D.C. UNITED CLUB HISTORY

1996 | 16-6-0

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS, U.S. OPEN CUP CHAMPIONS

The club's inaugural season in 1996 proved to be a fruitful one for the Black-And-Red. After a slow start in League play, United found the right balance and went into the postseason as the team to beat. They proved to be just that, defeating the Los Angeles Galaxy 3-2 in overtime via a golden goal header by defender Eddie Pope to capture the first MLS Cup title on October 20. One trophy was not enough for the Black-and-Red that fall, as three days later, United shut out the Rochester Raging Rhinos of the A-League (now the USL First Division) 3-0 to win the U.S. Open Cup, the country's oldest soccer tournament. The Black-and-Red became the first club to capture America's version of the "double."

1997 | 21-11-0

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS, SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS

The team's second season was another banner year for United, as the team rolled through the regular season with a League-best record of 21-11. D.C., went a perfect 5-0 in the MLS Cup Playoffs, which culminated in a 2-1 victory over the Colorado Rapids in MLS Cup '97 in front of a record – and rabid – home crowd of 57,431 at RFK Stadium.

1998 | 24-8-0

CONCACAF CHAMPIONS' CUP WINNERS, INTERAMERICAN CUP WINNERS

United failed to capture domestic honors for the first time in its short history, losing to the Chicago Fire 2-0 in MLS Cup '98. Though United would be disappointed on the home front, their previous success gave them the opportunity to seek honors on a larger stage. After reaching the semifinals of the CONCACAF Champions' Cup in 1997, the Black-and-Red made it one step further to the finals in 1998, where it faced Mexican 'supercampeon' Toluca. A dramatic 1-0 victory at RFK Stadium not only gave the Black-and-Red its first international trophy, but also a chance for a second by earning a berth to the 1998 InterAmerican Cup. Legendary Brazilian side Vasco da Gama would be South America's representative, and it proved to be a formidable side, winning the first leg of the championship at RFK Stadium by a 1-0 score. However, United shocked the Brazilian team, and much of the soccer world, by winning the away leg at Lockhart Stadium in Ft. Lauderdale by a 2-1 margin. Thanks to a pair of road goals, United won the fixture on the away goals rule and came away with the InterAmerican Cup trophy and the title "Champion of the Americas." That contest proved to be a fitting farewell for head coach Bruce Arena, who left the District of Columbia to conquer further international battles as the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team.



1999 | 23-9-0

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS, SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS

The 1999 season would feature a new coach, as former Tampa Bay Mutiny and New England Revolution Head Coach Thomas Rongen took over on the United sideline. The club produced the same successful results its supporters now demanded, as the squad earned its second Supporters' Shield for the League's best regular season record (23-9) and once again represented the Eastern Conference in the MLS Cup. Just as in 1996, MLS Cup '99 featured the Black-and-Red and the Galaxy in Foxborough, but this time dramatics were not necessary as a pair of first-half goals gave United a 2-0 victory and its third Alan I. Rothenberg Trophy in four seasons.

2000 | 8-18-6

For the first time in club history, United failed to qualify for postseason competition or capture any sort of silverware. The team managed a record of just 2-9-1 to start the season and never recovered from its early struggles, finishing last in the Eastern Division. The team's midseason 3-1 win over Newcastle United at RFK Stadium was one of the rare positives in a difficult campaign. Another of the bright spots during the 2000 campaign was the debut of 16-year old midfielder Bobby Convey, who at the time of his first game – March 25 versus the Los Angeles Galaxy – was the youngest player to play in an MLS game.

2001 | 8-16-2

The 2001 campaign saw United supporters suffer another difficult year as the club finished last in the Eastern Division and missed out on the playoffs in consecutive seasons. For the second year in a row, United had a player debut as the youngest in League history when Santino Quaranta came on as a substitute against the New England Revolution on May 9. The 16-year-old also became the youngest player to be named as a Player of the Week and an MLS All-Star.

2002 | 9-14-5

After two disappointing seasons, United named former Miami Fusion skipper Ray Hudson as the club's third head coach on 1/8. Hudson saw his new club's push for the postseason last until the final match of the schedule, but the Black-and-Red missed out on the MLS Cup Playoffs for a third straight season. 2002 did have some bright spots, however, with a trio of club and League firsts. Domestically, United hosted the 2002 MLS All-Star Game at RFK Stadium for the first time and also won the inaugural Atlantic Cup trophy in its yearly season series with New York. Internationally, the Black-and-Red became the first MLS side to travel to England when it defeated Tottenham Hotspur 1-0 in a tribute match at the famed White Hart Lane in October.



2003 | 10-11-9

Following a third unsuccessful campaign, the club used the time before the start of the 2003 season to make drastic changes to the squad. U.S. National Team star Earnie Stewart was allocated to the club, bringing the veteran home from Holland, where he enjoyed unparalleled success for an American expatriate. Richie Williams, Eddie Pope and Jaime Moreno all headed north to join the New York MetroStars, while defender Mike Petke made the reverse journey to join the Black-and-Red. Former Indiana University standout and MLS All-Star Dema Kovalenko was also brought in to shake things up in the midfield, while his Fire teammate and Bulgarian legend Hristo Stoitchkov was added as a player/coach. Though United struggled early in the season to pick up points, the off-season moves did pay off, as the club posted a regular season record of 10-11-9, sending the club back to the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since last winning it all in 1999. However, a fourth MLS Cup was not in the cards and United fell to the Chicago Fire in the first round of the postseason.

