Kinross Curling Trust: Sponsorship and Fundraising Committee

Please help us raise funds to purchase an IceMaster!

This group met for the first time on 15th December and have set out a plan of action for the future to coordinate sponsorship and fundraising. We are eager to attract local businesses to use our rink and our great sport of curling as a means to increase the exposure of their company and products. We also want to showcase our clubs.

There are several strands to fundraising which we will launch over the weeks and months ahead. The funds will be directed to specific targets. The first target will be to bring in sufficient funds to purchase an IceMaster machine. We are reassured by comments made so far by clubs and individuals that this target of approx £13k can be achieved before the start of next season.

The first three projects to focus on are:

- The end of ice boards
- Adopt a stone names of individuals/clubs on the curling stones
- Honours Boards clubs can purchase a board to record club results. These will be updated each season

We will use the logo above on all publicity etc linked to fundraising and sponsorship.

Look out for more details and other ways you can support the rink.

Chairman Bob retires!!

Members of KCT will have received the news that Bob has stepped down as Chair of the Board. KCT Roar is pleased to add a few details to acknowledge the long and significant role Bob has played in the development of Kinross Curling.

Bob was a Director of Scottish Curling between 2005 and 2009 and Chair 2008-09. He was the lead person in the Scottish Curling Trust during the discussions to build a National Curling Academy at Kinross. When it became clear that this project was not going to proceed, Bob and others changed focus to ensure curling had a place in Kinross. Bob was the first chair of Kinross Curling Trust and with the Board raised the substantial funds required to start the redevelopment of the rink. The energy and commitment to the task cannot be overstated.

The modernisation of the rink was dependent on raising well over £1 million. Bob was tireless in making demands on several key bodies. Sports Scotland provided a grant of £540k. Perth and Kinross followed with £150k, and a loan of 100k US dollars was secured from the WCF. A further £164k was raised in donations and loans from local businesses and curlers. Bob recalled a moment when he and Mike Caffyn had a jig on the doorstep of a local farm as they celebrated receiving two cheques for £50k each. These 2 donations meant the project had reached the target set and could proceed.

Kinross Curling Trust was awarded the Ice Diamond Award from the RCCC in 2015.

Bob stepped down from the Board in Jan 2016 after 7 years when the future of the rink had been secured. He continued to be involved for a couple of years as Chair of the Finance Committee.

During all of this time Bob has continued to be an active and successful club curler with Inverkeithing and Boreland.



Bob returned to the Board in January 2020, just before Covid had a massive impact on our sport and business. The skills and commitment required during the early years of KCT were once again employed as he led the Board and staff team through the two very difficult seasons. A crucial £132k grant from Sports Scotland was secured.

He hands over to Jim Barton with an enthusiastic Board, a new dynamic staff team, steady bookings and an optimistic outlook for curling at Kinross.

Many thanks Bob from curlers past, present and future.

Curling Development News from Kim Dalland


Looking back at the first half of this season, the most satisfying part of my job has been seeing the great progress made by some of our newest curlers. I love coming to the rink and seeing them in a game with a club or practicing with their friends, when only weeks before they had come to their first Try Curling and beginner coaching sessions.

We run Try Curling sessions for anyone wanting a taster session. No previous experience is necessary and there is no further commitment. However, for those who enjoy it, we have a beginners' course. This course runs over two sessions of two hours each, labelled week 1 and week 2. This is designed to teach the basics and prepares participants to start curling with our clubs.

All our sessions cost £12 per adult or £8 for Juniors.
