GOING THE DISTANCE

On Wednesday, March 10, daily life for the HCA community came to an abrupt halt. Schools closed overnight, and Remote Learning became the new norm. Students went to school, and many parents went to work, all within the confines of their own homes. HCA faculty and staff dove into remote learning with incredible success, implementing engaging and rigorous live-streamed lessons and purposeful assignments for all of our students. In a matter of a few days, almost everything changed; but what did not change was HCA's commitment to provide its students with a strong, Christ-centered education along with exceptional opportunities for academic and spiritual growth.

As the weeks grew into months, the challenge of remaining positive required perseverance. We were truly living one day at a time, keeping our focus on the Lord, our source of strength. Entire families gathered together each Wednesday for HCA's live-streamed Chapel services. Students and faculty met virtually to encourage one another and to lift each other up in prayer. RTS TASKFORCE

We continue to seek the Lord's guidance as HCA prepares to safely welcome our students back to campus in the fall. As we thoughtfully and prayerfully proceed, we turn to the input of our community to define a safe, God honoring "new normal" for our students, families, and faculty. In an effort to best accomplish this tremendous task, HCA has formed an official Return-to-School (RTS) Taskforce.

The RTS Taskforce is a group of stakeholders from the HCA community, each with unique expertise, skills, and viewpoints, gathered together to create our Return-to-School Action Plan. This group meets weekly to discuss newly-released state guidelines, feedback from the community, and challenges that may arise as we move forward. The Taskforce includes HCA's leadership team, as well as representatives from the elementary and secondary level faculty, HCA PTF, Academy Committee, HGC maintenance team, and HGC pastoral staff, along with our own school nurse.

We are grateful to the teachers, parents, and HGC leadership that are serving alongside HCA's leadership team as a part of this important Taskforce.



HCA LAUNCHES VIRTUAL SCHOOL!

A new program is currently under development for the 2020-2021 school year - a virtual chapter of HCA, entitled *HCA Virtual*. *HCA Virtual* is an online instructional program, delivered in an at-home environment. The goal of *HCA Virtual* is to reach students and families that may not be able to participate in HCA's on-campus learning.

HCA continues to provide our traditional, in-seat program, fully driven by our current faculty and administration. If necessary, HCA can also utilize Remote Learning as an extension of our in-seat instruction. Remote Learning is offered as live, synchronous instruction, provided by our in-seat teachers. In contrast, *HCA Virtual* is a separate instructional program, delivered primarily asynchronously, and experienced independently.

HCA's Virtual School exists to provide a unique, directed online curriculum consistent with that provided in the traditional classroom. Students in *HCA Virtual* will experience a more asynchronous (independent) style of education in keeping with HCA's Mission Statement.

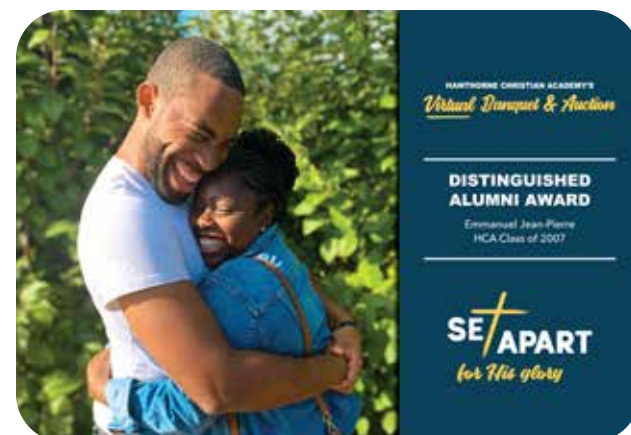

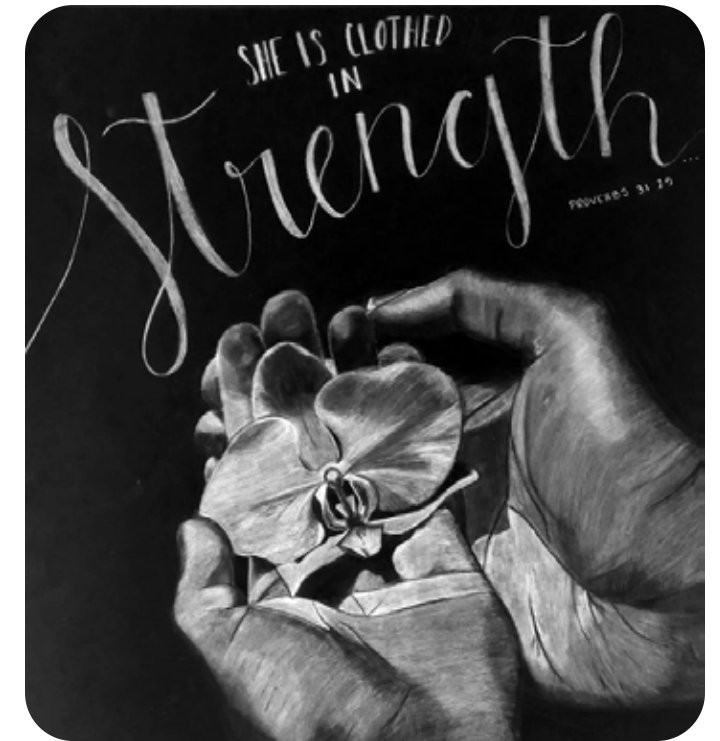
VIRTUAL GALLERY WALK
