THE TEAM



Schellas Hyndman | HEAD COACH

Now entering his fifth season as head coach, Hyndman joined FC Dallas on June 17, 2008 after 31 seasons as a college head coach, including 24 at nearby Southern Methodist University. He has compiled a 42-34-35 MLS regular season record during his three-and-a-half year tenure and currently holds the top winning percentage in team history (.536). The fifth head coach of FC Dallas, Hyndman was the first to be named MLS Coach of the Year in 2010. He also led the club to its first appearance in MLS Cup that season, leading to a berth in the 2011 CONCACAF Champions League tournament.

Under Hyndman, the 2011 FC Dallas side became the first team in MLS history to defeat a Mexican opponent in Mexico as the club opened its first foray into the competition with an unprecedented 4-0-0 record and four consecutive shutouts. Hyndman also led Dallas to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since the 2007 season and equaled the greatest number of points in a MLS season (52) despite enduring an additional 14 matches in outside competition.

Hyndman ranks fifth all-time in victories among Division I coaches, posting an all-time college record of 466-122-49, which includes a record of 368-98-38 at SMU and 98-24-11 at Eastern Illinois University, where he has been inducted into the school's Hall of Fame. In 31 years as coach, he led his schools to 30 NCAA playoff appearances, 11 quarterfinals and five final fours (three in Division I, two in Division II). He was named National Coach of the Year in 1981 and also earned eight league Coach of the Year honors during his career (WAC: 1997, 1998, 1999; MVC: 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004; Conference USA: 2006). Hyndman was recognized for his long-term service and contributions towards the growth of intercollegiate soccer on Jan. 13, 2012. He

received the Bill Jeffrey Award for Long-Term Service to Intercollegiate Soccer during the annual NSCAA Awards Banquet in Kansas City, Mo. Hyndman also remains a Director of Coaching Emeritus of the NSCAA Academy.

Born Nov. 4, 1949 in Macau (China) to a Portuguese father and Russian mother, Hyndman lived in China until the age of eight, when his family moved to Springfield, Ohio. He attended and played football at Butler High School, while playing club soccer with the Dayton Edelweiss Soccer Club. Hyndman played collegiate soccer at Eastern Illinois University, where he was part of the 1969 NAIA national championship team. After playing one season with the Cincinnati Comets of the American Soccer League in 1975, Hyndman moved to Sao Paulo, Brazil, where he was an apprentice at Escola Graduada de Sao Paulo and trained regularly with Sao Paulo FC.

On Oct. 20, 2007, Hyndman was enshrined into the Walk of Fame at FC Dallas Stadium, along with Kenny Cooper Sr., an honor given to those who have made significant contributions to the sport of soccer in Texas. He is also a former president of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (2005). Hyndman, who also holds a 10th degree black belt in karate, is married to Kami and has three children, Tony, Jaime and Tamara. His grandson Emerson is playing with Fulham Football Club Academy in London, England.



John Ellinger | ASSISTANT COACH

John Ellinger is entering his fifth season as an FC Dallas assistant coach. Before joining Dallas, Ellinger spent time as technical director for U.S. Youth Soccer (2007-2008), head coach at Real Salt Lake (2004-2007), and head coach of the U.S. Under-17 national team (1997-2004).

He began his coaching career as the head coach of Montgomery College in Maryland in 1979, before moving to the University of Maryland-Baltimore from 1981 to 1990. He then served as the Director of Coaching for Columbia Soccer Association from 1990 to 1998. He became a member of the U.S. Soccer National team coaching staff in 1992, and then was also an assistant coach for the Columbus Crew during the inaugural 1996 MLS season.

In 1997, Ellinger was hired as U.S. Soccer's Under-17 head coach and the organization's Director of Youth Development, which included spearheading the launch of the U.S. Soccer U-17 Residency Program in Bradenton, Florida. The program debuted on January 17, 1999, with U.S. Soccer collecting the top 20 of the country's elite youth players and placing them in year-round training at the IMG Academy. Among the more than 200 players that have graduated from the program are: Landon Donovan, DaMarcus Beasley, Bobby Convey, Oguchi Onyewu, Michael Bradley, Heath Pearce and current FC Dallas player Brek Shea.

After eight years with U.S. Soccer, Ellinger was given the opportunity to be the first head coach in Real Salt Lake history in late 2004. He remained in the role until early in the 2007 season, when he became the team's Technical Director before moving to U.S. Youth Soccer.

A native of Maryland, he earned his bachelor's degree and master's degree in health and physical education from Frostburg State University. He and his wife, Tami, have three children: daughters Leigh and Brooke and son Matt.

Marco Ferruzzi | ASSISTANT COACH

Marco Ferruzzi enters his eighth season as an assistant coach and his first as the head coach of the FC Dallas Reserves. During his tenure, FC Dallas has compiled a regular season record of 73-61-50. In addition to assisting in running practices and evaluating players for the first team, Ferruzzi oversees the scouting of college and youth players for the club, including the staff preparations for the annual MLS Player Combine and SuperDraft. He has served as a reserve team, Pre-Academy and premier team coach in the FC Dallas youth club.

Ferruzzi, 39, was selected sixth overall in the 1997 MLS Supplemental Draft by the Tampa Bay Mutiny, where he played in 19 games, registering two assists.

Following his time with Tampa Bay, Ferruzzi played two seasons with the Minnesota Thunder of the A-League, captaining them to the league final in 2003. The former midfielder previously played four seasons with the Richmond Kickers (A-League), serving as the team's captain when the Kickers reached the finals in 2002.

Ferruzzi, who also holds his USSF "A" coaching license, played his collegiate soccer at the University of North Carolina for four seasons. He is married to Zaida and has a daughter, Ysabella and a son, Diego.



Drew Keeshan | GOALKEEPER COACH

Drew Keeshan is entering his fifth season as FC Dallas' goalkeeper coach. In 2010 he guided goalkeeper Kevin Hartman to an all-time MLS record GAA of 0.62 including nine shutouts. Keeshan also serves as the Director of Goalkeeping for the FC Dallas Academy, playing an integral role in the development of 2011 FIFA U-17 World Cup Championship goalkeeper and FC Dallas Homegrown player, Richard Sanchez.

