The Georgia Mountains Regional Commission (GMRC) is organizing a regional aerial photography and LiDAR project which includes 16 counties & 2 cities in northern Georgia. Photography will be captured between January & February 2023. The final photography product will be 6" resolution color imagery, which is the same resolution and specification as our previous imagery acquisitions. The county's cost is \$33,388.00. The LiDAR acquisition, meeting USGS QL2 standards, will include 2' contours. The data will be collected during the same timeframe as the photography acquisition. Hall County last acquired contours in 2010. The LiDAR project cost is \$72,177.00. The final product delivery for both photography & LiDAR products is September 2023. These requested products are part of the GIS program strategy to maintain current data for staff and citizens.

Hall County has participated in a number of previous GMRC regional projects. By participating in these regional projects, the county has realized a significant cost savings over acquiring aerial photography and LiDAR individually. 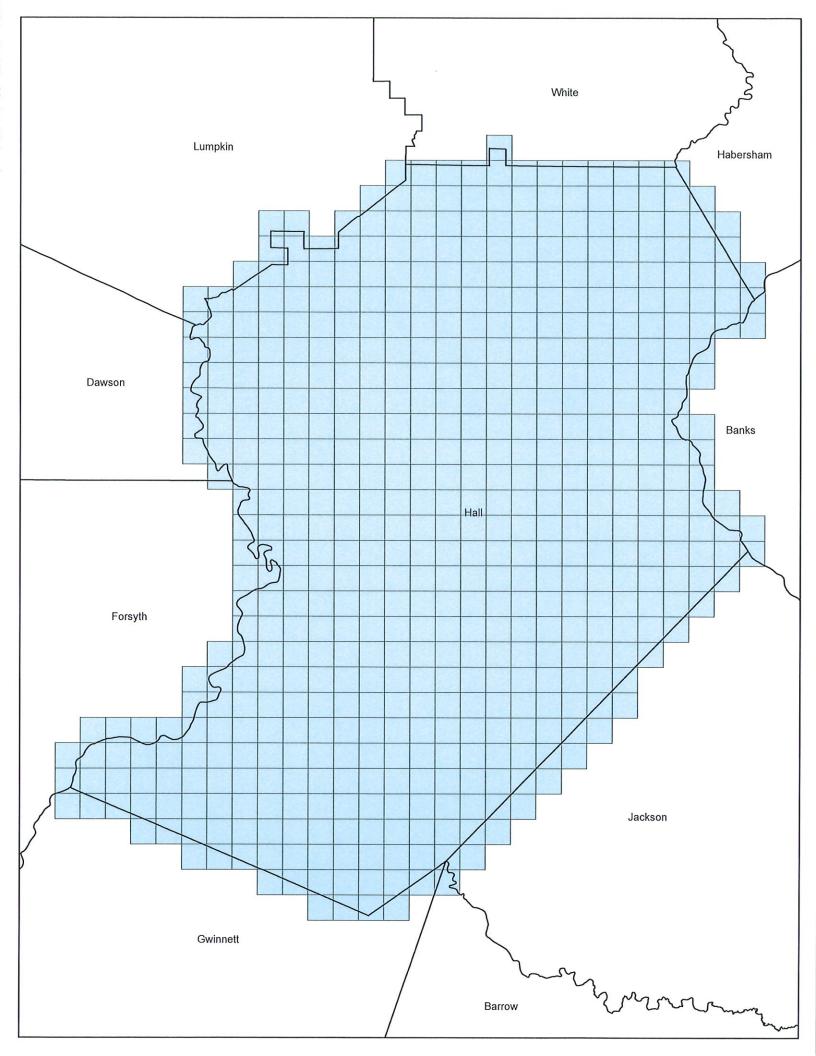

 - e. Architectural standards: All facades of all residences, shall be finished with brick, stone, stucco, wood siding, wood shakes, or fiber cement type siding. The front facades shall incorporate changes in building material, texture, and/or color. Vinyl siding on all residential and non-residential buildings shall be prohibited.
- 5. A homeowners association shall be required to maintain the common ownership elements of the development.
- 6. The proposed Stormwater BMP (pond) shall be a part of the open space and shall be provided a county approved maintenance access.
- 7. Encroachment of state waters and stream buffers shall be allowed on individual lots, however encroachment into any of the 50 to 75 foot buffered area located on individual lots shall not be allowed, including any fencing, patios, construction improvements, or de-vegetation.
- 8. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operations in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property: "Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."
- 9. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plats created for the property.
- 10. This approval shall be valid for 12 months after sewage is available to this property.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting approval to rezone 118.5 acres, per the applicant's site plan, from Agricultural Residential III (ARIII) to Planned Residential Development (PRD) for the purpose of developing a 349-unit single family attached and detached subdivision.

• It should be noted that the applicant's narrative states the development is 116 but parcels being rezoned have a cumulative acreage of 118.5; therefore, all staff calculations are based on the cumulative acreage of the parcels being rezoned.

The overall density for the development is 2.94 units per acre.

- The gross density for the single-family detached component is 2.32 units per acre.
 - Net density is 3.56 units per acre.
- The gross density for the single-family attached (townhomes) is 5.37 units per acre.
 - Net density is 6.68 units per acre.
- The gross density for Riverbrook (Price Rd/Thompson Bridge Rd), approved in 2021, was 4.14 units per acre with a net density of 7.05 units per acre. Riverbrook is located in an area designated as an Activity Center on the Future Land Use Maps. The subject parcels are shown as Residential and Mixed Use Corridor on the Future Land Use map, with some conservation areas. The residential character anticipates 2 units per acre but the mixed-use corridor anticipates higher density residential where the same is found on adjacent properties. At present adjacent properties are large residential/agricultural tracts or residential developments with half acre parcels. There is some higher density residential on the adjacent property located within Gwinnett County.

The applicant's narrative states that the proposed design allows for the flexible placement, arrangement, and orientation of residential structures given the property's characteristics, including streams located on the property. The proposed development will include both single family detached homes and single-family attached homes (townhomes). Two landscaped entrances will be provided, the primary entrance will be onto Friendship Circle into the single family residential section of the development. The second entrance will connect directly to Friendship Road (State Route 347) for the townhome component. Per the narrative, grading will be in accordance with site characteristics, topography, and the presence of streams.

From the primary entrance on Friendship Circle you will enter the detached single family residential component of the development and can take a left towards a small section of single family homes, past the homes you will find the an amenity site with a pool and clubhouse, then continues to the townhome portion development. Alternatively you can continue straight from the entrance to the larger section of single family homes. Multiple side streets with cul-de-sac branch off from the primary road and at least 4 creek crossings are shown. The entrance road continues through the single family development before looping and connecting to the townhome component, and ultimately connecting to Friendship Road.

Of the 349 proposed parcels, 209 will be developed as single-family detached dwellings. The lots will be a minimum of 8,000 square feet in size, with a minimum lot width of 60 feet. The minimum heated floor area of the detached homes will be 2,000 to 2,500 square feet. Four (4) foot sidewalks

are proposed on both sides of the street and a 50 foot undisturbed exterior buffer surrounds the development, including the single-family attached component.

The attached single family residential, townhome, component will make up the remaining 140 units within the development. The townhomes are proposed to have a minimum lot width of 24 feet. The minimum heated floor area for the townhomes is proposed to be 1,600 – 1,800 square feet in area and the minimum lot area is proposed to be 1,200 square feet.

The project will include 35.46 cumulative acres of open space and common area for the proposed development. The site plan anticipates 5.11 acres of open space and common area for the single-family attached development and 30.35 acres of open space and common area for the single-family detached portion. The narrative explains that the common areas are to include an open-air cabana for the pool. Other amenities include, but are not limited to, a dog park, an open-air covered pavilion with outdoor rated bodyweight workout equipment, and grilling/gathering places for the residents. Mailbox kiosks will be located throughout the development, per the narrative.

• It should be noted that no amenity area is shown foe the single-family attached (townhome) component. The Planning Commission should seek clarity on whether the amenity area shown will be for both components.

The narrative states that the architectural style of the community will be traditional 1-2 story single family detached homes and townhomes with 2-car garages. Architectural renderings were submitted for reference. The narrative continues that the homes will have brick and stone accents on the front of the homes. The remaining front façade will be board and batten, shake, or lap fiber cement siding. The side and rear of the homes will be fiber cement lap siding. All grass areas and all front and side yards will be sodded.

The narrative states that dependent upon permitting and approvals, the applicant anticipates 12 to 36 month development period.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject parcels comprise of approximately 118.5± acres and are zoned Agricultural Residential III (AR-III). The properties are currently developed with single family residences and various outbuildings over the 4 parcels. The structures will be removed prior to development of the subdivision.

Properties along Friendship Road (SR 347) are a mixture of residentially zoned parcels, including properties zoned AR-III, R-I, and PRD. Across Friendship Road to the west is the Vulcan Rock Quarry, located in the City of Flowery Branch and zoned Manufacturing.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The Comprehensive Plan's future land use designation for the subject parcel is "Residential" but is also within a "Mixed-Use Corridor".

- Residential Areas are characterized by moderate-density (2 dwellings per acre) residential development and neighborhoods. Street networks are defined by curvilinear streets and green space is largely provided on individual lots but neighborhood open space and/or park amenities may also be provided. Pedestrian connectivity is moderate, where sidewalks may be internal to a neighborhood but may not currently connect nearby parks and schools. Future development will continue to be detached, single-family homes at moderate densities, with opportunities for variations in housing size and types through the Planned Development District zoning classification. New development should provide opportunities for open space/greenspace, including shared areas for the benefit of residents and ample tree cover. Future land use include moderate density residential uses, greenways, and trails, civic benefit uses such as community centers, libraries, schools, and places of worship.
- Corridors in Residential and Rural Residential areas, and multi-jurisdictional corridors (Atlanta Highway and Browns Bridge Road), are generally those roadways that are intended to accommodate a variety of nonresidential uses without encroaching upon or replacing adjacent residential neighborhoods. Non-residential uses along corridors in Residential and Rural Areas should be located in close proximity to Community Crossroads or Activity Centers. Access should be from secondary roads so as not to impede traffic flow, and adjacent businesses should share interparcel access. Corridors with interstate or rail access that support industrial or more intensive commercial uses are intended to provide additional larger-scale employment generators. Corridors adjacent to Lake Lanier should accommodate lake-oriented commercial uses with effective screening, where appropriate. Corridors are located throughout Hall County and are classified into three categories: Mixed-Use, Employment, and Lake Supportive. Primary Future Land Uses: Mixed-Use Corridor: Retail activities, office based employment, civic uses, single-family residential Low-impact industrial or higher density residential only where the same is found on adjacent properties

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated August 12, 2022 Emily McGahee stated "No comment. Public sewer."

Hall County Fire Services

In an email dated August 15, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick, stated that the Hall County Fire Marshal's Office had no comments regarding the concept plan for the 349 unit residential development.

Per Hall County GIS, the subject parcel is located approximately 4 miles from Hall County Fire Station #14, located at 7065 Dove Point Lane. The nearest fire hydrant is located at the terminus of Friendship Circle.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a letter dated June 13, 2022, Bill Nash, P.E., Assistant Director of Public Works and Utilities, provided a letter confirming availability of sewer service at this time. The project will not be able to obtain an LDP for this project until one year prior to the anticipated Friendship Road Sewer Extension Project Completion. A completion date was not provided.

In a memo dated August 18, 2022, from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Public Works and Utilities, the following comments were provided:

Engineering

- 1. The site may require a stormwater management report should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.
- 2. Show stream buffers and impervious setback from wrested vegetation not centerline of stream.
- 3. Show flood Hall County studied and FEMA.
- 4. Roads must meet all Hall County standards.
- 5. Stormwater ponds must be out of flood.
- 6. Development is not allowed in flood.

Traffic Engineering

- 1. GDOT approval/permitting required.
- 2. Improvements/modifications to the intersection of Friendship Circle and Friendship Place may be required.
- Improvements/modifications (possibly including signalization) may be required for the intersection of Friendship Road (SR347) and Friendship Place/Swansey Road.
- Developer should be financially responsible for all required roadway improvements/modifications and they should be constructed concurrently with the development.

Utilities

- 1. Hall County sewer district.
- 2. No sewer available.
- No application for land disturbance permit can be made prior to Friendship Road sewer project construction is less than one year from its anticipated completion. No final plat will be approved until Friendship Road sewer is installed and operating.

Hall County Tax Assessors

No comments were provided.

Gainesville Water Resources

In a letter dated June 21, 2022 Nick Swafford, Permitting Services Manager for the City of Gainesville Water Resources department, provided a letter confirming water availability for a period of 1 year from the date of the letter.

Per Hall County GIS, there is public water line operated by the City of Gainesville in the right-of-way along Friendship Road (SR 347).

