# CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD



## LAWRENCE (LARRY) M. TANENBAUM, O.C.

Chairman of the Board  
Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment Ltd.  
MLS Governor, Toronto FC

Larry Tanenbaum was appointed Chairman of Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment in July 2003. His ownership (MLSE) dates back to 1996 with the predecessor company of MLSE – Maple Leaf Gardens Ltd. He also serves as a Governor of the NBA for the Toronto Raptors, of the NHL for the Toronto Maple Leafs and of Major League Soccer for Toronto FC. Toronto FC is the latest addition to the MLSE sports family, and began play in spring 2007 at the new 21,140 seat BMO Field located on the Exhibition grounds.

Mr. Tanenbaum was the primary force in bringing an NBA franchise to Toronto. In the early 1990's, Tanenbaum attempted to move established NBA clubs to Toronto and then, as head of the Palestra Group, he initiated the expansion process that opened the eyes of the NBA to Canada. Although he was unsuccessful in being awarded the initial expansion franchise, Tanenbaum established himself in NBA circles and the city as a legitimate NBA home.

In 1996, Mr. Tanenbaum acquired an interest in the Toronto Maple Leafs of the National Hockey League and Maple Leaf Gardens, Limited (now Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment). With MLG's purchase of the Raptors and Air Canada Centre in February 1998, Tanenbaum fulfilled his goal of NBA and NHL ownership in Toronto under the same group.

In 2000, Mr. Tanenbaum was appointed to the Planning Committee of the NBA Board of Governors. He also serves on the Advisory/Finance Committee – the senior most committee of the NBA Board of Governors which considers and makes recommendations to the Board concerning a wide range of financial and league business matters.

Mr. Tanenbaum is currently Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Kilmer Van Nostrand Co. Limited (KVN), having served as President & CEO from 1968 to 2000. Under his direction, Kilmer developed into a multi-faceted construction operation with operating divisions and subsidiaries covering road building and paving, ready-mix concrete, aggregates, heavy construction, trucking and pipe manufacturing. Through December 2000, Kilmer's road building, paving and aggregates operations were conducted through Kilmer's wholly owned subsidiary, The Warren Paving & Materials Group Limited. Mr. Tanenbaum served as Chairman of Warren, which was Canada's largest asphalt paving company. Warren's activities also included major commercial aggregates operations, liquid asphalt trading and distribution and road maintenance. In December 2000, Warren was merged into Lafarge Corporation, North America's largest diversified supplier of construction materials. As a result of this merger, Kilmer became a significant shareholder in Lafarge NA, and Mr. Tanenbaum served on the Board and chaired its Finance Committee until the 2006 buyout by Lafarge SA. Kilmer today manages infrastructure investments through Kilmer Brownfield

Equity Fund LP, Quickload CEF Inc., Host Kilmer Service Centres Inc. (ONroute) and Dundee Kilmer (PAN-AM Village Development).

Kilmer also has significant investments in various sports-related entities, including Insight Sports Ltd, which is a leading sports media company involved in the creation, production and broadcasting, on all platforms, of sports and related lifestyle content. Insight Sports holds equity positions in several Canadian specialty television services including The NHL Network and Score Media and owns and/or operates the World Fishing Network (WFN) and Game TV. In 2003, through Plaza Gaming and Entertainment, Kilmer invested in the charitable gaming industry. Over the course of its investment, Plaza's facilities have raised in excess of \$60 million per year for local municipal charities.

In addition, Mr. Tanenbaum serves as Chairman of Kilmer Capital Partners, a private equity investment fund, which provides equity capital to small to mid-market companies, and is dedicated to building leading companies in partnership with management. Kilmer Capital's portfolio includes Unisync Group Ltd., Algorithmhe Pharma Inc., Coalition, Tribal Sportswear and Compact Power.

Mr. Tanenbaum served as National Revenue Chair of the Liberal Party of Canada during Prime Minister Paul Martin's term of office. He currently serves as a member of the Ontario Investment and Trade Advisory Council, and recently served as a member of the Toronto Prosperity Initiative. He has also served on the Independent Fiscal Review Panel of the City of Toronto and the Mayor's Economic Competitiveness Advisory Committee of the City of Toronto.

Mr. Tanenbaum's involvement in Community Associations includes the following: Vice-Chairman, Board of Directors, Mount Sinai Hospital – a tertiary care teaching hospital associated with the University of Toronto; Co-Chairman of the Samuel Lunenfeld Research Institute; Member, Board of Directors, Brain Canada; Member, University Council, Cornell University; Member, Honourary Board & Advisory Board, Baycrest Centre for Geriatric Care; Member, Dean's Advisory Council, Schulich School of Business, York University; Member, Advisory Council, Toronto Board of Trade; Member, Board of Directors, Miller Thomson Foundation; Founding Member, Centre for Israel and Jewish Affairs, and Co-Chair, Tomorrow Campaign for UJA Federation.

In recognition of his contributions in the areas of business, philanthropy, and volunteerism, Mr. Tanenbaum was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada on October 25, 2007. The Order of Canada is the centrepiece of Canada's honors system and represents its highest civilian award.

Mr. Tanenbaum has a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics from Cornell University (1968).

