- 1. Development is approved for lots as generally shown on the concept plan and described in the project narrative modified as necessary for compliance with development standards enforced at the time of site plan approval. Minor changes can be approved by the Planning Director provided there are no reductions in buffers, no changes in the structural design and materials, and the changes do not create the need for a variance from the Hall County development standards.
- 2. Standard Hall County Development Review and permitting processes shall be followed. Approval of this request does not supersede development standards or processes in effect when the plans are submitted for review. Such standards include, but are not limited to, stormwater management and emergency access requirements.
- 3. This development is approved for a maximum of 11 lots with a minimum lot size of 2 acres.
- 4. The parcel identified on the site plan as Tract 2, located at the intersection of Skitts Mountain Road and Lula Road / SR 52, and consisting of 0.49 acres is not approved as a separate building lot.
- 5. The development shall meet the requirements of the Planned Residential Development (PRD,17.180.060) zoning district, except as noted below.

limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."

This Agreement (hereafter the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of this 8th of September. 2023 by and between Trane U.S. Inc., (hereinafter "Trane") and Hall County, Georgia(hereinafter "Customer") for the purpose of furnishing certain services and work designed to improve the facility at the Premises (as defined below).

ARTICLE 1 - THE SERVICES AND COMPENSATION

Section 1.01. Contract Price. Subject to the terms and conditions hereof, as payment for Trane's performance and furnishing of the Services (as defined below) at the Premises identified in Exhibit C hereto, Customer shall pay or cause to be paid to Trane, in accordance with the dates and amounts on Exhibit A pursuant to Section 1.04, the sum of Two Million, One-hundred Thousand, Four Hundred and Six dollars (\$2,124,406.00), which Contract Price includes all sales, consumer, use and similar taxes (excluding income taxes) for the Services which are legally enacted as of the date of this Agreement.

Section 1.02. The Services and Exclusions. No later than 365 days from the Effective Date, Trane shall have designed and substantially completed installation of the equipment and performance of the work and services described in Exhibit B (hereinafter, collectively, the "Services"). Trane's obligation hereunder is limited to the Services as defined herein. Excluded from the Services are any modifications or alterations to the Premises (not expressly included within the Services as defined) that may be required by operation of the Americans With Disabilities Act or any other law or building code(s).

Section 1.03. Construction Procedures and Changes to Services. Trane shall supervise and direct the Services using its best skill and attention. Trane shall have exclusive control over construction means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures. Trane shall at all times have the right to replace, delete or substantially alter any item of equipment or part of the Services, correct any work, or revise any procedures included in this Agreement, provided, however, that Trane shall obtain Customer's prior consent to substantial deviations from the original scope of Services, said consent not to be reasonably withheld or delayed.

Section 1.04. Payment Terms. Customer shall pay Trane or cause Trane to be paid for the Services as follows:

- (a) Initial Payment: Customer agrees to pay an initial payment (for engineering, drafting and other mobilization costs incurred prior to on-site installation) within thirty (30) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement in the amount of \$318,660.90, which amount represents 15% of the Contract Price; and
- (b) **Progress and Final Payments:** Trane will invoice in accordance with Exhibit A for all materials and equipment delivered to the Premises (or, as applicable, to an off-site storage facility) and for all installation, labor and services performed during the billing period; Customer shall pay all amounts due upon receipt of the invoice and any invoice not paid within thirty (30) calendar days of its date shall be past due.

Section 1.05. Substantial Completion and Final Completion.

(a) Substantial Completion. When Trane considers that the Services, or a portion thereof, are substantially complete, Trane will submit to Customer a proposed "punch list" listing items of the Services to be completed prior to final completion. Customer and Trane shall inspect the Services (or portion thereof) to determine if the same is substantially complete. (Substantial Completion is defined as the stage in the progress of the Services (or designated portion thereof) when the Services are sufficiently complete so that Customer can occupy or utilize the Services for its intended use.) Customer and Trane shall add to the punch list any item of work that has not been completed. When the Services (or designated portion thereof) are substantially complete, Customer and Trane shall execute a Certificate of Substantial Completion in the form of Exhibit D.1, setting forth



the date of Substantial Completion and shall state the date by which Trane shall complete the items of work included on the punch list.

(b) Final Completion. Upon Customer's receipt of written notice from Trane that the installation work included in the Services is ready for final inspection and acceptance, Customer and Trane shall inspect the installation work and determine whether the same has been performed in accordance with this Agreement. If Customer considers the installation work to have been performed in accordance with this Agreement, Customer shall issue a Certificate of Final Completion and Acceptance, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit D.2, to be executed by an authorized representative of Customer. In the event Trane presents a Certificate of Final Completion and Acceptance to Customer for execution and, within fourteen (14) calendar days from the date noted in the Certificate as the date of such presentation, Customer fails to deliver an executed original of the Certificate to Trane and does not provide to Trane written objections to issuance of the Certificate, providing specific facts as to why the Services have not been finally completed, the Date of Final Completion shall be the date noted in the Certificate as the date the Certificate was submitted to Customer.

Section 1.06. Delays. If Trane is delayed in the commencement or completion of any part of the Services due to events beyond Trane's control (including, but not limited to, fire, flood, labor disputes, unusual delays in deliveries, unavoidable casualties, abnormal adverse weather, and acts of God), or due to Customer's action(s) or failure to perform its obligations under this Agreement or to cooperate with Trane in the timely performance of the Services, then Trane will notify Customer in writing of the existence, extent of, and reason(s) for such delay(s). Trane and Customer shall extend the contract time and/or increase the Contract Price by Change Order for such reasonable time and/or amount as they shall agree.

Section 1.07. Equipment Location and Access. Customer shall provide, without charge, a mutually satisfactory location or locations for the installation and operation of the equipment and the performance of the installation work, including sufficient areas for staging, mobilization, and storage. Customer shall provide access to the Premises for Trane and its contractors or subcontractors during regular business hours, or such other hours as may be requested by Trane and acceptable to Customer, to install, adjust, inspect, and correct the installation work. Trane's access to correct any emergency condition shall not be restricted by Customer.

Section 1.08. Permits and Governmental Fees. Trane shall secure (with Customer's assistance) and pay for building and other permits and governmental fees, licenses, and inspections necessary for proper performance and completion of the installation work and which are legally required when bids from Trane's subcontractors are received, negotiations thereon concluded, or the effective date of a relevant Change Order, whichever is later. Customer is responsible for necessary approvals, easements, assessments and charges for construction, use or occupancy of permanent structures or for permanent changes to existing facilities.

Section 1.09. Utilities During Construction. At no cost to Trane, Customer shall provide and pay for water, heat, and utilities consumed by Trane during performance of the Services hereunder. Trane shall install and pay the cost of any temporary facilities not already in existence, which will be required during construction for accessing such water, heat, and utilities.

Section 1.10. Concealed or Unknown Conditions. In the performance of the installation work, if Trane encounters conditions at the Premises that are (i) subsurface or otherwise concealed physical conditions that differ materially from those indicated on the drawings or (ii) unknown physical conditions of an unusual nature that differ materially from those conditions ordinarily found to exist and generally recognized as inherent in construction activities of the type and character as the installation work, Trane shall notify Customer of such conditions as promptly as practicable, prior to significantly disturbing the same. If such conditions differ materially and cause an increase in Trane's cost of, or time required for, performance of any part of the Services, Trane shall be entitled to, and Customer shall consent by Change Order to, an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price, Contract Time, or both.



Section 1.11. Damage to Equipment; Casualty or Condemnation of Premises. (a) If any fire, flood, other casualty, or condemnation renders a majority of the Premises incapable of being occupied and the affected portion is not reconstructed or restored within ninety (90) days from the date of such casualty or condemnation, Trane may terminate this Agreement by delivery of a written notice to Customer, whereupon both parties shall have no further liability to each other, subject to Customer's obligation to pay to Trane for all parts of the Services, equipment and material furnished to the date of termination, including any specially manufactured or non-stock items, whether in production or delivered.

- (b) If any significant item of equipment is irreparably damaged by Customer, its employees, agents or invitees, or is destroyed or stolen, and if Customer fails to repair or replace said item within a reasonable period of time, Trane may terminate this Agreement by delivery of a written notice to Customer, whereupon both parties shall have no further liability to each other, subject to Customer's obligation to pay to Trane for all parts of the Services, equipment and material furnished to the date of termination, including any specially manufactured or non-stock items, whether in production or delivered. Any such termination shall not be considered any Event of Default on the part of either party.
- Section 1.12. Changes to the Services. (a) Customer, by written Change Order, may request that Trane perform work in addition to the Services. Trane shall be obligated to perform such additional work only pursuant to a Change Order agreed to and executed by Customer and Trane. The Change Order shall reflect the parties' agreement with respect to the scope of the additional work, the amount of any adjustment in the Contract Price, and the extent of any adjustment in the contract time.
- (b) If a Change Order provides for an adjustment to the Contract Price, such adjustment shall be based on one of the following methods:
 - (1) A lump sum agreed to by Customer and Trane;
 - (2) Unit prices set forth in this Agreement or subsequently agreed to; or
 - (3) Cost of the work ordered plus a fee agreed to by the parties.
- (c) The following types of costs, which listing is not all-inclusive, shall be included in the determination of the cost of the additional work:
 - costs of labor, including social security, old age and unemployment insurance, fringe benefits required by agreement or industry practice or custom, and workers' compensation insurance;
 - (2) costs of materials, supplies and equipment, including transportation thereof, whether the same is incorporated or consumed in the additional work;
 - the costs of renting machinery and equipment, except hand tools;
 - (4) premium costs for all bonds and insurance, permit or other governmental approval or inspection fees, and sales, use or comparable taxes relating to the additional work; and
 - (5) additional costs of supervision and field office personnel directly attributable to the additional work.

Section 1.13. Adjustment to Contract Time. Trane shall be allowed an equitable adjustment in the Contract Time for performance of additional Work that increases the amount of time required to perform the Services.



Section 1.14. Allocation to Trane of Tax Deduction under Section 179D of the Internal Revenue Code. For calendar tax year(s) in which (a) the provisions of Section 179D of the Internal Revenue Code are in effect and (b) the qualifying property installed as a part of the Services has been placed in service pursuant to Section 179D, Customer agrees to allocate the tax deduction available under Section 179D solely to Trane pursuant to Section 179D(d)(4) and, upon a written request from Trane, shall provide the written form of allocation to the Customer that is required by the Internal Revenue Service.

Section 1.15. Pre-Existing Conditions. Trane is not liable for any claims, damages, losses, or expenses, arising from or related to conditions that existed in, on, or upon the Work site before the Commencement Date of this Agreement ("Pre-Existing Conditions"), including, without limitation, damages, losses, or expenses involving Pre-Existing Conditions of the building envelope, mechanical system, plumbing, and/or indoor air quality issues involving mold and/or fungi. Trane also is not liable for any claims, damages, losses, or expenses, arising from or related to work done by or services provided by individuals or entities that are not employed by or hired by Trane.

