Larry Tanenbaum was appointed Chairman of Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment in July 2003. He also serves as a Governor of the NBA for the Toronto Raptors, of the NHL for the Toronto Maple Leafs and of Major League Soccer for Toronto FC. Toronto FC is the latest addition to the MLSE sports family, and began play in spring 2007 at the new 21,000 seat BMO Field located on the Exhibition grounds.

Mr. Tanenbaum has shown a long-standing interest in the sports and entertainment industry and was the primary force in bringing an NBA franchise to Toronto. In the early 1990's, Tanenbaum attempted to move established NBA clubs to Toronto and then, as head of the Palestra Group, he initiated the expansion process that opened the eyes of the NBA to Canada. Although he was unsuccessful in being awarded the initial expansion franchise, Tanenbaum established himself in NBA circles and the city as a legitimate NBA home.

In 1996, Mr. Tanenbaum acquired an interest in the Toronto Maple Leafs of the National Hockey League and Maple Leaf Gardens, Limited (now Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment). With MLG's purchase of the Raptors and Air Canada Centre in February 1998, Tanenbaum fulfilled his goal of NBA and NHL ownership in Toronto under the same group.

In 2000, Mr. Tanenbaum was appointed to the Planning Committee of the NBA Board of Governors, a group that charts the course of future direction for the league. In addition to that prestigious posting, he also serves on an NBA task force comprised of players and Board members to further the league's community outreach efforts. Mr. Tanenbaum has recently been appointed to the Advisory/Finance Committee - the senior most committee of the NBA Board of Governors which considers and makes recommendations to the Board concerning a wide range of financial and league business matters.

Mr. Tanenbaum is currently Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Kilmer Van Nostrand Co. Limited (KVN), having served as President & CEO from 1968 to 2000. Under his direction, Kilmer developed into a multi-faceted construction operation with operating divisions and subsidiaries covering road building and paving, ready-mix concrete, aggregates, heavy construction, trucking and pipe manufacturing. Through December 2000, Kilmer's road building, paving and aggregates operations were conducted through Kilmer's wholly owned subsidiary, The Warren Paving & Materials Group Limited. Mr. Tanenbaum served as Chairman of Warren, which was Canada's largest asphalt paving company. Warren's activities also included major commercial aggregates operations, liquid asphalt trading and distribution and road maintenance. In December 2000, Warren was merged into Lafarge Corporation, North America's largest diversified supplier of construction materials. As a result of this merger, Kilmer became a significant shareholder in Lafarge NA, and Mr. Tanenbaum served on the Board and chaired its Finance Committee until the 2006 buyout by Lafarge SA. Kilmer today manages infrastructure investments through Kilmer Brownfield Equity Fund LP, Quickload CEF Inc. and Host Kilmer Service Centres Inc.

Kilmer also has significant investment in various sports-related entities, including Insight Sports Ltd, which is a leading sports media company involved in the creation, production and broadcasting, on all platforms, of sports and related lifestyle content. Insight Sports holds equity positions in several Canadian specialty television services including The NHL Network and Score Media and owns and/or operates the World Fishing Network (WFN) and Game TV. In 2003, through Plaza Gaming and Entertainment, Kilmer invested in the charitable gaming industry in Canada. Through its operations in Ontario and BC, Plaza's facilities raise over \$20 million per year for local municipal charities.

In addition, Mr. Tanenbaum serves as Chairman of Kilmer Capital Partners, a private equity investment fund, which provides equity capital to small to mid-market companies, and is dedicated to building leading companies in partnership with management. Kilmer Capital's portfolio includes Unisync Group Ltd., McGregor Industries Inc., Algorithm Pharma Inc., Coalition and Tribal Sportswear.

Mr. Tanenbaum served as National Revenue Chair of the Liberal Party of Canada during Prime Minister Paul Martin's term of office. He currently serves as a member of the Ontario Investment and Trade Advisory Council, and recently served on the Independent Fiscal Review Panel of the City of Toronto and the Mayor's Economic Competitiveness Advisory Committee of the City of Toronto.

Mr. Tanenbaum's involvement in Community Associations includes the following: Vice-Chairman, Board of Directors, Mount Sinai Hospital – a tertiary care teaching hospital associated with the University of Toronto; Co-Chairman of the Research Committee for the Samuel Lunenfeld Research Institute; Member, Board of Directors, NeuroScience Canada; Member, University Council, Cornell University; Member, Advisory Board, Baycrest Centre for Geriatric Care; Member, Dean's Advisory Council, Schulich School of Business, York University; Member, National Board of The Canadian Council of Christians & Jews; Member, Board of Directors, Miller Thomson Foundation; Founding Member, Canadian Council for Israel and Jewish Advocacy (CIJA), and Co-Chair, Tomorrow Campaign for UJA Federation.

In recognition of his contributions in the areas of philanthropy, business and volunteerism, Mr. Tanenbaum was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada on October 25, 2007. The Order of Canada is the centrepiece of Canada's honours system and represents its highest civilian award.

Mr. Tanenbaum has a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics from Cornell University (1968).

For Richard Peddie the concept of a winning organization at Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment (MLSE) reflects winning on the ice, on the court and on the pitch and being a winner off the playing field. Peddie's company vision is clear – WIN. Accordingly, the company's core values are: Excite Every Fan, Inspire Our People, be Dedicated To Our Teams, and be Leaders In Our Community.

When Peddie took the helm of the newly formed MLSE in February 1998, the organization consisted of two sports teams — the Toronto Maple Leafs and Toronto Raptors — and one venue (Air Canada Centre). Under his guidance and determination, Peddie has led MLSE to become a sports and entertainment powerhouse with four teams in three venues on three networks, while at the same time, making a measurable difference within the community and city.

In November 2010, Peddie announced his intention to retire from his position as President and CEO by December 31, 2011. Peddie who currently oversees all business operations related to the Maple Leafs, Raptors, Toronto FC, Marlies, the operations of Air Canada Centre, BMO Field and Ricoh Coliseum, the organization's three digital channels – Leafs TV, NBA TV Canada and GOLTV – and Maple Leaf Square, a sports and entertainment development adjacent to Air Canada Centre, will continue to do so until his retirement.