Tom Anselmi is an accomplished sports and entertainment business leader and has been with Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment since 1996. In 2012, he was appointed President and Chief Operating Officer, leading the senior management team responsible for growing MLSE into a global leader in the industry.

Tom originally joined Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment as Vice President, Project Director responsible for the overall development of Air Canada Centre, the critically acclaimed home of the Leafs and Raptors. Tom was promoted to Senior Vice President, Business and Chief Marketing Officer in July 1999 and in March 2004, he was appointed Executive Vice President & Chief Operating Officer, responsible for business operations for the Toronto Maple Leafs (NHL), Toronto Raptors (NBA), Toronto FC (MLS) and the Toronto Marlies (AHL).

Prior to joining the Leafs organization, he was Vice President, General Manager of Arena Operations for Orca Bay Sports and Entertainment in Vancouver. Tom spent several years at Toronto's SkyDome during the development of the facility and during its initial operating phase. He also consulted on a variety of other sports and entertainment projects internationally and has had involvement in various major capital projects across North America.

Born and raised in Toronto, Tom holds an Engineering Degree from the University of Saskatchewan and a Degree from Ryerson Polytechnical University. Tom is a Professional Engineer, an Alternate Governor for Major League Soccer and is an active supporter of various other business and academic organizations. Tom is also a recognized community leader, sits on the Board of Covenant House, actively involved with the MLSE Team Up Foundation and serves as an advisor on the Foundation.

Tom is also a passionate supporter of Canada's military and a member of Canada Company. As a leader of "Team Canada," he made five goodwill trips to Afghanistan accompanying the Leafs Alumni to visit Canadian troops situated in the region. In 2011, Tom received the CDS commendation from Canada's Chief of the Defence Staff, which is the highest military honour a civilian can receive.

# PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER

## KEVIN J. PAYNE

President & General Manager, Toronto FC

Kevin Payne was named President and General Manager of Toronto FC on November 28, 2012.

After careers as an award-winning radio journalist in New York City and as a marketing and special events executive in Vail, Colorado, Kevin Payne became the National Administrator, and the Director of Marketing of the United States Soccer Federation in 1989.

In 1991, he moved to New York and became the Executive Vice President and, ultimately, the President of Soccer USA Partners, which owned all marketing, broadcast and event promotion rights to the U.S. Men's National Team leading up to the 1994 and 1998 World Cups.

In 1994, Payne created the first ownership group for D.C. United and the team began Major League Soccer play in 1996. Since then, D.C. United has become the most successful team in United States professional soccer history, boasting 12 major domestic and international championships.

For his tireless efforts to promote soccer in the United States, Payne was awarded the prestigious Werner Fricker Builder Award by U.S. Soccer in February 2011.

He is a founding member of the Major League Soccer/Soccer United Marketing (MLS/SUM) Board of Governors, Chairman of the Technical Committee for the U.S. Soccer Federation, is the Vice Chairman of the U. S. Soccer Foundation, and on the U.S. Soccer Board of Directors.

### PAUL BEIRNE

Vice-President, Business Operations,  
Toronto FC

Paul joined Toronto FC in its inaugural season from parent company, Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment, with 17 years of experience in the sports and entertainment industry. He has a passion for sports and is recognized as a leader in the entertainment industry in ticketing, customer service, and the use of technology.

Paul began his career in live theatre working with industry leaders such as Live Entertainment and Mirvish Productions. He held a variety of positions in the ticketing, merchandising and group sales areas before participating in the start-up of Encore Tickets, a province-wide ticket service company based in Vancouver. Paul managed the ticketing for the World Championship of Basketball in 1994 prior to joining the NBA expansion Toronto Raptors.

With Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment, Paul has held a variety of management positions with the NHL Toronto Maple Leafs and the NBA Toronto Raptors. He supported implementing a number of service and marketing initiatives that have enabled the Raptors and Leafs Season Seat Holders to feel more connected and be amongst the best served in all pro sports, leading to higher satisfaction and retention.

Paul is a big believer in grassroots marketing and over the last five years he has taken it to a new level with Toronto FC. The fans and supporter groups of the club enjoyed a sense of belonging and membership from day one. As a result of many initiatives in the build up to Toronto FC's record breaking launch in 2007, Paul was honoured by Major League Soccer, winning the prestigious "Doug Hamilton Executive of the Year" award at the conclusion of the team's opening season. In the seasons following the launch Toronto FC has been singled out in a number of publications including: Sports Business Journal (nomination for 2008 Team of the Year), Marketing Magazine (Toronto FC – Top 10 Marketers in Canada), and Strategy Magazine (Toronto FC 2009 Brand of the Year).

The growth of the game in Canada, particularly the development of professional players and coaches, are very important to Toronto FC. Under Paul's stewardship Toronto FC has invested in a number of initiatives aimed at improving the landscape for professional soccer: the installation of a world-class heated grass pitch at BMO Field, the addition of 1700 seats to BMO Field, and most importantly, the creation of Toronto FC Academy.

Paul lives in Toronto with wife, artist Anne-Marie Olczak, and their children Eileen and Alec.