ARTICLE 2 - CUSTOMER'S OBLIGATIONS

Section 2.01. Representations and Warranties of Customer. Customer hereby warrants and represents to Trane that:

- (a) Customer is the legal fee owner of the Premises and/or otherwise has all requisite authority to make the improvements to the Premises that will result from Trane's performance of the Services;
- (b) Customer has provided Trane with all records heretofore requested by Trane and the information set forth therein is, and all information in other records to be subsequently provided pursuant to this Agreement will be, true and accurate in all material respects except as may be disclosed to Trane by Customer in writing;
- (c) Customer has disclosed in writing to Trane the existence and location of all known or suspected asbestos and other hazardous materials on the Premises; and
- (d) Customer has no knowledge of any facts or circumstances that, but for the passage of time, would materially, adversely affect either party's ability to perform its respective obligations hereunder and, if Customer is a governmental entity or instrumentality thereof, Customer has complied with all laws and regulations relative to bidding or procurement.
- Section 2.02. Customer Default. Each of the following events or conditions shall constitute a default by Customer and shall give Trane the right to, without an election of remedies: (a) proceed pursuant to Section 7.01; and/or (b) terminate this Agreement by delivery of written notice declaring termination, upon which event Customer shall be liable to Trane for all Services furnished to date, including any specially manufactured or non-stock items, whether in production or delivered, and any damages sustained by Trane, including anticipatory profits:
- (1) Any failure by Customer to pay or cause to be paid amounts due Trane more than thirty (30) days after the date of the invoice therefor;
- (2) Any representation or warranty furnished by Customer in this Agreement is false or misleading in any material respect when made;
- (3) Any default by Customer under any instrument or agreement related to the financing of all or any part of the Services or equipment hereunder;
- (4) Any failure by Customer to perform or comply with any material term or condition of this Agreement, including breach of any covenant contained herein, provided that such failure continues for ten (10) days after



written notice to Customer demanding that such failure be cured or, if cure cannot be effected in such ten (10) days, Customer fails to promptly begin to cure and diligently proceed to completion thereof; or

(5) The commencement of any voluntary or involuntary proceedings in bankruptcy or receivership by or against Customer, Customer shall become insolvent, make a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or Customer shall fail to pay its debts as and when they become due.

ARTICLE 3 - INSURANCE

Section 3.01. Trane's Liability Insurance. Trane shall purchase from and maintain, without interruption from the commencement of the Services until the date of final payment, a Commercial General Liability policy, Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability policy and Commercial Automobile Liability policy, through a company or companies rated A -VI or better by A.M. Best Company.

Section 3.02. Customer's Liability and Property Insurance. (a) Customer shall be responsible for purchasing and maintaining Commercial General Liability Insurance of the type and amount Customer deems necessary and appropriate.

- (b) Customer shall purchase and maintain until Final Payment property insurance for the installation work in progress at least in an amount equal to the Contract Price, as the same may be adjusted from time to time, for the installation work (including the equipment) on a replacement cost basis with a deductible of no more than \$5,000 from an insurer reasonably acceptable to Trane. Such property insurance shall include the interests of Customer, Trane, and its subcontractors (at whatever tier) as additional insureds as their interests may appear. The property insurance purchased by Customer shall be on an all-risk policy form. The property insurance shall cover portions of the installation work stored off site after written approval of Customer at the value established in the approval. Customer, for itself and its insurance carriers, hereby waives all rights of subrogation against Trane and any of its subcontractors, agents, employees, and officers with respect to property insurance and any other insurance coverages maintained by Customer.
- (c) A loss insured under Customer's property insurance shall be adjusted by Customer's Insurer as a fiduciary and made payable to Customer as a fiduciary for the insureds, as their respective interests may appear, subject to requirements of any applicable mortgagee clause. Trane shall pay its subcontractors their just shares of insurance proceeds received by Customer and remitted to Trane, and, by appropriate agreements, written where legally required for validity, shall require said subcontractors to make payments to their subcontractors in a similar manner. In its fiduciary role, Customer shall have the power to negotiate and settle a loss with insurers; provided, however, that at least ten (10) days prior to agreeing to the proposed settlement, Customer shall advise the parties in interest in writing of the terms of the same and the parties in interest shall have seven (7) days thereafter to object in writing to the proposed adjustment or settlement; if such objection is made, Customer shall not enter into or agree to the proposed adjustment or settlement and the parties shall proceed pursuant to Section 7.01.

Section 3.03. Customer's Loss of Use/Business Interruption Insurance. Customer may purchase and maintain insurance to protect against loss of use of Customer's property or business interruption due to fire or other commonly insured hazards, however such fire or hazards may be caused. Customer acknowledges that Trane is not required to purchase or maintain such insurance against the loss of use of Customer's property or business interruption.

Section 3.04. Evidence of Insurance. Certificates of insurance acceptable to the Customer and to Trane shall be provided by each party to the other prior to commencement of performance of any Services. Such certificates shall contain a provision that coverages afforded under the policies will not be canceled or allowed to expire until at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the other party. If any of the insurance coverages are required to remain in force after final payment and are reasonably available, an additional certificate evidencing continuation of such coverage shall be submitted with the final application for payment. Customer's



certificate shall clearly name "Trane U.S. Inc." as an additional insured with an endorsement containing no restrictions or limitations on the policy that do not also apply to the named insured. Neither the procurement nor maintenance of any type of insurance by Customer shall in any way be construed or deemed to limit, waive, or release Customer from any of the obligations and risks of Customer under this Agreement, or to be a limitation on the nature and extent of such obligations and risks.

ARTICLE 4 - HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Section 4.01. Asbestos and Hazardous Materials. (a) Trane's Services and other work in connection with this Agreement expressly exclude any work connected or associated with Hazardous Materials. Hazardous Materials means any pollutant, contaminant, toxic or hazardous waste, dangerous substance, potentially dangerous substance, noxious substance, toxic substance, flammable, explosive, radioactive material, urea formaldehyde, foam insulation, asbestos, asbestos-containing materials ("ACM's"), polychlorinated biphenyl ("PCB"), mold, fungus, bacteria, microbial growth, or other contaminates or airborne biological agents, and any other substances, the removal of which is required, or the manufacture, preparation, production, generation, use, maintenance, treatment, storage, transfer, handling, or ownership of which is restricted, prohibited, regulated, or penalized by any and all federal, state, county, or municipal statutes or laws now or at any time hereafter in effect, including but not limited to, the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 9601 et seq.), the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (49 U.S.C. §§ 1801 et seq.), the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 6901 et seq.), the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. §§ 1251 et seq.), the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 7401 et seq.), the Toxic Substances Control Act, as amended (15 U.S.C. §§ 2601 et seq.), and the Occupational Safety and Health Act (29 U.S.C. §§ 651 et seq.), as the laws have been and may be amended and supplemented.

- (b) Trane shall not be required to perform any identification, abatement, remediation, cleanup, control, or removal of Hazardous Materials. Customer warrants and represents that, except as expressly, and by reference to this Section, set forth in Exhibit B (Scope of Services) or Exhibit C (Description of Premises), there are no Hazardous Materials on the Premises that will in any way affect Trane's Services and Customer has disclosed to Trane the existence and location of any Hazardous Materials in all areas within which Trane will be performing any part of the Services. The existence or location of any Hazardous Materials that have been so disclosed by Customer to Trane shall be the responsibility of Customer.
- (c) Should Trane become aware of or suspect the presence of Hazardous Materials, Trane shall have the right to immediately stop work in the affected area and shall notify Customer. Customer will be responsible for taking any and all action necessary to correct the condition in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. Trane shall be required to resume performance of the Services in the affected area only in the absence of Hazardous Materials or when the affected area has been rendered harmless; if the area has not been or cannot be rendered harmless within thirty (30) days of discovery of the Hazardous Material, Trane may terminate this Agreement and Customer shall be liable to Trane for the Services completed to date of termination and anticipatory profits. Customer shall compensate Trane for any additional costs incurred by Trane as a result of work stoppage, including demobilization and remobilization. Under no circumstances shall Trane be obligated to transport or handle Hazardous Material, to provide any notices to any governmental authority or agency, or to inspect or examine the Premises for the presence of Hazardous Materials. Trane shall not have any liability (whether direct or indirect and regardless of cause) relating to or arising from mold, fungus, bacteria, microbial growth, or other contaminates or airborne biological agents.

ARTICLE 5 - INDEMNIFICATION AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Section 5.01. Indemnification. Neither party shall indemnify the other against actions, costs, expenses, damages and liabilities to the extent attributable to the acts or omissions of the other party. To the extent allowed by law, if

the parties are both at fault hereunder, then any obligation to indemnify shall be proportional to their relative fault. To the extent allowed by law, the duty to indemnify will continue in full force and effect, notwithstanding the expiration or early termination of this Agreement, with respect to any claims based on facts or conditions which occurred prior to expiration or termination.

Section 5.02. Limitation of Liability. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION TO THE CONTRARY, NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL (INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION LOST REVENUE OR PROFITS) OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES.

ARTICLE 6 - WARRANTY

Section 6.01. Workmanship and Equipment Warranty. Trane warrants that, for a period of one year from the date of Substantial Completion (the "Warranty Period"), Trane-manufactured equipment installed hereunder and the installation work (i) shall be free from defects in material, manufacture, and workmanship and (ii) shall have the capacities and ratings set forth in Trane's catalogs and bulletins. Trane obligations of equipment start-up, if any are stated in the Proposal, are coterminous with the Warranty period. For Trane-manufactured equipment not installed by Trane the Warranty Period is the lesser of 12 months from initial start-up or 18 months from the date of shipment. Equipment and/or parts that are not manufactured by Trane are not warranted by Trane and have such warranties as may be extended by the respective manufacturer. If such defect in Trane-manufactured equipment or the installation work is discovered within the Warranty Period, Trane will correct the defect or furnish replacement equipment (or, at its option, parts therefor) and, if said Trane-manufactured equipment was installed pursuant hereto, labor associated with the replacement of parts or equipment not conforming to this warranty. No liability whatsoever shall attach to Trane until said equipment and Services have been paid for in full and then said liability shall be limited to Trane's cost to correct the defective equipment or work and/or the purchase price of the equipment shown to be defective. Trane's warranties expressly exclude any remedy for damage or defect caused by corrosion, erosion, or deterioration, abuse, modifications or repairs not performed by Trane, improper operation, or normal wear and tear under normal usage. Trane shall not be obligated to pay for the cost of lost refrigerant.