Peddie played an instrumental role in bringing professional soccer back to Toronto after multiple teams failed to establish longevity in the city by securing a Major League Soccer (MLS) team and supporting the development of Canada's first soccer specific stadium for the city. Pivotal to growing football in Canada, it was imperative to have a dedicated stadium that served the needs of professional and amateur teams, as well as the community. MLSE was brought in as a private sector partner and investor to help close the funding gap on a proposed stadium designated to be built on the Grounds of Exhibition Place by the three levels of government. After MLSE was granted a Major League Soccer franchise conditional on it having a dedicated soccer stadium for the team, the City of Toronto voted to build a new soccer-specific stadium in October 2005.

In May 2006, MLSE unveiled its newest sports team – Toronto FC. Toronto FC, the 13th team in Major League Soccer and the first outside the United States, has proven to be one of the most successful start-up teams in professional sports history. Later that year, Peddie and his executive team finalized an agreement with BMO Bank of Montreal for the stadium naming rights, which would be called BMO Field. Since opening play in April 2007 in the 20,000 seat BMO Field, Toronto FC has sold out every regular season home game and established league standards in several areas of business operation. It was runner-up to the Boston Red Sox as Sports Business Journal's Professional Sports Franchise of the Year in 2007. Major League Soccer calls Toronto FC "a model franchise" and attributes its present success and rapid expansion to Toronto FC's success, which has created the blueprint for new, expansion teams coming into the league.

BMO Field's success extends beyond the playing field by creating economic growth for Exhibition Place and the City of Toronto. Its high-profile events outside of the Toronto FC games such as the FIFA Under 20 World Cup, 2008 Major League Soccer All-Star Game and 2009 Real Madrid friendly match have generated an economic impact of \$158 million for Toronto. The stadium, which is operated by MLSE, has returned more than \$1.2 million in profits back to the City of Toronto to date. BMO Field continues to be a successful example of a private-public sector partnership between MLSE and the three levels of government.

Peddie, along with MLSE Executive Vice-President and Chief Operating Officer, Tom Anselmi and Bob Hunter, MLSE Executive Vice-President of Venues and Entertainment, continue to grow football's footprint. In 2010, they spearheaded an initiative that saw MLSE invest \$5.5 million to replace the Field Turf at BMO Field with a natural grass field and upgrade Allan Lamport Stadium with a winter bubble, making it a year-round community facility. This investment resulted in additional revenue for the City of Toronto and more than 2,500 hours available for community sport-use at BMO Field and Lamport Stadium. MLSE also plans to invest and build a new \$17.5 million Toronto FC Academy in the Greater Toronto Area that will further support the growth and development of football in Canada.

In 2001, MLSE became the first North American sports franchise to unveil separate television channels dedicated to coverage of its hockey and basketball entities. The stations have witnessed substantial growth in programming and viewership. In 2009, MLSE acquired GOLTV Canada, a network dedicated to soccer, to complement its existing broadcast portfolio and to support its aspiration to grow football in Canada. Today, MLSE is one of the largest producers of live sports broadcasts in Canada. Developing new innovative digital platforms to deliver Leafs, Raptors, Marlies and Toronto FC content to fans is one of MLSE's primary initiatives for the coming years.

Peddie was named president of the Raptors on November 22, 1996, but his first foray into professional team sports came in 1993 with the Palestra Group, a consortium of local businessmen seeking to bring an NBA expansion franchise to Toronto. The group, headed by Larry Tanenbaum, current Chairman of the Board of MLSE, was unsuccessful in securing the rights to the franchise but did establish Toronto as a viable entry into the NBA marketplace. It showcased the city's overwhelming capability to support a new franchise in uncharted waters. In 1998, when the merger of Maple Leaf Gardens Limited and Toronto Raptors created Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment Ltd. (MLSE), Peddie moved over to become the organization's president. Peddie was appointed to MLSE's Board of Directors in July 2003.

A native of Windsor, Ontario, Peddie graduated from the University of Windsor in 1970 and received an honorary doctorate from the institution in 2001. Peddie accepted an invitation to teach a bachelor of commerce course in strategic leadership to fourth year students at the University of Windsor in the fall of 2002. Peddie remains one of the University's most philanthropic and active donors.

ARON WINTER

TORONTO FC HEAD COACH & TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Aron Winter (pron. A-ron Vinter) was named Toronto FC's Head Coach and Technical Director on January 6, 2011. Born in Paramaribo, Suriname on March 1, 1967, he arrived in Toronto after a long and successful career in Europe.

Winter started and ended his playing career in Amsterdam with Ajax and returned to the storied Dutch club later in his career before announcing his retirement from playing in 2003. Winter made his first appearance for Ajax in 1986 at the age of 19 and during his time there he won the Dutch Eredivisie title (1990), two KNVB Cups (1987 & 1988), one UEFA Cup (1992), and one UEFA Cup Winners Cup (1987).

Following the 1991-1992 season, Winter signed for Lazio in Italy's Serie A. He spent four seasons there before moving to Inter Milan in 1996. With Inter, he made back-to-back UEFA Cup Final appearances and won the trophy in 1998. Winter returned to Ajax in 1999 and also spent time on loan with Sparta Rotterdam before bringing his playing career to a close at the end of the 2002-03 season.

Winter also had an accomplished career with the Netherlands national team. He made his first appearance for the Netherlands in 1987 and went on to earn 84 caps – a mark that currently has him sitting eighth all-time for appearances for the country. Winter scored six goals during his international career.

He was part of the Netherlands team that defeated the former Soviet Union 2-0 to win the European Championship in 1988. That was the first of four European Championships that he appeared in along with the 1992 tournament in Sweden, 1996 in England, and 2000 in Belgium and the Netherlands. Winter also played in three FIFA World Cups (1990 in Italy, United States in 1994, and France in 1998).

As a player, Winter was known for his strong work ethic in the centre of midfield. He played the majority of his time in a defensive midfield position but still tallied 73 goals over the course of a 400 game club career.

Winter's arrival marks the start of a new era for Toronto FC as the club looks to qualify for the MLS Playoffs for the first time. With a heavy influence from the Netherlands, home of Total Football, Winter looks to make his own mark in Canada by helping create a new on-pitch identity for Toronto FC with a style of play that will excite supporters.