### EARL COCHRANE

Director of Team and Player Operations,  
Toronto FC

Earl Cochrane, a native of Scarborough, Ontario, is an original member of Toronto FC's front office, joining the team in July 2006 as the club's Manager of Team Operations. Cochrane has served as Toronto FC Academy Director, overseeing Toronto's player development program, in addition to his role within Team Operations. In September 2010, Cochrane took over the role as Toronto FC's Interim General Manager following the departure of Mo Johnston. He was promoted to Director of Team and Player Operations in January 2011.

Prior to joining Toronto FC, Cochrane worked for the Canadian Soccer Association as the National Teams Manager from January 2001 before taking over the role of Director of Communications in late 2005; a role he had previously held for two years at DC United.

As a player, Cochrane was a four-time OUA All-Star and two time all-Canadian defender at Carleton University. He spent two seasons in Malaysia before an injury during a trial in Japan ended his playing career. Cochrane holds a Masters degree from the University of Toronto.





## COACHING STAFF



### JASON BENT

Assistant Coach,  
Toronto FC

Jason Bent was named as a first team assistant coach in February 2011 after spending the previous three seasons with Toronto FC Academy.

A native of Brampton, Ontario, Bent is a local coach who brings a wealth of experience having played internationally and within Major League Soccer. He went to the University of Maryland prior to joining the Colorado Rapids. Bent spent three seasons with the Rapids appearing in over 50 matches and was part of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup finals squad in 1999.

His last professional club was Plymouth Argyle in England where he played three seasons. Bent helped Plymouth win the Division Three Championship in 2001-2002, and the Division Two Championship in 2003-2004.

In addition to his club football career, Bent earned 32 caps for the Canadian National Team.



### JIMMY BRENNAN

Assistant Coach,  
Toronto FC

Jimmy Brennan was named as a first team assistant coach on May 14, 2012 after spending the previous 15 months as head coach of the Toronto FC U17 Academy Team.

Brennan was named the first player and captain in Toronto FC's history on September 8, 2006. Prior to signing with Toronto, Brennan spent several years playing in England with Bristol City, Nottingham Forest, Norwich City, and Southampton. While at Norwich City, Brennan was part of the 2004 League One Division championship side. With the promotion, Brennan became the first Canadian outfield player to play in the English Premier League.

Brennan earned 49 caps with the Canadian National Team during his playing career. He was part of the Canada squad that won the Gold Cup in 2000. He also played in the Gold Cup in 2002 and 2005 and the 2001 FIFA Confederations Cup.

Following his retirement as a player on April 6, 2010, Brennan was named the club's assistant general manager. On March 1, 2011, Brennan was named head coach of Toronto FC's U17 Academy team.



### STEWART KERR

Goalkeeping Coach,  
Toronto FC

Stewart Kerr was named the club's goalkeeping coach on December 14, 2011.

A native of Bellshill, Scotland, Kerr spent the majority of his playing career with Celtic F.C. of the Scottish Premier League from 1993 until 2001. During his time at Celtic, Kerr won two Scottish League titles and two Scottish Cups.

He went on loan for one season with English side, Brighton during his time with Celtic. Kerr finished his career at Wigan Athletic in 2002.

Following his retirement as a player Kerr worked as the goalkeeping coach for Scottish clubs, Airdrie United and then with Motherwell FC before moving to Toronto FC.

Bekker was drafted third overall by Toronto FC in the 2013 MLS SuperDraft. He spent the past four seasons at Boston College, appearing in 80 games for the Eagles, scoring 17 goals and adding 22 assists. In his Freshman year he earned ACC All-Freshman Team honours and was the only player at Boston College to start in every match. Bekker was named to the All-ACC First Team in 2011 and again this past season. He ranks second all-time at Boston College in assists.

The Oakville, Ontario native earned four caps for the U23 Canadian Men's National Team during the 2012 CONCACAF Men's Olympic qualifying tournament. Bekker made his debut at the age of 15 with the Canadian national youth program. In January 2013, Bekker earned his first call up for the Canadian Men's National Team and earned two caps in a pair of friendlies.

Prior to joining Boston College, Bekker played his youth soccer with the Oakville Bluestars winning the Ontario Cup championship twice (2004 and 2005) along with the national title in 2004. In 2006 he joined the Mississauga Dixie Dominators and won back-to-back Ontario Cup championships in 2006 and 2007 and added another national title in 2006. Bekker then moved onto the Sigma Elite Training Centre program prior to his collegiate career. In 2008, Bekker earned an invitation to train with AFC Ajax youth academy.

In 1997 he moved to Italy where he played for Sampdoria and Lecce before returning to England in 1998. Dichio won promotion to the English Premier League with Sunderland and was part of the squad that finished in seventh place in the top flight for two consecutive seasons. From there he moved to West Bromwich Albion where he also won promotion to the Premier League. He also spent time with Derby County, Millwall and Preston North End.

# IMPORTANT DATES IN TORONTO FC HISTORY

**OCTOBER 2005** Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment Ltd. and the City of Toronto are awarded the rights to create an expansion team for the 2007 MLS Season, after an agreement was reached with Major League Soccer to build a permanent soccer stadium on the Exhibition Place grounds.

**MAY 11, 2006** Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment Ltd. announces that Toronto FC will be the name of their MLS expansion franchise. During the presentation the club's logo and uniform are unveiled.

