Fees: Entry fees for all Outreach Classes are \$35. Classic/ Derby prices are listed as follows: \$60/ \$500, \$45/ \$250 **PLEASE NOTE A 4% FEE WILL BE ASSESSED FOR ANY CREDIT CARD CHARGE**

Service Fee—All horses, showing or non-showing, will be assessed a fee of \$15 per day while on premises. This fee allows for unlimited adds and scratches (with the exception of same day adds), access to schooling areas and competition rings at designated times, **and includes Night Watch.**

Post Entry Fees: \$25/ horse if received after August 25th

Adds/ Scratches: Same day adds must be done by 8 am to prevent the \$10/ add fee per class. **Scratches:** **A scratch must be done before the show day has started, otherwise you will be charged for that class. SCRATCHES MAY NOT BE MADE AT THE GATE!!!!**

****** NEW INFORMATION: Schooling: For horses ENTERED into the show. NO HORSES ARE PERMITTED ON THE GROUNDS IF THEY ARE NOT ENTERED INTO THE SHOW. IF THERE ARE HORSES THAT ARE NOT ENTERED INTO THE SHOW ON THE GROUNDS, THERE WILL BE A \$500 FINE.**

Open schooling will be offered THURSDAY afternoon for \$50/ per horse. **Hacking will be permitted in the mornings on show days in each arena**

ALL LUNGING must be done in ARENA 2. NO lunging will be permitted in the SHOW arena at any time. UHJA Horse Shows is following all the rules and regulations that UHJA requires, all classes on the schedule and class list that are asterisk (*) are NOT UHJA point classes. If you plan on riding in a UHJA medal class, you must be a member of UHJA. Forms will be available in the show office. All class requirements are located on the UHJA website under member resources.

1. EQUINE HEALTH AND WELFARE

Any horse on the show grounds with a fever of unknown origin or of suspicious origin must be reported to Horse Show Management and to the Show Veterinarian. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.

Please take the time to review equine hygiene practices. Please convey the importance of this to your equine caretakers for their daily routines.

2. RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER AND INDEMNIFICATION GR908

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing. **I AGREE** in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following: **I AGREE** that the "Federation" and "Competition" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations. **I AGREE** that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, loungeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm"). **I AGREE** to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition. **I AGREE** to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition. **I AGREE** to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR801 and, if applicable, EV114 and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and **AGREE** to all of the above GR9 - PRIZE LISTS © USEF 2016 || provisions and **AGREE** to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition. **I AGREE** that if I am injured at this competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the Federation on the official USEF accident/injury report form. BY SIGNING BELOW, **I AGREE** to be bound by all applicable Federation Rules and all terms and provisions of this entry blank and all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If I am signing and submitting this Agreement electronically, I acknowledge that my electronic signature shall have the same validity, force and effect as if I affixed my signature by my own hand.

3. HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE AND MANAGEMENT

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to

change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

4. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS

Competition Days: Office opens one hour before the start of the first class and closes 30 minutes following the last class. Non-Competition Days: 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM

5. ENTRIES

The closing date for entries of the UHJA show is Aug 25th. Entries received at the show will be charged a late fee of \$25. Entries should be submitted through RINGRADAR.com. **Numbers WILL NOT be issued without a SIGNED OPEN CHECK/ and or Credit Card on file logged with the Horse Show Secretary.** The entry form for each show must include the following:

6. DEPOSIT: \$35

VALID CREDIT CARD MUST BE ON FILE TO ENTER. CREDIT CARD WILL NOT BE CHARGED UNTIL Oct 15th, CHECK MAY BE PROVIDED AT CLOSE OF SHOW TO AVOID CREDIT CARD PROCESSING of 4%

4.FEE SCHEDULE

Mandatory office/grounds fee of \$15/ day. Arenas will be available for schooling the day prior to the first day of competition. Please refer to the schedule for schooling times and heights.

Post Entry Fee. Regular fees will be charged for all post entries plus a \$25/ horse Post Entry Fee.

A check returned for any reason will incur a \$50 Returned Check Fee.

Horses scratched from the show will be charged a \$75 Scratch Fee. Horses scratched from the show before the closing date will receive a full refund. Scratching special classes AFTER 5PM the day prior to the class results in forfeiture of all entry fees.

on-Showing Horse Fee: Non showing horses will pay a \$25 non-showing horse fee.

