It was an evening of entertainment, but more than that, this concert marked the beginning of a new partnership for HCA and a new step in the fulfillment of our mission to impact the world for Christ! Danny Gokey brought people together to enjoy a great time, to pray, and to raise financial support for the HCA Missions Fund and Handfuls of Hope! Handfuls of Hope (HoH) is a ministry that runs several programs in the DR, including a Christian school, Christian sports camps, and the Isaiah 58 ministry, which brings the gospel (along with food and supplies) to the villages

5th-grade's culminating STEM project integrated architecture, engineering, and construction. Mrs. Burres required each village to include two houses connected by a road, a working water tower, open green space, a river, and a bridge connecting it to other villages. After weeks of designing and testing, students visited Servant's Heart Operations Site, where they built their houses using carpenter tools under the supervision of experienced tradesmen. Back at HCA, students affixed their house to a table and installed a circuit to provide electrical, heating, and water. This engaging project required weeks of critical thinking, collaboration, problem-solving, creativity, perseverance, and achievement!

# **Graduation Testimony**
