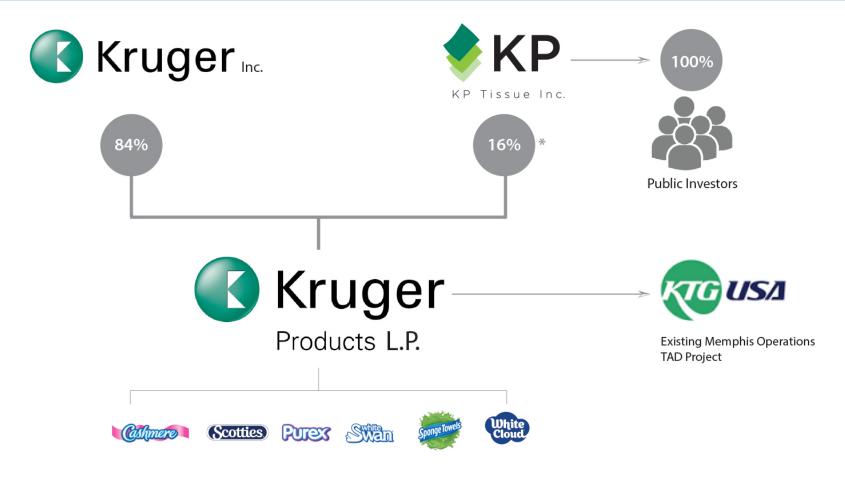

Q3 2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- Q3 2017 revenue of \$336.3 million, up 7.5% over Q3 2016
- Revenues increased in Canada (+7.2%), the U.S. (+7.6%) and Mexico (+10.4%)
- Adjusted EBITDA¹ of \$39.4 million, down \$6.2 million from Q3 2016
 - Significant impact of higher pulp prices
 - Higher freight costs
 - Incurred start-up costs from PM8
- TAD products contribution improved over prior year and in-line with expectations
- Continued growth in AFH revenues, which increased by 5.2% to \$62.5 million
- Net income of \$16.5 million compared to \$21.6 million in Q3 2016

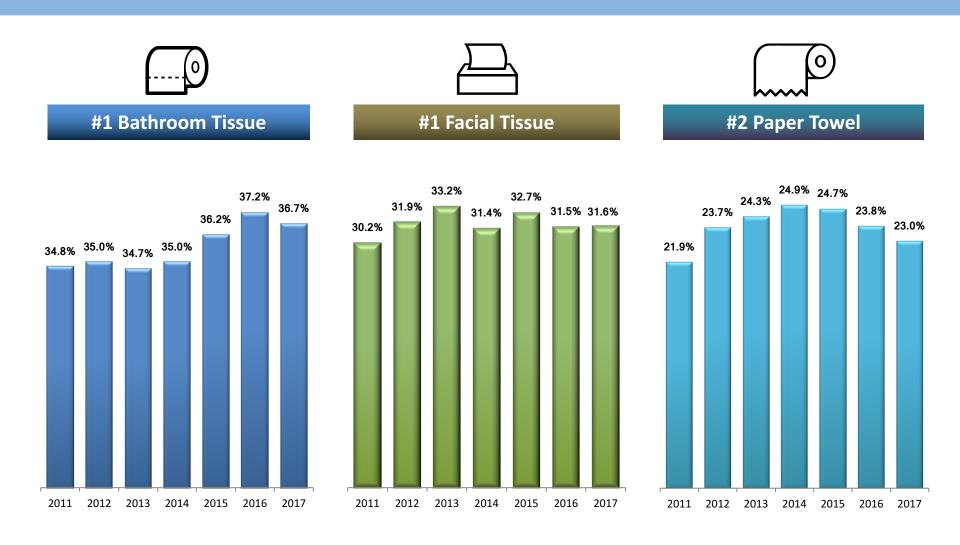

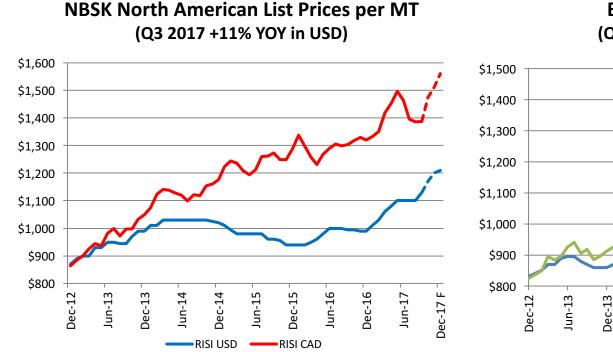
BRAND LEADERSHIP POSITION



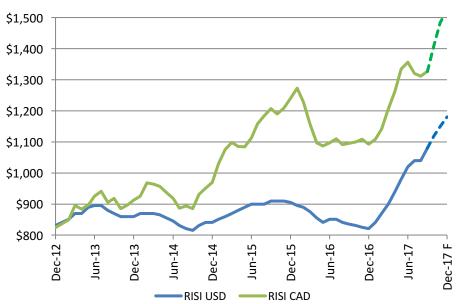

PULP INPUT PRICES

- Q3 pulp prices rose sequentially compared to Q2 2017, and also year-over-year, in both USD and CAD.
- Based on industry information, management expects pulp prices in USD to increase in the short term.
 The volatile CAD will create further fluctuations in pulp input costs.

