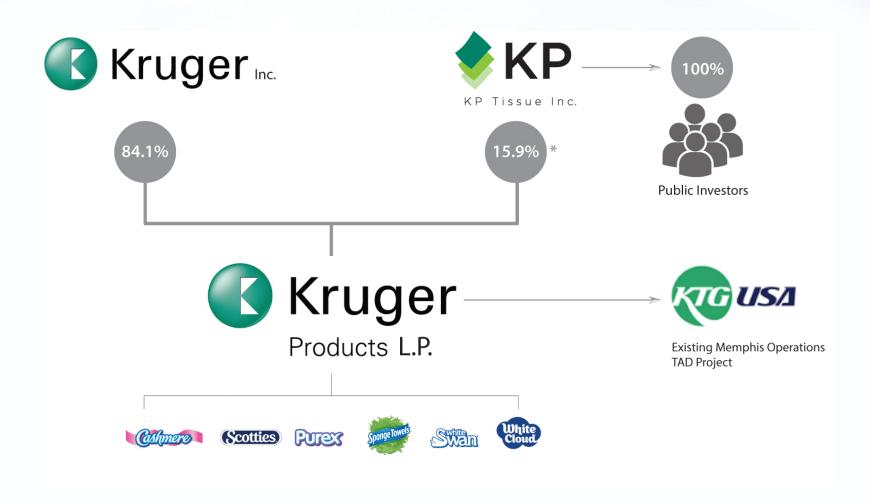

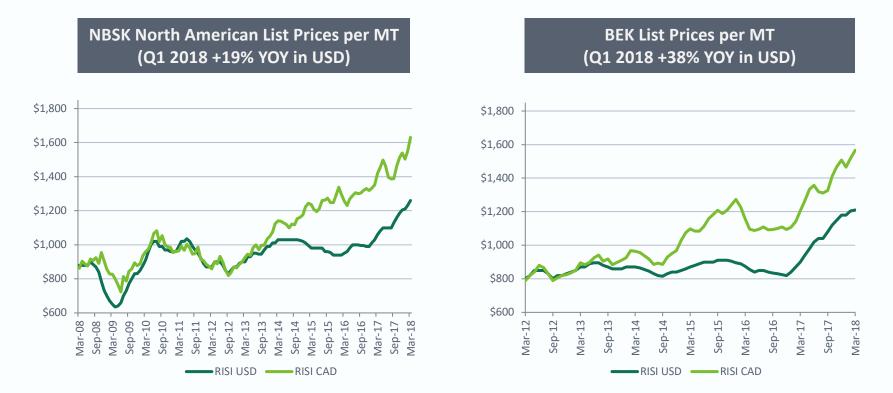

Pulp Input Prices



Q1 2018 market pulp prices rose sequentially compared to Q4 2017, and also year-over-year, in both USD and CAD.

Based on industry forecasts, pulp prices in USD are expected to remain high for the balance of 2018. The volatile CAD will create further fluctuations in pulp input costs.

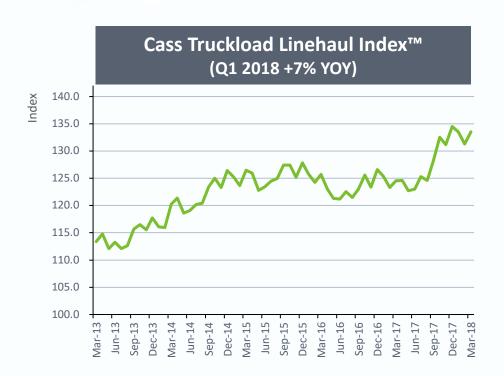

Freight costs have risen significantly since the beginning of 2017 and reached an all-time high in Q4 2017. Management expects these costs to remain high for the balance of 2018.



The Cass Truckload Linehaul Index™ is an accurate, timely indicator of market fluctuations in per-mile truckload pricing. The index isolates the linehaul component of full truckload costs from other components (e.g. fuel and accessorials), providing an accurate reflection of trends in baseline truckload prices.

Data within this unique index is derived from actual freight invoices paid on behalf of Cass' clients. The index uses January 2005 as its base month.

