## HOW I GET MY INSPIRATION by A Weird Tales Author

A fundamental requisite, however, is the possession of some antique book. At present the ancient manuscripts used are these: The Book of Eibon. The Neronamicon. The My-teries of the Worm, Unaussprechlichen Kulten, Cultes des Goules, and the Black Boook. All these may be purchased from Panurge Press for \$1.49, prepaid. They will be sent to you in a plain realed wranper.

Other references are indispensable. Suppose you are writing a story about tailsmans and prophecies. You will need to refer to such magazines as Signs and Invention, or The Omen's Hom Companion.

Then, too, you mut. exercise a vocabulary. Practice using such words as ANTHROPOLITH, VIVISEPULTURE, NACROCOSMIO TERATOLOGICAL, ANTHROPOMORPHOSIS. NOCTAMBULIST, NYCTA-PHOBIA, NYCTALOPTIC, etc. Fifteen minutes a day devoted to writing down such words will not only provide you with a vocabulary, but will also give you writer's cremp.

Always write your stories at midnight, preferably in a pitch-dark room. Stories should be written on the skin of a gander. That usually gives the readers gooce flesh.

Follow the above rules and you can't go wrong. If, however, for some strang reason these hints fall you, always remember there is one more infallible way to break into the pages of Weird Tales.
