HOME SWEET HOME

Reno's opened up the season with a six-match undefeated streak at Greater Nevada Field. The team has three victories and three draws. Most recently, 1868 topped intra-state rival Las Vegas Lights FC 4-0 in a Silver State Cup match. The team will look to keep the home momentum, with four of their next five matches coming at Greater Nevada Field. Since the team's inaugural season in 2017, 1868 FC is 21-7-11 at home. The team's last home loss was August 25, 2018, and since then the Reno has gone 8-0-4. In their last 20 home matches, Reno's record is 12-2-6.

GOOD HISTORY

Reno and LA have met four times before, with Reno winning all four. Reno 1868's goal differential of +14 [is its highest against any western conference opponent.] The differential includes Reno's dominant 9-0 victory in March of 2017. The offensive explosion, just the 15th match in 1868's inaugural season, still stands as the most goals in franchise history. LA has been shut out in two of the four matches, scoring just one goal apiece in the other two matches.

- 20 Points on the season for Reno, good for eighth in the western conference. The total is five points back of conference-leading New Mexico United, and three points back of second-place Phoenix Rising FC. Phoenix comes to Reno on Tuesday.
- **8** Matches this season in which Reno has outshot their opponent. Reno is 2-1-5 in those matches, and 3-2-0 when they do not.

YOUNGSTER MAKING MOVES

15-year-old forward Cade Cowell notched his first USL goal last week in San Antonio. The youngster put the 1868 FC up 0-2 in the 16th minute after an errant pass by San Antonio in front of their own net. The goal came in Cowell's first start with 1868 FC.

NATIONAL TEAM CALL-UP

1868 forward Brian Brown was recently called up to the Jamaican national team, and earned the start in last week's friendly victory over the United States. Brown netted a goal and an assist in his most recent game for Reno, the 4-0 drubbing of Las Vegas on June 1.

Reno Set to Defend Home Pitch Against Los Angeles Galaxy II 1868 FC has started the year 3-0-3 at Greater Nevada Field

Reno, Nev. – After a road loss in San Antonio, Reno 1868 FC returns home to Greater Nevada Field this weekend to welcome LA Galaxy II to Northern Nevada. Reno leads the all-time series with LA 4-0-0, and has yet to lose a home match this season.

"The guys after a loss are practicing a bit testy, a little more physical," said head coach lan Russell. "They're not sulking, they're not pouting, they're ready to go."

In San Antonio, Reno took a 2-1 lead into halftime thanks to goals from forwards Corey Herzog and Cade Cowell. The first goal, off Herzog's right foot, came just seven minutes into the match and raised his season total to six. In the 16th minute, fifteen-year-old Cowell pounced on an errant pass and fired the ball into the net for his first career USL Championship goal. The match was Cowell's first start with the team.

"We had a good chance to go up three, Raul Mendiola hit the crossbar," said Russell. "We had a good first half and felt good going into the second half."

LA is coming off of a 3-0 road loss to El Paso. The loss is their second straight scoreless match, and was their first defeat since a 3-0 loss to Fresno on May 12. The Galaxy II had tied their previous four matches.

On the season, Reno is 3-0-3 in the friendly confines of Greater Nevada field, and LA is 1-2-2 on the road. LA comes into Reno averaging fewer goals and shots per match than 1868 FC, and sports a -9 goal differential to Reno's +7.

"Typically they are a mix of some younger players along with the first team players that are coming down," said Russell. "Should be a good team coming."

Only two points separate the two teams in the USL Championship's Western Conference, as Los Angeles sits in the 11 spot with 18 points. Reno sits in eighth with 20 points on the season.

Saturday's action gets underway at 7:15 p.m. PT, with gates opening at 6:15 p.m. PT. The first 1,000 fans in attendance will receive an 1868 FC soccer ball, and the first fireworks show of the season will start after the match. Tickets are still available at reno1868fc.com or the Greater Nevada Field ticket office.

TECHNICAL STAFF



IAN RUSSELL HEAD COACH

Russell played for the University of Washington and later started his professional career with the Seattle Sounders of the USL First Division in 1998 and 1999. Russell was drafted by the San Jose Earthquakes in 2000 and continued to play seven seasons in MLS. Six of those seasons came with the Earthquakes, where Russell helped the team win two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003. In 2008, Russell returned to the Earthquakes as an assistant coach, a position he held for eight seasons. He helped lead the club to the postseason twice, while earning the Supporters' Shield for best regular season record (19-6-9) in 2012. Russell was also instrumental in the Quakes' international and collegiate scouting efforts, and briefly helped oversee the club's youth development as the academy's technical director. He served as the Earthquakes interim head coach for the final two games of the 2014 season and holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license.



CASEY TATE ASSISTANT COACH

Tate joined the Reno 1868 FC staff in 2017 and served as an Assistant Coach under Head Coach Ian Russell for the inaugural season. He came to Reno 1868 from the University of Nevada where he spent 8 seasons as the Assistant Coach for the Wolf Pack Soccer program, being promoted to Head Coach Interim for the 2016 season. Tate helped lead the Pack to two postseason appearances and in 2016 posted the program's highest win total since its inaugural season in the Mountain West Conference. He has also been involved in the Reno/Tahoe youth soccer community for the past eight years and was the Director for several elite local clubs.



CHRIS MALENAB ASSISTANT COACH

Malenab joined Reno 1868 FC in 2018 after spending four years as an assistant coach and video analyst at Sacramento Republic FC. During the 2014 inaugural season of the Sacramento Republic FC, Malenab served as an assistant coach to Predrag Radosavljević (Preki) during the club's championship campaign. From 2015 to 2017 Malenab served as video analyst for the Sacramento Republic FC under head coach Paul Buckle. Malenab started his coaching career coaching and serving as technical director at various youth clubs in the greater Sacramento area while coaching high school soccer. Along with his youth coaching experience, Malenab has served as an assistant coach at the college level, at Cosumnes River College (NJCAA), California State University Stanislaus (NCAA D-II) and San Joaquin Delta College (NJCAA).

The midfielder made four starts and nine appearances for FC CIncinnati while recording one of the highest passing accuracies on the team (83 percent) and won half of his aerial duels.Before joining FC Cincinnati in 2017, Seymore played for Vancouver Whitecaps FC 2 for two years (2015-2017)

The midfielder scored one goal for Reno 1868 FC and was selected to the USL Team of the week during week 27 of the 2018 season.

He had 17 appearances for the club, scored two goals and had two assists.

Marcinkowski was selected to USL's Team of the Week in week two of the 2018 season and was named