Since arriving at the club in January, Winter has made known his desire to play a creative, attractive style of soccer using a 4-3-3 formation. Throughout preseason Winter has talked often about the need for his players to dictate the play, keeping the ball on the ground and playing the game in the opponents half of the pitch. His focus has been building a squad capable of playing the new style and bringing Toronto FC's 'All For One' philosophy to life both on and off the pitch.

Winter will look to establish a style of play that runs throughout the club, from the First Team down to the youngest Academy team. Having coached in the famed youth Academy at Ajax before moving to Toronto, Winter knows the value of developing young talent and ensuring the club's youth players learn Toronto's style of play from the earliest age possible. Toronto FC's first two homegrown players graduated from the Academy to sign professional contracts in 2010 and Winter wants many more to follow as the club invests heavily in developing young Canadian players.

PAUL MARINER

TORONTO FC DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Paul Mariner was named Toronto FC's Director of Player Development on January 6, 2011. Mariner was born on May 22, 1953 in Farnworth, England and brings international experience to Toronto FC along with knowledge of Major League Soccer.

He returns to North America where he previously worked as Assistant Coach at Harvard University, and then Assistant Coach with New England Revolution in MLS. Mariner was hired by the Revs in 2004 to work alongside Head Coach Steve Nicol, and he gained experience in scouting, recruiting, and signing MLS players. He was credited with developing 2005 MLS M.V.P. Taylor Twellman.

During his five seasons with New England, the Revolution made three consecutive appearances in the MLS Cup (2005, 2006, 2007). They also won the 2007 U.S. Open Cup and 2008 SuperLiga title. In 2009, Mariner returned to England to join the coaching staff at Plymouth Argyle where he worked until signing with Toronto FC.

Mariner's playing career began with Plymouth Argyle in 1973 and he went on to play over 130 games for, scoring 56 goals. Sir Bobby Robson signed Mariner for Ipswich Town ahead of the 1976-1977 season and he stayed there through until 1984, scoring 96 goals in 260 games. He was named Man of the Match in the 1978 FA Cup Final as Ipswich beat Arsenal 1-0 and played a key role in Ipswich Town's UEFA Cup winning squad in the 1980-1981 season.

In 1984 Mariner moved to Arsenal where he spent two seasons before finishing his time in England with two years at Portsmouth. He moved to North America to join the Albany Capitals of the American Soccer League where he also served as the team's assistant coach. In the spring of 1992 he was offered the head coaching role of the team but left to join the San Francisco Bay Blackhawks. Following his playing time in the United States, Mariner moved to Maltese side the Naxaar Lions and retired in 1993.

Mariner earned his first cap for the England national team in 1977. He was named to the England squad for the 1980 European Championship and the qualifying campaign for the 1982 FIFA World Cup. Mariner scored the lone goal in a win against Hungary to secure England's spot at the World Cup in Spain where he played in all of the country's games.

Bob de Klerk was named Toronto FC's First Assistant Coach on January 6, 2011, joining former Ajax colleague Aron Winter in Toronto. The Amsterdam native was most recently working with Ajax A1 youth squad alongside Frank de Boer. When de Boer was promoted to become Manager of Ajax in December 2010, de Klerk stepped up to take control of the A1 squad before deciding to head to North America to work in Major League Soccer. He spent a total of nine years working with Ajax. In addition to his work at Ajax, de Klerk spent time with Ajax Cape Town of the South African league.

Before moving into coaching, de Klerk played for KSV Waregem in Belgium and De Graafschap of the Dutch Eredivise.

de Klerk has dedicated most of his career to developing young players and will use that knowledge and experience to ensure Toronto FC is positioned in the best possible way to develop players for both club and country. One of the main reasons he decided to make the move across the Atlantic to join Toronto FC was the opportunity to be involved in establishing a new philosophy and style of play at the club from the First Team all the way through to the youngest Academy teams.

Jason Bent stepped up to become a First Team Assistant Coach in February 2011 after spending the previous three seasons with Toronto FC's Academy program.

Bent was born on August 3, 1977. The Brampton native brings a wealth of experience having played internationally and within Major League Soccer. His last professional club was Plymouth Argyle in England where he played three seasons. Bent helped Plymouth win the Division Three Championship in 2001-2002, and the Division Two Championship in 2003-2004. Before moving to Europe, Bent became one of the first young Canadians to be signed by an MLS club when the Colorado Rapids inked him to a two year contract in June 1998. He was part of the Rapids side that reached the US Open Cup Final for the first time in team history in 1999.

Bent has represented Canada at U-17, U-20, U-23, and Senior level. His senior team career began in October 1997 during a World Cup qualifier against Mexico. He finished his international career with 32 caps and was a member of the 2000 CONCACAF Gold Cup winning squad. Bent announced his retirement from playing in March 2006 after a series of knee injuries brought a premature end to his career.

Mike Toshack, a native of Prescott, Ontario, joined Toronto FC on January 8, 2009 after two seasons with Houston Dynamo. Before working in Major League Soccer, Toshack was Director of Goalkeeping at Vancouver Whitecaps. He started the role in February 2005 and was responsible for the development and training of all goalkeepers in the club, from youth teams to professional. He served as an assistant coach with Vancouver when they won the United Soccer League First Division Championship in 2006 and also spent time with Montreal Impact as an assistant coach in 2002-2003.

Toshack worked with leading youth club Mass Premier Soccer in Boston as Goalkeeping Director where he was responsible for the development of all goalkeepers for the 28 Super Y-league teams as well as the Cape Cod Crusaders of the Premier Development League. From 1994 to 2003, Toshack was the Assistant Coach at St. Lawrence University in Canton, New York and was part of the team that won the NCAA Division III championship in 1999. During his time in New York, Toshack also kept busy by serving as Goalkeeper Coach with the Canadian Under 20 national team from 1998 to 2001. That position took him around the world including a stop in Argentina where the 2001 FIFA World Youth Championships took place.

Nick Dasovic enters his first season as the North American Scout for Toronto FC after serving most recently as the Interim Head Coach of the first team for the final six weeks of the 2010 season. Dasovic has been part of Toronto FC's team staff since 2008 when he joined the club as Academy Head Coach and First Team Assistant Coach. Prior to joining Toronto FC, Dasovic spent five years with the Canadian National team program. He was the head coach for the men's Olympic team that finished third in CONCACAF Olympic qualifying. Dasovic also spent time as an assistant for the U-20 team and the National Team.

