ENTRIES & STALL RESERVATIONS

ONLINE ENTRIES

Submit online entries at RingRadar.com. Stall Reservation Form is linked in the Files section of RingRadar, on our website, and on Instagram.

PAPER / EMAILED ENTRIES

Paper and emailed entries incur a \$50 processing fee. Late fees apply if submitted after the show closing date.

Stall reservations should only be submitted by one member of a group and include a full stall count and hay/shavings order. Hay and shavings orders during the show can only be submitted in the show office. Stall reservations are due by the closing date.

FRIDAY SCHOOLING

"Ticketed Rounds" are offered on Friday in the Hunter and Jumper rings. Friday Schooling is intended for introduction to the competition space, not for extensive schooling or lessons in the show rings.

- All riders must be checked in and wearing a number. Trainer numbers assigned at the show office.
- Rounds permitted on a first-come, first-served basis per height section. If not signed up by the end of the allotted time, the arena will not be held for additional adds.
- **Limit 3 minutes per round:** can be used for jumping the posted course, hacking, or portions of the course.
- Riders exceeding 3 minutes will incur an additional schooling round fee.
- Only one trainer permitted per 3-minute window.
- Arenas are **not** open for hacking before or after the posted warm-up schedule.
- No changing of jump heights or direction is allowed.
- No schooling permitted 30 minutes after sunset. End-of-day over-fences schooling must be confirmed with management through back gate staff.

TACK, ATTIRE & EQUIPMENT

HUNTER / EQUITATION / JUMPER

Traditional attire and equipment is required during competition. Judges will follow USEF/USHJA rules for tack and equipment. The intention is to prepare competitors for rated-level practices and rules.

DRESSAGE

On schooling Saturdays, traditional attire is suggested but not required. For CDS-recognized Sundays, all CDS rules and USDF attire requirements apply.

USHJA OUTREACH PROGRAM

This program connects riders, trainers, and show organizations to the USHJA through USHJA-branded classes at non-rated shows. Outreach classes earn points toward year-end awards and a chance to qualify for the USHJA Affiliate National Championships.



USHJA Membership is NOT required to compete in any Sand Hill Equestrian Events show. Outreach Membership is free and only required for riders/horses wishing to be eligible for Outreach Program Awards.

THOROUGHBRED INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Classes and divisions are offered for the Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP), which also earn points toward the year-end Thoroughbred Sporthorse Challenge!



TIP awards will be given. Thoroughbred-only classes run concurrently with open classes and are placed separately. TIP placings do not count towards USHJA Outreach or division placings.

CDS-recognized dressage offered on Sunday. Sunday scores count toward CDS year-end awards and RAAC qualifying. Horses can earn CDS Horse Performance Awards.



WEST COAST CONNEMARA SHOW

The West Coast Connemara Show runs alongside the Woodside Show Series Summer Send Off, July 31 to August 2. Region X of the American Connemara Pony Society offers Connemara In-Hand and Performance Classes, to be judged by **Christina Keim**. Christina will also judge the Connemara Hunter division classes on Saturday. In-Hand, Trail, Celtic Caper, and Future Olympians classes run on **Friday, July 31**. For dressage, hunters, and jumpers, Connemara riders enter WSS classes directly via RingRadar. The 12 & Under and 17 & Under divisions run as open classes alongside the WSS open classes. ACPS tracking is built into the entry system.

★ **Friday classes:** In-Hand and breed classes are open to Connemara and Halfbred Connemara only. Trail, Celtic Caper, and Future Olympians classes are open to all breeds. Class list and ride times posted on RingRadar; see specifications at the end of this prize list.

ELIGIBILITY & REGISTRATION

- All horses showing in Connemara breed and In-Hand classes must be registered with the **ACPS** (American Connemara Pony Society), or have their Temporary Foal Certificates. A copy of registration papers must accompany the entry. Connemaras may also use the registration number from their country of origin (CPBS or BCPS, for example).
- Horses must be shown under their full registered names. No exceptions.
- ACPS registration numbers are required on the entry to be eligible for breed in-hand classes, breed performance awards, and perpetual trophies.
- Connemara In-Hand and breed-specific classes are Connemara/Halfbred only. All other classes are WSS classes; Connemara horses enter alongside open entries.
- A horse may be ridden by a maximum of two riders. Points from both riders are combined toward horse awards.
- Rider championship points (Open / AA / Jr / Child) are calculated on a **single horse/rider combination**. Points from multiple horses do not combine for rider awards.

★ **Dual entry required:** All Connemara show participants in correlated classes must enter both the Connemara class and the corresponding WSS class. See the correlations table below.

No additional fee for correlated classes. When a Connemara class is correlated with a WSS class and both entries are required, the Connemara entry is \$0. Riders pay only the standard WSS class fee.