Prior to joining FCD, the Tipperary, Ireland native spent the 2007 season as an assistant coach at Clemson following a successful season in a similar role at Emory in 2006. Keeshan began his professional career with Waterford United in 1993, and then had stints at Galway United, Kilkenny City and Limerick Football Club, all in the League of Ireland. Keeshan was a part of the Galway team that earned a promotion to the Premier Division at the end of the 1998-1999 season.

Keeshan's college playing career included two years at Lindsey Wilson College from 1996-1998, reaching the NAIA national championship tournament in 1997. After two years at Lindsey Wilson, Keeshan played two years at Life University, again reaching the national championship tournament in 1999. He graduated from Life University with a B.S. degree in Dietetics in 2001, earning Salutatorian honors.

Keeshan holds both a USSF B and USSF Goalkeeper license, and has served as an assistant for the Augusta Fireball of the PDL ('05-'06), head goalkeeping coach for the Georgia ODP ('02-'07), and goalkeeper staff coach for ODP Region III ('04-'07).

Joshua Watts

HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER

Joshua Watts is in his 11th season as head athletic trainer for FC Dallas. He joined the club during the 2002 season. Watts is responsible for injury assessment, rehabilitation and treatment of players to ensure their proper return to the playing field.

Watts spent two years prior to joining FC Dallas as the Head Athletic Trainer for Cistercian Preparatory School. He has also served as the head athletic trainer for the Texas Spurs soccer team in the USL Premier Development League.

Watts is a 1999 graduate of John Brown University in Arkansas where he received his Bachelor of Science degree in Sports Medicine with an emphasis in Athletic Training. He is married to Stacey and lives in Little Elm with their three children.





Paul Lombardo | ASSIST. ATHLETIC TRAINER

Paul Lombardo is beginning his second season as the Assistant Athletic Trainer, after joining the club in July of 2011. He calls two places home, the Pacific Northwest and the deserts of Tucson, Arizona. Lombardo has previously worked as a head athletic trainer at the high school level with his alma mater in Washington State. Following his time there, Lombardo moved to the college level at Texas State University.

Lombardo continues to work on his Masters of Science in Athletic Training from Texas State University and has received his BS in Sports Injury Management with an emphasis in Athletic Training from the University of Nevada in Las Vegas 2003.

His credentials include the titles of ATC & LAT. He is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and PSATS (Professional Soccer Athletic Trainers Society). When not at work, Lombardo enjoys hobbies such as golf and staying fit. He would like to acknowledge his mother Carmen and younger brother Andrew.

Jon Hancock | ASSIST. ATHLETIC TRAINER

Jonathan Hancock is beginning his first season with the FC Dallas family. He serves as the athletic trainer for the FC Dallas U.S. Development Academy teams. He is also in his fourth year as a lead athletic trainer for Texas Health Resources Ben Hogan Sports Medicine. Hancock is also responsible for coordinating the medical coverage for the North Dallas Chamber Boys Classic League.

Hancock received his Masters of Science in Applied Cognition and Neuroscience in 2011 from the University of Texas at Dallas and his BA in Exercise, Sport and Health Studies with an emphasis in Athletic Training from the University of Texas at Arlington in 1998.

He is also a certified strength and conditioning specialist through the National Strength and Conditioning Association. When not at work, Jonathan enjoys participating in recreational activities with family and friends.



Jim Walter, M.D. | TEAM DOCTOR

Dr. James C. Walter specializes in arthroscopy and the treatment of sports-related injuries. He is committed to the highest quality of care for all athletes ranging from youth to professional. A native of Oklahoma, Dr. Walter attended Stanford University. In 1991 he earned a B.S. in Biological Sciences and graduated with Distinction. Dr. Walter received his medical degree from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. Dr. Walter completed an orthopedic residency at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas. Following his residency, Dr. Walter was awarded a prestigious surgical fellowship in sports medicine at the American Sports Medicine Institute in Birmingham, Ala.

Dr. Walter returned to Dallas and joined Texas Orthopaedic Associates in 2001. In addition to being the Head Physician for FC Dallas, Dr. Walter currently serves as Orthopedic Team Physician for Allen High School, Wakeland High School and Little Elm High School. He serves as an Orthopedic Consultant to Prestonwood Christian Academy and Creekview High School. He is known for his expertise in shoulder and elbow injuries of the throwing athlete as well as arthroscopic and reconstructive surgery of the knee, shoulder and elbow. Dr. Walter is Board Certified by the American Board of Orthopedic Surgery and subspecialty Certified in Orthopedic Sports Medicine. He participates in education as an Assistant Clinical Professor at UT Southwestern Medical Center.



Marcus Owens | EQUIPMENT MANAGER

Marcus Owens is beginning his eighth season as equipment manager for FC Dallas. Owens' numerous responsibilities include the ordering and maintaining of game uniforms, practice gear and equipment. He also works closely with the assistant coaches on setting up practice both at home and on the road.

Prior to joining FC Dallas, Owens served four years with other Major League Soccer teams. He was the equipment manager with the MetroStars in 2002 and in 2003. Prior to that, Owens was with the Miami Fusion for 2000 and 2001. He also spent three seasons as equipment manager for the Myrtle Beach SeaDawgs of United Soccer Leagues. Originally from Dover, Delaware, Owens played midfield for Francis Marion University from 1982 to 1984. He and his wife, Sherry, reside in Frisco with son Ajay.



Bobby Hammond | DIRECTOR, TEAM ADMIN. AND PLAYER PERSONNEL

Hammond is entering his 14th season as director of team administration and player personnel, but 17th season overall with the team. Hammond is responsible for working closely with the technical director and head coach on all soccer matters. Hammond also organizes all team travel, preseason training camps and is a resource for all players for everything from work visas to family relocation. In 2003 and 2006, Hammond was recognized as Major League Soccer's Team Manager of the Year.