Georgia Department of Transportation

Per an email dated August 18, 2022, Parker Niebauer, District 1 Traffic Operations Supervisor, confirmed that this project will require GDOT coordination.

The applicant also submitted a letter dated June 13, 2022 from Jason Dykes, District 1 Traffic Engineer, confirming the work would be approved if all of the GDOT requirements are met.

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed use request is inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan, as the proposed density exceeds the density standard within the "Residential" land use designation but is located within a "Mixed-Use" Corridor which allows for higher density residential when adjacent to other uses with similar densities. The subject property is adjacent to vacant or moderate density properties within Hall County but adjacent to high density residential in Gwinnett County.
- The applicant is requesting to rezone the property from Agricultural Residential III (AR-III) to Planned Residential Development (PRD) for the purpose of developing a 349-unit single family attached and detached subdivision.
- Per §17.180.060, a PRD allows for more flexibility in the design and development of the property. This provides for a mixture of housing types and encourages maximum use of natural features, through proper site planning measures. The development should conform to the existing character and development pattern of the surrounding area. The proposal is using the natural features to enhance the development but the net density is higher than the adjacent uses within Hall County. The overall gross density for the project is 2.94 units per acres.
- Per §17.180.060.B.2, dimensional standards for single-family residences are detailed below. If standards are not specifically proposed, then the applicable standards in the Residential-I (R-I) district shall apply.
 - Detached Single Family Lots:
 - Lot area. Minimum lot area standards of 8,000 square feet for lots served by sanitary sewer. The overall gross density not to exceed two units per acre.
 - Per the site plan, the minimum lot size is 8,000 square feet. This standard **is met.**
 - Lot width. Minimum lot width of 50 feet.
 - Per the site plan, the minimum lot width is 60 feet. This standard is met.
 - Setbacks:

- Minimum front yard setback from the property line of 25 feet.
 - Per the site plan, the front setback is 25 feet. This standard is met.
- Minimum side yard setback from the property line of five feet.
 - Per the site plan, the side yard setback is 5 feet. This standard is met.
- Minimum rear yard setback from the property line of 20 feet.
 - Per the site plan, the rear setback is 20 feet. This standard is met.
- Attached Single Family:
 - Lot area, per §17.180.060.B.4.a.i, for a one-story multi-family residence and/or townhouse with the minimum three attached single-family units, the minimum lot area standard of 35,000 square feet will apply. It should be noted that these are not multi-family units but single-family attached units. Each of these dwellings will be on a separate parcel as opposed to a multi-family development which has multiple structures containing multiple units on one parcel.
- Per §17.180.060.B.5, a minimum 50 foot planted buffer shall be established along the
 perimeter of all property boundaries adjacent to residential and/or non-residential zoning
 districts to ensure that the planned residential development is appropriately screened.
 - Per the applicant's narrative and site plan, a 50 foot buffer exterior buffer is proposed. This standard is met.
- Per §17.180.060.B.6, a minimum of two trees per lot shall be provided or preserved in the front, side, or rear yard of each lot.
 - The narrative and site plan do not reference any tree plantings. This standard is not met.
- Per §17.180.060.B.7.a, residential developments with greater than 150 lots shall include at least two vehicular entrances connecting to a city, state, or county-maintained public road.
 - One entrance is proposed from Friendship Road (SR 347) and a second entrance is proposed from Friendship Circle. This standard is met.
- Per §17.180.060.B.7.b. all planned residential developments shall construct sidewalks on both sides of the streets that are a minimum of five feet wide.
 - o The applicant's narrative states 5 foot sidewalks for the development. This standard **is met**.
- Per §17.180.060.B.8, the development shall conform to all open space requirements of sections §17.430.100 through §17.430.150, as shown under the conservation subdivision design option chapter. The only open space requirement that may differ from those standards set forth in section §17.430.110 is the open space shall comprise at least 30 percent of the gross tract area. The open space requirements include:
 - At least 75 percent of the open space shall be in a contiguous tract. The open space should adjoin any neighboring areas of open space, other protected areas, and nonprotected natural areas that would be candidates for inclusion as part of a future area of protected open space.

- The open space shall be directly accessible to the largest practicable number of lots within the subdivision. Non-adjoining lots shall be provided with safe, convenient access to the open space. The majority of the lots abut greenspace; the project provides sidewalks, these should have access to the greenspace should the Commission approve the project.
- Per §17.430.120, permitted uses of open space, the following uses are permitted: conservation of natural, archeological or historical resources; meadows, woodlands, wetlands, wildlife corridors, game preserves, or similar conservation oriented areas; walking or bicycle trails, provided they are constructed of porous paving materials; passive recreation areas; active recreation areas, provided that they are limited to no more than ten percent of the total open space and are not located within primary conservation areas; agriculture, horticulture, silviculture or pasture uses; nonstructural stormwater management practices; easements for drainage, access, and underground utility lines; golf courses; or other conservation-oriented uses compatible with the purposes of this chapter.
 - The project appears to meet this requirement based on the narrative but clarification during the hearing is required.
- Per §17.180.060.B.9, provides design guidelines and standards for planned residential developments.
 - All facades of all residences shall be finished with brick, stone, stucco, wood siding, wood shakes, or fiber cement type siding. The front facades shall incorporate changes in building material, texture, and/or color. Vinyl siding on all residential and non-residential buildings shall be prohibited.
 - The applicant has listed the following information in the narrative: the homes will have brick and stone accents on the front of the homes. The remaining front façade will be board and batten, shake, or lap fiber cement siding. The side and rear of the homes will be fiber cement lap siding
 - Architectural renderings were submitted as part of this request but the materials were not identified.
- Per §17.180.060.B.9.b, single-family residence garages, garage placement shall be if the following: semi-flush, recessed, side-loaded, carriage court, or detached.
 - The architectural renderings and narrative suggest that the applicant is proposing to develop the semi-flush placement type of garage, which requires the following: garage doors shall be oriented towards the street and shall be positioned between five and 20 feet behind the front wall plane of the residence, extending no more than 40 percent of the width of the residence. It cannot be determined if this standard is met as the renderings submitted do not provide dimensions.
- Per §17.180.060.B.11, all new subdivisions are required to provide a cluster mailbox unit (CBU) for regular mail service delivery.
 - The narrative states that mail kiosks will be provided throughout the development.
 Because they are not depicted it cannot be determined if this standard is met.

- Per §17.380.050 of the Official Code of Hall County requires any application proposing the development of 100 or more residential dwelling units to submit a traffic impact study as part of an application.
 - The proposed development contains 349 units. A traffic study was prepared by Atlas Technical Consultants in July 2022.
 - One intersection was study as part of this report, the intersection. Friendship Road (SR 347) and Swansey Road.
 - The study concludes that the project is expected to warrant a signal at this intersection. The report states that the signalized level of service LOS is expected to be failing on the side street approach at full buildout of the development
- Per comment from the Georgia Department of Transportation, this project will require coordination with them.
- The narrative indicates water will be provided by the City of Gainesville through a waterline along Friendship Road (SR 347) right-of-way.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends **denial** of the applicant's request as it is inconsistent with the maximum density for the Residential future land use designation of the Hall County Comprehensive Plan.

If the Planning Commission should choose to recommend approval of the request, staff recommends the following conditions:

- 11. The development shall occur as depicted on the site plan and described in the project narrative, modified for compliance with zoning conditions and Hall County regulations, and geological or topographical constraints identified during development of engineered plans. The Planning Director can approve the changes provided:
 - a. No increase in density:
 - b. No decreased minimum lot area or width;
 - c. No decrease in minimum building setbacks;
 - d. No decrease in buffers.
- 12. The developer shall be responsible the cost of any improvements identified by the traffic study, and/or required by Hall County Engineer or the Georgia Department of Transportation.
- 13. The proposed residential development shall conform to §17.180.060 Planned Residential Development (PRD) standards. No variances are granted as part of this request, unless specifically identified during the motion.
- 14. The proposed residential development shall confirm to §16.60. No variances are granted as part of this request.
 - a. All site plans shall indicate that the distance from the rear of the sidewalk to the garage meets or exceeds 22 feet.
 - b. Open Space: minimum of 30%.
 - c. The Open Space and lot configuration shall be redesigned to meet §17.430.110.E and §17.430.110.F, including the requirement that "F. The open space shall be

- directly accessible to the largest practicable number of lots within the subdivision. Non-adjoining lots shall be provided with safe, convenient access to the open space." The redesigned lot layout shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to submission of the application for a Preliminary Plat/ LDP application.
- d. A recreational trail system shall be constructed with low impact/ non-pervious materials (mulch or other approved materials) in the Open Space with a connection to the sidewalk system. The trail system shall have a minimum length of 1,500 and a width of four (4) feet that generally follows the stream to the south of the property. The Open Space shall connect to the street system to provide access to the trail system. The trail system is allowed to encroach into the buffers. The trail system design shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to submission of the application for a Preliminary Plat/ LDP application.
- e. Buffers: A minimum 50 undisturbed buffer shall be retained around the perimeter except along the rights-of-way of Friendship Circle and Friendship Rd. These shall have a 25FT landscaped buffer which will provide dense screening of the development. The landscape plan shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to the issuance of the LDP.
- f. Architectural standards: All facades of all residences, shall be finished with brick, stone, stucco, wood siding, wood shakes, or fiber cement type siding. The front facades shall incorporate changes in building material, texture, and/or color. Vinyl siding on all residential and non-residential buildings shall be prohibited.
- 15. A homeowners association is required to maintain the common ownership elements of the development.
- 16. The proposed Stormwater BMP (pond) shall be on a separate "utility" lot that is not a part of the open space and will provide an access and maintenance easement.
- 17. The lots shall be designed so that all state waters and required buffers (75') do not encroach on individual lots.
- 18. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operations in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property:
 - "Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."
- 19. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plats created for the property.

Excerpts from the minutes of the October 17, 2022 meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Ellis Still, Assistant Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Tyler Smith, 340 Jesse Jewell Parkway, Gainesville, presented the request. The applicant stated the community would have two entrances, landscaping, monuments, and homes would be single and double story. The applicant stated that the homes would not exceed a height of 35 foot, driveways for the single family homes and townhomes would be 40 foot in length and 20 feet wide. The applicant stated that for single family home units they are requesting 2.32 units per acre for a 2000-2500 square foot conditioned area and for townhome units they are requesting 5.37 units per acre for a 1600-1800 square foot conditioned area. Single family homes will have three to five bedrooms per unit while townhomes will have three to four bedrooms per unit. The applicant stated that the common area will be 31 percent of the site including an open air cabana, pool, open air covered pavilion, Dog Park, exercise section and gathering spaces with 5 foot wide sidewalks and may include a walking trail of at least 1500 linear feet. The applicant stated that the homes will have brick and stone accents on the front facing the street. The applicant stated the homes will have at least two trees, one in the front and one in the backyard. The applicant stated that there will be a bio detention pond and it is under review to expand. The applicant presented the variances for the project as follows: 1. There will be a 75-foot impervious stream buffer, inclusive of a 50-foot undisturbed stream buffer, from the top of the stream bank (point of rested vegetation). Some of the impervious stream buffer area (outside the 50-foot undisturbed stream buffer) will be included as a part of the individual lots, subject to the buffer requirements. If a variance is allowed for inclusion of those stream buffer areas within the lots, Scott Puckett, Inc. requests that the variance be allowed. 2. Scott Puckett, Inc, requests any variances required to accomplish the following densities: a. allow the density of the Single Family Section to be 2.32 units per acre, and b. allow the density of the Town Home Section to be 5.37 units per acre.

Rebuttal

The applicant stated that they can entertain requests to protect adjacent property owner's property but the creek buffer along the property lines should take care of it.

Public Forum:

Chris Puckett, 3516 Friendship Road, Buford, spoke in opposition. Concerns were walking trails, fencing, and privacy.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell questioned if the amenity area was for all of the development. The applicant stated that was correct. Mr. Hunt questioned the time limit based on sewer availability from the county. Ms. Doveton stated the time limit should be adjusted based on the availability of the sewer. Mr. Varner wanted to address the possibility of a fence. Mr. Hunt stated a fence might impede on the creek buffer. Mr. Braswell stated that there is already an undisturbed 50 foot and 25 foot stream buffer along the property lines.

