CLUB HISTORY

1996 | 16-16-0

MLS Cup Champions, U.S. Open Cup Champions

The club's inaugural season in 1996 proved to be a fruitful one for the Black-And-Red. After a slow start in League play, United found the right balance and went into the postseason as the team to beat. They proved, however, to be the team that no one could beat, defeating the Los Angeles Galaxy 3-2 in overtime via a golden goal header by defender Eddie Pope to capture the first MLS Cup title on October 20. One title wasn't enough for the Black-and-Red that fall, as three days later United shut out the Rochester Raging Rhinos of the A-League (now the USL First Division) 3-0 to win the U.S. Open Cup, the country's oldest soccer tournament. The Black-and-Red became the first club to capture America's version of the "double."

1997 | 21-11-0

MLS Cup Champions, Supporters' Shield Winners

The team's second season was another banner year for United, as the team rolled through the regular season with a league-best record of 21-11. D.C. went a perfect 5-0 in the MLS Cup playoffs, which culminated in a 2-1 victory over the Colorado Rapids in MLS Cup '97 in front of a record – and rabid – home crowd of 57,431 at RFK Stadium.

1998 | 24-8-0

CONCACAF Champions' Cup champions, InterAmerican Cup champions

United failed to capture domestic honors for the first time in their short history, losing to the Chicago Fire 2-0 in MLS Cup '98. Though United would be disappointed on the home front, their previous success gave them the opportunity to seek honors on a larger stage. After reaching the semifinals of the CONCACAF Champions Cup in 1997, the Black-and-Red made it one step further to the finals in 1998, where they faced Mexican 'superchampeon' Toluca. A dramatic 1-0 victory at RFK Stadium not only gave the Black-and-Red their first international trophy, but also a chance for a second by earning a berth in the 1998 InterAmerican Cup. Legendary Brazilian side Vasco da Gama would be South America's representative, and they proved to be a formidable side after taking leg one of the championship at RFK Stadium by a 1-0 score. However, United shocked the Brazilian team, and much of the soccer world, by winning the away leg at Lockhart Stadium in Ft. Lauderdale by a 2-1 margin. Thanks to the pair of road goals, United broke the aggregate goals draw and came away with the InterAmerican Cup trophy and the title "Champion of the Americas." That contest proved to be a fitting farewell for head coach Bruce Arena, who left the District to conquer further international battles as the head coach of the United States Men's National Team.

1999 | 23-9-0

MLS Cup Champions, Supporters' Shield winners

The 1999 season would feature a new coach, as former Tampa Bay and New England head coach Thomas Rongen took over on the United sideline.

The club still produced the same successful results its supporters now demanded, as the squad earned their second Supporters' Shield for the League's best regular season record (23-9) and once again represented the Eastern Conference in MLS Cup. Just as in 1996, MLS Cup '99 would feature the Black-and-Red and the Galaxy in Foxboro, but this time dramatics were not necessary as a pair of first half goals gave United a 2-0 victory and their third Alan I. Rothenberg Trophy in four seasons.

2000 | 8-18-6

For the first time in club history, United failed to qualify for post-season competition or capture any sort of hardware. The team managed a record of just 2-9-1 to start the season and never recovered from its early struggles, finishing last in the Eastern Division. The team's midseason 3-1 win over Newcastle United at RFK Stadium was one of the rare positives in a difficult season. Another of the bright spots during the 2000 campaign was the debut of 16-year old midfielder Bobby Convey who at the time of his first game – 3/25 vs. LA Galaxy – was the youngest player to play in a MLS game.

2001 | 8-16-2

The 2001 campaign saw United supporters suffer another difficult year as the club finished last in the Eastern Division and missed out on the playoffs for a second consecutive season. For the second year in a row, United had a player debut as the youngest in League history when Santino Quaranta came on as a substitute against New England on 5/9. The 16-year old also became the youngest player to be named as a Player of the Week and a MLS All-Star.

2002 | 9-14-5

After two disappointing seasons, the United brass named former Miami Fusion head man Ray Hudson as the club's third head coach on January 8. Hudson saw his new club's push for the post-season last until the final match of the schedule, but the Black-and-Red missed out on the MLS Cup playoffs for the third straight season. 2002 did have some bright spots, however, with a trio of club and League firsts. Domestically, United hosted the 2002 MLS All-Star Game at RFK Stadium for the first time and also won the inaugural Atlantic Cup trophy in its yearly season series competition with New York. Internationally, the Black-and-Red became the first MLS side to travel to England when they defeated Tottenham Hotspur, 1-0, in a tribute match at the famed White Hart Lane in October.

2003 | 10-11-9

Following a third unsuccessful campaign, the club used the time before the start of the 2003 season to make drastic changes to the squad. U.S. National Team star Earnie Stewart was allocated to the club, bringing the veteran home from Holland, where he enjoyed unparalleled success for an American expatriate. Richie Williams, Eddie Pope and Jaime Moreno all headed north to join the MetroStars, while defender Mike Petke made the reverse journey to join the Black-and-Red. Former Indiana University standout and MLS All-Star Dema Kovalenko was also brought in to shake things up in the midfield, while his Fire teammate and

Bulgarian legend Hristo Stoitchkov was added as a player/coach. Though United struggled early in the season to pick up points, the off-season moves did pay off, as the club posted a regular season record of 10-11-9, sending the club back to the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since winning it all in 1999. However, a fourth MLS Cup was not in the cards and United fell to the Chicago Fire in the first round of the post-season.

2004 | 11-10-9

MLS Cup Champions

The beginning of 2004 saw an exciting time for the Black-and-Red, as Head Coach Peter Nowak and teen phenom Freddy Adu both joined the club in January. Nowak became the fourth United coach in team history, while Adu was the first overall selection in the MLS SuperDraft. Jaime Moreno returned to DC following a one-year stint with the MetroStars. After a 5-5-5 start during the first part of the MLS regular season, United began to buy into Coach Nowak's hardworking, aggressive and team-oriented strategy and finished the regular season with an 11-10-9 record. In the final game of the regular season, the team notched a thrilling 3-2 victory over the MetroStars that vaulted them past New York and into second place in the Eastern Conference standings. United carried their hot streak into the playoffs and dispatched of both the MetroStars in the first round and the New England Revolution in the Eastern Conference championship on the way to their fifth MLS Cup Championship game. Led by MLS Cup MVP Alecko Eskandarian, United went on to defeat the Kansas City Wizards 3-2 and capture their fourth MLS Championship. In all, United finished the season with nine victories in its last ten games while achieving the "Return to Glory."

2005 | 16-10-6

In 2005, after a middling beginning to the season, United rebounded and finished second in the Eastern Conference with a record of 16-10-6. The 16 wins were the most since 1999, when the team won 23 games. Jaime Moreno again led the Black-and-Red charge, notching 16 goals – tied for his career best. The year was also highlighted by appearances in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, Copa Nissan Sudamericana and an international friendly versus the reigning English Premier League Champion, Chelsea FC. The club's MLS season ended with a disappointing loss in the first round of MLS Cup playoffs to the Chicago Fire.

2006 | 15-7-10

Supporters' Shield winners

D.C. United reasserted themselves as the best team in Major League Soccer in 2006, bringing home their third Supporters' Shield trophy with a 15-7-10 record. United started off the season in torrid form – going unbeaten from May 1 to July 29 – for a team-best 14 straight matches. Christian Gomez led the League's most potent offense, chalking up 12 goals and 11 assists on his way to the MLS MVP award. Other highlights for the year included a 4-0 victory over Scotland's Celtic FC, and an impressive 1-1 draw against the famous Real Madrid of Spain. The club's MLS season ended with a 1-0 loss in the Eastern Conference championship to the visiting New England Revolution.