Convenience Fee: all accounts closed with a credit card will pay a 5% per entry convenience fee

7. ADDED CLASS POLICY

ALL ADD/DROPS WILL BE PERFORMED BY EXHIBITOR OR TRAINER ON HORSESHOWTIME.COM PRIOR TO 5PM ON THE EVE OF SHOW DAY TO AVOID PENALTY

Please note that a \$10 charge per class will be added for Day-of-Adds as we encourage riders/trainers to add classes the day prior at no charge to allow for more accurate scheduling. Day-of-Ads will be based on schedule availability and management approval. There is no guarantee that Day-of-Ads will be accepted.

Featured Classes: Horses entering the same day may be required to go first and will pay the entry fee and a \$10 post entry fee.

8. CAVEAT DUE TO UNCERTAINTY

All Hunter Classics with prize money require 6 entries to fill and complete or the classes may be combined or canceled

All Jumper Classes with prize money require 6 entries to fill and complete or the class may be combined or canceled

9. ACCIDENTS INVOLVING COMPETITORS USEF GR1316.2

In the event of a fall/accident where the competitor is apparently unconscious or concussed, he/she is precluded from competing until evaluated by qualified medical personnel as defined in GR1211.5. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the competition.

ENTRY CLOSING: Entries must be submitted electronically. USEF, USHJA and various other organizations have specific requirements for entry and participation in certain or all classes at this competition. Proof of membership for owners, riders and trainers, USEF Pony, Junior and Small Hunter measurement cards and horse recording numbers are among the items that sanctioning organizations require. Competitors are responsible for knowledge of the requisite rules and for providing the required data. Non-member, Show Pass and other fees may be assessed if these items are not available. Competitors may be refused entry into certain classes if required information is not provided.

j) MICROCHIP VERIFICATION: All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be eligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions.

k) SAFE SPORT VERIFICATION: As of January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete SafeSport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are bound by the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies, also known as the MAAPP. This includes the SafeSport Training requirement for adult members and participants who have regular contact with minor athletes. Additionally, please be reminded about reporting obligations. Any concerns that are non-sexual in nature, please use the USEF SafeSport Incident Reporting Form available on the USEF website. Concerns or suspicions regarding sexual misconduct must be reported to <https://safesport.isight.com/portal> and the authorities if a minor is involved. All of this information can be found in the USEF Safe Sport Policy. To find the most up to date information, see the new USEF Safe Sport web pages on the USEF website including comprehensive resources regarding USEF Safe Sport efforts. 1. ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE: Horse arrival is anytime after 6:00 am on Wednesday. Departure is anytime before 8:00pm on Sunday. **Early arrivals and/or late departures must be arranged in advance by emailing Holly Dwyer - altahillstack@gmail.com.**

2. STABLING: STABLING REQUEST FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO RESERVE STALLS:

Stabling Request can be emailed to Altahillstack@gmail.com

Stalls are reserved on a first come first reserved basis only upon submission of the stabling request form. First bedding is not included. Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls. Stall fees are not refundable after entry closing date.. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges. Private transactions involving stalls are not permitted. Whether occupied by horses, feed or tack stall fees remain the same:

1.. STABLE AREA: Between the hours of 9:00 pm and 7:00am music may not be played in the stable area. At all other times the noise level may not exceed 75 decibels for more than three consecutive minutes. Smoking is not allowed anywhere in the stable area. Aisle ways may not be blocked at any time.

2. NON-SHOWING HORSES: Any horse on the grounds but not competing must be registered as a Non-Showing Horse. This includes completing and signing an entry blank, along with paying the requisite fee(s). Non-showing horses must pay the service fee of \$15/ day.

3. FEED AND BEDDING: Feed and bedding are available for purchase during the horse show. If you want a delivery available upon your arrival, please make sure to email: Altahillstack@gmail.com Please note all deadlines and provide all required information in order to ensure your delivery. Same day shaving orders are available through Saturday of each show providing that orders are placed with the show office by 11:00 am.

