, including those across an abutting public right-of-way, and any other significant site improvements proposed to accommodate the proposed use or buffer adjacent uses, etc., or a plat of the subject property where no specific land use is proposed. In cases where only a plat or map is provided and no land use is proposed, the planning commission and county commission shall evaluate the application based on the most intense possible land use permitted in the proposed district. The applicant has submitted a site plan drawn to scale.
- C. For any application for a slow rate land treatment system (see chapter 17.20), the following additional requirements apply. This standard is not applicable as the site will be served by an onsite septic system.
- D. For any application proposing the development of 100 or more residential dwelling units, a traffic impact study shall be submitted prior to consideration of the application by the planning commission. At the applicant's expense, the traffic impact study shall be prepared by a professional engineer in accordance with requirements established by the Hall County Engineering Department. The engineering department shall review the traffic impact study and forward any comments to the Hall County Planning Commission. As there are not 100 or more residential dwelling units proposed this question is not applicable.

<u>Development Support and Constraints – Departmental / Agency Comments</u>

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated June 22, 2023, Emily McGahee stated "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review. Additional items, including, but not limited to: soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan. Tourist Accommodation permit/plan review and/or Food Service permit/plan review may be required after review of business plan. Sewage flows for the entire property will be limited to 600 gallons per non-restricted acre per day."

Hall County Fire Marshal

In an email dated June 22, 2023, John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review Lieutenant provided the following comments:

- 1. If approved engineered site development plan will need to be submitted to Hall County for review and approval by the Development Review Committee
- 2. Based off the size of the proposed building and occupant load a fire protection and fire alarm system will be required
- 3. 8 inch underground fire line will be required for the fire protection water supply
- 4. Gainesville Fire Service Vault will be required
- 5. Additional fire hydrant(s) may be required
- 6. Fire apparatus accessibility must meet International Fire Code Standards.
- 7. Emergency responder radio coverage test will be required

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated May 18, 2023, Bill Nash, Director of Public Works and Utilities, provided the following comments:

Engineering:

The site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage. Show stream buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation not center line of stream. Show stream buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation not center line of stream.

Georgia Department of Transportation

In an email dated May 25, 2023, Parker Niebauer, D1TO Traffic Operations Supervisor confirmed GDOT coordination would not be required.

I cant change the world but I can try and change the small part of the world I touch.

I have included several Neighbors letters that touch my property. As you can see I get along with <u>ALL</u> my neighbors. If more letters are required I am sure I can get them from any neighbor you require I know them all. My property has always been open to all they only need ask.

The property directly behind us is a natural area and will never be developed. It is declared "Wet Lands". I have included this Site plan. Plat from 116 spring street for 4340 Chatuga drive. Plat book 627 Page: 107A.

I would need to provide a variance for the building and the parking since it sits next to my neighbor Jeremy Fouler. Jeremy Fouler will join us for the meeting, he also signed a letter. I need this variance since there is a large 1-acre pond in the middle of the property. Which means I can only build on the side of it and park near it.... See the proposed drawing for Parking and building specs. The pond is one of the selling features of the property and gives people a beautiful setting (For the guests and the neighbors). If Jeremy would ever move I would buy his property and we have talked about it.

I am proposing a planted buffer on the side property lines with shrubs or a Sypris trees or a 4 rail fence. the building soundproof as well as acoustically designed. This is just a proposal, and I am totally open to any changes the board, or my neighbors would like to see. On my property or theirs. My intention is not to dictate what I want but provide, its to find something that everyone agrees on.

There is a winery only three houses to the North of us called "Cloud Land". I am not in a subdivision, but I am on a the same major road: "North Bogan Road" where many businesses exist. My property is over seven acres which is more than most wedding venues provide, like four Oak Manor, that only has a couple acres and is only a couple miles away. My property is also zoned AR III. This venue would cater to people over a short window, mainly on the weekends.

I have provided a plat with "existing", and "proposed" buildings, Proposed Pavilion and parking with an existing house.