<u>Motion:</u> A motion to approve, with conditions was made by Mr. Hunt and seconded by Mr. Varner. Vote: 4-0

Conditions:

- 1. The development shall occur as depicted on the site plan and described in the project narrative, per all conditions stated below. The Planning Director can approve any necessary changes provided:
 - a. No increase in overall density greater than 3.0 units per acre;
 - b. No decreased minimum lot area or width;
 - c. No decrease in minimum building setbacks;
 - d. No decrease in buffers.
 - e. In geological or topographical constrains identified during development or engineering plans.
- 2. The developer shall be responsible for the cost of any improvements identified by the traffic study, and/or required by Hall County Engineer or the Georgia Department of Transportation.
- 3. The proposed residential development shall conform to §17.180.060 Planned Residential Development (PRD) standards. No variances are granted as part of this request, unless specifically identified during the motion.
- 4. The proposed residential development shall confirm to §16.60.
 - a. All site plans shall indicate that the distance from the rear of the sidewalk to the garage meets or exceeds a minimum of 22 feet.
 - b. Open Space: minimum of 30%.
 - c. The Open Space and lot configuration shall be redesigned to meet §17.430.110.E and §17.430.110.F, including the requirement that "F. The open space shall be directly accessible to the largest practicable number of lots within the subdivision. Non-adjoining lots shall be provided with safe, convenient access to the open space." The redesigned lot layout shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to submission of the application for a Preliminary Plat/ LDP application.
 - d. Buffers: A minimum 50 undisturbed buffer shall be retained around the perimeter except along the rights-of-way of Friendship Circle and Friendship Rd. These shall have a 25FT landscaped buffer which will provide dense screening of the development. The landscape plan shall be approved by the Planning Director prior to the issuance of the LDP.
 - e. Architectural standards: All facades of all residences, shall be finished with brick, stone, stucco, wood siding, wood shakes, or fiber cement type siding. The front facades shall incorporate changes in building material, texture, and/or color. Vinyl siding on all residential and non-residential buildings shall be prohibited.
- 5. A homeowners association shall be required to maintain the common ownership elements of the development.
- 6. The proposed Stormwater BMP (pond) shall be a part of the open space and shall be provided a county approved maintenance access.
- 7. Encroachment of state waters and stream buffers shall be allowed on individual lots, however encroachment into any of the 50 to 75 foot buffered area located on individual lots shall not be allowed, including any fencing, patios, construction improvements, or de-vegetation.
- 8. The following statement regarding the potential impacts of agricultural operations in the area shall be made a part of any plat recorded on the property:

"Owners, occupants, and users of property shown on this plat are hereby informed of the impacts associated with normal farming practices which may take place on adjacent and nearby property including, but not limited to, noise, odors, dust, the operation of machinery of any kind, the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Therefore, owners, occupants, and users of the property shown on this plat should be prepared to expect the effects of such practices."

- 9. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plats created for the property.
- 10. This approval shall be valid for 12 months after sewage is available to this property.

Scott Puckett, Inc. presents this revised narrative regarding its application to rezone four tracts of property to PRD for a Planned Residential Development. The PRD includes four parcels:

Provided with this Project Narrative is a revised proposed site plan dated September 29, 2022. Included with the applications are renderings for the proposed single-family and townhomes.

§ 17.180.060: Planned Residential Development (PRD)

A. Characteristics

The proposed design allows for flexible placement, arrangement, and orientation of residential structures given the property's characteristics, including streams located on the property. The subdivision will be a mixed-use development consisting of single-family homes and townhomes. The community will have two entrances with landscaping and monuments. The proposed design will maximize natural features through creative site planning. Grading will be in accordance with site characteristics, topography, and the presence of streams.

<u>B.1: Proposed Size, Location, Number of Units, and Number of Bedrooms of All</u> <u>Residential Structures</u>

The proposed development includes a total of 116 acres. The site plan for the subject tract provides for 209 Single Family Residential lots with amenities on 89.95 acres (the "Single Family Section") and 140 Town Home units on 26.05 acres (the "Town Home Section"). Each residence will be a one-story or two-story home and will not exceed a height of 35 feet.

The Town Home Section incorporates zero lot lines for Town Home Lots. Rear entry town homes are not feasible on the site given the topography. However, the Town Home lots include the home site, back yard, front yard areas, and front driveways (approximately 40 feet in length and 20 feet wide) extending to the street right-of-way.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to rezone the subject property from Residential-I (R-I) to a Planned Commercial District (PCD) for the use of a self-storage facility. The narrative states that the operating hours will be 9:00am-5:00pm with management on site. After-hours access will be provided via key pad with remote entry to the facility. The narrative continues that the development will have high security systems and proper lighting subject to the county requirements.

The site will be serviced by an on-site septic system, subject to county regulations. The narrative states that adjacent properties will be protected by proper fencing, foliage, and shrubbery with input from neighbors to ensure the proper buffers are maintained. The submitted site plan shows a 25 foot vegetated buffer with opaque fencing adjacent to all properties zoned R-I.

The submitted site plan shows three (3) self-storage buildings on the property, with total impervious area equaling 1.65 acres, or 48% of the total lot area. All two (2) of the three (3) buildings are proposed to be one story in height (less than 15 feet), with the building located on the western portion of the lot having a bi-level option (less than 27 feet).

The total proposed square footage of self-storage area is 39,800 square feet of one story storage and 60,950 square feet if the bi-level building is constructed. The site plan shows a 700 square foot office connected to Building A with 8 parking spaces near the entrance. After the parking spaces is a gated access to the storage buildings. A stormwater detention facility is shown in the front of the property, to the north of the proposed parking spaces and a monument sign is shown adjacent to Mountain View Road.

A breakdown of the proposed development can be shown in the table below:

History and Existing Land Use

The subject property is zoned Residential I (R-I) and measures approximately 3.54± acres. The property is currently undeveloped as the property card shows a demolition permit was issued for a residence and a barn on November 2, 2018 and shows that demolition took place on March 6, 2019.

This parcel was the subject of a previous rezoning request to Planned Commercial Development (PCD) for a gas station and convenience store with retail offices and storage units. The Planning

Commission on March 18, 2019 recommend denial. The request to rezone to a PCD was **denied** by the BOC on April 10, 2019.

Subsequently, a conditional use application for a daycare center was approved by the Board of Commissioners on January 9, 2020, with 9 conditions. Per §17.380.130, the approval of any application for a use subject to approval of the county commission shall be effective for a period of no longer than 12 months from the date of approval unless action is taken by the applicant to implement the use proposed in the application by obtaining the proper permit and/or license, and development plat approval, and proceeding with the building, occupancy or establishment of business. Since the approval there has been no action taken by the applicant to implement the proposed use and as such the approval for a daycare center has **expired**.

All adjacent parcels to the subject property are zoned Residential-I (R-I). The eastern and northwestern property lines abut lots within the Colbert Buice Subdivision. The western and southwestern property lines are developed residential lots that are not within a subdivision.

Across Mountain View Road are multiple larger tracts of land within the City of Gainesville jurisdiction, zoned Light Industrial (L-I). The parcels are developed with industrial uses, including a 371,890± square foot manufacturing building.

Within unincorporated Hall County limits, directly across from the subject property, is a parcel zoned R-I and developed with a hair salon business that has been in business since the 1970s. The property to the west of the hair salon business (2941 Mountain View Road) was rezoned to Highway-Business (H-B) in 2017, and is currently developed with a Family Dollar store.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The Comprehensive Plan designates the subject property and surrounding area as a "Lake Area Residential" land use category. This category includes low-density residential development and neighborhoods. Land use patterns are similar to Residential Areas, and there is orientation toward Lake Lanier in terms of development and flexibility in use of single-family homes. The area includes the 500-feet buffer around the lake, wherein properties have the potential to be zoned Vacation Cottage District in order for single-family homes to be used as short-term vacation rentals. Future development will continue to be detached, single family homes at low densities in addition to less intensive agricultural uses that are found in the northwestern part of the area.

These areas are located outside of the County's sewer service area, but public water is available.

While non-residential uses have been introduced on the southern side of Mountain View Road, there has been none yet introduced on the northern side of the road. The introduction of nonresidential uses on this parcel is inconsistent with the future land use policy of the Comprehensive Plan.

This proposal is **inconsistent** with the Comprehensive Plan.

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

In an email dated September 23, 2022, Emily McGahee stated, "Must meet all Environmental Health commercial septic system permitting requirements. Further determination will be made during the civil plan review process. A detailed business plan must be submitted to Hall County Environmental Health for review. Additional items, including, but not limited to: recorded plat, soil evaluation, and septic system installation may be required after review of business plan."

Hall County Fire Services

In an email dated September 28, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick, NPQ Fire Inspector 1, Plans Review, stated the following:

"IFC Section 903, 42,300 SF bi-level storage building exceeds the 12,000 SF sprinkler threshold requirements and will be required to have a fire protection system installed.

All access controlled gates will require a Knox key switch override device for fire department access into gated development.

IFC Section 507, All buildings must be with in the 400' hose lay distance requirements from a fire hydrant as the truck travels. Fire hydrant(s) may have to be installed along the access road to meet the hose lay distance requirements."

Per Hall County GIS, the property is located approximately 2.7 miles from Hall County Fire Station #4, located at 2940 McEver Road. There is a fire hydrant in front of the subject property.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

A memorandum from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Public Works and Utilities, dated September 29, 2022 stated the following:

Engineering:

Georgia Power Approval is required prior to civil plan approval.

Traffic:

Driveway must meet commercial standards. Applicant should verify that required intersection and stopping sight distances can be achieved at proposed driveway location.

Utilities:

No sewer available.

Georgia Department of Transportation

This project will not require GDOT coordination.

Hall County Tax Assessors

No comments were provided in relation to this item.

Gainesville Water and Sewer Resources

No comments were provided in relation to this item.

Per Hall County GIS, there is public water along Mountain View Road.

Georgia Power

In an e-mail dated July 14, 2022, Andrew Crews, Forestry and Right of Way Services, Georgia Power, stated:

I've discussed this with our transmission maintenance group. A set of site and grading plans will be needed to make a full evaluation. Here are some of the requirements, but not necessarily limited to,

- No permanent structures in the easement area
- Vertical clearances to the line must be maintained at all times, included during site work
- 25' feet radius around any Georgia Power structure is preferred
- Any proposed utility crossings must be locatable and marked at both ends of the easement area, and must be installed at a depth and strength to withstand heavy construction traffic
- Paving and parking should be HS20 loading, and able to withstand passage of large construction equipment and vehicles
- Trailered parking of boats is generally acceptable provided that it is no taller than 15' and immediately removable upon request by GPC – this is generally only approved as "temporary parking". No washing of boats/RVs permitted in the right-of-way
- Any proposed fill/cut will need to be evaluated. GPC will need to retain access to line at all times, for maintenance and emergency purposes

Zoning Analysis

- The proposed development is inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan. The plan suggests that this area will continue to be residential in nature. The introduction of nonresidential uses adjacent to residential uses has the potential to increase traffic to the area and cause disruption to local residents.
- The subject property is located in a residentially dominated area along the north side of Mountain View Road, and this rezoning would create a spot zoning district. Across from the subject property is a parcel that was rezoned in 2017 to an H-B zoning district. Nearby parcels within the City of Gainesville have PUD and/or industrial zoning categories.
- The proposed uses listed in the application are consistent with permitted uses under Highway Business (H-B) commercial zoning districts, which permits warehousing, subject to Planning Commission approval (§17.150.020).
- Per, §17.180.080. (Planned commercial development (PCD)), planned commercial development shall provide for the maximum attainable commercial usage of property while employing the best aspects of prior site planning and development controls to insure:
 - 1. Protection of surrounding residential uses;
 - 2. Safe access by motorists;
 - 3. Minimum traffic congestion; and

- 4. A development which is consistent with long-range plans of the county.
- §17.180.080.B (Required plans), the following special items shall also be addressed:
 - 1. The site plan shall indicate the proposed size, location and number of stories of each commercial structure.
 - The applicant's site plan shows the proposed size, location, and number of stories of each commercial structure. This standard is met.
 - 2. The entrances, exits and number and location of all parking spaces shall be shown in detail, together with all loading and no parking zones.
 - The applicant's site plan shows the proposed entrance, exit and number and location of all parking spaces. This **standard is met.**
 - 3. The proposed methods and location of all buffers shall be described.
 - The applicant's site plan shows 25 foot vegetated buffer with an opaque fence where the property is adjacent to residentially zoned parcels. However, due to the Georgia Power line easement, the buffer and proposed fencing would not be able to be placed in the power line easement. Therefore, according to the current site plan, this **standard is NOT met**.
 - 4. The proposed exterior lighting shall be shown.
 - The applicant's site plan states that exterior lighting will be provided by mounting wall packs on exterior of buildings. Lights will be placed in such a way to minimize light directed towards adjacent properties. This **standard** is met.
 - 5. All proposed signs, advertising or identification graphics shall be indicated, showing their number, size, height and location.
 - The site plan shows a proposed monument sign at the front of the development, adjacent to Mountain View Road. The site plan notes that the sign will comply with setback and other sign permit requirements.
 - 6. The type and number of uses proposed for the commercial development shall be indicated.
 - The applicant states that the proposed development is a self-storage facility.
 - 7. The development controls for the district shall be stated (lot coverage, setbacks, building heights, lot sizes, etc.). If standards are not specifically proposed, then the applicable standards in the suburban shopping district (S-S) shall apply.
 - No explicit setbacks were listed on the site plan or described in the project narrative. Per §17.240.010, the minimum setbacks for the S-S zoning district are:
- Front: 55 feet from center line of road or 30 feet from property line, whichever is greater.