2004 | 11-10-9

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS

The beginning of 2004 was an exciting time for the Black-and-Red, as head coach Peter Nowak and teen phenom Freddy Adu both joined the club in January. Nowak became the fourth United coach in team history, while Freddy was the first overall selection in the MLS SuperDraft. Jaime Moreno returned to D.C. following a one-year stint with the New York MetroStars. After a 5-5-5 start during the first part of the MLS regular season, United began to buy into Coach Nowak's hardworking, aggressive and team-oriented strategy and finished the regular season with an 11-10-9 record. In the final game of the regular season, the team registered a thrilling 3-2 victory over the MetroStars that vaulted the team past New York and into second place in the Eastern Conference standings. United carried its hot streak into the playoffs and dispatched of the MetroStars in the first round and the New England Revolution in the Eastern Conference championship on the way to its fifth MLS Cup championship game. Led by MLS Cup MVP Alecko Eskandarian, United went on to defeat the Kansas City Wizards 3-2 and capture its fourth MLS Cup championship. In all, United finished the season with nine victories in its last 10 games while achieving its "Return to Glory."

2005 | 16-10-6

In 2005, after a middling beginning to the season, United rebounded and finished second in the Eastern Conference with a record of 16-10-6. Its 16 wins were the most since 1999, when the team won 23 games. Jaime Moreno again led the Black-and-Red charge, tallying 16 goals – tied for his career best. The year also featured appearances in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, Copa Nissan Sudamericana and an international friendly versus the reigning English Premier League Champion, Chelsea FC. The club's MLS season ended with a disappointing loss in the first round of MLS Cup Playoffs to the Chicago Fire.



2006 | 15-7-10

SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS

D.C. United reasserted themselves as the best team in Major League Soccer in 2006, bringing home their third Supporters' Shield trophy with a 15-7-10 record. United started off the season in torrid form – going unbeaten from May 1 to July 29 – for a team-best 14 straight matches. Christian Gomez led the League's most potent offense, chalking up 12 goals and 11 assists on his way to the MLS MVP award. Other highlights for the year included a 4-0 victory over Scotland's Celtic FC and an impressive 1-1 draw against the famed Real Madrid of Spain. The club's MLS season ended with a 1-0 loss in the Eastern Conference championship to the visiting New England Revolution.

2007 | 16-7-7

SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS

Tom Soehn became the fifth head coach in United history after Peter Nowak left to become an assistant coach with the U.S. Men's National Team. Soehn, who had served as an assistant under Nowak since 2004, got off to a slow start, beginning the season 0-3. The Black-and-Red, however, rebounded and for the second consecutive season had the most potent attack in MLS. United won its fourth Supporters' Shield, becoming the first team in League history to win the award in back-to-back years. The addition of Brazilians Luciano Emilio and Fred, along with veterans Jaime Moreno, Christian Gomez and Ben Olsen helped the team score 56 regular season goals. In August, Moreno scored his 109th career regular season goal, breaking the MLS record. He finished the season with 112 career goals. The campaign also featured the club's participation in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, the inaugural SuperLiga and Copa Nissan Sudamericana.

2008 | 11-15-4

LAMAR HUNT U.S. OPEN CUP CHAMPIONS

Though the 2008 season saw United add their 12th major piece of silverware to the trophy case, the campaign was largely a disappointment as D.C. missed out on the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2002. After a terrible 2-7 start in League play, the team found its groove through the middle part of the year, going 8-3-1 from May 4 until August 23. Unfortunately, injuries decimated Tom Soehn's side and the team's record down the stretch was a dismal 1-5-3. Matters were complicated by the most games in club history – an astonishing 47 fixtures. The team fell short in international competitions, failing to capture hardware in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, SuperLiga and CONCACAF Champions League. The lone bright spot was the team's second Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup championship, which was captured after a 2-1 win over the Charleston Battery of United Soccer League's First Division.



2009 | 9-8-13

Despite the fact that United made significant changes to the 2008 team, the Black-and-Red found itself at the end of the 2009 campaign without hardware and, for the second year in a row, out of the playoffs. The team collected a League-record 13 draws as it put together a 9-8-13 mark. The club began the season admirably and found itself in first place in the Eastern Conference at the midpoint of the season with a record of 5-2-8. As the summer wore on and the games piled up, D.C., did not get the results it needed, managing a record of just 4-6-5 in the second half of the year. In non-League competitions, United also fell short. An impressive run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup ended with a deflating 2-1 loss to the expansion Seattle Sounders FC at RFK Stadium. The team showed vast improvement in CONCACAF Champions League play, finishing the group stage with a 3-2-1 record, but failed to advance to the next round. The play of rookies Chris Pontius and Rodney Wallace, along with newcomers Dejan Jakovic, Julius James and Josh Wicks, in particular, gave United fans hope the team would soon reestablish itself atop Major League Soccer.