3555 North Bogan Road Rezoning Request for Wedding/Other Events

The main concerns with this rezoning request at 3555 N. Bogan Rd. in Buford, that I and my nearby neighbors have are:

- 1. Much more traffic congestion with 144 cars trying to get on to N Bogan Rd from Friendship going to an event or getting onto Friendship from N. Bogan when leaving an event and the backups that already occur in this area will be seriously multiplied. Everyone in all the surrounding neighborhoods knows how difficult it is to turn left on Friendship Rd at the school there is no light there. And, it is just as difficult to turn left from Jones Rd onto Friendship already with no light there either, but add 144 more cars it will to be extremely long wait times to get to Friendship Rd, turn left or right there, or get to 985. I wonder what might happen if 175 cars showed up for a wedding event would the invited guests in 31 of those cars be turned away because the car limit has been reached? If not where will they park? The only access & exit to these venues will be N. Bogan Rd.
- 2. The noise level will increase due to the request for an outdoor pavilion where 300 people in a 99.9% residential area will be milling around talking and likely consuming alcohol. Hall County officials told me the outside music cannot be amplified but outdoor voices can be (like using a microphone and speakers). This could mean that entire ceremonies and other types of events could be amplified outdoors in the pavilion, toasting, celebrating, clapping, talking etc.
- 3. Mr. Moore has requested his setbacks from his neighbor's property lines be changed and reduced from 200 feet to 15 feet so he can put the proposed 2 buildings and the parking within 15 feet of his neighbors. The neighbors directly across the street and some whose backyards are in Bogan Gates subdivision are close to Mr. Moore's property. Also, the Morgan's Crossing neighbor's backyards are very close to the back of Mr. Moore's property right where he is proposing to build these 2 large buildings and parking.
- 4. Event venues could be of all kinds, not just weddings, including rock concerts if he ever chose to do so. These events could potentially be between 9am 10pm Sunday through Thursday and 9 am Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is a lot of traffic and car emissions and potential noise every day of the week and late into the evenings when folks are trying to sleep.
- 5. If this proposal is approved, having a commercial venue such as this in a 99.9% residential neighborhood and surrounded by other single homes and subdivisions on all sides will change the look and feel of our area. It can impact traffic flow, increase noise levels, and increase traffic backups and emissions in the area and reduce air quality.
- 6.This request of Mr. Moore's for an event venue is also totally inconsistent with the Residential Future land use designation in the Hall County's Comprehensive Plan. In part, this Plan states the primary future land uses for this area are "moderate density single-family residential developments..." The Narrative submitted by Mr. Moore to Hall County states "...it is about making money" thus making this a proposal for a commercial venue in a primarily residential area.

My name is Tony Reilly. I am against this proposed request for an Entertainment Venue for 3355 N. Bogan Rd for several reasons as follows:

- 1. Bogan Rd is only a small 2 lane road with no bike, walking, running, or turn lanes with the exception of some small turn lanes into some of the existing subdivisions and properties. There are already traffic bottlenecks for access from the N. Bogan Rd. to Friendship Rd. intersection at the school and from N. Bogan Rd. to the small cut through street Jones Rd. to Friendship intersection. These bottlenecks occur in the morning rush hour at the school on Friendship and at the intersection at Jones to Friendship. Cars are trying to mostly turn left to get to 985 so Jones and Bogan Roads get very backed up there. It also backs up on the weekends when folks are out and about running errands and trying to get to 985. There are no lights at either intersection. It is so bad on school mornings that there is usually a policeman directing traffic at N. Bogan and Friendship. The property at 3555 N. Bogan Rd is very close to Jones Rd and also very close to Friendship Rd and if wedding events or any other kinds of events that might be held according to the applicant's Narrative document this could cause a lot of major backups and a potential rise in accidents at those intersections with Friendship. The applicant has requested possible space for parking of at least 144 vehicles that is a lot more vehicles coming and going in the area coming around the same time and leaving around the same time. I do not believe that narrow Bogan Rd nor the intersections could handle the traffic.
- 2. Our area is 99.9% residential and has a nice residential feel including 3555 N. Bogan Rd. property. The look and feel or residential would change to a more commercial look and feel. The applicant has never said he would apply for a liquor or alcohol license and most wedding events serve alcohol so this would be likely going forward. The applicant has stated in his Narrative that this proposal is "to make money", so it will be commercial because of that and it will contain a larger building plus another large outdoor pavilion which will certainly be used for outside purposes so if people are outside there will be potential much higher noise levels even if most, but not necessarily all, amplified music and noise are going to be inside the building. What is the use of the Pavilion for it is not specifically stated in the Narrative so it is difficult to say what the noise levels in the surrounding residences and neighborhoods would be like until it happens, if this request is approved. If an event, whether wedding or other type of event, did include imbibing of alcohol then drivers leaving the area after a few hours may very well be inebriated and potentially be less safe drivers to say the least, thus more traffic accidents could occur, particularly trying to turn left on Friendship Rd. from N. Bogan Rd or Jones Rd. I have lived in this area for 24 years and have seen many people almost have an accident trying to go left on Friendship Rd and Friendship Rd. traffic is flying and coming to those intersections way beyond the posted speed limits.

