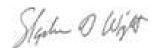

Educating the future is only part of the team's mission. They also actively engage in recruitment of new hires, using their skill set to attract new talent at military and adult career fairs.



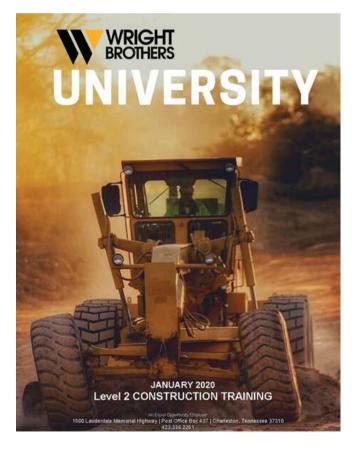

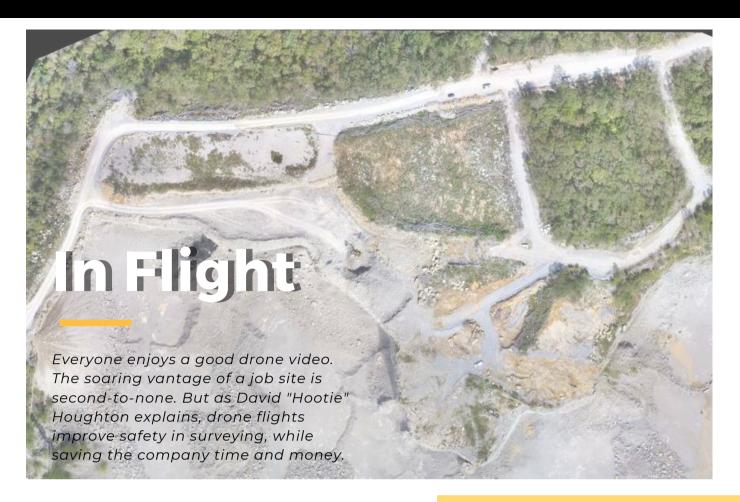

# WRIGHT BROTHERS DRONE PROGRAM

In Summer 2017, Wright Brothers Surveying and GPS Department began utilizing drones for project mapping purposes. We now have three FAA licensed SUAS (small unmanned aircraft system) pilots on staff: David Houghton, Michael Franklin and William Keys.

Drone flight have vastly improved safety, quality, and production of our surveys in quarries. First, a "safe zone" had to be determined by checking site conditions and with assistance from a site supervisor. Once the safe zone was established, we would use GPS in these areas, then use a reflectorless instrument to capture the unsafe zones. This required many setups of the instrument to capture all the angles, piles, and berms. We would have to do this from the top side of the high wall and then again from the floor below the high wall. This process typically took 10 - 12 hours to complete.



With a drone flight, we have cut survey time to 2-3 hours. There is no need to determine a safe or an unsafe zone, since no one ever needs to be anywhere near the high walls. The processing means we get as good or better topography than ever before.



### PROCESSING

We examined different services for processing, ultimately deciding on a custom-built Workstation designed by our Wright Brothers IT department. This gave us the ability to tailor each flight for its project needs, and to only process the data we needed, speeding up the processing time tremendously.

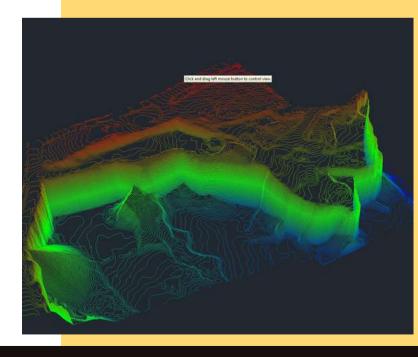

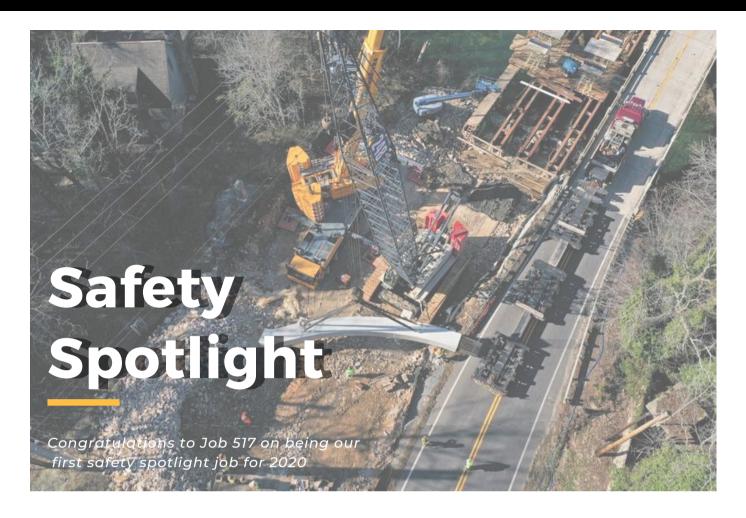
#### **HOW IT WORKS**

Sites are mapped by photogrammetric methods; combining aerial drone imagery, ground control points, and photogrammetry processing software to produce accurate 3D surveys of project sites.

