

HEAD COACH | GÜNTER KRONSTEINER

Hometown: Hieflau, Austria

Günter Kronsteiner came to the Strikers on July 17th, 2013 as head coach and sports director for the team. Under Coach Kronsteiner, the Strikers finished with a 5-3-6 record in the Fall 2013 Season.

Prior to joining Kronsteiner's professional career as a player began in 1978 in Austria with Donawitzer SV Leoben. He later played with FC Wacker Innsbruck, where he won two titles with the



team in the Austrian Bundesliga and participated in the UEFA Cup. He then went on to play with FC Salzburg, LASK Linz and finally with Rapid Lienz where he began his coaching career as a player/coach in 1984.

Aside from his coaching experience, Kronsteiner has also worked as sports director for several organizations including FC Casino Salzburg, which reached the finals of the UEFA Cup in 1994.

As the sports director for Austria Vienna, Kronsteiner oversaw Joachim Löw, before Löw was hired by Jürgen Klinsmann to be his assistant coach of the German National Team in 2004. Kronsteiner then took over Austria Vienna as the head coach and led the team to the Quarterfinals of the UEFA Cup in 2005.

1 OKA NIKOLOV

Position:Goalkeeper Date of Birth:05-25-1974 Age:39 Country:Germany Weight:189.2 lbs Height:6.2'

2014: German Bundesliga veteran Oka Nikolov signed with the Strikers on January 28, 2014 for the 2014 NASL Spring Season. He brings to the club nearly 20 years of professional experience with Eintracht Frankfurt in Germany.

Professional: He spent nineteen seasons with German giants Eintracht
Frankfurt, appearing in 413 official games over the course of 13 Bundesliga seasons (19 overall).

After leaving the Bundesliga, Nikolov signed with Philadelphia Union of Major League Soccer in 2013, fufilling his lifelong dream to play in the United States.

International: Nikolov chose to represent Macedonia, the country of his ancestors, instead of Germany at the international level. He was unable to acquire a Macedonian passport because he possessed German nationality, and was therefore unable to appear in any official matches under FIFA ruling. He made five appearances for Macedonia, all in friendlies.



2 STEFAN ANTONIJEVIC

2014: Antonijevic re-signed with the Strikers for the 2014 season on February 14, 2014.

2013: On March 25, 2013 Stefan Antonijevic put pen to paper on his first professional contract with the Strikers.

Antonijevic made his professional debut for the Strikers in the 1-0 win against FC Edmonton on May 26th, partnering Justin Chavez in center defense. He and Chavez were named to the NASL Team of the Week for their performances in the shutout win in Edmonton.

Under head coach Günter Kronsteiner, Antonijevic became a regular starter, partnering Rafael Alves in defense. Antonijevic started and played 90 minutes in the 2-1 win against San Antonio Scorpions on August 17th, before starting the remaining 11 matches in the Fall season.

Antonijevic finished 2013 with 14 starts in 15 matches. He helped keep four shutouts and picked up just a single vellow card.

Professional: Antonijevic was selected by Sporting Kansas City as the 43rd overall pick in the 2012 Supplemental Draft. He spent time with Sporting KC and Chicago Fire in preseason, but did not sign a pro contract with either MLS franchise.

Had training stints with Spartak Zlatibor Voda in the Serbian first division and HNK Rijeka in Croatia.

College: Played college ball at Valparaiso University. As a defender Antonijevic recorded eight goals and three assists in 59 appearances over three seasons for the Crusaders.

He was named the Horizon League Defensive Player of the Year in 2011, earned Second Team All-Horizon League two years in a row, and was a First Team All-League honoree and NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region First Team selection in 2011.

Amateur: Played PDL for Chicago Fire Premier. In 2009 Antonijevic won the USASA U23 National Cup Championship and USASA Region III U23 Men's Cup with Carolina RailHawks U23.

International: Antonijevic has been capped by Serbia at the U-19 level.

Personal: Antonijevic is a dual citizen of USA and Serbia. His father Zelimir Antonijevic played professional soccer in Yugoslavia, and his younger brother currently plays collegiate volleyball at Pepperdine.

2014: 20-year old Mitchell Lopez signed with the Fort Lauderdale Strikers on March 28, 2014. Lopez was discovered by the Strikers at an open tryout in February and earned a contract after impressing the coaching staff during preseason.

Professional: Played for Club Atlético Peñarol.

Personal: Mitchell wears his first name on his jersey. He was born in Opa-locka, Fla. and grew up in Brazil, Uruguay and South Florida.



5 MATT HALL

2014: The Strikers announced the signing of Matt Hall on March 12, 2014.

Professional: Hall signed his first professional contract in 2012 with the L.A. Blues of USL Pro (the third division of professional soccer in the United States). He made 33 appearances in two seasons.