As a player, Dasovic earned 63 caps and scored two international goals for Canada. His club career began in 1989 with Croatian side Dinamo Zagreb. From there he played for the Toronto Rockets, Montreal Impact and the Vancouver 86ers. In 1995, he moved back to Europe with French side Stade Briochin for a short time and then moved to Trelleborg I.F. of the Swedish Premier League. Following his time in Sweden, Dasovic joined St. Johnstone of Scotland where he played for six seasons. In a 1999 League Cup Final with the Glasgow Rangers, Dasovic scored in a 2-1 loss and earned Man of the Match honours.

Dasovic was born in Vancouver on December 5, 1968. He holds both his UEFA "A" and "B" coaching licences. He is fluent in English, Croatian and French, with an understanding of Italian and Spanish.

Toronto then traded Regan to the New York Red Bulls where he made three appearances in 2007. With Toronto FC missing nine players due to international duty, Regan signed a one-game contract in September 2008 to play for the Reds in a 3-1 defeat at home to Chivas USA. In addition to his scouting role for Toronto FC, Regan serves as an assistant coach on Mike Matkovich's staff for the United States U-18 men's team.

Danny Dichio is heading into his first season as Head Coach of Toronto FC Academy's Senior Team. Dichio retired from playing in September 2009 and moved into coaching. He was assistant coach to the first team in 2010 and has now taken on the new challenge of running his own team.

Dichio was born on October 19, 1974 in Hammersmith, London, England. He had a long playing career in Europe before moving across the Atlantic to join Toronto FC early in the club's inaugural season in 2007. He is still a popular figure amongst the fan base for Toronto FC and was immortalized in their minds as he became the first player to score a goal in team history on May 12, 2007. He was named to the 2007 MLS All-Star inactive roster later that year and finished the season with six goals. Dichio scored 14 goals for Toronto FC in a total of 59 appearances. On May 8, 2010 he was the second player to have his name and number added to Toronto FC's Wall of Honour.

Dichio began his professional career with Queens Park Rangers in 1993 and went on to score 20 goals in 75 appearances for the London club. In 1997 he moved to Italy where he played for Sampdoria and Lecce before returning to England in 1998. Dichio won promotion to the English Premier League with Sunderland and was part of the squad that finished in seventh place in the top flight for two consecutive seasons. From there he moved to West Bromwich Albion where he also won promotion to the Premier League. He also spent time with Derby County, Millwall and Preston North End.

Jim Brennan is entering his first season as Head Coach of Toronto FC's Junior Academy Team. Brennan moves into the role after serving as the team's Assistant General Manager last season following his retirement as a player on April 6, 2010.

Brennan was born on May 8, 1977. He became the first ever player to join Toronto FC when he signed with the club on September 8, 2006 and held the role of team captain from the inaugural 2007 season through until his retirement. Brennan was named Toronto FC's Defender of the Year and Co-MVP in 2007. He represented Toronto in the 2008 MLS All-Star game against West Ham United at BMO Field and in 2009 he won the team's Humanitarian of the Year Award. Brennan started in 83 of the 84 league games he featured in and registered four goals and four assists. On April 15, 2010 he was the first player in team history to have his name added to the Wall of Honour at BMO Field.

The Toronto born defender also had an accomplished career with the Canadian National team and after making his debut in April 1999, earned a total of 49 caps. Brennan was part of the Canadian squad that won the Gold Cup in 2000, defeating Colombia 2-0 in the final. He also played in the Gold Cup in 2002 and 2005 and the 2001 FIFA Confederations Cup. Brennan's final game for Canada was on September 10, 2008 in a World Cup qualifying match against Mexico.

Launched in 2008, the goal of Toronto FC Academy is to provide the most talented, committed and dedicated soccer players in the country an opportunity to receive advanced coaching instruction within the Academy system. Last year, the Academy expanded via the new Club Academy Program (CAP) as links were established with clubs across Ontario and coaches began to scout players at combines throughout the province. In the first three seasons, Toronto FC's Academy has already achieved significant success.

2010: In the summer of 2010, Doneil Henry and Nicholas Lindsay became the first two players to graduate from the Academy and sign a professional contract with Toronto FC. The highlight of last season for the Senior Team was a 4-4 draw against storied Chilean side Colo Colo in an International Friendly. The team finished sixth in the Canadian Soccer League and qualified for the playoffs for the second consecutive year. The Junior Academy team finished third in the CSL Reserve Division and qualified for the playoffs. Sergio Camargo was named the CSL Reserve Division Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Player.

2009: The Senior Academy team qualified for the Canadian Soccer League Playoffs for the first time, but the highlight of the year was beating AC Milan 3-0 in the Dallas Cup Supergroup. The Junior Academy team finished top of the Canadian Soccer League Reserve Division and also won the CSL Reserve Division Cup Final.

2008: The Junior Academy Team made it to the semi finals in the SUM U-17 Cup in Colorado, beating a number of established MLS Clubs along the way.

It is the goal of Toronto FC's Academy teams to follow the style of play set by the First Team. They will be encouraged to play in the same way in order to create a single Toronto FC philosophy and approach to the game at all levels throughout the club. This will help prepare players to make the step up to the First Team squad and also help establish Toronto FC's on-pitch identity.







IMPORTANT DATES IN TORONTO FC HISTORY

April 2005 – Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment Ltd. And the City of Toronto are awarded the rights to create an expansion team for the 2007 MLS Season, after an agreement was reached with Major League Soccer to build a permanent soccer stadium on the Exhibition Place grounds.

May 11, 2006 – Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment Ltd. Announces that Toronto FC will be the name of their MLS expansion franchise. During the presentation the club's logo and uniform are unveiled.

August 22, 2006 – Toronto FC name Maurice 'Mo' Johnston as the first head coach in club history.

September 8, 2006 – Canadian born Jim Brennan becomes Toronto FC's first ever signing leaving English side Southampton and is named team captain.

September 20, 2006 – The stadium at Exhibition Place becomes "BMO Field" after naming rights were purchased by corporate partner, Bank of Montreal.

