YURCAK FIELD

Sky Blue FC plays its home matches at Yurcak Field on the campus of Rutgers University in Piscataway, NJ.

Officially known as “The Soccer/Lacrosse Stadium at Yurcak Field” in honor of Ronald N. Yurcak, a 1965 All-American Rutgers Lacrosse player, the stadium was dedicated in 1994 and is considered one of the premier soccer and lacrosse facilities in the country. Yurcak Field seats 5,000 fans in the grandstand with room for additional fans across the field in the stadium’s lawn area.

POLICIES AND PARKING

CLEAR BAG POLICY

Fans will be able to carry the following style and approximately sized bags into all athletic venues:

Bags that are clear plastic, vinyl or PVC and are approximately 12" x 6" x 12", or one-gallon clear plastic storage bag or similar, and/or Small clutch bags, approximately the size of a hand, with or without a handle or strap can be taken into athletic venues in addition to one of the clear plastic bag options.

An exception will be made for medically necessary items after proper inspection at the Guest Services gates designated for this purpose.

Prohibited bags include: purses larger than a clutch bag, coolers, briefcases, backpacks, fanny packs, cinch bags, luggage of any kind, computer bags and camera bags or any bag larger than the permissible size.

Prohibited items include: alcoholic beverages, balloons, bottles, cans, containers, coolers, fireworks, flares, laser pointers, noise making devices, pets, plastic horns, smoke bombs, smoking, sticks/poles, strollers, umbrellas, weapons, whistles and other items deemed dangerous and/or inappropriate.

Any prohibited bag at the gate will be highly visible and more quickly resolved. Prohibited bags will be turned away. Clear bags are easily and quickly searched and greatly reduce faulty bag searches. It also supports the Department of Homeland Security's "If You See Something, Say Something" campaign.

PARKING

Parking is conveniently located next to Yurcak Field and costs \$5 per vehicle.



OWNERSHIP GROUP



STEVEN TEMARES

Steven Temares has been part of the ownership group of Sky Blue Soccer since 2009. He is the Chief Executive Officer and member of the Board of Directors of Bed Bath & Beyond Inc., which operates under the names Bed Bath & Beyond, Christmas Tree Shops, Christmas Tree Shops and That!, or and That!, Harmon or Harmon Face Values, buybuy BABY and World Market, Cost Plus World Market or Cost Plus. In addition, The Company operates Of A Kind, an e-commerce website that features specially commissioned, limited edition items from emerging fashion and home designers. The Company also operates Linen Holdings, a provider of a variety of textile products, amenities and other goods to institutional

customers in the hospitality, cruise line, food service, healthcare and other industries. Additionally, the Company is a partner in a joint venture which operates seven retail stores in Mexico under the name Bed Bath & Beyond. He is a graduate of Rutgers University – where he serves on the Board of Overseers – and the University of Pennsylvania Law School. In addition, he is on the Advisory Board and Board of Directors of the New York Mets.

Temares and his wife, Amy, have three daughters.

PHIL AND TAMMY MURPHY

Born in Boston, Gov. Murphy and his family have called Monmouth County, New Jersey, home for two decades. A graduate of both Harvard University and the University of Pennsylvania, he made his career in financial services, and worked around the world. Since his retirement from business 2003, he and Tammy have immersed themselves in charitable works and public service.

From 2009 until 2013, the Governor served with distinction as the United States Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany, having been appointed by former President Barack Obama. He also served as national finance chairman of the Democratic National Committee alongside former chairman Howard Dean, and played an integral role in the implementation of the 50-State Strategy that culminated in Democrats retaking Congress and the 2008 election of President Obama.

The Governor has served as the board chair of 180 Turning Lives Around, a Monmouth County organization committed to ending domestic and sexual violence; he and Tammy founded 2nd Floor, a successful teen helpline. He also served as New Jersey's sole representative on the national operating board of the NAACP. In 2014, he and Tammy founded New Start New Jersey, a statewide "think and do" organization dedicated to finding bold ideas to jump-start the state's economy and rebuild the middle class. Gov. Murphy is a founding partner of Democracy Alliance, an organization committed to growing grassroots engagement in politics and public service.

DENISE REDDY

HEAD COACH

Denise Reddy is entering her second season as head coach of Sky Blue FC. Previously an assistant coach with the Washington Spirit, Reddy is a New Jersey native who has served as a head coach in three different countries. Additionally, she is a UEFA Pro Licensed Coach with experience as a head coach in Sweden, Denmark and the United States, making her coaching philosophy an extremely unique one that incorporates a variety of cultures and playing styles.