**AUGUST 22, 2006** Toronto FC name Maurice 'Mo' Johnston as the first head coach in club history.

**SEPTEMBER 8, 2006** Canadian born Jim Brennan becomes Toronto FC's first signing leaving English side Southampton and is named team captain.

**SEPTEMBER 20, 2006** The stadium at Exhibition Place is named BMO Field after naming rights are granted to Bank of Montreal.

**JANUARY 12, 2007** Toronto FC participate in their first MLS SuperDraft. Toronto selected University of Maryland midfielder Maurice Edu as the first overall pick.

**APRIL 7, 2007** Toronto FC take to the field for the first time in club history against Chivas USA. Toronto was defeated 2-0.

**APRIL 28, 2007** Toronto FC play their first home game at BMO Field against the Kansas City Wizards. Final score was 1-0 Kansas City.

**MAY 12, 2007** Toronto FC earn first victory in the MLS, 3-1 over the Chicago Fire at BMO Field. Danny Dichio scored the first goal in club history in the 24th minute of the match.

**NOVEMBER 2007** Midfielder Maurice Edu was named the MLS Rookie of the Year. Edu capped off a strong rookie campaign with four goals in 25 starts.

**FEBRUARY 1, 2008** John Carver was named the new head coach of Toronto FC. Mo Johnston remained on as the Director of Soccer.

**JULY 24, 2008** BMO Field hosts the 2008 MLS All-Star Game. The MLS All-Stars defeated West Ham United, 3-2.

**DECEMBER 12, 2008** Dwayne De Rosario traded to Toronto FC from the Houston Dynamo.

**JUNE 18, 2009** Toronto FC wins the Nutrilite Canadian Championship with a 6-1 victory over the Montreal Impact. Dwayne De Rosario scored three goals to power Toronto to victory.

**JULY 29, 2009** Toronto FC make debut in the CONCACAF Champions League in the preliminary round against the Puerto Rico Islanders.

**AUGUST 5, 2009** Toronto FC host Real Madrid in a friendly match. The game featured the debut of Kaka in a Real Madrid uniform and marked the first time Kaka and Cristiano Ronaldo appeared together for the club.

**SEPTEMBER 9, 2009** Danny Dichio announces his retirement from the game.

**SEPTEMBER 11, 2009** Canadian international Julian De Guzman signs as Toronto FC's first Designated Player.

**OCTOBER 9, 2009** The City of Toronto officially announces the approval to install natural grass at BMO Field.

**NOVEMBER 19, 2009** Predrag "Preki" Radosavljevic is named the new head coach of Toronto FC.

**FEBRUARY 2010** Construction begins on the expansion of BMO Field with 1,249 seats added into the north end of the stadium bringing the total capacity to just under 21,140.

**APRIL 6, 2010** Toronto FC's first player and captain Jim Brennan announces his retirement from playing and assumes the role of assistant general manager for the club.

**APRIL 8, 2010** Dwayne De Rosario is named the team's new captain.

**JUNE 2, 2010** Toronto FC secures back-to-back Nutrilite Canadian Championships by tying the Vancouver Whitecaps 0-0 at BMO Field.

**AUGUST 17, 2010** Toronto FC host its first match in the group stages of the CONCACAF Champions League against Cruz Azul of Mexico.

**SEPTEMBER 14, 2010** The club announces they have parted ways with Director of Soccer Mo Johnston and Head Coach Preki.

**NOVEMBER 21, 2010** BMO Field plays host to the 2010 MLS Cup. The Colorado Rapids defeated FC Dallas 2-1 in extra time to claim the championship.

**JANUARY 6, 2011** Toronto FC names Aron Winter as the club's new Head Coach & Technical Director. Joining Winter are former New England Revolution Assistant Coach Paul Mariner, as the Director of Player Development and Bob de Klerk as the team's First Assistant Coach.

**JUNE 29, 2011** Toronto FC sign midfielder Torsten Frings and forward Danny Koevermans as Designated Players.

**JULY 2, 2011** Toronto FC defeat Vancouver Whitecaps FC, 2-1 at BMO Field to win third consecutive Nutrilite Canadian Championship (3-2 on aggregate).

**OCTOBER 11, 2011** Toronto FC officially break ground on Academy and Training facility located at Downsview Park.

**OCTOBER 18, 2011** Toronto FC defeat FC Dallas, 3-0 to secure a spot in the Quarter Finals of the CONCACAF Champions League for the first time in club history.

**MARCH 7, 2012** Toronto FC host LA Galaxy at the Rogers Centre in front of 47,658 fans during the first leg of the 2011-2012 CONCACAF Champions League Quarter-Finals

**MARCH 28, 2012** Toronto FC host Santos Laguna of Mexico at BMO Field in the first leg of the 2011-2012 CONCACAF Champions League Semi-Finals.

**MAY 23, 2012** Toronto FC defeat Vancouver Whitecaps FC, 1-0 at BMO Field to win fourth consecutive Amway Canadian Championship (2-1 on aggregate).

**JUNE 7, 2012** Toronto FC name Paul Mariner the club's new head coach and director of football operations after Head Coach and Technical Director Aron Winter steps down.

## REGULAR SEASON

Each of the 19 MLS clubs will play 34 games, 17 at home and 17 away.