Side: 20Rear: 10

- The applicant's site plan shows 20 foot side and rear setbacks and a 30 foot front setback.
- 8. If residential uses are proposed in conjunction with the planned commercial development, then the applicable requirements of the planned residential development shall be provided.
 - No residential uses are proposed.

- §17.260.020 of the Hall County Zoning Regulations requires a 10 foot wide planted buffer when retail use with no outside activity (beyond parking and loading areas) abuts residential use. Where there is outside activity, then the planted buffer is to be 20 feet wide. If the proposed zoning is approved, the subject area will require a transitional vegetated buffer as regulated by the Hall County Ordinance to help mitigate the commercial development impact on abutting residential properties.
 - 1. Substitution of all or part of a planted buffer with a solid fence may be allowed with Planning Commission approval if satisfactory overall screening of the property is achieved.
 - 2. The submitted site plan shows a 25 foot vegetated buffer where the property is adjacent to residentially zoned parcels. However, due to the Georgia Power line easement, the buffer and proposed fencing would not be able to be placed in the power line easement. Therefore, according to the current site plan, this **standard** is **NOT met**.
- §17.270.070.C of the Hall County Zoning Regulations regulates permitted signs in PCD zoning districts.
 - 1. §17.270.070.C.2 states that one monument sign is permitted with a maximum height of 10 feet height is permitted for developments with 50,000 100,000 square feet of gross floor area.
 - The applicant's site plan includes one monument sign and a statement that signage will be in accordance with county sign regulations.
- This property is not in the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD) and is not subject to the GCOD architectural standards.
- The applicant submit any architectural renderings for the proposed development.
 - o The applicant submitted renderings of the proposed building. The proposed building materials for the roof and siding is metal.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends **denial** for the following reasons:

- 1. The proposed development is inconsistent with the future land use classifications in the Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. The rezoning of this parcel would result in the creation of a "spot zone" on the north side of Mountain View Road. Currently, non-residential development is restricted to the southern portion of the road.
- 3. The proposed development presents conflicts in the existing Georgia Power easement.
- 4. The proposed development is not compatible with the adjacent, existing residential uses.

If the Commission choses to approve the application, the following conditions are recommend.

 All required buffers for the rear of the site shall be on the south side the Georgia Power easement as no fencing or planted vegetation for required for the buffers can be placed in the Georgia Power easement.

- 2. The placement and design of the buffers shall be approved by the Planning Director on a revised site plan prior to submission to Development Review.
- 3. Before a building permit is issued, the proposed architectural plans shall receive approval from the Hall County Planning Director.
- 4. Driveway design and placement are subject to approval by Hall County Traffic Engineering.
- 5. The following uses shall be prohibited: adult entertainment establishments, junk yards, and billboard signs.
- 6. Georgia Power shall approve the commercial site plan prior to the Land Disturbance Permit being issued.
- 7. No commercial parking or drive aisles shall be in the Georgia Power easement.
- 8. All exterior lighting shall be full cutoff down lights.
- 9. The development shall be in conformity with all Hall County ordinances at the time of submission for Development Review, including the Tree Protection ordinance.
- 10. The development shall be subject to the non-residential property development standards found in §17.420.050 of the Gateway Corridors Overlay District. Metal sided buildings and roofing materials are prohibited.

Excerpts from the minutes of the October 17, 2022 meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Ellis Still, Assistant Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Philip Edwards, Athens, presented the request. Mr. Edwards stated that there would be 225 to 340 units depending if there was a second story on the third building. Mr. Edwards stated the units would be 90 percent climate controlled with an architectural build of metal roof and siding. The buildings facing the road will have three to four foot high brick kind of foundation. Mr. Edwards explained that adding a 20 foot buffer from the south side of the easement it would kill the project.

Dylan Lee, 66 Lothridge Road, Cleveland, presented the request. Mr. Lee explained the site plan.

Public Forum:

There were no comments in support or opposition.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell stated that when the development is key access accessible by customers that it is best to regulate the hours of operation to divert inconveniencing neighbors. Mr. Varner questioned if any buildings would have a second floor. Mr. Lee stated that only one of the buildings would be and it would roughly be a 20 foot height building.

I've discussed this with our transmission maintenance group. A set of site and grading plans will be needed to make a full evaluation. Here are some of the requirements, but not necessarily limited to,

- No permanent structures in the easement area
- Vertical clearances to the line must be maintained at all times, included during site work
- 25' feet radius around any Georgia Power structure is preferred
- Any proposed utility crossings must be locatable and marked at both ends of the easement area, and must be installed at a depth and strength to withstand heavy construction traffic
- Paving and parking should be HS20 loading, and able to withstand passage of large construction equipment and vehicles
- Trailered parking of boats is generally acceptable provided that it is no taller than 15' and immediately
 removable upon request by GPC this is generally only approved as "temporary parking". No washing of
 boats/rvs permitted in the right-of-way
- Any proposed fill/cut will need to be evaluated. GPC will need to retain access to line at all times, for maintenance and emergency purposes

The application before you is a request for a front yard setback variance from 30 feet to 15 feet on a .61± acre lot to allow a single family dwelling.

At their October 17, 2022 meeting, the Hall County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval (5-0) of this request with the following two (2) conditions:

- 1. The Board grants a variance for lot 36 of Magnolia Station Phase 2 to vary the front yard setback from 30 feet to 22 feet in a Planned Residential Development.
- 2. In accordance with the PRD ordinance section 17.180.060.B.10: Footing inspections. Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to vary the front yard setback from 30 feet to 15 feet for the purpose of constructing a single-family residence. The property is zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD) and the 30 foot front setback standard was established by the applicant of the original rezoning application.

The applicant's Statement of Hardship states that "an error in topography created grading issues the impacted the depth of the building pad." The statement continues that maintaining a 30 foot front setback would cause the lots to be unbuildable and that the conditions were created by the previous owner.

History and Existing Land Use

The subject parcel is 0.61 acres in size and is undeveloped. The property is zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD) and is lot 36 of Magnolia Station Subdivision, Phase 2. The current owner/developer received approval for an amended Master Plan from the BOC on June 24, 2021. The PRD approvals were amend by the BOC on April 14, 2022, which set the setbacks and lot standards for Phase 2 as follows:

The plat for Magnolia Station, Phase 2 was recorded for 56 lots on June 30, 2022 in Plat Book 882, page 124-134 with the Hall County Clerk of Courts.

Surrounding properties are primarily zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD) though there are some Agricultural Residential IV (AR-IV) properties to the west. Most properties are developed with similar residential uses. To the southeast of the development is the intersection of Lula Road and Cornelia Highway/State Route 365, where there a number of commercially zoned and developed properties.

Significant Factors

Per, §2.60.060. – effective period of approved applications, all applications approved by the board, whether a request for variance from the terms of Title 17, a request for conditional use, a request for the enlargement, change or continuance of a nonconforming use or a request to appeal a decision by an administrative official in the enforcement of Title 17, shall be effective for a period of six months. If no action is taken by the applicant to implement the purpose of the application by obtaining the proper permit and/or license and proceeding with the building, occupancy or establishment of business within six months from the date of approval by the board, said approval shall become null and void.

Per Hall County GIS, the property is located approximately 1.5 miles from Hall County Fire Station #6, located at 6172 Lula Road. The nearest fire hydrant is located at the terminus of River Station Drive, approximately 200 feet away.

Staff Recommendation

- 1. The application of the setback requirements would not cause an unusual hardship. The applicant still has the option of building a residence with a smaller footprint or building vertical.
- 2. The applicant obtained this property and development before the streets and infrastructure were built and the project received Final Plat approval.
- 3. The applicant had the option to remove the stormwater pond from the proposed lot as the density could have transferred to another phase when the master plan for Magnolia Station was updated in March and April, 2022.
- 4. Staff recommended during the master plan update in 2022 for Magnolia Station that this lot should be platted without the stormwater pond on the individual lot.

Applicant's Presentation:

Ellis Still, Assistant Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Holt Persinger, **196 Villa Court**, **Winder**, presented the request. The applicant stated that detention ponds would not be allowed per phase II of the development but were approved by Hall County when they were purchased and it would be a shame to let two lots go with the cost of construction. The applicant stated that the two houses would be side entry with an area to the side of the houses for parking.

Mr. Braswell questioned the topography of the site. Mr. Hunt questioned if the homes could be vertical. - The number of dwelling units on a single fire apparatus access road shall not be increased unless fire apparatus access roads will connect with future development, as determined by the fire code official. ri
- The fire apparatus access roads cannot be installed because of location on the property, topography, waterways, nonnegotiable grades or other similar conditions, and an approved alternative means of fire protection is provided. ń

Plans shall accompany the written request that delineate improvements to proposed fire apparatus access roads approved by the fire code official of the local responding fire department. Recommended compliance alternatives for residential developments having less than the minimum of two entrances includes, but is not limited to one of more of the following alternative remedies:

- Enhanced turning radii to meet local responding fire department requirements; and/or ۲,
- Increased road widths to meet local responding fire department requirements; or
- Fire Lane signs per D103.6 in locations determined by the Fire Code Official; or ω,
- The absence of dead-end streets and cul-de-sacs; and unless the requirements meet or exceed Table D103.4 for Fire Apparatus Access Roads; or 4.
- The primary entrance roadway being a boulevard with medians and each lane meeting fire access road widths; or 'n
- Single entrance roads providing a dedicated emergency lane separating each drive lane; or ø,
- Additional fire apparatus access road which is permitted to be a roadway or approved surface not accessible to motor vehicles, designed by a registered design professional to meet the loading requirements and minimum specifications of Appendix D; and this surface provides all weather conditions capabilities for emergency fire department access; or 7
- Statement by Fire Code Official that the Plans submitted meet the requirements of Exception 3 and/or Appendix D for access by local responding fire department α.

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Title 25-2-12 (e)(4) the local fire official, building official, or developer may obtain a waiver when adequate access appropriate for the fire apparatus of the local designated representative shall respond within 30 days for the decision for approval or disapproval or recommendations for modifications to the Plan. If the 30-day time frame is not met, the responding fire department is not met or provided by using alternative methods on a waiver form designed and prescribed by the Safety Fire Commissioner. The State Fire Marshal Plans submitted shall be deemed to be approved.

Add a new section, Appendix D 107.2, as follows:

Where two fire apparatus access roads are required, they shall be placed a distance apart equal to not less than one-half of the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the property or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting to vary the front yard setback from 30 feet to 15 feet for the purpose of constructing a single-family residence. The property is zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD) and the 30 foot front setback standard was established by the applicant of the original rezoning application.

The applicant's Statement of Hardship states that "an error in topography created grading issues the impacted the depth of the building pad." The statement continues that maintaining a 30 foot front setback would cause the lots to be unbillable and that the conditions were created by the previous owner.

History and Existing Land Use

The subject parcel is 0.51 acres in size and is undeveloped. The property is zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD) and is lot 35 of Magnolia Station Subdivision, Phase 2. The current owner/developer received approval for an amended Master Plan from the BOC on June 24, 2021. The PRD approvals were amend by the BOC on April 14, 2022, which set the setbacks and lot standards for Phase 2 as follows:

The plat for Magnolia Station, Phase 2 was recorded for 56 lots on June 30, 2022 in Plat Book 882, page 124-134 with the Hall County Clerk of Courts.

Surrounding properties are primarily zoned Planned Residential Development (PRD) though there are some Agricultural Residential IV (AR-IV) properties to the west. Most properties are developed with similar residential uses. To the southeast of the development is the intersection of Lula Road and Cornelia Highway/State Route 365, where there a number of commercially zoned and developed properties.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends **denial** of the applicant's request for a variance for the following reasons:

- 1. The application of the setback requirements would not cause an unusual hardship. The applicant still has the option of building a residence with a smaller footprint or building vertical.
- 2. The applicant obtained this property and development before the streets and infrastructure were built and the project received Final Plat approval.
- 3. The applicant had the option to remove the stormwater pond from the proposed lot as the density could have transferred to another phase when the master plan for Magnolia Station was updated in March and April, 2022.
- 4. Staff recommended during the master plan update in 2022 for Magnolia Station that this lot should be platted without the stormwater pond on the individual lot.

