The San Jose Earthquakes have an official partnership with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club of the English Premier League. The partnership was originally announced on Oct. 9, 2008, during a press conference at The Fairmont hotel in San Jose, and has continued to blossom ever since.

With the objective of creating a long-term bond between the two clubs, the partnership primarily focuses on soccer and commercial development through the exchange and implementation of best practices both on the pitch and in the front office. The two clubs have also collaborated on several community and charitable endeavors.

The Earthquakes initially kicked off the partnership with a trip to London in December of 2008 to visit Tottenham Hotspur headquarters and training facilities. John Doyle, Frank Yallop, Ian Russell and Jason Batty met with members of Spurs technical staff during the visit and took in a match at White Hart Lane.

The partnership moved to a new level in 2010. First, the Earthquakes traveled to England for an 11-day stay at Spurs Lodge from March 4 through March 11. The Quakes trained on Tottenham Hotspurs' grounds during the trip and won three exhibition matches - 2-0 victories against West Ham and the Colorado Rapids as well as a 1-0 result against the Spurs' reserve side. Quakes players also had the opportunity to take in a Spurs match while enjoying their time in London.

Building on the success of the Quakes' trip to England, the partnership reached a major accord on April 22. Tottenham Hotspur and San Jose announced a friendly to be played at Buck Shaw Stadium, home of the Earthquakes, on July 17, 2010. The match took place in front of a sell-out crowd at Buck Shaw Stadium, and ended in a 0-0 draw.

After a successful 2010 season, the Earthquakes returned to London for another preseason trip to Spurs Lodge. The club departed for England on Feb. 17 and trained through Feb. 27. The club again lined up three matches during their time across the pond. The Quakes won their first two matches - 4-0 over Birmingham City and 3-0 over Colchester United - before falling 3-1 to Sven-Goran Eriksson's Leicester City. In addition to the entire first team making the trip to London, this installment of the pre-season trip also included four Academy players under the supervision of Technical Advisor Troy Dayak.

The clubs reached a milestone agreement on March 15, 2011, as the Earthquakes announced a loan deal that brought Simon Dawkins to San Jose from Spurs. The midfielder played with the Tottenham Hotspur Academy and Reserve sides and trained with the Quakes during their preseason trip to London. Dawkins scored six goals and had two assists while with the Quakes in 2011.

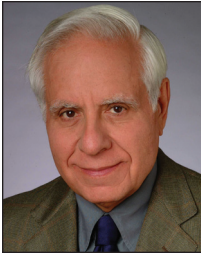

LEW WOLFF - INVESTOR/OPERATOR

FIFTH SEASON



Lew Wolff is co-owner of the San Jose Earthquakes after exercising his exclusive option to bring the team back to the Bay Area on July 18, 2007. Wolff's entry into MLS came after a trip to the 2006 FIFA World Cup in Germany. For over two years prior to the team's return, Wolff was instrumental in laying the groundwork for the revival of the Earthquakes as an expansion franchise with its records, colors and trophies intact.

As soon as the franchise returned to the league, Wolff spent four million dollars for renovations to Buck Shaw Stadium at Santa Clara University, helping create one of the best and most intimate atmospheres in MLS. The newly-improved Buck Shaw Stadium has a top quality grass field, and a state-of-the-art scoreboard and video screen. He also worked to create the Earthquakes Training Facility, adjacent to the site of the proposed new stadium on Coleman Avenue in San Jose. In 2011, the organization took a crucial step toward paving the way for a new stadium by commencing and completing the demolition process of the Food Machinery Corporation buildings at the Coleman Avenue site. Due to Wolff's commitment to Bay Area soccer, the club's new stadium will be privately financed with no public funding.

In October of 2008, Wolff was a key piece in the establishment of a partnership with the English Premier League's Tottenham Hotspur Football Club. The partnership primarily focuses on both soccer and commercial development by exchanging and implementing the best practices from both organizations. The Earthquakes have made two pre-season trips to London while Spurs played the Earthquakes at a sold-out Buck Shaw Stadium in 2010. Additionally, Spurs midfielder Simon Dawkins joined the Earthquakes on loan, becoming the first player in league history to join an MLS franchise through a strategic partnership with an international team.

The San Jose Mercury News ranked Wolff first in its annual listing of the Bay Area's 25 Most Powerful Sports Figures in both 2006 and 2007.

In September 2008, the Silicon Valley Leadership Group also presented Wolff with its prestigious "Community Cornerstone Award." The award is given to "a Silicon Valley leader who has displayed a lifetime of impeccable ethics, business achievement and community engagement."

Wolff is the founder of Wolff Urban Development and co-founder of Maritz-Wolff, entities that are involved in the development, acquisition and management of a wide range of commercial, office, parking and hotel properties in a number of California cities including San Jose, Los Angeles, Pasadena and Burbank.

Wolff's ownership interests in representative hotels and resorts include properties such as The Carlyle in New York City; Four Season Hotels in Houston, the Park Hyatt in Carlsbad; The Ritz-Carlton in St. Louis; Fairmont Hotels in San Jose and San Francisco; Rosewood-managed hotels including The Mansion in Dallas, Little Dix Bay, Virgin Gorda, Inn of the Anasazi, Sante Fe plus other brands such as Marriott. In addition, Maritz-Wolff has a 50 percent interest in the Dallas-based Rosewood Management Company, which owns and operates luxury hotels and resorts throughout the world.

Wolff began his career in real estate economics and appraisal in his hometown of St. Louis, Mo., before relocating to Los Angeles. In addition to his real estate analysis work, he also served as the President of the 20th Century Fox Realty & Development Company where he managed Fox's worldwide real estate activities.

Wolff is a former minority owner of the St. Louis Blues, the Golden State Warriors and the San Jose Missions, a now-defunct minor league baseball team. He holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Wisconsin in Madison, a master's degree in business administration from Washington University in St. Louis, and is also a member of the American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers (MAI).

Wolff resides in the Westwood section of Los Angeles with his wife, Jeane. The Wolffs have three children and four grandchildren.

KEITH WOLFF - MANAGING PARTNER

FIFTH SEASON



Keith M. Wolff is the Managing Partner for the San Jose Earthquakes and President of Wolff Urban Development, LLC. In addition, Mr. Wolff is part of the related ownership group for the Oakland Athletics professional baseball club.

During his time with the Earthquakes, Wolff has taken the lead on several multi-million dollar projects. In 2010, Wolff was the point man for the development of the world-class Earthquakes Training Facility, a one-million dollar venture. San Jose's training grounds were home to Tottenham Hotspur of the English Premier League for one week in July of 2010. The Earthquakes' club partner used the facility in preparation for a friendly played at Buck Shaw Stadium, an event that Wolff was intricately involved with.

At the outset of 2011, Wolff made significant progress on the Earthquakes' proposed new stadium by beginning the demolition process on the Food Machinery Building at 1125 Coleman Avenue. The demolition process wrapped up midway through the year, paving the way for the club to pursue its own stadium.

Wolff has over 20 years of experience within the real estate industry with an emphasis on hotel, office and retail project assets. Wolff has an extensive background in all facets of commercial real estate and has been working on behalf of the team ownership group to lead the site acquisition, entitlement, design and development team for a soccer specific stadium for the Earthquakes and a new professional baseball stadium for the Athletics. Wolff received a Bachelor of Science degree, Magna Cum Laude, from the University of the Pacific, and holds a master's in business administration from Harvard University.



MICHAEL CROWLEY - MANAGING DIRECTOR

FIFTH SEASON



Michael Crowley is in his second season with the Earthquakes as the Managing Director. In October of 2010, Crowley was promoted after hiring Dave Kaval as Earthquakes President. He served as the team's President from 2007 to October of 2010.

Under the guidance of Crowley, the club saw significant success on the business side in 2011. The Earthquakes boosted attendance by an average of over 2,000 per game, ending the season at 11,858 fans per game. The club closed the year on a six-game sellout streak. In addition to attendance success at Buck Shaw Stadium, the Earthquakes hosted their first-ever game at the newly-renovated Stanford Stadium, drawing 41,028 for a 2-2 draw against New York on July 2 with a fireworks extravaganza following the match. The total attendance for 2011 was 201,587, up from 144,885 in 2010.

During the 2010 season, Crowley was instrumental in helping to bring club partner Tottenham Hotspur to San Jose for a friendly on July 17, 2010, a match that drew a sellout crowd as well as a national television audience on ESPN. Additionally, the Earthquakes set a franchise record for single-game attendance against the LA Galaxy on Aug. 21, 2010, with a crowd of 10,799 on hand for San Jose's 1-0 win. The new attendance mark eclipsed the previous record of 10,712 on hand for San Jose's friendly against Tottenham Hotspur.

Under Crowley's leadership in 2009, the Quakes posted the third-highest average attendance in Quakes history. The Earthquakes also signed a multi-million dollar sponsorship deal with Amway just before the 2009 season kicked off. He also played a key role in bringing the Night of Champions doubleheader to San Francisco, which saw the largest Bay Area soccer crowd since the 1999 Women's World Cup. The Night of Champions saw the Earthquakes take on the Columbus Crew followed by FC Barcelona playing Chivas de Guadalajara at Candlestick Park.

Crowley oversaw the four-million dollar renovations made to Buck Shaw Stadium and greatly influenced the establishing of a strategic partnership with the English Premier League's Tottenham Hotspur in 2008. On the team side, he played an important role in the hiring of General Manager John Doyle and head coach Frank Yallop.

Crowley also serves as President of the Oakland Athletics. The 2012 season marks Mike Crowley's 15th year with the Athletics organization and his 14th as President after being named to the position on Sept. 28, 1998. His tenure is the longest among those who have served in the same capacity since 1968. A limited partner in the Athletics ownership group, Crowley is responsible for the overall day-to-day functioning of the Athletics organization both on the business and baseball sides of the operation, working directly with Managing Partner Lew Wolff.

After spending three years in the San Jose office of Price Waterhouse and nine years with I.C.I./Fuller O'Brien Paints, Crowley joined the Athletics organization in July 1997 as vice president and chief financial officer. Considered a key figure in the A's resurgence as one of baseball's premier franchises, Crowley has been committed to fielding a championship-caliber team with homegrown talent. He works closely with General Manager Billy Beane on key player decisions and issues relating to the baseball operations overall objectives and philosophies.

In 1999, Crowley and his wife, Kathy, played a key role in implementing the Oakland A's Breast Cancer Awareness Day, which has raised \$1.2 million for cancer-related causes over the last 13 years. Crowley has also served on the Bay Area Board of Trustees of the Knowledge is Power Program (KIPP), which aims to create a respected, influential and nationwide family of schools that are successful in helping educationally underserved students develop the knowledge, skills and character to succeed in college and in the competitive world. He also served on the board of top business executives and community leaders that attempted to land the 2012 Summer Olympic Games in the Bay Area. Recently, Crowley has been named to the advisory board for the Institute of Sports Law and Ethics at Santa Clara University's law school.

A native Californian, Crowley graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 1985 with a degree in business administration with an emphasis in accounting. He earned his MBA from Duke's Fuqua School of Business in 1992. In November of 2002, Crowley was named one of Street & Smith's Sports Business Journal's "40 Under 40", honoring the nation's top sport executives under the age of 40. Crowley resides in Los Gatos with his wife, Kathy, and their three children.

DAVE KAVAL - PRESIDENT THIRD SEASON

Dave Kaval was hired as the President of the San Jose Earthquakes in October of 2010. He oversees the business and technical sides of the franchise.

In his first full season with the club, Kaval played a pivotal role in a number of successful ventures. In addition to helping boost attendance by over 2,000 per game from 2010 to 2011, the club ended the season on a six-game sellout streak. At season's end, the Earthquakes averaged 11,858 per game and boosted its total attendance from 144,885 in 2010 to 201,587 in 2011. The Earthquakes also staged one of the best-attended games of the 2011 MLS season, as 41,028 spectators took in an entertaining 2-2 draw with the New York Red Bulls at Stanford Stadium on July 2. The crowd was the Quakes' largest-ever in a non-doubleheader match, and the third-biggest overall in club history. Attendance figures weren't the only thing on the rise in San Jose last season, as the club also saw a significant increase in sponsorship revenue under Kaval's direction. The club added VISA, Farmer's Insurance, 7UP Bottling Company of San Francisco, Kaiser Permanente and Wells Fargo to the docket and renewed programs with KFC and SuperCuts, among others.

Numbers aside, Kaval created a visibly more enjoyable game-day atmosphere at Buck Shaw Stadium in 2011 by revamping the Epicenter Fan Zone. He introduced gourmet food trucks with authentic cuisine, and streamlined concessions operations. Through a partnership with *yorder*, the Earthquakes now offer fans the convenience of ordering food and beverages right from their smartphones without missing any of the action. Additionally, a bevy of unique events were featured throughout the season for Quakes fans to enjoy.

Kaval ushered in more than new food and entertainment options. He also dedicated a gate to George Best, a player for the San Jose Earthquakes of the North American Soccer League in 1980 and 1981. Just inside the gate is a video on loop where fans can watch "The Greatest Goal Ever" in honor of Best. The 2011 version of Buck Shaw also included VIP restrooms and a new team store.

Away from the field, Kaval played a key role in the demolition process of the Food Machinery Company buildings at 1125 Coleman Avenue, site of the club's new stadium. Kaval presided over a special event, "Demolition Day", to commemorate the beginning of the process. The event was attended by hundreds of Earthquakes season ticket holders, fans, media, players, coaches and front office staff.