### WESTERN CONFERENCE – 24 IN-CONFERENCE + 10 OUT-OF-CONFERENCE GAMES

Western Conference clubs will play each West opponent 3 times (24 games):

- West clubs will play 4 conference opponents twice at home and once away.
- They will play the other 4 conference opponents once at home and twice away.
- The home and away games are reversed from 2012.

Western Conference clubs will play each East opponent once each (10 games):

- 5 of these will be at home and 5 will be away.
- The East opponents that each team faces at home and away are reversed from 2012.

### EASTERN CONFERENCE – 25 IN-CONFERENCE + 9 OUT-OF-CONFERENCE GAMES

Eastern Conference clubs will play 25 games against other East clubs:

- East teams will play 7 conference opponents three times each (21 games) and
- 2 conference opponents twice each (4 games); these will not be the same conference opponents they faced twice in 2012.
- Eastern Conference clubs will play each West opponent once each (9 games):
- Some will play 4 at home and 5 away while others will play 5 at home and 4 away.
- The West opponents that each team faces at home and away are reversed from 2012.

### POINT SYSTEM

Teams will receive three points for a win, one point for a tie and zero points for a loss.

### REFEREES

All referees in MLS are either USSF (United States Soccer Federation) or CSA (Canadian Soccer Association) National Referees. Referees for all MLS games will be trained, assigned and evaluated by PRO (Professional Referee Organization).

### GAME CLOCK

The official game time for all Major League Soccer games will be managed on the field by the referee. If necessary, the referee may also allot extra time (a.k.a. “stoppage time”) at the end of each period (first half, second half, and if applicable, first overtime period and second overtime period during playoff matches) to allow for injuries, time-wasting or other disturbances.

The stadium clock will display the time from 0:00 to 45:00 and from 45:00 to 90:00 (plus stoppage time where applicable in each half). For statistical purposes, the minutes for goals, substitutions, yellow cards, etc., will be listed from the first minute until the 90th minute. A goal scored at 15 minutes 10 seconds will be listed as having been scored in the 16th minute. Events occurring during stoppage time will follow the international norm by being demarcated with a “+” sign and the extra minutes. For example, a goal scored three minutes into first half stoppage time will be officially identified as happening at “48+”.



# 2013 MLS RULES OF COMPETITION

## GAME DAY ROSTERS

Each team can nominate 18 players for a game day roster. Teams are allowed three substitutions per game.

## CAUTIONS AND SUSPENSIONS

A player will be suspended for one game upon receiving his fifth yellow card – regardless of the nature of the infraction that resulted in his being awarded a yellow card. A second suspension of one game would result after the awarding of an additional three cards, as would a third suspension after the awarding of card number eleven. When one yellow card away from being suspended for caution accumulation, if a player appears in three consecutive games without receiving a yellow card or disciplinary sanction, the player will have one yellow card expunged. A player may take advantage of the “Good Behavior” incentive only once throughout the season.

## MLS CUP PLAYOFFS: FORMAT

**Who Qualifies:** Ten teams, the top five in points from each conference at the end of the regular season, qualify for the 2013 MLS Cup Playoffs.

The fourth and fifth place teams in each conference will play a single knockout game, the winner of which will advance to the Conference Semifinals and face the first place team in the conference.

The four Conference Semifinals will be decided by two-game aggregate series, with the lower seed hosting the first leg and the higher seed hosting the second leg. If the aggregate score is tied after 180 minutes of play, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by penalty kicks, if necessary.

The two Conference Championships will be decided by a two-game aggregate series, with the lower seed hosting the first leg and the higher seed hosting the second leg. If the aggregate score is tied after 180 minutes of play, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by penalty kicks, if necessary.

MLS Cup will be a single championship match hosted by the finalist with the most regular season points. If the two finalists have the same number of regular season points, the tiebreakers for playoff qualification will be applied to determine the host team.

If the score is tied after 90 minutes of play, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by kicks from the penalty mark, if necessary.

## TEAM-STANDINGS TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

The team awarded the highest position in the MLS standings will be the team with the greatest number of points (three points for a win, one point for a tie, zero points for a loss). In the event that two teams finish the regular season with an equal number of points, the following system will be used to break the tie:

When two or more teams are tied in the standings on points (3 points for a win, 1 point for a draw, 0 points for a loss), the following tiebreakers will be used in the sequence below, until one team ranks ahead of the other(s):

1. Most Wins
2. Goals For (See column labeled GF on [www.MLSsoccer.com/standings](http://www.MLSsoccer.com/standings) page)
3. Goal Differential (GD)
4. Fewest Disciplinary Points
5. Road Goals
6. Road Goal Differential
7. Home Goals
8. Home Goal Differential
9. Coin Toss (2 teams) or Drawing of Lots (3 or more)

## MLS CUP PLAYOFFS

- 10 clubs will qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs – the top five in points from each conference at the end of the regular season.
- The 4th and 5th place teams will play a single knockout game, the winner of which will advance to the Conference Semifinals and face the 1st-place team in the conference.
- The Conference Semifinals will be decided by a two-game, aggregate-goal format (same as 2011).
- The Conference Championships will be decided by a two-game, aggregate-goal format (change from recent years).
- MLS Cup will be hosted by the finalist that finished the regular season with the most points in the standings.