These 3D surveys are then used for volumetric analysis and capture some pretty cool images of our sites. We learned a lot in 2017 and early 2018 through trial and error. We had to not only master the proper protocols for ground control points along with the drone and flight, but also the office software required to produce an accurate 3D survey. We performed a lot of checks to verify and build trust in the new technology. We performed traditional surveys and aerial surveys and then compared the two. This helped to establish our protocols for aerial surveys.

In 2019 we successfully performed 112 flights with processing.





### MENTONE ALABAMA

Project Length: 2450' Overall Bridge Length 156' 108' Precast Arch Span Contract Value: \$5,714,487

The safety plan was developed, discussed and executed flawlessly with no accidents or near misses during a very interesting phase of the project that required precision accuracy. A very small space in which two large cranes had to operate a tandem pick to set each of the four arches. This task took months of prep and excellent planning to safely set each 140,000 pound arch. Hats off to Steve Turner, his crew, our crane operator, Charlie Frost, and the guys from Crane Works to safely and precisely set and secure each arch.

#### CIVIL DIVISION

The current jobs have advanced as fast as possible, but not lacking in frustration from both the Client and our sides.

### I-40 SLIDE REPAIR

When a rockslide shut down I-40 at mile marker 7.5, NCDOT first priority was to get it back open, safely, as quickly as possible. This section of I-40 is critical to commerce and carries tens of millions of dollars' worth of goods and supplies everyday. Discussions between the Department and Harrison Construction, who had an open paving job at the site at the time, immediately turned to Wright Brothers Construction Company as a contractor who could excavate and remove this material the quickest. Jeff Ball and his crew were on site within hours. Five days later, I-40 was opened to one lane in each direction and by the first week of May, all lanes of traffic were restored, and the slope was stabilized.

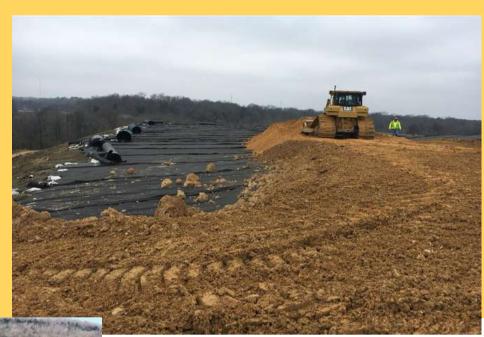

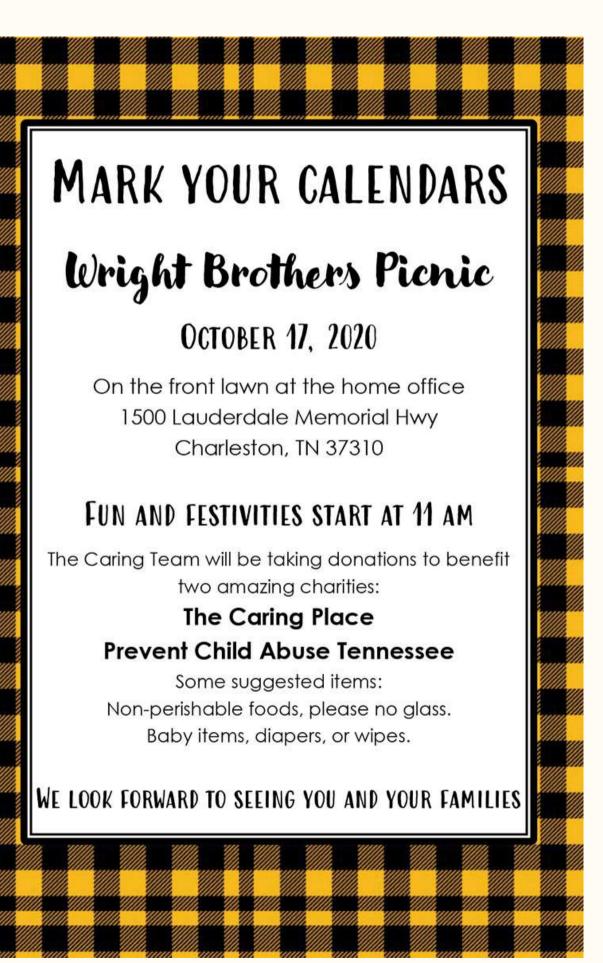