Plans shall accompany the written request that delineate improvements to proposed fire apparatus access roads approved by the fire code official of the local responding fire department. Recommended compliance alternatives for residential developments having less than the minimum of two entrances includes, but is not limited to one of more of the following alternative remedies:

- Enhanced turning radii to meet local responding fire department requirements; and/or ۲,
- Increased road widths to meet local responding fire department requirements; or
- Fire Lane signs per D103.6 in locations determined by the Fire Code Official; or ω,
- The absence of dead-end streets and cul-de-sacs; and unless the requirements meet or exceed Table D103.4 for Fire Apparatus Access Roads; or 4.
- The primary entrance roadway being a boulevard with medians and each lane meeting fire access road widths; or 'n
- Single entrance roads providing a dedicated emergency lane separating each drive lane; or ø,
- Additional fire apparatus access road which is permitted to be a roadway or approved surface not accessible to motor vehicles, designed by a registered design professional to meet the loading requirements and minimum specifications of Appendix D; and this surface provides all weather conditions capabilities for emergency fire department access; or 7

If the 30-day time frame is not met, the responding fire department is not met or provided by using alternative methods on a waiver form designed and prescribed by the Safety Fire Commissioner. The State Fire Marshal Plans submitted shall be deemed to be approved.

 - c. All public utilities shall be installed prior to issuing a building permit for a model home. The installation of the utilities shall be certified by Hall County Public Works.
 - d. A hard surface (crusher run or equivalent) access is provided that meets all requirements of a GSWCC "Construction Road" as specified in the GSWCC manual
 - e. Fire protection shall be provided within 500 feet of any structure under construction.
 - Restroom facilities shall be provided for any structure under construction.
 - g. No model home site shall be used as a stockpile area, for storage of construction materials or as a trash site.
 - h. An as-built survey shall be required for all model home structures built or under construction prior to approval of a Final Plat in any future phase to ensure the proposed platted lines meet all ordinance requirements.
- 12. The proposed development must provide curbing, gutters, and minimum 5-foot-wide sidewalks along the full length of the subject property, both against Old Winder Highway and Union Church Road, if determined to be feasible by the Hall County Planning Director and Hall County Public Works Director.
- 13. No land disturbance permit shall be issued until the new combination plat is formally recorded with Hall County Clerk of Court.
- 14. Per §17.180.060.B.8, the development shall conform to all open space requirements of sections §17.430.100 through §17.430.150. Prior to submission of the LDP/ Preliminary Plat for review, a revised Open Space plan shall be submitted for review and approval by the Planning Director. This may include

- modification of street and lot layouts to comply with the Open Space design standards.
- 15. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plats created for the property.
- 16. Architectural standards: All facades of all residences shall be finished with masonry (brick or stone), wood, or fiber cement / Hardi-plank type siding. The front facades shall be 100% masonry as depicted on the architectural elevations submitted with the application package.
- 17. Garage doors shall not exceed 70% of front facade.
- 18. Driveways shall be at least 22 feet in length, as measured from behind the edge of the sidewalk to the garage and all driveways shall be the width of the 2 car garage product.
- 19. A minimum 50-foot planted buffer shall be established along the perimeter of the property adjacent to residential and/or non-residential zoning districts to ensure that the planned development is appropriately screened. The planted buffers shall conform to the requirements described in section 17.260.020 titled Vegetation Buffers and Vision Clearance. This shall cover the road frontage along Union Church Road.
- 20. Except for approved road connections, a 5' Non-Access Easement shall be indicated on the plat for access to Old Winder Highway and Union Church Road.
- 21. A property maintenance association is required to maintain common ownership elements of the development. Draft HOA documents shall be submitted with the LDP/ Preliminary Plat submission for review to ensure compliance with the conditions of zoning and review for any inconsistencies with County ordinances. This is required by §16.30.120 Contents of preliminary plat application.
- 22. The amenity package shall be completed before the building permits are granted for the fifth building.
- 23. There shall only be up to one construction trailer issued on site after LDP.

There was one (1) written comment in opposition submitted in advance of the Planning Commission meeting and one (1) person spoke in favor during the public hearing on October 17, 2022.

Since the Planning Commission took action, the applicant submitted an updated site plan.

Applicant Proposal

The applicant is requesting approval to rezone a ten-parcel site totaling ± 19.2 acres from Agricultural Residential IV to Planned Residential Development for the purpose of developing a 135-unit fee simple townhome development. All parcels, except three located at 5901, 5911, and 5919 Union Church Rd also currently fall in the Gateway Corridor Overlay District (GCOD). No request has been made to remove the GCOD designation at this time. The overall density of the proposed development is 7.03 units per acre. The narrative submitted by the applicant states that the creation of this development will provide quality, traditional housing with an amenity area, and up to a maximum of 37.9% open space. Per the project narrative, the community at minimum will contain a cabana with restrooms, pool, parking lot, and the United States Postal Service required mailbox kiosk. Residents will have convenient access to commercial uses proposed upon the Planned Commercial Development zoned portions of the 491-acre Reveille Development to be constructed directly across the site, off Old Winder Highway. Residents will also have convenient access to any commercial uses constructed upon the Highway-Business zoned parcel located at the intersection of Union Church Road and Howington Road. Convenient access to I-85 (Exit 126) is located 2.5 miles to the east. Buildout of the development is planned for 2024.

The subject property is comprised of ten parcels with nine different owners, and each parcel contains either a one-story residential home, modular home, and/or undeveloped lands. The concept plan shows southbound right turn lane and the entrance / exit into the community proposed off Old Winder Highway. It does not include the northbound left turn lane recommended by the submitted traffic study. No access is proposed off Union Church Road. Old Winder Highway

(SR 211) is presently a two-lane minor arterial with a posted speed limit of 55 mph. Union Church Road is a two-lane major collector with a posted speed limit of 45 mph. Also, Howington Road to the south, is a two-lane unpaved local road with no posted speed limit. None of these roads have curbing, gutters, or sidewalks. Any future access dedicated solely to the site will be subject to GDOT and Hall County approval. The proposed Reveille mixed-use project is across Old Winder Highway from the subject properties.

The townhomes will be constructed in buildings consisting of at least five but not more than eight vertically attached units. Each unit is illustrated as sitting upon its own lot (i.e., as drawn, the conceptual plan shows that home buyers will own the property beneath their unit). The units themselves will be two stories, with a maximum building height of 35 feet and offer a minimum heated square footage of 1400 SF. There will be monument style signs package that will be provided for the primary entrance to the development. The project proposal includes a 17-space parking lot next to the mail kiosk and the narrative requests the ability to use either one or two car garages. As a result of this request, the total parking spaces could be as few as 152 or as many as 287 spaces, site-wide. Driveway dimensions proposed are 14' feet wide by 20' feet deep. Units would be front loaded to allow for the construction of an 8' x 10' patios in the rear of each unit. Garage doors would not exceed 70% of the front façade. The applicant requests the right to use masonry, hardy-plank, or shake siding (unclear what materials they wish to use for the shingles) on all facades of the homes. No variance has been requested to allow relief from the PRD requirement requiring garage doors to be set behind the front door of each unit or in another approved configuration.

The proposed units would be buffered from internal public streets by 5-foot-wide sidewalks and a 2-foot sodding strip. The applicant proposes to meet open space requirements by preserving existing stream buffers on-site, by providing a planted landscape strip along Union Church Road, and by providing a 50' PRD buffer against the properties at 5532 and 5937 Old Winder Highway and abutting the subject properties. No buffer is proposed against Old Winder Highway, instead a 40' front setback is shown. The proposed stormwater facility to collect runoff during significant rain events is located against the southern portion of the property, adjacent to Union Church Road.

The following additional standards are requested in the narrative for PRD approval:

Model Homes

The narrative also is requesting that "up to two (2) buildings of model home permits be issued prior to Final Plat recording provided that hard surface (crusher run) access is provided and fire protection (functioning hydrant) is located within 500 feet of any structure under construction.

However, no certificate of occupancy permits (CO) will be issued prior to final platting."

Sales and Construction Trailers

The "applicant is requesting permission to install one sales trailer and one construction trailer with associated parking areas in locations to be determined at the time of the Final Plat approval."

Entry Monument Signage

Applicant is requesting permission for an entry monument type of sign with a natural stone base with a sign size (monument base and signage) totaling approximately 42 SF. Applicant is requesting modification to the existing zoning conditions for approval of a non-breakaway base, a minimum distance of 5' from the nose of the medial and a total sign area of 42 SF.

The entrance may include the following structural item:

- Masonry walls
- Wood or PVC fencing
- Illuminated Signage in accordance with the Hall County Sign Ordinance
- Ornamental Sculpture
- Landscaping and Irrigation

Conceptual Master Plan

The development of the community shall be controlled by the Conceptual Master Plan (the "Plan") attached as exhibit "A". The plan is considered conceptual in nature, and as such may require minor modifications during the engineering and development process. Modifications to the

locations and arrangement of lots, road, amenities, and other improvements that do not conflict with specific standards and requirements of these conditions may be made by the Developer so long as such modifications do not change the land use, increase the overall density of the project or reduce any established buffers or setbacks. Developer is requesting a variance to allow for the development of lots 39-42 and lots 70-73. Developer is requesting to develop the above referenced lots as show on the attached site plan.

History and Existing Land Uses

The subject parcels comprise approximately 19.2 acres and are zoned Agricultural Residential IV. These properties are currently developed with single family residences (modular or site built). These structures and any outbuildings would be removed prior to development. A significant portion of the properties are wooded.

The property falls within the Gateway Corridors Overlay District (GCOD) which provides supplemental design standards for non-residential property development. These standards do not apply for residential uses.

Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation

The subject property is located within the "Residential" future land use area and also falls within a "Mixed Use Corridor". Residential Areas are characterized by moderate density residential development and neighborhoods. Street networks are defined by curvilinear streets and green spaces largely provided on individual lots, but neighborhood open space and/or park amenities may also be provided. Pedestrian connectivity is moderate, where sidewalks may be internal to a neighborhoods, but may not necessarily connect to nearby parks and schools. Future development will continue to be detached single family homes at moderate density (i.e., 2 units per acre) with opportunities to vary housing sizes and types through PRD zoning classifications. Ample tree cover, greenways, and trails is desired.

The "Mixed Use Corridor" also known as the Revitalization Corridor, is intended to support the following land uses: retail, office-based employment, civic uses, and single family residential. Low impact industrial uses or higher density residential uses may be appropriate, on a case-by-case basis, only where the same is found on adjacent properties. Desirable density is low to moderate. Greenspaces should provide formal landscaping (i.e., not just passive existing buffering) and should include adequate screening between frontage uses adjacent to residential uses and where uses have outdoor displays / storages / sales (i.e., commercial against residential buffering). Transportation design should support high internal vehicular and pedestrian connections, access to management should facilitate traffic flows. There is no residential density recommendation in the Mixed Use Corridor. There is also no higher density residential on adjacent properties, so according to the Comprehensive Plan, there should not be higher density residential on this property.

The proposed townhome community exceeds the moderate density requirement for Residential Character Area (proposed 7.03 units per acre / desired 2 units per acre). The proposal is also inconsistent in that it provides an attached product, rather than the detached residences the future land use designation prefers here. Improved compliance with the Comprehensive Plan could be achieved by reducing the overall number of units proposed, using a rear loaded townhome product that better supports safe pedestrian activity internal to the site, replacing the 2-foot sod strips with min 6-foot-wide planting strips to support a neighborhood street tree canopy. Additionally, traffic Improvements should include the left turn lane required by the traffic study. Curbing, gutters, and sidewalks along the full length of Old Winder Highway, Union Church Road are advised to accommodate new residents and users that will come as area projects come online, transforming the area from its current rural character to the Comprehensive Plan's mixed use corridor vision.

Based on the "Residential" recommended density of 2 units per acre, this proposed 7.03 units per acre project is **inconsistent** with the Comprehensive Plan; **however**, **it is consistent with recent land-use approvals in the area. Reveille, is located across the street from the subject property and was approved with approved net densities ranging from 3.08 units per acre to 9.33 units per acre (POD D).**

Development Support and Constraints

Hall County Environmental Health

An email dated September 14, 2022, Emily McGahee stated "Public sewer. Any abandoned well shall be properly closed as per Water Well Standards Act. Any abandoned septic tank shall be pumped by a State certified pumper/hauler and crushed/filled."

Hall County Fire Services

In an email dated September 16, 2022, Lieutenant John Hornick, provided the following comments:

IFC Section D107, Developments of one or two family dwellings where the number of dwelling units exceeds 120 shall be provided with two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads, see attachment.

IFC Section 507, All buildings must be with in the 400' hose lay distance requirements from a fire hydrant as the truck travels.

Complete set of engineered civil plans will have to submitted for review and approval by the Hall County Fire Marshal's Office.

Per Hall County GIS, the subject parcel is located approximately 5 mile from Hall County Fire Station #12, located at 4890 Winder Highway. The nearest fire hydrants border the subject property at 5556 Old Winder Highway and 5901 Union Church Road.

Hall County Public Works and Utilities

In a memo dated September 16, 2022, from Srikanth Yamala, Director of Public Works and Utilities, the following comments were provided:

Engineering:

The site may require a stormwater management report, should the site plan indicate the proposed development meets stormwater thresholds for impervious surfaces and/or disturbed acreage.