# 2013 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

## I. MLS ROSTER COMPOSITION

A Major League Soccer club's first team roster is comprised of up to 30 players. All 30 players are eligible for selection to each 18-player game-day squad during the regular season and playoffs.

### SALARY & BUDGET

- Players occupying roster spots 1-20 count against the club's 2013 salary budget of \$2,950,000, and are referred to collectively as the club's Salary Budget Players.
  - Roster spots 19 and 20 are not required to be filled, and teams may spread their salary budget across only 18 Salary Budget Players. A minimum salary budget charge will be imputed against a team's salary budget for each unfilled senior roster slot below 18.
  - The maximum budget charge for a single player is \$368,750.\*

\* See section entitled Allocation Money below, under Player Acquisition Mechanisms, for details on buying down a player's budget charge.

\*\* Age of player is determined by year (not date) of birth.

- Players occupying roster spots 21-30 do not count against the club's salary budget, and are referred to collectively as the club's Off-Budget Players (maximum of 10 per team).
  - All Generation adidas players are Off-Budget players.
  - Players occupying roster spots 1-24 will earn at least \$46,500 in 2013.
  - Players occupying roster spots 25-30 will earn at least \$35,125 in 2013.
  - Clubs may sign up to two Homegrown Players contracts above the minimum salary and similar to Generation adidas player contract amounts.

### AGE DESIGNATIONS

- Any player making \$35,125 must be under the age 25 (does not turn 25 or older in 2013).

### DOMESTIC/INTERNATIONAL

- In 2013, a total of 152 international slots are divided among the 19 clubs. Each club began with eight international slots, which are tradable. There is no limit on the number of international slots on each club's roster.
  - The remaining roster slots must belong to domestic players. For clubs based in the United States, a domestic player is either a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident (green card holder) or the holder of other special status (e.g., refugee or asylum status).
- The three MLS clubs based in Canada – Montreal Impact, Toronto FC and Vancouver Whitecaps FC – began with eight international slots, but their domestic slots may be filled with either Canadian or

U.S. domestic players.

- MLS clubs based in Canada are required to have a minimum of three Canadian domestic players on their rosters.
- Players with the legal right to work in Canada are considered Canadian domestic players (i.e., Canadian citizen, permanent resident, part of a protected class).

NOTE: The terms Homegrown and Generation adidas are used to describe mechanisms by which players are acquired. They are not roster designations. All players' roster slots are determined by their compensation and/or age as outlined above.

## II. PLAYER ACQUISITION MECHANISMS

MLS teams may acquire players and add them to their rosters via the following mechanisms:

### (A) ALLOCATION RANKING

The allocation ranking is the mechanism used to determine which MLS club has first priority to acquire a U.S. National Team player who signs with MLS after playing abroad, or a former MLS player who returns to the League after having gone to a club abroad for a transfer fee. The allocation rankings may also be used in the event two or more clubs file a request for the same player on the same day when the discovery period opens in December. The allocations will be ranked in reverse order of finish for the 2012 season, taking playoff performance into account.

Once the club uses its allocation ranking to acquire a player, it drops to the bottom of the list. A ranking can be traded, provided that part of the compensation received in return is the other club's ranking. At all times, each club is assigned one ranking. The rankings reset at the end of each MLS League season.

### ALLOCATION MONEY

Allocation money is a resource available to clubs in addition to their respective salary budgets.

A club may receive allocation money for:

- (1) failure to qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs;
- (2) the transfer of a player to a club outside of MLS for value;
- (3) expansion status;
- (4) qualification for the CONCACAF Champions League;
- (6) funds from purchased third designated player roster spots.

Each year the MLS Competition Committee determines the allocation amount to be made available to each club. Allocation money can be traded by clubs. Allocation money does not count against a club's salary budget and can be used:

- To sign players new to MLS (that is, a player who did not play in MLS during the previous season).



# 2013 MLS PLAYER RULES AND REGULATIONS SUMMARY

- To re-sign an existing MLS player, subject to League approval.
- To “buy-down” a player’s salary budget charge below the League maximum of \$368,750.
- In connection with the exercise of an option to purchase a player’s rights or the extension of a player’s contract for the second year provided the player was new to MLS in the immediately prior year.

NOTE: To protect the interests of MLS and its clubs during discussions with prospective players or clubs in other leagues, amounts of allocation money held by each club will not be shared publicly.

## (B) DESIGNATED PLAYER

The Designated Player Rule allows clubs to acquire up to three players whose salaries exceed their budget charges, with the club bearing financial responsibility for the amount of compensation above each player’s budget charge. Designated Player slots may be used to acquire players new to MLS or to retain current MLS players, subject to League approval.

In 2013, a Designated Player over the age of 23\*\* will carry a salary budget charge of \$368,750, unless the player joins his club in the middle of the season, in which case his budget charge will be \$175,000.

A Designated Player 20 years old or younger\*\* counts as \$150,000 against the club’s salary budget and a Designated Player 21-23 years old counts as \$200,000 against the club’s salary budget.

Clubs have the option of “buying down” the budget charge of a Designated Player with allocation money. The reduced charge may not be less than \$150,000.

The budget charge for the midseason signing of a young Designated Player (23 years old and younger) is \$150,000 and this amount cannot be lowered with allocation funds.