January 12, 2007 – Toronto FC participate in their first ever MLS SuperDraft. Toronto selected University of Maryland midfielder Maurice Edu with the first overall selection.

April 7, 2007 – Toronto FC take to the field for the first time in club history against Chivas USA, were they were defeated 2-0.

April 28, 2007 – Toronto FC play their first ever home game at BMO Field against the Kansas City Wizards.

May 12, 2007 – Toronto FC earn first ever victory in the MLS, 3-1 over the Chicago Fire at BMO Field. Danny Dichio scored the first goal in club history in the 24th minute of the match.

November 2007 – Midfielder Maurice Edu was named the MLS Rookie of the Year. Edu capped off a strong rookie campaign with four goals in 25 starts.

February 1, 2008 – John Carver was named the new head coach of Toronto FC. Mo Johnston remained on as the Director of Soccer.

July 24, 2008 – BMO Field hosts the 2008 MLS All-Star Game. The MLS All-Stars defeated West Ham United, 3-2.

December 12, 2008 – Dwayne De Rosario traded to Toronto FC from the Houston Dynamo.

June 18, 2009 – Toronto FC wins the Nutrilite Canadian Championship with a 6-1 victory over the Montreal Impact. Dwayne De Rosario scored three goals to power Toronto to victory.

July 29, 2009 – Toronto FC make debut in the CONCACAF Champions League in the preliminary round against the Puerto Rico Islanders.

August 5, 2009 – Toronto FC host Real Madrid in a friendly match. The game featured the debut of Cristiano Ronaldo and Kaka in a Real Madrid uniform.

September 9, 2009 – Danny Dichio announces his retirement from the game.

September 11, 2009 – Canadian international Julian DeGuzman signs as Toronto FC's first ever designated player.

October 9, 2009 – The City of Toronto officially announces the approval to install natural grass at BMO Field.

November 19, 2009 – Predrag "Preki" Radosavljevic is named the new head coach of Toronto FC.

February 2010 – Construction begins on the expansion of BMO Field with 1,249 seats added into the north end of the stadium bringing the total capacity to just under 21,800.

April 6, 2010 – Toronto FC's first ever player and captain Jim Brennan announces his retirement from playing and assumes the role of assistant general manager for the club.

April 8, 2010 – Dwayne De Rosario is named the team's new captain.

June 2, 2010 – Toronto FC secures back-to-back Nutrilite Canadian Championships by tying the Vancouver Whitecaps 0-0 at BMO Field.

August 17, 2010 – Toronto FC host its first ever match in the group stages of the CONCACAF Champions League against Cruz Azul of Mexico.

September 14, 2010 – The club announces they have parted ways with Director of Soccer Mo Johnston and Head Coach Preki.

November 21, 2010 – BMO Field plays host to the 2010 MLS Cup. The Colorado Rapids defeated FC Dallas 2-1 in extra time to claim the championship.

January 6, 2011 – Toronto FC names Aron Winter as the club's new Head Coach & Technical Director. Joining Winter are former New England Revolution Assistant Coach Paul Mariner, as the Director of Player Development and Bob de Klerk as the team's First Assistant Coach.

2011 MLS CUP PLAYOFFS

Ten clubs will qualify for the 2011 MLS Cup Playoffs:

- The top three finishers in each conference, based on regular season points (six automatic berths)
- The next best four clubs based on regular season points, irrespective of conference (four wild cards)
- The four wild cards will play single elimination games against each other, with higher seeds hosting (1 vs. 4; 2 vs. 3). These play-in games are part of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

After the two play-in games conclude, the lowest remaining seed will face the Supporters' Shield winner in the Conference Semifinals; the other will face the No. 1 seed in the opposite conference from the Supporters' Shield winner.

The four Conference Semifinals will be decided by two-game aggregate series, with each club hosting one game. The two Conference Championships will be single games hosted by the higher seed. MLS Cup will again be a single championship match hosted at a predetermined site to be announced at a later date.

2011 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY**I. MLS ROSTER COMPOSITION**

A Major League Soccer club's first team roster is comprised of up to 30 players. All 30 players are eligible for selection to each 18-player game-day squad during the regular season and playoffs.

Salary & Budget:

- Players occupying roster spots 1-20 count against the club's 2011 salary budget of \$2,675,000, and are referred to collectively as the club's Salary Budget Players.
 - Roster spots 19 and 20 are not required to be filled, and teams may spread their salary budget across only 18 Salary Budget Players. A minimum salary budget charge will be imputed against a team's salary budget for each unfilled senior roster slot below 18.
 - The maximum budget charge for a single player is \$335,000.*
 - A Designated Player counts \$335,000 against the club's salary budget, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$167,500.
- * See section entitled *Allocation Money* below, under *Player Acquisition Mechanisms*, for details on buying down a player's budget charge.
- Players occupying roster spots 21-30 do not count against the club's salary budget, and are referred to collectively as the club's Off-Budget Players (maximum of 10 per team).
 - All Generation adidas players are Off-Budget players.
- Players occupying roster spots 1-24 will earn at least \$42,000 in 2011.
- Players occupying roster spots 25-30 will earn at least \$32,600 in 2011.
 - Clubs may elect to leave up to two of these roster spots (25-20) vacant and use \$35,000 for each empty spot as allocation money.
 - Clubs may sign up to two Home Grown Players to Generation adidas contracts.

Age Designations:

- Any player making \$32,600 must be under the age 25 (does not turn 25 or older in 2011).

Domestic/International:

- In 2011, a total of 144 international slots are divided among the 18 clubs. Each club began with eight international slots, which are tradable. There is no limit on the number of international slots on each club's roster.
 - The remaining roster slots must belong to domestic players. For clubs based in the United States, a domestic player is either a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident (green card holder) or the holder of other special status (e.g., refugee or asylum status).
- The two MLS clubs based in Canada – Toronto FC and Vancouver Whitecaps FC – began with eight international slots, but their domestic slots may be filled with either Canadian or U.S. domestic players.
 - MLS clubs based in Canada are required to have a minimum of three Canadian domestic players on their rosters.
 - Players with the legal right to work in Canada are considered Canadian domestic players (i.e., Canadian citizen, permanent resident, part of a protected class).