Show buffer and impervious setback from wrested vegetation, not centerline of creek. Show flood Hall County studied and FEMA. Roads must meet all Hall County Standards; Stormwater ponds must be out of the flood zone; development is not allowed in flood.

Traffic:

Development access must be approved and permitted through GDOT. Improvements recommended in the traffic study should be required.

Utilities:

No Sewer in the area of project; requires a Hall County Sewer Availability Letter and Application approval

Hall County Tax Assessors No

comments were provided.

Gainesville Water Resources

A letter dated June 6, 2022 from Nick Swafford, Permitting Services Manager, stated the following:

"The purpose of this letter is to confirm the availability of water service to the above referenced properties.

The City of Gainesville owns and operates an existing 12-inch DIP water main in the right-of-way of Old Winder Highway (SR 211), as well as an 8-inch DIP water main in the right-of-way of Union Church Road adjacent to the subject properties. Currently, the City has adequate domestic water capacity to serve your proposed residential development.

This confirmation of water availability is good for one year from the date of this letter at which time, it will become null and void unless engineered plans have been submitted for issuance of a development permit."

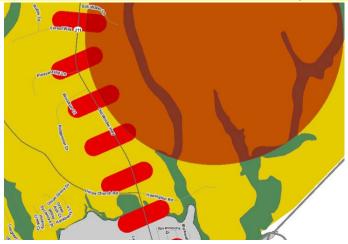
Georgia Department of Transportation

Per an email dated September 19, 2022, Parker Niebauer, Traffic Operations Supervisor confirmed that this project will require GDOT coordination.

Zoning Analysis

a. The applicant is requesting to rezone the property from Agricultural Residential IV to Planned Residential Development (PRD). The proposed use of a 135-unit townhome development is partially inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan, as the proposed density exceed the density standard within the "Residential" land use designation and desired building type.

Within the residential character area, the maximum density is recommended to be 2 units per acre with access to public water. Reveille is located across the street from the subject property and was approved with approved net densities ranging from 3.08 units per acre to 9.33 units per acre (POD D). It should be noted that a large portion, not all, of Reveille is identified as an activity center on the Future Land Use Map.



- b. Per §17.180.060, a PRD allows for more flexibility in the design and development of the property. This provides for a mixture of housing types and encourages maximum use of natural features, through proper site planning measures.
- c. Per §17.180.060.B.1. Required items, requires that the application include a development schedule, a listing of proposed uses, and the size, location and number of units of all residential structures. The proposed schedule is built out by 2024. The proposed uses are single family residential attached. The minimum size of each unit is 1400 SF heated. The location of the units are as depicted on the conceptual site plan. The number of residential units proposed is 135 units.
- d. Per §17.180.060.B.4. Lot areas for developments where there is no sanitary sewer available shall be set by the <u>County Health Department</u>. This requirement currently applies to the subject site, as Public Works has confirmed no sewer service presently exists. The property must connect to sewer. This will require approval of sewer extension plans by County Engineer prior to issuance of a land disturbance permit (LDP).
 - The applicant refers to the units as townhouses, the definition of a townhouse (<u>17.20.1230</u>) infers that townhouses are multi-family and not single-family attached as shown on the submitted site plan. See the definitions of multi-family in <u>17.20.890</u>, and <u>17.20.160</u>, and single-family in <u>17.20.900</u>, and <u>17.20.1051</u>. It should be noted that there is no definition

or standard in the Hall County regulations for <u>single-family attached</u> or <u>zero lot-line</u> <u>units.</u> Law Insider (https://www.lawinsider.com/dictionary) defines single-family attached as "any building containing two or more living units attached but each living unit located on a separate parcel of land." This definition represents the current application.

- e. Per §17.180.060.B.5, a minimum 50 foot planted buffer shall be established along the perimeter of all property boundaries adjacent to residential and/or non-residential zoning districts to ensure that the planned residential development is appropriately screened.
 - Per the applicant's narrative and site plan, a 50 foot buffer exterior buffer is proposed.
 This standard is met.
- f. Per §17.180.060.B.6, a minimum of two trees per lot shall be provided or preserved in the front, side, or rear yard of each lot.
 - No landscape plan was included with this request. The applicant will be held to the standards of the PRD requirements as well as §17.280.080 (tree requirements for non-single-family residential development).
- g. Per §17.180.060.B.7.a, residential developments with greater than 150 lots shall include at least two vehicular entrances connecting to a city, state, or county-maintained public road.
 - This standard does not currently apply to the applicant because they request 135 units only; however, the 2018 International Fire Code as adopted and amended by the Georgia Department of Community affairs requires 2 entrances for any residential development containing more than 120 units.
- h. Per §17.180.060.B.7.b. all planned residential developments shall construct sidewalks on both sides of the streets that are a minimum of five feet wide.
 - The applicant's narrative and site plan specify 5 foot sidewalks for the development.
 This standard is met.
- Per §17.180.060.B.8, the development shall conform to all open space requirements of sections §17.430.100 through §17.430.150, as shown under the conservation subdivision design option chapter. The only open space requirement that may differ from those standards set forth in section §17.430.110 is the open space shall comprise at least 30 percent of the gross tract area. The open space requirements include: At least 75 percent of the open space shall be in a contiguous tract. The open space should adjoin any neighboring areas of open space, other protected areas, and non-protected natural areas that would be candidates for inclusion as part of a future area of protected open space. The open space shall be directly accessible to the largest practicable number of lots within the subdivision. Non-adjoining lots shall be provided with safe, convenient access to the open space.
 - The applicant does not meet this standard. Open space provided is around the perimeter not at the center of the tract, where most units may access it.
 - Per §17.430.120, permitted uses of open space, the following uses are permitted: conservation of natural, archeological or historical resources; meadows, woodlands, wetlands, wildlife corridors, game preserves, or similar conservation oriented areas; walking or bicycle trails, provided they are constructed of porous paving materials; passive recreation areas; active recreation areas, provided that they are limited to no more than ten percent of the total open space and are not

located within primary conservation areas; agriculture, horticulture, silviculture or pasture uses; nonstructural stormwater management practices; easements for drainage, access, and underground utility lines; golf courses; or other conservation-oriented uses compatible with the purposes of this chapter.

- The applicant's site plan indicates 7.8 acres of open space provided.
 This provides 40% open space, standard is met.
- Per §17.180.060.B.9, provides design guidelines and standards for planned residential developments.
 - All facades of all residences shall be finished with brick, stone, stucco, wood siding, wood shakes, or fiber cement type siding. The front facades shall incorporate changes in building material, texture, and/or color. Vinyl siding on all residential and non-residential buildings shall be prohibited.
 - The applicant has listed masonry, Hardi-planks, and shakes as their requested siding materials. If made of wood or fiber cement, the shakes will comply with the standards.
 - Architectural renderings were submitted as part of this request but only for the property frontage. These were filed as a sample architectural elevation, not the actual proposed product. It cannot be determined if this standard is met until the building permit review stage.
 - Clarification required from BOC as to whether they are ok allowing vinyl siding for the garage door or if prohibition applies for this.
 - Townhomes Garage designs may be front, or rear loaded. If front loaded, garage doors should not exceed 50% of the width of the individual townhome unit. Applicant currently proposes 70% garage door with. This does not meet the standard.
 - Townhome Garages must be at least 20 feet behind the back of the sidewalk. The applicant meets this standard.
- Per §17.180.060.B.11, all new subdivisions are required to provide a cluster mailbox unit (CBU) for regular mail service delivery.

 A cluster mailbox is required to sit at least 200 feet from the main entrance and at least 60 feet from any intersection. It cannot be determined if the current mailbox location meets this standard.
 - Parking required for mailboxes is at least 7 spaces. The conceptual site plan meets this standard. Provides at least 17 spaces, including ADA spots.
- Per §17.250 (off-street parking, storage, and loading requirements), 1.5 parking spaces per unit are required for multi-family developments.
 - To comply applicant must provide at least 203 parking spaces. It cannot be determined if applicant meets this requirement until we know which units will be one car garages and which may be for two.
- Per §17.380.050 of the Official Code of Hall County requires any application proposing the development of 100 or more residential dwelling units to submit a traffic impact study as part of an application.
 - A traffic study was prepared by Southeastern Engineering on September 09, 2022.
 Traffic impacts were evaluated for the proposed residential development located in

Hall County. On approximately 19 acres of undeveloped land located on SR 211/ Old Winder Highway. The development will consist of 140 units of townhomes. • The development proposes access at the following locations:

- Site Driveway 1: Full-access driveway on Old Winder Highway.
 - Existing and future operations after completion of the project were analyzed at the intersections of:
- SR 211/Old Winder Highway at Atlas Drive (new community access)
- SR 211/Old Winder Highway at Union Church Rd / Howington Road The analysis included the evaluation of future traffic operations for "NoBuild" and "Build" conditions, the differences between "No-Build" and

"Build" accounts for increases in traffic due to proposed site. The result of the future traffic operations analysis are that the new Atlas Drive operates at an acceptable level of service during both peak periods; but, that the existing intersection at Union Church Road continues to operate unacceptably in peak hours as it did under the existing and no-build conditions. As there is already an intersection improvement plan in progress for the Union Church Rd / Howington Road intersection, due to an active development on the east side of the intersection, no improvements were considered for the Union Church Rd / Howington Road area. The following access configuration is recommended:

SR 211 at Atlas Drive

- Atlas Drive approach should be stop sign controlled.
- Atlas Drive should be two lanes, one entry and one exit lane.
- SR 211 should have a south bound right-turn lane, and a northbound left-turn lane designed to GDOT minimum standards.
- The applicant's narrative indicates that water service will be provided by the City of Gainesville. The municipality has confirmed water service is available. Hall County Public Works however, stated there is no current sewer service available to the site. Applicant needs to resolve sewer service / develop a plan with Hall County Public Works that satisfies this requirement. No plan for land disturbance will be accepted without a solution to this issue.

Variances Requested within the Narrative

- Allow the developer to modify the arrangement of lots, roads, amenities, and other improvements shown on the Conceptual Plan. The only thing the developer may not change is the proposed land use (i.e., townhomes), the proposed project density (i.e., 135 units), or proposed perimeter buffers (i.e., 50-foot setbacks / planted buffers shown on the Conceptual Plan).
- Allow the applicant to provide only one access rather than two required by the Fire Code. (IFC Section D107). The Planning Commission cannot grant a variance to the Fire

Code. The applicant will have to lower the number of lots, or meet one the exceptions. Exceptions must be approved by the Fire Marshal.

- 3. Allow garage doors to constitute 70 percent of the width of the individual townhome unit. (17.180.060.B.9.c.ii)
- 4. Allow the option to use one car garages to meet the 1.5 parking space per unit parking minimum. (17.240.020A).
- 5. Waive the requirement of at least two trees per lot in the front, side, or rear setbacks, outside of easements or septic drain fields, which are currently required prior to Certificate of Occupancy. (17.180.060.B.6)
- Allow the use of stream buffers and detention ponds to count towards the minimum 30% open space requirement. (17.180.060.B8)
- 7. Allow the use of Temporary Sales and Marketing Signs along the property frontage of Union Church Road. These signs shall not exceed 32 square feet per sign face or 8 feet in height.

 (Section 17.420.060 / Chapter 17.270)
- 8. Allow the use of illuminated signage at the community entrance. (Section 17.420.060. / Chapter 17.270)
- 9. Allow the installation of a monument sign at the community entrance. The monument sign will have a natural stone base, maximum total size of 42 square feet (includes the monument base and signage), and be placed a minimum distance of 5 feet from the nose of the median. (Section 17.420.060 / Chapter 17.270)
- 10. Allow the release of up to two model home permits to be issued prior to Final Plat, providing that hard surface (crusher run) access is provided, and fire protection is located within 500 feet of any structure under construction.
- 11. Allow the installation of one sales trailer and construction trailer with associated parking areas in locations to be determined at time of final plat approval.
- 12. Allow the use of ornamental sculptures at the community entrance.
- 13. Allow the use of PVC fencing.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval with conditions:

- All streets shall be built to Hall County Public Streets standards as indicated on the site plan dated 7-12-2022. No Variances to Public Street design standards in Articles 16, Subdivisions, and the parking requirements in Article 17. No on street parking shall be allowed.
- 2. The maximum residential density for the development shall not exceed 6.25 units per acre or 120 single family attached units, whichever is less, to comply with International Fire Code (IFC) standards for residential developments with one entrance.
- 3. Front setbacks for each townhome unit shall be a minimum of 22 feet from back of sidewalk; 0 feet side internal setback; minimum 10 foot building separation (unless greater spacing is required by the Building or Fire code); and 30 foot rear setbacks. The setbacks for each building shall be determined and approved on the Preliminary Plat.

