On December 7, 2020 the National Women's Soccer League announced the return of professional women's soccer to Kansas City as founders Angie Long, Chris Long and Brittany Matthews were awarded an expansion team to begin play in the 2021 season.

With only 37 days from inception to their first draft, the ownership group began to assemble their new organization. In the inaugural season, the NWSL expansion team announced they will play with the KC crest, while the club develops a permanent name and brand for future seasons.

Kansas City NWSL brings the women's game back to the Soccer Capital of America. Drawing on the success of KC's championship history, with an eye towards future accomplishments, this team seeks to always live up to the promise that We Play For Kansas City.



ANGIE LONG Founder

Angie is a trailblazer in the world of credit-related asset management, having dedicated her entire career to portfolio management and trading. She spent more than a decade working on Wall Street and was named Managing Director

of JPMorgan Chase & Co. at age 29. She held many senior roles, including Deputy Head of North America Credit Trading, before moving to Palmer Square Capital Management where she serves as Chief Investment Officer and leads all investment-related activities.

An advocate for equal opportunities for women no matter what field or industry, Angie's determination and vision was critical in securing an expansion franchise for Kansas City. Her commitment to the vision is one of many ways in which Angie proudly supports women, opening more doors for generations to come behind her.

Angie is a Kansas City native who grew up playing many sports at a high level, including soccer where she excelled as a goalie. consistently among the top WNBA teams in ticket sales and saw significant growth in merchandising, broadcast distribution and partnerships.

ECNL efforts are grounded in player-centered programming, which creates a better, more enjoyable experience and, ultimately, more successful players, coaches and clubs.

The ECNL Girls is widely considered the top development and competition environment in the world for youth female players. Since 2016 more than half of all players drafted in the NWSL played as youth players in the ECNL; and in the 2021 NWSL Draft, the top four players drafted, and 29 of the 40 players drafted in total, played in the league.

Coach Williams is a widely recognized coach and sports management executive at all levels of the industry—from professional to youth. The Welsh native has spent his entire career playing, coaching and managing sports, predominately soccer. He founded GSI Sports, a regional sports management company, in 2001.

Williams served as General Manager and Assistant Coach of FC Kansas City from 2012-2016. During his stint as GM, the club won two National Women's Soccer League Championships.

He holds the USSF 'A' License and is currently undertaking the Senior 'A' license. Williams recently served as an opposition scout for the USWNT and was included on Matt Potter's USWNT U23s and Laura Harvey's USWNT U20s coaching staffs.

Coach Williams has coached numerous youth players who have gone on to play professionally, including six players who currently play in the NWSL. He has a lifelong passion for the game, and is proud of his contribution in helping build Kansas City into a city which develops highly-talented players for both the MLS and the NWSL.

PROFESSIONAL

2016-2017: Boston Breakers - Smith was drafted in the third round of the 2016 NWSL College Draft and signed with the Boston Breakers in April 2016. Smith suffered a season-ending knee injury during the second game of the season in May 2016. Smith won the starting job during the 2017 season and appeared in 19 games for the Boston Breakers in the net.

2018-2019: Utah Royals - Due to the Boston Breakers team concluding their club, Smith was acquired by the Utah Royals in the Dispersal Draft on January 30, 2018. She appeared in 17 games for the Royals in 2018 and signed a new contract with the team before the 2019 season.

2021: KC NWSL - Smith started the first two games of the Challenge Cup preseason tournament.

INTERNATIONAL

Smith has represented the United States on the U-17, U-20, and U-23 National teams. In May 2017, she was called up to the USWNT for friendlies against Norway and Sweden but did not appear in either match.

COLLEGE

2012: Smith came in as the starting goalkeeper for Texas for the last 12 games of the season during her freshman year. She allowed 8 goals and made 34 saves. During this stretch, she set a record for a Texas rookie goalkeeper for the lowest goals-against an average of 0.63. Smith's save percentage of .810 was first in the Big 12 Conference and second in overall Goals Against Average. Smith helped lead the way with the help of the defensive line that tied the regular-season record for the fewest goals allowed (five) in the Big 12 Conference. She received the Soccer America Goalkeeper of the week following a 1-0 shutout against Oklahoma State on October 5, 2012.