4. PAYMENT METHODS: The horse show accepts cash, money order, checks drawn on an American bank and credit cards. Credit Cards accepted are VISA, Mastercard, Discover and American Express. **Credit Cards will be charged a 4% convenience fee.**

5. UNPAID ACCOUNTS: All accounts not settled by 5:00pm on the last day of competition of the competition week will be closed out by the show secretary using the payment information provided. All persons issuing returned checks and/or declined credit cards will have ten days to settle their account, with cash or cash equivalent (including penalty) or will be turned over to USEF for disciplinary action. Accounts not closed out by Tuesday following each show may be assessed a penalty of \$75.

6. NUMBERS: Horse entry numbers will not be released without form of payment and having all necessary paperwork completed. All horses on the grounds will be assigned a number, including non-showing horses. ***In the effort to keep all our horses safe and healthy entry numbers must accompany horses at all times when not in their assigned stabling area. The show number must be attached to the horse or the individual riding, lunging or handling.***

7. NON-NEGOTIABLE FUNDS: All returned checks and declined credit cards will be charged a 10% penalty (\$50 minimum). Account holders will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash, cash equivalent or credit card. After 10 days without payment the horse show will notify USEF and other sanctioning organizations for disciplinary action.

8. USEF RULE GR901.11: The horse show policies stated herein regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of USEF Rule GR901.11.

9. MINOR EXHIBITORS: No minor's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian.

10. SPECIAL CLASSES: See Special Class information in Division Specifications for adding, scratching, and minimum entry requirements.

11. ADDING REGULAR CLASSES: There is no additional (post entry) fee to add regular classes. **Adds must be done by 5:00pm the day preceding the class.** Same day adds are allowed there will be a \$10 per class late fee and all same day adds must be made in the horse show office. Adds and Scratches should be made using ringradar.com.. If you have any trouble please don't hesitate to come by the horse show office for technical support, we are here to help you!

12. SCRATCHING REGULAR CLASSES: Classes (with the exception of classics and special classes) scratched prior to the start of the class will receive full credit. We strongly encourage all scratches to be handled online through ringradar.com..

13. SHOW SCRATCH: A "Show Scratch" is applied to any horse entered in the show that does not show in any classes and is not registered as a "Non- showing Horse." In order to be eligible for a refund, Show Scratches must be submitted in writing (email okay) by the deadlines described herein. Show Scratches submitted before the official closing date for the show entered will receive a full refund of the stall fee, the service fee, the deposit, and any other fees paid. Show Scratches submitted after the closing date and before the start of the show will receive a refund of the service fee and a refund of the stall fee only if the stall can be re-sold by the show. The entry deposit will only be refunded after closing date in extraordinary circumstances.

14. SUBSTITUTIONS: Under the same ownership, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse as long as the scratched horse has not shown in any classes. The scratched horse's Service Fee and stall fee are transferred to the substituted horse with no penalty. The scratched horse will pay only the \$100 deposit.

15. CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters in order to reduce delays. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely. Trainer conflicts are not considered legitimate conflicts.

16. MINIMUM ENTRIES: Medal classes that do not have enough entries to fill by 4:00 pm the night preceding the class will be combined if possible, and otherwise canceled. For regular classes, a minimum of three entries to fill. For Special Classes—see section on Special classes.

17. RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter): Entries that show in a class that are not properly entered will be charged the class entry fee plus a \$20.00 RDNE Fee.

18. PRIZE MONEY: Prize money will be automatically added to your show bill.

19. SCHOOLING: Schooling will be permitted in designated areas only. The word schooling includes, but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading, and exercising. Poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted anywhere at the Utah State Bastain Center.. Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for fines and/or elimination. Ticketed schooling may be held in the Main Hunter Ring. Hunter Ring will be open from 6:30am to 8:30:00am each day for hacking only. **Ticketed rounds must be signed up for the evening prior and are 35/ round day of show 7-8:30 - .**

20. LUNGING: Horses may be lunged in the designated lunging areas only. The correct and current show entry number must be attached to the horse or the individual lunging. No lunging in any show arena or show arena warm up area is permitted.

21. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters have authority as agents of management to enforce USEF schooling rules.

22. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Per USEF GR801.2 All persons are required to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag while mounted anywhere on the competition grounds. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition.

SAFETY VESTS: Per GR801.4 Any exhibitor may wear a protective vest either body protecting or inflatable, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest pass or surpass the current ASTM standard F1937 or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute.