CONNEMARA SHOW AWARDS

Connemara Division Championships and Perpetual Trophies are awarded to the Connemara and Halfbred Connemara only. For rider awards, points are calculated on individual horse/rider combinations. For horse awards, points accumulated by up to two riders are combined.

★ IRISH DERBY

LARRY ERVIN MEMORIAL TROPHY

Donated by Darian and Allen Hall, Rosewood Connemaras. Awarded to the highest placed Connemara or Halfbred Connemara in the Irish Derby.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible, the horse/rider combination must ride **Training Level Test 3** *and* a **.90m jumper class**.

Qualifying Classes: Training Level Test 3 (Class 978) and .90m Open Jumper (Class 962).



RULES & POLICIES

CLASS ADD / SCRATCH POLICY

Same-day class adds allowed based on schedule availability and subject to management discretion.

Hunter/Jumper: Add/scratch form must be processed in the show office before the start of the class. Add/scratch slip must be brought to the back gate after processing.

Scratch classes before they start! "Did Not Ride" classes will be charged the full amount if not scratched in the office before class start. Classes will not be removed from a bill after the class closes.

Dressage: Late adds after closing date require management approval. Adds may be placed at end of ride times and forfeit class placing. Dressage scratch incurs a \$50 processing fee after the closing date. Riding an un-entered test incurs a \$25 fee plus the class fee.

SHOW SCRATCH

A "show scratch" applies to any horse that completely withdraws from the competition. Must be delivered in writing to entries.woodsideschoolingshows@gmail.com.

1. **Before closing date:** no fees apply.
2. **After closing date, before show starts** (horse not on premises): \$50 scratch fee; no other show fees.
3. **After 12:01 AM show Friday:** exhibitor is responsible for all applicable fees including stabling and facility fees.

SCHOOLING POLICY

Schooling permitted on warm-up day per the ticketed round schedule. Non-judged and warm-up classes will not be placed; riders must jump the course as posted and trainers are not allowed in the ring. Riders may choose non-compete/non-judged status for any class by informing the back gate. Schooling and hacking in Warm Up rings is allowed sunrise to sunset. ASTM-rated helmets required at all times when mounted. No juniors or amateurs may school over fences without a trainer present. Hacking in show arenas outside of posted hours must be approved by management in advance.

STABLING

Move-in starts at **10 AM Thursday**. Horses must vacate by **8 PM Sunday**. **No riding on Thursdays**. The Horse Park at Woodside offers 12×12 box stalls. Feed options: alfalfa, grass mix, meadow grass, timothy. Grain not provided.

PAYMENT & REFUND POLICY

Payment due in full by close of show Sunday. Accepted: cash, check, or credit card. Debit cards not accepted. Exhibitors must leave a payment method on file at check-in to receive an entry number. Prior outstanding balances must be paid before picking up show numbers.

Open Balances: Competitors who do not close out their balance or review their bill in person at the show office forfeit the right to adjust any show charges. Final balances will be charged to the payment method on file. Any checks returned by the bank will be charged a \$35 penalty in addition to bank charges.

HPW STALL USE POLICY

By renting a stall you agree to the following. Stalls will be inventoried before and after each rental; any damages are the financial responsibility of the owner, exhibitor, and/or trainer.

1. Do not damage stalls. No staples, nails, screws, liquid nail, rubber cement, duct tape, paint, or similar products.
2. Decorations must use temporary set-ups (wire or plastic ties) and be removed at check-out.
3. Name cards must be removed at check-out with no residue on stall surfaces.
4. Do not remove any part of the stalls.
5. Manure in dumpsters only.
6. No vehicles in the aisles between stall rows.

CROSS COUNTRY SCHOOLING

Cross Country schooling at HPW is run separately from the Woodside Show Series and must be registered and paid through the main HPW office. Sand Hill Equestrian Events LLC is not responsible for exhibitors who separately engage in cross country schooling.

BIOSECURITY & EQUINE HEALTH

All horses must have proof of vaccination for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinoepneumonitis) within six months. All horses must have maintained a 3-day, twice daily temperature log prior to arrival. Horses must have temperature monitored twice daily during their stay. Management reserves the right to cancel entries who do not comply. Notify management immediately if a horse's temperature exceeds **101.5°F**.



GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The following rules apply to all competitors, riders, and visitors for the duration of the show.

Entries: All riders must complete and return an entry by the closing date. Late fee of \$50 per entry applies after the closing date.

ASTM-Rated Hard Hats must be worn by all riders when mounted.

Waivers must be signed by all riders prior to any riding, including warm-up arenas. For riders under 18, a parent or guardian must sign. Entry numbers will not be given until all waivers are complete.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is outside of the stall.

Dogs must be on a leash **at all times** and are not permitted in warm-up or competition areas.

Stall Use is by reservation only; availability is subject to change. By renting a stall at The Horse Park, you agree to abide by the stall use policies.