- 3. Allowing this to become a potential commercial event venue may encourage the other nearby neighbors who have single homes on their properties to sell out to some commercial venture going forward. As is mentioned in the Hall County Planning Commission Staff Report, "Based on the future land-use plan, staff finds the requested use inconsistent with the future land use classification of Residential in the Comprehensive Plan. The Primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments..." I, and many of my nearby Hall County neighbors agree with this statement wholeheartedly. Others, who do not live near our residential area and neighborhoods may support the applicant but they do not have to be around it in the future, nor the traffic and potential safety issues, nor the possible drop in our property values. Who wants to buy a residential home near commercial businesses? I am all for commercial business success in areas where there are already many other commercial businesses that have been zoned for those purposes but not in a primarily residential area as ours.
- 4.I am also against the times for the events being requested and what could potentially be allowed according to already existing Hall County rules for a venue like this. The applicant's Narrative proposed that events might be held on "Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays between 5pm to 11pm and some events also on week days from 11 am through 6pm." But I believe the Hall County rules events say that if the applicant's proposal is approved, the applicant could potentially be allowed to hold events between 9 am to 10 pm Sunday through Thursday, and from 9 am to Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is potentially all day everyday from 9 am to 10 pm or Midnight. With those hours in mind plus the applicant states in the proposal there up to but "not more than 300 people" at an event means a lot of cars leaving at midnight on the weekends and possibly at 10 pm during the week. With a possible 144 parking spaces that is a lot of potential traffic noise late at night on work and school nights plus later at night on the weekends, and all of this in a residential neighborhood area surrounding this property. And, the applicants Narrative states he wants to "have as many weddings as possible" as well as other types of events not described in the narrative. Since none of these other types of events have been described in the Narrative, how can neighbors in the area know what to expect going forward. Will these other events be rock concerts? Will these other events be for parties and social events? What type of customers will this venue be attracting to our neighborhood areas? We just do not know what this will look like or possibly turn into in the future whether the applicant stays as the owner in the future or builds it up, then decides to sell out to some other owner who wants to turn it into a dance club, a bar, or who knows what?

In summary, my main concerns at this time are

- 1.Traffic backup issues and access from Bogan Rd to Friendship Rd to go left to get to 985 and from Bogan Rd to Jones to Friendship Rd. to get to 985. This will be a problem with any day or night time venues and especially when an approximate potential 144 cars come to a venue or leave a venue along with the noise level of cars potentially leaving at late hours of the night even up to 10 pm weekdays and up to midnight on weekends.
- 2. The impact on our residential look and feel with a commercial venue operating in the heart of several existing residential neighborhoods & subdivisions. There is a definite possibility of dropping home property values going forward if the request is approved, particularly for the homes nearest the venue. Who wants to buy a home near a commercial venture such as this?
- 3. If this applicant's request is approved, there are several nearby single & property homeowners not within a subdivision who might be encouraged to try to get their property rezoned to allow for commercial use as well thus changing our area even more toward commercial useage. This would of course go against the Hall County's "Comprehensive Plan which states that this area's land use classification is Residential in the Comprehensive Plan. And it also states, "The Primary future land uses for this classification are moderate density single-family residential developments..."
- 4. If the proposal is approved, the times that potential events could be held are every day between 9 am to 10pm work and school week days and 9 am to Midnight on weekends. This means it could possibly go on all day everyday until late hours at night with lots of noisy traffic leaving the events late at night. There are surrounding neighbors and subdivisions close by 3555 N. Bogan Rd. as well as neighbors directly across the street from this location that will have to deal with any traffic or event noise on any given day. And since the applicant has stated in his Narrative that he wants to "have as many weddings as possible" as well as other events but has not given a description of any of these other types of events, nearby neighbors have no idea of what the circumstances will be like going forward and cannot know until after the fact, if this is approved. More information would definitely be needed by all Hall County and all of our neighbors up front on the other types of events might be like so as to have a thorough understanding of what might be coming from this rezoning if approved.