2007 | 16-7-7

Supporters' Shield winners

Tom Soehn became the fifth head coach in United history after Peter Nowak left to become assistant coach with the U.S. Men's National Team. Soehn, who had served as an assistant under Nowak since 2004, got off to a slow start, beginning the season 0-3. The Black-and-Red, however, rebounded and for the second consecutive season had the most potent attack in MLS. United won its fourth Supporters' Shield, becoming the first team in League history to win the trophy in back-to-back years. The addition of Brazilians Luciano Emilio and Fred, along with veterans Jaime Moreno, Christian Gomez and Ben Olsen helped the team score 56 regular season goals. In August, Moreno scored his 109th career regular season goal, breaking the MLS record. He finished the season with 112 career goals. The season was also highlighted by the club's participation in CONCACAF Champions' Cup, the inaugural SuperLiga and Copa Nissan Sudamericana.

2008 | 11-15-4

U.S. Open Cup Champions

Though the 2008 season saw United add its 12th major piece of hardware to the trophy case, the campaign was largely a disappointment as D.C. missed out on the MLS Cup playoffs for the first time since 2002. After a 2-7 start in League play, the team found its groove through the middle part of the year, going 8-3-1 from May 4 until August 23. Unfortunately, injuries decimated Tom Soehn's side and the team's record down the stretch was a dismal 1-5-3. Matters were complicated by the most games in club history – an astonishing 47 fixtures. The team fell short in international competitions, failing to capture hardware in the CONCACAF Champions Cup, SuperLiga and CONCACAF Champions League. The lone bright spot was the team's second U.S. Open Cup championship, which was captured after a 2-1 win over the Charleston Battery of United Soccer League's First Division.

2009 | 9-8-13

Despite the fact that United made significant changes to the 2008 team, the Black-and-Red found itself at the end of the 2009 campaign without hardware and, for the second year in a row, out of the playoffs. The team collected a League-record 13 draws as it put together a League record of 9-8-13. The club began the season admirably and found itself in first place in the Eastern Conference at the midpoint of the season with a record of 5-2-8. As the summer wore on and the games piled up, D.C. did not get the results it needed, managing a record of just 4-6-5 in the second half of the year. In other competitions, United also fell short. An impressive run in the U.S. Open Cup ended with a deflating 2-1 loss to the Seattle Sounders at RFK Stadium in the final. The team showed vast improvement in Champions League play, finishing the group stage with a 3-2-1 record, but failed to advance to the

2010 | 6-24-4

Steadying the ship in United's most tumultuous season, Ben Olsen took over as Interim Head Coach from Curt Onalfo on August 7 away to New England. The Black-and-Red showed marked improvement under Olsen, winning on August 22 2-0 over Philadelphia and beating eventual MLS Cup Champion Colorado 1-0 on the road on October 1. United also got to the semifinal round of the 2010 U.S. Open Cup, falling in extra time to Columbus. The lasting image of the 2010 campaign was of club captain and 15-year MLS veteran Jaime Moreno taking his lap of honor around RFK Stadium on October 23 in his final match for D.C. United against Toronto FC. Moreno retired as MLS' all-time leading goal scorer with 133 tallies.

purchased the team with Victor MacFarlane on January 1, 2007 from Anschutz Entertainment Group (AEG).

Chang also serves as Chairman of Westlake International Group and is the driving force behind the company's vision and direction. Westlake is a privately held diversified investment company with operations in the United States, China, Latin America, Japan, India, and Canada. KEVIN PAYNE **PRESIDENT AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER**

After careers as an award-winning radio journalist in New York City and as a marketing and special events executive in Vail, CO, Kevin Payne became

the National Administrator, and the Director of Marketing of the United States Soccer Federation in 1989. In 1991, he moved to New York and became the Executive Vice President and, ultimately, the President of Soccer USA Partners, which owned all marketing, broadcast and event promotion rights to the U.S. Men's National Team leading up to the 1994 and 1998 World Cups.

In 1994, Payne created the first ownership group for D.C. United and the team began Major League Soccer play in 1996. Since then, D.C. United has become the most successful team in United States professional soccer history, boasting 12 major domestic and international championships.

For his tireless efforts to promote soccer in this country, Payne was awarded the prestigious Werner Fricker Builder Award by U.S. Soccer in February 2011.

He is a founding member of the MLS/SUM Board of Governors, Chairman of the Technical Committee for the U.S. Soccer Federation, is the Vice Chairman of the U. S. Soccer Foundation, and is a member of the FIFA Standing Committee for Club Football. Payne is also a founding board member of United for D.C., the Greater Washington Sports Alliance and is a member of the Federal City Council.



STEPHEN ZACK

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

Executive Vice President, Stephen Zack oversees all aspects of day-to-day business operations of D.C. United. A member of D.C. United since its inception,

Zack was actively involved with the development of the D.C. United brand and marketing strategies. Formerly vice president of marketing, Zack was honored as the 1997 and 2000 MLS Marketing Executive of the Year and in 2006 was named the League's Executive of the Year.

Zack serves as the President of United for D.C., the charitable foundation of D.C. United and is also a board member of the non-profit organization, DC Scores.

Prior to coming to D.C. United, Zack was a senior manager of events for Soccer USA Partners, the marketing agent for the United States Soccer Federation, where he was responsible for a range of activities related to the staging of 40 U.S. National Team exhibition matches from 1991-1995. DAVID COPE SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

David Cope joined D.C. United as the club's senior vice president of business development in December 2007. In this role he oversees the team's sponsorship properties, relying on more than 20 years of sales and marketing experience.

Cope came to United after serving as the director of business development and sales for DC Sports and Sponsorship Sales. Previously, he worked for the Washington Nationals from 2004-2005, where he was vice president of sales and marketing. Cope built and managed a 24-person sales and marketing team that started up the Nationals in a mere 148 days. With the Nationals, he oversaw marketing, promotions, ticket sales and operations, broadcasting and sponsorship elements. Cope's efforts were key to the team's successful year and resulted in 2,700,000 tickets sold during the Nationals' inaugural season.

Cope is no stranger to the D.C. sports scene, having broken into the industry selling tickets for the Baltimore Orioles. There, he later served the team as director of marketing and advertising. After seven years with the Orioles, Cope helped launch the Sports Business Daily. THE TEAM



DAVE KASPER GENERAL MANAGER

Dave Kasper joined D.C. United in 2002 after a stint with the New England Revolution where he served as the Director of Business

Development. After five years as United's Technical Director, he was named the club's General Manager in September 2007.

Under his watch, United captured the 2004 MLS Cup, two Supporters' Shields (2006 & 2007) and the 2008 U.S. Open Cup title.

As the team's GM, Kasper works closely with the coaching staff in identifying and signing talent, developing a draft strategy, creating closer ties to foreign club teams, and managing all player transactions. He also oversees the direction of the club's youth development efforts including

the D.C. United Academy and the Super Y-League program. Kasper has a wide variety of soccer experience as a player, coach and front office executive.