Amateur: While in college, Hall played for Hampton Roads Piranhas in the PDL and later with Arizona Sahuaro of the NPSL. He also had stints with Thunder Bay Chill, Vermont Voltage, and the Las Vegas Knights.

College: Between 2005 and 2006, Hall played college soccer at Tyler Junior College, before transferring to Grand Canyon University for his junior and senior year.



6 CHRIS NURSE

2014: The Strikers announced the signing of Guyana national team captain Chris Nurse on March 14, 2014.

Professional: Chris Nurse started his career in England with non-league side Kingstonian F.C. in 2002. Spells with Sutton United, Aldershot Town, Moor Green, Hinckley United, Tamworth, Stevenage Borough and Halesowen Town followed.



In 2009, Nurse left England to join USL First Division side Rochester Rhinos in Rochester, NY. He joined AFC Telford United in England before signing with Puerto Rico Islanders for the 2010 USSF-D2 Pro League season.

Nurse captured the CFU Club Championship with the Islanders in 2010. He was part of the Islanders team that defeated MLS side Los Angeles Galaxy 5-3 on aggregate and progressed to the group stages of the CONCACAF Champions League for the third consecutive year. Nurse won the USSF Division 2 Pro League championship title defeating the Carolina RailHawks in the final.

Carolina RailHawks signed Nurse for the 2011 North American Soccer League season. Nurse was part of the RailHawks team that that broke almost every existing club record and collected the regular season title. He left the RailHawks during the 2012 season to re-join Puerto Rico Islanders. In 2013, Nurse joined FC Edmonton where he re-established himself as one of the premier holding midfielders in the league.

International: Despite being born in England, Nurse, who is of Guyanese descent, elected to play for the Guyana national football team. Nurse captained Guyana during the 2014 FIFA World Cup qualification matches.



2014: De Mujica signed on for a second season with the Strikers on January 8, 2014.

2013: The Fort Lauderdale Strikers announced local product Gonzalo De Mujica signed with the team on January 31, 2013.



Amateur: During college, De Mujica played in the United Soccer League (USL) with Central Florida Kraze (now Orlando City U-23) in 2009, Schulz Academy in 2010, FC JAX Destroyers in 2011, and again with Orlando City U-23 in 2012.

College: De Mujica was a four-year starter for the Stetson University Hatters in DeLand, Fla., from 2007-2011. As a freshman, Mujica earned Atlantic Sun All-Freshman honors and had five goals and seven assists for the Hatters. As a sophomore, De Mujica earned Atlantic Sun All-Academic Team honors while starting all 20 games for Stetson.

As a junior, he again earned All-Academic Team honors while also earning a spot on the Second Team All-Atlantic Sun Team. De Mujica finished his junior year with five goals, three assists and assisted on a game-winning goal in the Atlantic-Sun semifinals against Jacksonville University. He earned First Team Atlantic-Sun, Third Team NSCAA All-South Region, Third Team NSCAA Scholar All-American and First Team NSCAA Scholar All-South Region honors as a senior, scoring five goals and leading the Hatters in assists with seven.

High School: De Mujica graduated from Cypress Bay High School in Weston, Fla. His high school soccer honors included being named the BCAA All-Star Team MVP and Herald All-Broward Team.

Personal: Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina.





8 PECKA

2014: The Strikers announced that Pecka would be returning to the club for another season on January 22, 2014. It was subsequently announced that Pecka would go on loan to Madureira Esporte Clube in Brazil until April.

2013: On October 17, 2012 the Fort Lauderdale Strikers announced that Pecka had signed a new contract with the club and would be returning to play for the 2013 season.

Pecka started in center midfield alongside compatriot Rubens in the first match of the season against FC Edmonton on April 6th. Was named to the NASL Team of the Week for Week 1.

Recorded his first assist of the season on April 20th against Carolina RailHawks, setting up Jemal Johnson for the opening goal. Pecka was named to the NASL Team of the Week for the second time in 2013 after the 2-1 defeat against Minnesota United FC on June 8th.

Pecka was appointed captain ahead of the Fall season. On August 10, Pecka was injured in a match against Minnesota and had to be substituted in the first half. He finished 2013 with 17 appearances, all starts, and one assist.

2012: The 2012 season was Pecka's first full season with the Strikers. Following the departure of Bryan Arguez to the Montreal Impact in the offseason, Pecka claimed to the holding midfield position. He formed a solid partnership with on-loan DC United midfielder Conor Shanosky in the center of midfield.

Pecka scored his first goal for the club on September 8, 2012 in a 1-1 draw with the Puerto Rico Islanders. He finished the season with 22 starts from 27 appearances in all competitions and scored one goal.

2011: Wellington Paeckart, better known as Pecka, was the last signing made by the Fort Lauderdale Strikers during the 2011 season, joining the club on August 22, 2011. He inherited the number 8 jersey, last worn by compatriot Lennon Celestino.