NOTE: The terms *Home Grown* and *Generation adidas* are used to describe mechanisms by which players are acquired. They are not roster designations. All players' roster slots are determined by their compensation and/or age as outlined above.

II. PLAYER ACQUISITION MECHANISMS

MLS teams may acquire players and add them to their rosters via the following mechanisms:

(A) ALLOCATION RANKING

The allocation ranking is the mechanism used to determine which MLS club has first priority to acquire a U.S. National Team player who signs with MLS after playing abroad, or a former MLS player who returns to the League after having gone to a club abroad for a transfer fee. The allocation rankings may also be used in the event two or more clubs file a request for the same player on the same day. The allocations will be ranked in reverse order of finish for the 2010 season, taking playoff performance into account.

Once the club uses its allocation ranking to acquire a player, it drops to the bottom of the list. A ranking can be traded, provided that part of the compensation received in return is another club's ranking. At all times, each club is assigned one ranking. The rankings reset at the end of each MLS League season.

Allocation Money

Allocation money is a resource available to clubs in addition to their respective salary budgets.

A club may receive allocation money for:

- (1) failure to qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs;
- (2) the transfer of a player to a club outside of MLS for value;
- (3) expansion status;
- (4) qualification for the CONCACAF Champions League;

Each year the MLS Competition Committee determines the allocation amount to be made available to each club. Allocation money can be traded by clubs. Allocation money does not count against a club's salary budget and can be used:

- To sign players new to MLS (that is, a player who did not play in MLS during the previous season).
- To re-sign an existing MLS player, subject to League approval.
- To "buy-down" a player's salary budget charge below the League maximum of \$335,000.

- In connection with the exercise of an option to purchase a player's rights or the extension of a player's contract for the second year provided the player was new to MLS in the immediately prior year.

NOTE: To protect the interests of MLS and its clubs during discussions with prospective players or clubs in other leagues, amounts of allocation money held by each club will not be shared publicly. (Similarly, most clubs in other countries do not announce the amount of money they plan to spend during a given transfer window.)

(B) DESIGNATED PLAYER

The Designated Player Rule allows clubs to acquire up to three players whose salaries exceed their budget charges, with the club bearing financial responsibility for the amount of compensation above each player's budget charge. Designated Player slots may be used to acquire players new to MLS or to retain current MLS players, subject to League approval.

In 2011, a Designated Player's salary budget charge will be \$335,000, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$167,500.

Each club has two Designated Player slots, and clubs are allowed to "purchase" a third Designated Player slot for a one-time fee of \$250,000 that will be dispersed in the form of allocation money to all clubs that do not have three Designated Players.

Designated Player slots are not tradable.

Clubs have the option of "buying down" the budget charge of a Designated Player with allocation money. The reduced charge may not be less than \$150,000.

(C) SUPERDRAFT

The 2011 MLS SuperDraft, held Jan. 13 in Baltimore, Md., consisted of three rounds of 18 picks for a total of 54 player selections. A supplemental draft was held Jan. 18 via teleconference and consisted of three rounds.

The majority of draft prospects are NCAA college seniors who have exhausted their college eligibility. Generation adidas players and non-collegiate international players are also eligible for selection in the SuperDraft and supplemental draft. Clubs may nominate players for the League's draft-eligible list, and only players from that list may be selected.

Generation adidas is a joint program between MLS and adidas that is dedicated to developing exceptional domestic talent in a professional environment. Each year, a handful of top domestic underclassmen and youth national team players are signed to the league and placed in the SuperDraft through this program. Generation adidas players also receive an educational stipend.

Draft Order: Through the Expansion Priority Draft, Vancouver Whitecaps FC earned the first selection in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft while the Portland Timbers selected second. The next six selections went to clubs that did not qualify for the 2010 MLS Cup Playoffs beginning with the club with fewest regular season points (3 points per win, one point per tie). The remaining eight positions were ranked by fewest regular season points among the teams that were eliminated in the same round of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

Unless claimed on waivers, a player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign with the League, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to the player.

(D) TRADES

Players, SuperDraft and supplemental draft picks, allocation money, allocation rankings, and international player slots may all be exchanged in trades approved by the MLS League Office, provided all of the necessary rules regarding roster and salary budget compliance are met and the trade is completed during a valid trading period. No trades may occur after the Roster Freeze Deadline of September 15, 2011 at 5 p.m. ET.

(E) DISCOVERY SIGNINGS

Clubs may make discovery claims on players not yet under MLS contract who are not subject to the allocation ranking or lottery mechanisms.

Each club has the opportunity to make six discovery signings per season (expansion teams may make 10 discovery signings in their inaugural season). A club may have up to 10 discovery claims on unsigned players at any time and may remove or add players at any time. The last day for discovery player signings is September 15, 2011 – coinciding with the roster freeze date and trade deadline.

The six discovery signings can be used to fill senior roster spots only. If multiple clubs claim the same player using a discovery, the club that filed the claim first will have first rights to the player. Discovery claims expire following each season. If the League and player are unable to reach an agreement during the season, the club that first filed the discovery retains the right of first refusal in the event the player is later signed by the League.

Note: To protect interests of MLS clubs in scouting and negotiations with prospective players, the League office will not publicize the names of players on club discovery lists, nor specify if a discovery claim has been filed on a particular player.

(F) HOME GROWN PLAYER SIGNINGS

A club may sign a player to his first professional contract without subjecting him to the MLS SuperDraft if the player has trained for at least one year in the club's youth development program and has met League criteria. Players joining MLS through this mechanism are known as Home Grown Players. There is no limit to the number of Home Grown Players a club may sign in a given year.

(G) RE-ENTRY PROCESS

The 2011 Re-Entry Process will commence after MLS Cup. The priority order for the Re-Entry Draft is reverse order of finish in 2011, taking into account playoff performance.

Available to all teams in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry draft will be:

1. Players who are at least 23 years old and have a minimum of three years experience in MLS whose options were not exercised by their clubs (available at option salary for 2012).
2. Players who are at least 25 years old with a minimum of four years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them at their previous salary (available for at least their 2011 salary).
3. Players who are at least 30 years old with a minimum of eight years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them (available for at least 105% of their 2011 salary).