I wonder what might happen if 175 cars showed up for a wedding event would the invited guests in 31 of those cars be turned away because the car limit has been reached? If not where will they park? The only access & exit to these venues will be N. Bogan Rd.
- 2. The noise level will increase due to the request for an outdoor pavilion where 300 people in a 99.9% residential area will be milling around talking and likely consuming alcohol. Hall County officials told me the outside music cannot be amplified but outdoor voices can be (like using a microphone and speakers). This could mean that entire ceremonies and other types of events could be amplified outdoors in the pavilion, toasting, celebrating, clapping, talking etc.
- 3. Mr. Moore has requested his setbacks from his neighbor's property lines be changed and reduced from 200 feet to 15 feet so he can put the proposed 2 buildings and the parking within 15 feet of his neighbors. The neighbors directly across the street and some whose backyards are in Bogan Gates subdivision are close to Mr. Moore's property. Also, the Morgan's Crossing neighbor's backyards are very close to the back of Mr. Moore's property right where he is proposing to build these 2 large buildings and parking.
- 4. Event venues could be of all kinds, not just weddings, including rock concerts if he ever chose to do so. These events could potentially be between 9am 10pm Sunday through Thursday and 9 am Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. That is a lot of traffic and car emissions and potential noise every day of the week and late into the evenings when folks are trying to sleep.
- 5. If this proposal is approved, having a commercial venue such as this in a 99.9% residential neighborhood and surrounded by other single homes and subdivisions on all sides will change the look and feel of our area. It can impact traffic flow, increase noise levels, and increase traffic backups and emissions in the area and reduce air quality.
- 6.This request of Mr. Moore's for an event venue is also totally inconsistent with the Residential Future land use designation in the Hall County's Comprehensive Plan. In part, this Plan states the primary future land uses for this area are "moderate density single-family residential developments..." The Narrative submitted by Mr. Moore to Hall County states "...it is about making money" thus making this a proposal for a commercial venue in a primarily residential area.

- 1) The county has the obligation to make public, and the residents the right to review, a properly completed application before making a recommendation concerning the variance request
 - a. Per county application requirements the application "shall include" the location of signs, a
 DOT letter of commitment, details on ingress and egress, and where the full 144 parking
 spots will be located; none was provided
 - b. Without the proper public notice a complete application provides, no other decision but a denial of the variance request is appropriate
- 2) The proposed activities are not in keeping with character of the neighborhood
 - a. Nearby subdivisions contain hundreds of homes
 - b. No nearby businesses have paved parking lots for more than 10 vehicles
- 3) Other factors:
 - a. Excessive size: The size of the new barn as proposed is to be limited only by "whatever the county allows" but hopefully will hold up to 300 people at one time; the pavilion is even larger.

REGARDING 3555 N. BOGAN RD

To the Hall County Board of Commissioners, my name is Tony Reilly and I live at 4561 Bogan Gates Trail in Buford, Ga. 30519 which is just south of 3555 North Bogan Rd by about 1000 feet.