Each club has two Designated Player slots and clubs are allowed to “purchase” a third Designated Player slot for a one-time fee of \$150,000 that will be dispersed in the form of allocation money to all clubs that do not have three Designated Players. Clubs will not have to buy the third DP roster slot to accommodate Designated Players 23 years old and younger.

Designated Player slots are not tradable.

\*\* Age of player is determined by year (not date) of birth.

## (C) SUPERDRAFT

The 2013 MLS SuperDraft, held Jan. 17 in Indianapolis, IN, consisted of two rounds of 19 picks for a total of 38 player selections. A supplemental draft was held Jan. 21 via teleconference and consisted of four rounds of 19 picks.

The majority of draft prospects are NCAA college seniors who have exhausted their college eligibility. Generation adidas players and non-collegiate international players are also eligible for selection in the SuperDraft and supplemental draft. Clubs may nominate players for the

League’s draft-eligible list, and only players from that list may be selected.

Generation adidas is a joint program between MLS and adidas that is dedicated to developing exceptional domestic talent in a professional environment. Each year, a handful of top domestic underclassmen and youth national team players are signed to the league and placed in the SuperDraft through this program. Generation adidas players also receive an educational stipend.

**Draft Order:** The first nine selections went to the clubs that did not qualify for the 2012 MLS Cup Playoffs beginning with the club with fewest regular season points (3 points per win, one point per tie). The remaining ten positions were ranked by fewest regular season points among the teams that were eliminated in the same round of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

Unless claimed on waivers, a player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign with the League, is placed on that team’s “College Protected List” until the second December 31 following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to the player.

## (D) TRADES

Players, SuperDraft and Supplemental draft picks, allocation money, allocation rankings, and international player slots may all be exchanged in trades approved by the MLS League Office, provided all of the necessary rules regarding roster and salary budget compliance are met and the trade is completed during a valid trading period. No trades may occur after the Roster Freeze Deadline of September 13, 2013 at 5 p.m. ET.

## (E) DISCOVERY SIGNINGS

Clubs may make discovery claims on players not yet under MLS contract who are not subject to the allocation ranking or lottery mechanisms.

Each club has the opportunity to make six discovery signings per season (expansion teams may make 10 discovery signings in their inaugural season). A club may have up to 10 discovery claims on unsigned players at any time and may remove or add players at any time. The last day for discovery player signings is September 13, 2013 – coinciding with the roster freeze date and trade deadline.

The six discovery signings can be used to fill senior roster spots only. If multiple clubs claim the same player using a discovery, the club that filed the claim first will have first rights to the player. Discovery claims expire following each season. If the League and player are unable to reach an agreement during the season, the club that first filed the discovery retains the right of first refusal in the event the player is later signed by the League.

Note: To protect interests of MLS clubs in scouting and negotiations with prospective players, the League office will not publicize the names of players on club discovery lists, nor specify if a discovery claim has been filed on a particular player.

# 2013 MLS PLAYER RULES & REGULATIONS

## (F) HOMEGROWN PLAYER SIGNINGS

A club may sign a player to his first professional contract without subjecting him to the MLS SuperDraft if the player has trained for at least one year in the club's youth development program and has met the League's Homegrown Player criteria. Players joining MLS through this mechanism are known as Homegrown Players.

There is no limit to the number of Homegrown Players a club may sign in a given year.

## (G) RE-ENTRY PROCESS

The 2012 Re-Entry Process will commence after MLS Cup. The priority order for the Re-Entry Draft is reverse order of finish in 2012, taking into account playoff performance.

Available to all teams in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry draft will be:

1. Players who are at least 23 years old and have a minimum of three years experience in MLS whose options were not exercised by their clubs (available at option salary for 2014).
2. Players who are at least 25 years old with a minimum of four years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them at their previous salary (available for at least their 2013 salary).
3. Players who are at least 30 years old with a minimum of eight years of MLS experience who are out of contract and whose club does not wish to re-sign them (available for at least 105% of their 2013 salary).

Players who are not selected in Stage 1 of the Re-Entry Draft will be made available in Stage 2. Clubs selecting players in 2 will negotiate a new salary with the player.

Players who remain unselected after Stage 2 will be available to any MLS club on a first come, first serve basis.

## (H) WAIVERS

A team may place a player on waivers at any time during the regular season at which point he is made available to all other teams. The waiver claiming period shall commence on the first business day after the League delivers notice to teams and shall expire at 5 p.m. EST on the second business day after the Waiver Period Commencement Date. The claiming period is 48 hours.

The Waiver Draft order is determined via points per game once all teams have played at least three MLS League games. If the waiver takes place prior to all teams playing in at least three League games, priority shall be granted based upon the prior year's performance, taking playoff performance first, with teams eliminated from playoff contention at the same stage separated according to their point totals through the end of the regular season. New expansion teams shall be at the bottom of the waiver order.