Hammond is the longest tenured Dallas staff member, and one of the longest in all of MLS. Having started with the club in 1995 as a Ticket Services Manager, he was promoted to Manager of Marketing Programs in 1997 - a role which led him to create the first website in team history. Prior to joining the club, Hammond served as the Assistant Manager of Volunteer Services of World Cup USA 1994 - Dallas. He is a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin and resides in Plano with wife Lisa.

Daniel Granados | ASST. TEAM ADMIN.

Daniel Granados is in his 16th season with FC Dallas. He started out as a volunteer with the team and today is part of the full time staff. His responsibilities include assisting Marcus Owens in practices and on game day. Granados is also responsible for assisting new players when they first sign with the team by helping with housing, transportation, visas and everything else a player needs when moving to a new city.

Born in Leon Guanajuato Leon, Mexico, Granados resides in Dallas with his wife Carmen.

Assisted on David Ferreira's first half goal in MLS Cup. 2009: Signed with FC Dallas on July 22 on loan from Deportivo Cali of Colombia's Primera Division...Made his FC Dallas and MLS debut in the left back position on July 24 versus Real Salt Lake...Earned his first MLS assist on Sept. 30 versus the New England Revolution when he crossed the ball to Jeff Cunningham for the game-winning goal...Started all 13 games he appeared in. 1999 – 2009: Spent time with clubs in both Colombia and Argentina...Spent the majority of his career with Independiente Medellin of Colombia's Primera Division, where he twice helped the club win Copa Mustang, Colombia's national tournament, in 2002 and 2004...In 2006, Benitez joined Deportivo Cali, where he played 95 games and scored two goals before returning to Independiente Medellin on loan in 2009...As a member of Medellin in 2009, Benitez appeared in 17 total contests, including both the regular season and the South American club championship, Copa Libertadores.

2011: A finalist for the Volkswagen MLS MVP award, Shea was named to the MLS All-Star team and MLS Best XI. He led FC Dallas in goals with 11. Five of his goals were game-winners, which tied for the league lead. Shea also added four assists. He ranked fourth on the team in minutes played across all competitions (3,446MP/41GP) in addition to playing eight games with the U.S. National Team. 2010: Shea finished seventh on the team in minutes played (1,797). Lamar Hunt 1932-2006

Major League Soccer and the American sports community lost a true treasure on December 13, 2006 when MLS founding investor, and investor-operator of FC Dallas and Columbus Crew Lamar Hunt peacefully passed away at Presbyterian Hospital in Dallas, Texas at the age of 74.

Born on August 2, 1932 in El Dorado, Arkansas, Hunt is recognized as one of the greatest sports visionaries in American history and a pioneer professional soccer in the United States. Hunt helped make pro football history in 1960 by founding and organizing the American Football League. Long known for his role in the development of football as founder of the Kansas City Chiefs, Hunt's contributions to pro soccer have also had a major impact on sports in the U.S.

The Hunt family stepped to the forefront of U.S. soccer in 1996 by becoming a charter investor in Major League Soccer, which was created with a unique single-entity operating structure, in which investors own an interest in the league in addition to individual teams. The Hunts were the original investor-operators of the charter teams from Columbus (Ohio) and Kansas City.

Hunt made his greatest contribution to soccer in this country in 1998-99, when he made pro soccer history by funding the construction of the first soccer-specific stadium in the United States as the Columbus Crew opened their revolutionary facility. The stadium broke ground on Aug. 14, 1998, and was finished in nine months and one day. Columbus Crew Stadium opened on May 15, 1999 and a sold-out, overflow crowd of 24,741 to watch the Crew defeat the New England Revolution 2-0.

The 1999 MLS season proved to be a historic one for Hunt, as he was awarded the National Soccer Hall of Fame Medal of Honor -- the second to receive the medal reserved for extraordinary individuals whose positive contributions to soccer at the national level affected the course of soccer history in the United States.

That year, he also saw the U.S. Open Cup Tournament renamed in his honor. The Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, recognized as U.S. Soccer's National Championship, is an annual competition open to all amateur and professional soccer teams affiliated with U.S. Soccer. Dating back to 1914, the single-elimination tournament is the oldest annual team tournament in U.S. sports history.

Having taken over the operations of Dallas in 2003, Hunt's youngest son Dan joined the Hunt Sports Group to help make Texas soccer history by breaking ground on the team's sparkling new Pizza Hut Park on Feb. 18, 2004. The 20,500 seat, state-of-the-art soccer-specific stadium in Frisco became the first soccer stadium built through a coordination of both private and public funds. Hunt Sports Group, the City of Frisco, Collin County and the Frisco Independent School District partnered to build the facility that features 17 championship-quality soccer fields adjacent to the stadium. Through Hunt's visionary leadership, Pizza Hut Park has become the model for soccer-specific stadiums in the United States.

Since opening on Aug. 6, 2005 with a 2-2 draw between home-side FC Dallas and the MetroStars (now New York Red Bulls), the 117-acre facility has hosted nearly three million spectators and participants. Entering the 2006 season, Hunt-founded Crew Stadium and Pizza Hut Park were two of the three operating stadiums in Major League Soccer built specifically for soccer. The stadiums have hosted numerous high-profile events, including many memorable soccer games.

At the 2004 MLS Cup, Hunt was presented the Commissioner's Award by MLS Commissioner Don Garber for being one of the league's founding fathers as well as a man who has championed soccer in the United States for nearly 40 years.

As far back as 1982, Hunt was honored for his efforts to help establish pro soccer in America by being inducted into the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame in Oneonta, N.Y. Hunt has also been inducted into both the Pro Football Hall of Fame and the International Tennis Hall of Fame, as well as the sports halls of fame of both Missouri and Texas. In 2005, the U.S. Soccer Foundation, the major charitable arm of soccer in the United States, presented Hunt with the Foundation's Lifetime Achievement Award.

Clark K. Hunt

Hunt Sports Group Chairman

A founding investor-operator of Major League Soccer, Clark Hunt remains one of the most innovative and influential members of the MLS Board of Governors. As chairman of the Hunt Sports Group, Hunt oversees the operations of the Hunt family's two MLS interests – the Columbus Crew and FC Dallas.