Early Move-In before Friday must be approved by show management.

Haul-In Fee applies to any exhibitor who has not rented a stall. Waived only for annual full-use HPW members.

HPW Facility Fee applies to all competitors regardless of HPW membership or boarding status. 100% goes to the HPW.

Management and Judges reserve the right to dismiss riders displaying extreme aggression or force, or riders who seem unsafe.

Non-Competing Horses stabled or hauled in must pay applicable fees: haul-in or stabling, office, CDFA, HPW facility fee.

Schooling: No juniors or amateurs may school over fences without a trainer present.

Arenas: Competitors restricted to show arenas and warm-up arenas. Competitors who are not HPW members may not use member-only arenas. Members not competing may not use show-designated arenas.

Lunging is permitted in designated lunging areas only. Do not lunge in warm-up or show arenas.

No Trainers are permitted on foot in the show ring during competition. Trainers are allowed in the ring on warm-up days.

Photography & Media Consent: By competing or attending with Sand Hill Equestrian Events LLC, all exhibitors, spectators, and attendees grant SHEE the unrestricted right to use photographs, media, and/or video footage from the show for promotional purposes. No unauthorized photography is allowed; unauthorized photographers will be asked to leave.

Management reserves the right to refuse or cancel entries, disqualify, remove awards or prizes, and/or adjust the time schedule, combine, scratch, or move classes as necessary. Management will not be responsible for any loss or damage. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor holds this horse show blameless for any loss or accident. All judge's decisions are final.

Riders can earn qualifying scores for the Regional Adult Amateur Championships (RAAC). Horses can earn CDS Horse Performance Awards. A USEF-licensed judge provides educational feedback and official scores.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

ALL JUMPERS

No combinations for .80m and below. Classes judged in accordance with USEF jumper rules. Judges and management will follow USEF/USHJA rules to ensure the safety & welfare of horses and riders. Traditional attire is encouraged but riders will not be dismissed on the basis of attire unless deemed unsafe. Prize money, if offered, will be split: 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 12%, 10%.

JUMPER EQUITATION

Open to JR/AM riders only. Minimum 8 fences at the specified jumper height. Judged on equitation style, technical ability, seat guidance, & control for a jumper-style ride. No timers or time allowed. Penalized for refusals, falls, going off course, or rails down. Limit 2 refusals. Jumper bits & equipment allowed. Jumping penalties follow USEF Equitation rules.

CLOVERLEAF JUMPER CHALLENGE

Open to JR/AM riders not showing in any jumper class over 3'3" (1.0m) during this show year. Minimum 9 fences at 2'7" (80cm). Judged under any/all USEF jumper tables. Jumper-type bit or equipment allowed, except draw reins. Minimum 2 riders must enter for the class to qualify. All ribbon winners qualify for Finals. Finals at Brookside Fall Finale: two rounds over two separate days, with a final jump-off of top 10 combined scores. Champion: golf cart; Reserve Champion: \$1,000 shopping certificate. 3rd–10th place receive awards. Previous Cloverleaf Equitation Finals winners are ineligible.

ALL HUNTERS & EQUITATION

Traditional attire and equipment is required for placing. Riders may choose non-compete status at any time before entering the in-gate. Judges will follow USEF/USHJA rules. **Key rules:** No martingales permitted in hack or flat classes. No boots or polo wraps in hunter classes. Prize money split: 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 12%, 10%.

HUNTERS & EQUITATION OVER FENCES

- **Poles:** ridden at trot or canter. No lead changes required.
- **Crossrails:** ridden at trot or canter. Jumps not to exceed 18"/crossrail size with no fill. No lead changes required.
- **Hunters 2':** no oxers. Simple changes of lead allowed. Striding at judge's discretion.
- **Hunters 2'3":** includes oxers. Striding at judge's discretion.
- **Hunters 2'6", 2'9", 3':** judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules.

FLAT & UNDER SADDLE CLASSES

- Classes with excessive entries may be split A/B at judge's discretion.
- All flat classes need 3 entries to run; classes & age groups may be combined if fewer than 3 entries.
- **Poles Equitation / U/S:** judged at walk and trot only.
- **Crossrail Equitation / U/S:** judged at walk, trot, and canter.
- All other Hunter U/S and Flat Equitation judged per USEF/USHJA rules.

SAND HILL EQUESTRIAN MEDAL: 2'3"

The Sand Hill Medal provides a fun and educational finals experience for junior and amateur riders. Grand prize for the final winner; all finalists receive prizes. Judge's personal feedback discussion held for all finalists. Any rider that has previously won the Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

★ **Qualifying Classes:** Riders who place in any Sand Hill Medal class during the competition year are eligible for the finals. Offered at every WSS show in the season. Fences not to exceed 2'3". Minimum 3 riders must complete the course to qualify. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1–16. Open to JR/AM riders not showing at 2'6" or above.