Players who are not selected in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry Draft will be made available in Stage 2. Clubs selecting players in Stage 2 will negotiate a new salary with the player.

Players who remain unselected after Stage 2 will be available to any MLS club on a first come, first serve basis.

(H) WAIVERS

A team may place a player on waivers at any time during the regular season at which point he is made available to all other teams. The waiver claiming period shall commence on the first business day after the League delivers notice to teams and shall expire at 5 p.m. EST on the second business day after the Waiver Period Commencement Date. The claiming period is 48 hours.

The Waiver Draft order is determined via points per game once all teams have played at least three MLS League games. If the waiver takes place prior to all teams playing in at least three League games, priority shall be granted based upon the prior year's performance, taking playoff performance first, with teams eliminated from playoff contention at the same stage separated according to their point totals through the end of the regular season. New expansion teams shall be at the bottom of the waiver order.

Once a team selects a player off waivers, that club is automatically moved to the bottom of the priority list for subsequent waiver selections in a given season, regardless of its points-per-game total. Players who may be placed on the MLS waiver wire are as follows:

- (i) A player waived by an MLS team in the current season;
- (ii) A player who completed his college eligibility within the past season, who was not made available in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft;
- (iii) A player who has remaining college eligibility (and was not made available in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft), but the League at its discretion and after taking into account exceptional circumstances determines the player may be offered an MLS contract;
- (iv) A player who has played in MLS previously where his last MLS team does not wish to exercise their right of first refusal, except in the case of returning U.S. National Team players as stated above.
- (v) A player who was drafted in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft, and who after a trial with the club is not offered a contract by the first Monday of June.

(I) LOTTERY

Some players shall be assigned to MLS teams via the weighted Lottery process. Any team assigned a player through the lottery in any particular season shall not be assigned another lottery player that season unless and until all teams have received a lottery player or have agreed to waive their option to participate in a Lottery. The players made available through lotteries include:

- (i) *Generation adidas* players signed after the MLS SuperDraft;
- (ii) Draft eligible players to whom an MLS contract was offered but who failed to sign with the League prior to the Draft.

The weighted lottery takes into consideration each team's performance over its last 30 regular season games and the most recent postseason. The team with the worst record over its last 30 regular season games (dating back to previous season if necessary and taking playoff performance into account) will have the greatest probability of winning the lottery. Teams are not required to participate in a lottery. Players are assigned via the lottery system in order to prevent a player from potentially influencing his destination club with a strategic holdout.

(J) EXTREME HARDSHIP CALL-UPS

Teams may add players to their roster in cases of "extreme hardship" as follows: (1) a club with three goalkeepers on its 30-man roster, but has less than two available goalkeepers or (2) a team has less than 15 available players. Extreme hardship call-ups are made on a game-by-game basis.

(K) SEASON-ENDING INJURY REPLACEMENTS

A team with a player lost to a season-ending injury can replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the season-ending injury list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). International player limits still apply at the time a season-ending replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).



(L) SHORT-TERM INJURY REPLACEMENTS

A team with a player who has a short-term injury can replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the short-term injured reserve list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). Note that the injured player will have to sit out a minimum of six MLS League matches before he can rejoin the team's roster. International player limits still apply at the time a short-term replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

NOTE: No changes may be made to a team's active full roster during the period beginning on September 16, 2011 (day after Roster Freeze Date) through the day after MLS Cup. Nevertheless, a team may obtain players in accordance with the extreme hardship rules and procedures to replace players who are injured or otherwise legitimately unavailable after the Roster Freeze Date. Any other replacements after the Roster Freeze Date may only be made in exceptional circumstances in the League's sole and absolute discretion.

(III.) METHODS OF RELEASING PLAYERS

(A) WAIVERS

Teams may waive players based on performance at any time during the MLS season. Players with guaranteed contracts will continue to have their salary budget charge applied to the team salary budget, subject to any settlement. Players on semi-guaranteed contracts can be waived prior to July 1 of any year and free up the corresponding budget space. If a player on a semi-guaranteed contract is waived after July 1, his salary budget charge will count against the team's salary budget and the team waiving the player will not receive a replacement except under the normal player acquisition mechanisms. Any settlement amount will be charged to the team's salary budget.

(B) TRANSFERS AND LOANS

An MLS player may be transferred or loaned at any time to a team outside the League (subject to that team's Federation's transfer window), subject to the consent of the player.

The registration windows – the dates between which MLS may request the transfer certificate of a player under contract in another country – are as follows:

January 21 – April 15 (*Primary Window*)
July 15 – August 14 (*Secondary Window*)

(C) CONTRACT EXPIRATION

When a player's contract expires, the player does not count against the roster or budget of the team in question. Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the rights to the player indefinitely following the expiration of a contract only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

(D) BUYOUT OF GUARANTEED CONTRACT

Teams may have the ability to buyout one guaranteed player as follows:

- A Team may buy out one (1) guaranteed player (including a DP's) contract during the off-season and free up the corresponding budget space. Such a buyout is at the particular MLS Team's own expense.
- A Team may not free up budget space with a buyout of a player's salary budget charge during the season. Such a buyout will be conducted by the League and count on a Club's budget in a manner consistent with current MLS guidelines.

(IV.) RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL

Right of first refusal grants one MLS club the first opportunity to add a player to its roster in the event that the player signs with MLS. Holding a right of first refusal applies only within MLS and does not indicate holding of the player's International Transfer Certificate.

OUT OF CONTRACT PLAYERS / OPTIONS NOT PICKED UP: Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the right of first refusal to the player indefinitely only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

DRAFTED BUT NOT SIGNED: A player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign, or who as of the first Monday in June is not offered a contract after a trial and clears waivers, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 immediately following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to sign the player.

PLAYER TRANSFERRED OUTSIDE MLS: If a team receives allocation money as a result of a player's transfer, the team does not retain a right of first refusal.

BMO FIELD INFO

BMO Field, located at Exhibition Place in Toronto, is Canada's first soccer-specific stadium. With a capacity of 21,500, BMO Field is home to Toronto FC, Canada's first Major League Soccer Team as well as the Canadian National Team.