2010 | 6-24-4

Steadying the ship in United's most tumultuous season, Ben Olsen took over as interim head coach from Curt Onalfo on August 7 at New England. The Black-and-Red showed marked improvement under Olsen, winning 2-0 over the Philadelphia Union on August 22 and beating eventual MLS Cup champions Colorado Rapids 1-0 on the road on October 1. United also reached the semifinal round of the 2010 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, falling in extra time to the Columbus Crew. The lasting image of the 2010 campaign was of club captain and 15-year MLS veteran Jaime Moreno taking his lap of honor around RFK Stadium on October 23 in his final match for D.C. United against Toronto FC. Moreno retired as MLS's all-time leading goal scorer with 133 tallies.

2011 | 23-9-0

United made big strides in 2011, as the team was in the playoff hunt until the final week of the season. The mid-season acquisition of Dwayne De Rosario provided United the playmaker it had been lacking as the Canadian tallied 13 goals and seven assists in 17 games en route to the League's scoring title and MVP award. Through 25 games, United had the best record of all Eastern Conference teams, but injuries to Chris Pontius and Dejan Jakovic were the catalyst to a 1-6-2 finish to the season. The year also included friendlies against reigning Dutch champion Ajax FC and England's Everton FC.



2012 | 8-18-6

After a disappointing end to the 2011 campaign and the fourth straight season without making the postseason, Head Coach Ben Olsen and the technical staff made the difficult decision to part ways with several club veterans. Santino Quaranta (10 seasons in DC), Clyde Simms (7 seasons), Devon McTavish (6 seasons), and Marc Burch (5 seasons) all departed as United rebuilt. United had an up-and-down season – that saw the club go undefeated at home since opening night and three named to the MLS All-Star Game roster (Olsen, Pontius, De Rosario), but finished the year on a high note after 2011 MLS MVP Dwayne De Rosario went down with an injury while on Canadian National Team duty. Instead of finishing the season poorly as many in the soccer world expected, United went undefeated in their next seven games to lock up their first playoff berth in five years along with the number two seed in the 2014 MLS Cup Playoffs.

2013 | 8-16-2

LAMAR U.S. OPEN CUP CHAMPIONS

Out of a season full of difficulty, injuries, bad luck and disappointment, D.C. United completed a stirring run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, capturing the title for the third time. United opened the competition with a penalty shootout win over its USL Pro affiliate, the Richmond Kickers, before beating Philadelphia, New England and Chicago en route to the final on the road at Real Salt Lake. Lewis Neal's goal was the difference at Rio Tinto Stadium, where the Black-and-Red stunned the hosts, 1-0. The trophy celebration brought relief as United set an MLS record for fewest victories in a season. Perry Kitchen, who made 31 appearances (31 starts), was named the team's most valuable player

2014 | 23-9-0

With a rebuilt roster full of new faces and a maturing group of young players, D.C. United completed the biggest single season turnaround in MLS history, improving 45 points from their finish in 2013. Under the stewardship of General Manager Dave Kasper and Head Coach Ben Olsen, the Black-and-Red had one of the toughest defenses in MLS and a variety of contributions on offense while players in multiple positions throughout the squad had career seasons. Among them, Bill Hamid was a front-runner for goalkeeper of the year, center back Bobby Boswell was a candidate for defender of the year in his first year back in D.C. after a six-season absence, rookie Steven Birnbaum locked down the backline alongside Boswell and Fabián Espíndola was an outside contender for MLS MVP. United captured first place in the Eastern Conference and posted a perfect 4-0-0 record in CONCACAF Champions League group play to qualify for the quarterfinals of the competition in early 2015.



2015 | 15-13-6

En route to their 12th postseason appearance in 20 seasons, D.C. United set the pace early in the regular season. With three 1-0 victories in their first four matches, the Black-and-Red took over first place in early April and held it until mid-September, meanwhile establishing a new club record of 20 straight matches at home without a defeat. United utilized 29 different starting lineups in 34 matches, had a goal or assist from 18 different players, came from behind to win eight times and won 11 one-goal matches. The Black-and-Red went 3-0-1 in the group stage of the Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League.

DAVE KASPER

GENERAL MANAGER AND VICE PRESIDENT OF SOCCER OPERATIONS


D.C. United General Manager and Vice President of Soccer Operations Dave Kasper has overseen the club's Major League Soccer team for nearly a decade and a half. Under his stewardship, D.C. United recently qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs for the second consecutive season and third time in four years. In 2014, Kasper was a critical leader in the biggest single-season turnaround in Major League Soccer history, as the Black-and-Red finished atop the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2007.