THE WARRANTY AND LIABILITY SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION ARE IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES AND LIABILITIES, WHETHER IN CONTRACT OR IN NEGLIGENCE, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, IN LAW OR IN FACT, INCLUDING IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR USE OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. IN NO EVENT SHALL TRANE BE LIABLE FOR ANY INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL (INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION LOST PROFITS), OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES. NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR PARTICULAR PURPOSE, IS MADE REGARDING PREVENTING, ELIMINATING, REDUCING OR INHIBITING ANY MOLD, FUNGUS, BACTERIA, VIRUS, MICROBIAL GROWTH, OR ANY OTHER CONTAMINANTS (INCLUDING COVID-19 OR ANY SIMILAR VIRUS) (COLLECTIVELY, "CONTAMINANTS"), WHETHER INVOLVING OR IN CONNECTION WITH EQUIPMENT, ANY COMPONENT THEREOF, SERVICES OR OTHERWISE. IN NO EVENT SHALL TRANE HAVE ANY LIABILITY FOR THE PREVENTION, ELIMINATION, REDUCTION OR INHIBITION OF THE GROWTH OR SPREAD OF SUCH CONTAMINANTS INVOLVING OR IN CONNECTION WITH ANY EQUIPMENT, ANY COMPONENT THEREOF, SERVICES OR OTHERWISE AND CUSTOMER HEREBY SPECIFICALLY ACKNOWLDGES AND AGREES THERETO.

ARTICLE 7 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 7.01. Notices and Changes of Address. All notices to be given by either party to the other shall be in writing and must be either delivered or mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed as follows:

or such other addresses as either party may hereinafter designate by notice to the other. Notices are deemed delivered or given and become effective upon mailing if mailed as aforesaid and upon actual receipt if otherwise delivered. All notices or other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing and may be delivered in person, or may be sent by receipted courier, facsimile transmission, express mail, e-mail, or postage prepaid certified or registered mail, addressed to the party for whom it is intended, at the addresses set forth in this Agreement. Either party may change its address for notice by giving written notice to the other party of the change. Any notice or other communication shall be deemed given no later than the date actually received. Notice by courier, express mail, certified mail, or registered mail shall be deemed given on the date it is officially recorded as delivered by return receipt or equivalent and, in the absence of such record of delivery, it shall be rebuttably presumed to have been delivered on the third business day after it was deposited, first-class postage prepaid, in the mails. Notices sent by fax or e-mail shall require tangible confirmation of receipt from the person to whom addressed.

Section 7.02. Assignment. Customer may not assign, transfer, or convey this Agreement, or any part hereof, or its right, title or interest herein, without the written consent of Trane. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of Customer's successors and assigns.

Section 7.03. Applicable Law and Jurisdiction. This Agreement is made and shall be interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the state in which the Services are to be performed. Customer hereby submits to the personal jurisdiction of the courts of the state and of the United States District Court in such state in which the Services are to be performed and to being sued in such jurisdiction.

Section 7.04. Term of Agreement. The term ("Term") of this Agreement shall commence as of the date first written above and shall end upon final completion of the Services, provided, however, that the warranty obligation set forth in Article 6 shall survive expiration of the Term.

Section 7.05. Complete Agreement. This Agreement and the Exhibits attached hereto, together with any documents expressly incorporated herein by reference, shall constitute the entire Agreement between both parties regarding the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be amended, modified or terminated except by a writing signed by the parties hereto.

Section 7.06. Further Documents. The parties shall timely execute and deliver all documents and perform all further acts that may be reasonably necessary to effectuate the provisions of this Agreement.

Section 7.07. Exhibits. The following Exhibits are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference:

Section 7.08. Force Majeure. Trane shall not be considered to be in default hereunder when a failure of performance is due to an Event of Force Majeure. An "Event of Force Majeure" shall mean any cause beyond the control of Trane. Without limiting the foregoing, "Event of Force Majeure" includes: acts of God; acts of the public enemy; flood, earthquake, tornado, storm, fire; civil disobedience, labor disputes, labor or material shortages, or sabotage; restraint by court order or public authority (whether valid or invalid), and action or non-action by or inability to obtain or keep in force the necessary governmental authorizations, permits, licenses, certificates or approvals if not caused by the fault of Trane. If Trane is rendered unable to fulfill any of its obligations under this



Agreement by reason of an Event of Force Majeure, it shall give prompt written notice of such fact to Customer and Trane's obligations shall be suspended until removal of the Event of Force Majeure.

Section 7.09. Execution and Counterparts. This Agreement and any amendment may be executed by the parties individually or in any combination, in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Execution and delivery of this Agreement and any amendment shall be legally valid and effective through: (i) executing and delivering the paper copy of the document; (ii) transmitting the executed paper copy of the document by electronic mail in portable document format (".pdf") or other electronically scanned format; or (iii) creating, generating, sending, receiving or storing by electronic means this Agreement and any amendment, the execution of which is accomplished through use of an electronic process associated with this Agreement, and executed or adopted by a party with the intent to execute this Agreement (i.e. electronic signature).

Section 7.10. Severability. If any term or conditions of this Agreement is invalid, illegal or incapable of being enforced by any rule of law, all other terms and conditions of this Agreement will nevertheless remain in full force and effect so long as the economic or legal substance of the transaction contemplated hereby is not affected in a manner adverse to any party hereto. Upon any such determination of invalidity, illegality or unenforceability, the parties hereto shall negotiate in good faith to modify this Agreement so as to affect the original intent of the parties as closely as possible in an acceptable manner, to the end that the transactions contemplated by this Agreement are consummated to the extent possible.

Section 7.11. Bonds. In no event shall the Performance and Payment bonds cover any energy savings guarantees. Additionally, the bonds shall not cover any warranties beyond one year from completion of the installation.

Section 7.12. U.S. Government Work. If the Work is in connection with a U.S. Government contract, Customer certifies that it has provided and will provide current, accurate, and complete information, representations and certifications to all government officials, including but not limited to the contracting officer and officials of the Small Business Administration, on all matters related to the prime contract, including but not limited to all aspects of its ownership, eligibility, and performance. Anything herein notwithstanding, Trane will have no obligations to Customer unless and until Customer provides Trane with a true, correct and complete executed copy of the prime contract. Upon request, Customer will provide copies to Trane of all requested written communications with any government official related to the prime contract prior to or concurrent with the execution thereof, including but not limited to any communications related to Customer's ownership, eligibility or performance of the prime contract. Customer will obtain written authorization and approval from Trane prior to providing any government official any information about Trane's performance of the work that is the subject of this offer or agreement, other than this written offer or agreement

TAX LEVY RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, pursuant to a bond resolution adopted on June 22, 2020, a supplemental bond resolution adopted on August 13, 2020, and a Second Supplemental Bond Resolution adopted on September 25, 2023 (collectively, the "Bond Resolution"), the Board of Education of Hall County (the "Board of Education"), as managing and controlling body of the Hall County School District (the "District"), a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, authorized the issuance of Hall County School District (Georgia) General Obligation School Series 2023 Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$80,000,000 (the "Series 2023 Bonds"), for the purpose of providing funds to the District to pay or to be applied toward the cost of (i) acquiring, constructing and equipping new schools, including a new middle school and new elementary schools; (ii) acquiring, constructing and equipping new fine arts facilities, performing arts centers, physical education facilities, sports facilities, agribusiness centers, other student activity facilities, maintenance facilities, transportation facilities, and other school system facilities; (iii) acquiring and conducting site preparation of real estate for current and future school district purposes; (iv) constructing and equipping additional classrooms and instructional and support space; (v) remodeling, renovating and equipping classrooms, instructional and support space, and other school district facilities at existing school system facilities, including but not limited to roofing, HVAC, security and emergency alarm systems, flooring, plumbing and electrical capacity; (vi) acquiring furnishings, equipment and fixtures for new and existing facilities system-wide, including technology equipment and infrastructure; (vii) payment of a portion of the interest on the Series 2023 Bonds and (viii) paying expenses incident thereto; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of such general obligation Series 2023 Bonds of the District was approved by a majority of qualified voters of the District at the election duly called and held on June 9, 2020, after notice of the time thereof had been given in the manner required by law by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, being charged with the duty of managing the affairs of the District, has determined that in order to pay the principal of and the interest on the Series 2023 Bonds as the same become due and payable, whether by maturity, redemption or otherwise, to the extent such interest is not paid from the construction fund to be created with the proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds, and it is necessary that there be levied an annual tax upon all the taxable property in said District sufficient to raise the amounts set forth below in each of the calendar years set forth below; and

WHEREAS, proper certificates and recommendations have been made that a direct annual tax for such purposes be made in the amounts and for the years hereinafter stated; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that a tax be levied for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Series 2023 Bonds due in each year, whether by maturity, redemption or otherwise; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Hall County, and it is hereby resolved by authority of same, that there shall be and is hereby levied upon all the taxable property in the District subject to taxation for school bond purposes, a direct annual tax sufficient to raise in each of the years set forth below (or in each prior year) the sums



Brannen Motor Company already has 2023 F-150s on order that should arrive at the dealer in approximately two months. The recommendation is made because the Ford 2023 Vehicle Order Bank closed Friday September 8, 2023, there is an ongoing and yet unresolved automotive workers union strike, and 2024 pricing is expected to increase by \$3,500 per vehicle and the order book will not be open until the first quarter of calendar year of 2024.

Four (4) quotes were received and while Brannen Motor Company is not the lowest cost, they do have enough 2023 models on order to fulfill the order. Brannen is a vendor in good standing with the County. This purchase is an approved capital item to replace aging vehicles currently in the fire rescue fleet.

Fire Rescue is seeking to purchase one (1) Ford F450 XL 4x4 crew cab super duty dual rear wheel pickup as a tow vehicle. This purchase is an approved capital item to replace an aging vehicle currently in the Fire Rescue fleet. Akins Ford is the lowest responsible and responsive bidder.

Current vehicle shortage has forced us to purchase vehicles from vendors that have availability. Staff compared this pricing to the Statewide Contract and the pricing listed is comparable to State Contract pricing. Staff recommends that due to a material disruption of goods and services and a lack of inventory, the purchase be considered through the County Ordinance Section 3.10.140(G).

WITNESSETH:

<u>WHEREAS</u>, as set forth herein, Grantor is the owner of that certain real property located in Hall County, Georgia, being more particularly described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Grantor Property").

<u>WHEREAS</u> Grantor desires to grant and convey to Grantee certain easement rights over a portion of the Grantor Property being more particularly described below and on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Easement Plat");

 - 1.3 "Grantor Property" shall have the meaning set forth in the recitals.
- 1.4 "Water/Sewer Facilities", "Utilities Facilities", or "Water, Sewer" shall mean and refer to collectively, the water, sewer, reuse water and wastewater infrastructure and equipment, manholes, sampling stations, fire hydrants, utility piping and equipment useful for such purposes and other water and sewer infrastructure, to be constructed within the Easement Area and operated and maintained by the Grantor upon expiration of the temporary easements granted herein.