2013: Smith started all 20 matches and scored her first career goal. She made 72 saves with 9 shutouts while maintaining a 0.78 goals-against average (GAA). She recorded nine shutouts tying the school record for the most in the single season. Her 24 career shutouts ranked second in school history. Concluding the season she was awarded All-Big 12 Conference First Team.

2014. Smith finished up her junior season with a 0.92 GAA and 98 saves which ranked first in the Big 12. 2015: During Smith's senior season, she was a National Finalist for the 2015 Senior Class Award and was named to the All-Big 12 Conference First Team Academic Team. Furthermore, she was named ESPNW Player of the week for the week on October 21, 2015, and Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week twice during October. Smith ranked first in the Big 12 conference for total saves with 96 and saves per match with 5.33. She set a new school shutout record on October 30 with her 30th career shutout. She also scored a game-winning goal for her third career goal on a 90-plus-yard punt against the University of Miami.

HIGH SCHOOL

Smith attended Plano West High School in Texas where she was the starting goalkeeper until she graduated a semester early to facilitate travel with the U.S. Women's National Team.

YOUTH

Smith played club soccer for the Dallas Texans 94 Red Soccer Club from 2005-2012. She captained the team for four years and led them to the Nike Cup victory in Portland, Oregon, Gothia Cup in Sweden, and the US Youth Soccer championship finals in 2009. Following the season in 2009, Smith was awarded USYS ODP National Championship Golden Glove. Smith was also twice named to the National Coaches Association of America Youth All-America honoree in 2010 and 2011 and was named Parade Magazine All-American in 2010.

2008-2014: Glasgow City - Corsie joined Glasgow City from Aberdeen Ladies when she was 18. In her first season, she contributed 10 goals as the club won a domestic treble. She also was featured in the UEFA Women's Champions League. In May of 2012, Corsie made her 100th league appearance.

2014: Notts County - Corsie left Glasgow City to pursue soccer in England in 2014. She has a successful year at Notts where she was captain and was awarded Supporters Player of the Season and joint Managers Player of the Season.

2015-2017: Seattle Reign FC - Corsie signed in the National Women Soccer League for the Seattle Reign for the 2015 season.

2018-2020: Utah Royals - Corsie signed with the Utah Royals for the 2018 season where she appeared in all 24 games for Utah and was named to the NWSL Team of the Month in July. Corsie returned to Utah for the 2019 season and was again named NWSL Team of the Month for May. Corsie scored her first goal for the Royals on July 19 to earn a 2-2 draw against the Portland Thorns. Corsie missed several NWSL games due to participating in the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup.

2021: KC NWSL - Corsie has started 4 games so far for Kansas City with 357 minutes played.

INTERNATIONAL

In March 2011, Corsie captained the team to a 2-0 win over England, a first for Scotland in more than 30 years. Corsie scored four goals for Scotland during UEFA qualifying for the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. Scotland finished second in their stage and advanced to the UEFA play-offs where they were eliminated by the Netherlands. In 2017, Corsie and Scotland qualified for the European championships for the first time where she appeared in all three group games for Scotland. On September 10, 2017, Corsie was named the new captain of Scotland's Women's National Team. Corsie made her 100th international appearance on June 12, 2018, in a 2019 World Cup qualifier against Poland where Scotland won and qualified for the World Cup for the first time ever. Corsie made her World Cup debut at the 2019 World Cup where she played every minute of Scotland's group games.

PERSONAL

Has a massed 122 appearances on the Scotland National Team and 17 career goals in her international career. Corsie's great-grandfather was Aberdeen FC legend, Donald Colman. Corsie remains an Aberdeen FC supporter and models her game on that of Zander Diamond.

2011: Stjarnan - Edmonds signed with Icelandic Team Stjarnan and helped the team with the league championship and Icelandic Women's Cup.

2012-2013: WFC Rossiyanka -

Edmonds joined WFC Rossiyanka of the Russian Premier League for the 2012-2013 season where she made 13 appearances while recording seven assists and scoring two goals. Rossiyanka finished in first place in the regular season with a record of 10-1-3. Edmonds made two appearances with the club in the 2012-13 UEFA Women's Champions League. Edmonds made 13 starts in 13 games in the 2013 season where she scored one goal while the team placed fourth in the regular season with a record of 8-4-2. She then made four appearances for the club in the 2013-2014 UEFA Women's Champions League.