In the summer of 2007, it was the main venue for the third most watched sporting event in the world, the FIFA U-20 World Cup, in which it hosted over 260,000 people and 12 games. In its first year of operation, over 500,000 people entered through BMO Field's gates. Toronto FC hosted their first International match on May 23, 2007 in a game that featured Portuguese club Benfica.

There are over 200 points of sale for food and beverage throughout the building. It's unique and original food offerings make it an industry leader and set it apart from any other venue in North America. BMO Field is also used for community soccer purposes, corporate functions, private parties, and concerts.

The BMO Field Ticket Office is located at 170 Princes' Blvd, Toronto, ON. During the season, the Ticket Office on-site is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. It is located at Gate 1 of the stadium. On event days, the Ticket Office opens at 9:30 a.m.

WILL CALL

The Will Call window is located at the main ticket office located at Gate 1 on the north side of the stadium. Will Call is only open on event days starting at 9:30am. Only the person whose name appears on the ticket order may pick up the tickets. You must have valid photo identification to pick up the tickets. You should also bring with you the credit card used to order the tickets with and your Ticketmaster confirmation number. On days of events, you may also pick up tickets ordered through Ticketmaster at the ticket office.

MERCHANDISE

Merchandise stands are located throughout the stadium. There is one permanent merchandise location on the Main Concourse on the southeast side behind section 112. Toronto FC items are also available online at www.torontofc.ca or from Real Sports Apparel at Maple Leaf Square – next to Air Canada Centre.

The Air Canada Centre is located at the northwest corner of Lakeshore Blvd. (westbound) and Bay St. in downtown Toronto.

For your convenience, BMO Field is equipped with four ATM machines. Locations are behind Section 107, Section 111, Section 121/122 and Section 125/225.

NEW PITCH AND EXPANSION

BMO Field's artificial playing surface was replaced with a new permanent grass pitch ahead of the 2010 season. The total cost of the project was \$5.5 million of which \$2 million was earmarked for community sports facilities. Toronto's new pitch was laid using Kentucky bluegrass brought in from Alliston, Ontario. The 7,850-square metre playing field is the first major sports field in Canada to employ a SubAir System, which acts like a huge underground vacuum to pull away excess water. 34 kilometres of tubing lies beneath the pitch to heat the field.

As well as the new pitch, over 1400 seats were added to BMO Field's capacity ahead of the 2010 season with the building of the new North End Stand which cost around \$2.5 million.




SEATING CHART

BMO FIELD CREDENTIALS:

Season credentials are limited to local reporters covering Toronto FC on a regular basis. Requests for individual game credentials must be made by email or fax, 48 hours before kick off. Credential requests must be sent by an editor or director and should indicate the access required (media or photographer). Credentials must be worn at all times and are non transferable – they do not guarantee press box seating.

ROAD GAMES:

Media members wishing to cover the team on the road should contact Toronto FC's Media Relations department at least three days prior to the game. Media should make requests for credentials through Toronto FC and not the host team.

GETTING TO BMO FIELD:

From Pearson International Airport:

Take PROVINCIAL ROUTE 427 south and merge onto Gardiner Expressway East via the exit on the left. Take Jameson Avenue exit. Turn left onto Lakeshore Blvd (West). Turn left onto Ontario Drive. Driving time is around 30 minutes although this can be much longer during rush hour.

On Public Transit:

BMO Field is accessible on public transit using the TTC Streetcar or the GO Train and is a 10-15 minute ride from downtown Toronto. From Union Station, take the 590 streetcar to Exhibition Place or the GO Train to the Exhibition stop.

MEDIA ENTRANCE:

Gate 4 – located on the west side of BMO Field off Ontario Drive

ACCREDITATION COLLECTION:

Gate 4 – located on the west side of BMO Field off Ontario Drive. Individual game credentials can be picked up 90 minutes before kick off. Any media members arriving after kick off must contact Toronto FC Media Relations to gain access to the stadium.

SEATING:

The press box and broadcast booths are located on level three on the west side of the stadium. Enter through Gate 4 and turn left. Head through the double doors and take the elevator to the third level. A seating chart is posted at the entrance to the press box.

PRESS CONFERENCE ROOM:

Press conferences at BMO Field are held in the Press Conference Room on the ground floor. When coming from the press box, take the elevator to the ground floor. On exiting the elevator, turn left and head straight forward. The press conference room is on the left, just past the stairs.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM:

Located on the ground floor. Enter Gate 4 and turn left. Head through the double doors and turn right. The work room is on the left, just past the stairs.

MATCHDAY DINING:

Food will be served for accredited media in the press box an hour before kick off.

MATCHDAY PARKING:

Unfortunately we are unable to offer parking privileges for media at BMO Field, however there are many pay parking lots located around the stadium. Lot 2 (south side) is closest to Gate 4 and can be accessed by turning from Lakeshore Blvd onto Ontario Drive.

TORONTO FC MEDIA DIRECTORY

LOCKER ROOMS:

Both the home and visiting team locker rooms will be open to credentialed media 10 minutes after each Major League Soccer game. There is no access to locker rooms at Nutrilite Canadian Championship or CONCACAF Champions League matches. For those games, there will be post-match player availability in a mixed zone.

The use of cell phones by media members in the locker room is prohibited. No autographs are to be asked of any team personnel during media access periods.

Training Sessions: Training session locations for 2011 are TBA, but most will take place away from BMO Field. Players and coaches will be available for interviews at the conclusion of training. The Toronto FC Media Information line is updated daily with the latest training and media availability times – call 416-815-6172.

PHOTO/VIDEO:

All photographers and television camera operators must stay behind the field boards at all times, unless released by the on-site photo marshal. Each photographer will be permitted to use one monopod – but no tripods. No seats other than 'lawn type' photographer seats will be permitted. Stand alone remote units will not be permitted at any time on or around the goalposts. Units mounted on top of field boards behind the end line will be permitted at the stadium's discretion, provided the equipment does not interfere with the clear display of the field board and does not impede the operation of the broadcast equipment.

Photographers and camera operators shall be permitted in the area between the field boards and the touchline in the area bounded by the edge of the penalty area and the end line. Once situated, no movement between the two halves of the field shall be allowed until half time. No photographer will be permitted to move from end to end on the bench side of the pitch.