I am definitely opposed to any conditional use changes or variance requests for 3555 N. Bogan Rd to allow any kinds of events for the following reasons:

- 1. Mr. Moore's request is inconsistent with Hall County's Comprehensive Plan for this area which is zoned for "Moderate Density Single Family Homes". Our area is 99.9% residential now and has a nice quiet residential look and feel definitely not a commercial feel. Mr. Moore's Narrative stated that "many businesses exist" in this area on N. Bogan Rd. which is totally incorrect. There is only one in this area. Our neighborhood area is not commercialized. There are businesses further up off of the 4 lane Friendship Rd. but not on two lane residential area of N. Bogan Rd. Mr. Moore's property has single homes adjacent to his, single residential homes directly across the narrow 2 lane Bogan Rd from him, and single residential homes backed up to and very close to his property as well as many nearby subdivisions all with single family residences.
- 2. Mr. Moore has requested incredible and unprecedented 15' variances from adjacent neighbors and wants to build a huge building and huge pavilion within 15' of other neighbors properties. Noise level will increase tremendously with outside wedding event music and ceremonies with speakers which will be allowed to be amplified in his proposed Pavilion or on other places on his property if this is approved. The noise levels inside the proposed building may end up being loud enough to be heard outside of the building though it may be insulated. No one knows what it will be like until it is too late. This is commercial venue
- 3. Mr. Moore's Site Plan drawing shows he wants the option of having 60 cars on gravel parking and 84 cars on grass parking for a total of 144 cars. The Site Plan itself only shows one Proposed Parking place for about 44 cars and does not say if that is the gravel area or the grass area. Who knows where 144 total cars will end up parking on this property during Events and how will they enter and leave will it be on N. Bogan Rd only or does Mr. Moore want to try and exit out onto Chatuge in Morgan's Crossing? The Site Plan does not seem to clearly draw this out. And will the parked cars be close to the road? How close will they be near surrounding neighbors. How loud will these cars be starting up and driving out at 10 pm on school and work nights or at midnight on weekends when they leave Events? Will it be so loud that close neighbors can't get to sleep or will be awakened?
- 4. There is no traffic study to show the impact on traffic flow of a potential 144 cars coming and going to the Events which is only about 2000 feet from the major intersection of N. Bogan Rd and Friendship Rd at the school. Traffic already backs up at that intersection when people are going to work, school or shopping at different times of the day. This is especially true when cars are trying to turn left on to Friendship to get to 985. Average length of cars in 2023 is about 15' so if a potential

144 cars left an event at the same time that would be about 2160' of total car lengths without any space between them which means they would be backed up all the way from Friendship Rd to 3555 N. Bogan Rd property if they were all exiting toward Friendship Rd. What neighbors would want to have to get behind a trail of cars like that just to get to Friendship Rd. to get to work, school, shopping,or to the freeway or to the NE Georgia Hospital in Braselton on Friendship Rd? It can already take up to 5 to 10 minutes waiting time at these intersections with only having to wait for 5 - 6 cars. Narrow two lane only North Bogan Rd is simply not set up to accomodate 144 cars nor a commercial event venue such as the one being proposed by Mr. Moore. In the Narrative Mr. Moore talks about having "Wet Lands" that will never be developed but this is not shown on the Site Plan and he gives different addresses referring to that. The Pond may be what he is talking about as the wetlands but he lists 116 Spring St and 4340 Chatuga Drive when mentioning Wetlands so this is extremely confusing.

- 5. Mr. Moore states in his Narrative that he wants to operate this commercial Event Venue for the next 30 years and to have "as many weddings as possible" as well as other events where he wants to "extend the range of activity" to mornings, and have other various Events but never describes what kinds of Events he means. Could they be rock concerts, dance club events, and will alcohol be served which is usually the case at most weddings? Will folks be milling around outside in the 'Pavilion' having drinks and partying, etc? Who knows what this might look like or turn into in the future?
- 6. Mr. Moore's Narrative talks about giving back to the community but what he proposes would actually take away from our neighborhood residential community in many ways with rising noise levels, increased traffic and more traffic congestion, potentially lowering of home values and changing the look and feel of our residential look and feel. The quality of life of Mr. Moore's neighbors will definitely be impacted for years and years to come and all for the purpose that Mr. Moore gives in his Narrative when in his own words he said, '...this is about making money." This is totally a commercial enterprise in a single family home residential area. How many folks on the Board of Commissioners would like to have something like this across the street from them. Many of our neighbors definitely do not want this in their area. Please do not approve this conditional use request and change the quality of life in our single family home residential area. Thank you.
