

# The Basics



## UNI ID CARD

Your UNI ID Card is your official UNI identification. Upload your ID photo in your orientation portal so your UNI ID can be ready for you when you arrive to campus for the start of the semester.

- + **Living on-campus:** your ID card will be available at move-in.
- + **Living off-campus:** you can pick up your ID at the Housing & Dining office in Redeker Center.

## USING YOUR UNI ID CARD ALLOWS ACCESS TO THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS:

- + Charge items to your U-bill from on-campus dining
- + Use your meal plan and dining dollars
- + Check out books and pay for color copies at Rod Library
- + Access to the Wellness & Recreation Center
- + Discounts at some local businesses
- + Opens electronic access doors, such as your dorm
- + Check-in at Panther Welcome events
- + Student ID Card purchases will appear on your U-Bill. Carry your UNI ID at all times and keep it safe. Replacement UNI IDs cost \$30.



## CAT ID

Your Cat ID consists of your username and your password. Your username is a unique 3-8 character account name that identifies you as a member of the UNI community. Your username in conjunction with your password allows you access to various online resources and computers on campus. Use your Cat ID wherever you see the Cat ID logo.

Passwords expire after 365 days. You can reset your password in MyUNIverse. If you have forgotten your password, or your account is disabled, you may call the IT Service Desk (319-273-5555) for assistance.

## UNI EMAIL

You will have access to your UNI email after your orientation session. UNI email is powered by Google and will allow you to access other Google products such as Google Docs, Google Sheets and Google Slides. Your UNI email address will be CatID@uni.edu.



## MYUNI APP

This is your one stop shop for quick and easy access to helpful resources you need as a UNI student. Just search MyUNI in your application store.

## PARKING ON CAMPUS

Parking on campus requires either the appropriate parking permit or the use of metered spaces by paying the appropriate fee. Permit eligibility is based on if you are living on or off campus.

It is best to order your permit as soon as possible after your orientation session. You will access the parking portal using your UNI CatID. Please do NOT create a visitor or guest account. More information, including how to order your parking permit, is in the "After Orientation Tasks" section of your orientation portal.

### Receiving your parking permit

- + If you are living on campus and purchase a physical permit, you will get your permit at move-in.
- + If you are living off campus, you have the option to pick up your permit in August or mail it to the address of your choice if ordered before August 1.

## VISITOR PARKING ON CAMPUS

Do you have a friend, family member or guest who is planning to visit you while you live on campus? Students living on campus are welcome to come to the Public Safety Office to pick up a visitor permit for "C" or "R" parking for their guests. As long as it is for no more than one overnight during the week (M-F) there is currently no charge. Anything more than that would carry a fee.

# Student Accessibility Services

UNI believes that disability is a naturally occurring aspect of humanity and is an integral part of society and at UNI. UNI believes in working collaboratively with students, faculty and staff to provide accessible and equitable opportunities for all students.

Students with disabilities are encouraged to connect with the UNI Student Accessibility Services Office (SAS) to begin the individualized process of determining reasonable accommodations based on the nature of the disability and the academic environment. The student engages in the interactive process by having a conversation with SAS staff which is taken into consideration when making accommodation determinations along with the student's past accommodations history and supporting documentation related to their disability.

Reasonable accommodations provide equal access to educational programs and activities; they do not lower course standards, provide an unfair advantage or fundamentally alter program requirements.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR ACCOMMODATIONS?

Any individual with a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. Examples include, but are not limited to, learning disabilities (including ADHD), chronic health conditions, mental health conditions (anxiety, depression, PTSD) and physical disabilities.

## WHAT ARE ACCOMMODATIONS?

An accommodation is an alteration to the academic environment to ensure students with disabilities have equitable access to course materials, information, activities, programs and campus facilities. Accommodations can include digital textbooks, extended testing time, access to slide presentations and recording lectures, among many others.

## HOW CAN I ACCESS SERVICES?

1. Request accommodations by completing the application at [sas.uni.edu/submit-accessibility-request](https://sas.uni.edu/submit-accessibility-request)
2. Provide Documentation supporting your request with the completed application
3. Documentation can include a previous IEP or 504 plan; psychoeducational or neuropsychological assessment; relevant medical records; a letter from a current counselor, physician, psychiatrist or psychologist; etc
4. Schedule an Initial Meeting to discuss the barriers limiting the student's academic access and to identify reasonable accommodations




# Academic Resources

## GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

UNI Foundational Inquiry (UNIFI), UNI's general education curriculum, is a common curricular experience for all students, enabling you to develop skills and knowledge across a breadth of disciplines. We take pride in preparing students for fulfilling personal, professional and civic lives. Students take courses from three tiers for a total of 37 credits. Your advisor will help you select courses that meet UNIFI requirements.