Prior to joining the Earthquakes, Kaval founded the Golden Baseball League in 2003 with fellow Stanford Business School graduate Amit Patel. Kaval was responsible for raising the initial capital to launch the league and attracted a number of investors from around the country to fund the venture. He also negotiated a number of major corporate partnerships, including the multi-million dollar league naming rights agreement with Safeway. Kaval served as the President of the Yuma Scorpions, Long Beach Armada and Chico Outlaws teams, as well as the Arizona Winter League. The Golden Baseball League included 12 teams in three different countries. Under Kaval's leadership, the league turned an operating profit in multiple years.

In addition to his time with the Golden Baseball League, Kaval worked at Key Bank, served as a Business Analyst for Accenture, and was the Director of Business Development for Sparks.com. Kaval has also spent time in the Office of the President of the United States on the budget for National Security. He is a recognized expert by the Superior Court of the State of California on the subject of minor league baseball and the business of professional sports. He lectures in a variety of programs at Stanford University, including the Graduate School of Business, and is a Director of the Workforce Investment Board in San Mateo County.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Kaval earned a B.A. in 1998 and an M.B.A. in 2003 from Stanford University. He currently resides in Menlo Park with his wife and two daughters.

JOHN DOYLE - GENERAL MANAGER

FIFTH SEASON



John Doyle is in his fifth season with the club as General Manager of Soccer Operations. Overseeing all aspects of the club's soccer operations, Doyle has assembled one of the top coaching staffs in the league in head coach Frank Yallop, assistant coaches Ian Russell and Mark Watson, and goalkeeper coach Jason Batty.

In 2011, Doyle made a landmark acquisition in bringing 23-year-old midfielder Simon Dawkins to San Jose on loan from club partner Tottenham Hotspur. Dawkins became the first player from an English Premier League club to play in MLS while on loan. He scored six goals and had two assists in 26 games with the Quakes. Doyle also traded San Jose's first-round pick in the 2011 SuperDraft to acquire Steven Lenhart from the Columbus Crew, a move that paid immediate dividends to the tune of five goals and three assists.

The 2010 season was a benchmark for success under Doyle's leadership. A mixture of transactions played a key role in San Jose's run to the Eastern Conference Championship. Doyle traded for eventual 2010 MLS Budweiser Golden Boot winner Chris Wondolowski in the 2009 season, signed veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, acquired a budding star in Sam Cronin and picked up the club's first Designated Player, former FC Barcelona and Hull City star Giovanni. This confluence of personnel decisions coupled with Yallop's coaching led to the best season for San Jose since returning to MLS in 2008, a 13-10-7 record. The team earned the third-highest point total in team history with 46. With a bevy of talent on the back line, the Earthquakes set a new franchise mark with 13 shutouts in 2010.

Despite an unfavorable record in 2009, it was Doyle's trade to acquire Wondolowski from Houston that resonates most from that season. Doyle sent Cam Weaver to Houston in exchange for Wondolowski and a second-round pick in the 2010 SuperDraft on June 9, 2009. Since joining San Jose, Wondolowski has led the league in goals in consecutive years and has amassed 37 total goals, No. 2 all-time in club history.

After a slow start in their 2008 expansion season, Doyle showed his resourcefulness by overhauling the team's attack during the international transfer window in July, signing English midfielder Darren Huckerby and former AS Roma midfielder Francisco Lima, and trading for midfielder Arturo Alvarez. Those moves jump-started the Quakes attack and helped them put together a nine-game unbeaten streak from July 12-Sept. 27, the longest unbeaten streak in the league in 2008 and the second-longest ever by an expansion team. The team finished the year with more wins (8), points (33) and goals scored (32) than any expansion team this decade.

Doyle has been a part of the Earthquakes' organization every season since its inception. He and Michael Emenalo were signed as the first players in club history on Dec. 7, 1995, when the team was known as the San Jose Clash. The Fremont, Calif. native played five illustrious seasons as the captain of the Clash/Earthquakes and until 2003 held the team records for games played (132) and minutes played (11,385). A two-time MLS All-Star (1996, 1997), Doyle scored 11 goals and dished out 15 assists in his career. He was the 1996 MLS Defender of the Year and named to the League's Best XI that year.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Doyle served as the television analyst from 2001-03. He was then hired on Jan. 22, 2004, as the assistant coach for Dominic Kinnear. With Doyle as the assistant coach, the Quakes made two consecutive playoff appearances and in 2005 won the Supporters' Shield. The 2005 team became just the second team in league history to record over 60 points. In 2005, Doyle was the inaugural member of the San Jose Earthquakes Hall of Fame.

Doyle has also spent the past 12 years as the Director of Coaching for Mustang Soccer, where he is responsible for the training and development of coaches who oversee over 5,000 children from the Danville, Alamo, Walnut Creek and San Ramon areas. In 2003, Doyle was appointed the Technical Director of U.S. Super Y League. He was elected to the U.S. Soccer Board of Directors in 2001 and was named to the U.S. Soccer Technical Committee in 2002. He holds an "A" coaching license from the U.S. Soccer Federation.

The former University of San Francisco All-American enjoyed one of the most decorated playing careers in U.S. soccer history. Doyle first began training with the U.S. national team in 1987 and was a member of the squad until 1994. He played in the 1988 Seoul Olympics and the 1990 World Cup in Italy, as well as the 1991 CONCACAF Gold Cup. Doyle earned 53 caps for the U.S., notching three goals and two assists.

Doyle grew up in nearby Fremont and starred at Washington High School. He resides in Pleasanton with his wife, Kaarin, and their two children, Jay and Kate.

FRANK YALLOP - HEAD COACH

EIGHTH SEASON



In his eighth season as head coach of the San Jose Earthquakes, Frank Yallop looks to lead the club back from a down year after guiding the Earthquakes to their first MLS Cup Playoff appearance in 2010 since the club rejoined MLS in 2008.

The Quakes finished with 38 points and an 8-12-14 record in 2011. Chris Wondolowski led the league in goals for a second straight year, tallying 16 times. The club put together a 3-2-4 stretch to close the season, culminating with a thrilling 4-2 win against FC Dallas in the final game, to create some momentum heading into 2012.

Yallop's squad entered the 2010 season flying under the radar, but they transformed into MLS Cup contenders. At season's end, Bobby Convey garnered Comeback Player of the Year and Wondolowski won the MLS Budweiser Golden Boot and was a finalist for the Volkswagen MVP award. In the MLS Cup Playoffs, the Earthquakes fell behind 1-0 on aggregate to the New York Red Bulls. However, under Yallop's leadership, San Jose bounced back for an improbable 3-1 win in front of a packed Red Bull Arena in the second leg to advance to the Conference Championship for the first time since 2003.

In 2009, the Earthquakes finished with 30 points and a 7-14-9 record. Despite their struggles, Yallop rallied the squad to close the season 4-4-5 over their final 13 games. Most notably during that 13-game stretch was a dominant 4-0 win against playoff-bound Seattle Sounders FC.

Under Yallop's guidance, the Quakes made a successful return to MLS in 2008 as the top expansion team of the last decade. The Quakes had more wins (8) and points (33), scored more goals (32), and allowed fewer goals (38), than any expansion team since 1998. The team also posted a nine-game unbeaten streak from July 12-Sept. 27, which was the longest unbeaten streak in the league in 2008 and the second-longest ever by an expansion team. At the conclusion of the season, Yallop was invited to coach MLS' Generation adidas team for a week of games in London, England.

Yallop's current tenure as head coach of the Earthquakes is his second stint with the club. He also coached the Quakes from 2001-03 before serving as the head coach of the Canadian men's national team from 2004-06 and the Los Angeles Galaxy from 2006-07.

During his previous three seasons as head coach of the Earthquakes, Yallop won two MLS Cup championships while posting a 41-25-18 record, the best mark in MLS during that stretch. Yallop was named MLS Coach of the Year in 2001 after taking over a team that posted a league-worst 7-17-8 record in 2000 and leading them to the MLS Cup championship in 2001. The former Canadian international defender is the club's all-time leader in wins (77). In addition, Yallop coached the MLS All-Stars to a 3-2 win over the U.S. Men's National Team in 2002.

With Yallop in charge between 2001-03, the Earthquakes broke numerous club records, including fewest goals allowed in a season (29) and most consecutive wins at home (12). Many players flourished under Yallop's tutelage, as the Quakes had 13 players named All-Stars in Yallop's three seasons and had five members selected to the MLS Best XI postseason team. Seven Earthquakes players also earned their first call-up to the senior men's national team for training camps during Yallop's first three seasons in San Jose.

Yallop began his coaching career in 1999 with the U.S. Project 40 team. He was an assistant coach to Tim Hankinson for the Tampa Bay Mutiny in 1999, and then went to work with D.C. United in 2000 as the top assistant to then-head coach Thomas Rongen.

Prior to coaching, Yallop spent almost 20 years playing in England and in the U.S. as a defender. He signed his first professional contract at the age of 16 with Ipswich Town FC in England, and in 1992, helped the club win the English First Division. Yallop was twice named the team's MVP, and scored game-winning goals in back-to-back games in 1993 to lead Ipswich to Premiership victories over Tottenham Hotspur and legendary side Manchester United.

Yallop also played in MLS as a top defender for the Tampa Bay Mutiny from 1996-98, where he earned the Mutiny's Defender of the Year award in 1997 and 1998. In 1996, Yallop helped the Mutiny to a league-best regular-season record of 20-12, and in 1998, he scored the only goal of his MLS career. Yallop has a United States Soccer Federation "A" coaching license and an FA Preliminary Badge.

He and his wife, Karen, have two sons, Jack and Samuel.

IAN RUSSELL - ASSISTANT COACH

FIFTH SEASON



Ian Russell returns to San Jose for his fifth season as one of the top young assistant coaches in Major League Soccer. The former Earthquakes player works closely with head coach Frank Yallop in the preparation of daily training sessions, while also helping to coordinate San Jose's international and collegiate scouting efforts.

During his coaching tenure to date with the Earthquakes, Russell has helped the franchise make a successful return to MLS in 2008, posting the best record for any expansion team in a decade, and reach the Conference Championship of the 2010 MLS Cup Playoffs, finishing that year with the No. 3 mark all-time in club history for points with 46.

A native of Seattle, Wash., Russell spent six seasons playing for the San Jose Earthquakes from 2000-05, and seven total years in MLS. After being selected in the fifth round of the 2000 MLS SuperDraft, Russell appeared in 131 games for the Quakes. A lightning-quick midfielder, he scored five goals and notched 20 assists, aiding the Quakes to their two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003. Russell's best season came in 2001 when he started all 26 league matches, producing three goals and nine assists. He is 10th all-time in Quakes history in assists, and is tied for first in playoff appearances with 14.

Russell also played three games in 2007 with the Los Angeles Galaxy under Frank Yallop.

Prior to his MLS career, Russell starred at the University of Washington as a three-time (1995-97) All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation First Team honoree. He moved on to play two seasons for the Seattle Sounders, then of the A-League. Russell holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license.

MARK WATSON - ASSISTANT COACH

THIRD SEASON



Mark Watson returns to San Jose for his third season as an Earthquakes assistant coach after joining the staff in 2010. The Canadian native of Vancouver, British Columbia, assists with daily training regimens, pregame tactical preparations and scouting efforts.

Watson contributed to a memorable 2010 season, as San Jose reached the Conference Championship in the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2003 and finished with the No. 3 mark all-time in franchise history for points with 46.

Previously, Watson served as both a player and assistant coach for the Charleston Battery of the United Soccer Leagues First Division (USL-1) from 2006-09. During that same time, he was an assistant coach in the Canadian national team system from 2004-09, aiding with the U-20, U-23 and senior squads. He was on the staff of the U-23 team for Olympic qualifying in 2004 and 2008, and also worked with the U-20 team in qualifying for the 2009 FIFA Under-20 World Cup. The former defender and captain appeared in 78 matches for the Canadian national team, scoring three goals. Watson helped Canada win the 2000 CONCACAF Gold Cup.

During his playing career, Watson spent time in England with Watford from 1993-95, and came to MLS in its inaugural season in 1996, splitting time between the Columbus Crew and the New England Revolution. Watson played with the Seattle Sounders briefly in 1997, and then went abroad to Sweden from 1997-98 to play with Osters IF. He played in the Second Division in England with Oxford and Oldham before returning to the United States in 2001 for a season with D.C. United.



JASON BATTY - GOALKEEPER COACH

THIRD SEASON

Jason Batty returns for his fifth season as the goalkeeper coach for the San Jose Earthquakes. The New Zealand native works day-to-day with the club's goalkeepers and plays a key role in opponent scouting.

Under Batty's tutelage in 2011, Generation adidas goalkeeper David Bingham was selected to participate in Olympic training camp for the United States U-23 National Team in Germany from Nov. 6 to Nov. 17.

In 2010, Batty oversaw a goalkeeping crew that posted a franchise record 13 clean sheets during the regular season. Keeper Jon Busch provided a steadying presence in goal for the San Jose Earthquakes all season long, especially down the stretch of the regular season after Joe Cannon suffered a fractured ankle.

In 2008, Joe Cannon had another outstanding season. Cannon ended the year as one of six players in MLS to play every minute of every game, recording a career-high 2,700 minutes.

Prior to joining the Earthquakes, Batty was the Director of Goalkeeping for Texas Premier SC, while serving as a coach for a number of soccer academies and camps. He previously served as an assistant coach and the goalkeeper coach for Dartmouth College.

As a player, he competed professionally for 14 seasons in England, Singapore, New Zealand and the United States. Watson earned 55 caps for New Zealand's national team.

He and his wife, Jess, have two children.