Once a team selects a player off waivers, that club is automatically moved to the bottom of the priority list for subsequent waiver selections in a given season, regardless of its points-per-game total. Players who may be placed on the MLS waiver wire are as follows:

- (i) A player waived by an MLS team in the current season;
- (ii) A player who completed his college eligibility within the past season, who was not made available in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft;
- (iii) A player who has remaining college eligibility (and was not made available in the SuperDraft or Supplemental Draft), but the League at its discretion and after taking into account exceptional circumstances determines the player may be offered an MLS contract;
- (iv) A player who has played in MLS previously where his last MLS team does not wish to exercise their right of first refusal, except in the case of returning U.S. National Team players as stated above.
- (v) A player who was drafted in the SuperDraft or supplemental draft, and who after a trial with the club is not offered a contract by the first Monday of June.

## (I) LOTTERY

Some players shall be assigned to MLS teams via the weighted Lottery process. Any team assigned a player through the lottery in any particular season shall not be assigned another lottery player that season unless and until all teams have received a lottery player or have agreed to waive their option to participate in a Lottery. The players made available through lotteries include:

- (i) Generation adidas players signed after the MLS SuperDraft;
- (ii) Draft eligible players to whom an MLS contract was offered but who failed to sign with the League prior to the Draft.

The weighted lottery takes into consideration each team's performance over its last 34 regular season games and the most recent postseason. The team with the worst record over its last 34 regular season games (dating back to previous season if necessary and taking playoff performance into account) will have the greatest probability of winning the lottery. Teams are not required to participate in a lottery. Players are assigned via the lottery system in order to prevent a player from potentially influencing his destination club with a strategic holdout.

## (J) EXTREME HARDSHIP CALL-UPS

Teams may add players to their roster in cases of "extreme hardship" as follows: (1) a club with three goalkeepers on its 30-man roster, but has less than two available goalkeepers or (2) a team has less than 15 available players. Extreme hardship call-ups are made on a game-by-game basis.



# 2013 MLS PLAYER RULES & REGULATIONS

## (K) SEASON-ENDING INJURY REPLACEMENTS (SEASON ENDING INJURY LIST)

A team with a player lost to a season-ending injury can place the player on the Season Ending Injury List and replace that player on its roster, while remaining responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary. A player can be placed on the season-ending injury list once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). International player limits still apply at the time a season-ending replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

## (L) SHORT-TERM INJURY REPLACEMENTS (DISABLED LIST)

A player who has a short-term injury can be placed on the Disabled List once another player has been signed as a replacement (provided the team has budget space). The team will remain responsible for the full amount of the injured player's salary on the salary budget. Note: the injured player will have to sit out a minimum of six MLS League matches before he can rejoin the team's roster.

International player limits still apply at the time a short-term replacement is made (with the player being replaced not counting against those limits).

**NOTE:** No changes may be made to a team's active full roster during the period beginning on September 14, 2013 (day after Roster Freeze Date) through the day after MLS Cup. Nevertheless, a team may obtain players in accordance with the extreme hardship rules and procedures to replace players who are injured or otherwise legitimately unavailable after the Roster Freeze Date. Any other replacements after the Roster Freeze Date may only be made in exceptional circumstances in the League's sole and absolute discretion.

## (III.) METHODS OF RELEASING PLAYERS

### (A) WAIVERS

Teams may waive players based on performance at any time during the MLS season. Players with guaranteed contracts will continue to have their salary budget charge applied to the team salary budget, subject to any settlement. Players on semi-guaranteed contracts can be waived prior to July 1 of any year and free up the corresponding budget space. If a player on a semi-guaranteed contract is waived after July 1, his salary budget charge will count against the team's salary budget and the team waiving the player will not receive a replacement except under the normal player acquisition mechanisms. Any settlement amount will be charged to the team's salary budget.

### (B) TRANSFERS AND LOANS

An MLS player may be transferred or loaned at any time to a team outside the League (subject to that team's Federation's transfer window), subject to the consent of the player.

The registration windows – the dates between which MLS may request the transfer certificate of a player under contract in another country – are as follows:

- February 12 – May 6 (Primary Window)
- July 9 – August 8 (Secondary Window)

### (C) CONTRACT EXPIRATION

When a player's contract expires, the player does not count against the roster or budget of the team in question. Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the rights to the player indefinitely following the expiration of a contract only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

### (D) BUYOUT OF GUARANTEED CONTRACT

Teams may have the ability to buyout one guaranteed player as follows:

- A Team may buy out one (1) guaranteed player (including a DP's) contract during the off-season and free up the corresponding budget space. Such a buyout is at the particular MLS Team's own expense.
- A Team may not free up budget space with a buyout of a player's salary budget charge during the season. Such a buyout will be conducted by the League and count on a Club's budget in a manner consistent with current MLS guidelines.

### (IV.) RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL

Right of first refusal grants one MLS club the first opportunity to add a player to its roster in the event that the player signs with MLS. Holding a right of first refusal applies only within MLS and does not indicate holding of the player's International Transfer Certificate.

#### **Out of contract players / options not picked up:**

Subject to the Re-Entry Draft rules, a team retains the right of first refusal to the player indefinitely only if attempts were made to re-sign the player.

**Drafted but not signed:** A player who was drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft or supplemental draft and did not sign, or who as of the first Monday in June is not offered a contract after a trial and clears waivers, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second December 31 immediately following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to sign the player.

**Player transferred outside MLS:** If a team receives allocation money as a result of a player's transfer, the team does not retain a right of first refusal.