23. DAMAGE / HOLES IN STALLS & BARN WALLS: Damage to stalls (permanent or portable) will be billed to the account of the owner of the horse occupying the stall, or in the case of tack stalls to the trainer assigned the stalls. All stalls will be checked by the barn manager prior to move in of the horses. Please note any prior damage to stalls to the barn manager immediately upon occupancy to avoid any incorrect charges.

24. ARENAS: All warm up and competition arenas contain clay/ sand footing. Approximate size of arenas: **Indoor arena**—200'x 380', **Covered Arena**—150' x 275'

25. MOTORIZED VEHICLES / GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

26. PERSONAL ELECTRONIC TRANSPORT DEVICES: GR1301.8 The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

27. DOGS: All dogs must be on leashes or otherwise contained, this includes Bull Dogs. Owners of loose dogs will be subject to a fine of up to \$100 and the issuance of a USEF Official Warning Card.

28. MEDICAL WASTE: Sharps must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a \$100 fine per occurrence.

29. VACCINATIONS and HEALTH CERTIFICATES:

a. Per USEF GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule: At Federation licensed competitions, horses more than 7 months of age entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horse not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

b. Statement of Health/Veterinary Health Certificate: A health certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of arrival at USU Bastain center. is required. To facilitate a quick and easy entry to the horse park we highly recommend that you submit the required health certificates prior to travel. **Health certificates can be submitted for pre-check to:**

30. RV PARKING: RV spaces with electricity are available but limited. Please let horse show management know prior to the show.

31. PONY, JUNIOR & SMALL HUNTER MEASUREMENT: All Ponies, Junior and Small Hunters are required to possess a current USEF Measurement Card or valid measurement form and it must be shown at the horse show office before numbers are released. Measurements can be scheduled throughout the show by signing up in the horse show office.

32. CRUELTY AND ABUSE: Per USEF GR838 Any action(s) against a horse by any person which are deemed excessive by a Federation judge, Federation steward, technical delegate, or competition veterinarian in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds or evidence of action(s) described above on a horse on competition grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination. Such action(s) could include, but are not limited to excessive or inappropriate use of equipment, including but not limited to the whip or spurs. Evidence may include raw, bleeding, or irritated skin, or welts consistent with excessive use or inappropriate use of equipment. **Cruelty and Abuse will not be tolerated at any time, anywhere at the USU Bastain Center.**

33. ANIMAL WELFARE: We require that all horse be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subjected to mistreatment. At all times, while the horse is on the show grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing all rules pertaining to the welfare of the horse. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers organizers, sponsors or officials.

IN THE EVENT OF AN ACUTE AND SERIOUS INJURY TO OR ILLNESS OF A HORSE ON COMPETITION GROUNDS WHEN THE OWNER OR PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE HORSE (TRAINER OF THE HORSE OR AGENT OF THE OWNER) IS NOT PRESENT, AFTER REASONABLE EFFORT TO CONTACT THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN MADE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH A LICENSED VETERINARIAN, MAY AUTHORIZE THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY VETERINARY TREATMENT OF THE HORSE. IF COMPETITION MANAGEMENT SO AUTHORIZES TREATMENT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE RULE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT AND VETERINARIAN ARE NOT LIABLE FOR ANY RESULTING COSTS, DAMAGES, LOSSES, CLAIM OR ACTIONS ARISING DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FROM THE TREATMENT OF THE HORSE.

34. MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions with regard to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, alter any course, cancel, combine, or re- schedule classes, change rings, substitute judges, change specifications in jumper classes, etc. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by Management whose decision will be final.

35. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Please be advised that alcoholic beverages in any form may not be brought onto the grounds of the USU Bastain Center.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

RELEASE OF LIABILITY

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND DEFINITIONS OF THE RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER AND INDEMNIFICATION

In consideration for entry upon the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES of the COMPETITION, the undersigned on behalf of myself, my trainers, instructors, coaches, clients, agents, employees, grooms, invitees, representatives, assigns, executors, heirs, independent contractors (including but not limited to veterinarians, farriers, masseuse, chiropractor, therapists, braiders, shippers), and, if applicable, on behalf of my minor child or children (hereinafter collectively referred to as "I") agrees:

I agree that COMPETITION as used in this entry blank, in the prize list and in the USEF rules means Colorado Spring Series (individually and as a whole), each and every class and/or event conducted and ALL ACTIVITIES that I undertake AT ANY TIME upon entry of the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES including any horse which is on the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES for my use, in my control or at my request. I further agree that COMPETITION includes the entire week of the horse show including the time horses and/or people are allowed to enter to set up, stable and/or conduct business whether its expressly and/ or specifically related to the horse show and classes being conducted/held that week through and including the time all horses and/or people vacate the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES II agree that this Release of Liability includes any horse that I have asked to come onto the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES for any purpose, and/or is in my control and/or custody and regardless whether the horse is being stabled at the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and/or competing in the COMPETITION.