- 5. The development shall meet all required Fire Codes (IFC) including, but not limited to the follow:
 - a. IFC Section D107, Developments of one or two family dwellings where the number of dwelling units exceeds 120 shall be provided with two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads. Note: exceptions to this code are found in IFC Appendix D

Board Action required on Requested Variances:

The only thing the developer may not change is the proposed land use (i.e., townhomes), the proposed project density (i.e., 135 units), or proposed perimeter buffers (i.e., 50-foot setbacks / planted buffers shown on the Conceptual Plan). Staff does not support this variance as this would be contrary to the stated purpose and intent of the PRD ordinance that the Board of Commissioners reviews and approves the conceptual site plans. If modifications to a conceptual site plan for a PRD is requested, the Board of Commissioners should have the right to review the changes.
- Allow the applicant to provide only one access rather than two required by the Fire Code. (IFC Section D107). The Board of Commissioners cannot vary the adopted Fire Code with a zoning action, as the zoning ordinance does not contain the fire code. Additional Board action would be required for this variance to be allowed.
- 3. Allow garage doors to constitute 70 percent of the width of the individual townhome unit. (17.180.060.B.9.c.ii) Staff **does not support** this request, this is not within the design guidelines of the PRD ordinance. This is addressed in staff recommendation #5, Development Standards table.

 - (17. 240.020A). Staff **supports** this request if driveways are at least 22 feet in length, as measured from behind the edge of the sidewalk to the garage.

(17.180.060.B8) Staff does not support this request as this action would decrease the amount of usable open space to the detriment of water quality and the quality of life of future residents.

Excerpts from the minutes of the October 17, 2022 meeting

Applicant's Presentation:

Ellis Still, Assistant Planning Director, presented a summary of the request.

Steve Gilliam, 340 Jesse Jewell, Gainesville, presented the request. Mr. Gilliam stated that there will be amenities at the development such as a cabana with restrooms, pool, parking lot, and a USPS kiosk. Mr. Gilliam stated that the minimum lot size would be 1600 square foot with a minimum of 1400 square foot heated floor area. Mr. Gilliam stated that some changes were made to the site plan including eleven more parking spaces, entrance to the common area, and a fire entrance from Union Church Road. Mr. Gilliam requested a variance for a 20 foot internal rear setback rather that 30 foot, garage front facade to be 70 percent rather than 50 percent, remove the conditions that no land disturbance permit shall be issued until the new combination plat is formally recorded with Hall County Clerk of Court, allow stream buffer space to be a part of open space, and to use PVC fencing rather than wood. Mr. Gilliam requested clarification of staff recommended conditions.

Cameron Henderson, 14 W Main Street, Buford, presented the request. Mr. Henderson requested clarification on staff condition #14. Mr. Henderson questioned if the easement needs to be placed in or outside the development.

Public Forum:

Terry Mercer, **400 Kinsley Way**, **Statham**, **GA**, spoke in favor. Spoke about the property owners' enthusiasm.

Planning Commission Comments:

Mr. Braswell questioned what the amenity package included. Mr. Henderson stated that the package would mainly cater to active adults. The amenity package would include a cabana, Dog Park, and picnic benches. Mr. Braswell questioned why 20 feet setback is requested rather than 30 feet. Mr. Henderson answered that it is to have flexibility. Mr. Hunt questioned if the applicant had a commitment letter of sewer availability. Mr. Henderson stated it is still in the works due to adjacent developments. Mr. Bell questioned the mix of one to two cars garages. Mr. Bell stated that a one car garage is better for the front view of the homes with a wider driveway to allow more cars since street parking is not allowed. Mr. Varner stated that with no commitment to sewer it was difficult to proceed. Mr. Bell requested clarification from Ms. Doveton regarding staff recommendations. There was much discussion about the fire access road to Union Church Road, the landscaping of the detention pond and maintenance of said landscaping, The Planning

Commission stated that it would be advisable to present the revised site plan and a timeline/plan for sewer service prior to the Board of Commission voting meeting on November 17th.

- e. Fire protection shall be provided within 500 feet of any structure under construction.
- f. Restroom facilities shall be provided for any structure under construction.
- g. No model home site shall be used as a stockpile area, for storage of construction materials or as a trash site.
- h. An as-built survey shall be required for all model home structures built or under construction prior to approval of a Final Plat in any future phase to ensure the proposed platted lines meet all ordinance requirements.
- 12. The proposed development must provide curbing, gutters, and minimum 5-foot-wide sidewalks along the full length of the subject property, both against Old Winder Highway and Union Church Road, if determined to be feasible by the Hall County Planning Director and Hall County Public Works Director.
- 13. No land disturbance permit shall be issued until the new combination plat is formally recorded with Hall County Clerk of Court.
- 14. Per §17.180.060.B.8, the development shall conform to all open space requirements of sections §17.430.100 through §17.430.150. Prior to submission of the LDP/ Preliminary Plat for review, a revised Open Space plan shall be submitted for review and approval by the Planning Director. This may include modification of street and lot layouts to comply with the Open Space design standards.
- 15. All conditions of zoning shall be made part of any plats created for the property.
- 16. Architectural standards: All facades of all residences shall be finished with masonry (brick or stone), wood, or fiber cement / Hardi-plank type siding. The front facades shall be 100% masonry as depicted on the architectural elevations submitted with the application package.
- 17. Garage doors shall not exceed 70% of front facade.
- 18. Driveways shall be at least 22 feet in length, as measured from behind the edge of the sidewalk to the garage and all driveways shall be the width of the 2 car garage product.
- 19. A minimum 50-foot planted buffer shall be established along the perimeter of the property adjacent to residential and/or non-residential zoning districts to ensure that the planned development is appropriately screened. The planted buffers shall conform to the requirements described in section 17.260.020 titled Vegetation Buffers and Vision Clearance. This shall cover the road frontage along Union Church Road.
- 20. Except for approved road connections, a 5' Non-Access Easement shall be indicated on the plat for access to Old Winder Highway and Union Church Road.
- 21. A property maintenance association is required to maintain common ownership elements of the development. Draft HOA documents shall be submitted with the LDP/ Preliminary Plat submission for review to ensure compliance with the conditions of zoning and review for any inconsistencies with County ordinances. This is required by §16.30.120 Contents of preliminary plat application.
- 22. The amenity package shall be completed before the building permits are granted for the fifth building.
- 23. There shall only be up to one construction trailer issued on site after LDP.

APPLICANT – Atlas Development Services, Inc., Smith Gilliam Williams & Miles

Summary

The accompanying application seeks zoning district change from R-I and AR-III to PRD for 19.2 acres of undeveloped property located on Union Church Road and Winder Highway in south Hall County. The intent is to develop up to 135 Fee Simple Townhouse units of quality, traditional housing with an amenity area and 37.9% open space. The proposed use is consistent with the Hall County Comprehensive Plan for "residential" use and appropriate for Hall County's Planned Residential Development (PRD) District for this location. Additionally, the above-mentioned area is slated for a "Mixed Use Corridor" in the Future Development Map, which is defined as Retail activities, office-based employment, civic uses, single-family residential, with a low-impact industrial or higher density residential only where the same is found on adjacent properties. Completion of development is anticipated by 2024.

Site Description

The overall tract has approximately 630 LF of frontage along Union Church Road and 900 LF along Winder Highway. The overall tract is mostly rectangular in shape and is approximately 800 LF deep with an average width of 1200 LF. These measurements form one large tract that is an assemblage of 10 (ten) smaller tracts combined. The overall tract contains multiple single-family homes and multiple modular homes which is consistent with its current residential and agricultural uses.

Applicant is requesting permission for an entry monument type of sign with a natural stone base with a sign size (monument base and signage) totaling approximately 42 SF. Applicant is requesting a modification to the existing zoning conditions for approval of a non-breakaway base, a minimum distance of 5' from the nose of the median and a total sign area of 42 SF.

The entrance may include the following structural items:

- Masonry walls
- Wood or PVC fencing
- Illuminated Signage in accordance with the Hall County Sign Ordinance
- Ornamental Sculpture
- Landscaping and Irrigation

Conceptual Master Plan

The development of the community shall be controlled by the Conceptual Master Plan (the "Plan") attached as exhibit "A". The plan is considered conceptual in nature, and as such may require minor modifications during the engineering and development process. Modifications to the locations and arrangement of lots, roads, amenities, and other improvements that do not conflict with specific standards and requirements of these conditions may be made by the Developer so long as such modifications do not change the land use, increase the overall density of the project or reduce any established exterior buffers or setbacks. Developer is requesting a variance to allow for the development of lots 39-42 and lots 70-73. Developer is requesting to develop the above referenced lots as shown on the attached site plan.

REQUIRED CONSTITUTIONAL AND ANTE LITEM NOTICE

Georgia law and the procedures of Hall County requires the Applicant to raise Federal and State constitutional objections during the PRD master plan application process. While the Applicant anticipates a smooth application process, failure to raise constitutional objections at this stage may mean that the Applicant will be barred from raising important legal claims later in the process. Accordingly, the following constitutional objections are stated:

The portions of the Hall County Development Code, facially and as applied to the Property, which restrict the Property to any uses, conditions, land use designations, development standards, or to any zoning district other than that proposed by the Applicant are unconstitutional in that they would destroy the Applicant's property rights without first paying fair, adequate and just compensation for such rights, in violation of Article I, Section I, Paragraph I and Section III, Paragraph I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia of 1983, and the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

The application of the Hall County Development Code, facially and as applied to the Property, which restricts the Property to any uses, conditions, land use designations, development standards, or to any zoning district other than in accordance with the application as proposed by the Applicant is unconstitutional, illegal, null and void, constituting a taking of Applicant's Property in violation of the Just Compensation Clause of the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; Article I, Section I, Paragraph I, and Section III, Paragraph I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia of 1983; and the Equal Protection and Due Process Clauses of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States denying the Applicant an economically viable use of its land while not substantially advancing legitimate state interests.

A denial of this Application would be unconstitutional under the Takings Clause of the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States and the Just Compensation Clause of Article I, Section III, Paragraph I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia of 1983. A refusal by the Hall County Board of Commissioners to approve the zoning conditions as requested would constitute a taking of the Applicant's property.

A denial of this Application would constitute an arbitrary and capricious act by the Hall County Board of Commissioners without any rational basis therefore constituting an abuse of discretion in violation of Article I, Section I, Paragraph I and Section III, Paragraph I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia of 1983, and the Due Process Clause of the FourteenthAmendment to the Constitution of the United States. A refusal to grant the PRD zoning request would lack objective justification and would result only from neighborhood opposition, which would constitute an unlawful delegation of the zoning power to non-legislative bodies in violation of the Georgia Constitution, Article IX, Section II, Paragraph 4.

A refusal by the Hall County Board of Commissioners to approve this Application for the Property in accordance with the criteria as requested by the Applicant would be unconstitutional and discriminate in an arbitrary,

capricious and unreasonable manner between the Applicant and owners of the similarly situated property in violation of Article I, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution of the State of Georgia of 1983 and the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States. Any rezoning of the Property subject to conditions which are different from the conditions requested by the Applicant, to the extent such different conditions would have the effect of further restricting Applicant's utilization of the Property, would also constitute an arbitrary, capricious and discriminatory act in zoning the Property to a unconstitutional classification and would likewise violate each of the provisions of the State and Federal Constitutions set forth hereinabove.

- Masonry walls
- Wood or PVC fencing
- Gate House

- Operable or Faux Gates
- Illuminated Signage in accordance with the Hall County Sign Ordinance
- Ornamental Sculpture
- Landscaping & Irrigation

Amenities

The community amenities will vary depending on the housing option executed but at a minimum will contain the following items:

- Cabana with restrooms
- Pool
- Parking Lot
- Mailbox kiosk

Other amenities, at the sole discretion of the Developer, may include the following items:

- Walking Trails
- Passive Pocket Parks

Signage

The Developer and/or Builder shall be allowed to post permanent directional signs and monuments within the Community to direct traffic to sales and recreation centers and to identify differing residential areas. All permanent internal signage must be outside of any Right of Way or Utility Easement with a Landscape and Signage easement recorded on the Final Plat.

Temporary Sales and Marketing signs not exceeding 32 square feet per sign face and 8 feet in height may be used along property frontage of Union Church Road.

Model Home Permits

Applicant requests that up to ten (10) model home permits be issued prior to Final Plat recording provided that hard surface (crusher run) access is provided and fire protection (functioning hydrant) is located within 500 feet of any structure under construction. However, no certificate of occupancy permits (CO) will be issued prior to final plat recording.

Sales and Construction Trailers

Applicant is requesting permission to install one sales trailer and one construction trailer with associated parking areas in locations to be determined at the time of final plat approval.

Entry Monument Signage

Applicant is requesting permission for an entry monument type of sign with a natural stone base with a sign size (monument base and signage) totaling approximately 42 SF. Applicant is requesting a modification to the existing zoning conditions for approval of a non-breakaway base, a minimum distance of 5' from the nose of the median and a total sign area of 42 SF.

