MATCH PREVIEW

The Carolina RailHawks (4W-2D-4L) travel to Blaine, Minn. to take on Minnesota United FC (5W-1D- 4L) at National Sports Center Stadium. The opening fixture of the fall season will feature a rematch of the spring season opener. The last time the two sides met, the host RailHawks earned a 2-1 victory over Minnesota. A goal from Tiyi Shipalane cancelled out Minnesota's opener in the 13th minute, and in the 26th minute, Austin Da Luz headed home the game-winner. Minnesota United finished fourth in the spring season while the RailHawks finished seventh, with two points separating the teams. Both sides will look to earn a win and start the season on a positive note.

LAST TIME OUT

The RailHawks fell to Indy Eleven in the final game of the 2016 NASL Fall Season 4-1 in Indianapolis, Ind. on June 11. Nazmi Albadawi scored his first goal of the NASL Spring Season and Jeremy Kelly made his first start for Carolina.

COMING UP NEXT

The RailHawks will return to WakeMed Soccer Park to host the Tampa Bay Rowdies in their next match on Saturday July, 9 at 7:30 PM. The last meeting between the two sides saw the RailHawks earn a 3-1 victory over the Rowdies. James Marcelin, Alex Pérez and Brian Shriver all scored in the match. Nick Taitague also made his debut during the game, becoming the youngest-ever player to appear in a RailHawks match.

RAILHAWKS BOLSTER ATTACK

The RailHawks recently acquired prolific striker Matt Fondy for the start of the 2016 Fall Season. Fondy, the 2015 USL MVP and Golden Boot winner, joins the RailHawks from NASL's Jacksonville Armada FC. The 26-year-old, who set a record scoring 22 goals in 28 appearances in the USL, also spent time with MLS sides Chivas USA and Chicago Fire in 2013 and 2014.

CAROLINA RAILHAWKS HEAD COACH COLIN CLARKE



Colin Clarke enters his fifth season as head coach of the Carolina RailHawks after being appointed to the position on December 6, 2011. Clarke signed a new multi-year contract with the RailHawks on 2014. This contract makes Colin Clarke the longest tenured head coach in franchise history.

Prior to joining the RailHawks for the 2012 NASL Season, Clarke enjoyed successful seasons with league rival the Puerto Rico Islanders and FC Dallas of Major League Soccer. After a successful professional and international playing career, Clarke was hired to his first head coaching job with the Richmond Kickers by then Kickers General Manager and current RailHawks' President Curt Johnson in 1998. In his first season, Clarke led the RailHawks to a fourth place league finish accompanied by a run to the NASL Semifinals and a historic run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup highlighted by a victory over the 2011 and 2012 MLS Champion, LA Galaxy.

In the newly formatted 2013 NASL Regular Season, Clarke led the RailHawks to accumulate the most points over the Spring Season and Fall Season with an overall record of 12 wins, 7 ties, and 7 losses in league play. In 2013, Clarke and the RailHawks once again defeated the LA Galaxy in the Third Round of the U.S. Open Cup and avenged their Fourth Round loss in 2012 with a 3-1 victory over Chivas USA. The trip to the Quarterfinals of the 100th Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup was the RailHawks longest run in the annual tournament since their Semifinal run in 2007.

Over his two seasons in charge, Clarke led the Kickers to a 38 - 18 record. During the 2003 Major League Soccer season, Clarke took over as head coach of the Dallas Burn (later named FC Dallas) and turned around the club's fortunes, leading the club to a Western Conference first place finish in 2006. In 2007 Clarke joined the Puerto Rico Islanders. His tenure in Puerto Rico was highlighted by a league regular season championship in 2008 and a historic run to the semifinals of the 2008-2009 CONCACAF Champions League before losing to Cruz Azul in a penalty kick shootout. For his accomplishments over the course of the 2008 season, Clarke was named the league's Coach of the Year. In 2010, Clarke's Islanders made headlines in Champions League play once again when they defeated the LA Galaxy 4 - 1 at the Home Depot Center. Following their Champions League success, the Islanders went on to defeat the RailHawks in the USSF-D2 Pro League Championship Final. Clarke left his tenure with the Islanders with a league regular season championship (2008), a league championship (2010), two CFU Club Championships (2010, 2011), and five consecutive playoff berths (2007-2011).

Prior to coaching, Clarke established himself as one of the top players from Northern Ireland representing the country in the 1986 World Cup and experiencing a twelve-year playing career in England. Clarke began his playing career with Peterborough United of the Football League Fourth Division in 1981 and quickly ascended to England's First Division spending time with Southampton, Queens Park Rangers, and Portsmouth until a knee injury ended his playing career. Appearing 38 times for the Northern Ireland National Team, Clarke recorded a World Cup goal, a hat-trick, and finished his career as the all-time leading goal scorer for Northern Ireland (13). Clarke finished his professional career with 147 goals in 436 matches.