BRUCE MORGAN - HEAD TRAINER

FIFTEENTH SEASON

Bruce Morgan returns for his 17th season in the MLS and his 15th as the San Jose Earthquakes head athletic trainer. Having spent the first ten seasons in San Jose (with the Clash/Earthquakes), Morgan is the only person who has been a part of every game (preseason, exhibition, regular season and postseason) in team history.

Morgan started his MLS career with the San Jose Clash in 1996 and was a fixture on the team until 2005 when the Earthquakes were relocated to Houston. Morgan joined the Houston Dynamo during the Earthquakes relocation to Houston in December 2005. He has been a part of four MLS Cup-winning teams, two with San Jose in 2001 and 2003 and two more with Houston in 2006 and 2007.

He returned to San Jose in 2008 to rejoin his former club for the team's return to MLS.

A native of Northern California, Morgan earned his undergraduate degree from California State University Sacramento and his master's degree at the University of Arizona. As a member of the league's medical advisory panel (1996-2002), he assisted in the development of the policies and procedures manual that guides the practice of teams' medical staffs.

Prior to joining San Jose's staff in 1996, Morgan supervised a hospital-based out-reach athletic training program, served as a consultant to numerous youth athletic organizations in that capacity, including the North and Central Coast Sections of the California Interscholastic Federation and the California Youth Soccer Association (CYSA).

An avid reader, he has authored or co-authored articles appearing in a variety of publications, including the American Journal of Orthopedics, the Journal of Arthroscopy and the American Journal of Sports Medicine.

When not attending to the medical needs of the team, Morgan enjoys traveling. He is also passionate about running, a passion which dates back over thirty years to his days spent as a member of his high school's cross country team.



HANK HOUSE - ASSISTANT TRAINER

FOURTH SEASON

Hank House enters his fourth full season with the Earthquakes as an assistant athletic trainer. House is a graduate of San Jose State University and holds a Master's Degree in athletic training. House worked at Baysport Physical Therapy Clinic for three years, and has provided athletic training services for several colleges in the Bay Area. He also spent time as the athletic trainer for the San Francisco Seals. Most recently, House was the Head Athletic Trainer for Prospect High School and then Castro Valley High School. In 2010, House was a part of the Earthquakes run to the MLS Cup Playoffs. The squad reached the Conference Championship and posted its best season since rejoining the league in 2008. House lives in San Leandro with his wife, Suzanne, and his two children, Kristin and Joshua.



JOSE VEGA - EQUIPMENT MANAGER

FIFTH SEASON

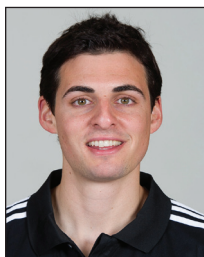
After six years with the Los Angeles Galaxy, Jose Vega joined the San Jose Earthquakes in May of 2008 as the team's equipment manager. During his stint with the Galaxy, Vega worked numerous international matches at the Home Depot Center while also accompanying the Galaxy on its 2007 tour of Australia and New Zealand. He has worked at two MLS Cups during his time in the league. Tella played soccer for most of his life and enjoyed success at the club level with Fremont Celtic, and later at the U-23 level with the La Jolla Nomads in the San Diego area. JOE DINCECCO - TEAM ADMINISTRATOR

Joe Dincecco enters his fifth season as the team administrator for the San Jose Earthquakes. Working directly with General Manager John Doyle, Dincecco oversees and coordinates all team travel and works on the team's preseason training schedule. He also helps coordinate the team's college scouting efforts. Additionally, the Massachusetts native plays a big role in player relocation and the acquisition of the appropriate entry visas for international players. In addition to his work at the Quakes, he also serves as an assistant coach for the Aptos High School soccer team. Dincecco graduated from the University of Richmond in 2007 after playing four years of varsity soccer for the Spiders. He served as captain of the team as a senior. He earned a degree in Business Administration from the Robins School of Business at Richmond. During his college years, he also played for the Cape Cod Crusaders (PDL).

The Beginning (1994-1996)

The San Jose organization was established in 1994, when San Jose became a charter member of Major League Soccer on June 15. San Jose joined Boston, Columbus, Los Angeles, New York/New Jersey and Washington, D.C. as the first teams in MLS. Between November, 1994 and June 1995, Tampa Bay, Denver, Kansas City and Dallas were added as clubs and the San Jose team was assigned to the Western Conference.

The club began to take shape on August 1, 1995 when a Bay Area soccer icon, Peter Bridgwater, was named the president and general manager of the team. Bridgwater previously served as the owner and general manager of the North American Soccer League version of the San Jose Earthquakes, and was one of the founders of the Western Soccer Alliance in the mid-1980s. Bridgwater was also the Venue Executive Director for the San Francisco venue of World Cup 1994.

The San Jose MLS club began its history nicknamed the "Clash," a moniker it kept for four seasons before changing the name of the organization to "Earthquakes" prior to the 2000 season, embracing the name of the former NASL franchise that had been successful in the area throughout the 1970's and 1980's.

Laurie Calloway was named the first head coach in San Jose history on December 7, 1995. Soon after, Calloway announced the first two members of the San Jose club: Bay Area native and U.S. National Team veteran John Doyle and Nigerian World Cup veteran Michael Emenalo.

1996: Excitement in San Jose

Throughout the early stages of 1996, San Jose remained busy attempting to field their first squad in the organization's history. The club received a huge boost when it was allocated U.S. National Team leading scorer Eric Wynalda on January 23, just one day after he became the all-time leading goal scorer in U.S. National Team history.

The team continued to take shape, as Paul Bravo was the club's first ever draft pick on February 6 in the inaugural MLS Draft. Eleven days later, San Jose was involved in the first trade in league history, sending Rhett Harty and a first-round draft choice to the MetroStars for defender Troy Dayak.

Soon after the first draft, Calloway convened the team on the south campus of San Jose State University on March 1 for the club's first-ever training camp. San Jose was once again an integral part of the launching of MLS, hosting the MLS' Inaugural Game at Spartan Stadium before a crowd of 31,683 on April 6. The then-record crowd did not go away disappointed as San Jose won its first game on the first goal in MLS history courtesy of Wynalda, defeating D.C. United 1-0. One month later, the club made history again, as they hosted the Los Angeles Galaxy in a match that drew 31,728 fans to Spartan Stadium, setting the record for attendance at a sporting event in the city of San Jose.

San Jose went on to finish their first season with a 15-17 record and a tough three-game exit from the playoffs by the eventual MLS runners-up Los Angeles Galaxy. It was a season that saw the club host the one millionth fan to attend an MLS game and record the first



victory for an MLS team against an international opponent. The Clash defeated UNAM Pumas of the Mexican First Division 2-1 at Spartan Stadium June 12 to earn that distinction. Doyle went on to be recognized as the first MLS Defender of the Year after a stellar season, while also earning a spot on the MLS Best XI team. Missael Espinoza, a Mexican National Team standout, earned the Clash Budweiser MVP Award in that first season.

San Jose would continue with its international success, becoming the first MLS team to make a post-season international tour. The club split two games during a 13-day trip through China in late October and early November.

One player from the original team, Ramiro Corrales, remains with San Jose today. John Doyle, the first official member of the club, now serves as the Earthquakes general manager of soccer operations.

1997: A Star Emerges

San Jose finished the 1997 season with a 12-20 record and failed to make the playoffs. The Clash played through a mid-season coaching change that occurred when Brian Quinn replaced Calloway on June 25, 1997. At the time, the 37-year old Quinn became the youngest coach in MLS history and he finished the '97 campaign with a 7-10 record.

The 1997 team was led by first-year MLS player Ronald Cerritos. Cerritos would go on to become a fan favorite in San Jose, playing with the team for six seasons and becoming the club's all-time leading goal scorer. The Salvadoran set both an MLS and San Jose record with his 11-game point streak during the season, which helped him to be named to the MLS Best XI. Notable members of the '97 club were former head coach Dominic Kinnear and U.S. National Team star Eddie Lewis, then a second-year MLS midfielder. San Jose also made its first appearance in the Lamar Hunt

U.S. Open Cup in 1997, defeating the Central Coast Roadrunners in their first match, before bowing out in the next round of the historic competition.

1998: Another Lean Season

The 1998 season was one of excitement tempered by frustration. Quinn led the team to a 13-19 record, good for 33 points in MLS. San Jose was forced to play the first three home games of the season at Stanford University after winter rains delayed the renovation on Spartan Stadium. When the club returned to Spartan, they faced the New England Revolution May 3, 1998 on a newly widened field that was 70 yards wide and 110 yards long.

Ronald Cerritos again led the team, putting in 13 goals to finish the season as the eighth leading goal-scorer in the league. During the 1998 season, the pieces of the eventual 2001 MLS Cup Champions began to form at Spartan Stadium. Eventual 2002 MLS all-star Wade Barrett was drafted in the first round of the 1998 College Draft, and eventual 2002 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year Joe Cannon gained his first MLS experience. Cannon was called to the club from the A-League to serve as a back up for ten days before returning to soccer's minor leagues. Defender Richard Gough enjoyed an all-star season in 1998, as he was the only member of the team selected to play in the mid-season classic. The club was forced to play through May and June without forward Eric Wynalda, who was with the United States National Team at the World Cup in France. Wynalda appeared in two matches for the U.S. during the World Cup.

1999: The Kraft Era Begins

For the first three seasons of the League's history, the San Jose club had operated as a league-owned team. That arrangement changed on November 18, 1998 when the Kraft Group Sports, the investor-operator of the New England Revolution and owner of the NFL's New England Patriots, took over operations of the team. The change in ownership brought immediate

change throughout the organization.

Kraft Group Sports assumed operation of the team on January 4 and named Lynne Meterparel the general manager and Renato Capobianco as director of soccer. The 1999 season also marked the final year that the club would be known as the Clash, and the team retired the nickname by setting a club record for wins in a season with 19. Unfortunately, the team's 37 points saw them come up just short of a playoff spot for the third straight season.

However, the team did place three players in the All-Star Game, as Cerritos, Lewis and defender Mauricio Wright were selected. Wright knocked in the game-winning goal in the mid-season classic off a Cerritos assist in the 84th minute. The 1999 season also saw Cerritos break his own goal-scoring record with 15, and Lewis establish a new high mark for assists, registering 14.

Lothar Osiander became the third head coach of the team when he took over for Quinn on September 16 with five games remaining in the season. Assistant coach Jorge Espinoza guided the team to two wins before Osiander, the former U.S. National Team coach, was able to join the team from coaching the MLS Project-40 team for the final three matches of the year.

Despite missing the post-season, San Jose continued building for the future. The 1999 season was the first season for four key members of the 2001 MLS Cup Championship squad. Midfielder Richard Mulrooney, defender Jimmy Conrad, goalkeeper Joe Cannon and midfielder Scott Bower all debuted over the course of the year, establishing the solid foundation of the club. Mulrooney was a finalist for the MLS Rookie of the Year award.

With precocious rookies arriving, San Jose parted ways with a piece of its past, loaning striker Eric Wynalda to Leon of the Mexican First Division for the early stages of the season and then sending him to the Miami Fusion via the MetroStars on June 1 as part of the "future considerations" from an early season deal.

Ronald Cerritos again led the team in scoring and finished as the third-leading scorer in MLS with 15 goals and 39 points. His bicycle kick assist to Alejandro Sequeira Sept. 4 also earned him the Nickelodeon Play of the Year. He was also named the MLS Player of the Month for September when he scored four goals and notched four assists as the team battled for a playoff spot. Solid midfielder Eddie Lewis was named to the MLS Best XI, becoming the third San Jose player ever to be so honored.

2000: Earthquakes Shake San Jose Again

The 2000 season marked the return of a soccer club with the Earthquakes nickname to the Bay Area. San Jose played its first season under the Earthquakes moniker, revamping the organization under the name of the NASL soccer team that had been so popular in the area in the 1970's and early 1980's.

The 2000 edition of the Quakes was not immediately able to rekindle the glory days of the club, missing out on the playoffs for a fourth straight year and finishing the season with a 7-17-8 record in the first season that MLS games finished as ties. The season began with much promise after the allocation of Khodadad Azizi, a

forward who played in the German Bundesliga and was the 1996 Asian Player of the Year. Azizi was selected to the All-Star team along with midfielder Dario Brose, but he managed to score just three goals in 20 games.

While Azizi and several new Quakes, including 2001 MLS Cup Champions Ian Russell and Jon Conway, were getting adjusted to the style of play under Osiander, San Jose was forced to part ways with one of its past stars. Eddie Lewis, the team's midfield star, was transferred to Fulham of the English First Division for a then MLS-record \$1.5 million transfer fee.

While the team struggled at times, the Earthquakes did manage to set an MLS record with 15 straight unbeaten matches at Spartan Stadium. The streak stretched from Aug. 21, 1999 – July 15, 2000. It was a mark that the club would equal just two seasons later.

With a defense led by the emerging force of goalkeeper Joe Cannon, the Quakes recorded a club record nine shutouts in 2000. Long-time Bay Area soccer legend John Doyle played his last game as a member of the club in 2000, finishing a highly-decorated career that included eight years as a member of the U.S. National Team and a spot in the 1988 Olympics and 1990 World Cup. Doyle is still amongst the Earthquakes club leaders in numerous statistical categories, including appearances, games started, minutes played and cautions.

Forward Abdul Thompson Conteh was recognized as the MLS Humanitarian of the Year for his efforts to raise awareness and funds for the victims of war in his native Sierra Leone.

In a move that would foreshadow the dramatic upheaval the club would soon undergo, Lynne Meterparel stepped down as the Earthquakes General Manager on October 4 after 21 months.