Son of the late American sports pioneer Lamar Hunt, Clark Hunt shares his father's passion for soccer and the family's vision for the sport's success in the United States. At Lamar's request, Clark engaged in the formative discussions for MLS lending his proven business acumen to the league's financial structure. Now in its 17th season, MLS has earned a stake in the landscape of professional sports and is well-positioned for future growth.

In 1999, Clark Hunt worked closely with his father to construct the first "soccer-specific stadium" in the United States in Columbus. Realizing the vision of Lamar Hunt, the debut of professional soccer at Columbus Crew Stadium on May 15, 1999, represented a pivotal moment in the history of MLS and solidified the long-term viability of soccer in the United States. Six years later, in 2005, Hunt Sports Group unveiled FC Dallas Stadium, a 145-acre soccer complex in Frisco, Texas, and the home of FC Dallas.

With its 17 tournament-grade fields, permanent event stage and first-class design, FC Dallas Stadium has now become the model for soccer-specific stadiums in North America. By the 2007 season, less than a decade after the inaugural match in Crew Stadium, more than half of all MLS teams had a soccer-specific stadium to call home – a credit to the vision of Lamar Hunt and leadership of the Hunt Sports Group.

As stadium construction, new investment, player development and a broadening fan base continue to shape the soccer marketplace in North America, Clark Hunt is intimately involved in the development and direction of MLS. Hunt currently serves as one of four members of the MLS Board of Governors appointed to Commissioner Don Garber's Executive Committee. He is also a member of the Competition Committee as well as the league's Labor and Philanthropy Committees.

In addition to his roles in MLS, Hunt is also a respected voice in the National Football League. Hunt is in his seventh year as Chairman of the Board of the Kansas City Chiefs, the storied franchise founded by his father. In 2006, Hunt was one of eight NFL owners to serve on the Commissioner Search Committee which recommended Commissioner Roger Goodell as the successor to then-Commissioner Paul Tagliabue. In 2007, Goodell appointed Hunt to the NFL's Digital Media and International Committees, as well as the Executive Committee of the NFL Management Council.

Hunt graduated first in his class at Southern Methodist University in 1987, earning a degree in business administration with a concentration in finance. He was a two-time recipient of the university's highest academic honor, the Provost Award for Outstanding Scholar. During his career he was a four-year letterman on the Mustangs nationally ranked soccer team, earning first-team Academic All-America honors as a junior and senior and serving as a tri-captain his final season. He was recognized as one of the SMU Cox School of Business Outstanding Young Alumni in 2004, and in 2005, he was appointed to the Cox School Executive Board of Trustees. Hunt currently serves on the SMU Board of Trustees.

Hunt and his wife, the former Tavia Shackles of Kansas City, are involved in numerous philanthropic efforts. In 2004, the Hunts were part of the grassroots effort behind the formation of Lift Up America – an organization that facilitates widespread compassion and giving through strategic partnerships with corporations and sports teams. Since that time, more than 30 teams have partnered with Lift Up America, and corporations like Cinemark Theaters, Interstate Batteries and Tyson Foods have helped the organization distribute millions of pounds of food and countless other services to people in need worldwide.





2012 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

I. MLS ROSTER COMPOSITION

A Major League Soccer club's first team roster is comprised of up to 30 players. All 30 players are eligible for selection to each 18-player game-day squad during the regular season and playoffs.

Salary & Budget

- Players occupying roster spots 1-20 count against the club's 2012 salary budget of \$2,810,000, and are referred to collectively as the club's Salary Budget Players.
 - o Roster spots 19 and 20 are not required to be filled, and teams may spread their salary budget across only 18 Salary Budget Players. A minimum salary budget charge will be imputed against a team's salary budget for each unfilled senior roster slot below 18.
 - o The maximum budget charge for a single player is \$350,000.*
 - o A Designated Player over the age of 23 counts as \$350,000 against the club's salary budget, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$175,000.
 - o A Designated Player 20 years old or younger** (referred to as Young Designated Players or Young DPs) counts as \$150,000 against the club's salary budget
 - o A Designated Player 21-23 years old** counts as \$200,000 against the club's salary budget.
 - o The budget charge for the midseason signing of a Young DP is \$150,000 and this amount cannot be lowered with allocation funds.
 - o Clubs will not have to buy the third DP roster slot to accommodate a Young Designated Player whereas clubs are normally required to buy that slot for a one-time fee of \$250,000.
 - o Clubs are responsible for all amounts above the budget charge for all Designated Players.
- * See section entitled Allocation Money below, under Player Acquisition Mechanisms, for details on buying down a player's budget charge.
- ** Age of player is determined by year (not date) of birth.

• Players occupying roster spots 21-30 do not count against the club's salary budget, and are referred to collectively as the club's Off-Budget Players (maximum of 10 per team).

- o All Generation adidas players are Off-Budget players.
- o Players occupying roster spots 1-24 will earn at least \$44,000 in 2012.
- o Players occupying roster spots 25-30 will earn at least \$33,750 in 2012.
- o Clubs may elect to leave up to two of these roster spots (25-30) vacant and use \$35,000 for each empty spot as allocation money.
- o Clubs may sign up to two Homegrown Players contracts above the minimum salary and similar to Generation adidas player contract amounts.

Age Designations

- Any player making \$33,750 must be under the age 25 (does not turn 25 or older in 2012)

Domestic/International

- In 2012, a total of 152 international slots are divided among the 19 clubs. Each club began with eight international slots, which are tradable. There is no limit on the number of international slots on each club's roster.
 - o The remaining roster slots must belong to domestic players. For clubs based in the United States, a domestic player is either a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident (green card holder) or the holder of other special status (e.g., refugee or asylum status).
- The three MLS clubs based in Canada – Montreal Impact, Toronto FC and Vancouver Whitecaps FC – began with eight international slots, but their domestic slots may be filled with either Canadian or U.S. domestic players.
 - o MLS clubs based in Canada are required to have a minimum of three Canadian domestic players on their rosters.
 - o Players with the legal right to work in Canada are considered Canadian domestic players (i.e., Canadian citizen, permanent resident, part of a protected class).