Reddy began her coaching career in 2007 as the head coach of Jersey Sky Blue, which was the USL W-League side that preceded Sky Blue FC as a professional club. She then served as an assistant for the Chicago Red Stars from 2008 to 2010 before joining Linköpings FC in Sweden the following year. After working there as an assistant coach during the 2011 season, which saw Linköpings FC reach the UEFA Champions League Quarterfinals, she took over as head coach of the club in 2012. Reddy then made the move to B93/HIK/Skjold in Denmark, where she was the head coach from 2012 to 2014. She followed that up with a two-year campaign as head coach of Vittsjö GIK in Sweden before coming back stateside to work as an assistant coach for the Washington Spirit under former Sky Blue FC head coach Jim Gabarra. In her first year in Washington, the Spirit reached the NWSL Championship Match.

Sky Blue FC is the sixth professional team that Reddy has coached across Europe and the United States, and she also played internationally for 11 years as a center back for Umeå IK and Malmö FF in Sweden. While playing for Malmö FF from 1995-2005, she served as team captain for seven consecutive seasons and helped them reach the UEFA Champions League Semifinals in 2004. Prior to playing professionally, she was a two-year captain and NSCAA All-American at Rutgers University.



ALEX MENDOLIA ASSISTANT COACH

Mendolia joins Sky Blue from Unión Deportiva San Lorenzo del Flumen of the La Liga Division 3 in Spain where he served as the first assistant coach. Prior to that Mendolia served as an academy coach for Escuela de Futbol Huesca, where he oversaw the player residency program for domestic and international players and the Women's B team. Before his time in Spain, Mendolia spent two years (2016-18) as the head coach for the men's soccer team at St. Joseph's College where he led the team to the 2017 Conference Finals.

Mendolia has also served as an assistant coach for Stony Brook University (2015-16), LIU Post (2012-15) and Farmingdale State College (2011-12).



CHRISTIANE LESSA ASSISTANT COACH

Lessa joins Sky Blue from Shandong Province Federation of China where she has served as their head coach since September of 2018. Prior to that she spent time in Norway as the assistant coach for Avaldsnes I.L. who competed in the Champions League.

Prior to going overseas, Lessa served as the U-20 Washington Spirits Head Coach. Additionally, she was the head coach for Young Harris College and Iowa Central Community College.



HUGO MACEDO GOALKEEPER COACH

Macedo joins Sky Blue from Des Moines Menace of the Women's Professional Soccer League and Premier Development League where he served as the head coach. In addition, he has served as the assistant coach for Drake University.

Macedo has also been a professional coach for Johnston Urbandale Soccer Club and Sporting Iowa Soccer. He has also been the Director of Goalkeeping for Altoona Youth Soccer



MORGAN HOFACKER PERFORMANCE COACH

Hofacker joins Sky Blue FC from Perseverance Strength and Conditioning where she served as a strength coach, implementing training programs on an individual and team level.

Hofacker earned a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and Exercise Science at Rutgers University and a second Bachelor of Science degree in Food and Nutrition from the University of Alabama. She is currently enrolled in Rutgers' graduate program in Kinesiology and Applied Physiology.

CREDENTIALS

Season media credentials will be issued to accredited news-paper, magazine, television, radio and online outlets making reasonable requests. Individual game credentials may be requested no later than 48 hours before kickoff by emailing npaolino@skybluesoccer.com. Any unauthorized use of media credentials, including receiving player autographs and posing for pictures with players, will result in forfeiture of credential privileges. Credentials are property of Sky Blue FC and can be revoked at any time.

MEDIA ENTRANCE

Media can pick up their credentials at the media entrance near will call on the right side of Yurcak Field. The media entrance will open up approximately two hours prior to kickoff. In order to receive one's credential each member of the media must present photo identification.

STADIUM ACCESS

Access at Yurcak Field will be determined prior to the match and cannot be changed. Only credentialed photographers are allowed on the field during the match. No members of the media will be granted access of any kind to the Sky Blue FC locker room.

POST-GAME PROCEDURE

Following the final whistle, a representative of the Sky Blue FC communications department will escort media down to the mix zone area near the Sky Blue FC locker room. The Sky Blue players will walk through the mix zone on the way to their locker room while the visiting team will walk through the mix zone on the way to the bus.

PRESS BOX

The press box, which opens two hours before kickoff, is for working media members with valid credentials only. It is a workplace, therefore cheering and loud noises are strictly prohibited. It is important that even media members with season credentials notify Sky Blue FC communications department of their intentions to cover a game in order to receive press box seating. Abuse of press box privileges will result in forfeiture of media credentials.