2014-2015: Western New York Flash - Edmonds signed with the Western New York Flash in the NWSL for the 2014 season where she started 19 of 22 games. She recorded an assist while playing defender. The Flash finished the season in seventh place. In the 2015 season, Edmonds made 10 starts in her 11 appearances while recording one assist. Again, the club placed seventh place.

2016-2020: Orlando Pride - Edmonds was traded to the Orlando Pride in December of 2015. She started in all of the 19 games where she scored six goals while playing midfield. She scored two goals in the 2017 season and 1 goal in the 2018 season for the Pride.

2021: KC NWSL - Edmonds has appeared in two games for Kansas City while logging two starts for those games for a total of 151 minutes.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials and access will be granted only to individuals with a legitimate working function at a game, training session or event. The bearer must be on a specific assignment. Credentials are non-transferable. Any unauthorized use of a credential subjects the bearer to ejection from the event. Resale or attempted resale is grounds for seizure and cancellation.

The following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the stadium or training facility:

- · Requesting autographs at any time.
- · Taking photographs with players/coaches
- · Using credential for family or friends of a working media member
- Conduction of unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (Cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages, failure to abide by posted rules, etc.)

Credential Applications

Kansas City NWSL is accepting applications for Season-Long Credentials and Single-Game Credentials. Members of the media with season-long credentials will be given priority at all Kansas City NWSL home matches. Due to COVID restrictions, space is limited and media must RSVP to gain access. Media credentials do not guarantee entry into the venue without prior reservation.

All single-game credential requests must be submitted in advance two (2) days prior to the scheduled match. Applications and reservations can be found throughout the season at KCWoso.com/credential-applications

Upon arrival at the venue, your name will be confirmed on a list of approved attendees for that particular match. Once your name is confirmed, you will receive a credential that allows you to enter and exit the venue. Your credential access will determine the areas of the venue you will be able to visit.

Treatment of Credentialed Media

Postgame Media Access: Players from both teams will be available to media post-game in a mix-zone located outside the team locker rooms or in a location near the field of play. The mix-zone will begin 10 minutes after the conclusion of the match. Locker rooms will not be open to media at any point.

No individuals other than League or Club representatives shall be allowed in Club locker rooms following a game.

Under no circumstances shall any club and/or its players discriminate in any fashion against an accredited member of the media based upon race, creed, sex or national origin.

Seating Access: Accredited media members will have access to the stadium, professional workrooms and stadium seating, if available. During the match, accredited media will have access to the press box which will be restricted to only those accredited media members.

All credentialed media shall be seated in media seating areas, consistent with treatment afforded comparable media. In addition, all members of the media are to be afforded equal treatment and access to facilities and personnel, regardless of sex.

Traveling Media: Members of the working media who travel with a visiting team will not be treated in a discriminatory manner with regard to seating or any other privilege or facility accorded to the home media. Comparable seating and equipment should apply to home and road media (print and electronic).

Media Access to Practice: Kansas City NWSL will work to provide media access to practice whenever possible. If practices are closed, Kansas City NWSL will grant a 30-minute media access period at the start or end of practice at least once per week. In addition, Kansas City NWSL will make a member of the coaching staff and a player available for interviews at least once per week.

Game Day Guidelines for Photographers and Camera Operators: All photographers and television camera operators must stay behind the field boards at all times, unless released by the on-site photo marshal.

Each photographer will be permitted to use one monopod — but no tripods.

Stand-alone remote units on or around the goal posts will not be permitted without permission from the Home Team, the NWSL and the Referees.

Photographer Access to field: Photographers shall be permitted behind the field boards in designated areas in Legends Field. Photographers must not be blocking viewing of fans or spectators in any capacity.

Once situated, no movement shall be permitted until halftime. Changes in this policy will be allowed in cases where stadium facilities dictate alterations. No photographers shall be allowed near the team benches. Game Day Photographer Identification: In addition to their regular credential photographers will be issued colored bibs. Photographers will pick up their bib when they check-in at the stadium and return as they leave. Game Day Photography Work Area: A work area will be provided for photographers, near the field where appropriate, with high-speed internet access.