During his playing career, Kasper was a standout forward at the University of Maryland, earning All-ACC honors while also serving as a member of the U.S. Under-20 National Team. He played professionally for the Milwaukee Wave (1989-90) and the Pittsburgh Stingrays (1990-94) and transitioned into the first men's head soccer coach for Duquesne University in 1994. In 1998, Kasper was hired as the first Vice-President and General Manager of the Pittsburgh Riverhounds (USL-1). The following year, Kasper led the organization to the playoffs and to Organization of the Year honors.

Kasper is actively involved in the Leukemia Society's successful Kicks for Cancer program.



BEN OLSEN HEAD COACH

Olsen's coaching career began prior to the 2010 MLS campaign as an assistant under Curt Onalfo. Midway through the 2010 campaign,

Olsen stepped into the breach to replace Onalfo, making his debut as Interim Head Coach on August 7 at New England. Olsen won his first match in charge on February 22 against Philadelphia in a 2-0 triumph. Following improved play under the former United captain, Olsen was hired permanently as Head Coach on November 29, 2010. At 33-years-old, he is currently the youngest coach in Major League Soccer, having retired from the Black-and-Red on November 24, 2009.

As a player, Olsen was amongst the club's all-time leaders in several key categories at the time of his retirement – second in games played (221), minutes played (17,098) and game-winning goals (13), third in assists (49) and shots on goal (155), and seventh all-time in goals (29). Arguably the most popular player in United history, the midfielder won eight total trophies while in DC, including two MLS Cups (1999 & 2004). He was a two-time All-Star (1998 & 1999), the 1998 MLS Rookie of the Year, the 1999 MLS Cup MVP, the 2003 USSF Humanitarian of the Year and was named to the MLS Best XI in 2007.

In addition to his storied career with United, Olsen also had an illustrious career with the U.S. Men's National Team. He made his full international debut against Australia on November 6, 1998. His first goal for the U.S. came in just his second international game when he tallied against Chile on February 21, 1999. In 2000, he was part of the team that reached the bronze medal game at the Sydney Olympics before falling to Chile. Olsen was selected to the 2006 World Cup team and played 51 minutes in the team's final match against Ghana. All told, the midfielder earned 37 caps and six goals with the U.S. Men's National Team.

Prior to his professional career, from 1995-97, Olsen spent three seasons at the University of Virginia. During his time with the Cavaliers, the team posted a 56-8-8 record. All told, the midfielder compiled 34 goals with 41 assists and started and played every game (69) of his collegiate career. After his junior season, he was named the 1997 Soccer America Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Hermann Trophy. He was also named as the ACC Tournament MVP and selected to the NSCAA All-American first-team after his senior year.



CHAD ASHTON

ASSISTANT COACH

Chad Ashton rejoins United's bench following a season as the club's Technical Director in 2010. Ashton was first introduced as an Assistant

Coach on January 17, 2007 and helped guide the team to the Supporters' Shield in his first season. He helped the team capture the 2008 U.S. Open Cup during his second year.

Ashton joined United after ten seasons as the Head Coach of men's soccer at University of Denver, where he compiled a record of 85-85-14, ranking him as the second most winning coach in school history. In 2006, he was named Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Co-Coach of the Year after guiding the Pioneers to an 11-5-2 record. It was his second Coach of the Year honor, having also won the award in 2004.

Throughout the 1990's, Ashton played professionally with Colorado Foxes of the American Professional Soccer League, the Wichita Wings of the National Professional Soccer League and MLS' Dallas Burn.

Ashton was a very accomplished player in the college ranks. As a midfielder at the University of North Carolina, he was selected to the All-ACC team three times. He finished his collegiate career in 1989 as the Tarheels' all-time leader in assists with 43, a record he still holds. Ashton also helped UNC to two NCAA tournament appearances, including a berth in the 1987 Final Four. In high school, he was selected as the Colorado High School Player of the Year in 1986.



PAT ONSTAD

ASSISTANT COACH

Widely considered to be one of the top goalkeepers in Major League Soccer history, Pat Onstad joins the D.C. United coaching ranks for the 2011 season.

Onstad was a stalwart in goal, playing with Houston and San Jose for a combined eight seasons. The 43-year old is the League's all-time leader with a goals-against average mark of 1.12 (minimum 10,000 minutes played). With the Dynamo, Onstad started 136 regular season matches, helping the club win back-to-back MLS Cup titles in 2006 and 2007. Most recently, Onstad started 23 regular season games for Houston in 2010, registering four shutouts in 2,070 minutes on the field. During the 2006 campaign, Onstad played every minute of every match, barring a single U.S. Open Cup fixture. Following a 1-1 draw with New England in the 2006 MLS Cup Final, Onstad helped the Dynamo win its first title through a stunning display in the penalty shootout. In 2007, Onstad led the League with a 0.82 goals against average mark, finishing second in shutouts with 11. In the MLS Cup Final at RFK Stadium that season, the Vancouver native made seven saves.

Before his time in Houston, Onstad was a member of the San Jose Earthquakes, helping the club to raise its second MLS Cup in 2003 during his first season in the League. That same year, Onstad took home the MLS Goalkeeper of the Year Award and a spot on the MLS Best XI squad. He would replicate this feat in 2005, helping San Jose earn a Supporters' Shield as the club went undefeated at home. Onstad also led the League in shutouts (12), goals-against average (0.97), and wins (18).

The Canadian international earned 57 caps throughout his career, most all-time for Canadian goalkeepers. Onstad recorded a record 21 shutouts for his country, and he is the longest-serving member of the squad in Canadian National Team history. Onstad made his debut on February 18, 1988 against Bermuda in a 0-0 draw. In total, the former Houston goalkeeper represented Canada in 15 FIFA World Cup qualification matches across three separate qualifying campaigns. Onstad's final appearance for his country came in May of 2010 in a friendly against Argentina.

At the club level, Onstad began his career in 1987 with the Vancouver 86ers, and he played for a variety of clubs before his rise in MLS, including the Montreal Impact, Rochester Rhinos, and Scotland's Dundee United.

MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: Signed as a Designated Player on 6/14, Boškovic appeared in 13 matches and started eight for D.C. in 2010. The midfielder joined United from Rapid Vienna, one of the most successful sides in the Austrian Bundesliga. Boškovic was in and out of the Black-and-Red side after his midseason arrival because of his duties as captain of the Montenegrin national team, which enjoyed a 3-1-0 record in UEFA Euro 2012 qualifying during the course of the MLS season. Though Boškovic did not register any League goals in 2010, his deft playmaking ability was obvious, and he scored United's opening goal in the U.S. Open Cup quarter-final against Harrisburg on 7/21.

OTHER PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

2006-2010: After three seasons in France, Boškovic made a move to Rapid Vienna of the Austrian Bundesliga. Joining the club in January of 2006, he faced a tough task to break into the first team at his new club, but managed to score two goals in 12 first team appearances in his inaugural season. The 2007-2008 campaign saw him return to top form, as he featured regularly in the Rapid midfield, scoring eight goals as the team went on to win the Austrian league championship. During his time with Rapid, Boškovic played in 122 matches, scoring 24 goals in all competitions.

2003-2005: Following his exploits with Red Star, the midfielder moved to French giants Paris Saint-Germain in the summer of 2003. Although minutes were harder to come by with the Ligue 1 club, Boškovic did manage to make 24 first team appearances in his first season, scoring three goals. He made 12 appearances the next season before joining Troyes on loan for the 2005-06 campaign.