REGULAR SEASON:

Each of the nine (9) NWSL clubs will play 24 games, 12 at home and 12 away.

Clubs will play each opponent three times.

POINT SYSTEM:

Teams will receive three points for a win, one point for a tie and zero points for a loss.

REFEREES:

All referees in NWSL are either USSF (United States Soccer Federation) or CSA (Canadian Soccer Association) National Referees. Referees for all NWSL games will be trained, assigned and evaluated by PRO (Professional Referee Organization).



2018 NWSL RULES & REGULATIONS

GAME CLOCK:

The official game time for all National Women's Soccer League games will be managed on the field by the referee. If necessary, the referee may also allot extra time (a.k.a. "stoppage time") at the end of each period (first half, second half, and if applicable, first overtime period and second overtime period during playoff matches) to allow for injuries, time-wasting or other disturbances.

The stadium clock will display the time from 0:00 to 45:00 and from 45:00 to 90:00. For statistical purposes, the minutes for goals, substitutions, yellow cards, etc., will be listed from the first minute until the 90th minute. A goal scored at 15 minutes 10 seconds will be listed as having been scored in the 16th minute. Events occurring during stoppage time will follow the international norm by being demarcated with a "+" sign and the extra minutes. For example, a goal scored three minutes into first half stoppage time will be officially identified as happening at "48+".

GAME DAY ROSTERS:

Each team can nominate 18 players for a game day roster. Teams are allowed three substitutions per game.

CAUTIONS AND SUSPENSIONS:

A Player will be suspended for one game upon receiving her fifth yellow card, regardless of the nature of the infraction which resulted in her being awarded the yellow card. A second suspension of one game would result after the awarding of an additional three cards as would a third suspension after the awarding of card number eleven.



2018 NWSL RULES & REGULATIONS

LIGHTNING AND SEVERE WEATHER:

Given the likelihood of lightning during the League season, and the potential for personal injury and structural damages lightning can cause, each Home Team will have a detailed weather delay plan that includes the following:

- 1) Specific persons in charge of decision-making (one management level person from the stadium, one person from the Home Team, one person from law enforcement)
- 2) Direct contact with the U.S. Weather Bureau and/or Doppler radar
- 3) Formation of a weather delay committee with pre-designated meeting location (and back-up location) that includes the Referee, Team representatives and TV producer
- 4) Immediate and consistent contact with the League's Game Notice Designee
- 5) Updates to spectators and media via PA announcement (and video if available)
- 6) "Standing Orders" (procedures) published and posted to accomplish the above in the event it is deemed safe to resume play, refer to "Team Warm-Up Period Following Game Delay" for League guidelines.

HYDRATION BREAKS:

The match referee reserves the right to implement hydration breaks during matches during extremely hot or humid weather conditions. The League will provide each Team with a wet bulb globe thermometer (WBGT), which must be used to determine whether hydration breaks are to be implemented, and the following process shall be used by the match referee:

Pre-Game and Halftime Decision Making Process

The wet bulb globe temperature reading will be required for every League match.

The League shall mandate the use of hydration breaks if the wet bulb globe temperature measures 82 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. The referee can, at any time, implement a discretionary hydration break in cases in which player safety is determined to be at risk.

The fourth official will be responsible for reading the WBGT at the kickoff spot at the conclusion of the pre-match warmup and after the whistle blows for the end of the first half.

The option to employ a hydration break should be confirmed by the referee to a member of each Team's technical staff after each WBGT reading. A designated representative from each Team must be present at the time of the reading.

Any onsite questions should be directed to the match day officials.

Implementation and control of the breaks will be managed solely by the referee.

HYDRATION BREAKS CONTINUED:

Implementation

Two (2) separate WBGT readings will take place during the match:

The first reading will take place immediately after the conclusion of pre-match warmups have concluded.

- If the WBGT measurement meets or exceeds 82 degrees Fahrenheit, there will be a mandatory hydration break near the 30th and 75th minutes respectively.
- If the WBGT measurement does not meet 82 degrees Fahrenheit, there will not be a mandatory hydration break at the 30th minute.

The second reading will take place immediately after the Referee signals the end of the first half.

- If the WBGT measurement meets or exceeds 82 degrees Fahrenheit, there will be a mandatory hydration break near the 75th minute.
- Each break will last up to three (3) minutes in length. If the match is nationally televised the match may not restart without the direction and approval from the designated Red Hat.
- If the WBGT drops by at least ten (10) degrees (72 degrees Fahrenheit or below) prior to the 30th or 75th minute, the Referee will have the ability to nullify the mandatory hydration break.
- The Fourth Official will be responsible for the reading of the temperature near the 30th and 75th minute respectively in cases where the WBGT may drop by at least ten (10) degrees.
- Additionally, the Referee will still be able to impose a “discretionary” hydration break(s) if they believe there is a risk to player safety even if the WBGT reading does not reach 82 degrees Fahrenheit.