## YOUR ACADEMIC DEGREE

To graduate with a bachelor's degree, you must earn 120 credits. Think of these credits like a pie made of three pieces. The first piece is your general education requirements - UNIFI (37 credits). The second piece is your major requirements (33-87 credits). The final piece of the pie is University Electives. University Electives are credits that do not count towards your general education or major requirements and help you to earn 120 credits. Each student needs a different number of university electives and can choose to fulfill them by earning a double major, minor, or certificate; or by enrolling in courses they find interesting. Your academic advisor can help calculate how many university electives you need and how best to use them.

# Academic Advising

The Office of Academic Advising works with students who are exploring majors, as well as with students declared in specific majors from the College of Social & Behavioral Sciences and the College of Humanities, Arts, & Sciences. The Wilson College of Business and the College of Education have advising centers within their respective buildings.

All UNI students are encouraged to talk with an advisor about:

- + Meeting degree requirements
- + Adjusting your class schedule
- + Changing your major or confirming your major is the best fit for you
- + Connecting to campus resources

## WORKING WITH YOUR ADVISOR

Your advisor is here to help you succeed! To get the most out of your advising meetings, you should:

- + Review your advisement report before each advising appointment
- + Create a list of questions to ask your advisor during your appointment
- + Share your personal and educational goals so your advisor knows what your big-picture dreams are
- + Be honest about how you are doing! Share any issues you're experiencing so your advisor can help brainstorm possible solutions

## WHO IS MY ACADEMIC ADVISOR?

All students are assigned to an academic advisor. You can find your assigned advisor in your Student Center, accessed through MyUNiverse within one week after your orientation session.

## CAN I CHANGE MY MAJOR?

YES! It is common for students to change their major; nationally, about 80% of college students change their major at least once. UNI has several resources to assist students with this process. Contact the Office of Academic Advising to meet with an advisor and discuss your options!

## CAN I CHANGE MY SCHEDULE?

Students can make changes to their schedule through the first week of each semester. Always talk with your advisor before altering your schedule to ensure changes won't affect your degree plan.

## GPA & ACADEMIC STANDING

You must earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 to graduate from UNI. As long as you maintain a 2.00 GPA, you will be in Good Academic Standing. Your declared major may have a GPA requirement higher than 2.00. It is your responsibility to speak with your advisor about your major requirements.

If you fall below a 2.00 GPA, your academic standing will change, which can have academic and financial aid consequences. The Undergraduate Academic Standing Policy is outlined in the Academic Catalog.

## WHEN SHOULD I ORDER MY BOOKS?

When deciding how early to order your books there are a few things to keep in mind.

- + Textbook orders are processed in the order in which they are received.
- + Used books are first-come, first-serve, so if getting used books is important to you, place your order as early as possible.
- + Remember to place your order early enough to ensure delivery by the start of classes.

The UNI Bookstore allows you to charge your textbooks to your U-Bill enabling your scholarships and financial aid to help cover the cost.

# Office of Business Operations

The Office of Business Operations (OBO), is the place you'll work with for a variety of financial services, including paying your bills and receiving payments from any refunds.

## IMPORTANT U-BILL INFORMATION & KEY BILLING DATES

- + All University Bills (U-Bill) are available in your Student Center through MyUNiverse
- + Students will receive a notification via their UNI email account when their U-Bill is ready
- + The first U-Bill of the semester will be available on the 1st day of the month and will include the semester costs for tuition, mandatory fees and campus room and meal plans
- + U-Bill due date is the 20th of each month starting:
  - + August 20 for Fall
  - + January 20 for Spring

## DEFERRED PAYMENT PLANS

- + You must sign up in the Student Center by the deadlines for each semester:
  - + September 20 for Fall
  - + February 20 for Spring

# Financial Aid & Scholarships

It's really never too early or late to discuss how you plan to pay for college, which includes tuition, fees, housing and meals. Allow the Office of Financial Aid & Scholarships to assist you in navigating the path to paying for college. Here's a recommended checklist for you to follow.



## Complete your FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the form used to apply for federal and state financial aid. The 2025-26 FAFSA became available at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov) on December 2025. The FAFSA for the upcoming academic year can still be completed at this time! You will want to complete the FAFSA every year.