1999-2003: In his first full season with Red Star, Boškovic appeared regularly in the first team, scoring nine goals as he helped the Belgrade side

win the Serbo-Montenegrin Football League title – ending a rare five-year title drought for the club. The following season, Boškovic was once again an essential part of the team, as Red Star won its second consecutive league title. Appearing in 32 games during the season, he contributed another nine-goal campaign, and helped the team win its second Serbo-Montenegrin Cup in three years. In 2002 Boškovic helped Red Star to win its third Serbo-Montenegrin Cup in four years. During the 2002-2003 campaign, the talented playmaker etched his name into the modern history of Red Star, as he scored against Lazio in the UEFA Cup. In total, Boškovic made 123 league appearances for Red Star, scoring 30 times for the Serbian club.

1996-1998: Boškovic made his professional debut with FK Mogren of Budva, Montenegro. He played at the lower-division club for two-and-a-half seasons before moving to Red Star Belgrade in the winter of the 1998-1999 campaign.



2010: Though he played the full 90 minutes in each of his starts for United, Burch featured just four times in MLS play for the Black-and-Red due to injury. The American defender suffered damage to his right foot in late February and managed to come back later in the year, but he re-aggravated the injury on 9/1 in the U.S. Open Cup semifinal at RFK Stadium against the Columbus Crew. MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: Hamid became the youngest goalkeeper in MLS history to win a League contest on 5/5 against Kansas City in a 2-1 victory at RFK Stadium, beating the previous record held by former New York netminder Tim Howard. The 19 year-old was 3-5 in eight games for United, posting one shutout and 20 saves en route to a 1.25 goals against average mark. Hamid made his final appearance of the season against Columbus on 9/4 at RFK Stadium in a 1-0 defeat before undergoing successful season-ending surgery to repair a torn labrum in his right shoulder.

2009: Hamid made United history on 9/2/09, when he became the first D.C. United Academy player to sign with the first team. As the first player to come up through the club's youth system, Hamid was only available for non-League games during the 2009 season and did not see any playing time.

OTHER EXPERIENCE

2009: During the summer, Hamid was first choice in goal for the U-17/18 Academy team that compiled a 20-4-5 record and was a finalist in the U.S. Soccer Development Academy.

MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: A near-automatic starter for United, the Canadian defender again anchored the Black-and-Red backline from the centerback position. Despite missing a large chunk of the season due to a broken clavicle, the gifted 25-year-old ranked fifth on the team in minutes played with 1,624 for the season in 19 MLS matches (18 starts). Jakovic, who was continually called upon by the Canadian National Team in 2010, remains a centerpiece of D.C.'s plans for the future.

2009: Dejan Jakovic had an impressive first season for D.C. United after signing with the club during pre-season. The Croatian-born defender immediately stepped into the starting centerback role for the Black-and-Red and anchored the defense almost the entire year. Jakovic's season was interrupted briefly during the summer months when he was called-up to the Canada National Team for the Gold Cup. The 24-year old made three appearances as Canada went 2-1-1 in the tournament. After returning to D.C., Jakovic missed a couple of weeks due to sports hernia surgery. Despite the setback, Jakovic played every minute of all 23 games in which he appeared in MLS play. In all competitions, the center back played in 28 games (26 starts) for United.

OTHER PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

2008: After a trial with Red Star Belgrade of the Serbian Superliga, Jakovic signed with the European power on 6/30/08. He made three starts during the 2008-09 league campaign and two additional starts in UEFA Cup play.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

2010: The United defender made three appearances for the Canada National Team in friendlies against Peru on 4/9, Honduras on 7/9 and Ukraine on 8/10. Canada went 1-1-1 in those matches. Jakovic is steadily becoming a more integral part of the Canadian side ahead of next summer's Gold Cup.

2009: Jakovic made three appearances for the Canada National Team during the Gold Cup tournament, playing against Jamaica on 7/3, El Salvador

on 7/7 and Honduras on 7/18. He was also called-up to play two international friendlies, against Guatemala in June and Poland in November.

2008: Jakovic made his full Canada Men's National Team debut on 1/30/08 against Martinique. He was then named to the U-23 Team that participated in the CONCACAF Men's Olympic Qualifying Tournament in the summer. He played every minute of Canada's four contests and helped the team to a third place finish. He was also called into full National Team camp in the fall in preparation for World Cup qualifiers, and was on the 18-man gameday roster for five qualifying games, but did not see the field.

COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

2007: In his final season in Birmingham, Jakovic led UAB with six goals and also contributed an assist in 14 games (13 starts). For the second year in a row, he was honored as a member of the All-Conference USA First Team and the NSCAA All-Region First Team. Jakovic finished his career with 49 total appearances, collecting eight goals and five assists over three seasons.

2006: During his sophomore season at UAB, Jakovic played both in the defense and midfield. He saw time in 18 games (all starts), collecting a goal and four assists. Jakovic was named to the All-Conference USA First Team and the NSCAA All-Region First Team.

2005: After being redshirted in 2004, Jakovic played in 17 games during the 2005 season at the University of Alabama-Birmingham. He notched a single goal and was named to the All-Conference USA Second Team for his efforts.

MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: Acquired from Seattle for a second-round 2011 MLS SuperDraft pick on 4/30, King played his 2010 home games for United at the same stadium where he enjoyed a 2009 U.S. Open Cup final victory with the Sounders FC. The Medford, N.J. native gelled well with the Black-and-Red, playing in 20 MLS regular season matches and starting 16 of them. In 1,415 minutes of action, King registered one assist. His 17 shots were the third-most among United players without a goal scored in the regular season.

2009: After being acquired by Seattle in the 2009 expansion draft, King made ten appearances for the Sounders (3 starts), playing a total of 433 minutes. King asserted himself in Seattle's 2009 U.S. Open Cup run, scoring three goals (two match-winners) while posting one assist. MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: As a fifth-year United player, McTavish appeared in 19 League games for the Black-and-Red and started 16 of those matches. The experienced defender was on the field for 1,405 MLS minutes.

2009: In 2009, Devon McTavish played in 11 games (five starts) in MLS play. The versatile defender/midfielder was a big part of the team's Open Cup and Champions League campaigns, as he played every minute in four of the team's five Open Cup games and six of eight Champions League matches. In all competitions, McTavish played in 23 games (16 starts) and collected an assist.







MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: The striker scored two goals – both in a 6/10 match at Seattle – in 17 regular season appearances and 13 starts for United, totaling 1,189 minutes played. Unfortunately, the forward's season was cut short due to a hamstring injury that plagued him for much of the MLS calendar. Pontius underwent successful surgery on 9/21 after appearing in uniform for the last time on 8/28 at Chivas USA.

2009: With the seventh overall pick of the 2009 MLS SuperDraft, D.C. United selected Chris Pontius out of the University of California, Santa Barbara. United fans knew they had a special player on the team after just 62 minutes of the 2009 MLS season when, in D.C.'s season-opener against the LA Galaxy, the rookie scored his first goal as a professional – a beautiful, bending strike to the far post. Pontius, who was used at nearly every offensive position on the field, went on to play in all but two of the team's 30 League games (23 starts), tallying four goals and three assists. In all competitions, his numbers are even more impressive: 40 of a total 44 games played, 31 starts, eight goals, six assists.

COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

2008: During his senior year, Pontius led UCSB with 14 goals. He started each of the team's 22 games and was second on the team in minutes (1,883). Following his senior campaign, Pontius was named as a MAC Hermann Trophy semifinalist, a member of College Soccer News All-American Second Team, to the NSCAA All-American Third Team, and the All-Far West First Team.