Q3 2017 REVENUE COMPARED TO Q3 2016

- Q3 2017 revenue increased by \$23.5 million or 7.5% over
 Q3 2016 primarily due to the following factors:
 - Consumer segment revenue increased \$24.1 million or 9.7% driven by sales volume growth in all geographic regions, partially offset by unfavourable F/X on U.S. sales
 - AFH revenue was up 5.2%

From a geographic perspective:

- Revenue increased in Canada by \$14.1 million or 7.2%, primarily due to higher sales volume in the Consumer and also AFH
- Revenue in the U.S. increased by \$8.0 million or 7.7%, primarily due to higher sales volume in the Consumer segment

Q3 2017 ADJUSTED EBITDA COMPARED TO Q3 2016

- Q3 2017 Adjusted EBITDA decreased by \$6.2 million or 13.6% to \$39.4 million primarily due to the following factors:
 - Higher commodity costs for pulp and SOW
 - Higher freight costs (i.e Hurricanes)
 - PM8 start-up costs
 - Partially offset by:
 - Increased sales volume
 - Lower SG&A
- Gross margin decreased (13.5% in Q3 2017 versus 17.9% in Q3 2016) primarily due to the above factors

Q3 2017 REVENUE COMPARED TO Q2 2017

- Q3 2017 revenue increased by \$21.9 million or 7.0% over Q2 2017, primarily due to the following factors:
 - Consumer segment revenue increased by \$20.7 million or 8.2%
 - AFH segment revenue increased by \$2.6 million or 4.3%

From a geographic perspective

- Revenue increased in:
 - Canada by \$21.5 million or 11.5%
 - U.S. decreased \$1.8 million or (1.5%)

Q3 2017 ADJUSTED EBITDA COMPARED TO Q2 2017

- Q3 2017 Adjusted EBITDA increased by \$2.1 million over Q2 2017 due to the combination of the following factors:
 - Higher volume
 - Partially offset by:
 - Higher pulp prices
 - Increased freight costs
 - PM8 start-up costs
- Gross margin decreased (13.5% in Q3 2017 versus 15.0% in Q2 2017) primarily due to higher pulp prices

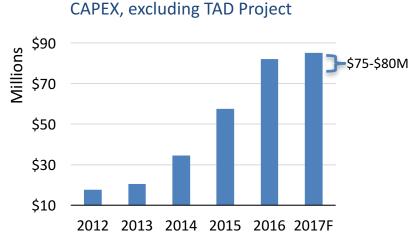

CAPEX

 Q3 2017 CAPEX of \$12.5 million, down from \$20.0 million in Q3 2016, spending mainly on PM8 in Crabtree

 2017 focus on high return CAPEX projects – total estimated at approximately \$75-\$80 million

Cost reduction and Capacity/Growth projects generally have 3 to 4 year paybacks

NEW CRABTREE PAPER MACHINE (PM8)

- Total project CAPEX of \$55 million with approximately \$3 million of CAPEX remaining as of the end of Q3 2017
- Project on time and on budget
- Incurred start-up costs of approximately
 \$0.7 million during the quarter
- PM8 Timeline:

Q3 2017

Commissioning/initial start-up costs

Q4 2017

Commercial/neutral contribution

Q1 2018

Commercial ramp-up/positive contribution





CONCLUSION

- Maintain market share leadership in the Canadian consumer segment in the context of a competitive and price sensitive environment
- A price increase to Canadian retailers was announced in late July 2017 and will take effect during Q4
- Continued benefits of cost reduction program and capital projects
- Pursue White Cloud® customer diversification strategy with additional retailers
- Continue to leverage TAD products market potential
- AFH segment new production line projects improving manufacturing costs

CONCLUSION

- Paper machine in Crabtree commissioning started Q3 2017. Positive contribution to AFH expected in Q1 2018
- Above normal CAPEX in fiscal 2017 dedicated to improve profitability and manufacturing efficiencies, both in the Consumer and AFH segments – estimated at \$75-\$80 million. Positive impact on Adjusted EBITDA will start primarily in fiscal 2018
- Adjusted EBITDA for Q4 2017 is expected to decrease over Q4 2016, due to higher pulp prices