2012 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

NOTE: The terms Homegrown and Generation adidas are used to describe mechanisms by which players are acquired. They are not roster designations. All players' roster slots are determined by their compensation and/or age as outlined above.

II. PLAYER ACQUISITION MECHANISMS

MLS teams may acquire players and add them to their rosters via the following mechanisms:

(A) ALLOCATION RANKING

The allocation ranking is the mechanism used to determine which MLS club has first priority to acquire a U.S. National Team player who signs with MLS after playing abroad, or a former MLS player who returns to the League after having gone to a club abroad for a transfer fee. The allocation rankings may also be used in the event two or more clubs file a request for the same player on the same day when the discovery period opens in December. The allocations will be ranked in reverse order of finish for the 2011 season, taking playoff performance into account.

Once the club uses its allocation ranking to acquire a player, it drops to the bottom of the list. A ranking can be traded, provided that part of the compensation received in return is the other club's ranking. At all times, each club is assigned one ranking. The rankings reset at the end of each MLS League season.

Allocation Money

Allocation money is a resource available to clubs in addition to their respective salary budgets.

A club may receive allocation money for:

- (1) failure to qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs;
- (2) the transfer of a player to a club outside of MLS for value;
- (3) expansion status;
- (4) qualification for the CONCACAF Champions League;
- (5) trading in up to two Off-Budget roster spots;
- (6) funds from purchased third designated player roster spots.

Each year the MLS Competition Committee determines the allocation amount to be made available to each club. Allocation money can be traded by clubs. Allocation money does not count against a club's salary budget and can be used:

- To sign players new to MLS (that is, a player who did not play in MLS during the previous season).
- To re-sign an existing MLS player, subject to League approval.
- To "buy-down" a player's salary budget charge below the League maximum of \$350,000.
- In connection with the exercise of an option to purchase a player's rights or the extension of a player's contract for the second year provided the player was new to MLS in the immediately prior year.

NOTE: To protect the interests of MLS and its clubs during discussions with prospective players or clubs in other leagues, amounts of allocation money held by each club will not be shared publicly.

(B) DESIGNATED PLAYER

The Designated Player Rule allows clubs to acquire up to three players whose salaries exceed their budget charges, with the club bearing financial responsibility for the amount of compensation above each player's budget charge. Designated Player slots may be used to acquire players new to MLS or to retain current MLS players, subject to League approval.

In 2012, a Designated Player over the age of 23** will carry a salary budget charge of \$350,000, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$175,000.

A Designated Player 20 years old or younger** counts as \$150,000 against the club's salary budget and a Designated Player 21-23 years old counts as \$200,000 against the club's salary budget.

Clubs have the option of "buying down" the budget charge of a Designated Player with allocation money. The reduced charge may not be less than \$150,000.

The budget charge for the midseason signing of a young Designated Player (23 years old and younger) is \$150,000 and this amount cannot be lowered with allocation funds.

2012 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

Each club has two Designated Player slots and clubs are allowed to "purchase" a third Designated Player slot for a one-time fee of \$250,000 that will be dispersed in the form of allocation money to all clubs that do not have three Designated Players. Clubs will not have to buy the third DP roster slot to accommodate Designated Players 23 years old and younger.

Designated Player slots are not tradable.

** Age of player is determined by year (not date) of birth.

(C) SUPERDRAFT

The 2012 MLS SuperDraft, held Jan. 12 in Kansas City, Mo., consisted of two rounds of 19 picks for a total of 38 player selections. A supplemental draft was held Jan. 17 via teleconference and consisted of four rounds of 19 picks.

The majority of draft prospects are NCAA college seniors who have exhausted their college eligibility. Generation adidas players and non-collegiate international players are also eligible for selection in the SuperDraft and supplemental draft. Clubs may nominate players for the League's draft-eligible list, and only players from that list may be selected.

Generation adidas is a joint program between MLS and adidas that is dedicated to developing exceptional domestic talent in a professional environment. Each year, a handful of top domestic underclassmen and youth national team players are signed to the league and placed in the SuperDraft through this program. Generation adidas players also receive an educational stipend.

Draft Order: The Montreal Impact held the first overall selection in the 2012 MLS SuperDraft as expansion clubs are always given the top spot in the SuperDraft and the Supplemental Draft. The next eight selections went to clubs that did not qualify for the 2011 MLS Cup Playoffs beginning with the club with fewest regular season points (3 points per win, one point per tie). The remaining ten positions were ranked by fewest regular season points among the teams that were eliminated in the same round of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

Unless claimed on waivers, a player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign with the League, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to the player.

(D) TRADES

Players, SuperDraft and Supplemental draft picks, allocation money, allocation rankings, and international player slots may all be exchanged in trades approved by the MLS League Office, provided all of the necessary rules regarding roster and salary budget compliance are met and the trade is completed during a valid trading period. No trades may occur after the Roster Freeze Deadline of September 15, 2012 at 5 p.m. ET.

(E) DISCOVERY SIGNINGS

Clubs may make discovery claims on players not yet under MLS contract who are not subject to the allocation ranking or lottery mechanisms.

Each club has the opportunity to make six discovery signings per season (expansion teams may make 10 discovery signings in their inaugural season). A club may have up to 10 discovery claims on unsigned players at any time and may remove or add players at any time. The last day for discovery player signings is September 15, 2012 – coinciding with the roster freeze date and trade deadline.

The six discovery signings can be used to fill senior roster spots only. If multiple clubs claim the same player using a discovery, the club that filed the claim first will have first rights to the player. Discovery claims expire following each season. If the League and player are unable to reach an agreement during the season, the club that first filed the discovery retains the right of first refusal in the event the player is later signed by the League.

Note: To protect interests of MLS clubs in scouting and negotiations with prospective players, the League office will not publicize the names of players on club discovery lists, nor specify if a discovery claim has been filed on a particular player.

(F) HOME GROWN PLAYER SIGNINGS

A club may sign a player to his first professional contract without subjecting him to the MLS SuperDraft if the player has trained for at least one year in the club's youth development program and has met the League's Homegrown Player criteria. Players joining MLS through this mechanism are known as Homegrown Players.

There is no limit to the number of Homegrown Players a club may sign in a given year.