★ **Medal Finals:** Held on Sunday at the WSS Fall Finale. Eligibility: 1) winning a qualifying class, or 2) placing top 10 in the final qualifying class on Saturday. Riders will receive a posted order. Judges may integrate a test or work off per the same qualifying specifications.



CLASS SPECIFICATIONS (CONTINUED)

USHJA OUTREACH HUNTER DERBY

Open to JR/AM riders only. Fences set at 2'6", with option fences no more than 3" higher than the course. May be offered as a two-round classic/handy format or "Hunt and Go" format per current USHJA 2'6" JR/AA Hunter Derby Specifications. Open numerical scoring system. One point added for each option fence jumped successfully.

MADDEN CROSSRAIL MEDAL

Established in 2023 for Jr/Am riders in honor of William Bill Madden. For junior or amateur riders starting or returning to competition who are not competing over 1'9" from October Final to October Final. Two riders must enter for the class to count as a qualifier. Any rider earning a ribbon (1st–10th or 1st–8th) qualifies. Riders who subsequently compete at 2' height are disqualified from Crossrail Finals. Finals held at Brookside Fall Finale in October. Champion receives a golf cart; Reserve Champion receives a \$1,000 shopping certificate. Previous winners are ineligible for future Finals.

PASO PARK 2'6" MEDAL

Fences not to exceed 2'6". Minimum two riders must complete the course. Top four riders may be asked to work off at judge's discretion. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1–17. May be run in either a jumper or hunter competition arena; jumper-style tack permitted, no time allowed. Open to all JR/AM riders. Riders may not cross-enter the Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider 2' Medal. Finals at Turkey Trot & Jump. Points: 1st – 7pts, 2nd – 5pts, 3rd – 4pts, 4th – 3pts, 5th – 2pts, 6th – 1pt. Riders with 7+ points invited to Medal Final. Previous Paso Park 3' Medal Final winners ineligible.

LINDSAY ASHBURN MEMORIAL GREEN RIDER 2' MEDAL

Fences not to exceed 2'. Hunter-style equitation. Minimum two riders must complete the course. Top four riders may work off at judge's discretion. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1–6 and 10–13. Open to all JR/AM riders who have not competed above 3'. Riders may not cross-enter the Paso Park Medal. Finals at Turkey Trot & Jump. Same points structure as Paso Park Medal. Riders with 7+ points invited to Final. Previous Green Rider Medal Final winners ineligible.





CONNEMARA CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

The following classes are unique to the West Coast Connemara Show. For dressage, hunters, and jumpers, Connemara riders enter WSS classes directly; see the WSS class specifications and the Saturday correlations table on page 6. Classes may be combined or split if entries warrant.

HALFBRED CONNEMARA IN-HAND

Classes 918–920. Open to Halfbred Connemara only. Judged to the ACPS breed standard; shown in hand at walk and trot. One attendant per horse. May be split by sex if entries warrant.

CONNEMARA IN-HAND

Classes 921–933. Open to registered purebred Connemara only. Foals through stallions, plus championships (Filly/Mare, Gelding, Stallion, Breed Supreme) and Produce of Dam / Get of Sire group classes. Judged to the ACPS breed standard; transmissible weakness counted strongly against breeding stock.

PROSPECT HUNTERS

Classes 935, 937, 938. Open to Connemara and Halfbred Connemara at the start of their career (no more than three prior shows of any type). Walk/trot only; fences 18". Canter between fences is not penalized; cantering into a fence is. Cross-enter only with walk/trot, trail, and breed classes. Over fences classes run with WSS crossrail classes; see page 6.

TRAIL CLASSES

Held Friday over a trail course. Tests may include walk-overs, back-through, gate, bridge, carrying objects, and mount/dismount. Open to all breeds. Divisions: 12 & Under, Junior, Adult Amateur, Prospect, Green, Regular. Baby Obedience in Hand offered for horses not yet started under saddle.

CELTIC CAPER CLASSES

Held Friday. Open to all breeds and ages, purely for fun; no points toward Division Championships. Family Class, Pairs, Western Pleasure & Equitation, Bareback Equitation, Costume Class, and Games.

12 & UNDER DIVISION

Walk/Trot Equitation, Pleasure, and Showmanship. Open to all breeds; runs with the WSS open classes. Walk/trot riders may not enter any class which canters. Future Olympians (6 & Under) offered on Friday.

17 & UNDER DIVISION

Open Equitation, Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, Pairs, and Hunter Hack 2'6". Open to all breeds; runs with the WSS open classes. Schedule on RingRadar.

Eligibility reminder: Horses in Connemara breed classes must be ACPS-registered or carry their country-of-origin registry number (CPBS or BCPS, for example), with a copy of papers accompanying the entry. Horses must be shown under their full registered names. No exceptions.