During Kasper's 14-year tenure, D.C. United have won five major trophies: the 2004 MLS Cup, two MLS Supporters Shields (2006 and 2007) and two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups (2008 and 2013). United also reached the 2009 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final and have earned eight playoff appearances, including three as the first place team in the Eastern Conference. Kasper has managed 16 MLS Best XI selections, including three MLS MVPs: Christian Gomez (2006), Luciano Emilio (2007) and Dwayne De Rosario (2011). He has also had two goalkeepers of the year, Troy Perkins (2006) and Bill Hamid (2014), one defender of the year, Bobby Boswell (2006) and one rookie of the year, Andy Najar (2010). In addition to Najar, four other D.C. United players have been named a rookie of the year finalist in the last six seasons: Chris Pontius (2009), Perry Kitchen (2011), Nick DeLeon (2012) and Steven Birnbaum (2014).

Kasper, who was originally named Technical Director in Dec. 2001 and then General Manager in Sept. 2007, also has overseen the dramatic growth and success of D.C. United's youth development efforts, including the D.C. United Academy. He has been largely responsible for one of the strongest academy systems in Major League Soccer, bringing seven local products through the ranks to the First Team: Andy Najar, Bill Hamid, Ethan White, Conor Shanosky, Michael Seaton, Collin Martin and Jalen Robinson. Najar, who played for Honduras at the 2014 FIFA World Cup, was the first Homegrown player to be named MLS Rookie of the Year in 2010 and the first Homegrown player to permanently move to a European side when he was signed by Belgium's R.S.C. Anderlecht in January 2013. Hamid was the first Homegrown player to be named MLS Goalkeeper of the Year Award in 2014.

Kasper has a wide variety of soccer experience as a player, coach and front office executive. During his playing career, Kasper was a standout forward at the University of Maryland, earning All-ACC honors while also serving as a member of the U-20 U.S. Men's National Team. He played professionally for the Milwaukee Wave (1989-90) and the Pittsburgh Stingrays (1990-94) and transitioned into Duquesne University's first-ever head coach. Kasper was named general manager of the Pittsburgh Riverhounds in 1998 (USL-1). The following year, Kasper led the organization to the playoffs and to Organization of the Year honors.

Kasper lives in Ashburn, Va., with his wife, Lizzethe, and daughters, Alexandra and Isabella.



BEN OLSEN

HEAD COACH

Olsen's coaching career began at the beginning of the 2010 season as an assistant under United head coach Curt Onalfo. Midway through the 2010 campaign, Olsen replaced Onalfo, making his debut as Interim Head Coach on August 7 at New England. Olsen won his first match in charge on August 22 against Philadelphia in a 2-0 triumph. Following improved play under the former United captain, Olsen was hired permanently as Head Coach on November 29, 2010. At 33-years-old he was, at the time, the youngest coach in Major League Soccer.

In 2011, his first full season at the helm, Olsen's side made big strides as the team finished 9-13-12 and was in the playoff hunt until the final week of the season. The club's offense saw vast improvement that year scoring 49 goals – good enough for fourth most in MLS. Like its coach, D.C. United showed pride, bringing the momentum from a much-improved season into a very successful 2012 season.

In his second full season as head coach, Olsen's side reached the playoffs for the first time in five years and the first such appearance for Olsen as head coach. With the third best regular-season record in all of MLS, United captured the #2 seed in the East, defeating the New York Red Bulls in the Eastern Conference semifinals and losing to the Houston Dynamo in the conference finals. On the offensive side, the Black-and-Red netted 53 goals, good for fourth in the League. Perhaps more impressively, the team went undefeated at home in 16 games (12-0-4), dating all the way back to March 30. At season's end, Olsen was named a finalist for MLS' Coach of the Year.

2013 proved a tough season for the leader of the Black-and-Red, but Olsen and his squad never lost hope. Though finishing with an MLS-worst record of 3-24-7, United won all five of its U.S. Open Cup matches, capturing the title and bringing home D.C. United's 13th trophy— an MLS best.

As a player, Olsen was amongst the club's all-time leaders in several key categories at the time of his retirement – second in games played (221), minutes played (17,098) and game-winning goals (13), third in assists (49) and shots on goal (155), and seventh all-time in goals (29). Always a United fan favorite, the midfielder won nine total trophies while in DC, including two MLS Cups (1999 & 2004). He was a two-time All-Star (1998 & 1999), the 1998 MLS Rookie of the Year, the 1999 MLS Cup MVP, the 2003 USSF Humanitarian of the Year and was named to the MLS Best XI in 2007. He retired from the Black-and-Red lineup on November 24, 2009.

In addition to his storied career with United, Olsen also played with the U.S. Men's National Team. He made his full international debut against Australia on November 6, 1998. His first goal for the U.S. came in just his second international game when he scored against Chile on February 21, 1999. In 2000, he was part of the team that reached the bronze medal game at the Sydney Olympics before falling to Chile. Olsen was selected to the 2006 World Cup team. In his career, the midfielder earned 37 caps and six goals with the U.S. Men's National Team.

Prior to his professional career, Olsen spent three seasons at the University of Virginia from 1995-1997. During his time with the Cavaliers, the team posted a 56-8-8 record. The midfielder compiled 34 goals with 41 assists and started and played every game (69) of his collegiate career. After his junior season, he was named the 1997 Soccer America Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Hermann Trophy. He was also named as the ACC Tournament MVP and selected to the NSCAA All-American first-team after his senior year.