MEDIA GUIDELINES

NON-RIGHTS HOLDER VIDEO GUIDELINES

Video Footage:

All rights to match footage including all applicable copyrights belong to the National Women's Soccer League and its rights holders who broadcast each specific match.

Television Broadcasters

Game Action: Television broadcasters can use footage of NWSL events obtained either via 1) their own recording or 2) action dubbed from a NWSL rights holder broadcast with credit only in connection with its regularly scheduled news programming within a week of the game. This footage should not exceed two (2) minutes. Highlights aired as part of a continuous news program should not be longer than one (1) minute per 30-minute segment. Credits: NWSL / Kansas City.

Filming – Game Action: FOR TELEVISED EVENTS, NON-RIGHTS HOLDERS / ENG CAMERAS MAY RECORD THE FIRST 5 MINUTES OF EACH HALF. For non-televised events, non-rights holders / ENG cameras may record the entire game but are still subject to the aforementioned limits. This includes events that are web streamed live online.

Filming - Interviews and Scene Sets: There is no limit to the gathering of footage pre-game, at halftime and post-game. All footage gathered is subject to the usage guidelines indicated in this document.

Filming – In Seating Area: Video cameras looking to shoot in the concourse or seating area must contact home team and NWSL in advance of the event for approval.

Previews or Advances: In advance of a NWSL event, television broadcasters can use two (2) minutes of archival game action to preview an upcoming event. In the local/regional markets, broadcasters should mention the time and location of the game along with their report. Outside of the local markets, broadcasters should mention the time and broadcast information.

Television Broadcasters' Web Sites: Video produced for air as part of regular programming that is simulcast or archived online must be accompanied by a link to NWSLSoccer.com. Content produced exclusively for the Internet is subject to the guidelines for Online Video.

Online Video

Game Action: Online organizations (including print publications that post video online) are not permitted to film or use game action video without prior written approval by NWSL. Game action includes any footage of the field, teams, etc., following the beginning of the television broadcast window. Only video of off-field activities (i.e. interviews, training sessions) may be recorded.

Non-Game Video: Any video posted online that is recorded as part of media access is limited to the use of eight (8) minutes per day/activity date. Online video may not incorporate integrated advertising and must be accompanied by links to NWSLSoccer.com.

Professional Presentation: Online video is expected to be recorded, edited and presented in a professional manner. Video must be presented/hosted on an organization's website, and not solely on a site provided by a third-party (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, Facebook, etc.).

Online Video Sites: Organizations who regularly post video to online video sites (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, etc.) may not include advertising with video gathered as a result of media access. Allowing users to embed these videos is not permitted, and the description of any video must include a link to NWSLSoccer.com.

SWOPE SOCCER VILLAGE



Swope Soccer Village is the official training home for Kansas City NWSL. State-of-theart Swope Soccer Village sits in the heart of Kansas City, Missouri's historic Swope Park.

The \$20+ million facility has served as a training site for an illustrious list of teams since opening in 2007, including the U.S. Men's and Women's National Teams, Manchester United, Manchester City, AS Roma, CD Guadalajara, Club America, Montpellier, Newcastle United and Stoke City. In addition, Swope Soccer Village has attracted numerous championship-level events to the region.

Swope Soccer Village consists of six (6) Greenfields synthetic turf fields, and three (3) natural Bermuda grass fields. Pitch dimensions are 75 yards wide by 112 yards long. For soccer, all fields are capable of a 11v11, 9v9, or 7v7 set up.

For Championship play, Children's Mercy Victory Field has fixed stadium seating for up to 2,000+ spectators, a press box with Wi-Fi, PA, scoreboard, and catwalk for all necessary game production needs. Also, all fields have the capability to be multi-sport!

LEGENDS FIELD

Legends Field is the home of Kansas City NWSL for the 2021 season. Located in Kansas City, Kansas, the stadium opened in 2003 as the baseball home of the Kansas City T-Bones, now known as the Kansas City Monarchs.

On match days, this facility is transformed into a unique and intimate soccer stadium full of the loudest, craziest and passionate fans in the NWSL.

Season, group and flex plan ticket packages are available, or fans can buy individual match tickets for as little as \$20.