2001: That Championship Season

After several years of frustration, the San Jose club was able to deliver a true season to remember for its fans in 2001, a season that ended with the club capturing its first MLS Cup Championship. It was a roller coaster ride right from the start when a new operating group was introduced in January and it accelerated with the addition of a savvy coach and the signing of the brightest American star the sport has ever seen.

The San Jose Earthquakes experienced a re-birth in 2001 when it was announced that Silicon Valley Sports & Entertainment, the business and marketing arm of the NHL's San Jose Sharks, would become the operator of the club on January 10. In addition, Spartan Stadium was named the site of the 2001 MLS All-Star game the same day, and the stage was set for the Earthquakes historic season.

Just two days later, head coach Lothar Osiander was relieved of his duties. With the days leading to the draft and pre-season training rapidly approaching, Tom Neale was hired as the Earthquakes general manager on Feb. 1. Frank Yallop became the fifth head coach in Earthquakes history when he was hired on Feb. 2, giving him just two days in command prior to the MLS Superdraft.

Yallop wasted little time turning the Quakes into a contender, acquiring one of the league's best defenders, Jeff Agoos, from D.C. United in exchange for two



draft picks and Abdul Thompson Conteh. Yallop then received defender Zak Ibsen in a trade from Los Angeles for a draft pick and acquired high-scoring A-League forward Dwayne De Rosario as an allocated player.

Yallop's busy week was not over, however, as he drafted six players in the Feb. 5 SuperDraft, including Chris Carrieri with the number one pick and defender Eddie Robinson with the 20th selection. Yallop was able to solidify the Quakes midfield when he acquired Manny Lagos from Tampa Bay in exchange for two draft picks.

With a revamped Earthquakes team coming into focus, former Earthquakes player Dominic Kinnear was hired as an assistant coach Feb. 15. The coaching staff was also bolstered by the return of goalkeeper coach Tim Hanley, who had served in the same capacity from 1997-1999. Seven days after Kinnear's hiring, another important piece of the 2001 Earthquakes came together when Ramiro Corrales rejoined his original club, coming over in a trade with the MetroStars.

Perhaps the biggest announcement in Earthquakes history took place on March 29, when it was announced that then 19-year-old superstar Landon Donovan would join the club as an allocated player. Donovan, from Redlands, Calif., was well known in the soccer world, joining the Quakes from German Bundesliga club Bayer Leverkusen, with whom he signed a contract in 1999.

As the season was set to start with a sense of optimism never before experienced at Spartan Stadium, Yallop and the Quakes made two more major moves, signing Danish star Ronnie Ekelund and bringing defender Troy Dayak back to the team.

Dayak was an original member of the club in 1996 and appeared in matches in 1997-1998 before succumbing to serious surgery on a bulging disk in his neck that took over two years to fully recover.

The Quakes got off to a slow start in April before tearing through an undefeated stretch from late April to early July (7-0-5) to establish themselves as one of the best teams in the league.

MLS recognized the Quakes firepower, as a team record six players were named to the MLS West All-

Star team in July. A large crowd at Spartan Stadium watched the Quakes put on a mid-season show in the 6-6 game July 28. Ronald Cerritos, Joe Cannon, Troy Dayak, Manny Lagos, Jeff Agoos and Landon Donovan all represented the team, with Donovan taking home the MVP honors after thrilling the crowd with four goals.

Quakes general manager Tom Neale resigned a day before the All-Star game, but the team continued to roll along, finishing with a 13-7-6 record for the best winning percentage (.615) in club history. The team entered the final two games (both against the Los Angeles Galaxy) of the season trailing the Galaxy by two points in the Western Division standings. Tragedy struck the day the team was set to travel to Los Angeles for the first of their final two matches, as the terrorist attacks on New York City and Washington, D.C. put the country on hold. MLS canceled the remaining regular season games and the Quakes finished second in the Western Division and fifth overall in MLS, their best finish in club history. Overall, the Quakes winning percentage improved by .271 from 2000 to 2001, the third highest increase from one season to the next in league history.

The Earthquakes made this playoff appearance count, rolling over the Crew in the MLS Cup Playoff quarterfinals in two games, 3-1 and 3-0. The Quakes then faced the owners of MLS' best regular-season record, the Miami Fusion, in the semifinals.

It was a hard-fought series, with Miami striking first with a 1-0 win in the first game off a goal in the 53rd minute from Preki. San Jose responded in the second game with a resounding 4-0 win at Spartan Stadium, setting the stage for one of the biggest games in Quakes history at Lockhart Stadium in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. on October 17.

The game was a tight, pressure-packed affair that headed into overtime deadlocked at zero. It remained that way until four minutes into the extra session when Richard Mulrooney curled in a corner kick from the right side. Standing on the back post in heavy traffic, Jimmy Conrad knocked the ball in the air toward the goal-mouth, where a leaping Dayak powered the ball past Miami goalkeeper Nick Rimando for a 1-0 win and the Earthquakes first-ever trip to the MLS Cup Final.

It was an incredible week to be a member of the Earthquakes as the club prepared for MLS Cup 2001 in Columbus, Ohio against their in-state rival Los Angeles

Galaxy. In his first season as head coach, Frank Yallop was recognized for turning the club around from its last-place finish in 2000 to the MLS title game with the Coach of The Year Award. First year Quake Jeff Agoos was named MLS Defender of The Year and a member of the MLS Best XI while Troy Dayak won the Ace Comeback Player of the Year Award for his dramatic recovery from neck surgery. As a team, the Earthquakes were recognized with the Fair Play Award.

MLS Cup 2001 would feature a similar Earthquakes sweep. Despite falling behind 1-0 on a Luis Hernandez goal in the 21st minute, San Jose responded with a world-class strike by Donovan in the 43rd minute. The team then won the first championship in club history on a golden goal by Dwayne De Rosario six minutes into overtime. De Rosario was rewarded with the MLS Cup MVP trophy, and the Earthquakes were finally able to call themselves MLS Cup Champions.

2002: Defending the Cup

The Quakes began the 2002 campaign in an unusual position. For the first time they were among the league favorites to win the championship. The team was well positioned for another run at the title, as MLS Defender of the Year Jeff Agoos and star forward Landon Donovan were returning. The team also made a major off-season move as it sent all-time leading scorer Ronald Cerritos to the Dallas Burn for the Burn's top goal scorer Ariel Graziani on Feb. 8. On the same day, the Quakes announced that Johnny Moore would serve as the new general manager. Moore had strong roots in the history of San Jose soccer, having played for the NASL Earthquakes from 1974-1977, while also serving as assistant general manager from 1974-1976. In 1977, Moore became the first person to serve as a player and general manager at the same time, helping the Quakes rank among the leaders in NASL in attendance.

With Frank Yallop and Dominic Kinnear in charge, 2002 turned out to be another fantastic season for San Jose. The team held first place overall in MLS from April 20-Sept. 13 and posted an MLS all-time best home record of 12-1-1 at Spartan Stadium. The Quakes posted a then-MLS record 12-game winning streak at Spartan Stadium and a 15-game unbeaten streak at home that tied their own home unbeaten streak. At the end of the year, the Quakes finished with the second-best record in MLS and equaled the club record for points in a season with 45.

The Quakes also participated for the first time in the CONCACAF Champions Cup, where they advanced to the quarterfinals. The team swept CD Olimpia of Honduras in the Round of 16 1-0 and 3-1, but could not get by Mexican champion Pachuca CF, who won the two-game series 3-1 on aggregate.

Individually, a number of Quakes shined both internationally and in the league. Jeff Agoos and Landon Donovan represented the United States at the 2002 World Cup with Donovan starting every game and scoring two goals. The U.S. shocked the world by advancing to the quarterfinals.

At home, Wade Barrett and Ronnie Ekelund earned spots on the MLS Best XI team, while Joe Cannon was named MLS Goalkeeper of the Year. For the second straight season, six Quakes players participated in

the MLS All-Star game (Jeff Agoos, Wade Barrett, Joe Cannon, Landon Donovan, Ariel Graziani and Richard Mulrooney). Frank Yallop earned the honor of coaching the MLS All-Stars in the game and his squad defeated the U.S. National Team 3-2. In 2002, Cannon set a club record with eight shutouts, while Graziani also broke a record by scoring six game-winning goals on his way to leading the team with 14 goals and five assists.

The playoffs were not as fruitful for the Quakes, however, as they were swept by the Columbus Crew, losing two games by 2-1 scores. Landon Donovan led the playoff charge with a goal and an assist, but his efforts were not enough as the Quakes were unable to defend their title.

2003: Return to Glory

After losing in the first round of the 2002 MLS Cup Playoffs, the Earthquakes went through a tumultuous off-season prior to 2003. Eight players left the team through trade or free agency, and the club re-loaded by bringing in nine new faces through the draft and shrewd trades. Starters Joe Cannon, Jimmy Conrad, Wade Barrett and Ariel Graziani would not be back for 2003.

The Quakes acquired Stanford All-American Todd Dunivant, 17-year-old Arturo Alvarez, Pac-10 Player of the Year Roger Levesque, forward Jamil Walker and goalkeeper Josh Saunders in the MLS SuperDraft. The team picked up Los Angeles Galaxy midfielder Brian Mullan in a trade, while also acquiring Craig Waibel (Waiver Draft) and Brian Ching (Supplemental Draft). After an injury to goalkeeper Jon Conway in preseason, Yallop and Kinnear signed Canadian National Team veteran Pat Onstad to man the net.

Yallop's squad had two setbacks prior to kicking off the regular season. First, CSD Municipal of Guatemala eliminated the Quakes from the CONCACAF Champions Cup in the round of 16 5-4 on aggregate. Second, projected starting forward Dwayne De Rosario, who had missed the preseason with a broken foot, suffered a torn lateral collateral ligament in his right knee and was expected to be out for the year.

Despite the difficulties suffered in preseason, the Quakes surprised the League by bursting out of the gate with a 4-0-2 record in their first six games to claim the top spot in the Western Conference. The team, however, continued to deal with adversity as a number of players went down with injuries while Landon Donovan, Richard Mulrooney, Pat Onstad and Arturo Alvarez all missed time due to national team commitments.

Overall in 2003, the Quakes lost over 100 man games to injuries and national team call-ups, but they battled through and held the top spot in the Western Conference for every week but one. Contributions came from every player on the roster. Rookies Todd Dunivant and Jamil Walker each notched eight points, setting the single-season rookie scoring record, while Arturo Alvarez scored a goal in his first career start. Brian Mullan and Brian Ching put together career years with each netting six goals, while Craig Waibel, another former Galaxy player, put up career highs in games played and minutes played.

With strong efforts from everyone, San Jose captured its first-ever regular season Western Conference Championship with 51 points, a new club record. Pat

Onstad and Landon Donovan were named to the Best XI team and Onstad was also recognized as the MLS Goalkeeper of the Year. The Canadian international re-wrote the San Jose record book for goalkeepers, setting the club record for shutouts (9), wins (14), catch/punches (117), games played in goal (27) and goals against average (1.04). He also found himself among the league leaders in most goalkeeping categories, placing first in catch/punches (117), first in shutouts (9), second in goals against (1.04) and second in wins (14).

Donovan and Dwayne De Rosario also had two defining moments in 2003 as they notched the first two hat tricks in club history. Donovan got things started by netting the first Quakes hat trick on Sept. 20 against Kansas City and then De Rosario followed the next week with a hat trick of his own against the Dallas Burn. De Rosario scored his first goal of that game 11 seconds in, setting the record for the fastest goal in MLS history.

In the MLS Cup Playoffs, the Quakes started slowly with a 2-0 loss to the Los Angeles Galaxy in the first game of a two-game aggregate goal series and then they fell behind 2-0 just 13 minutes into game two. Facing a 4-0 aggregate goals deficit, Yallop's squad responded with the tenacity and desire shown all season, as they netted four unanswered goals in regulation, capped by Chris Ronér's 90th minute header. Rodrigo Faria, who arrived in a late season trade, scored the overtime winner setting off a celebration at Spartan Stadium. The 5-2 comeback win has since been called the "greatest game in MLS history."

The Quakes continued their run to the championship, coming back just six days after the miracle against the Galaxy to record another memorable victory in the Western Conference Championship. Against the Kansas City Wizards, the Quakes twice recovered from one-goal deficits in the second half to tie the game and send it to overtime to the delight of 16,108 fans at Spartan Stadium. With only three minutes remaining in the overtime period, Landon Donovan sent the crowd



into delirium with the game-winning goal off a pass from Ronnie Ekelund, giving San Jose its first-ever Western Conference Championship.

After coming from behind in their previous two playoff matches, the Quakes struck first in the MLS Cup against the Chicago Fire at The Home Depot Center. Ronnie Ekelund blasted a free kick past Fire goalkeeper Zach Thornton in the fifth minute, tying the MLS Cup record for the fastest goal in Cup history. Donovan stretched the lead to two goals by finishing off a Jamil Walker through ball in the 38th minute and the Quakes headed into halftime with a two-goal cushion. Onstad was outstanding in the first half with seven saves to hold Chicago scoreless.

The first 15 minutes following intermission saw back-and-forth action as three goals were scored during that interval and a penalty kick was called. DaMarcus Beasley scored for Chicago in the 49th minute, but Richard Mulrooney responded a minute later with a goal to stretch the lead back to two goals at 3-1. An own goal by Chris Ronér made it a 3-2 game and three minutes later Fire forward Damani Ralph was fouled in the penalty box to earn a penalty kick. Ante Razov stepped up to take the penalty and drove it towards the lower left corner, but Onstad was there to make a momentum-changing save. Donovan put the finishing touches on the Quakes' second championship win in three seasons with a goal in the 71st minute from a Dwayne De Rosario cross. The Quakes four goals set and MLS Cup record, while the six combined goals were also a record.