I agree that "RELEASED PARTIES" means the competition known as Colorado Spring Series (individually and as a whole), the "Horse Show Management" as referenced in the prize list, Langer Equestrian Group, Inc. and each of their officers, directors, managers, members, owners, shareholders, employees, representatives, agents, subsidiaries, volunteers, officials, affiliated and associated persons, companies and organizations, assigns and entities or organizations related to Horse Show Management and/or related to or manage the property owned by such entities. I agree that SHOW GROUND FACILITIES means the Colorado Horse Park including but not limited to all improvements, structures (permanent or temporary), buildings, tents, stalls, fixtures (including but not limited to all jumps and related equipment), arenas, exercise and schooling areas (and the footing therein) located on the premises and/or provided by RELEASED PARTIES during the COMPETITION. I agree that if I am not a member of USEF that I will abide by all rules and regulations of USEF. I agree that the Rules of the Prize List are incorporated as if set forth herein.

RELEASE AND WAIVER OF CLAIMS: I hereby fully and forever release, waive and discharge the RELEASED PARTIES and each of them who are or might be liable in any way from any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of actions, liabilities of any kind which I may or might have against RELEASED PARTIES or any of them, arising from or by reason of any and all known and unknown, foreseen or unforeseen bodily and personal injuries, damage to property, injury to horse and any consequences thereof, which I may sustain due to the ordinary negligence of RELEASED PARTIES; I further agree that except for the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the RELEASED PARTIES, I shall not bring any legal action, claim, demand against and/or sue for any economic and non-economic losses due to bodily injury, death, property damage and/or injury to any horse in relation to the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and/or the operation and conduct of the COMPETITION. I agree this RELEASE INCLUDES ALL ACTIVITIES I PARTICIPATE IN AND ALL AREAS OF THE SHOW GROUND FACILITIES as defined above.

HOLD HARMLESS: I hereby agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless RELEASED PARTIES from and against any and all claims, liabilities, loss, damages, demands, actions, causes of action, including attorneys' fees, cost and expenses of any kind, which may be made against them, or any of them, by anyone, which arise out of my actions, including my ordinary negligence, including active and passive, and gross negligence or willful misconduct and/or the active or passive negligence of RELEASED PARTIES while either I or any horse at my request or in my control is/was on the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and/or participating in the COMPETITION.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I hereby acknowledge and assume the risk that equestrian activity, including jumping, is very dangerous and involves the risk of serious injury and/or death and/or property damage. I expressly acknowledge that injuries may be compounded or increased by negligent maintenance of the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES, faulty or improperly secured equipment, improper supervision or compliance with USEF rules and regulations, Acts of God and negligent rescue operations or procedures of RELEASED PARTIES and negligent handling of horses and independent operations by trainers, riders and/ or boarders who use the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES or others who are not affiliated with RELEASED PARTIES. I acknowledge that horses can be injured

while being ridden, groomed, stabled, walked and/or exercised and I expressly assume the risk of injury to any horse under my control and/or custody or on the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES at my request.

This agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with respect to all RELEASED PARTIES, except for the USEF as set forth on page one. I agree this Release extends to all acts of ordinary negligence of RELEASED PARTIES and is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by law. If any portion of this Release and/or Entry Blank is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall continue in full legal force and effect. I have not relied on any oral representations or statements made that are contrary to or modify the above Release or warnings. I agree that by signing the front page of this Entry Blank that I am bound by the Release, waiver and warnings contained herein and that both sides/pages constitute one incorporated agreement. If applicable, I agree I have the express authority to sign this entry blank/Release on behalf of the owner and/or rider.

Federation Entry Agreement: By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longueur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Summer in the Rockies Series.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.
