FIRST SECTION OF END OF SEASON REPORT BY KCT CHAIRMAN - JIM BARTON

By any standard, this has been a remarkable season. The purchase of the rink in October stands out, of course. It marks the culmination of incredible and sustained support from curlers at Kinross since the Trust took on responsibility for the refurbishment and operation of the rink in 2013. That initial upgrading cost well in excess of £1m and was funded by grants, loans and donations with local curlers providing a very significant proportion of that funding, so it was fantastic that, this season, our curlers were able to provide loans and donations that allowed us to purchase the freehold without the need for any commercial borrowing. Thank you to everyone involved. But it's not just those curlers who have provided financial support that I need to thank. Everyone who uses the facilities both on the ice and upstairs helps to make the facility what it is today, so thank you.

There have been many highlights over the season. We started with the British Curling League event with teams from across the UK competing over the opening weekend. This was the second year that we have hosted this tournament. It's a great way to start our season and we hope to hold it again in the coming season. The International Bonspiel goes from strength to strength with 20 teams taking part, we were very pleased to host the U14 Slam for the first year and we were very proud to have 24 teams playing in the Indoor Grand Match. The biggest single event that we hosted, the finals of the Henderson Bishop towards the end of the season, was a fantastic occasion. In fact, all of these events were tremendously successful and we received so many positive comments regarding the quality of the ice, the fantastic catering and bar facilities and the warm welcome from everyone involved at Kinross*to be continued*

The ParalympicsGB 'Every Body Moves' Award

In March, the month during which the Paralympics were being held in Cortina, we at Kinross Curling were honoured and excited to have won the ParalympicsGB 'Every Body Moves' 'Club of the Month Award'. The 'Every Body Moves' programme is ParalympicsGB's grassroots participation initiative and the UK's largest inclusive activity finder. The award has been presented in collaboration with Scottish Disability Sports and British Curling and celebrates clubs and providers setting the gold standard of what inclusive and adaptive provision can be and breaking down barriers to create even more opportunities for the disabled community to be physically active in ways that suit the individual.

Main credit goes to coach **Dottie Burt** for her involvement in and running of the inclusive programmes at Kinross. We were told that in their initial investigations they looked at all the curling rink websites and found ours to be the easiest to navigate and to find information about our inclusive programmes., which is thanks to our Office Manager, **Angela Wilcox**. We were also praised for our communication; we won out of a shortlist of 10 curling rinks.

ParalympicsGB produced a fabulous short video showcasing some of our inclusive curling. Search for 'Every Body Moves' on Facebook and Instagram to see it.

The trophy we received was presented to **Elaine Spain** with thanks and congratulations for all her coaching of our Inclusive groups, which she does with skill and compassion.

If anyone with any physical challenges would like to give curling a go please get in touch.

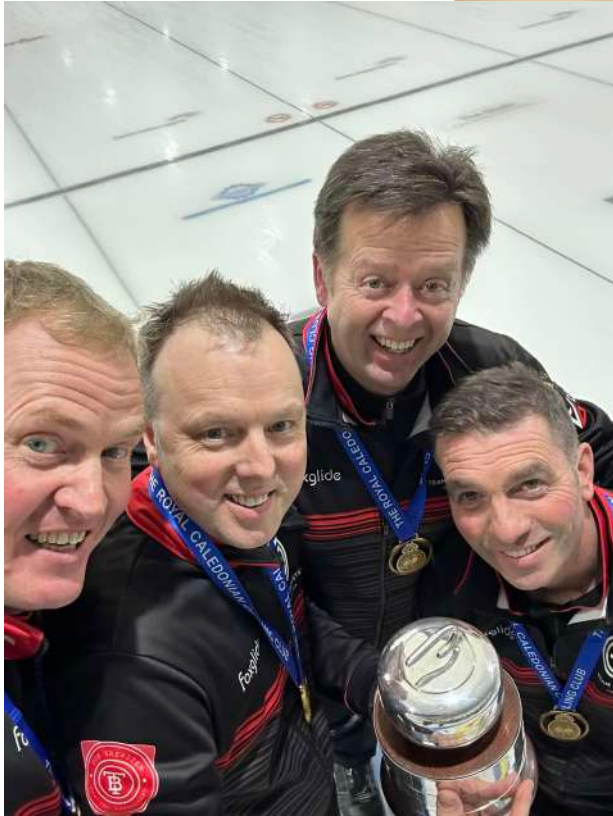

There were two sessions of play with 6 teams in each:

1430 Killin, Kilsyth, Doune, Muthill, Dundee, Coupar Angus & Kettins

1730 Orwell, Hercules Ladies, Markinch, Dunfermline, Cupar, Gargunnock

We sourced 16 pairs of the older curling stones in our Collection for them to play with and everybody used hair brooms or corn brooms to sweep with rather than the modern pads.