CHAD ASHTON

ASSISTANT COACH



Chad Ashton joined D.C. United's technical staff prior to the start of the 2007 season. He currently serves as an Assistant Coach to Ben Olsen after holding the same position under Tom Soehn from 2007-2009. In 2010, Ashton served as the club's Technical Director before a move back to the sidelines when Olsen was named Interim Head Coach midway through the 2010 season.

Ashton helped guide the team to the Supporters' Shield in his first season in 2007 and capture the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in 2008 and 2013. He joined United after ten seasons as the Head Coach of men's soccer at University of Denver, where he compiled a record of 85-85-14, ranking him as the second-most winning coach in school history. In 2006, he was named Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Co-Coach of the Year after guiding the Pioneers to an 11-5-2 record. It was his second Coach of the Year honor, having also won the award in 2004.

During the 1990s, Ashton played professionally with Colorado Foxes of the American Professional Soccer League, the Wichita Wings of the National Professional Soccer League and MLS' Dallas Burn.

Ashton was a three-time All-ACC midfielder at the University of North Carolina and finished his collegiate career in 1989 as the Tarheels' all-time leader in assists with 43, a record he still holds. Ashton also helped UNC to two NCAA tournament appearances, including a berth in the 1987 Final Four. In high school, he was selected as the Colorado High School Player of the Year in 1986.

ZACH THORNTON

DIRECTOR OF GOALKEEPING, ASSISTANT COACH



Zach Thornton joined D.C. United before the 2015 MLS season from Villanova University, where he served as the Associate Head Coach for the Men's Soccer team from January 2013 -January 2015. Prior to Villanova, Thornton volunteered his time at Loyola University for the 2012 season. He also holds a U.S. Soccer Federation National "B" Coaching License.

Thornton enjoyed an illustrious playing career, earning nine caps for the U.S. National Team, playing 16 seasons in MLS and for the Portuguese giant Benfica from 2003-2004, where he won the Portuguese Cup. Thornton won one MLS Cup, four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups, one Supporters' Shield and was MLS runners-up in 2000 and 2003. He was a six-time MLS All-Star, earned MLS Goalkeeper of the Year honors twice, was named the MLS Comeback Player of the Year and was named to MLS Best XI twice.

He was also the Chicago Fire Team MVP in 2002, Chicago's Defensive Player of the Year in 2001 and '02 and Chivas USA's Team MVP in 2009. Thornton was named as an alternate for both the 1996 Olympics and the 2002 World Cup.

Before playing professionally, Thornton was an NSCAA All-American at Loyola University for soccer in 1993 and 1994, and earned All American Honor for lacrosse in 1994 and 1995. He was inducted into the university's Hall of Fame for both sports in 2003. At Essex Community College of Baltimore County, he was inducted into the NJCAA Soccer Hall of Fame in 2000, the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2015, and the CCBC Hall of Fame for both sports in 2012.

AMOS MAGEE

ASSISTANT COACH



Amos Magee joined D.C. United in 2014 as U-23 Head Coach and Assistant Coach to the First Team before moving solely to the First Team in 2015. Magee came to United after two seasons as the Head Coach of the Portland Timbers Reserves and Assistant Coach for the Timbers first team.

A native of St. Paul, Minn., Magee attended Wesleyan University and is the all-time leading scorer (35 goals and 85 points) for the Cardinals, as well as a member of the Wesleyan University Hall of Fame. After college, he played for United Soccer League (USL) side Minnesota Thunder for 12 seasons, becoming its all-time leading goal scorer (64) en route to being inducted in the USL Hall of Fame in 2008. After his time with the Thunder, he had several loan stints with Major League Soccer (MLS) sides Tampa Bay Mutiny and Chicago Fire.

Magee began his coaching career with the Minnesota Thunder in 2006, and in 2007 led the U.S. Maccabi squad to a gold medal in the 2007 Pan American Maccabiah in Buenos Aires, Argentina. In 2008, he was named Director of Soccer Development for the Portland Timbers, then a USL side, until being named Head Coach of the Timbers Reserves in 2011.



DAVY ARNAUD

ASSISTANT COACH

Following his retirement on March 3, 2016, Davy Arnaud transitioned into a full-time coach for D.C. United. The 14-year MLS veteran is continuing his tenure with the Black-and-Red since his acquisition from the Montreal Impact after the 2013 season.

"Davy has had a remarkable playing career and we greatly appreciate what he has brought to our club over the past two seasons. He is one of the most hard-working, honest and competitive players I have worked with in the past 14 years at the club," Dave Kasper, United general manager and VP of soccer operations, said. "We are excited that he is starting his coaching career with us, and we know that he will bring the same passion and commitment to the club as a coach."

Arnaud, who played for the Kansas City Wizards and Montreal Impact before United, is in the top ten of various MLS all-time records, including fifth in games played (351), sixth in minutes (28,471) and tied for seventh in starts (316). He is also the most fouled player in the history of MLS, drawing the referee's whistle 746 times over his career.

Since becoming a regular starter in 2004 for the Wizards, who drafted him 50th overall in the 2002 MLS SuperDraft, Arnaud played in at least 22 matches every year and averaged over 25 starts a year.