## Review Your Aid Offer

Financial Aid Offers are available electronically. View your offer by logging into your MyUNiverse account, clicking 'Go to my Student Center', scrolling down to the Finances section, then using the links under Financial Aid. Here, you can also accept or decline Federal Direct Loans. Any aid initially declined can be re-offered by contacting the Office of Financial Aid & Scholarships.



## Report Your Scholarships

All scholarships from outside the institution (off-campus scholarships) are required to be reported on your Financial Aid Offer. Scan the QR code to refer to our website for detailed instructions.

## Financial Literacy

All incoming first year students are required to complete financial literacy training. Students can complete this requirement through an in-person class, Live Like a Student, or online through Panther CashCourse. There are scholarships available ranging from \$250-1,000 which you can be entered to win if you take Live Like a Student. ## CAMPUS JOBS

# Study Abroad

Interested in studying abroad but not sure where to start? UNI offers a wide selection of programs ranging from two weeks to an academic year abroad. Many programs offer a cost of attendance comparable to studying on campus at UNI. Approximately 80% of programs offer courses in English. Scholarships are available specifically for UNI students studying abroad. Financial aid can be used for study abroad expenses. Funding options should be discussed with a Financial Aid Advisor. It is recommended to plan your Study Abroad experience sooner rather than later. Talk to your academic advisor about integrating Study Abroad into your academic plan.

## TYPES OF PROGRAMS:

- + **Partner Universities:** UNI students can live and learn at a university abroad during the fall and/or spring semester and take classes towards their degree. Some schools offer a summer school option where students can study with that university for 1 to 3 months.
- + **Faculty-led:** Students can learn course content from UNI faculty through hands-on, dynamic experiences. Students travel with a class of 10-25 for 2-3 weeks during winter break or the summer term. Some faculty-led programs offer general education courses open to all majors while others may be major specific.

## PSYCHIATRIC AND COUNSELING SERVICES

Taking care of your mental health is very important to your success as a college student. UNI Psychiatric and Counseling Services is located on the 2nd floor of the Student Health Center. It is open each day classes are in session from 8 am – 4:30 pm. After hours (nights and weekends), students can call (319) 273-2676 and select option 2 to speak with a mental health professional from TELUS. All students have access to TELUS, a 24/7 real-time early intervention support via telephone or chat. This provides students with the ability to access crisis resources and on-demand counseling support in multiple languages from any location. TELUS works closely with UNI and is able to provide additional campus and community resources when necessary.

## WHAT ARE DINING DOLLARS?

Dining dollars are pre-paid spending dollars that may be used for purchases in the retail stores or additional meal purchases in the dining centers. Dining dollars come as part of all meal plans, but can also be purchased as needed.

Dining dollars roll over from fall to spring semester and expire at the end of the spring semester, so use them up by the end of the academic year.

## RECREATION SERVICES



# Student Conduct

As a part of the UNI community, it is important for students to understand expectations for all student behavior and the process for which allegations of misbehavior will be addressed.

The Student Conduct Code, grounded in a commitment to Respect, Responsibility, and Honesty, outlines the conduct prohibited by our students.

- + The Good Samaritan Provision encourages students or student organizations to seek medical or professional assistance for individuals in need rather than focusing on potential allegations of misconduct

# A Helpful Glossary as you Transition to Life at UNI

- + **Direct Subsidized vs. Unsubsidized loans** - Federal student loans that cover the cost of education. Subsidized loans do not accrue interest while you are in school, but unsubsidized do.
- + **Midterms** - Exams/Tests taken during the mid-way point in the semester.
- + **Office hours** - Specific times scheduled outside of the normal class time where you can meet with professors to ask questions or get help.
- + **Registration** - typically referring to registering for classes. During orientation, your advisor will register for you, but in the future you will register yourself with an advisor assisting.
- + **Student organizations** - student-run organizations out of the office of Student Involvement. You can learn more about individual organizations on their website: [union.uni.edu/involvement](http://union.uni.edu/involvement).
- + **Syllabus** - an outline of the class, including assignments, policies, and more. Usually given out on the first day of class.
- + **Drop a Class** - removing one or multiple classes from your schedule but remaining in at least one (1) course.
- + **Withdrawal from Classes** - removing ALL courses from your schedule for a semester
- + **Faculty** - professors that teach and do research at UNI.
- + **Staff** - employees on campus that are not professors.
- + **Work-study** - work-study jobs are federally-funded jobs that can help students pay for everyday expenses or tuition.