(G) RE-ENTRY PROCESS

The 2012 Re-Entry Process will commence after MLS Cup. The priority order for the Re-Entry Draft is reverse order of finish in 2012, taking into account playoff performance.

Available to all teams in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry draft will be:

1. Players who are at least 23 years old and have a minimum of three years experience in MLS whose options were not exercised by their clubs (available at option salary for 2013).
2. Players who are at least 25 years old with a minimum of four years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them at their previous salary (available for at least their 2012 salary).
3. Players who are at least 30 years old with a minimum of eight years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them (available for at least 105% of their 2012 salary).

Players who are not selected in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry Draft will be made available in Stage 2. Clubs selecting players in Stage 2 will negotiate a new salary with the player.

Players who remain unselected after Stage 2 will be available to any MLS club on a first come, first serve basis.

(H) WAIVERS

A team may place a player on waivers at any time during the regular season at which point he is made available to all other teams. The waiver claiming period shall commence on the first business day after the League delivers notice to teams and shall expire at 5 p.m. EST on the second business day after the Waiver Period Commencement Date. The claiming period is 48 hours.

The Waiver Draft order is determined via points per game once all teams have played at least three MLS League games. If the waiver takes place prior to all teams playing in at least three League games, priority shall be granted based upon the prior year's performance, taking playoff performance first, with teams eliminated from playoff contention at the same stage separated according to their point totals through the end of the regular season. New expansion teams shall be at the bottom of the waiver order.

Once a team selects a player off waivers, that club is automatically moved to the bottom of the priority list for subsequent waiver selections in a given season, regardless of its points-per-game total. Players who may be placed on the MLS waiver wire are as follows:

- (i) A player waived by an MLS team in the current season;
- (ii) A player who completed his college eligibility within the past season, who was not made available in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft;
- (iii) A player who has remaining college eligibility (and was not made available in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft), but the League at its discretion and after taking into account exceptional circumstances determines the player may be offered an MLS contract;
- (iv) A player who has played in MLS previously where his last MLS team does not wish to exercise their right of first refusal, except in the case of returning U.S. National Team players as stated above.
- (v) A player who was drafted in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft, and who after a trial with the club is not offered a contract by the first Monday of June.

2012 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

(I) LOTTERY

Some players shall be assigned to MLS teams via the weighted Lottery process. Any team assigned a player through the lottery in any particular season shall not be assigned another lottery player that season unless and until all teams have received a lottery player or have agreed to waive their option to participate in a Lottery. The players made available through lotteries include:

- (i) Generation adidas players signed after the MLS SuperDraft;
- (ii) Draft eligible players to whom an MLS contract was offered but who failed to sign with the League prior to the Draft.

The weighted lottery takes into consideration each team's performance over its last 34 regular season games and the most recent postseason. The team with the worst record over its last 34 regular season games (dating back to previous season if necessary and taking playoff performance into account) will have the greatest probability of winning the lottery. Teams are not required to participate in a lottery. Players are assigned via the lottery system in order to prevent a player from potentially influencing his destination club with a strategic holdout.

(J) EXTREME HARDSHIP CALL-UPS

Teams may add players to their roster in cases of "extreme hardship" as follows: (1) a club with three goalkeepers on its 30-man roster, but has less than two available goalkeepers or (2) a team has less than 15 available players. Extreme hardship call-ups are made on a game-by-game basis.

(K) SEASON-ENDING INJURY REPLACEMENTS

A team with a player lost to a season-ending injury can place the player on the Season Ending Injury List and replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the season-ending injury list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). International player limits still apply at the time a season-ending replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

(L) SHORT-TERM INJURY REPLACEMENTS

A player who has a short-term injury can be placed on the Disabled List once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). The team will remain responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary on the salary budget. Note: the injured player will have to sit out a minimum of six MLS League matches before he can rejoin the team's roster.

International player limits still apply at the time a short-term replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

NOTE: No changes may be made to a team's active full roster during the period beginning on September 16, 2012 (day after Roster Freeze Date) through the day after MLS Cup. Nevertheless, a team may obtain players in accordance with the extreme hardship rules and procedures to replace players who are injured or otherwise legitimately unavailable after the Roster Freeze Date. Any other replacements after the Roster Freeze Date may only be made in exceptional circumstances in the League's sole and absolute discretion.

III. METHODS OF RELEASING PLAYERS

(A) WAIVERS

Teams may waive players based on performance at any time during the MLS season. Players with guaranteed contracts will continue to have their salary budget charge applied to the team salary budget, subject to any settlement. Players on semi-guaranteed contracts can be waived prior to July 1 of any year and free up the corresponding budget space. If a player on a semi-guaranteed contract is waived after July 1, his salary budget charge will count against the team's salary budget and the team waiving the player will not receive a replacement except under the normal player acquisition mechanisms. Any settlement amount will be charged to the team's salary budget.

(B) TRANSFERS AND LOANS

An MLS player may be transferred or loaned at any time to a team outside the League (subject to that team's Federation's transfer window), subject to the consent of the player.

2012 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

The registration windows – the dates between which MLS may request the transfer certificate of a player under contract in another country – are as follows:

January 21 – April 15 (Primary Window)
June 27 – July 27 (Secondary Window)

(C) CONTRACT EXPIRATION

When a player's contract expires, the player does not count against the roster or budget of the team in question. Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the rights to the player indefinitely following the expiration of a contract only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

(D) BUYOUT OF GUARANTEED CONTRACT

Teams may have the ability to buyout one guaranteed player as follows:

- A Team may buy out one (1) guaranteed player (including a DP's) contract during the off-season and free up the corresponding budget space. Such a buyout is at the particular MLS Team's own expense.
- A Team may not free up budget space with a buyout of a player's salary budget charge during the season. Such a buyout will be conducted by the League and count on a Club's budget in a manner consistent with current MLS guidelines season. Such a buyout will be conducted by the League and count on a Club's budget in a manner consistent with current MLS guidelines.

IV. RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL

Right of first refusal grants one MLS club the first opportunity to add a player to its roster in the event that the player signs with MLS. Holding a right of first refusal applies only within MLS and does not indicate holding of the player's International Transfer Certificate.