Article 2 Grant of Easements

- 2.1 Grantor hereby grants and conveys unto the Grantee, its agents, employees and contractors (collectively, the "Grantee Agents"), a temporary non-exclusive access and construction easement (the "Temporary Construction and Access Easement") for the purpose of installing and constructing the Water/Sewer Facilities, and access thereto, in, on, over, under, upon, across, and through the Easement Area, together with the right of ingress and egress over the Grantor Property and other adjacent land of Grantor as may be reasonably necessary to accomplish the aforesaid purposes, but in no event shall the right of ingress and egress over the Grantor Property extend more than ten feet (10') beyond the Easement Area without express permission from Grantor. The Easements shall automatically terminate upon completion and final acceptance of the initial Water/Sewer Facilities by Grantor or one year after the date of conveyance of the Easements, whichever comes first (the "Easements Termination"). Any access over adjacent lands of the Grantor shall be coordinated by Grantee.
- 2.2 Upon the Easements Termination, Grantor shall become solely responsible for utilizing, testing, operating, maintaining, repairing, renewing, expanding and improving the Water/Sewer Facilities and Grantee shall have no Easements nor any remaining interest or rights to the Easement Area and Grantor Property.



ARTICLE #101 - INTRODUCTION

This Contract for the turnkey construction of all the improvements at
the McEver Road and Light Ferry Road Intersection as shown on
Attachment #001 - Construction Plans. (hereinafter "Services") as
entered into on, is by and between; Hall
County, Georgia (hereinafter "County") located at 2875 Browns Bridge
Rd, Gainesville, Georgia 30504, and Chattahoochee Group, Inc, located
at 220 Carter Street, Clermont, GA 30527 (hereinafter "Contractor").
Contractor is an entity that is legally registered and qualified, and
holding any such licenses and certifications as may be required to render
Services to do business in the State of Georgia. County and Contractor
are known individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Whereas, the parties do mutually desire to enter into this Contract to document the provision of Services or other valuable consideration by the Contractor to the County in exchange for payment as compensation.

This Contract is the result of the competitively bid IFB #062-43, the Bidder's bid response, the Scope of Work, Exhibits, Attachments, and references are all incorporated herein by reference. Therefore, in consideration of the terms, conditions, and mutual promises contained herein, expressed by a valid offer and acceptance, the receipt and sufficiency of which both parties hereby acknowledge, the parties hereto agree as follows:

ARTICLE #102 – CONTRACT

- A. Contractor agrees to provide the Services to the County as detailed herein as the **Scope of Work**, at the location described and services as described in IFB #062-43 and the bidder's response.
- COMPENSATION: County hereby agrees as good and valuable compensation as provided in the attached bidder's response entitled Exhibit C – Mandatory Cost Proposal Worksheet, which

shall serve as the Guaranteed Maximum Price Lump-Sum Cost. All payments are in arrears, as the County does not pay for Services not yet rendered.

C. Price Escalation Clause. - Reserved

ARTICLE #103 - NOTICES:

To the extent that either party to this Contract are required to provide notice(s) to the other party in compliance herewith, then the party shall direct notice(s) to the following persons:

ARTICLE #104 – NON-EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS:

The Contract is not exclusive. The County reserves the right to select other Contractors to provide the Services similar to those described in this Contract, during the term of the Contract should the need arise or the contractor fail to perform.

ARTICLE #105 – CONTRACT TERM:

Until substantial, completion, and all sub-contractor(s) and material suppliers' liens are satisfied.

ARTICLE #106 - CONTRACT AMENDMENTS AND MODIFICATION:

This Contract can only be modified, amended, or added to in writing and fully executed by both parties hereto. This Contract document constitutes the sole and entire Contract and understanding between the parties as to the subject matter hereof, and no verbal promises have been made by either party in relation hereto.

<u>ARTICLE # 107 – REMEDIES AND CONTRACT PERFORMANCE:</u>

In the event that either party to this Contract breaches this Contract, including by failure to meet the timetables set forth herein, the non-breaching party shall provide written notice to the breaching party which describes the breach of this Contract. The party whose breach is alleged shall have thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the written notice to cure the breach or to otherwise negotiate a resolution of the breach.

If the breach has not been cured and the parties hereto have not resolved the issue described in the notice letter by thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice letter, the party authoring the letter shall be entitled to seek any and all remedies allowed by Georgia law, including damages, equitable relief, declaratory relief, specific performance, and/or seeking relief as to any bonds issued hereon. Additional provisions are:

A. Delay or Impossibility of Performance. Any failure or delay must be beyond the control of and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. If the Services to be provided to the County are interrupted by a Force Majeure Event, as defined below, the County will be entitled to an equitable adjustment to the fees and other payments due to the Contractor under this Contract. If delay results from a subcontractor's negligent conduct or failure to perform, the Contractor shall not be excused from compliance with the terms and obligations of the Contract. Epidemics and pandemics are not considered Force Majeure events by the County.

Neither party shall be held liable or responsible to the other party nor be deemed to have defaulted under or breached this Agreement for failure or delay in fulfilling or performing any obligation under this Agreement when such failure or delay is caused by or results from causes beyond the reasonable control of the affected party, including but not limited to fire, floods, embargoes, war, acts of war, insurrections, riots, strikes, lockouts or other labor disturbances, or acts of God; provided, however, that the party so affected shall use reasonable commercial efforts to avoid or remove such causes of nonperformance, and shall continue performance hereunder with reasonable dispatch whenever such causes are removed. Either party shall provide the other party with prompt written notice of any delay or failure to perform that occurs by reason of Force Majeure.

Definition: The term 'force majeure' as defined in Black's Law Dictionary, is 'an event or effect that can be neither anticipated nor controlled. It is a contractual provision allocating the risk of loss if performance becomes impossible or impracticable, especially as a result of an event that the parties could not have anticipated or controlled."

- **B.** Obligations beyond Contract Term. The Contract shall remain in full force and effect to the end of the specified term or until terminated or canceled pursuant to the Contract.
- **C.** Transition Cooperation with the County and Cooperation with other Contractors. Contractor agrees that upon termination of this Contract for any reason, it shall provide sufficient efforts and reasonable cooperation and assistance to the County to ensure an orderly and efficient transition to the County or an alternative Contractor. Further, in the event that the County has entered into or enters into contracts with other Contractors related to the Services, Contractor agrees to cooperate fully with such other Contractors. Contractor shall not engage in any act that will interfere with the performance of work by any other Contractor(s).

ARTICLE # 108 - TERMINATION:

Either party may terminate this Contract by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party at any time. Should either party terminate this Contract prior to the date of automatic termination pursuant to section four (4) above, Contractor shall provide the County with all deliverables up to the date of termination thirty (30) days after the Notice to Terminate is issued. The County shall pay the Contractor for all work properly performed in compliance with the terms of the Contract up to the date of termination.

- A. **Termination for Convenience**. Following thirty (30) days written notice, either party may terminate the Contract in whole or in part for any reason without the payment of any penalty or incurring any further obligation to the Contractor.
- B. **Termination for Cause**. The occurrence of any one or more of the following events shall constitute cause for the County to declare the Contractor in default of its obligations under the Contract:
 - The Contractor fails to deliver or has delivered nonconforming Services or fails to perform, to the County's satisfaction, any material requirement of the Contract or is in violation of a material provision of the Contract, including, but without limitation, the express warranties made by the Contractor.
 - 2. The County determines that satisfactory performance of the Contract is substantially endangered or that a default is likely to occur.
 - 3. The Contractor fails to make substantial and timely progress toward performance of the Contract.
 - 4. The Contractor becomes subject to any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding under federal or state law to the extent allowed by applicable federal or state law including bankruptcy laws; the Contractor terminates or suspends its business; or

the County reasonably believes that the Contractor has become insolvent or unable to pay its obligations as they accrue consistent with applicable federal or state law.

- The Contractor has failed to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, County ordinances, regulations and orders when performing within the scope of the Contract.
- 6. The Contractor has engaged in conduct that has or may expose the County or the State to liability, as determined in the County's sole discretion; or a material breach of the terms of the Contract by County upon County's failure to cure such material breach after written notice thereof has been delivered in accordance with ARTICLE #108.C. below constitutes cause for the Contractor to declare that the County is in default of its obligations under the Contract.
- C. Notice of Default. If either party causes one or more of the default events set out in ARTICLE #108, then either party shall issue a written Notice-of-Default to the party that causes one or more of the default events, requesting that the breach or noncompliance be remedied within the period of time specified in the party's Notice-of-Default to the Contractor. If the breach or noncompliance is not remedied within the period of time specified in the written notice, the non-breaching party may:
 - 1. Immediately terminate the Contract for default without additional written notice.
 - 2. In the event of a breach by the Contractor, the County may procure substitute Services from another source and charge the difference between the Contract and the substitute Contract to the defaulting Contractor; and/or,
 - 3. Enforce the terms and conditions of the Contract and seek any legal or equitable remedies.

D. Termination Due to Non-Availability of Funds.

This Contract will terminate immediately and absolutely if the County determines that adequate funds are de-appropriated such that the County cannot fulfill its obligations under the Contract, such determination being at the County's sole discretion and conclusive. County agrees to provide prompt written notice to Contractor in the event of any de-appropriation.

E. Termination due to Failure of Contractor to Act.

The County may terminate the Contract for any one or more of the following reasons effective immediately without advance notice:

- In the event that the Contractor must be certified or licensed as a condition precedent to providing the Services, the revocation or loss of such license or certification may result in immediate termination of the Contract effective as of the date on which the license or certification is no longer in effect.
- 2. The County determines that the actions, or failure to act, of the Contractor, its agents, employees or sub-Contractors have caused, or reasonably could cause, life, health or safety to be jeopardized.
- 3. The Contractor furnished any statement, representation, or certification in connection with the Contract or the bidding process, which is materially false, deceptive, criminal activity, incorrect or incomplete.
- 4. Failure of the Contractor to obtain, provide, maintain, and deliver the Performance and Payment Bonds (if required) as and when required under this Contract, or failure to comply with any requirement pertaining to the appropriate amounts thereof as set forth in ARTICLE #123 PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BOND REQUIREMENT.
- F. Payment Limitation in Event of Termination. In the event of termination of the Contract for any reason by either party, the County shall pay only those amounts, if any, due and owing to the Contractor for Services actually received and accepted by the County up to and including the date of termination of the Contract and for which the County is obligated to pay pursuant to the Contract.
- G. The Contractor's Termination Duties. Upon receipt of notice of termination, the Contractor shall:
 - 1. Cease work under the Contract and take all necessary or appropriate steps to limit disbursements and minimize costs and furnish a report within thirty (30) days of the date of notice of termination, describing the status of all work under the Contract, including, without limitation, results accomplished, conclusions resulting therefrom, and any other matters the County may require.
 - 2. Immediately cease using and return to the County, any personal property or materials, whether tangible or intangible, provided by the County to the Contractor.
 - 3. Comply with the County's instructions for the timely transfer of any active files and work product produced by the Contractor under the Contract.
 - 4. Cooperate in good faith with the County, its employees, agents, and Contractors during the transition period between the notification of termination and the substitution of any replacement Contractor; and
 - 5. Immediately return to the County any payments made by the County for goods and services that were not delivered by the Contractor.