On June 7, 2003, Arnaud scored his first MLS goal against Tim Howard and the MetroStars in a 2-1 victory, and he recorded his 50th and final career goal in Portland on May 3, 2014. He also scored the first ever goal in MLS play for the Montreal Impact on March 17, 2012.

The passionate midfielder also earned seven caps with the U.S. Men's National Team, making his debut against Brazil on Sept. 9, 2007 at Soldier Field in Chicago. He scored his first international goal against Haiti during the 2009 CONCACAF Gold Cup.

Arnaud lives in Northern Virginia with his wife, Stephanie and two children, Peyton and Brody.

2016 Season Notes

LAST MLS GAME RECAP

In the 34th match of the 2016 MLS season, the Black-and-Red lost to Orlando City FC 4-2 at Camping World Stadium on October 23. Kevin Molino opened the scoring for Orlando with a goal in the 13th minute. Orlando then doubled their lead with a goal from Kaká in the 21st minute. Álvaro Saborio put the Black-and-Red on the board with a goal in the 43rd minute. Cristian Higuita scored Orlando's third goal in the 50th minute. United's Kennedy Igboananike scored the second goal for the Black-and-Red in the 78th minute. Julio Baptista scored the fourth goal for Orlando and final of the match in the 89th minute.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS

D.C. United were the first to be MLS Cup Champions in the inaugural season in 1996 when they beat the L.A. Galaxy 3-2 on October 20. The following year, the Black-and-Red took home the trophy once again when they beat the Colorado Rapids 2-1 on October 26, 1997. The third win was on November 21, 1999 when D.C. United won 2-0 against the L.A. Galaxy. The fourth and final MLS Cup Championship was on November 11, 2004 when the Black-and-Red beat the Kansas City Wizards 3-2.

2015 PLAYOFFS

In the 2015 season, D.C. United beat New England Revolution 2-1 on October 28, 2015 at RFK Stadium in the knockout round. The Black-and-Red went on to lose to the New York Red Bulls in the Conference Semifinals. The Black-and-Red lost 1-0 against the Red Bulls in both legs of the series.

GOALS SCORED IN LAST 10 GAMES

D.C. United scored 27 goals in the last 15 matches of the 2016 MLS regular season. The Black-and-Red go into the Audi 2016 MLS Cup playoffs with the best attacking form in club history; scoring more goals in the final 15 matches of the regular season than any other playoff year.

NINE CONSECUTIVE MULTI-GOAL GAMES

After the 4-2 loss to Orlando City FC on October 23, D.C. United recorded their ninth consecutive multi-goal game. The last time the Black-and-Red have scored nine consecutive multi-goal games was July 28, 1996 to August 29, 1996 when they scored 21 goals in 9 matches.

D.C. UNITED'S FOURTH CONSECUTIVE WIN

After beating Orlando 4-1 on September 24, winning against Columbus 3-0 on September 28, defeating Toronto FC 2-1 on October 1, and winning against NYCFC 3-1 on October 16, D.C. United strung together their fourth consecutive win for the first time this season. The last time United won four consecutive games was in 2014 when they beat Toronto 2-1 on July 5, San Jose 2-1 on July 11, Chivas USA 3-1 on July 20, and Toronto 3-0 on July 30.

D.C. UNITED CLINCH A SPOT IN THE PLAYOFFS

After their victory over NYCFC on October 16, the Black-and-Red clinched a spot in MLS Playoffs posting a 11-9-13 regular season record. The Black-and-Red have scored the most goals (35) since July 20.

HAMID AND SAM NAMED TO MLS TEAM OF THE WEEK

United midfielder Lloyd Sam and goalkeeper Bill Hamid have been named to the MLS Team of the Week for their outstanding performances against NYCFC on Sunday, October 16, while Bobby Boswell and Patrick Mullins made the bench. Sam recorded two assists and four chances created. Hamid had eight saves and only allowed one goal. Mullins opened the scoring with a goal in the 26th minute. Boswell scored his 18th career goal in the 30th minute.

BOBBY BOSWELL MAKES 350 CAREER START

D.C. United's captain Bobby Boswell made his 350th career start against NYCFC on September 16. The 33-year-old marked the milestone with his 18th career goal. Boswell has made 30 appearances for the Black-and-Red this season recording two goals and one assist.

D.C. UNITED'S THIRD CONSECUTIVE WIN

After beating Orlando 4-1 on September 24, winning against Columbus 3-0 on September 28 and defeating Toronto FC 2-1 on October 1, D.C. Lamar Neagle has been nominated for MLS Player of the Week. Neagle scored both goals in United's 2-1 victory over Toronto FC on October 1, helping them win their first road match since May 27. Neagle is United's leading scorer with 9 goals. This season, Neagle has appeared in 31 games for the Black-and-Red.

D.C. UNITED WIN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

After beating Orlando 4-1 on September 24 and winning against Columbus 3-0 on September 28, D.C. United strung together two consecutive wins for the first time this season. The last time the Black-and-Red won consecutive games was in 2015 when they beat New York City F.C. 2-1 on October 2 then beat Chicago 4-0 on October 18.