2007: In his junior year, Pontius led the Big West conference with 11 goals and was honored as the Big West Offensive Player of the Year. He played in 21 games (19 starts) and was also named to the All-Big West First Team.

2006: Pontius' versatility was on display during his sophomore season, as he played in 23 matches (22 starts). Though he was primarily used as a left midfielder he also saw time both in the defense and as a forward. He scored a goal and contributed two assists.

2005: During his freshman year, Pontius played in 20 of 21 matches, making five starts for the Gauchos. He scored his first career goal against Northwestern, and finished the season with a total of three.

MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: The United veteran was a constant presence on the field in 2010, leading all D.C. players with 27 games played, 26 starts and 2,331 minutes. Quaranta also led the squad with 58 shots and 24 shots on goal, scoring twice and also recording two assists during the MLS campaign.

2009: After reviving his career in 2008, Santino Quaranta took additional steps forward in 2009. He played in 22 games (19 starts) and tabbed 1,769 minutes of play in MLS matches. The midfielder scored two goals and a set a career-high assist mark with six helpers in League play. Following his impressive play during the first half of the season, Quaranta earned his first U.S. Men's National Team call-up since 2006. The 25-year-old's season was cut short towards the end of the year after rupturing the plantar plate in his left foot on 10/9. In all competitions with United, the Baltimore native made 28 appearances (22 starts) and recorded two goals and nine assists.

2008: Following what became a much-publicized fall from grace, Santino Quaranta found himself out of MLS at the end of 2007. He asked D.C. United for an opportunity to revive a career that had all but escaped him. Following a trial that included several sit-down meetings with members of the technical staff and front office, Quaranta was given a second chance with the Black-and-Red. After humbling early season apologies to United's fervent supporters for past indiscretions and an honest mid-season admission of his past drug addiction, the Baltimore native went on to have the best season of his career. He produced career-highs in games played (27), started (23), minutes (1,963), and goals (five). His Week 24 goal – in a 2-1 loss to San Jose on 9/6 – was tabbed as the Sierra Mist Goal of the Week. In all competitions, Quaranta played in 35 games (30 starts) and tallied six goals and six assists.

2007: After playing just six games with the Galaxy, Quaranta was traded to the New York Red Bulls on 6/30. There he saw action as a substitute in three matches – 47 total minutes – before being sidelined for the rest of the season with a foot injury.

2006: After four appearances as a member of United to begin the season, Quaranta was sent to the LA Galaxy in exchange for a partial allocation and a conditional 2008 MLS SuperDraft pick. While in LA, he played in 12 games (ten starts) and scored three goals.

2005: Despite playing on only 18 games (13 starts) during the season, Quaranta was the third-highest scorer on the team, having notched five goals and

five assists. Three of his five goals were game-winners, tied for most on the team. He missed a significant number of games due to U.S. Men's National Team call-ups for the CONCACAF Gold Cup and World Cup qualifiers.

2004: A string of injuries limited Quaranta to one League appearance for D.C. United during the 2004 campaign. He made an impact in United's international friendlies, however, striking for two goals and an assist against CD Municipal to accompany his penalty-kick shootout tally in the Black-and-Red's win over Nottingham Forest.

2003: Quaranta got off to a good start netting his only goal of the campaign in the season-opener against the Kansas City Wizards on 4/12. He then struggled much of the season to recover from an MCL injury that he picked up while playing with the U.S. U-20 National Team. The forward underwent arthroscopic surgery in September, causing him to miss the end of the season. He totaled three assists during the season, the first of which led to Marco Etcheverry's goal that earned the Black-and-Red their first road point of the season in a 1-1 tie versus the Colorado Rapids on 4/26. Quaranta also tallied the game-winning assist on Ben Olsen's goal versus the Chicago Fire at Cardinal Stadium on 7/12.

2002: In only his second year in MLS, Quaranta started in all 11 games he appeared in, contributing three goals and four assists. He got off to a quick start with an assist on Ali Curtis' goal in the season opener against the LA Galaxy on 3/23 and scored his first goal against the Dallas Burn on 4/6. Quaranta recorded two assists in the Black-and-Red's 4-2 drubbing of the New York/New Jersey MetroStars on 5/18. He then registered both a goal and an assist on Ryan Nelsen's goal in the 3-2 victory over the New England Revolution on 6/8. Unfortunately the young forward had to miss the last three months of the season due to an abdominal hernia and the subsequent surgery to correct it, which took place on 7/31.

2001: Quaranta was originally selected by D.C. United in the first round (8th overall) of the 2001 MLS SuperDraft on 2/5/01. At the time of his selection, he was the youngest player ever drafted by Major League Soccer. He paid immediate dividends for United, notching five goals and one assist in 16 games (10 starts). The Baltimore, MD native recorded a pair of two-goal games in addition to being named MLS Player of the Week on 7/16, the only United player to receive the award during the season. At the time, Quaranta was the youngest player in league history to play, start, score and earn Player of the Week and MLS All-Star honors. He was the youngest player to appear

in an MLS match when he came on for Mark Lisi in the 74th minute versus New England on 5/9. He was the youngest player to score in MLS history (16 years, 7 months, and 5 days) when he tallied his first MLS goal in the 69th minute versus the Columbus Crew on 5/19. Quaranta started and played the full match versus Bayer Leverkusen on 5/23, tallying an assist. He missed the Miami Fusion (5/30) and Chicago Fire (6/2) games while on tour with U.S. U-17 team. Quaranta made his first career start and played the full 90 minutes versus the MetroStars (6/13), recording his first assist. He scored two goals against New England on 7/14, earning Player of the Week honors (7/16). Quaranta missed the Columbus match (8/25) with a groin injury and the last two games of the campaign, while tending to duty with the U.S. U-17 team at the World Championship in Trinidad & Tobago.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

2009: Following his impressive play during the first half of the MLS season, Quaranta earned his first U.S. Men's National Team call-up since 2006. Playing in a Gold Cup game on July 8 in front of his home crowd at RFK Stadium, Quaranta scored his first-ever goal in a USA jersey. In total, Quaranta played four games with the USMNT during the summer.

2005: Quaranta was called up to the U.S. Men's National Team for both Gold Cup and World Cup qualifying competitions. In all, the Baltimore, MD native made eight appearances for the U.S. Men, primarily on the right side of midfield. He saw time in four games during the team's Gold Cup championship run and has seen the field in four World Cup qualifiers, including the last 10 minutes of the World Cup-clinching 2-0 win over Mexico. Quaranta tallied one assist.

2001: Quaranta appeared in 32 matches (29 starts) for the U.S. U-17's. He started in 11 of the 12 full international matches, registering two goals and

seven assists. Overall, Quaranta led the team in assists (11) and was second in goals scored (17). He tallied two goals in the CONCACAF qualifying tournament in April, leading the U.S. to a 3-0 first place finish. He started in two of the three matches at the U-17 World Championship in Trinidad & Tobago.

2000: Quaranta was one of 20 players to train with the United States Under-17 National Team at the full-time residency program in Bradenton, Florida. He appeared in 51 matches (45 starts) for the U-17's during the year. Quaranta was a member of the team's starting 11 in each of its 12 full international matches, scoring six times and recording three assists. For the year, he was the team's assist leader (22) and second leading goal-scorer (23). At the Mundialito of Salerno Tournament in Italy (featuring Argentina, Italy, France, Brazil, and Germany), Quaranta captured the Golden Boot Award as the tournament's top goal-scorer, as he notched three goals in three games. His performance in Salerno was part of a five-game stretch that saw him register eight goals, including a pair of consecutive two-goal games against the U-18 Irvine Strikers and a hat trick versus the U-18 California South Select.