OUT OF CONTRACT PLAYERS / OPTIONS NOT PICKED UP: Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the right of first refusal to the player indefinitely only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

DRAFTED BUT NOT SIGNED: A player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign, or who as of the first Monday in June is not offered a contract after a trial and clears waivers, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 immediately following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to sign the player.

PLAYER TRANSFERRED OUTSIDE MLS: If a team receives allocation money as a result of a player's transfer, the team does not retain a right of first refusal.



About FC Dallas

FC Dallas became a charter member club of Major League Soccer on June 6, 1995, selected along with Kansas City and Colorado to give the league 10 teams for its initial year. Known originally as the Dallas Burn, the team's original colors (green and red) and logo (fire-breathing horse) were unveiled at a gala in New York City on October 17, 1995. That same day, MLS announced that Mexican-icon Hugo Sanchez was allocated to the team as its first player in team history.

Six months later, Dallas played its first MLS game, defeating the San Jose Clash in front of 27,779 fans at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas on April 14, 1996. In its second year, Dallas claimed its first major championship, winning the 1997 U.S. Open Cup title by defeating D.C. United 5-3 on penalty kicks after a scoreless game.

The team was a league-owned entity from its inception until the fall of 2003, when Lamar Hunt and his family took over the operating rights. Between 1996 and 2012, Dallas compiled a regular season record of 207-201-84 and qualified for the postseason on 12 occasions. In 2006 and once again in 2012, the club recorded its highest point total in franchise history by accumulating 52 points (Dallas earned the top seed in the Western Conference Playoffs for the first time ever in 2006).

The team changed its name to FC Dallas after the conclusion of the 2004 season. As part of the club's rebranding, new uniforms and a new logo were unveiled along with the name change. The logo features the name FC Dallas and the number 96, signifying the year the club played its inaugural game, above a drawing of a bull, signifying the kind of Texas cattle that were driven along North Texas trails throughout the 19th century. The logo features the club's new colors red, white and blue, (all of which can be found in the American flag and the state flag of Texas) with a hint of silver. After playing all of the team's home games at either the Cotton Bowl in Dallas or Dragon Stadium in Southlake, Texas for the first nine-and-a-half seasons of its existence, FC Dallas moved to its new home, FC Dallas Stadium, the third soccer-specific stadium in Major League Soccer, on August 6, 2005.

In 2006, FC Dallas formed exclusive partnerships with Mexican First Division club Tigres de la Universidad Autonoma de Nueva Leon (UANL) and Clube Atletico Paranaense of Brazil's Campeonato Brasileiro Serie A. These partnerships provide FC Dallas with an avenue to develop philosophies, practices, and training methods, as well as the opportunity to exchange players through loans. These partnerships have seen FCD play an annual home-and-away series against each club. FC Dallas won the inaugural Rio Grande Plate against Tigres in 2006, but the Mexican club claimed the plate in 2007 and 2008. Dallas retook the plate in dramatic fashion in 2011, besting Tigres in a penalty kick shootout. Atletico Paranaense won the inaugural USA-Brazil Challenge in 2007, but 2008 saw FCD claim the title.

In January 2008, FC Dallas was recognized as the 2007 Frisco Business of the Year, taking the top honor at the 24th Annual Frisco Chamber of Commerce Banquet Awards. Out of 1,300 businesses that qualified for the honor, 100 were nominated and presented in front of a nomination committee. Only four finalists were selected from the nominees, and the Frisco business leaders selection committee awarded FCD the winner.

2011 Competitions

The main goal for every team throughout the MLS regular season is to put itself in position to win the MLS Cup in November. However, along the way there are several other competitions that FC Dallas will also participate in – both international and domestic. These competitions are played during the regular season, which is why on some occasions, FCD will play against another MLS team but the results won't have an impact on the regular season standings. Below is the list of competitions for 2011.

Supporters' Shield

The Supporters' Shield is given to the team that finishes the regular season with the best record in the league (most points). In the past few years, the winner of the Supporters' Shield has represented the United States in the CONCACAF Champions Cup (now the CONCACAF Champions League), the longest running international club competition in the CONCACAF region and has crowned the champion club of the Confederation since its inception over four decades ago. FC Dallas qualified for the CONCACAF Champions League tournament in 2011 by advancing to MLS Cup in Toronto in 2010.

Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup

The U.S. Open Cup, which is recognized as U.S. Soccer's National Championship, is an annual competition open to all amateur and professional soccer teams affiliated with U.S. Soccer. The tournament has crowned a champion for 96 consecutive years dating back to 1914. Within the U.S. Open Cup framework, teams compete in one of the following four categories: professional outdoor Division I (Major League Soccer), Division II (NASL) or Division III (USL Pro); or Amateur Division (USL Premier Development League & U.S. Adult Soccer Association). FCD won the Open Cup in 1997 and has reached the final on two other occasions (2005 vs. LA, 2007 vs. NE). The team that wins the Open Cup will collect \$100,000, and the runner-up taking home \$50,000.

Brimstone Cup

When FC Dallas and the Chicago Fire play, they play for more than the game at hand. In 2001, the team's fans joined to start the inaugural Brimstone Cup, which is handed to fans of the team that wins the season series. That year, the teams tied the season series with each team going 2-2. The fans decided goal-differential should not decide the winner of the cup, and instead left the winner to be determined by the playoff series or the U.S. Open Cup. The teams met in the 2001 playoffs, which the Fire won, in turn keeping the first-ever Brimstone Cup. Dallas has gone on to hold the Cup ever since...