For part of the session the teams delivered the stones from a crampit as opposed to a hack.

Alongside the three sheets of teams competing for the prizes we had some of the oldest stones in the collection for anybody to have a go at delivering on the 4th sheet.

The Bonspiel was open to spectators and was a real treat.

..... Away from the ice, the 9th End Cafe and Bar goes from strength to strength. Whether it's providing food for bonspiels and club events, Christmas Lunches, Burns Suppers and Quiz nights or just lunch in the bar, the food is great and the welcome warm.

We are very lucky to have the staff that we have and lucky too to have a very appreciative clientele.

We are already starting to plan for next season and I expect all Match Secretaries are busy looking at ice requirements. On that, there are some things that I would ask clubs and individuals to consider.

We have had an incredible season in terms of curling development, particularly towards the end of the season because of the boost from the Winter Olympics. Kim Dalland and the coaches have done a fantastic job putting people through the Try Curling and Beginners programme. Many of these have already joined KCDC and we expect more will at the start of next season. These will feed into clubs over the next couple of years. Kim and her team will be working hard next season to put more new curlers through the programme but I would ask all clubs to think hard about how they can recruit new members. One way that clubs might do this would be to ask all existing members to think if there is anyone they know who might be interested in trying curling. If a club could get just three four people interested, Kim would arrange for a Try Curling session to take place at a time that suits the club and would provide the coaches for the session. Pitlessie, Glenfarg and Inverkeithing all ran this type of session successfully last season. If any club would like to look at this I know Kim would be very happy to talk to you. Bringing new curlers into the club is essential for the clubs continued future and vibrant and buoyant clubs are essential for the future of Kinross Curling. Perhaps this is something to raise at your AGMs. The curling development team really do deliver a fantastic programme over the season so it was great that the work was recognised when Kinross Curling was presented with the Paralympics GB 'Club of the Month Award' for March 2026.

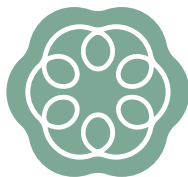

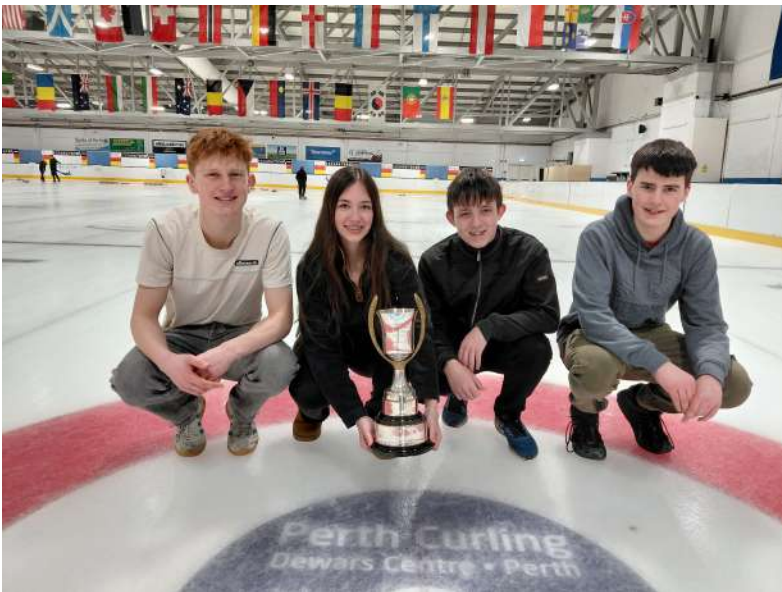


Great season for Finlay Rutherford

KCDC rink wins Low Road at National Gateway Club Challenge

A team from KCDC recently delivered an excellent performance at the Scottish Curling National Gateway Club Challenge in Stranraer, returning home with the Low Road title.

The rink—Jane Smith (Lead), Rory Stewart (Second), Sophie Humphries (Third), and David Johnstone (Skip)—made a strong start to the competition with an impressive 7-0 victory over Team Edinburgh 2 in their opening match. They then faced tougher tests in the remainder of the group stage, going down 1-7 to both Team Wallace and Team Moray. Despite those results, KCDC had still done enough to progress to the Low Road section of the playoffs. Rising to the challenge, KCDC produced a determined display in the semi-final, edging out Team Moray 4-3 in a closely fought rematch. They carried that momentum into the final, where a confident performance saw them defeat Team Fife Gateway B with a score of 6-1 to lift the Low Road trophy.