Pecka made four starts in eight total appearances in his first season with the Strikers, contributing one assist.

Youth: Pecka started his youth career in the academy of one of Brazil's most storied clubs, Flamengo. Without making a first team appearance with the club, Pecka was loaned to Centro de Futebol Zico Sociedade Esportiva.

International: In 2006, Pecka was selected to represent the U-18 Brazilian national team at the Sendai Cup International Youth Tournament in Japan.



9 MARTIN NUÑEZ

2014: On January 24, 2014 the Strikers secured the re-signing of the club's leading-goalscorer in 2013.

2013: After spending the 2012 season with Minnesota Stars FC (now Minnesota United FC), Nuñez returned to the Fort Lauderdale Strikers ahead of the 2013 NASL Fall season.



He made his return to the team in the first match of the Fall season, coming on as a substitute in the 2-1 defeat to The New York Cosmos on August 3. Nuñez scored his first goal of the season in the next match, a 3-1 defeat to Minnesota United FC on August 10. He started the next match, a 2-1 victory against San Antonio Scorpions on August 17, opening the scoring in just the second minute of the match.

Nuñez finished 2013 as the Strikers leading goalscorer with five goals. He made 11 starts in 13 appearances in the Fall season.

2011: The Fort Lauderdale Strikers re-signed Martin Nuñez ahead of the 2011 NASL season. He began the campaign as a starting forward, but lost his place due to the good form of strike partnership between Abe Thompson and Brian Shriver. Nuñez was often used as a substitute to provide an injection of energy into the game. In stoppage time of the August 8th encounter with the Carolina RailHawks, Nuñez scored with a last-gasp volley to steal a win for the Strikers. It was just one of many important goals he scored in 2011 for the Strikers.

Martin Nuñez played 29 games in all competitions with the Strikers, starting 13 of them. He scored a total of 5 goals, and contributed 3 assists.

2010: Nuñez signed with Miami FC (now the Fort Lauderdale Strikers) towards the end of the 2010 USSF-D2 season. He was limited to the role of a bit-part player, often coming on towards the end of matches. Nuñez played nine games in 2010, and tallied a goal and an assist.

Nuñez had an exceptional debut season with the RailHawks, scoring five goals from 28 games as an attacking midfield position. He was nominated for Rookie of the Year, but lost out to Osvaldo Alonso, now with the Seattle Sounders FC of MLS.

Nuñez joined the Puerto Rico Islanders for the 2009 season. He couldn't replicate the good form he showed in Carolina, and was released from the club after playing just 14 games.

After two seasons in South Florida, Nuñez was traded to Minnesota Stars FC in exchange for defender Jack Stewart. He played 25 games for the Stars in their run to the NASL Championship Series, scoring 5 goals.

College: Martin attended Georgia Perimeter College in 2006 where he played one year of college soccer. In his sole season with the Jaguars he scored 30 goals and provided 17 assists, leading the team to an impressive 23-1-1 record. After an outstanding season, Nuñez opted to turn professional.

2013: The Fort Lauderdale Strikers announced the signing of veteran Iván Guerrero for the 2013 season on January 24, 2013.

Guerrero made his first appearance for the Strikers on April 20th against Carolina RailHawks, starting and playing the entire 90 minutes at left back. Guerrero started and played every match in the Fall season. In August, he assisted on the winning goals in matches against Atlanta and Carolina.

Guerrero recorded an unprecedented four assists in the 6-2 win against Atlanta at Lockhart on October 19th. He finished the Fall season as the league-leader and Strikers top-provider with six assists. Guerrero made 22 appearances in 2013, all starts, and captained the side on many occasions.

Professional: Guerrero began his professional career in 1996 with Club Deportivo Motagua of the first division of Honduran soccer. He made 99 appearances with Motagua before transferring to Coventry City, then of the English Premier League, in 2000.

He started four of the five remaining Spring season games.

Chavez was used as a substitute under new head coach Günter Kronsteiner in the Fall season. He made the bench in 13 of the 14 Fall matches, coming on as a substitute seven times. After coming on as a substitute on October 5th against Tampa Bay, Chavez dummied a pass from Paulo Jr. for Bradlee Baladez to score the winning goal in a 2-1 victory at Lockhart. Wearing the number 99 jersey, Hassan made his first appearance of the season from the bench in a 2-1 loss to the Rowdies. Hassan started the international friendly match against Brazilian Serie A side Cruzeiro on June 23rd and suffered a broken nose. Hassan was limited to just six substitute appearances in 2013.

High School: Brown was team captain, a BCAA All-Star Goalie and an All-State Honorable Mention at Coconut Creek High School.







Pérez finished the season with 9 starts in 10 league appearances. He scored three goals and one assist.


