PREVIEW

FAMILIAR FACES

Orange County SC and LA Galaxy II played each other six weeks ago in a preseason match at Championship Soccer Stadium, which finished in a 3-1 loss for OC.

Not to mention, a number of Orange County players have spent time at Los Dos including, Nathan Smith, Brian Iloski, and Abraham Romero.

THE 405 DERBY

Orange County and LA have a historied rivalry in the USL and, while the season has just begun, this match comes at a crucial point for both clubs. OC looks to continue their momentum from last week's victory over a strong Sacramento side and LA looks to bounce back from an ugly loss at home to the USL newcomers, Oakland.

DEFENSE

Both teams like to play with an aggressive, physical style of play. Of the five clubs that have played two matches so far this season, Orange County is the only to have tallied eight yellow cards. At the moment, OC is also tied with El Paso for the least goals conceded. LA's defense has been solid as well, only allowing an average of one goal per game in their six matches.

MATCH RECAP: SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC

Orange County SC welcomed fans back to Championship Soccer Stadium for the first time in 442 days last Saturday night and impressed the hometown crowd by handing Sacramento Republic FC their first loss of the regular season.

Despite having limited capacity, the stadium was buzzing and the fans helped push the boys in black and orange to victory in the final moments of the match.

Both teams battled for opportunity to start the game, but Orange County was lethal on the counter attack and eventually found the back of the net in the 33' minute. Thomas Enevoldsen teed up Chris Wehan beautiful inside the box, and the rest was history.

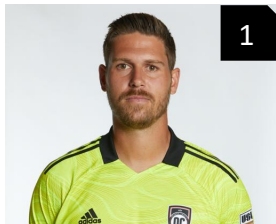
It was only fitting to have the Orange County native score the first goal of the season for his hometown club. It was a special moment that drove OC's momentum for the rest of the match.

Both sides played aggressively in the second half, tallying a total of six yellow cards and three for each club. Sacramento came closer to evening the score, but the closest chance of the half came from Enevoldsen with only a few minutes remaining. He took the ball nearly half the length of the field before he was halted by the keeper.

ABOUT ORANGE COUNTY SC

Orange County Soccer Club is Orange County's only professional soccer team and a part of the United Soccer League (USL), the fastest growing Division II professional soccer league in the world comprised of 31 teams across the United States.

The team plays their home games at the Orange County Great Park's Championship Soccer Stadium located in Irvine, CA. Nestled right in the heart of the Great Park, the Championship Soccer Stadium has a capacity of over 5,000 for Orange County SC matches.

Orange County SC was one of 12 founding members of the USL during its inaugural 2011 season. The predecessor club, Orange County Blues, were the 2015 Western Conference Regular Season Champions and reached the Western Conference Semi-Finals of the USL Playoffs in back-to-back seasons. Orange County SC won the Western Conference Championship and reached the USL Cup semi-finals in 2018.

Team owner and Chief Investment Officer of LARO Properties, James Keston, purchased and rebranded the team in 2017. Keston actively oversees all operations of the team and is dedicated to providing a pathway to professional soccer and a world-class soccer organization that focuses on the fans, players, and youth clubs of Orange County. In December 2019, Orange County SC entered into a strategic partnership with Rangers FC from the Scottish Premier League.



ABOUT USL CHAMPIONSHIP

The USL Championship is one of the most successful professional soccer leagues in the world, reaching a population of more than 84 million and fueling the growth of the game across North America. Sanctioned by the U.S. Soccer Federation as a Division II professional league, the USL Championship includes a membership of more than 31 clubs across the United States and Canada.

Through the USL Championship headquarters in Tampa, Florida, the league's clubs are provided with unparalleled support with a growing team of more than 50 professionals across 17 departments, ranging from operations to marketing, communications and sponsorship.

The USL Championship has a national media partnership with ESPN, wherein all league matches are broadcast on ESPN+, ESPN3 and across linear channels. The league also operates USL Productions, which includes a state-of-the-art facility that produced and distributed more than 500 league matches and more than 1,000 hours of original content to national partners, local affiliates and international markets throughout the 2018 season.

HISTORY

The USL Championship was formed when two existing professional leagues were combined into a single league property before the 2011 season. The league was designed to help ensure the long-term stability of professional soccer in North America and featured 12 teams in a pair of six-team divisions during its initial campaign. Among the league's founding members were five longtime USL clubs with more than 100 years of operation among them: the Charleston Battery, Harrisburg City Islanders (now Penn FC), Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, Richmond Kickers and Rochester Rhinos.

Over the course of the current decade, the sophisticated business model that provides the foundation for the USL Championship has allowed the league to grow into the largest professional soccer league in North America, with more than 31 current members that include world-class ownership groups. The league's current club owners also hold stakes in teams that compete in the National Basketball Association, Major League Baseball, the National Hockey League, Minor League Baseball and the NBA G-League. In January of 2017, after a thorough application review process, the U.S. Soccer Federation granted the USL Division II status beginning in the 2017 season, recognizing the significant investment and high level of operating excellence within the USL Championship and its member clubs.