The Earthquakes proved once again that they were the top team in MLS. From 2001-2003, San Jose was the top team in MLS with two MLS Cup Championships and the best regular season record at 41-25-18.

2004: Kinnear Takes Charge

Despite coming off their second championship in three seasons, changes at the top were the big story heading into the 2004 season. In December 2003, head coach Frank Yallop stepped down from the Quakes to take over the Canadian National Team. In his place, the Quakes elevated assistant coach Dominic Kinnear to the top job and he brought in long-time San Jose player John Doyle to serve as his assistant coach. In late January 2004, changes continued as general manager Johnny Moore stepped down and was replaced by former U.S. World Cup star Alexi Lalas, who was named President and General Manager on January 27, 2004.

A successful draft by Kinnear and Doyle saw the team acquire local Santa Clara products defender Ryan Cochrane and goalkeeper Steve Cronin in the first round. The team also picked up midfielder Tighe Dombrowski from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in the fifth round. Those draft picks served to bolster a team that brought back over 90 percent of the 2003 team. Manny Lagos, who was traded to Columbus for a third round pick, was the only starter not retained.

The 2004 season again saw the Quakes lose over 100 man games to injury and national team call-ups, and coupled with nine one-goal losses, San Jose finished 9-10-11 and fourth in the Western Conference. San Jose then faced Kansas City in the Western Conference Semifinals in a two-game series. After winning the first game 2-0 at home on goals by Dwayne De Ro-

sario and Craig Waibel, Kansas City turned the tables in game two to beat the Quakes 3-0 and end their season.

While San Jose did not make it back to MLS Cup, the team accomplished a number of notable feats. It set club records by recording four straight shutouts from Aug. 14–Sept. 4, while also recording a club record 459-minute shutout streak. Kinnear's squad also broke the MLS record by extending their unbeaten streak when scoring first at home to 46 games.

Individually, the Quakes had a number of outstanding performances and milestones. For the first time in club history, the Earthquakes had five players voted in as starters for the Sierra Mist MLS All-Star Game as Jeff Agoos, Brian Ching, Landon Donovan, Richard Mulrooney and Pat Onstad all earned spots on the West squad. Ching scored in the game on assists from Mulrooney and Donovan, but the West fell 3-2.

Ching had a breakout year after recovering from a torn Achilles tendon in 2003, as he scored a league-leading 12 goals and notched four assists to earn MLS Comeback Player of the Year honors and a spot on the RadioShack Best XI team. In another historic moment, Mulrooney set the club record for assists against the Los Angeles Galaxy on May 22 and finished the year with 44 career assists. Mulrooney finished 2004 as the all-time leader in six categories, including games played (163), minutes played (14,204) and fouls suffered (354), among others.

The off-season saw more change as the Quakes lost star forward Landon Donovan, who decided to return to Germany to play for Bayer Leverkusen, which had exercised the option to retain Donovan after his four years in MLS.

2005: The Supporters' Shield

Coming off a disappointing 2004 season, head coach Dominic Kinnear helped return the Quakes of long-time standout members of the club before the start of the season. Bringing in 18 new players, including returnees to the team Ronald Cerritos and Wade Barrett, Kinnear led the Quakes to the greatest regular season in team history with an 18-4-10 record and 64 points, clinching the club's first Supporters' Shield, despite losing over 100 man games to injury. Newcomers Ricardo Clark, Kelly Gray, Danny Califf, Mark Chung, Brad Davis and Alejandro Moreno all played big parts in the Quakes' 2005 success.

The team set the MLS record for the fewest losses in league history with four and became the second team in MLS history to surpass 60 points in a season. San Jose also set club records in the following categories: winning streak (6 games), road winning streak (6 games), shutouts (12), most road shutouts (4), most road wins (9), unbeaten streak (14 games) and most consecutive shutouts at home (5). Kinnear's squad became the first team in MLS history to finish the regular season unbeaten at home (9-0-7), while stretching their all-time unbeaten streak at home to 18 games, another MLS record. San Jose posted a +22 goal difference, the best in team history with 53 goals scored and 31 allowed.

Despite the great regular season success, the Quakes were eliminated for the second straight season in the Western Conference Semifinals. After losing 3-1 on the road to the Los Angeles Galaxy in the first leg of the series, the Quakes could not comeback and fell 4-2 overall on aggregate.

Dwayne De Rosario had the best season of his five-year MLS career in 2005 to lead the Quakes. Moving from forward to attacking midfielder, the Canadian international recorded career-highs in goals (9) and assists (9) and finished runner-up in the Honda MLS MVP race. He also earned his second straight Sierra Mist MLS Goal of the Year award for his spectacular free kick on Oct. 15 against the Los Angeles Galaxy.

Also having standout seasons for the Quakes were goalkeeper Pat Onstad and defender Danny Califf, who were both named to the RadioShack MLS Best XI team. Onstad was also named the MLS Goalkeeper of the Year for a season in which he led the league in wins (18), shutouts (12), goals against average (0.97) and save percentage (77.2). It was the second Goalkeeper of the Year award for the 37-year-old Canadian, who also moved into first place in team history with his 27th career shutout on Oct. 1 against New England. Califf helped stabilize the defense after coming over in a trade with the Galaxy, appearing in 20 games and scoring two goals. Along with Eddie Robinson, Califf helped form the most formidable central defense tandem in MLS.

Cerritos, the all-time leading goal scorer in team history, made a strong return to San Jose in 2005, after spending three seasons away from the team. Cerritos finished the year with six goals and eight assists to push his all-time totals to 61 goals and 47 assists, both team records. Cerritos notched his record-breaking 46th assist on August 6 against the Columbus Crew.

2005 also saw two original members of the team honored on the field at Spartan Stadium. The team in-



ducted John Doyle as the inaugural member of the San Jose Earthquakes Hall of Fame, while Troy Dayak was honored in a post-game ceremony after announcing his retirement. Doyle's number was unveiled in Spartan Stadium along with a Hall of Fame banner at halftime of the team's Aug. 27 game against the Los Angeles Galaxy. Doyle was the first signing in the team's history on Dec. 7, 1995 and had a standout career with San Jose. The team captain during every year of his tenure, Doyle appeared in 132 games during his five seasons in San Jose and scored 11 goals and notched 15 assists. He was named the 1996 MLS Defender of the Year and made the MLS Best XI that year as well. The Fremont, Calif. native also earned a spot in the MLS All-Star Game in 1996 and 1997. Since his retirement following the 2000 season, Doyle spent three years as the color commentator on Quakes broadcasts before serving as the assistant coach in 2004 and 2005.

Dayak announced his retirement from the Earthquakes after spending eight seasons with the team and overcoming two potential career-ending injuries. Dayak played for San Jose from 1996-1998 and then returned to the team in 2001 after overcoming a severe neck injury that required surgery and torn knee ligaments. The former Livermore High School standout was a major factor in the Quakes' 2001 MLS Cup Championship victory as he missed only one game in 2001 and was named the MLS Comeback Player of the Year, while also earning a spot on the MLS All-Star team. His overtime header against the Miami Fusion in the MLS Cup Playoff Semifinals sent San Jose to their first MLS Cup. Despite being hampered by injuries following that season, "The Beast" still helped San Jose win their second MLS Cup in 2003, while being one of MLS' elite teams in 2002, 2004 and 2005. He was honored on the Spartan Stadium field in a post-game ceremony on October 8, where he was presented a commemorative Earthquakes belt buckle.

On December 15, 2005, after the greatest regular season in team history with an 18-4-10 record and 64 points clinching the club's first Supporters' Shield, the Earthquakes were placed on hiatus by the League, with their players and coaching staff moving to Houston where they now play as the Houston Dynamo.

2006: The Rebirth Begins

On May 24, Lew Wolff, principal owner of the Oakland Athletics, purchased an exclusive option to acquire

an MLS team and bring professional soccer back to the Bay Area. David Alioto was named the Executive Vice President of the San Jose Earthquakes.

2007: The Earthquakes Return

On July 18, Lew Wolff activated an option for the rights to the San Jose Earthquakes and Major League Soccer granted them a new expansion team. The club started to take shape on Oct. 3, when John Doyle was named General Manager of Soccer Operations. On the same day, the Earthquakes unveiled their new uniforms and team logo. On Oct. 26 the Earthquakes announced Buck Shaw Stadium in Santa Clara as their temporary venue for the 2008, 2009 and 2010 seasons with some games being played at McAfee Coliseum in Oakland.

One of the biggest announcements for the new expansion team came on Nov. 5 when the Earthquakes named Frank Yallop their head coach. With Yallop aboard the Earthquakes selected ten players in the MLS Expansion Draft, including former Earthquakes defender Ryan Cochrane of the Houston Dynamo. Also selected were Clarence Goodson (FC Dallas), Ned Grabavoy (Columbus Crew), James Riley (New England Revolution), Joseph Vide (New York Red Bulls), Ivan Guerrero (Chicago Fire), Brian Carroll (D.C. United), Jason Hernandez (Chivas USA), Gavin Ginton (LA Galaxy) and Chris Pozniak (Toronto FC). A few days later, the Earthquakes acquired forward Kei Kamara from the Columbus Crew and goalkeeper Preston Burpo from Chivas USA. The Earthquakes traded defender Brian Carroll to the Crew for Kamara and traded the club's fourth-round pick in the 2008 MLS Super Draft to Chivas USA in exchange for Burpo.

On Nov. 29, the Earthquakes brought another familiar face to the club by naming Ian Russell the assistant coach.

Toward the end of the year, the Earthquakes had open tryouts in seven cities across Northern California looking for local talent. The tryout tour began on Nov. 3 and finished on Sunday, Dec. 2 with over 600 players trying out. The tour visited Sacramento, Santa Rosa, San Francisco, Salinas, Oakland, Walnut Creek and Hayward. There were 33 players selected from the tryout tour that participated in the Earthquakes invitation-only combine. These players competed with other players from United Soccer League and from other top colleges in the country for a spot on the Quakes reserve division team.

2008: Best Expansion Team of the Decade

The San Jose Earthquakes started 2008 with a flurry of activity. On Jan. 10, they acquired goalkeeper Joe Cannon from the Los Angeles Galaxy. Soon after the team acquired defender Nick Garcia from the Kansas City Wizards in exchange for the No. 1 overall pick in the 2008 MLS SuperDraft and then selected Shea Salinas with the 15th overall pick in the MLS SuperDraft.

The Quakes reported for preseason at the beginning of February and officially made their on-field return to the Bay Area on February 13, in a 1-0 preseason loss to the old version of themselves, the Houston Dynamo, at PAL Stadium in San Jose. Another familiar face returned to San Jose soon after, as the Earthquakes

acquired midfielder Ramiro Corrales from the Houston Dynamo in exchange for allocation money.

On Feb. 26, the Earthquakes named former Quakes midfielder Ronnie Ekelund the technical advisor. A day later, the team acquired midfielder Ronnie O'Brien from Toronto FC in exchange for a first round draft pick in the 2009 MLS SuperDraft and allocation money.

The Quakes kept on building the team and on March 13, Jason Batty was named the goalkeeper coach. At the end of the month, the team signed Shea Salinas and acquired forward John Cunliffe. Prior to the opener against the Los Angeles Galaxy on April 3, the Earthquakes signed Eric Denton, Jay Ayres, Matt Hatzke, Adam Smarte, Jamil Roberts and Ryan Johnson.

The team opened its home schedule in front of over 20,000 fans at the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum against the Chicago Fire on April 12. The Quakes won their first match on April 19 with a 2-0 road victory over the Colorado Rapids. Another milestone came on May 3 when the team opened its new home on the campus of Santa Clara University, Buck Shaw Stadium. The Quakes played to a 0-0 draw in front of a sold-out crowd of 10,515.

While the Quakes were back on the field, the team was not able to find its rhythm until midseason. To help bolster the attack, John Doyle and Frank Yallop signed English forward Darren Huckerby, MLS veteran forward Scott Sealy, former AS Roma midfielder Francisco Lima and acquired former Earthquakes player midfielder/forward Arturo Alvarez. The new signings paid off and the team posted a nine-game unbeaten streak from July 12-Sept. 27, the longest unbeaten streak in the league in 2008 and the second longest ever by an expansion team. That run got the Quakes back into the thick of the playoff race, but they were not able to climb all the way back up the standings and were eliminated from the playoff chase on the penultimate weekend of the

season.

During the 2008 season, the team earned a number of memorable victories, including a 2-1 victory over the Houston Dynamo on May 22 at Buck Shaw Stadium, a last-minute 3-2 win over the Los Angeles Galaxy at Oakland Alameda County Coliseum, a 4-0 win over the New England Revolution and a 2-0 road win over the eventual MLS Cup Champion Columbus Crew. The Quakes capped the season with a 2-0 win over Toronto FC on Oct. 25. The team also set a single-game attendance record on June 14 against the Los Angeles Galaxy, as 39,728 fans packed into Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum.

The Quakes saw standout performances from a number of players, including goalkeeper Joe Cannon and midfielder Darren Huckerby. Cannon led the league in saves and posted nine shutouts on the year and was also named the team's U.S. Soccer Foundation Humanitarian of the Year. Huckerby scored six goals and notched four assists in just 14 games to be named the MLS player of the month for September, MLS Newcomer of the Year and the Earthquakes Most Valuable Player. Jason Hernandez earned the team's Defensive Player of the Year award and a call-up into US national team camp the following January for his excellent play on the backline.