EIGHT CONSECUTIVE MULTI-GOAL GAMES

BÜSCHER SCORED FIRST MLS GOAL

Julian Büscher scored his first career MLS goal in the 4-1 win against Orlando on September 24. The rookie scored a right footed shot in the 90th minute to help seal the victory for the Black-and-Red.

KEMP NOTCHES THREE ASSISTS

Taylor Kemp tallied three assists in the 4-1 win against Orlando on September 24. It was the second time that Kemp recorded multiple assists in a game with the first coming on August 17, 2014 when he tallied two in the 4-2 win against Colorado at RFK Stadium.

GOALS SCORED SINCE MULLINS ARRIVAL

Luke Mishu made his first MLS appearance in 2016 in the 1-1 draw with Montreal on August 24. The defender played the first half as left back and the second half as right back for the Black-and-Red. The 25-year-old was second on the team in passing accuracy with 82.6%.

DURKIN NAMED TO U.S. UNDER-17 SQUAD

D.C. United's most recent Homegrown signing Chris Durkin has been named to the U.S. Under-17 roster to compete in the 2016 Torneo de Naciones, set to take place Aug. 22-29, in Mexico City. The 16-year-old signed with United on June 14, 2016, after spending the last five years in the academy. He made his competitive debut for the club on June 15, playing 86 minutes against the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the NASL in United's Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup match.

Only three minutes after Marcelo buried a penalty kick to cut the deficit to one goal in the 70th minute, Taylor Kemp swung in a corner to the back post, where Steve Birnbaum headed the ball back across the face of goal and Mullins rose highest to score his second Black-and-Red goal.

D.C. UNITED UNDEFEATED IN EIGHT HOME MATCHES

MULLINS NOMINATED FOR AT&T GOTW

United forward Patrick Mullins was nominated for the AT&T MLS Goal of the Week for his goal against the Montreal Impact on Sunday, July 31. Mullins, who made his home debut for the Black-and-Red and started for the first time, headed home a Taylor Kemp in-swinging cross in the 19th minute past Evan Bush to open the scoring.

KEMP TALLIES 10TH CAREER ASSIST

Taylor Kemp recorded his 10th career assist in the 1-1 draw with Montreal on July 31. Kemp's only previous assist in 2016 served as the game-winner in the 1-0 win over Sporting KC on May 27.

IGBOANAIKE MAKES BLACK-AND-RED DEBUT

Midfielder Kennedy Igboanike made his D.C. United debut after coming off the bench to play 26 minutes in a 1-1 draw v. Montreal.

D.C. UNITED SIGN KENNEDY IGBOANAIKE

Igboanike has played in 18 matches for the Fire in 2016 (starting every match) and accounted for over a quarter of the Fire's goals. The former University of Maryland standout has made 66 appearances (39 starts) over four seasons, scoring 18 goals and adding eight assists. Mullins was selected by New England Revolution as the 11th pick overall in the 2014 MLS SuperDraft.

ESPÍNDOLA TRADED TO VANCOUVER

United have acquired general allocation money from the Vancouver Whitecaps in exchange for Designated Player Fabián Espíndola. The Argentine forward, 31, played in 59 matches (49 starts) for the Black-and-Red after he was selected in the second stage of the 2013 Re-Entry Draft on December 18, 2013, scoring 20 goals and recording 17 assists.

LLOYD SAM MAKES BLACK-AND-RED DEBUT

Lloyd Sam made his debut for the Black-and-Red against Columbus Crew SC on July 16, 2016. The Ghanaian international started on the right of United's four-man midfield, playing all 90 minutes.

BIRNBAUM SELECTED FOR 2016 ALL-STAR ROSTER

D.C. United defender Steve Birnbaum was selected to the 2016 MLS All-Star roster that will represent the league against Arsenal F.C. at Avaya Stadium in San Jose, Calif., on July 28. In 2016, the central defender has made 26 appearances (playing all 90 minutes in each) and leads the team in Aerial Duels Won for players who have over 20 appearances (64%). A member of the U.S. Men's National Team, Birnbaum featured in World Cup Qualifiers and Copa America Centenario throughout the first half of the MLS season. HAMID NOMINATED FOR MLS SAVE OF THE WEEK

JALEN ROBINSON MAKES FIRST MLS START

D.C. United's seventh homegrown signing made his first career MLS start in the 2-0 win against New England on June 25. The center back's performance earned him a spot on the MLS Team of the Week.

BEN OLSEN COACHES 100th REGULAR SEASON GAME AT RFK

Head coach Ben Olsen won his 100th home game 2-0 against New England on June 25. Since 2010, Olsen has posted a 51-30-27 record at the stadium. As a player, the Black-and-Red head coach made 117 appearances (107 starts) at D.C. United's home field.

D.C. UNITED SIGN FIFTH YOUNGEST HOMEGROWN PLAYER

D.C. United signed Chris Durkin as their eighth MLS Homegrown Player on June 14, 2016. The Under-17 U.S. National Team captain is the fifth-youngest MLS Homegrown signing behind Diego Fagundez (15 years, 9 months, 11 days), Zach Pfeffer (15 years, 11 months, 16 days), Jack McBean (16 years, 1 month, 16 days) and Erik Palmer-Brown (16 years, 3 months, 9 days). Durkin is the youngest ever Black-and-Red Homegrown Player at 16 years, 4 months and 6 days.