H. **Liquidated Damages.** – One-Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per calendar day past three-hundred calendar days term period until substantial completion.

ARTICLE # 109 – NO DEFENSE OR INDEMNIFICATION BY COUNTY:

The parties agree that the County shall not be responsible for defending or indemnifying any Contractor from any claim brought by any third party against the Contractor.

ARTICLE #110 - ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION BY CONTRACTOR:

The Contractor shall not assign or delegate this Contract, or any performance required by it, in whole or in part, without the prior express written consent of the County.

ARTICLE #111 – USE OF THIRD PARTIES (SUB-CONTRACTORS):

This Contract is for the benefit of the parties hereto only and is not intended to benefit any third-party or give rise to any duty or causes of action for any third party. All restrictions, obligations and responsibilities of the Contractor under the Contract shall also apply to third parties such as sub-Contractors, if allowed in writing by the County. Any Contract with a subcontractor must also preserve the rights of the County.

ARTICLE #112 – SUPERSEDES FORMER CONTRACTS

Unless otherwise specified in the Contract, this Contract supersedes all prior Contracts or Agreements between the County and the Contractor for the Services provided in connection with the Contract.

ARTICLE #113 - SEVERABILITY:

If any paragraph, sub-paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Contract is declared invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction or if the provisions of any part of this Contract as applied to any particular situation or set of circumstances shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not be construed to affect the remaining portions of this Contract not so held to be invalid or the application of this Contract to other circumstances not so held to be invalid.

ARTICLE # 114 - RECORDS:

A. Public Records Request. The Georgia Open Records Act, as provided in O.C.G.A. § 50-18-70 et seq, requires procurement records and all other records received by or prepared or maintained on behalf of the County, shall be made open to public inspection, unless otherwise provided by law.

B. Record Retention and Access. The Contractor shall maintain books, records, and documents in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures and which sufficiently and properly document and calculate all charges billed to the County throughout the term of the Contract for a period of at least five (5) years following the date of final payment or completion of any required audit, whichever is later. Records to be maintained include both financial records and service records.

ARTICLE # 115 - ADDITIONAL TERMS:

- A. The County shall not be bound by any terms and conditions included in any Contractor's literature, packaging, invoice, catalog, brochure, technical data sheet, on-line representation, warranties or service level agreement or other document which attempts to impose any condition in variance with or in addition to the terms and conditions contained herein.
- B. The County shall not be bound to any Terms and Conditions of the Contractor that are only accessible by hyper-link. All Terms and Conditions must be in print and approved by the County.

ARTICLE # 116 - WAIVER:

The failure of any party hereto to seek a remedy for any alleged breach of this Contract shall not constitute a waiver of any claim, cause of action, or remedy allowed by Georgia law for breach thereof.

ARTICLE # 117 - CONTRACTOR AND COUNTY RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS:

- A. The County has the right to issue a written Stop Work Order at any time to require the Contractor cease any procedure, or the use of any equipment materials or chemicals considered by the County to be hazardous (or toxic) to persons, buildings, or surfaces. The Contractor will utilize acceptable substitutes as quickly as possible.
- B. The County has the right to require the Contractor to reassign or remove any employee or subcontractor's employee from the premises temporarily or permanently when, in the County's sole opinion, the employee is not suitable. The County's decision on this matter shall be final, and Contractor will remove this employee immediately and replace with a person of at least equivalent training, experience and requisite qualifications as quickly as possible, subject to the County's prior approval.

C. Contractor agrees to obtain prior written approval from the County for the use of sub-Contractors to provide the Services described in *SCOPE OF WORK* prior to subcontractor's performance of work.

ARTICLE # 118- INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

Workers Compensation Insurance: Required for all contracts.

a. \$500,000 Bodily Injury by Accident
b. \$500,000 Bodily Injury by Disease
c. \$500,000 Bodily Injury by Disease
Each Disease
Each Employee

Additional Provisions: Waiver of Subrogation. The insurer agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against Hall County Board of Commissioners (BOC), its elected or appointed officers, officials, agents, authorized volunteers and employees for losses paid under the terms of this policy which arise from work performed by the Named Insured for Hall County BOC; but this provision applies regardless of whether or not Hall County BOC has received a waiver of subrogation from the insurer.

General Liability Insurance: Required for all contracts.

a. \$2,000,000 General Aggregate

b. \$2,000,000 Products & Completed Operations Aggregate

c. \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence

d. \$1,000,000 Personal & Advertising Injurye. \$500,000 Damages to Premises / Fire / Legal

f. \$5,000 Medical Payments

<u>Commercial Auto Liability Insurance</u>: Required for all contracts, except for Goods and/or Services that are remote in nature and/or are delivered by a professional delivery service.

a. \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit OR

b. \$500,000 per Personc. \$500,000 per Occurrenced. \$100,000 Property Damage

e. \$1,000 for Medical Payments (no fault coverage)

Additional Provisions:

- a. Uninsured motorists coverage should be equal to the per occurrence limit except for contracts with other governmental entities
- b. Coverage shall be included for any owned, leased, hired, or non-owned autos
- c. For any contracts involving the transportation of hazardous materials, limited pollution endorsement ISO form CA9948 or its equivalent shall be on the policy

Umbrella Liability Insurance: Required for all contracts

a. \$1,000,000 per Occurrence

Additional Provisions:

- a. Underlying coverage shall be General Liability, Automobile Liability, and Employers Liability (Workers Compensation)
- b. Minimum limit of \$5,000,000 per occurrence for all contracts over \$1,000,000 or involving any special risks or high hazard activities
- c. Minimum limit of \$5,000,000 for automobile coverage for any transportation contracts involving seniors, special education, transit services, students, or youths.
- d. Concurrent policy dates with primary liability policies except for workers compensation
- B. **Insurance Certificates and General Requirements.** No Contract performance shall occur unless and until the County receives required insurance certificates.
 - The insurance certificate must reference the Contract number assigned by the County and document that the liability coverage purchased by the Contractor includes contractual liability coverage to insure the indemnity agreement as stated herein.
- C. The Contractor understands and agrees that the foregoing policies will not be canceled, or not renewed or allowed to lapse for any reason until at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the County, or until such time as other valid and effective insurance coverage acceptable in every respect to the County and providing protection equal to protection called for in the policies referenced in this section shall have been received, accepted, and acknowledged by the County. Certificates of insurance showing such coverage to be in force shall be filed with the County prior to commencement of any work under the Contract. The foregoing policies shall be obtained from insurance companies licensed to do business in Georgia and, unless waived or modified in writing by the County, shall be an insurer with a minimum A.M. Best Rating of "A-". All such coverage shall remain in full force and effect during the term and any renewal or extension thereof. The insurance certificate must be submitted with this Contract.
- D. **Waiver of Subrogation.** There is no waiver of subrogation rights by either Party with respect to insurance.

ARTICLE # 119 – NO WAIVER:

- A. **Authority to Enter into Contract.** The Contractor represents and warrants that it has full authority to enter into and perform its obligations under the Contract and that the Contract constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation upon the Contractor in accordance with its terms. The representatives of the parties hereto also represent and warrant that they are authorized to sign this Contract on behalf of each party hereto."
 - B. **Solicitation**. The Contractor warrants that no person or selling agency (except bona fide employees or selling agents maintained for the purpose of securing business) has been employed or retained to solicit and secure the Contract upon an agreement or understanding for commission, percentage, brokerage or contingency.

ARTICLE # 120 – INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS and OWNERSHIP:

Contractor agrees it will not use the name or any intellectual property, including but not limited to, County trademarks or logos in any manner, including commercial advertising or as a business reference, without the expressed prior written consent of the County.

ARTICLE # 121 - COMPENSATION:

- A. The County will pay the Contractor for the Services provided pursuant to this Contract and in accordance with the prices quoted and conditions set forth in the Bidder's response on Exhibit C Mandatory Cost Proposal Worksheet, which is attached hereto and incorporated into this Contract as if fully set forth herein. Payments will be made monthly in arrears to the Contractor after acceptance of the Contractor's delivered Services by the County, and after receipt of undisputed invoice to the County.
- B. Prices quoted shall be firm and fixed throughout the term of this Contract, unless otherwise Amended or Modified by mutual agreement.
- C. Cost may be prorated for Services added or removed under this Contract to align cost with the remaining term of Contract.
- D. It is understood that this bid or proposal is made without collusion or fraud. Contractor understands and acknowledges that collusive bidding is a violation of state and federal law and may result in the cancellation of the Contract.

ARTICLE # 122 - COUNTY PAYMENT TO CONTRACTOR:

A. The County will issue a Notice to Proceed (NTP) to the Contractor, and Purchase Order(s) (herein after 'PO'). The terms of this Contract shall be incorporated by reference into any and all PO(s) issued prior to the expiration or termination of this Contract. The County will issue the PO by electronic mail (e-mail) to the Contractor's representative in ARTICLE #103 - NOTICES. A PO is considered "issued" when the e-mail containing the PO is sent by the County to the Contractor.

The Contractor shall not deliver any Services, equipment, devices, or components thereof until authorized in writing by the County through issuance of a PO, which shall provide a commencement Notice to Proceed date. Any work, including but not limited to travel, preliminary meetings, planning, etc., performed outside of the terms and conditions of and before the issuance of the PO will not be considered for payment. Contractors are not to begin work or ship

any product on any verbal communication from within the County. The County will not be liable for payment for any work or product with the issuance of a verbal communication.

The Scope of Work shall remain in effect from the Notice to Proceed to completion of the project. The Parties agree that the County will not pay or otherwise compensate the Contractor for any Services, materials, equipment, devices or components thereof outside of the Scope of Work and/or beyond the term of this Contract, unless specifically authorized in writing as evidenced by an amendment (see ARTICLE #106 - CONTRACT AMENDMENTS &, MODIFICATION), a time extension letter, or as otherwise authorized by the County.

B. Invoice/Payment.

- Contractor shall invoice the County via email solely to accountspayable@hallcounty.org and only after the County inspects and accepts the Services provided. Receipt of the Services does not constitute acceptance. Invoice amounts shall not exceed the Contractor's pricing set forth in ARTICLE #102.
- 2. Each invoice shall include the Contractor's current "Remit to" address; a description and location of the Services provided; the invoice amount; the Contract number and the associated PO number issued. Each properly prepared invoice must be sent in accordance with the instructions listed on the PO. Standard payment terms are net 30 days (N30) in arrears from the date the invoice is accepted, following delivery of the Services.
- 3. The County does not pay for services not yet received but only in arrears.
- 4. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for paying all costs, expenses and charges it incurs in connection with its performance under the Contract, which includes release of any liens from all sub-contractors and material providers.