The Earthquakes made a very successful return to MLS as the top expansion team of the last decade. Under the guidance of head coach Frank Yallop, the Quakes had more wins (8), points (33) and goals (32) and allowed fewer goals (38) than any expansion team since 1998.

2009: Quakes Shake Things Up

The 2009 campaign was one filled with injury and frustration for the Earthquakes. They finished 7-14-9 with 30 points under head coach Frank Yallop. The season began with new hope, coming off of a strong finish to the 2008 season that included a nine game unbeaten streak. Unfortunately, Yallop and the team had to deal with key injuries to Jason Hernandez and Darren Huckerby. This, along with other injuries spread throughout the starting eleven and led to a lot of shuffling and player movement. All in all, eight players from the roster on opening day were gone by the middle of the season. Players like Andre Luiz, Ramon Sanchez, Cornell Glen, Chris Wondolowski, Bobby Burling, Aaron Pitchkolan and Antonio Ribeiro were brought in mid-season to help bolster the team and set them up for a good run in the future. Once all of these components were together, along with mainstays like Ryan Johnson, Arturo Alvarez and Joe Cannon, the team began to play better and finished the year on a nice run.

Ryan Johnson led the team with a breakout season in 2009, scoring a career-high 11 goals. Defender Chris Leitch, who was acquired early in the year from New York Red Bulls, led the team in assists with a career-high seven. Brandon McDonald broke through into a starting central back role during the middle of the season and solidified himself as a key part of the Quakes defense. He scored his first goal for San Jose, and just the second of his career, in a thrilling 2-2 draw in Los Angeles against Chivas USA late in the year.

McDonald was rewarded with a call-up into US national team camp in January.

Another mid-season addition, forward Chris Wondolowski, provided some highlights in the Quakes good form at the conclusion of the season. He scored a stoppage-time winner at home against Kansas City on Aug. 22 and added the final goal in a 4-0 thrashing of Seattle Sounders FC on Aug. 8. Arturo Alvarez added flair to the Quakes attack, scoring five goals in the 2009 season. His goal against Real Salt Lake on May 30 was nominated and finished in the top 10 for MLS Goal of the Year. 2009 also marked a significant point in Alvarez's career, as he was selected for the El Salvador national team for the first time. He appeared in five World Cup Qualifiers for his country, along with teammate and Salvadoran captain Ramon Sanchez, who appeared in all of the qualifiers.

Two Earthquakes hit big milestones during the season, as goalkeeper Joe Cannon became the franchise leader in starts (159) and minutes played (14,481) and captain Ramiro Corrales became the franchise leader in appearances with 167, while also appearing in his 200th MLS game. Midfielder Darren Huckerby, who provided such a lift to the Earthquakes after his arrival in 2008, called an end to his career towards the end of the season after undergoing season-ending surgery. Huckerby was honored before the game on Oct. 3 in a 1-0 win over New York Red Bulls.

San Jose had quite a few memorable wins in 2009: knocking off Houston 3-2 at home for their first win of the year on March 28, a big 2-1 win over eventual MLS Cup Champion Real Salt Lake on May 30, a 2-1 win over eventual Western Conference Champion Los Angeles Galaxy in which Ryan Johnson scored the game-winner, a 4-0 domination of Seattle Sounders FC on Aug. 2, the 1-0 stoppage-time win over Kansas City on Aug. 22 and a 2-1 come-from-behind victory over D.C. United on the road on Sept. 27, which marked



the first road win of the year and the first-come-from-behind win since the team came back in 2008.

2010: Quakes Return to Postseason

The 2010 season will be remembered for two things: San Jose's return to the MLS Cup Playoffs and the emergence of Chris Wondolowski.

The year began with a preseason camp that included a 10-day trip to train at the grounds of club partner Tottenham Hotspur. The Earthquakes played three friendlies during the time abroad, winning games against the Tottenham Hotspur (1-0) and West Ham United (2-0) reserves as well as the Colorado Rapids (1-0).

Building on a strong preseason, the Earthquakes jumped out to a 5-2-1 start over its first eight games. During that stretch, Wondolowski scored four goals in four games, a precursor to what would become an historic body of work.

In July, Tottenham Hotspur traveled to San Jose to train and play an exhibition against the Earthquakes. Two days before the match, over 1,200 fans attended a Spurs open practice session with players like Gareth Bale, Luka Modric and Robbie Keane on the pitch. On Saturday, July 17, a record crowd of 10,712 packed into Buck Shaw Stadium with more tuned in on ESPN2 to watch a spirited 0-0 draw.

One month later, the Earthquakes eclipsed the attendance record set against Tottenham Hotspur with 10,799 on hand for a thrilling 1-0 win against Southern California rival the Los Angeles Galaxy. As was the case in nine of San Jose's 13 wins during the 2010 campaign, it was Wondolowski tallying the decisive blow.

San Jose's win against the Galaxy was part of a 5-1-1 stretch that put the squad on the brink of clinching its first MSL Cup Playoff berth since returning to the league in 2008. On October 9, after two goals from Wondolowski gave the Earthquakes a 2-0 road win against DC United, the club officially sealed its spot in the postseason.

With a playoff spot secured, a different race heated up: Wondolowski's chase for the Golden Boot. With Edson Buddle in command heading into the final week of the season, San Jose's local product needed a small miracle to overtake the lead. That miraculous moment came on October 20 with Wondolowski coming off the bench to record a hat trick, leveling the race at 17 goals apiece. The drama continued as Wondolowski scored in San Jose's 4-1 loss to Kansas City on Saturday, October 23 and Buddle yet to play. The next day, Buddle failed to find the net, sewing up Wondolowski's comeback to win the 2010 MLS Budweiser Golden Boot.

From Sept. 15 to Oct. 23, Wondolowski scored all 10 of the Earthquakes goals, setting the all-time MLS record for the most consecutive goals scored by one player. Also, the Danville, Calif. native accounted for 52.9 percent (18 of 34) of the Earthquakes' goals in the 2010 season, the second highest such percentage all-time in MLS history. Also of note, Wondolowski posted the third-highest scoring percentage in MLS history, scoring 25 goals on 111 shots (22.5%).

For his efforts, Wondolowski was named a finalist for the Volkswagen MVP along with Buddle and even-

tual winner David Ferreira of FC Dallas.

Regular-season accolades aside, the Earthquakes sought to make an impact in the MLS Cup Playoffs after drawing the star-laden New York Red Bulls in the Eastern Conference Semifinal. A Red Bulls squad bolstered by Thierry Henry, Rafael Márquez and Juan Pablo Ángel took a 1-0 lead in the aggregate at Buck Shaw Stadium. However, on the strength of a brace by 2010 MLS Comeback Player of the Year Bobby Convey and a series-clinching goal by Wondolowski, the Earthquakes advanced to the Eastern Conference Championship.

One week later, the Earthquakes bowed out of the MLS Cup Playoffs in frigid conditions against the Colorado Rapids at Dick's Sporting Goods Park. Kosuke Kimura scored the lone goal for a squad that would go on to defeat FC Dallas, 2-1, to win the MLS Cup Championship.

2011: Wondo Solidifies Spot Among MLS Elite

The 2011 season started on a positive note with reigning Golden Boot winner Chris Wondolowski earning his first call-up to the U.S. National Team. He played his first match for the Red, White and Blue in January before returning to training camp. The rest of the season did not play out in storybook fashion as the Quakes were shut out of the playoffs, but not before providing a number of great thrills throughout the year.

The majority of the 2010 team that reached the Eastern Conference Semifinals returned for 2011 season with a few new additions that would make a big impact on the squad. Forward Steven Lenhart arrived in a draft day trade from the Columbus Crew and Simon Dawkins was signed on loan from partner club Tottenham Hotspur. Lenhart and Dawkins went on to combine for 11 goals and five assists for San Jose during the year.

Opening Day against Real Salt Lake will not likely be a game that is forgotten soon. RSL won the match 1-0, but the game on the field was not what will stick in the minds of the people in attendance. A heavy rain started falling an hour before kickoff and did not let up until after the falling whistle had blown. Combined with gusts of wind and low temperatures, the game will forever be known as the "Great Deluge of 2011".

After a slow start to the season, the Quakes righted the ship and had a 5-4-4 record after 13 games and were one of the highest scoring teams in the league. That start was capped off by Lenhart becoming just the fourth player in team history to record a hat trick with three goals against D.C. United on June 11. However, injuries, national team call-ups and scoring struggles conspired to lead to a 13-game winless stretch that knocked the team out of playoff contention.

Despite the winless streak, the team did have a number of highlights in 2011. On July 2, the Quakes hosted the New York Red Bulls at Stanford Stadium in front of a crowd of 41,028, the largest single-game crowd in team history. Just 10 days later, backup goalkeeper David Bingham earned world-wide notoriety when his 90-yard kick ended up in the back of West Bromwich Albion's net in an international exhibition. The goal generated nearly four million views on YouTube.

San Jose's No. 1 goalkeeper, Jon Busch, put together a great season of his own, starting 33 of 34 matches and leading MLS in saves with 113.

The run-in to the end of the season also saw the race for the Golden Boot heat up again. After capturing the Golden Boot in 2010 with a strong finish, Wondolowski scored in the Quakes' final five matches to finish the year with 16 goals, tying him for tops in the league. Despite losing the title to Dwayne De Rosario

by virtue of a tiebreaker, the Danville native became just the third player in league history to lead the league in goals one year and tie for the league lead the following year. He also passed former Quake Landon Donovan for second all-time in goals in club history with 37. Ronald Cerritos leads the club with 61 career goals.

Despite missing the MLS Cup Playoffs, the Earthquakes set a new club record by closing the season with six consecutive sellouts.



HISTORY OF THE EARTHQUAKES NAME

When the San Jose Major League Soccer club decided to change its name and look in 1999, it went into the past to do so. Reaching back to a previously successful soccer team in the area, the Clash became the Earthquakes. The previous incarnation of the Earthquakes played in the North American Soccer League from 1974-1984, and then in the Western Soccer Alliance from 1985-88. Those Earthquakes teams called Spartan Stadium home. The name Earthquakes originally came from a newspaper contest in the San Jose Mercury News, in which fans were encouraged to send in suggestions for the name of the soon-to-be formed San Jose franchise. The name Earthquakes was chosen by the team's management. Following are the results of those teams:

JOHN DOYLE - DEFENDER

INDUCTED ON AUG. 27, 2005

The San Jose Earthquakes inducted their first member into the Earthquakes Hall of Fame, former captain and current General Manager John Doyle, on Aug. 27, 2005, in front of his home fans at Spartan Stadium.

In 1995, Doyle was the first player selected by the San Jose Clash of Major League Soccer. He was chosen team captain for each of the five seasons he played for the organization. Doyle was honored as the MLS Defender of the Year in 1996, and was a member of the MLS West All-

Star Team in 1997. At the time of his retirement, he was the Earthquakes' all-time leading defensive goal-scorer and held the team record for games played.

A native of Fremont, Calif., Doyle graduated from Washington High School and was an All-American at the University of San Francisco.

RONALD CERRITOS - FORWARD

INDUCTED ON SEPT. 29, 2010

Former Earthquakes forward Ronald Cerritos became the second player inducted into the Earthquakes Hall of Fame on Sept. 29, 2010, at Buck Shaw Stadium.

Cerritos played in San Jose from 1997-2001 and returned to the club in 2005. He is the franchise's all-time leading scorer with 61 goals and 47 assists. Additionally, the Salvadoran international ranks fourth all-time in appearances (148), minutes played (12,382) and games started (142). Cerritos helped lead San Jose to its first-ever MLS Cup championship in 2001.

Cerritos earned 66 caps for the El Salvador National Team from 1995-2008, scoring eight goals.



TROY DAYAK - DEFENDER

INDUCTED ON OCT. 22, 2011

Troy Dayak played in San Jose as an original member of the Clash from 1996-98, and with the Earthquakes from 2001-05. During his tenure with the club, he scored nine goals and notched seven assists. Dayak ranks No. 7 all-time in minutes played (10,830) and games started (122), and No. 8 all-time in appearances (129).

The defender, better known to Earthquakes fans by his nickname, "The Beast," scored one of the most important goals in club history, sending the Quakes to their first MLS Cup in 2001 with a golden goal in Game 3 of the MLS Cup Playoff semifinals against the Miami Fusion. He earned MLS Comeback Player of the Year honors that year after playing in 25 games and scoring two goals while helping the team allow a club-record-low 29 goals.

Dayak continued to battle injuries throughout the rest of his career, but still helped San Jose win a second MLS Cup championship in 2003.

June 15, 1994: San Jose becomes a charter member of Major League Soccer, along with Boston, Columbus (Ohio), Los Angeles, New Jersey, New York and Washington D.C. The New Jersey and New York entries later were merged. In November 1994, Chicago and Tampa were added to the league.

June 6, 1995: The 10-team alignment for MLS' first season is completed, as Denver and Kansas City are added to the league and Dallas replaces Chicago. San Jose is assigned to the Western Conference, along with Dallas, Denver, Kansas City and Los Angeles.

August 25, 1995: Veteran Bay Area soccer promoter Peter Bridgwater, former owner and general manager of the NASL San Jose Earthquakes and Executive Director for the San Francisco venue of World Cup 1994, is named President and General Manager of the San Jose club.

October 17, 1995: The San Jose team is nicknamed the "Clash," and the team's logos and uniforms are unveiled.