JALEN ROBINSON MAKES MLS DEBUT

D.C. United's seventh Homegrown signing made his MLS debut as a late substitute in the 0-0 draw against Houston on June 18. The academy product has made four U.S. Open Cup appearances and five CONCACAF Champions League appearances since signing for the Black-and-Red on January 6, 2014.

ACOSTA REACHES 10th D.C. UNITED START

Luciano Acosta made his 10th career MLS start against Houston in the 0-0 draw on June 18. In 31 appearances, Acosta has scored three goals and recorded 11 assists. The Argentinean has completed 904 passes with a 75% passing accuracy so far this season.

BILL HAMID RETURNS FROM INJURY

Bill Hamid returned to action for the first time since undergoing knee surgery in January against Sporting KC on May 27. The 2014 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year made three saves on his return, securing three points and D.C. United's fifth shutout in 2016.

FIRST AWAY WIN OF 2016

D.C. United won their first away fixture of the season after defeating Sporting KC 1-0 on May 27. The Black-and-Red are now 2-6-9 away from home, scoring 17 and conceding 29.

BOSWELL THIRD ALL-TIME IN GAMES STARTED/MINUTES PLAYED

WORRA RECORDS FOURTH SHUTOUT

Travis Worra recorded his fourth MLS shutout in the 2-0 win against the New York Red Bulls on May 13 at RFK Stadium. In his 10th MLS appearance, Worra made five saves to help secure D.C. Birnbaum, 25, was recently called up to U.S. coach Jurgen Klinsmann's annual January camp in California where he scored his first international goal, a game-winning header against Iceland on Jan. 31. The 2014 Rookie of the Year finalist made 21 appearances for the Black-and-Red in his first season and 22 in 2015, when he scored two goals.

SABORIO NAMED TO FINAL COSTA RICAN WCQ ROSTER

United forward Alvaro Saborío made Costa Rica's final roster for their upcoming World Cup Qualifying matches against Jamaica on March 25 and March 29. The Costa Rican has scored over 30 goals for the national team since his debut in 2002, making more than 100 appearances for los Ticos. Since joining the Black-and-Red in 2015, Saborío has made 30 appearances for United, scoring 9 goals.

NEAGLE MAKES HIS 100th MLS START

D.C. United's newly acquired midfielder, Lamar Neagle made his 100th MLS start on March 20, 2016 against Colorado. Since joining from Seattle over the offseason, Neagle has already netted his first goal for United in the Black-and-Red's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles on March 6, 2016. Prior to United, Neagle made 141 MLS appearances, scoring 28 goals and recording 19 assists since joining Major League Soccer in 2009.

HOME OPENER RECORD

Since 1996, the Black-and-Red have accumulated a 9-7-5 home-opening record at RFK Stadium scoring 30 goals in 21 games.

CHARLIE HORTON SIGNS WITH UNITED

The Black-and-Red officially signed former New England Revolution goalkeeper Charlie Horton on March 3, 2016.

WEEK-ONE HISTORY

With D.C. United's 4-1 defeat to Los Angeles at the StubHub Center, the Black-and-Red have an overall week-one record of 8-11-2. United have scored 27 goals in all of its week-one fixtures since 1996.

DAVY ARNAUD RETIRES

The 35-year-old midfielder ended his 14-year playing career and will transition into a full-time coach for the Black-and-Red. Arnaud, who played for the Kansas City Wizards and Montreal Impact before his time in Washington, is the most fouled player in MLS history (746). He is sixth in games played (351), sixth in minutes (28,471) and tied for seventh in starts (316). After being traded to the Impact after the 2011 season, Arnaud became the first-ever captain for the Canadian side and scored the team's first MLS goal on March 17.

D.C. UNITED REACH SCCL QUARTERFINALS FOR 2nd CONSECUTIVE YEAR

For the second year in a row, United reached the quarterfinal round of the Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League. The Black-and-Red did not advance, falling 3-1 on aggregate to Liga MX side Querétaro F.C. Rookie Julian Büscher scored his first D.C. United goal in the second leg at RFK in the 84th minute.

D.C. UNITED SIGN ROB VINCENT

United completed the acquisition of midfielder Rob Vincent from the Pittsburgh Riverhounds of the United Soccer League on February 17. The Liverpool native scored 18 goals for the Riverhounds in 2015, and was taken on trial with the Black-and-Red in the fall of 2015 as well as the 2016 preseason. He made his competitive debut for the club in Querétaro, Mexico, during the first leg of the SCCL quarterfinals.

STEVE BIRNBAUM SCORES FOR USMNT

Third-year defender Steven Birnbaum scored his first goal for the U.S. Men's National Team against Iceland on Jan. 31. After providing the assist on Michael Orozco's equalizing goal in the 59th minute, Birnbaum scored rose highest on a Michael Bradley corner and headed home the winning goal in the 90th minute.