Price Increase and Cost Reductions



Selling price increase to Canadian retailers

Selling price increase implemented in Q4 2017, started to impact Q1 2018

As the market price leader, market share were impacted

During Q1, dollar value of paper tissue categories⁽¹⁾ increased between 3% to 5% greater than volume

Promotional activities have now returned to more normal levels

Value creation program

Value added program to be much larger in scope and size compared to the past

Smart cost reduction program with no impact on quality aimed at:

- Content reduction
- Procurement savings
- Smart savings at facility level/reducing fix costs
- North American logistics optimization

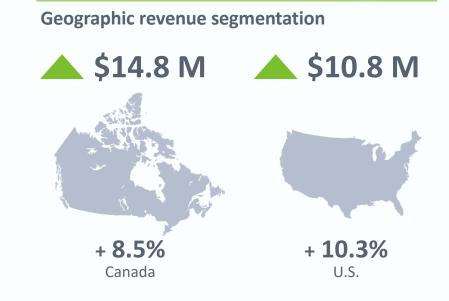

Q1 revenue increase

Impacted by a combination of:

- Additional 6 days of sales (or 7.1% of sales) in Q1 2018 versus Q1 2017
- Favourable impact of increased sales volume
- Consumer selling price increase implemented in Canada in Q4 2017
- Partially offset by unfavourable impact of F/X fluctuations on U.S. sales (USD average 1.26 in Q1 2018 compared to 1.32 in Q1 2017)

Primarily due to the following factors:

- Significantly higher pulp costs
- Increased freight costs
- Partially offset by increased sales volume, the Canadian selling price increase, net favourable impact of F/X fluctuations, and the benefits from cost reduction initiatives and capital projects

Gross Margin

Gross margin decreased (11.2% in Q1 2018 versus 15.6% in Q1 2017) primarily due to the above mentioned factors

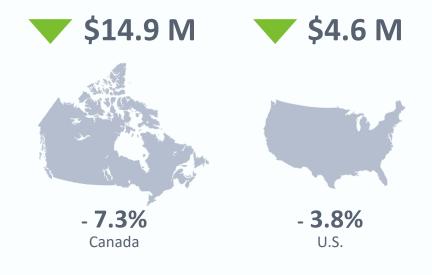
Q1 revenue decrease

over Q4 2017

Primarily due to the following factors:

- Q1 2018 consisting of 91 days and Q4 2017 consisting of 98 days
- AFH segment revenue decreased by \$8.7 million or 14.0%
- Consumer segment revenue decreased by \$8.7 million or 3.1%
- Q1 usually a lower seasonal quarter
- Selling price increase created market uncertainty, which affected volume for everyone

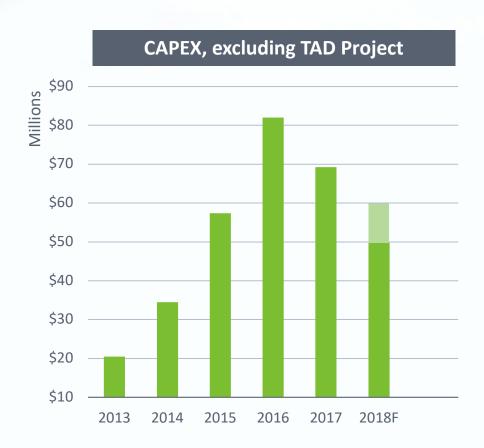

On April 24, 2018, Kruger Products issued CDN \$125 million principal amount of 6.00% Senior Unsecured Notes due April 24, 2025 by way of private placement. Interest on the Notes is payable semi-annually in arrears on April 24th and October 24th of each year, commencing on October 24, 2018. Kruger Products used the net proceeds of the financing to reduce the outstanding balance under its syndicated bank credit facility and to pay transaction costs associated with the Offering.







Q1 2018 CAPEX of \$15.7 million, up from \$12.7 million in Q1 2017 due to project timing

2018 focus on high return CAPEX projects – total estimated at \$50 to \$60 million

Cost reduction and Capacity/Growth projects generally have 3 to 4 year paybacks

TAD2 Project



Part of KPLP's long-term strategy is to increase premium paper capacity

Studying the potential for a second TAD paper machine with state-of-the-art converting capability ("TAD2")

• Potential sites in Canada and the U.S.

The project would require approximately two years for construction and installation following board approval, followed by a ramp-up period for production and sales A decision to proceed with the project is subject to a number of factors, including identification of an acceptable site and availability of financing on satisfactory terms





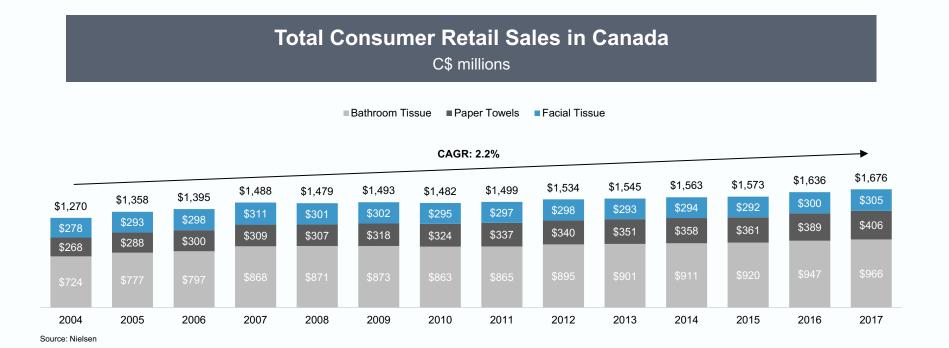
Resetting the AFH business to create a more efficient manufacturing and logistics footprint:

- In progress with a CAPEX program to improve manufacturing and logistics costs
- Results are also affected by pulp prices and freight costs
- Crabtree PM8 paper machine is now being partially used for the Consumer segment instead of AFH, reducing the beneficial impacts for AFH
- Reset will allow AFH business to become more competitive



Stable Underlying Demand for Consumer Tissue

- Tissue demand has been relatively stable over time
- Demand typically supported by overall population growth and high household penetration rates

U.S. Tissue Demand is Stable



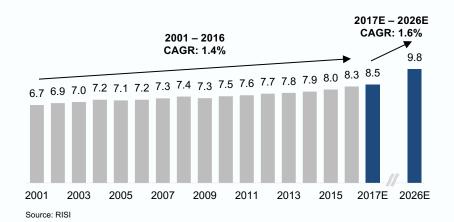
U.S. demand for tissue products has grown consistently at a CAGR of 1.4% from 2001 – 2016

- CAGR of 1.6% expected from 2017E to 2026E
- Consumer represents ~67% of U.S. tissue demand
- AFH has shown similar growth to consumer segment; typically greater sensitivity to economic cycles

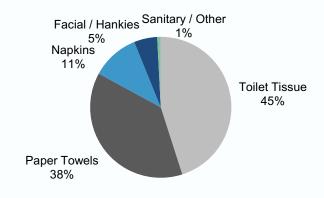
Private label volume continues to gain share, rising from 18% in 2008 to over 28% by 2016

- Greater acceptance since the economic downturn particularly in the towels and napkins segments
- Increasing emphasis on quality likely to support growth

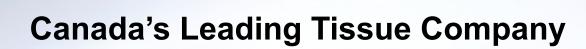




U.S. Tissue Demand Segments by Volume

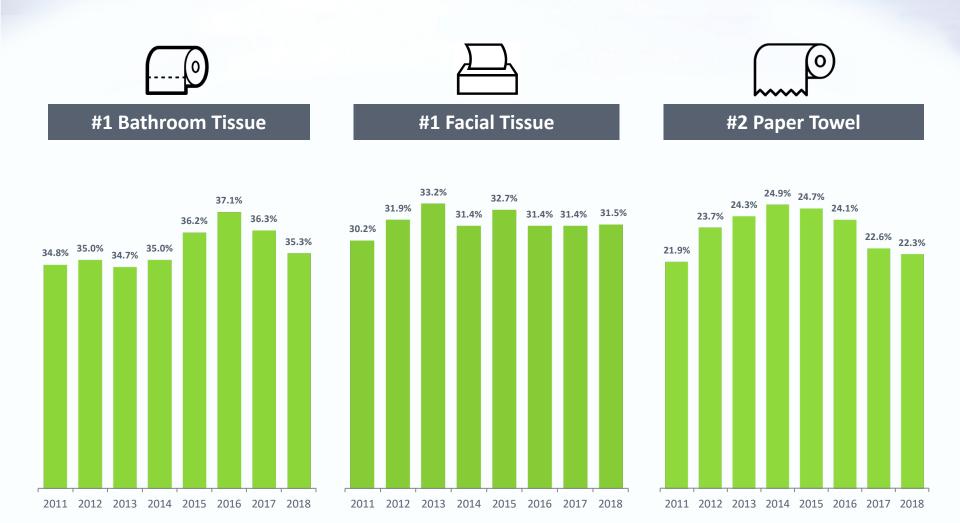

Conclusion



- Continue to build revenue, maintain market share leadership, secure our private label activities, and focus on opportunistic growth for AFH
- A price increase to Canadian retailers was implemented in Q4 2017 and was working through the system in Q1 2018
- Initiated an escalated value creation program to partially offset extraordinary short-term market conditions related to pulp and freight costs
- CAPEX in Fiscal 2018 will return to more normal levels after two years of increased investments
- Continue to leverage TAD products market potential and studying the potential for a second TAD machine
- Resetting the AFH business to create a more efficient manufacturing footprint
- In the U.S., continue to build the premium private label business and pursue White Cloud® customer diversification strategy
- KPLP continues to have strong long-term business fundamentals. However, Adjusted EBITDA is expected to decrease in Q2 2018 due to the significant run-up in pulp and freight costs