C. Unsatisfactory Performance; Delay of Payment.

- If the County determines that the quality of the Services provided are deficient, unacceptable, or unsatisfactory, the County's Project Manager identified in ARTICLE #103 shall issue a written notice to Contractor. Contractor agrees that upon receipt of the written notice, it shall make every effort to correct the deficiency (ies) within the timeframe prescribed therein. If the Contractor fails to timely correct the deficiencies, the County reserves the right to delay or withhold payment pursuant to this ARTICLE #122 or terminate the Contract (ARTICLE #108 TERMINATION PROVISIONS).
- 2. **Delay of Payment Due to Contractor's Failure.** If the County determines that the Contractor has failed to perform or deliver any Services as required by the Contract, the Contractor shall not be entitled to any compensation

under the Contract until such Services are delivered and accepted. In this event, the County may withhold that portion of the Contractor's compensation, which represents payment for Services that were not delivered. To the extent that the Contractor's failure to perform or deliver in a timely manner causes the County to incur costs, the County may deduct the amount of such incurred costs from any amounts payable to Contractor. The County's authority to deduct such incurred costs shall not in any way affect the County's authority to terminate the Contract.

- D. Set-Off Against Sums Owed by the Contractor. In the event that the Contractor owes the County any sum under the terms of the Contract, pursuant to any judgment, or pursuant to any law, the County may set off the sum owed by the Contractor against any sum owed to the Contractor, in the County's sole discretion.
- E. **Final Payment.** Contractor shall issue an invoice for final payment to the County no later than thirty (30) days following the expiration or termination date of the Contract.
- F. The Contractor must not "Factor or Assign Payments" to another or a financial institution. The County will only pay the party to whom it is contracted with. The County will not in any circumstances pay a third party.

ARTICLE #123 – BID, PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BONDS

A Bid Bond is required in the amount of the bidder's Cost Proposal. Such bid bond shall secure the faithful acceptance by the bidder or proposer of a bid or proposal award and shall be issued for the protection of the county.

After Notice of Award is given, Contractor must furnish to the County a Performance Bond equal to one-hundred percent (100%) of the Contract's total initial term dollar amount, and additionally a Payment Bond equal to one-hundred percent (100%) of the total awarded dollar amount. After receipt of the bonds, the County will issue a Notice-to-Proceed. Only surety companies licensed to do business in the State of Georgia are acceptable. The Contractor is required to provide new bonds at the issuance of each Renewal Option Term(s) or Extension(s) that follow.

The Contractor must provide all required bonding instruments to the County prior to commencement of any work. The County will consider any work done prior to the receipt of bonding instruments as null-and-void and thus not eligible for compensation. All bonds must be of a forfeiture type.

ARTICLE #124 – RETAINAGE

The County will retain funds from compensation in compliance with Georgia law. Hall County may hold up to <u>five-percent (5%) retainage</u> throughout the entire project and will release said retainage at the point of completion and final acceptance by the County and issuance of Occupancy Permit by County.

ARTICLE #125 – VENUE AND GOVERNING LAW

The parties agree that this Contract shall be interpreted, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia. To the extent that either party may bring a legal suit to enforce the terms of this Contract, including suit in equity, the parties agree and consent to file any such suit in the Superior Court of Hall County, Georgia.

ARTICLE # 126 - NOTICE OF INTENT TO LITIGATE

Contractor hereby agrees not to file any civil action of disputes or claims relating to the Contract except after first giving thirty days (30) written notice to the County of the claim and the intent to initiate a civil action.

ARTICLE # 127- GEORGIA SECURITY AND IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE ACT:

- A. By signing this Contract, the Contractor certifies that prior to and throughout the performance of all applicable work under this Contract it will remain in full compliance with all federal and state immigration laws, including but not limited to 8 U.S.C. § 1324a and the Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act (O.C.G.A. §13-10-90 et seq.), as amended by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011, regarding the verification of employment eligibility of employees under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986. Contractor will ensure that only persons who are citizens or nationals of the United States or non-citizens authorized under federal immigration laws are employed to perform services under this Contract or any subcontract or sub-subcontract hereunder.
- B. Contractor further certifies its compliance with the aforementioned federal and state immigration laws set forth by signing a sworn affidavit, the Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act Affidavit, notarized by an Official Notary Public, and obtaining the same affidavits from any sub-contractor providing services pursuant to this Contract.

ARTICLE # 128 – ORDER OF PRECEDENCE:

In the event of any inconsistency, ambiguity, or conflict among the specific provisions of the Contract and the Contractor's Response, the order of precedence shall be as follows:

- A. First, any amendments to the Contract, including all Exhibits thereto.
- B. Second, the Contract itself, including all Exhibits thereto.
- C. Third, Attachments appended to the Contract.

ARTICLE # 129– CONTRACT EXHIBITS AND ATTACHMENTS:

The Parties mutually acknowledge that any following Exhibits and Attachments listed below made a part of this Contract, as though expressly written in the RFQ/P documents and the bidder's response, are-herein-incorporated into this contract by reference.

EXHIBIT C - Mandatory Cost Proposal

ARTICLE # 130 - ENTIRE CONTRACT:

This Contract, as executed and approved, shall constitute the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all other prior and contemporaneous statements, agreements, and understandings between the Parties. No written or oral statements, agreements, or understandings that are not set out, referenced, or specifically incorporated in this Contract shall in any way be binding or of effect between the Parties.

ARTICLE # 131- VALIDITY

If any paragraph, sub-paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or any portion of this agreement shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction or if the provisions of any part of this agreement as applied to any particular situation or set of circumstances shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not be constructed to affect the portions of this agreement not so held to be invalid or the application of this agreement to other circumstances not so held to be invalid. The parties hereby declare that this is the intent of the parties to this agreement is to provide for separate and divisible parts.

<u>ARTICLE #132 – SALES TAX EXEMPTION STATUS</u>

The County is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes and from Georgia State and Local Sales and Use Taxes on the Services. The Contractor may request a copy of the County's Georgia Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate.

ARTICLE #133 – HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The successful respondent hereby agrees to indemnify, hold free and harmless, Hall County Government, County Commissioners, its agents, servants, employees, officers, directors and elected officials, or any other person(s) against any loss or expense. This includes attorney fees, because of any liability imposed by law upon the County, except in cases of the County's sole negligence, sustained by any person(s) on account of bodily injury or property damage arising out of or in the consequence of this agreement.

ARTICLE # 134 – CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- All purchases must comply with The Official Code of Hall County Sections 3.10.010 3.10.190.
- 2. If any conflict or ambiguity arises between the Terms and Conditions herein, and The Official Code of Hall County, the latter will govern.
- 3. The Terms and Conditions set forth herein shall supersede and govern over all Contractor's Terms and Conditions or Service Level Agreements.
- 4. Hall County, Georgia, herein referred to as 'The County', retains the right to 'red-line' sections of the Supplier's Terms and Conditions if such are in conflict with the best interest of the County.
- 5. Acceptance of a Purchase Order (PO) and delivery of Goods or Services serves as the Supplier's full and complete acceptance of The County's Terms and Conditions.
- 6. The terms; supplier, vendor, bidder, offeror, Contractor, Contractor, designer, distributor, dealer or manufacturer or otherwise purveyor or source of supply or performance of service shall mean one-and-the-same, herein denoted as 'Supplier' for goods and 'Contractor' for services.
- 7. Furthermore, the terms; goods, materials, commodities, components, drawings, drafts, renderings, plans, physical or digital, software, SaaS, Engineering, Architectural, capital asset equipment, vehicles, heavy earth-moving or other equipment, purchased or leased, or other such deliverables are herein denoted as 'Goods' and shall mean one-and-the-same.
- 8. 'Services' shall mean all services, either financial, advisory, consultative, labor, staff augmentation, construction, rehabilitation, restoration, repair, support or maintenance, communication, telephony, internet, TV or streaming, pest control, grounds maintenance, custodial and janitorial, street or paved surfaces cleaning, drain cleaning or otherwise where services are offered for consideration.
- 9. The County's payment terms are Net 30 days.
- 10. The Supplier shall transfer and deliver all goods or services described on the attached PO for the consideration set forth herein.
- 11. The Supplier shall only deliver goods and services as described on the PO and within the Scope of Work and the Supplier's Bid Response.
- 12. The County holds no obligation to pay for goods delivered or services rendered unless specified on a written Purchase Order or a Change Order of such.
- 13. The Supplier shall not construe any verbal consent to purchase goods or services as valid.
- 14. The County does not accept substitutions of services or goods that do not comply with the Scope of Work or Specifications set forth in the Purchase Order, Contract or Agreement, unless mutually agreed in writing by both parties.
- 15. The County does not accept automatic contract renewals with the exception of monthly subscription services.
- 16. The County only pays for services rendered in arrears. The County does not pay for services not yet rendered.
- 17. The County does not pay deposits towards goods ordered. Exceptions exist for custom made items (such as window coverings and blinds, or carpet, tile etc.), fabrication, decoration, or otherwise custom designed specifically for the County.

- 18. The County will accept backorders only if goods are out of stock and with prior written notice. Supplier's shall ship all quantities that it has in stock and hold orders for backorders.
- 19. The County participates in Cooperative Purchasing Agreements, State of Georgia Statewide Contracts, and other state, local, Intergovernmental Agreements, Memorandums-of-Understanding and other such Agreements.
- 20. In all cases, the jurisdiction shall be the State of Georgia, County of Hall, for arbitration or other legalities
- 21. Deliveries go to the ship-to addresses listed on the PO and within the time specified. The Supplier must follow instructions if multiple ship-to address exist on the PO.
- 22. Risk of loss of the goods shall pass to The County upon inspection and acceptance only.
- 23. Receipt of goods or services does not constitute acceptance.
- 24. Title to the goods shall remain with the Supplier until acceptance by The County.
- 25. The Supplier warrants that the goods are merchantable and that the Supplier has a legal right to deliver the goods and services and as described herein.
- 26. The County shall have the right to inspect all goods or services at the time and place of delivery.
- 27. Vendor agrees not to assign in full or part of the Contract to another party without the County's express written consent. Any attempted assignment or delegation shall void and make ineffectual for all purposes unless made in conformity with this paragraph.
- 28. The County is exempt from Federal Excise Tax and Georgia Sales and Use Tax.
- 29. This issuance of the PO shall not violate the Code of Ethics and Conflicts of Interest for Public Officers and Employees for Government Service set forth in the 2020 Section 45-1020 et seq. of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated and the Official Code of Hall County Section 3.10.070 governing Ethics.
- 30. All goods and services supplied pursuant to this PO shall, unless otherwise noted, must conform exactly to all of the descriptions, specifications, Exhibits and attachments contained in the Bid Solicitation upon which a PO is based and all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the Bid Solicitation are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.
- 31. Any-and-all media production, recordings, videos, photography, artwork, plates, engravings, and other printed or digital media materials paid in full by The County is considered County property and shall be delivered to The County upon request.
- 32. Invoices submitted to The County will reflect the language of the PO with the PO Number printed on each invoice submitted.
- 33. In the event that a PO has an attached Contract or Agreement, the terms and conditions of the latter shall govern in the event of any conflict with these terms and conditions.
- 34. The Supplier may be suspended, terminated, or debarred if it is determined that the Supplier has made false certification(s) or has violated such certification(s) by failure to carry out the requirements herein.
- 35. The Supplier certifies that it and its subcontractors are not been debarred, suspended, or declared ineligible by any agency of the County, or State of Georgia or as defined in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 48 C.F.R. Ch. 1 Subpart 9.4.
- 36. The Supplier certifies that the Supplier is not currently engaged in an active or pending lawsuit or other grievance, injunction, or levy against the County.
- 37. Goods are Free-On-Board (F.O.B.) destination and freight, shipping and delivery shall be prepaid and added to the invoice as a separate line item.
- 38. The County does not pay late fees nor interest charges.