2018 NWSL RULES & REGULATIONS



HYDRATION BREAKS CONTINUED:

The ball must be out of play for the hydration break to commence. The Referee will signal for the start of the break and inform both Clubs and all match Officials. The clock will continue to run and all time allotted for the break will be added to stoppage time. Both Clubs will go to their respective Club bench areas.

- Players must remain on the field of play.
- Coaches cannot leave their respective technical areas.
- Bench personnel cannot enter the field of play (excluding medical personnel). Entering the field of play during a hydration break is subject to sanctions.

EXTREME HEAT POLICY:

Due to the environmental conditions (high temperatures, humidity, and solar radiation, synthetic surface) during the summer months in the United States, and the need to protect our players from serious heat-related illnesses, the League has instituted the following policy and procedures in the event that the anticipated or current high air temperature for the day in the Team market is 90 degrees Fahrenheit or higher on the WBGT.

All current procedures for determining the implementation of hydration break(s) will not change. The threshold for mandatory hydration breaks still occurs at 82 degrees Fahrenheit on the WBGT and will take place at approximately the 30th and 75th minute of the match.

Extreme Heat – Reporting

If, in conjunction with the air temperature being at or above 90 degrees Fahrenheit, the National Weather Service issued an Extreme Heat Warning or Watch or a Heat Advisory, all WBGT readings, even if they are below the threshold, must be reported into the League office by the home Team's operations staff. The League will notify key contacts of WBGT readings.



2018 NWSL RULES & REGULATIONS

EXTREME HEAT POLICY CONTINUED:

Extreme Heat – Match Delay Procedures

The Referee will add a third WBGT measurement, if the anticipated high air temperature of the day is 90 degrees Fahrenheit or above. The first WBGT measurement will occur approximately 60 minutes prior to the start of the match at the kickoff spot.

If the WBGT temperature reads at or above 95 degrees Fahrenheit, the home Team's operations staff is required to alert the League.

- The League will disseminate the information to all appropriate parties.
- The Fourth Official will take a second WBGT measurement 45 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the match (approximately right before player warm-ups).
- If the WBGT temperature reads below 95 degrees Fahrenheit, warm-ups may begin.
- If the WBGT temperature reads at or above 95 degrees Fahrenheit, the home Team operations staff will alert the League and the match will officially go into a delay.

EXTREME HEAT POLICY CONTINUED:

During the Delay

Similar to a severe weather delay, the match will not start or resume until it is safe to do so as outlined by the procedures below.

The Fourth Official will take another WBGT measurement 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the match. Follow the same procedure as above, should the WBGT reading meet or exceed 95 degrees Fahrenheit.

- If the WBGT temperature reads below 95 degrees Fahrenheit, warm-ups may begin.

Following the reading 15 minutes prior to the start of the match, should the delay continue, a WBGT measurement will be taken every 30 minutes at the kickoff spot, until it is deemed safe to play, below 95 degrees Fahrenheit, or until such time has passed that the League decides to postpone the match.

- In the event a WBGT measurement is below the 95 degrees Fahrenheit threshold by 1 degree (i.e., 94 degrees Fahrenheit), it will be the Fourth Official in conjunction with the home Team's physician with feedback from visiting Team medical personnel, operations, officials and both technical staffs, to make the ultimate decision if and when play is allowed to resume.

The Referees will take the second WBGT reading immediately after the conclusion of pre-match warmups. Follow the same procedures as above should the WBGT reading meet or exceed 95 degrees Fahrenheit.

The referees will take the third WBGT reading immediately following the referee's whistle to end the 1st half of play. Again, follow the same procedures as above should the WBGT measurement meet or exceed 95 degrees Fahrenheit.

NWSL PLAYOFFS:

Single-Elimination Format

Who Qualifies:

The top four clubs in points from the League standings at the end of the regular season, qualify for the NWSL Playoffs. The two Semifinals will be decided by a single knockout game, the winner of which will advance to the Championship Game.

The NWSL Championship will be a single match hosted at a pre-determined site.

If the score is tied after 90 minutes of play in any playoff game, two 15-minute extra time periods will be played in their entirety, followed by kicks from the penalty mark, if necessary.