After winning the series in 2002 (2-0), the teams tied the series in 2003 - Cup rules stipulate that if a team does not straight out win the series, the current holders retain the Cup. Dallas has not lost the last 10 season series: 2004 – FCD won 2-0; in 2005, the teams split the series but Dallas won the U.S. Open Cup Semifinal matchup to keep the Cup. In 2006, FCD won both games in the series by a 3-2 score, and still retain the Cup. In 2007, FCD defeated Chicago 2-1 at Toyota Park on May 17 and tied 1-1 at FC Dallas Stadium on Sept. 20, thus winning the series by the aggregate score of 3-2 and retaining the Brimstone Cup. FCD again claimed the cup in 2008, winning both games by a combined 5-1 score. The 2009 season saw FC Dallas retain the cup by going 1-1-0 against the Fire and in 2010, FC Dallas won the series 1-0-1 after defeating the Fire, 3-1 at FC Dallas Stadium. Last season, Dallas drew the Fire 1-1 in its season-opener, but traveled to Chicago and claimed the cup on the strength of a 2-1 road victory.

El Capitan – The Cannon

The 2006 and 2007 seasons saw the beginning of what promises to be a competitive rivalry between the two Texas MLS teams – FC Dallas and Houston Dynamo. Prior to the first-ever meeting, the teams agreed to play for something more than points in the standings during the four-game regular season series. The winner of the series would earn the right to keep a 19th century Mountain Howitzer cannon, recognizing the winning side as the best Major League Soccer team in the state of Texas during the year. Through an online poll, the fans of both teams voted to call the cannon "El Capitan."

Houston claimed the cannon during the first year, by winning the series 2-1-1. The teams met four times during regular season play in 2007, with Houston claiming the series 3-0-1. FCD and Houston met three times in 2008 with each game ending in a tie, forcing the second tiebreaker of away goals to decide the winner. FCD had the edge, outscoring Houston 4-2 on the road, which means "El Capitan" was in Dallas' possession for the 2009 season. However, the Dynamo reclaimed "El Capitan" that season. The teams battled twice early in the 2010 season, a draw a FC Dallas Stadium and a 1-0 win for Dallas in Houston's Robertson Stadium on May 5 – the first win for FC Dallas in Robertson Stadium sent the cannon back to Frisco. The Dynamo retook the cannon in the 2011 campaign, drawing Dallas 2-2 in Houston before earning a 1-0 victory in FC Dallas Stadium.

About FC Dallas Stadium

Opened on August 6, 2005, FC Dallas Stadium is a 145-acre multipurpose sports and entertainment facility located at the intersection of Main Street and Dallas North Tollway in Frisco, Texas, and is the home stadium for FC Dallas.

The combination of a world-class stadium and a sports park make FC Dallas Stadium one of the best and most unique soccer facilities in the world. Included in the facility is the 20,500 state-of-the-art pro soccer stadium which features a built-in stage on the north end and 26 suites that are approximately 500 square feet in size. Located on the west side of the stadium, the suites are immediately above the lower bowl seating area and provide an outstanding view of both the playing field and the concert stage. By adding field seats above a state-of-the-art Terrafloir covering, the stadium can accommodate over 27,000 fans for concerts.

The facility has demonstrated to be one of the top venues in the United States for both professional and amateur soccer. The complex, which includes 17 tournament-grade fields used for youth and adult soccer, as well as high school sports and other events, has drawn over 1 million visitors each year since opening.

In addition to FC Dallas action, FC Dallas Stadium is the focal point of youth and adult soccer in North Texas and around the country. North Texas Soccer, the largest joint youth and adult soccer association in the United States, signed a marketing partnership with FC Dallas Stadium which further enhances the brand awareness for both properties throughout the region. Furthermore, the United States Youth Soccer Association is headquartered at the complex. US Youth Soccer is the largest member of the United States Soccer Federation, the governing body for soccer in the United States.

In February 2006, FC Dallas Stadium was recognized by the Dallas Business Journal as the winner of the 2005 Best Community Impact Award, given to a property that was judged to have created the most positive economic and social impact on a community. FC Dallas Stadium was also the Top Winner at the Topping Out 2007 Awards Presentation, recognized for excellence in the fields of development, architecture and construction which have a positive impact on the local community. In November 2006, FC Dallas Stadium was recognized as the first "Green" professional sports stadium in Texas after administering a formal recycling program. The SportsTurf Managers Association named the FC Dallas Stadium field as its 2011 Field of the Year in the professional soccer category on Monday, December 5, 2011. Coordinator of Stadium Grounds Allen Reed and Director of Stadium Grounds Miles Studhalter accepted the award on behalf of FC Dallas.

The \$105 million public-private complex is owned by the City of Frisco in partnership with the Hunt Sports Group (HSG), the Frisco Independent School District, and Collin County.

Media Guidelines

2012 FC Dallas Media Guidelines

Press Credentials

Single-game and full-season credentials can be requested through the FC Dallas Communications Department by e-mail at jminnick@fcdallas.net. Single-game credentials must be requested no later than 24 hours prior to the requested game day. Full-season credentials are granted to media based on the following criteria: commitment to season-long coverage of FC Dallas, need for and use of media access to facilitate reporting and newsgathering, and media outlet's adherence to media policies and procedures. All credential requests must be submitted by an editor or producer on behalf of the reporter or photographer. Generic freelance credentials without a specific publication assignment will not be approved.

Media Will Call

Media Will Call is located at the North Box Office and opens two hours prior to kick off on game days. It is closed in the 15th minute of the game. Parking is free.

Photographers/TV Crews

Television and still photographers holding proper credentials can shoot from the designated areas behind the goals. Photographers can use the press box to file photos.

Media Access on Game Days

In accordance with Major League Soccer policy, both home and visiting locker rooms are open to credentialed media beginning 15 minutes following the conclusion of the game. Both visiting and home head coaches will be available to media in a post-game press conference format located in Locker Room D. After the post game press conference there will be no access to the FC Dallas coach inside the locker rooms, only to players.

Media Access to Training Sessions

FC Dallas trains regularly on the adidas Field at FC Dallas Stadium. Unless otherwise noted, training sessions are open to credentialed media, however media are encouraged to contact the FC Dallas Communications Department to confirm practice times and dates. Players and coaches are available for interviews by request through the communications department following each session (requests must be made prior to the end of the training session).

Media can receive FC Dallas news and information via e-mail by contacting the FC Dallas Communications Department and requesting to be added to the distribution list. B-Roll, sound, highlights and photos are also available via the league Press FTP site. For username and password information, contact the FC Dallas Communications Department.