Fife & Kinross Area: Update

The Fife & Kinross Area President and Vice President (currently John Taylor, Fossoway and Iain Rennick, Glenrothes) sit on Scottish Curling's Areas Standing Committee (ASC). It has met 5 times over the season including 2 sessions with the Board.

Highlights for the year have been:

Competitions - the Area continued to run 4 competitions. Results were:

- Fife & Kinross v Perth: won by Fife & Kinross (highest-up rink: Inverkeithing +7 shots)
- George Sinclair Bonspiel: won by Boreland (+11 shots)
- Inter Province Bonspiel: won by Loch Leven Province (Fossoway, Kinross and Loch Leven Province Ladies team)
- Inter Province League: won by Cupar Province (Abdie, Ceres and Forret)

Support for Grassroots curling - a high priority for the Scottish Curling Board. There are a suite of initiatives aimed at helping clubs get new members: support available from the 3 Development Managers; workshops on how to attract and hold new members; development funding available to clubs to run their own Come & Try events; an accreditation scheme to raise standards of governance and help clubs provide a 'safe' environment for new members; and supporting inclusion of curlers with disabilities. Some Fife & Kinross clubs have taken advantage of these.

Indoor Grand Match - a bit late in being organised, but a great success - not least at Kinross.

Over 1500+ curlers took part overall nationwide. Extensively covered in the mainstream media. IGM may be held every 4 years from now on to coincide with Olympic cycle.

Winter Olympics - generated unprecedented interest in curling. More media and social media coverage in that month than in a normal year. Rinks inundated with requests for Come & Try sessions, most of which have been fully booked. Key is to retain that level of interest in curling through into the start of next season.

Tours - five Fife & Kinross curlers have been selected for Scottish Curling's touring team of 20 to the USA in January 2027. The next incoming tour is from Canada in January 2028.

World events - Scottish Curling are keen to attract major events such as the Worlds in future years, perhaps in 2029. Funding support is being explored.

Ice Rink Support - unfortunately a few ice rinks in Scotland remain 'at risk'. In addition to working with owners and curlers at those rinks, Scottish Curling joins with other sports such as swimming in lobbying for government support to help facilities manage rising energy costs.

Coaching - Scottish Curling has an ongoing programme to raise coaching standards, including current work to introduce a new advanced Level 3 qualification.

Restructuring - the proposal raised at 2025 RCCC AGM for a new Members Forum to replace the ASC has been parked for now. Restructuring proposals may be brought forward in 2027 flowing from the new strategy for Scottish Curling which is being developed now. All Scottish Curling members will have received an invite to take part in the members' survey which will shape this strategy.

Connor, one of our youngest coaches, has been selected as one of the Coach/Camp Leaders at the Lillehammer Youth Camp in August. The worldwide search to fill 4 posts was extensive and the application procedure was rigorous. We know Connor will do us and himself proud. Have a fantastic time!

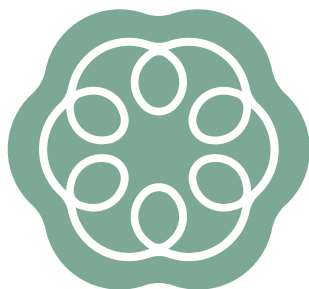
We have already had 4 or 5 clubs show interest in Christmas meals for December 2026 so again if anyone club is interested in booking please drop me an email and I will discuss further.

Development Review for 2025-2026; A Most Fabulous Season!

This has been a fabulous season for development and growth at the rink. We sold an incredible 968 'tickets' to our sessions, which included Try Curling, beginner coaching, 1-2-1s, corporate groups and private groups for family and friends.

A record number went on to join KCDC, our development club, as well as a few directly joining mainstream clubs, After-School Club, our inclusive clubs and Juniors. Out of KCDC's 71 members, 34 were new this year and nearly all directly from our coaching programme. The new curlers thrived due to KCDC's varied programme of games (well done to the KCDC Committee) plus a thorough and consistent coaching programme led by Iain Gwynne.

Although most of the interest was thanks to the exposure from and success of Team GB at the Olympics, many came by word-of-mouth, which we really appreciate.

The highlight of the season for newcomers was the Beginners' Curlympic & Paralympic Bonspiel held in March. Twenty-six beginner curlers made up eight teams with some of our club representatives as Skips. Eight of our coaches also joined in. Everyone had a great time and experienced the fun and friendship curling can bring.

The biggest thanks goes to all our dedicated coaches who gave many hours of their time to coach the 159 sessions this season! This number does not include coaching for KCDC, VICKS, KICC, After-School Club or Juniors. They are all amazing, but there can only be one Kinross Supercoach of the Year each season and this year the award went to a very deserving Stuart Morrison.