MLS EXPERIENCE

2010: Clyde Simms' 2010 playing time was hampered due to his second sports hernia injury in two years. Despite this nagging injury, the veteran defensive midfielder played 20 League matches (18 starts), registering a total of 1,508 minutes on the field. The 2010 season marked a major career milestone for Simms. Having played a career total of 153 games (10,780 minutes), he joined only five other players who have played 150 matches or more for D.C. United.

2009: A constant at defensive midfielder for the Black-and-Red, Clyde Simms only missed time this season due to a sports hernia surgery that sidelined him for a few weeks during the summer. He started all 28 games he played in during the MLS season, captaining the squad on occasion. Simms scored his only goal of the year in the U.S. Open Cup final against Seattle. In total, Simms appeared in 34 matches (33 starts) and recorded 2,989 total minutes.

2008: The 2008 season saw Simms solidify himself as the team's first option at defensive mid-field, playing in all but three minutes of the team's entire League season. His 30 games played, 30 starts, 2,697 minutes played and two goals were all career highs. He also contributed two assists in League play. The team's iron man also played in all four CONCACAF Champions' Cup games, all four U.S. Open Cup games, all three SuperLiga games and four of six Champions League games. In total, he played in 45 games (43 starts), tallying two goals and three assists. His 3,849 minutes in all competitions was the most-ever for a United player, barely eclipsing the mark set by goalkeeper Troy Perkins (3,847 minutes played) in 2007.

2007: After seeing the field primarily as a substitute early in the year, Simms took hold of the defensive midfield spot midway through the season. He tallied three assists in 25 games (16 starts). United was an impressive 11-1-5 in games in which Simms started. He also scored a game-winning goal against CD Guadalajara on 9/26 in a 2-1 victory in the first leg of Copa Nissan Sudamericana.

2006: Simms quickly established himself as a United regular in 2006, appearing in 24 games (14 starts) for the Black-and-Red. The tenacious midfielder also struck his first career goal for United, scoring the lone strike in D.C.'s 1-0 win over rivals Chicago on 6/21. Simms also chipped in an assist against Kansas City on 6/24. The midfielder also started seven matches for the United reserves, logging an assist in 585 minutes.

2005: Simms joined United after a season with the Richmond Kickers (USL 1). The defensive midfielder adjusted quickly and earned 12 starts in his 25 total appearances. Simms picked up his first career MLS assist in United's 5-1 win over Real Salt Lake on 8/31.

OTHER EXPERIENCE

2004: In his first professional season, Simms started 28 of 31 games for the Richmond Kickers of the USL First Division. As a midfielder, Simms notched three goals, two of which were game-winners. Simms was the only rookie to be named to the A-League Team of the Week on two occasions during the season. He was honored for his solid play versus the Virginia Beach Mariners on 5/31 and also for his game-winning goal over the Charleston Battery on 6/12.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

2005: Simms earned his first cap with the U.S. Men's National Team on 5/28 in a friendly versus England at Soldier Field in Chicago.

COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

2003: At East Carolina University, Simms was an All-Conference USA Third Team selection for the second year in a row and started all 17 games, captaining the team for the third straight year. He was third on the team in shots (21) and recorded two assists. Simms ended his career at East Carolina tied for fifth all-time in games played (72).

2002: As team captain, Simms was an All-Conference USA Third Team selection and started in all 18 games. He was tied for fourth on the team in points (6).



The Rapids seized the lead in contentious fashion in the 67th minute. There was widespread shock at Referee Jorge Gonzalez's decision to wave play on after Wells Thompson slid through Rodney Wallace's ankle near the halfway line, allowing sole goal-scorer Mehdi Ballouchy to lope clear down the right channel. The Moroccan nonetheless displayed impressive skill to advance on Pena, buy time with a quick stepover and cut inside before drilling a low left-footer just inside the near post, catching Hamid flat-footed as his view was obscured by Pena's attempted block. The Rapids came extremely close to doubling their advantage on several occasions as United's collective spirit sagged. D.C. coach Curt Onalfo brought on Jaime Moreno and Andy Najar as subs and switched to a three-man defense in the late going, but his team still struggled to create clear opportunities, and Gonzalez's full-time whistle brought down the curtain on another disappointing evening at RFK.

In the 84th minute, second half substitute Omar Cummings received a Kosuke Minura cross, but couldn't hit the net to equalize. Two minutes later, Moor missed the best chance of the night from a corner as he screwed the perfectly placed ball just wide of the net. Despite the result, Colorado remained in seventh place, still good for a playoff berth.

MLS RULES AND REGULATIONS

I. MLS ROSTER COMPOSITION

A Major League Soccer club's first team roster is comprised of up to 30 players. All 30 players are eligible for selection to each 18-player game-day squad during the regular season and playoffs.

Salary & Budget:

Players occupying roster spots 1-20 count against the club's 2011 salary budget of \$2,675,000, and are referred to collectively as the club's Salary Budget Players.

Roster spots 19 and 20 are not required to be filled, and teams may spread their salary budget across only 18 Salary Budget Players. A minimum salary budget charge will be imputed against a team's salary budget for each unfilled senior roster slot below 18.

The maximum budget charge for a single player is \$335,000.*

A Designated Player counts \$335,000 against the club's salary budget, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$167,500.

See section entitled Allocation Money below, under Player Acquisition Mechanisms, for details on buying down a player's budget charge.

Players occupying roster spots 21-30 do not count against the club's salary budget, and are referred to collectively as the club's Off-Budget Players (maximum of 10 per team).

All Generation adidas players are Off-Budget players.

Players occupying roster spots 1-24 will earn at least \$42,000 in 2011.

Players occupying roster spots 25-30 will earn at least \$32,600 in 2011.

Clubs may elect to leave up to two of these roster spots (25-30) vacant and use \$35,000 for each empty spot as allocation money.

Clubs may sign up to two Home Grown Players to Generation adidas contracts.

Age Designations:

Any player making \$32,600 must be under the age 25 (does not turn 25 or older in 2011).

Domestic/International:

In 2011, a total of 144 international slots are divided among the 18 clubs. Each club began with eight international slots, which are tradable. There is no limit on the number of international slots on each club's roster.

The remaining roster slots must belong to domestic players. For clubs based in the United States, a domestic player is either a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident (green card holder) or the holder of other special status (e.g., refugee or asylum status).

The two MLS clubs based in Canada – Toronto FC and Vancouver Whitecaps FC – began with eight international slots, but their domestic slots may be filled with either Canadian or U.S. domestic players.

MLS clubs based in Canada are required to have a minimum of three Canadian domestic players on their rosters.

Players with the legal right to work in Canada are considered Canadian domestic players (i.e., Canadian citizen, permanent resident, part of a protected class).

NOTE: The terms Home Grown and Generation adidas are used to describe mechanisms by which players are acquired. They are not roster designations. All players' roster slots are determined by their compensation and/or age as outlined above.

