

Walk Worthy!

Paul opens the fourth chapter of His letter to the Ephesians by stating, "I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received." Incumbent in this exhortation is understanding first, we are not inherently worthy. We are sinners, unworthy of the Lord's love, forgiveness, and grace. The good news is that God has chosen to love us! Because He loves us, He sent Jesus to die, that through His blood, when by His grace we repent and trust in Him, we are forgiven and we are called worthy. Paul is writing to those who are now positionally worthy and calling us to act like it!

He goes on to tell us what that looks like. Ephesians 4:2 declares, "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." Volumes could be written about this verse, but to state it simply we are called to the following:

- Humility: God is God, I am not; gratefully, obediently submit to His will, love Him, and love others above ourselves
- Gentleness: Meekness, or controlled strength
- Patience: Endurance of adverse interactions and actions without anger or frustration
- Forbearance (bear with one another in love):
 Patience under provocation; acceptance of mistreatment without retaliation

Paul then calls us to, "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3). The Holy Spirit establishes unity between believers. We then are called to keep this unity through the bond of peace. There should be harmony and oneness among all believers. Certainly, conduct in keeping with Ephesians 4:2 will make great contributions to maintaining unity and the bond of peace.

These teachings are so clear, and are a gracious roadmap from our heavenly father. However, after focusing on these verses this year, it has become evident that, as sinners, we have a propensity to apply these verses in our critique of others, rather than in self-examination. Might I state clearly, this verse was not given as a weapon against others, but as a weapon against our own flesh. We should battle our sin nature. Instead of putting our rights before others, and picking the speck out of our brother or sister's eye, we are called to willingly deal humbly, gently, and patiently, and lovingly serve our fellow believers in the name and love of Christ, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

May we strive to **WALK WORTHY**, and in doing so, share the love of Christ, keep unity through the bond of peace, and bring glory to His holy name!

Let us briefly consider that question. As a starting point, we know that God's commands are not frivolous. He would not call us to anything that was not for His glory or for our good. What follows are three reasons we are called to generosity:

First, giving is a form of worship. When we give of the money that God has given us, we glorify God in our obedience, trust, and gratitude. We demonstrate our dependence on God and our contentment in His love over our possessions. Second, giving motivates others to give thanks and praise. Responding to the generous Corinthians (2 Cor 9:12) Paul

Lower School Highlights

What happens when HCA faculty and students combine technology, learning, and a love of God's Word? The HCA Bible Bowl! It is an exciting, intense, and fun way to both study and demonstrate Bible knowledge. Our Fifth Grade Student Council, with the help of their teacher, Mr. Pollard, organize teams designated by colors. On the day of the Bible Bowl, spirited teams arrive decked out in their team color and after a time of worship together, the contest begins! Teams join together to answer questions loaded into Kahoot, a game-based learning platform that makes it easy for our students to create, share, and play learning games. As students representing their color are called up for their turn, large screens present the challenge of answering an involved Bible question.

This year, we explored the Book of Acts as an extension of our theme, **WALK WORTHY**. A clock gives the time and each individual player answers questions in a rotation, earning points for their teams. Scores and ranking are



seen in real time as the program's countdown gives the HCA students a sense of urgency, excitement, and healthy competition. The school spirit is captured in the buzz of the sanctuary, and roars of applause are frequent as students cheer each other on, answering Bible questions as difficult as any Jeopardy category I have watched Ken Jennings ask. I asked a Student Council member what he liked best about the HCA Bible Bowl, and after correcting me with the fact that he "loves," not likes, the Bowls, he also said, "They are energetic and everybody is included. It is a fun way to learn about the Bible." I could not say it better if I tried! In a school devoted to learning while growing in our faith, the Lower School Bible Bowl is a great example of our commitment to provide opportunities to our students to learn and love God's Word together.





A Spiritual Reflection: Fall 2024

Recently, during a faculty devotion, I shared with several teachers and administrators a quote from Blaise Pascal's **Pensees** (thoughts). Pascal states, "Knowing God without knowing our own poverty produces pride. Knowing our poverty without knowing God produces despair. Knowing Jesus Christ strikes the true balance, because in Him we know both God and our own poverty."

There is much here that rings true to the mature Christian. In what seems absurd to the world on its face, the reality is that true life is found in dying to oneself. The way up begins with humility. It is a strange but true reality that as we mature in the faith, we think less of ourselves. The reason for this is that we become increasingly aware of the sin remaining in us. To quote C.S. Lewis, "Good people know about good and evil." This is true because the one who is being sanctified sees his or her own faults more and more

clearly. This reality is not to lead us down a road to despair. On the contrary, this is our greatest hope. Why? Because it causes us to cling ever more tightly to our great Savior.

If we are honest, when we look at ourselves, we may not always like what we see. We are impatient, we act selfishly, and we say and do things that we regret. Indwelling sin is a reality throughout the Christian life. But our Savior is bigger than our sin! So, as you reflect upon these truths, confess and look up. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins..." (1 John 1:9) The gospel is not only for the unbeliever. It is a beautiful reminder that "as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us." (Psalm 103: 12). Amen and Amen!