Team-Standings Tie-Breaking Procedures

The team awarded the highest position in the NWSL standings will be the team with the greatest number of points (three points for a win, one point for a tie, zero points for a loss). In the event that two teams finish the regular season with an equal number of points, the following system will be used to break the tie:

When two or more teams are tied in the standings on points (3 points for a win, 1 point for a draw, 0 points for a loss), the following tiebreakers will be used in the sequence below, until one team ranks ahead of the other(s):

Team-Standings Tie-Breaking Procedures Continued:

- 1) The highest position shall be awarded to the team with the better win/loss record in current Regular Season games against all other teams equal in points. (head-to-head competition)
- 2) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team with the greater goal difference against all other teams during the Regular Season. (goal differential)
- 3) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team scoring the greatest number of total goals against all other teams during the Regular Season. (total goals)
- 4) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played on the road by each team against all other teams during the Regular Season. (road 1-3)
- 5) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played at home by each team against all other teams during the regular season. (home 1-3)

If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position in the standings shall be determined by the toss of a coin.

The first tiebreaker in a three-way tie is also head-to-head, but it is determined via points-per-game versus the other two teams. If two teams are tied in points-per-game head-to-head, the next tie breaker is goal difference.

NOTE: If two clubs remain tied after another club with the same number of points advances during any step, the tie breaker reverts to step 1 of the two-club format.



TEAM HISTORY

Sky Blue FC, owned and operated by Sky Blue Women's Soccer Inc., is an internationally recognized organization dedicated to becoming the leader in high-level soccer, both in the national and international arena. Sometimes referred to as Sky Blue Soccer, the organization's mission is based on an integrated program allowing players to progress from youth through amateur ranks to professional status.



Established in the fall of 2006, Sky Blue Soccer made its on-field debut as Jersey Sky Blue in the USL W-League in 2007. Sky Blue Soccer successfully operated Jersey Sky Blue for two seasons before partnering and transferring the W-League team to Quickstrike FC in New York.

Sky Blue FC made its professional debut in 2009 as a founding member of Women's Professional Soccer (WPS), winning the inaugural league championship that year after an improbable run through the WPS Playoffs with Christie Pearce as player/coach. Sky Blue FC competed in all three seasons that WPS played.

In November 2012, the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) announced the establishment of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL). Sky Blue FC became one of the eight founding members of the NWSL, which was supported by the USSF, Canadian Soccer Association and the Federation of Mexican Football.

TEAM HISTORY

Sky Blue FC set several franchise records during the inaugural 2013 NWSL season, including a 435-minute shutout streak and going six matches without a loss. Despite being at the top of the table for the majority of the regular season, the club finished the season in fourth place, claiming the final spot for the NWSL Playoffs. Sky Blue FC met the Western New York Flash in a semifinal game, suffering a 2-0 defeat.

During its 2014 campaign, Sky Blue FC hit a few hurdles along the way before truly finding its groove over the home stretch of the regular season. The New Jersey side ended the regular season as the hottest team in the league, matching a franchise-record five-match winning streak, but ultimately ended up just a single point shy of the postseason.

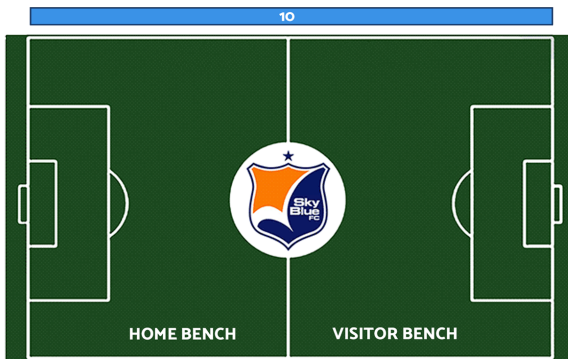
Prior to the start of the 2016 season, Sky Blue FC promoted assistant Christy Holly to head coach, as former head coach Jim Gabarra made the move to the Washington Spirit after four seasons in New Jersey. Holly spent most of two seasons at the position.

Over the past three seasons, Sky Blue FC has seen Imani Dorsey garner the 2018 NWSL Rookie of the Year, midfielder Raquel Rodriguez win NWSL Rookie of the Year honors in 2016 and Sam Kerr earn NWSL Most Valuable Player accolades in 2017. Kerr set the league single-season scoring record with 17 goals, and she also stands as the NWSL career record-holder in goals. This past season Kailen Sheridan set the league record for the most saves in a single season with 108.

Head Coach Denise Reddy returns for her second season with Sky Blue FC. A member of the original Jersey Sky Blue, Reddy looks to guide Sky Blue FC to its first playoff appearance since 2013.

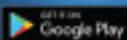
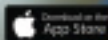