Conceptual Master Plan

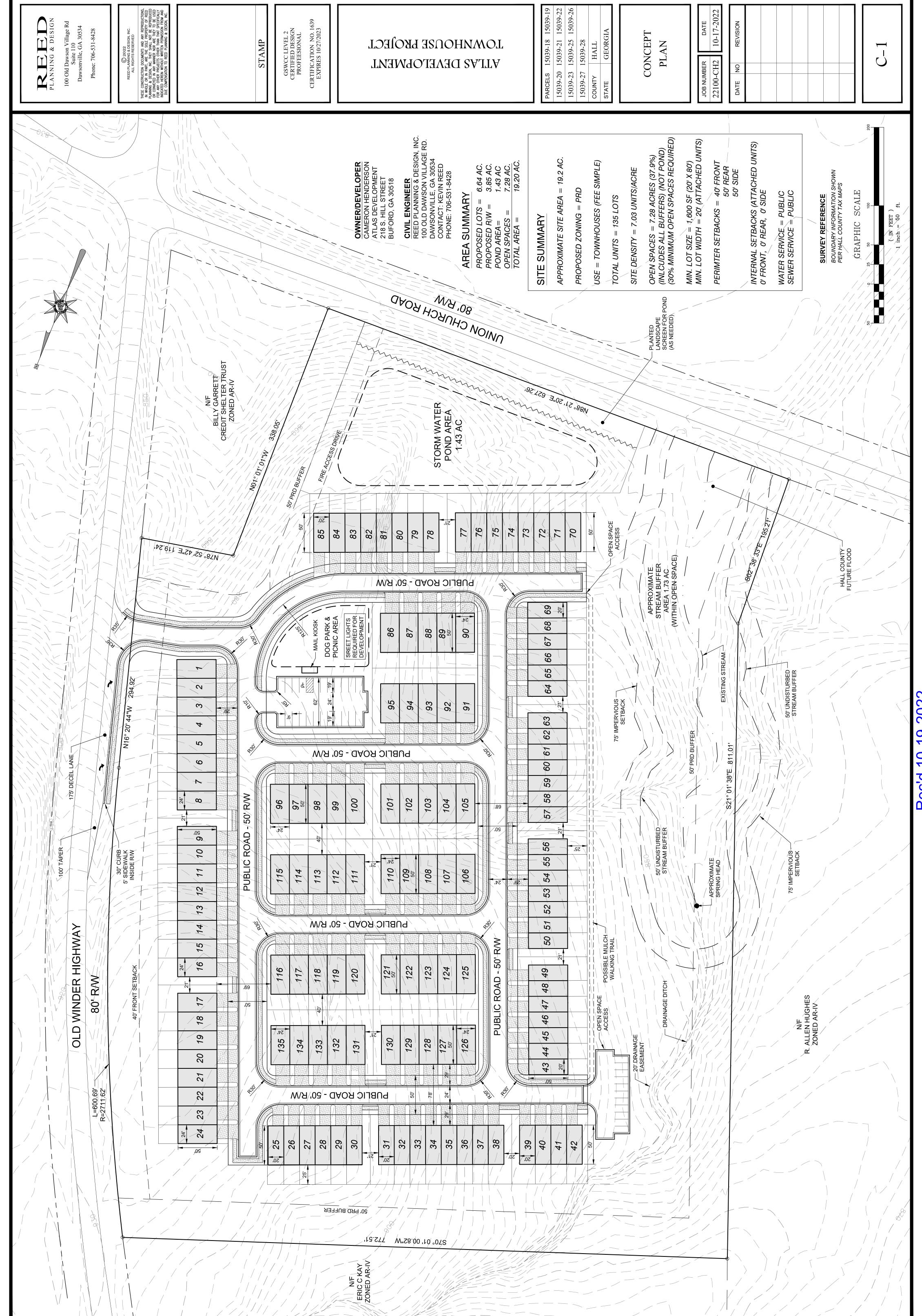
The development of the community shall be controlled by the Conceptual Master Plan (the "Plan") attached as exhibit "A". The plan is considered conceptual in nature, and as such may require minor modifications during the engineering and development process. Modifications to the locations and arrangement of lots, roads, amenities, and other improvements that do not conflict with specific standards and requirements of these conditions may be made by the Developer, so long as such modifications do not change the land use, increase the overall density of the project or reduce any established exterior buffers or setbacks.

D105.2 Width. Aerial fire apparatus access roads shall have a minimum unobstructed width of 26 feet (7925 mm), exclusive of shoulders, in the immediate vicinity of the building or portion thereof.

D105.3 Proximity to building. One or more of the required access routes meeting this condition shall be located not less than 15 feet (4572 mm) and not greater than 30 feet (9144) mm) from the building, and shall be positioned parallel to one entire side of the building. The side of the building on which the aerial fire apparatus access road is positioned shall be approved by the fire code official.

D105.4 Obstructions. Overhead utility and power lines shall not be located over the aerial fire apparatus access road or between the aerial fire apparatus road and the building. Other obstructions shall be permitted to be placed with the approval

SECTION D106 MULTIPLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS

D106.1 Projects having more than 100 dwelling units. Multiple-family residential projects having more than 100 dwelling units shall be equipped throughout with two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads.

Exception: Projects having up to 200 dwelling units shall have not fewer than one approved fire apparatus access road where all buildings, including nonresidential occupancies, are equipped throughout with approved automatic sprinkler systems installed in accordance with Section 903.3.1.1 or 903.3.1.2.

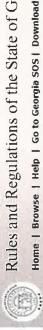

CHAP. 5

Route: GA R&R * Department 120 * Chapter 120-3 * Subject 120-3-3

Add a new section, Appendix D 107.1, as follows:

Developments of one- or two-family dwellings where the number of dwelling units exceeds 120 shall be provided with two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads.

Exceptions:

- 1. Where there are more than 120 dwelling units on a single public or private fire apparatus access road and all dwelling units are equipped throughout with an approved automatic sprinkler system in accordance with Section 903.3.1.1, 903.3.1.2 or 903.3.1.3, access from two directions shall not be required.
- The number of dwelling units on a single fire apparatus access road shall not be increased unless fire apparatus access roads will connect with future development, as determined by the fire code official. ri
- The fire apparatus access roads cannot be installed because of location on the property, topography, waterways, nonnegotiable grades or other similar conditions, and an approved alternative means of fire protection is provided. ń

Plans shall accompany the written request that delineate improvements to proposed fire apparatus access roads approved by the fire code official of the local responding fire department. Recommended compliance alternatives for residential developments having less than the minimum of two entrances includes, but is not limited to one of more of the following alternative remedies:

- Enhanced turning radii to meet local responding fire department requirements; and/or ۲,
- Increased road widths to meet local responding fire department requirements; or
- Fire Lane signs per D103.6 in locations determined by the Fire Code Official; or ω,
- The absence of dead-end streets and cul-de-sacs; and unless the requirements meet or exceed Table D103.4 for Fire Apparatus Access Roads; or 4.
- The primary entrance roadway being a boulevard with medians and each lane meeting fire access road widths; or 'n
- Single entrance roads providing a dedicated emergency lane separating each drive lane; or ø,
- Additional fire apparatus access road which is permitted to be a roadway or approved surface not accessible to motor vehicles, designed by a registered design professional to meet the loading requirements and minimum specifications of Appendix D; and this surface provides all weather conditions capabilities for emergency fire department access; or 7
- Statement by Fire Code Official that the Plans submitted meet the requirements of Exception 3 and/or Appendix D for access by local responding fire department α.

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Title 25-2-12 (e)(4) the local fire official, building official, or developer may obtain a waiver when adequate access appropriate for the fire apparatus of the local designated representative shall respond within 30 days for the decision for approval or disapproval or recommendations for modifications to the Plan. If the 30-day time frame is not met, the responding fire department is not met or provided by using alternative methods on a waiver form designed and prescribed by the Safety Fire Commissioner. The State Fire Marshal Plans submitted shall be deemed to be approved.

Add a new section, Appendix D 107.2, as follows:

Where two fire apparatus access roads are required, they shall be placed a distance apart equal to not less than one-half of the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the property or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses. To Hall County Board of Commissioners and Planning Commission Members:

RE: Atlas Development Services request to rezone 19.21 Acre tract to PRD - Single Family Townhomes

Our names are Teresa and Allen Hughes and we own 63 acres surrounding and adjacent to a 19.21 Acre tract the owners of which have applied for rezoning.

We have spent the last 9 years building our dream home and the home in which we plan to retire. We have spent a considerable part of our retirement funds toward the purchase and building of our property. While we do not expect to have a great deal of ability to stop or control others' property matters, we do strongly feel that you should put heavy requirements on limiting the number of homes and more importantly, vehicles, that will be using the roads.

Our requests for requirements would be at a minimum:

- 1. Access points to the proposed development should be limited to Highway 211 (Old Winder Hwy) only and not involve access to or from Union Church Road. Union Church Road is becoming increasingly more dangerous with the volume of traffic from recent and continuous development of single family detached subdivisions along its corridor. With the build-up of traffic along Union Church Road, access to Union Church Road from the proposed development would be nearly impossible due to the proximity of the intersection with Highway 211. Furthermore, any entrances to and from the proposed development should be installed along Highway 211 as far north as possible to avoid increased congestion and incidence risks associated with the Union Church Road - Highway 211 intersection. The volume of traffic from 135 units entering onto 211 from the development and entering the development is too close to the Union Church intersection from the current proposed access point. The grade of 211 coming from the north also adds another hazard for cars entering onto 211 from the proposed development. There will be a definite need for a turn lane on 211 and a possible red light at Union Church to prevent accidents that will surely increase with the increase of volume. With no red light there will be back ups on Union Church Rd with cars trying to turn left and right onto 211. The will be increased traffic from Deaton Creek and Union Grove Subdivisions, which are currently in development. The impacts on traffic from these developments will not be known until they are built out, but it will be an increasing problem as more and more houses are sold. It is impossible to determine at this time the true impacts of the proposed development on local traffic until Deaton Creek and Union Grove close out. Additionally, the previously approved new development on the Northeast 700 acres of the intersection will bring substantial new traffic to the area.
- The installation of a substantial privacy screen constructed/planted along the length of our property line as well as the northern property line of the proposed development to provide visual privacy and protection from the additional noise that will be generated by the proposed development.
- 3. All current storm water and additional storm water created by the project must be directed into storm sewers. There is substantial storm runoff already draining onto our property creating muddy flows throughout the year. The storm water that will be created by the impervious surfaces within the proposed development will create additional runoff that the current watershed patterns will not be able to handle, thus creating a risk of property damage to downstream structures. Impervious structures should be kept to a minimum, parking should be restricted to the driveways and garages of each unit in order to eliminate the need for parking lots which will create additional runoff.

- 4. Strict conditions regarding the density of the proposed development should be imposed. The propensity of single-family townhomes to become rental units increases the risk of multiple families or multiple adults occupying a single unit. This raises the risks of increased traffic and a general overload of the local infrastructure. At the very least, rental controls should be implemented to avoid the townhomes becoming apartment-like in density.
- 5. Using the density of the Reveille project as a gauge is inappropriate. Putting a small segment of a high density section inside a 500 acre development is substantially different in the effect on traffic. 135 homes directly on 211 causes measurably different direct traffic problems. The traffic on 211 can be backed up for a mile from the red light at Friendship road at any time of day. It makes little sense to add the new 135 homes to the 1500 across at Reveille to an overburdened intersection without first making the intersection upgrades to handle it.
- 6. Traffic currently coming from both directions is constantly causing crashes and numerous near misses. I have to turn left at Union Church/211 to go north on 211 several times a day. It is a dangerous act many of those times. People pass the left turning northbound traffic on 211 with no regard for the interesting and its dangers. Southbound traffic approaches the coming downhill at much higher rates of speed than is safe in current conditions. People are passing at full speed on 211 and I have personally witnessed dozens of near misses in the past few years. During bad weather it is a scary situation, heavy rain and icy conditions are a death trap.
- 7. All structures within the proposed development should consists of brick or stone exteriors to insure long term upkeep and quality of construction.
- 8. All structures should be no more than two stories above grade with a maximum height of 25' above grade.
- 9. Developers should be required to design the proposed development so as to preserve the current look and feel of the area. The removal and/or trimming of existing trees should be kept to a minimum to provide an attractive appearance and maintain the current natural beauty of the area.
- 10. No structures or impervious surfaces should be constructed within 75' of an adjacent property or within 100' of a wet or dry stream.

It is our contention that the proposed development is not in keeping with the current uses in the immediate area. Currently, there are no high density residential or townhome tracts in this part of Hall County and the development of such in this area would be inconsistent with surrounding uses.

Your attention to this matter is very much appreciated.