- 39. The Supplier shall charge the County the exact amount of freight, delivery, handling and insurance charges.
- 40. The County is not bound to any minimum or maximum quantity or dollar amount set by the Supplier
- 41. In the event there is a discrepancy between the unit price and extended price, the unit price shall govern.

TAB 1 MASTER AGREEMENT - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Customer Support

The vendor shall provide timely and accurate technical advice and sales support. The vendor shall respond to such requests within one (1) working day after receipt of the request.

Disclosures

Respondent affirms that he/she has not given, offered to give, nor intends to give at any time hereafter any economic opportunity, future employment, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, trip, favor or service to a public servant in connection with this contract.

The respondent affirms that, to the best of his/her knowledge, the offer has been arrived at independently, and is submitted without collusion with anyone to obtain information or gain any favoritism that would in any way limit competition or give an unfair advantage over other vendors in the award of this contract.

Renewal of Contract

Unless otherwise stated, all contracts are for a period of three (3) years with an option to renew for up to five (5) additional one-year terms or any combination of time equally not more than 5 years if agreed to by Region 14 ESC and the vendor.

Funding Out Clause

Any/all contracts exceeding one (1) year shall include a standard "funding out" clause. A contract for the acquisition, including lease, of real or personal property is a commitment of the entity's current revenue only, provided the contract contains either or both of the following provisions:

Retains to the entity the continuing right to terminate the contract at the expiration of each budget period during the term of the contract and is conditioned on a best efforts attempt by the entity to obtain appropriate funds for payment of the contract.

Shipments (if applicable)

The awarded vendor shall ship ordered products within seven (7) working days for goods available and within four (4) to six (6) weeks for specialty items after the receipt of the order unless modified. If a product cannot be shipped within that time, the awarded vendor shall notify the entity placing the order as to why the product has not shipped and shall provide an estimated shipping date. At this point the participating entity may cancel the order if estimated shipping time is not acceptable.

Tax Exempt Status

Since this is a national contract, knowing the tax laws in each state is the sole responsibility of the vendor.



Payments

The entity using the contract will make payments directly to the awarded vendor or their affiliates (distributors/business partners/resellers) as long as written request and approval by NCPA is provided to the awarded vendor.

Adding Authorized Distributors/Dealers

Awarded vendors may submit a list of distributors/partners/resellers to sell under their contract throughout the life of the contract. Vendor must receive written approval from NCPA before such distributors/partners/resellers considered authorized.

Purchase orders and payment can only be made to awarded vendor or distributors/ business partners/resellers previously approved by NCPA.

Pricing provided to members by added distributors or dealers must also be less than or equal to the pricing offered by the awarded contract holder.

All distributors/partners/resellers are required to abide by the Terms and Conditions of the vendor's agreement with NCPA.

Pricing

All pricing submitted shall include the administrative fee to be remitted to NCPA by the awarded vendor. It is the awarded vendor's responsibility to keep all pricing up to date and on file with NCPA.

All deliveries shall be freight prepaid, F.O.B. destination and shall be included in all pricing offered unless otherwise clearly stated in writing

Warranty

Proposal should address the following warranty information:

- Applicable warranty and/or guarantees of equipment and installations including any conditions and response time for repair and/or replacement of any components during the warranty period.
- · Availability of replacement parts
- Life expectancy of equipment under normal use
- Detailed information as to proposed return policy on all equipment

Products: Vendor shall provide equipment, materials and products that are new unless otherwise specified, of good quality and free of defects

Construction: Vendor shall perform services in a good and workmanlike manner and in accordance with industry standards for the service provided.

Safety

Vendors performing services shall comply with occupational safety and health rules and regulations. Also all vendors and subcontractors shall be held responsible for the safety of their employees and any conditions that may cause injury or damage to persons or property.



Permits

Since this is a national contract, knowing the permit laws in each state is the sole responsibility of the vendor.

Indemnity

The awarded vendor shall protect, indemnify, and hold harmless Region 14 ESC and its participants, administrators, employees and agents against all claims, damages, losses and expenses arising out of or resulting from the actions of the vendor, vendor employees or vendor subcontractors in the preparation of the solicitation and the later execution of the contract.

Franchise Tax

The respondent hereby certifies that he/she is not currently delinquent in the payment of any franchise taxes.

Supplemental Agreements

The entity participating in this contract and awarded vendor may enter into a separate supplemental agreement to further define the level of service requirements over and above the minimum defined in this contract i.e. invoice requirements, ordering requirements, specialized delivery, etc. Any supplemental agreement developed as a result of this contract is exclusively between the participating entity and awarded vendor.

Certificates of Insurance

Certificates of insurance shall be delivered to the Public Agency prior to commencement of work. The insurance company shall be licensed in the applicable state in which work is being conducted. The awarded vendor shall give the participating entity a minimum of ten (10) days notice prior to any modifications or cancellation of policies. The awarded vendor shall require all subcontractors performing any work to maintain coverage as specified.

Legal Obligations

It is the Respondent's responsibility to be aware of and comply with all local, state, and federal laws governing the sale of products/services identified in this RFP and any awarded contract and shall comply with all while fulfilling the RFP. Applicable laws and regulation must be followed even if not specifically identified herein.

Protest

A protest of an award or proposed award must be filed in writing within ten (10) days from the date of the official award notification and must be received by 5:00 pm CST. Protests shall be filed with Region 14 ESC and shall include the following:

- Name, address and telephone number of protester
- Original signature of protester or its representative
- Identification of the solicitation by RFP number
- Detailed statement of legal and factual grounds including copies of relevant documents and the form of relief requested



Any protest review and action shall be considered final with no further formalities being considered.

Force Majeure

If by reason of Force Majeure, either party hereto shall be rendered unable wholly or in part to carry out its obligations under this Agreement then such party shall give notice and full particulars of Force Majeure in writing to the other party within a reasonable time after occurrence of the event or cause relied upon, and the obligation of the party giving such notice, so far as it is affected by such Force Majeure, shall be suspended during the continuance of the inability then claimed, except as hereinafter provided, but for no longer period, and such party shall endeavor to remove or overcome such inability with all reasonable dispatch.

The term Force Majeure as employed herein, shall mean acts of God, strikes, lockouts, or other industrial disturbances, act of public enemy, orders and regulation of any kind of government of the United States or any civil or military authority; insurrections; riots; epidemics; pandemic; landslides; lighting; earthquake; fires; hurricanes; storms; floods; washouts; droughts; arrests; restraint of government and people; civil disturbances; explosions, breakage or accidents to machinery, pipelines or canals, or other causes not reasonably within the control of the party claiming such inability. It is understood and agreed that the settlement of strikes and lockouts shall be entirely within the discretion of the party having the difficulty, and that the above requirement that any Force Majeure shall be remedied with all reasonable dispatch shall not require the settlement of strikes and lockouts by acceding to the demands of the opposing party or parties when such settlement is unfavorable in the judgment of the party having the difficulty

Prevailing Wage

It shall be the responsibility of the Vendor to comply, when applicable, with the prevailing wage legislation in effect in the jurisdiction of the purchaser. It shall further be the responsibility of the Vendor to monitor the prevailing wage rates as established by the appropriate department of labor for any increase in rates during the term of this contract and adjust wage rates accordingly.

Termination

Either party may cancel this contract in whole or in part by providing written notice. The cancellation will take effect 30 business days after the other party receives the notice of cancellation. After the 30th business day all work will cease following completion of final purchase order.

Open Records Policy

Because Region 14 ESC is a governmental entity responses submitted are subject to release as public information after contracts are executed. If a vendor believes that its response, or parts of its response, may be exempted from disclosure, the vendor must specify page-by-page and line-by-line the parts of the response, which it believes, are exempt. In addition, the respondent must specify which exception(s) are applicable and provide detailed reasons to substantiate the exception(s).

The determination of whether information is confidential and not subject to disclosure is the duty of the Office of Attorney General (OAG). Region 14 ESC must provide the OAG sufficient

information to render an opinion and therefore, vague and general claims to confidentiality by the respondent are not acceptable. Region 14 ESC must comply with the opinions of the OAG. Region14 ESC assumes no responsibility for asserting legal arguments on behalf of any vendor. Respondent are advised to consult with their legal counsel concerning disclosure issues resulting from this procurement process and to take precautions to safeguard trade secrets and other proprietary information.



PROCESS

Region 14 ESC will evaluate proposals in accordance with, and subject to, the relevant statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations that govern its procurement practices. NCPA will assist Region 14 ESC in evaluating proposals. Award(s) will be made to the prospective vendor whose response is determined to be the most advantageous to Region 14 ESC, NCPA, and its participating agencies. To qualify for evaluation, response must have been submitted on time, and satisfy all mandatory requirements identified in this document.

Contract Administration

The contract will be administered by Region 14 ESC. The National Program will be administered by NCPA on behalf of Region 14 ESC.

Contract Term

The contract term will be for three (3) year starting from the date of the award. The contract may be renewed for up to five (5) additional one-year terms or any combination of time equally not more than 5 years.

It should be noted that maintenance/service agreements may be issued for up to (5) years under this contract even if the contract only lasts for the initial term of the contract. NCPA will monitor any maintenance agreements for the term of the agreement provided they are signed prior to the termination or expiration of this contract.

Contract Waiver

Any waiver of any provision of this contract shall be in writing and shall be signed by the duly authorized agent of Region 14 ESC. The waiver by either party of any term or condition of this contract shall not be deemed to constitute waiver thereof nor a waiver of any further or additional right that such party may hold under this contract.

Price Increases

Should it become necessary, price increase requests may be submitted at any point during the term of the contract by written amendment. Included with the request must be documentation and/or formal cost justification for these changes. Requests will be formally reviewed, and if justified, the amendment will be approved.

Products and Services Additions

New Products and/or Services may be added to the resulting contract at any time during the term by written amendment, to the extent that those products and/or services are within the scope of this RFP.

Competitive Range

It may be necessary for Region 14 ESC to establish a competitive range. Responses not in the competitive range are unacceptable and do not receive further award consideration.



Deviations and Exceptions

Deviations or exceptions stipulated in response may result in disqualification. It is the intent of Region 14 ESC to award a vendor's complete line of products and/or services, when possible.