December 7, 1995: Laurie Calloway is named head coach of the Clash. Francisco Matturano Ruiz is named assistant coach. U.S. World Cup veteran John Doyle and Nigerian World Cup veteran Michael Emenalo are introduced as the Clash's first players.

January 23, 1996: U.S. National Team star Eric Wynalda, the United States' all-time leading scorer in international play, is allocated to the Clash by MLS.

BEDARD "SPIRIT OF THE GAME" AWARD



In 2008, Soccer Silicon Valley Community Foundation and the San Jose Earthquakes along with the Bedard Family established the Andrew Bedard Memorial "Spirit of the Game" Award. The award is given at the end of each MLS season to an Earthquakes player who takes a prominent, active role in the community while exemplifying the positive attitude of the late Andrew Bedard.

The Earthquakes aim to be champions not only on the pitch, but off. Off the field, the club does its best to make fans proud by their service to the community, transcending what folks have become accustomed to with typical American sports stars. The club takes an active role in getting to know fans, coaching kids around the Bay Area, and supporting important causes such as the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society and Wounded Warrior Project with fundraisers. Our fans help foster and maintain that spirit among the players with this award.

The award is named for Andrew Bedard, a young Earthquakes fan who passed away at age 8 in 2004 and who was a fan of former Earthquakes goalkeeper Pat Onstad. Andrew was one of those happy children who lined the fence for autographs, but mostly



just wanted to see Onstad, who, along with defenders Craig Waibel and Jeff Agoos, and other players and their wives, stepped up to support Andrew's family after his sudden death from an aneurysm.

Andrew's favorite position was in goal. Even though he was a very young player, he seemed to understand the position and kept his heart up during a trying season. During the fall 2003 season, he was on a team that never won a game and didn't even score until most of the games had been played. Yet he worked very hard to keep the other teams from scoring. After a tough game, his dad asked him how he felt. Andrew's reply was, "I feel great! It doesn't matter what the score is. If you have a great attitude, you are a winner."

Andrew embodied the true "Spirit of the Game" with his attitude. It is this attribute of soccer which extends beyond the competition on the pitch that we want to recognize in the "Spirit of the Game" award bestowed by the fans in Andrew's name.

The Andrew Bedard Memorial Spirit of the Game Award is presented every year at SSVCF's Annual Dinner.

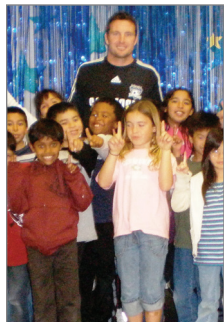

Dating back to 1914, the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup is the oldest soccer cup competition in the United States, and is among the oldest in the world. Open to all affiliated amateur and professional teams in the U.S., the annual Open Cup is a 98-year-old single-elimination tournament based on similar competitions played across the world concurrent with domestic league action. In 1999, the US Open Cup was renamed the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup to honor the long-time soccer supporter and pioneer.

San Jose has participated in the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup on eight occasions (1997, 1998, 2000-05), and has reached the quarterfinals seven times. The team reached the semifinals for the first time in team history in 2004, but fell 1-0 to the Kansas City Wizards on the road.

Since the team's inception in 1996, San Jose has played against a number of international foes, facing UNAM Pumas (Mexico), Bayer Leverkusen (Germany) and Sichuan Quan Xing (China) among others in exhibition matches both at home and on the road. The Quakes have a 5-8-5 record in exhibitions against international foes. In 2002, the Earthquakes took part in their first international competition, the 2002 CONCACAF Champions Cup. The Quakes qualified for the tournament by winning the 2001 MLS Cup and reached the quarterfinals of the competition before falling to Pachuca CF (Mexico) 3-1 on aggregate.

2005 marked the first season since 2001 that the Quakes did not participate in the Champions Cup as they competed from 2002-2004 in the prestigious tournament. In 2003, the team added another international tournament to its resume, the La Manga Cup. The La Manga Cup is played every year in La Manga in the Murcia region of Spain and has featured European powers like Rosenborg Trondheim and Dynamo Kiev.

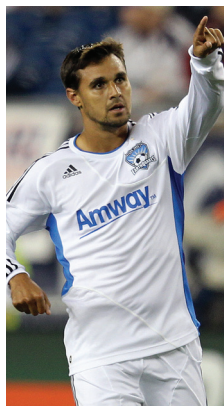

MLS RULES OF COMPETITION

STRUCTURE: The 19 MLS teams are divided into two conferences:

Eastern Conference – Chicago Fire, Columbus Crew, D.C. United, Houston Dynamo, Sporting Kansas City, Montreal Impact, New England Revolution, New York Red Bulls, Philadelphia Union, Toronto FC.

Western Conference – Chivas USA, Colorado Rapids, FC Dallas, LA Galaxy, Portland Timbers, Real Salt Lake, San Jose Earthquakes, Seattle Sounders FC, Vancouver Whitecaps FC.

SCHEDULE: Each team plays a 34-game regular season schedule; 17 home games, 17 away games.

Western Conference – 24 in-conference + 10 out-of-conference games:

- Western Conference teams will play each West opponent three times (24 games):
 - o West teams will play four conference opponents twice at home and once away
 - o They will play the other four conference opponents once at home and twice away.
 - o The home and away games will be reversed in 2013.
- Western Conference teams will play each East opponent once each (10 games):
 - o Five of these will be at home and five will be away.
 - o The East opponents each team faces at home and away will be reversed in 2013.

Eastern Conference – 25 in-conference + 9 out-of-conference games:

- Eastern Conference teams will play 25 games against other East teams:
 - o East teams will play seven conference opponents three times each (21 games) and
 - o Two conference opponents twice each (four games).
- Eastern Conference teams will play each West opponent once each (9 games):
 - o Some will play four at home and five away while others will play five at home and four away.
 - o The West opponents each team faces at home and away will be reversed in 2013.

POINT SYSTEM: Teams will receive three points for a win, one point for a tie and zero points for a loss.

REFEREES: All referees in MLS are either USSF (United States Soccer Federation) or CSA (Canadian Soccer Association) National Referees. All MLS games played in the US will be assigned by USSF and all games played in Canada will be assigned by CSA.

GAME CLOCK: The official game time for all Major League Soccer games will be managed on the field by the referee. If necessary, the referee may also allot extra time (a.k.a. "stoppage time") at the end of each period (first half, second half, and if applicable, first overtime period and second overtime period during playoff matches) to allow for injuries, time-wasting or other disturbances.

The stadium clock will display the time from 0:00 to 45:00 and from 45:00 to 90:00 (plus stoppage time where applicable in each half). For statistical purposes, the minutes for goals, substitutions, yellow cards, etc., will be listed from the first minute until the 90th minute. A goal scored at 15 minutes 10 seconds will be listed as having been scored in the 16th minute. Events occurring during stoppage time will follow the international norm by being demarcated with a "+" sign and the extra minutes. For example, a goal scored three minutes into first half stoppage time will be officially identified as happening at "48+."

GAME DAY ROSTERS: Each team can nominate 18 players for a game day roster. Teams are allowed three substitutions per game.

CAUTIONS AND SUSPENSIONS: A player will be suspended for one game upon receiving his fifth yellow card – regardless of the nature of the infraction that resulted in his being awarded a yellow card. A second suspension of one game would result after the awarding of an additional three cards, as would a third suspension after the awarding of card number eleven. With the "Good Behavior" incentive, it is possible for a player to have a caution expunged. If a player goes three games without receiving a yellow card, after an initial warning, the player will have one yellow card expunged. A player may take advantage of the "Good Behavior" incentive only once throughout the season.

MLS CUP PLAYOFFS: FORMAT

WHO QUALIFIES: Ten teams, the top five in points from each conference at the end of the regular season, qualify for the 2012 MLS Cup Playoffs.

The fourth and fifth place teams in each conference will play a single knockout game, the winner of which will advance to the Conference Semifinals and face the first place team in the conference.

The four Conference Semifinals will be decided by two-game aggregate series, with the lower seed hosting the first leg and the higher seed hosting the second leg. If the aggregate score is tied after 180 minutes of play, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by penalty kicks, if necessary.

The two Conference Championships will be decided by a two-game aggregate series, with the lower seed hosting the first leg and the higher seed hosting the second leg. If the aggregate score is tied after 180 minutes of play, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by penalty kicks, if necessary.

MLS Cup will be a single championship match hosted by the higher seed. If the score is tied after 90 minutes of play, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by penalty kicks, if necessary.

TEAM-STANDINGS TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

The team awarded the highest position in the MLS standings will be the team with the greatest number of points (three points for a win, one point for a tie, zero points for a loss). In the event that two teams finish the regular season with an equal number of points, the following system will be used to break the tie:

- 1) The highest position shall be awarded to the team with the better win/loss record in current regular season games against all other teams equal in points. (head-to-head)
- 2) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team with the greater goal difference against all other teams during the regular season. (goal differential)
- 3) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team scoring the greatest number of total goals against all other teams during the regular season. (total goals)
- 4) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played on the road by each team against all other teams during the regular season. (road 1-3)
- 5) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played at home by each team against all other teams during the regular season. (home 1-3)
- 6) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team with the fewest team disciplinary points in the League Fair Play table during the regular season.
- 7) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position in the standings shall be determined by coin toss.

8) The first tiebreaker in a three-way tie is also head-to-head, but it is determined via points-per-game versus the other two teams. If two teams are tied in points-per-game head-to-head, the next tie breaker is goal difference.

NOTE: If two teams remain tied after another teams with the same number of points advances during any step, the tie breaker reverts to step 1 of the two-team format.

PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS

I. MLS ROSTER COMPOSITION

A Major League Soccer club's first team roster is comprised of up to 30 players. All 30 players are eligible for selection to each 18-player game-day squad during the regular season and playoffs.

Salary & Budget:

- Players occupying roster spots 1-20 count against the club's 2012 salary budget of \$2,810,000, and are referred to collectively as the club's Salary Budget Players.
 - o Roster spots 19 and 20 are not required to be filled, and teams may spread their salary budget across only 18 Salary Budget Players. A minimum salary budget charge will be imputed against a team's salary budget for each unfilled senior roster slot below 18.
 - o The maximum budget charge for a single player is \$350,000.*
 - o A Designated Player over the age of 23 counts as \$350,000 against the club's salary budget, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$175,000.
 - o A Designated Player 20 years old or younger** (referred to as Young Designated Players or Young DPs) to counts as \$150,000 against the club's salary budget
 - o A Designated Player 21-23 years old*** counts as \$200,000 against the club's salary budget.
 - o The budget charge for the midseason signing of a Young DP is \$150,000 and this amount cannot be lowered with allocation funds.
 - o Clubs will not have to buy the third DP roster slot to accommodate a Young Designated Player whereas clubs are normally required to buy that slot for a one-time fee of \$250,000.
 - o Clubs are responsible for all amounts above the budget charge for all Designated Players.

* See section entitled Allocation Money below, under Player Acquisition Mechanisms, for details on buying down a player's budget charge.

** Age of player is determined by year (not date) of birth.

- Players occupying roster spots 21-30 do not count against the club's salary budget, and are referred to collectively as the club's Off-Budget Players (maximum of 10 per team).
 - o All Generation adidas players are Off-Budget players.
 - o Players occupying roster spots 1-24 will earn at least \$44,000 in 2012.
 - o Players occupying roster spots 25-30 will earn at least \$33,750 in 2012.
 - o Clubs may elect to leave up to two of these roster spots (25-30) vacant and use \$35,000 for each empty spot as allocation money.
 - o Clubs may sign up to two Homegrown Players contracts above the minimum salary and similar to Generation adidas player contract amounts.

Age Designations:

- Any player making \$33,750 must be under the age 25 (does not turn 25 or older in 2012).

Domestic/International:

- In 2012, a total of 152 international slots are divided among the 19 clubs. Each club began with eight international slots, which are tradable. There is no limit on the number of international slots on each club's roster.
- o The remaining roster slots must belong to domestic players. For clubs based in the United States, a domestic player is either a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident (green card holder) or the holder of other special status (e.g., refugee or asylum status).

- The three MLS clubs based in Canada – Montreal Impact, Toronto FC and Vancouver Whitecaps FC – began with eight international slots, but their domestic slots may be filled with either Canadian or U.S. domestic players.
 - o MLS clubs based in Canada are required to have a minimum of 3 Canadian domestic players on their rosters.
 - o Players with the legal right to work in Canada are considered Canadian domestic players (i.e., Canadian citizen, permanent resident, part of a protected class).

NOTE: The terms Homegrown and Generation adidas are used to describe mechanisms by which players are acquired. They are not roster designations. All players' roster slots are determined by their compensation and/or age as outlined above.

II. PLAYER ACQUISITION MECHANISMS

MLS teams may acquire players and add them to their rosters via the following mechanisms:

(A) ALLOCATION RANKING

The allocation ranking is the mechanism used to determine which MLS club has first priority to acquire a U.S. National Team player who signs with MLS after playing abroad, or a former MLS player who returns to the League after having gone to a club abroad for a transfer fee. The allocation rankings may also be used in the event two or more clubs file a request for the same player on the same day when the discovery period opens in December. The allocations will be ranked in reverse order of finish for the 2011 season, taking playoff performance into account.

Once the club uses its allocation ranking to acquire a player, it drops to the bottom of the list. A ranking can be traded, provided that part of the compensation received in return is the other club's ranking. At all times, each club is assigned one ranking. The rankings reset at the end of each MLS League season.

Allocation Money

Allocation money is a resource available to clubs in addition to their respective salary budgets.

A club may receive allocation money for:

- (1) failure to qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs;
- (2) the transfer of a player to a club outside of MLS for value;
- (3) expansion status;
- (4) qualification for the CONCACAF Champions League;
- (5) trading in up to two Off-Budget roster spots;
- (6) funds from purchased third designated player roster spots.