II. PLAYER ACQUISITION MECHANISMS

MLS teams may acquire players and add them to their rosters via the following mechanisms:

(A) ALLOCATION RANKING

The allocation ranking is the mechanism used to determine which MLS club has first priority to acquire a U.S. National Team player who signs with MLS after playing abroad, or a former MLS player who returns to the League after having gone to a club abroad for a transfer fee. The allocation rankings may also be used in the event two or more clubs file a request for the same player on the same day. The allocations will be ranked in reverse order of finish for the 2010 season, taking playoff performance into account.

Once the club uses its allocation ranking to acquire a player, it drops to the bottom of the list. A ranking can be traded, provided that part of the compensation received in return is another club's ranking. At all times, each club is assigned one ranking. The rankings reset at the end of each MLS League season.

Allocation Money

Allocation money is a resource available to clubs in addition to their respective salary budgets.

A club may receive allocation money for:

- (1) failure to qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs;
- (2) the transfer of a player to a club outside of MLS for value;
- (3) expansion status;
- (4) qualification for the CONCACAF Champions League;

Each year the MLS Competition Committee determines the allocation amount to be made available to each club. Allocation money can be traded by clubs. Allocation money does not count against a club's salary budget and can be used:

To sign players new to MLS (that is, a player who did not play in MLS during the previous season).

To re-sign an existing MLS player, subject to League approval.

To "buy-down" a player's salary budget charge below the League maximum of \$335,000.

In connection with the exercise of an option to purchase a player's rights or the extension of a player's contract for the second year provided the player was new to MLS in the immediately prior year.

NOTE: To protect the interests of MLS and its clubs during discussions with prospective players or clubs in other leagues, amounts of allocation money held by each club will not be shared publicly. (Similarly, most clubs in other countries do not announce the amount of money they plan to spend during a given transfer window.)

(B) DESIGNATED PLAYER

The Designated Player Rule allows clubs to acquire up to three players whose salaries exceed their budget charges, with the club bearing financial responsibility for the amount of compensation above each player's budget charge. Designated Player slots may be used to acquire players new to MLS or to retain current MLS players, subject to League approval.

In 2011, a Designated Player's salary budget charge will be \$335,000, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$167,500.

Each club has two Designated Player slots, and clubs are allowed to "purchase" a third Designated Player slot for a one-time fee of \$250,000 that will be dispersed in the form of allocation money to all clubs that do not have three Designated Players.

Designated Player slots are not tradable.

Clubs have the option of "buying down" the budget charge of a Designated Player with allocation money. The reduced charge may not be less than \$150,000.

(C) SUPERDRAFT

The 2011 MLS SuperDraft, held Jan. 13 in Baltimore, Md., consisted of three rounds of 18 picks for a total of 54 player selections. A supplemental draft was held Jan. 18 via teleconference and consisted of three rounds.

The majority of draft prospects are NCAA college seniors who have exhausted their college eligibility. Generation adidas players and non-collegiate international players are also eligible for selection in the SuperDraft and supplemental draft. Clubs may nominate players for the League's draft-eligible list, and only players from that list may be selected.

Generation adidas is a joint program between MLS and adidas that is dedicated to developing exceptional domestic talent in a professional environment. Each year, a handful of top domestic underclassmen and youth national team players are signed to the league and placed in the SuperDraft through this program. Generation adidas players also receive an educational stipend.

Draft Order: Through the Expansion Priority Draft, Vancouver Whitecaps FC earned the first selection in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft while the Portland Timbers selected second. The next six selections went to clubs that did not qualify for the 2010 MLS Cup Playoffs beginning with the club with fewest regular season points (3 points per win, one point per tie). The remaining eight positions were ranked by fewest regular season points among the teams that were eliminated in the same round of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

Unless claimed on waivers, a player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign with the League, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to the player.

(D) TRADES

Players, SuperDraft and supplemental draft picks, allocation money, allocation rankings, and international player slots may all be exchanged in trades approved by the MLS League Office, provided all of the necessary rules regarding roster and salary budget compliance are met and the trade is completed during a valid trading period. No trades may occur after the Roster Freeze Deadline of September 15, 2011 at 5 p.m. ET.

(E) DISCOVERY SIGNINGS

Clubs may make discovery claims on players not yet under MLS contract who are not subject to the allocation ranking or lottery mechanisms.

Each club has the opportunity to make six discovery signings per season (expansion teams may make 10 discovery signings in their inaugural season). A club may have up to 10 discovery claims on unsigned players at any time and may remove or add players at any time. The last day for discovery player signings is September 15, 2011 – coinciding with the roster freeze date and trade deadline.

The six discovery signings can be used to fill senior roster spots only. If multiple clubs claim the same player using a discovery, the club that filed the claim first will have first rights to the player. Discovery claims expire following each season. If the League and player are unable to reach an agreement during the season, the club that first filed the discovery retains the right of first refusal in the event the player is later signed by the League.

Note: To protect interests of MLS clubs in scouting and negotiations with prospective players, the League office will not publicize the names of players on club discovery lists, nor specify if a discovery claim has been filed on a particular player.

(F) HOME GROWN PLAYER SIGNINGS

A club may sign a player to his first professional contract without subjecting him to the MLS SuperDraft if the player has trained for at least one year in the club's youth development program and has met League criteria. Players joining MLS through this mechanism are known as Home Grown Players.

There is no limit to the number of Home Grown Players a club may sign in a given year.

(G) RE-ENTRY PROCESS

The 2011 Re-Entry Process will commence after MLS Cup. The priority order for the Re-Entry Draft is reverse order of finish in 2011, taking into account playoff performance.

Available to all teams in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry draft will be:

1. Players who are at least 23 years old and have a minimum of three years experience in MLS whose options were not exercised by their clubs (available at option salary for 2012).
2. Players who are at least 25 years old with a minimum of four years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them at their previous salary (available for at least their 2011 salary).
3. Players who are at least 30 years old with a minimum of eight years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish

to re-sign them (available for at least 105% of their 2011 salary).

Players who are not selected in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry Draft will be made available in Stage 2. Clubs selecting players in Stage 2 will negotiate a new salary with the player.

Players who remain unselected after Stage 2 will be available to any MLS club on a first come, first serve basis.

(H) WAIVERS

A team may place a player on waivers at any time during the regular season at which point he is made available to all other teams. The waiver claiming period shall commence on the first business day after the League delivers notice to teams and shall expire at 5 p.m. EST on the second business day after the Waiver Period Commencement Date. The claiming period is 48 hours.

The Waiver Draft order is determined via points per game once all teams have played at least three MLS League games. If the waiver takes place prior to all teams playing in at least three League games, priority shall be granted based upon the prior year's performance, taking playoff performance first, with teams eliminated from playoff contention at the same stage separated according to their point totals through the end of the regular season. New expansion teams shall be at the bottom of the waiver order.

Once a team selects a player off waivers, that club is automatically moved to the bottom of the priority list for subsequent waiver selections in a given season, regardless of its points-per-game total. Players who may be placed on the MLS waiver wire are as follows:

- (i) A player waived by an MLS team in the current season;
- (ii) A player who completed his college eligibility within the past season, who was not made available in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft;
- (iii) A player who has remaining college eligibility (and was not made available in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft), but the League at its discretion and after taking into account exceptional circumstances determines the player may be offered an MLS contract;
- (iv) A player who has played in MLS previously where his last MLS team does not wish to exercise their right of first refusal, except in the case of returning U.S. National Team players as stated above.
- (v) A player who was drafted in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft, and who after a trial with the club is not offered a contract by the first Monday of June.

