## NEW EVENT TO BE LAUNCHED AT KINROSS

The South of England Curling Club is organizing a new super league for competitive teams based in the U.K. during the 2024/25 curling season. This is intended for teams that enter national championships in England, Scotland, Wales, and Ireland that are not currently receiving sponsorship from British Curling. The league exists to promote

quality competition for the "competitive amateur". We welcome men's, women's, juniors, seniors, and mixed fours teams,

The league will run on Saturdays and Sundays over three weekends in the curling season. The format will be two games on Saturday and one game on Sunday morning. We will also have a dinner each Saturday evening for the teams to promote the social side of the game.

The Dates

Week 1. Kinross 7/8 September 2024

Week 2. Dumfries 5/6 October 2024

Week 3. Dumfries 18/19 January 2025

The total cost for the season is  $\mathfrak{L}900$  per team. This will include a 9-minute practice before every game. A meal each Saturday night at the host rink. And a small kitty for cash prizes. We'll pay out  $\mathfrak{L}20$  to a team per win and some additional prizes for the playoff high road and low road winners, plus a skins competition for teams that don't make the finals. This assumes 8 teams. Prizes will be adjusted if we attract a larger field. We have a maximum capacity for 16 teams. To register teams must sign up and put down a  $\mathfrak{L}300$  deposit. The remainder of the fees ( $\mathfrak{L}600$ ) will be due August 25th.