Each year the MLS Competition Committee determines the allocation amount to be made available to each club. Allocation money can be traded by clubs. Allocation money does not count against a club's salary budget and can be used:

- To sign players new to MLS (that is, a player who did not play in MLS during the previous season).
- To re-sign an existing MLS player, subject to League approval.
- To "buy-down" a player's salary budget charge below the League maximum of \$350,000.
- In connection with the exercise of an option to purchase a player's rights or the extension of a player's contract for the second year provided the player was new to MLS in the immediately prior year.

NOTE: To protect the interests of MLS and its clubs during discussions with prospective players or clubs in other leagues, amounts of allocation money held by each club will not be shared publicly.

(B) DESIGNATED PLAYER

The Designated Player Rule allows clubs to acquire up to three players whose salaries exceed their budget charges, with the club bearing financial responsibility for the amount of compensation above each player's budget charge. DP slots may be used to acquire players new to MLS or to retain current MLS players, subject to League approval.

In 2012, a Designated Player over the age of 23** will carry a salary budget charge of \$350,000, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$175,000.

A Designated Player 20 years old or younger** counts as \$150,000 against the club's salary budget and a Designated Player 21-23 years old counts as \$200,000 against the club's salary budget.

Clubs have the option of "buying down" the budget charge of a Designated Player with allocation money. The reduced charge may not be less than \$150,000.

The budget charge for the midseason signing of a young Designated Player (23 years old and younger) is \$150,000 and this amount cannot be lowered with allocation funds.

Each club has two Designated Player slots and clubs are allowed to "purchase" a third Designated Player slot for a one-time fee of \$250,000 that will be dispersed in the form of allocation money to all clubs that do not have three Designated Players. Clubs will not have to buy the third DP roster slot to accommodate Designated Players 23 years old and younger.

Designated Player slots are not tradable.

** Age of player is determined by year (not date) of birth.

(C) SUPERDRAFT

The 2012 MLS SuperDraft, held Jan. 12 in Kansas City, Mo., consisted of two rounds of 19 picks for a total of 38 player selections. A supplemental draft was held Jan. 17 via teleconference and consisted of four rounds of 19 picks.

The majority of draft prospects are NCAA college seniors who have exhausted their college eligibility. Generation adidas players and non-collegiate international players are also eligible for selection in the SuperDraft and supplemental draft. Clubs may nominate players for the League's draft-eligible list, and only players from that list may be selected.

Generation adidas is a joint program between MLS and adidas that is dedicated to developing exceptional domestic talent in a professional environment. Each year, a handful of top domestic underclassmen and youth national team players are signed to the league and placed in the SuperDraft through this program. Generation adidas players also receive an educational stipend.

Draft Order: The Montreal Impact held the first overall selection in the 2012 MLS SuperDraft as expansion clubs are always given the top spot in the SuperDraft and the Supplemental Draft. The next eight selections went to clubs that did not qualify for the 2011 MLS Cup Playoffs beginning with the club with fewest regular season points (3 points per win, one point per tie). The remaining ten positions were ranked by fewest regular season points among the teams that were eliminated in the same round of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

Unless claimed on waivers, a player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign with the League, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to the player.

(D) TRADES

Players, SuperDraft and Supplemental draft picks, allocation money, allocation rankings, and international player slots may be exchanged in trades approved by the MLS League Office, provided all of the necessary rules regarding roster and salary budget compliance are met and the trade is completed during a valid trading period. No trades may occur after the Roster Freeze Deadline of September 15, 2012 at 5 p.m. ET.

(E) DISCOVERY SIGNINGS

Clubs may make discovery claims on players not yet under MLS contract who are not subject to the allocation ranking or lottery mechanisms.

Each club has the opportunity to make six discovery signings per season (expansion teams may make 10 discovery signings in their inaugural season). A club may have up to 10

discovery claims on unsigned players at any time and may remove or add players at any time. The last day for discovery player signings is September 15, 2012 – coinciding with the roster freeze date and trade deadline.

The six discovery signings can be used to fill senior roster spots only. If multiple clubs claim the same player using a discovery, the club that filed the claim first will have first rights to the player. Discovery claims expire following each season. If the League and player are unable to reach an agreement during the season, the club that first filed the discovery retains the right of first refusal in the event the player is later signed by the League.

NOTE: To protect interests of MLS clubs in scouting and negotiations with prospective players, the League office will not publicize the names of players on club discovery lists, nor specify if a discovery claim has been filed on a particular player.

(F) HOMEGROWN PLAYER SIGNINGS

A club may sign a player to his first professional contract without subjecting him to the MLS SuperDraft if the player has trained for at least one year in the club's youth development program and has met the League's Homegrown Player criteria. Players joining MLS through this mechanism are known as Homegrown Players.

There is no limit to the number of Homegrown Players a club may sign in a given year.

(G) RE-ENTRY PROCESS

The 2012 Re-Entry Process will commence after MLS Cup. The priority order for the Re-Entry Draft is reverse order of finish in 2012, taking into account playoff performance.

Available to all teams in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry Draft will be:

1. Players who are at least 23 years old and have a minimum of three years experience in MLS whose options were not exercised by their clubs (available at option salary for 2013).
2. Players who are at least 25 years old with a minimum of four years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them at their previous salary (available for at least their 2012 salary).
3. Players who are at least 30 years old with a minimum of eight years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them (available for at least 105% of their 2012 salary).

Players who are not selected in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry Draft will be made available in Stage 2. Clubs selecting players in Stage 2 will negotiate a new salary with the player.

Players who remain unselected after Stage 2 will be available to any MLS club on a first come, first serve basis.

(H) WAIVERS

A team may place a player on waivers at any time during the regular season at which point he is made available to all other teams. The waiver claiming period shall commence on the first business day after the League delivers notice to teams and shall expire at 5 p.m. EST on the second business day after the Waiver Period Commencement Date. The claiming period is 48 hours.

The Waiver Draft order is determined via points per game once all teams have played at least three MLS League games. If the waiver takes place prior to all teams playing in at least three League games, priority shall be granted based upon the prior year's performance, taking playoff performance first, with teams eliminated from playoff contention at the same stage separated according to their point totals through the end of the regular season. New expansion teams shall be at the bottom of the waiver order.

Once a team selects a player off waivers, that club is automatically moved to the bottom of the priority list for subsequent waiver selections in a given season, regardless of its points-per-game total. Players who may be placed on the MLS waiver wire are as follows:

2012 MLS RULES & REGULATIONS

- (i) A player waived by an MLS team in the current season;
- (ii) A player who completed his college eligibility within the past season, who was not made available in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft;

(iii) A player who has remaining college eligibility (and was not made available in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft), but the League at its discretion and after taking into account exceptional circumstances determines the player may be offered an MLS contract;

(iv) A player who has played in MLS previously where his last MLS team does not wish to exercise their right of first refusal, except in the case of returning U.S. National Team players as stated above.

(v) A player who was drafted in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft, and who after a trial with the club is not offered a contract by the first Monday of June.

(I) LOTTERY

Some players shall be assigned to MLS teams via the weighted Lottery process. Any team assigned a player through the lottery in any particular season shall not be assigned another lottery player that season unless and until all teams have received a lottery player or have agreed to waive their option to participate in a Lottery. The players made available through lotteries include:

- (i) Generation adidas players signed after the MLS SuperDraft;
- (ii) Draft eligible players to whom an MLS contract was offered but who failed to sign with the League prior to the Draft.

The weighted lottery takes into consideration each team's performance over its last 34 regular season games and the most recent postseason. The team with the worst record over its last 34 regular season games (dating back to previous season if necessary and taking playoff performance into account) will have the greatest probability of winning the lottery. Teams are not required to participate in a lottery. Players are assigned via the lottery system in order to prevent a player from potentially influencing his destination club with a strategic holdout.

(J) EXTREME HARDSHIP CALL-UPS

Teams may add players to their roster in cases of "extreme hardship" as follows: (1) a club with three goalkeepers on its 30-man roster, but has less than two available goalkeepers or (2) a team has less than 15 available players. Extreme hardship call-ups are made on a game-by-game basis.

(K) SEASON-ENDING INJURY REPLACEMENTS

(Season Ending Injury List)

A team with a player lost to a season-ending injury can place the player on the Season Ending Injury List and replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the season-ending injury list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). International player limits still apply at the time a season-ending replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

(L) SHORT-TERM INJURY REPLACEMENTS

(Disabled List)

A player who has a short-term injury can be placed on the Disabled List once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). The team will remain responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary on the salary budget. Note: the injured player will have to sit out a minimum of six MLS League matches before he can rejoin the team's roster.

International player limits still apply at the time a short-term replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

NOTE: No changes may be made to a team's active full roster during the period beginning on September 16, 2012 (day after Roster Freeze Date) through the day after MLS Cup. Nevertheless, a team may obtain players in accordance with

the extreme hardship rules and procedures to replace players who are injured or otherwise legitimately unavailable after the Roster Freeze Date. Any other replacements after the Roster Freeze Date may only be made in exceptional circumstances in the League's sole and absolute discretion.

(III.) METHODS OF RELEASING PLAYERS

(A) WAIVERS

Teams may waive players based on performance at any time during the MLS season. Players with guaranteed contracts will continue to have their salary budget charge applied to the team salary budget, subject to any settlement. Players on semi-guaranteed contracts can be waived prior to July 1 of any year and free up the corresponding budget space. If a player on a semi-guaranteed contract is waived after July 1, his salary budget charge will count against the team's salary budget and the team waiving the player will not receive a replacement except under the normal player acquisition mechanisms. Any settlement amount will be charged to the team's salary budget.

(B) TRANSFERS AND LOANS

An MLS player may be transferred or loaned at any time to a team outside the League (subject to that team's Federation's transfer window), subject to the consent of the player.

The registration windows – the dates between which MLS may request the transfer certificate of a player under contract in another country – are as follows:

January 21 – April 15 (Primary Window)

June 27 – July 27 (Secondary Window)

(C) CONTRACT EXPIRATION

When a player's contract expires, the player does not count against the roster or budget of the team in question. Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the rights to the player indefinitely following the expiration of a contract only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

(D) BUYOUT OF GUARANTEED CONTRACT

Teams may have the ability to buyout one guaranteed player as follows:

- A Team may buy out one (1) guaranteed player (including a DP's) contract during the off-season and free up the corresponding budget space. Such a buyout is at the particular MLS Team's own expense.
- A Team may not free up budget space with a buyout of a player's salary budget charge during the season. Such a buyout will be conducted by the League and count on a Club's budget in a manner consistent with current MLS guidelines.

(IV.) RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL

Right of first refusal grants one MLS club the first opportunity to add a player to its roster in the event that the player signs with MLS. Holding a right of first refusal applies only within MLS and does not indicate holding of the player's International Transfer Certificate.

OUT OF CONTRACT PLAYERS/OPTIONS NOT PICKED UP

Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the right of first refusal to the player indefinitely only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

DRAFTED BUT NOT SIGNED

A player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign, or who as of the first Monday in June is not offered a contract after a trial and clears waivers, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 immediately following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to sign the player.

PLAYER TRANSFERRED OUTSIDE MLS

If a team receives allocation money as a result of a player's transfer, the team does not retain a right of first refusal.

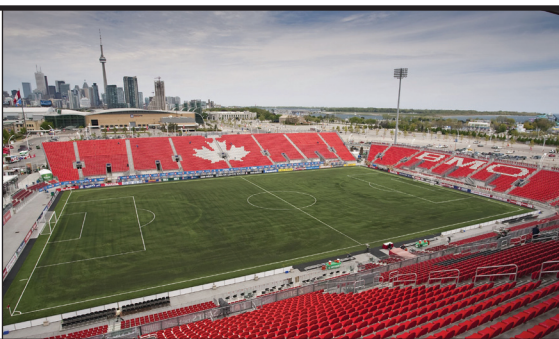

After a nearly four million-dollar renovation, Buck Shaw Stadium quickly became one of the most exciting venues for Major League Soccer in its first season in 2008. With an intimate setting and great sightlines, the fan experience at Buck Shaw ranks near the top of MLS.

The Earthquakes' first game at the stadium on the campus of Santa Clara University took place before a sold-out crowd of 10,515 on May 3, 2008, against FC Dallas. The team sold over 90 percent of the tickets for the 12 games played in the regular season at Buck Shaw in 2008.

In 2010, the Quakes set the attendance record twice in just over a month. On July 17, the Quakes tied Tottenham Hotspur, 0-0, in front of a record crowd of 10,712. Then on Aug. 21, the record was broken as 10,799 fans crowded into Buck Shaw to see San Jose defeat the LA Galaxy, 1-0.

Named after former Santa Clara football coach, Lawrence T. "Buck" Shaw, Buck Shaw Stadium has served as a showcase for some of Santa Clara University's proudest athletic achievements since the facility opened in 1962. Besides serving as the home for the Bronco soccer teams, the formerly 6,800-seat facility also housed Santa Clara baseball until 2005.

The stadium was dedicated on Oct. 6, 1962, prior to the football game between Santa Clara and Occidental, but was first used in the Broncos' loss to UC Davis on Sept. 22, 1962. Buck Shaw Stadium earned national attention in 1996, when it played host to the NCAA Women's College Cup. The two-day attendance of 17,600 set a record for the event. In 1994, the facility served as the practice site for the Brazilian national team during the World Cup competition. The U.S. National Team and the Japanese national team have also trained at Buck Shaw.