Estimated Quantities

While no minimum volume is guaranteed, the estimated (but not limited to) annual volume for Products and Services purchased under the proposed Master Agreement is \$400 million dollars annually. This estimate is based on the anticipated volume of Region 14 ESC and current sales within the NCPA program.

Evaluation

Region 14 ESC will review and evaluate all responses in accordance with, and subject to, the relevant statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations that govern its procurement practices. NCPA Administrative Agreement

The vendor will be required to enter and execute the National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance Administration Agreement with NCPA upon award with Region 14 ESC. The agreement establishes the requirements of the vendor with respect to a nationwide contract effort.

Discussions occur when oral or written communications between Region 14 ESC and respondent's are conducted for the purpose clarifications involving information essential for determining the acceptability of a proposal or that provides respondent an opportunity to revise or modify its proposal. Region 14 ESC will not assist respondent bring its proposal up to the level of other proposals through discussions. Region 14 ESC will not indicate to respondent a cost or price that it must meet to neither obtain further consideration nor will it provide any information about other respondents' proposals or prices.

TAB 2 NCPA ADMINISTRATION AGREEMENT

This Administration Agreement is made as of <u>December 1, 2022</u>, by and between National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance ("NCPA") and Howard Technology Solutions, a division of Howard Industries Inc. ("Vendor").

Recitals

WHEREAS, Region 14 ESC has entered into a certain Master Agreement dated <u>December 1, 2022</u>, referenced as Contract Number <u>01-145</u>, by and between Region 14 ESC and Vendor, as may be amended from time to time in accordance with the terms thereof (the "Master Agreement"), for the purchase of Technology Solutions, Products and Services;

WHEREAS, said Master Agreement provides that any state, city, special district, local government, school district, private K-12 school, technical or vocational school, higher education institution, other government agency or nonprofit organization (hereinafter referred to as "public agency" or collectively, "public agencies") may purchase products and services at the prices indicated in the Master Agreement;

WHEREAS, NCPA has the administrative and legal capacity to administer purchases under the Master Agreement to public agencies;

WHEREAS, NCPA serves as the administrative agent for Region 14 ESC in connection with other master agreements offered by NCPA

WHEREAS, Region 14 ESC desires NCPA to proceed with administration of the Master Agreement;

WHEREAS, NCPA and Vendor desire to enter into this Agreement to make available the Master Agreement to public agencies on a national basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the payments to be made hereunder and the mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, NCPA and Vendor hereby agree as follows:

General Terms and Conditions

- The Master Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth herein, and the terms and conditions contained therein shall apply to this Administration Agreement except as expressly changed or modified by this Administration Agreement.
- NCPA shall be afforded all of the rights, privileges and indemnifications afforded to Region 14 ESC under the Master Agreement, and such rights, privileges and indemnifications shall accrue and apply with equal effect to NCPA under this Administration Agreement including, but not limited to, Contractor's obligation to provide appropriate insurance and certain indemnifications to Region 14 ESC.

- Contractor shall perform all duties, responsibilities and obligations required under the Master Agreement in the time and manner specified by the Master Agreement.
- NCPA shall perform all of its duties, responsibilities, and obligations as administrator of purchases under the Master Agreement as set forth herein, and Contractor acknowledges that NCPA shall act in the capacity of administrator of purchases under the Master Agreement.
- With respect to any purchases made by Region 14 ESC or any Participating Agency pursuant to the Master Agreement, NCPA (a) shall not be construed as a dealer, remarketer, representative, partner, or agent of any type of Contractor, Region 14 ESC, or such Participating Agency, (b) shall not be obligated, liable or responsible (i) for any orders made by Region 14 ESC, any Participating Agency or any employee of Region 14 ESC or Participating Agency under the Master Agreement, or (ii) for any payments required to be made with respect to such order, and (c) shall not be obligated, liable or responsible for any failure by the Participating Agency to (i) comply with procedures or requirements of applicable law, or (ii) obtain the due authorization and approval necessary to purchase under the Master Agreement. NCPA makes no representations or guaranties with respect to any minimum purchases required to be made by Region 14 ESC, any Participating Agency, or any employee of Region 14 ESC or Participating Agency under this Administration Agreement or the Master Agreement.
- With respect to any supplemental agreement entered into between a Participating Agency and Contractor pursuant to the Master Agreement, NCPA, its agents, members and employees shall not be made party to any claim for breach of such agreement.
- This Administration Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other agreement, statement, or promise relating to the subject matter of this Administrative Agreement which is not contained herein shall be valid or binding.
- Contractor agrees to allow NCPA to use their name and logo within website, marketing
 materials and advertisement. Any use of NCPA name and logo or any form of publicity
 regarding this Administration Agreement or the Master Agreement by Contractor must
 have prior approval from NCPA.
- If any action at law or in equity is brought to enforce or interpret the provisions of this
 Administration Agreement or to recover any administrative fee and accrued interest, the
 prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs in addition to
 any other relief to which such party may be entitled.
- Neither this Administration Agreement nor any rights or obligations hereunder shall be assignable by Contractor without prior written consent of NCPA, provided, however, that the Contractor may, without such written consent, assign this Administration Agreement and its rights and delegate its obligations hereunder in connection with the transfer or sale of all or substantially all of its assets or business related to this Administration Agreement, or in the event of its merger, consolidation, change in control or similar transaction. Any permitted assignee shall assume all assigned obligations of its assignor under this Administration Agreement.
- This Administration Agreement and NCPA's rights and obligations hereunder may be assigned at NCPA's sole discretion, to an existing or newly established legal entity that has the authority and capacity to perform NCPA's obligations hereunder.

Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall be in effect so long as the Master Agreement remains in effect, provided, however, that the obligation to pay all amounts owed by Vendor to NCPA through the

termination of this Agreement and all indemnifications afforded by Vendor to NCPA shall survive the term of this Agreement.

Fees and Reporting

The awarded vendor shall electronically provide NCPA with a detailed quarterly report showing the dollar volume of all sales under the contract for the previous quarter. Reports are due on the fifteenth (15th) day after the close of the previous quarter. It is the responsibility of the awarded vendor to collect and compile all sales under the contract from participating members and submit one (1) report. The report shall include at least the following information as listed in the example below:

Each quarter NCPA will invoice the vendor based on the total of sale amount(s) reported. From the invoice the vendor shall pay to NCPA an administrative fee based upon the tiered fee schedule below. Vendor's annual sales shall be measured on a calendar year basis. Deadline for term of payment will be included in the invoice NCPA provides.

Supplier shall maintain an accounting of all purchases made by Public Agencies under the Master Agreement. NCPA and Region 14 ESC reserve the right to audit the accounting for a period of four (4) years from the date NCPA receives the accounting. In the event of such an audit, the requested materials shall be provided at the location designated by Region 14 ESC or NCPA. In the event such audit reveals an under reporting of Contract Sales and a resulting underpayment of administrative fees, Vendor shall promptly pay NCPA the amount of such underpayment, together with interest on such amount and shall be obligated to reimburse NCPA's costs and expenses for such audit.

Terms and Conditions

This Standard Service Contract (this "Contract"), entered into between Howard and _____ ("Customer"), covers the products identified in the Howard Quote #s _____ attached hereto (the "Covered Products"). Upon receipt of Customer's payment in full of the agreed-upon price, Howard will, during the term of this Contract, perform the following services:

- a) Assist the Customer with troubleshooting and/or perform diagnostic assessments related to performance issues which may arise with respect to the Covered Products;
- b) In the event it is determined that a warranty claim should be submitted to the manufacturer for Covered Products, Howard will, on the Customer's behalf, facilitate the submission claim to the manufacturer and will assist with communicating and working with the manufacturer throughout the process, including assistance with gathering and submitting information or documentation required by the manufacturer to process the claim;
- c) If the Customer's claim is accepted by the manufacturer, Howard will uninstall or disassemble the warranted Covered Product as may be necessary and will also provide assistance in packaging such equipment for return, or pickup, per the manufacturer's reasonable requirements in connection with the repair or replacement of such equipment under the terms of the manufacturer's warranty;
- d) Then, upon the Customer's receipt of repaired or replaced equipment from the manufacturer, Howard will handle the installation or re-installation of such parts or products.
- 1. The term of this Contract is one (1) year, beginning on the date of Howard's installation of the Covered Products. Requests to extend the term of or renew this Contract beyond one year will be considered and negotiated on a case-by-case basis. If you are interested in extending the term, please contact your Howard representative to discuss available options.
- 2. This Contract is an agreement to provide labor to the Customer in the event a warranty issue arises on a Covered Product during the term hereof; it does not cover any costs of packaging or shipping materials, freight or delivery charges, related equipment or any other costs or expenses. Howard makes no representation or guarantee as to whether any manufacturer of a Covered Product will accept the Customer's warranty claim or perform under its warranty or otherwise.
- 3. Every reasonable effort will be made to schedule the services described herein as soon as possible and no later than seven (7) business days from the date of the request, but exact response times may be subject to the availability of

Howard personnel. Customer must cooperate with and provide assistance to Howard personnel and access to Customer's facility as Howard may reasonably request for the purposes of performing the services.

- 4. This Contract is not a product warranty or an extension or upgrade of the manufacturer's product warranty. Howard does not warrant non-Howard branded products. Customer should refer to the manufacturer's warranty on the Covered Product for information about its coverage and terms, including Howard's standard Limited Warranty as to Howard branded products.
- 5. Howard warrants to the Customer that it shall perform the services in a professional and workmanlike manner in accordance with generally recognized industry standards for similar services. In the event of a breach of the foregoing warranty, Howard will, in its sole discretion, either: (i) re-perform such services; or (ii) credit or refund the price of the services at the pro rata contract price. THE REMEDIES SET FORTH IN THE PRECEDING SENTENCE SHALL BE HOWARD'S ENTIRE LIABILITY FOR ANY BREACH OF THE SAID WARRANTY.

IN NO EVENT SHALL HOWARD BE LIABLE FOR ANY LOSS OF USE, REVENUE OR PROFIT OR LOSS OF DATA OR DIMINUTION IN VALUE, OR FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT, EXEMPLARY, SPECIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES WHETHER ARISING OUT OF BREACH OF CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE) OR OTHERWISE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER SUCH DAMAGES WERE FORESEEABLE AND WHETHER OR NOT HOWARD HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.

IN NO EVENT SHALL HOWARD'S AGGREGATE LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS CONTRACT, WHETHER ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO BREACH OF CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE) OR OTHERWISE, EXCEED TWO (2) TIMES THE AGGREGATE AMOUNTS PAID OR PAYABLE TO HOWARD FOR THIS CONTRACT.

- 6. The Customer shall be responsible for all sales, use and excise taxes, and any other similar taxes, duties and charges of any kind imposed by any governmental entity on any amounts payable by the Customer hereunder.
- 7. Howard is an independent contractor, and nothing contained in this Contract shall be construed as creating any agency, partnership, joint venture, employment or fiduciary relationship between the parties. All matters arising out of or relating to this Contract are governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana without giving effect to any choice or conflict of law provision or rule.