(I) LOTTERY

Some players shall be assigned to MLS teams via the weighted Lottery process. Any team assigned a player through the lottery in any particular season shall not be assigned another lottery player that season unless and until all teams have received a lottery player or have agreed to waive their option to participate in a Lottery. The players made available through lotteries include:

- (i) Generation adidas players signed after the MLS SuperDraft;

- (ii) Draft eligible players to whom an MLS contract was offered but who failed to sign with the League prior to the Draft.

The weighted lottery takes into consideration each team's performance over its last 30 regular season games and the most recent postseason. The team with the worst record over its last 30 regular season games (dating back to previous season if necessary and taking playoff performance into account) will have the greatest probability of winning the lottery. Teams are not required to participate in a lottery. Players are assigned via the lottery system in order to prevent a player from potentially influencing his destination club with a strategic holdout.

(J) EXTREME HARDSHIP CALL-UPS

Teams may add players to their roster in cases of "extreme hardship" as follows: (1) a club with three goalkeepers on its 30-man roster, but has less than two available goalkeepers or (2) a team has less than 15 available players. Extreme hardship call-ups are made on a game-by-game basis.

(K) SEASON-ENDING INJURY REPLACEMENTS

A team with a player lost to a season-ending injury can replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the season-ending injury list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). International player limits still apply at the time a season-ending replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

(L) SHORT-TERM INJURY REPLACEMENTS

A team with a player who has a short-term injury can replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the short-term injured reserve list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). Note that the injured player will have to sit out a minimum of six MLS League matches before he can rejoin the team's roster. International player limits still apply at the time a short-term replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

NOTE: No changes may be made to a team's active full roster during the period beginning on September 16, 2011 (day after Roster Freeze Date) through the day after MLS Cup. Nevertheless, a team may obtain players in accordance with the extreme hardship rules and procedures to replace players who are injured or otherwise legitimately unavailable after the Roster Freeze Date. Any other replacements after the Roster Freeze Date may only be made in exceptional circumstances in the League's sole and absolute discretion.

(III.) METHODS OF RELEASING PLAYERS

(A) WAIVERS

Teams may waive players based on performance at any time during the MLS season. Players with guaranteed contracts will continue to have their salary budget charge applied to the team salary budget, subject to any settlement. Players on semi-guaranteed contracts can be waived prior to July 1 of any year and free up the corresponding

budget space. If a player on a semi-guaranteed contract is waived after July 1, his salary budget charge will count against the team's salary budget and the team waiving the player will not receive a replacement except under the normal player acquisition mechanisms. Any settlement amount will be charged to the team's salary budget.

(B) TRANSFERS AND LOANS

An MLS player may be transferred or loaned at any time to a team outside the League (subject to that team's Federation's transfer window), subject to the consent of the player.

The registration windows – the dates between which MLS may request the transfer certificate of a player under contract in another country – are as follows:

January 21 – April 15 (Primary Window)

July 15 – August 14 (Secondary Window)

(C) CONTRACT EXPIRATION

When a player's contract expires, the player does not count against the roster or budget of the team in question. Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the rights to the player indefinitely following the expiration of a contract only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

(D) BUYOUT OF GUARANTEED CONTRACT

Teams may have the ability to buyout one guaranteed player as follows:

- A Team may buy out one (1) guaranteed player (including a DP's) contract during the off-season and free up the corresponding budget space. Such a buyout is at the particular MLS Team's own expense.
- A Team may not free up budget space with a buyout of a player's salary budget charge during the season. Such a buyout will be conducted by the League and count on a Club's budget in a manner consistent with current MLS guidelines.

(IV.) RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL

Right of first refusal grants one MLS club the first opportunity to add a player to its roster in the event that the player signs with MLS. Holding a right of first refusal applies only within MLS and does not indicate holding of the player's International Transfer Certificate.

OUT OF CONTRACT PLAYERS / OPTIONS NOT

PICKED UP: Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the right of first refusal to the player indefinitely only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

DRAFTED BUT NOT SIGNED: A player who was drafted by a particular team through the Super-Draft or supplemental draft and did not sign, or who as of the first Monday in June is not offered a contract after a trial and clears waivers, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 immediately following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to sign the player.

PLAYER TRANSFERRED OUTSIDE MLS: If a team receives allocation money as a result of a player's transfer, the team does not retain a right of first refusal.

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS

Single-game credentials should be requested up to 48 hours prior to kickoff, by calling the D.C. United communications office. Requests for season credentials must be made via the online link provided by D.C. United prior to the season. All credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call at RFK Stadium's Gate A, beginning two hours prior to kickoff on game days.

PARKING

D.C. United will distribute a limited number of full-season parking passes. Please note, the club will not be able to accommodate all requests. Paid parking is available in Lot 5 and other stadium lots.

PRESS BOX

The D.C. United communications department will maintain the club's press box on the mezzanine level at midfield in RFK Stadium. Admission to the press box is limited to those who have either D.C. United or Major League Soccer credentials. Professional behavior is required at all times in the press box, while abuse of team or League credentials will lead to forfeiture of all credentials.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS

Following the match's conclusion, a post-game news conference will be held in the media room opposite the D.C. United locker room. At the conclusion of the news conference, the locker rooms will be open to media.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

ENG crews and still photographers holding proper credentials may position themselves along either endline at field level. Movement down the near touchline will not be permitted at any time during the match. Still photographers do not have access to the locker rooms post game.

GAME NOTES AND STATISTICS

Game notes, media guides and other information will be made available in both the media hospitality room and the press box prior to each game. During the game, statistics will be distributed to working media at both the half and the game's conclusion, as soon as they are compiled. Periodic game-related announcements will also be made during the game.


MEALS

Food and beverages are available to working members of the media in the media hospitality room, on the fourth floor of RFK, one hour prior to kickoff. A \$5 donation to the club's non-profit arm, United for D.C., is required for the full meal.

TRAINING SESSIONS

During the regular season, training sessions typically run 90 minutes and usually begin at 10:30 a.m. during the week. Practice times can and frequently do vary. Members of the media who intend to cover practice sessions on a regular basis should call the D.C. United communications office to obtain the latest training schedule information. Training sessions will, in general, be open to the media, but they may be closed at the discretion of the head coach. All training sessions are closed to the public.

DIRECTIONS

RFK Stadium From National Airport: Exit out of National Airport, follow signs for I-395 North. Stay on I-395 North for approximately three miles. Exit 395 at 6th Street Southeast and Navy Yard. At the bottom of the ramp go left at traffic light onto 6th Street. Stay on 6th Street for 1/2 mile until Independence Ave. Go right on Independence Ave. and drive for 1.1 miles until 19th Street. Go left on 19th Street and travel one block to East Capitol Street. Turn right on East Capitol Street to the Stadium.

RFK From Union Station: Drive East from Union Station along Massachusetts Avenue. Continue past Stanton Square on Massachusetts to Lincoln Park (at 12th Street). Go around Lincoln Park to East Capitol Street and turn right onto East Capitol. Follow East Capitol to stadium.

RFK From I-66 and Constitution Avenue: Follow Constitution East past the Capitol Building to Maryland Avenue. Turn left on Maryland and go two blocks to Stanton Square. At Stanton Square, turn right onto Massachusetts Avenue. Follow Massachusetts Avenue to Lincoln Park (at 12th Street). Go around Lincoln Park to East Capitol Street and turn right onto East Capitol.
